### San Diego State Aztecs (2-6, 0-0 MWC) vs. Loyola College Greyhounds (5-3, 1-1 MAAC)

- **When & Where:** Wed., Dec. 28 (7:30 p.m. PST) at Cox Arena (12,414), San Diego, Calif.
- **Webcast/Live Stats:** Dan Lawton (play-by-play) will have the audio broadcast, while live stats will be available for all games on the Aztecs' official website - www.goaztecs.com.
- **The Records:** The San Diego State women's basketball team rounds out its 2005-06 non-conference schedule by playing host to the four-team San Diego Surf 'N Slam tournament, Dec. 28 and 30, at Cox Arena. The tournament, sponsored by Basketball Travelers, Inc., will be the Aztecs' first at home since the 2000 campaign. After Auburn and UC Davis play at 5:30 p.m. on Dec. 28, SDSU will face Loyola College in the first-ever meeting between the two schools at 7:30 p.m. (PST).  
The Aztecs will be completing a five-game homestand this week and are 2-6 on the season, while the Greyhounds are 5-3 overall and 1-1 in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference.
- **SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the first year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She coached the Aztecs from 1989 to 1997 and has a school record of 153-89 in nine seasons. Her 14-year head coaching record stands at 234-154.
- **Loyola Head Coach Joe Logan:** Logan is in his first year at Loyola and his first season as a head coach, posting a 5-3 overall record.
- **Loyola Series History:** First meeting.

## Aztecs Play Host To Four-Team San Diego Surf 'N Slam



The San Diego State women's basketball team concludes the 2005 calendar year by playing host to the San Diego Surf 'N Slam, Dec. 28 and 30, at Cox Arena.

Besides the Aztecs, the tournament also includes Auburn University, Loyola College and UC Davis. Auburn and UC Davis will play the first game on Wednesday at 5:30 p.m., followed by SDSU's first-ever meeting with Loyola College at 7:30 p.m. The consolation

(5:30 p.m.) and championship (7:30 p.m.) games will follow two days later on Friday.

SDSU is coming off a loss to Pittsburgh on Dec. 22, after grabbing its first two victories of the season versus Portland State (75-71) and Boise State (54-51).

The last time the Aztecs played host to a tournament was in November of 2000, when SDSU went 1-1 at the Pacific Bell Classic.

►SDSU has not played in a non-conference tournament since the 2003-04 campaign when it traveled to Birmingham, Ala., for the Lady Blazer Invitational.

►SDSU did not play host to a regular-season tournament in Beth Burns' first stint as head coach from 1989-97.

►SDSU women's hoops has played host to 15 home tournaments in its previous 29 years of existence... SDSU is a perfect 15-0 in the first game of a home tournament... the Aztecs have won the team title nine times, including each of the first four.

►SDSU has split each of its last three home tournaments, winning the first game and falling in the second in 1998, 1999 and in 2000.

#### Aztecs Fall To Pittsburgh, 78-56

The San Diego State women's basketball team saw its short two-game win streak come to an end against a strong Pittsburgh squad, as the Panthers defeated the Aztecs 78-56, Thursday afternoon at Cox Arena. With the loss, SDSU fell to 2-6 on the season, while Pittsburgh improved to 9-2 overall following the two schools' first meeting in almost a decade.

The Aztecs were led by senior **Michelle Strawberry (Corona, Calif.)**, who scored 16 points on 50 percent shooting from the field and also added a team-best five rebounds. It is her fourth straight game in double-figure scoring and her seventh overall this season.

Strawberry was helped by senior **Desiree Johnson's (Kahuku, Hawaii)** 10 points, while freshman **Tamika Lipford (Oceanside, Calif.)** contributed a career-high nine points and seven assists.

Pittsburgh opened the game with an 8-0 run before SDSU got on the board at the 16:23 mark on a jumper by freshman **Jana Heinrich (Fischbach, Germany)**. The Aztecs cut the deficit to three points exactly four minutes later on Lipford's jumper at 12-9, but Pittsburgh used its height and strong presence on the offensive glass to lead by 16 points at the half, 36-20.

SDSU would close the gap to as few as 13 points in the second half on two occasions at 48-35 and 49-36, but Pittsburgh went on a 13-6 run over the next five and a half minutes to go up by 20 points, eventually winning by a 22-point margin at 78-56.

#### Other Pittsburgh Game Notes

A season-high 13 Aztecs saw playing time against the Panthers... Junior walk-on Taryn Milburn saw her first action in a SDSU uniform... SDSU had 17 assists on their 23 total field goals.

#### Lipford's Language

Aztec freshman Tamika Lipford has been an assist machine in the team's last three contests. Lipford has 22 assists in that span and currently ranks second in the Mountain West Conference with a 4.88 per game average.

After being shut out in the assist column at Pepperdine, Lipford had 11 versus Portland State, four against Boise State and then seven in last week's game with Pittsburgh. The 11 assists against Portland State are the most by an Aztec since Shannon Lee had 14 assists versus Illinois State on Nov. 24, 2000 (W, 88-59).

Through eight games, Lipford already has 39 assists, which are just 20 fewer than last year's team season leader, current sophomore **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)**, who had 59 in 28 contests.

#### Moving On Up

With her 2-for-3 performance from beyond the arc against Pittsburgh, SDSU senior Michelle Strawberry made a move

up the career charts in three-point field goal attempts. Strawberry is currently tied for eighth in attempts with 166, while she remains in 10th place in three-pointers made with 50.

The forward has accounted for half (8-of-16) of the Aztecs' three-pointers in 2005-06, after posting a career best 33 last season.

### Blocking Machine

After posting a season-high eight blocks versus Portland State, the Aztecs have five in each of the last two outings for a total of 18 in the current homestand. Senior Desiree Johnson has seven of those 18 and is currently leading the Mountain West Conference in blocks per game with a 1.62 average (13 blocks).

SDSU has two other players ranked in the conference top 13 in blocks, including sophomore **Shanna Demus (Palmdale, Calif.)**, who is seventh (1.12/g), and freshman **Audrey Green (Fallbrook, Calif.)**, who is 13th (0.71).

### On The Boards

While Pittsburgh easily won the rebounding battle, SDSU recorded a season-best 44 rebounds in the win over Boise State last Tuesday. The 44 boards included 21 on the offensive glass, the Aztecs' most in that category since also posting 21 on Jan. 31, 2004, at Air Force. Overall, SDSU had a season-high plus-12 margin against the Broncos, marking the fifth time this season that the team has outrebounded an opponent. The Aztecs outrebounded an opponent just twice in the entire 2004-05 campaign.

### Straw's String

With her team-best 16 points against Pittsburgh, Aztec senior Michelle Strawberry has now scored in double-figures in each of the last four contests and in seven of the team's eight games in 2005-06. Strawberry is fifth in the Mountain West Conference in scoring with her team-best 15.4 points per game, while her 29 points in the opener with Wichita State are tied for the best in the MWC this season.

Dating back to last year, Strawberry has recorded 10 points or more in a game in 12 of her last 13 and in 17 of her last 20 contests.

### Seniors Rule

Michelle Strawberry hasn't been the only senior to carry the offensive load for the Aztecs in 2005-06. Classmate **Veronica Shaw (Phoenix, Ariz.)** scored 14 points in the victory against Boise State, after recording 16 points versus Portland State and a season-high 17 points at Pepperdine. Shaw fell just one point short of her fourth straight game in double-figures with nine points in the loss to Pittsburgh.

So far this season, Strawberry and Shaw have reached double-figures in points a combined 11 times and have accounted for 217 of the team's 479 total points (45.3 percent). Add in junior Desiree Johnson's 66 points and the three upperclassmen starters are contributing 57.6 percent of the total offense.

### Second-Half Sparks

With her 10 points in the second half against Pittsburgh, senior Michelle Strawberry has reached double-figures in a half five times this year. Strawberry's classmate, Veronica Shaw, has turned the trick on four occasions, while junior Desiree Johnson had 10 points in the second half against USD.

So far this year, an Aztec has scored 10 or more points in the second half of a game eight times as opposed to only twice in the first 20 minutes.

- ▶SDSU has never lost the first game of a regular season tournament that it has played host to. SDSU improves to 16-0 all-time in its opening round games.
- ▶SDSU is 3-1 in its last four games and is 3-2 on the season at Cox Arena.
- ▶SDSU is 2-2 against first-time opponents in 2005-06.
- ▶SDSU is 3-1 all-time against teams in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference. The Aztecs are 0-1 all-time versus Canisius and 1-0 against Fairfield and Iona.
- ▶SDSU head coach Beth Burns is 1-0 all-time versus Loyola.

#### Loyola College Tid-Bits

Loyola comes to San Diego having won five of its last six outings, after dropping its first two of the season... Under the direction of first-year head coach Joe Logan, the Greyhounds have wins over Long Island, St. Francis, Howard, Iona and Towson... Loyola is 5-3 overall and 1-1 in conference play... The team has been led by a pair of junior guards in Brittany Dunn (11.8 ppg.) and Jill Glessner (11.6 ppg.) ... Jackie Valderas is the team's top rebounder with 7.5 boards per game, while Krystle Harrington has a team-best 39 assists ... The Greyhounds have used the same starting five in all eight contests (Dunn, Glessner, Harrington, Troupe, Ruffin) ... SDSU plays a member of the MAAC for the second straight year. The Aztecs fell to Canisius, 71-61, on Jan. 4, 2005, in San Diego.

#### Elsewhere

Across town, USD is also playing host to its own San Diego Surf 'N Slam on the same days. The Torero division includes the host Toreros, No. 2 Duke and Montana State. Game times for both days at Jenny Craig Pavilion are set for 6 and 8 p.m.

#### Other 2005-06 Aztec Notes Thus Far

- SDSU's 79 points at Wichita State are the program's most in a season-opener since scoring 101 versus McNeese State in 1990. The Aztecs have scored 79 points or more just six times in their first previous campaigns with two of those coming a year ago.
- Wichita State attempted an SDSU opponent record 50 free-throws beating the previous mark of 48, held by Louisiana Tech on Jan. 19, 1986 (L, 87-43).
- Michelle Strawberry's 29 points at Wichita State are the most by an SDSU player since Jamey Cox had 30 against Cal State Fullerton in 1999. Her 12 field goals are the most since Jodi Nowlin-Tres had 12 versus Air Force in Feb. 1997, while her 21 attempts are the most since Nowlin-Tres had 25 at Fresno State in Feb. 1996.
- The SDSU-USD game attracted 971 fans to Cox Arena, the largest Aztec home crowd since 1,062 people saw the Aztecs beat Air Force back on Jan. 26, 2002. It is the best attendance for a non-conference home game since Dec. 11, 1998, when there were 972 fans to watch SDSU play UCLA.
- The Aztecs' 93.8 percent free-throw percentage against USD is the team's best when attempting 10 or more in a game since the 1988-89 campaign. The Aztecs made 22 of their 23 attempts (95.7) in a 78-56 win over Tennessee Tech on Dec. 3, 1988, in the second game of the SDSU Classic in Peterson Gym.
- Michelle Strawberry was named Mountain West Conference player of the week on Dec. 19, following her 22-point, 11-rebound performance in the team's win over Portland State. Strawberry is the first Aztec to be named Mountain West Conference player of the week since December 2002. She became the fifth SDSU player in the league's seven-year history to be named player of the week.
- SDSU limited Boise State to just 16, first-half points. The 16 points are the fewest by an SDSU opponent in the first half since Utah Valley State also scored 16 on Feb. 10, 2005.

#### Pick Eight

The San Diego State women's basketball team has been predicted to finish eighth in the Mountain West Conference in a preseason poll released Oct. 13, at the league's basketball media day in Salt Lake City, Utah. The voting panel consisted of the league's nine head coaches and select media.

The Aztecs, who finished tied for seventh with Air Force in the 2004-05 regular season, earned 45 votes from the panel, 13 more than the Falcons (32) and 45 behind Wyoming (90) for seventh place.

Utah, which tied for the 2004-05 regular season crown with New Mexico, was tabbed as the clear-cut preseason favorite, marking the third time the Utes have been picked to finish atop the conference. Utah received 23-of-26 first-place votes and 214 total points. New Mexico had two first-place votes and finished second with 180 points, followed by MWC newcomer TCU with one first-place vote and 164 points. UNLV (137 pts.) placed fourth, followed by Colorado State (117 pts.), BYU (107 pts.), Wyoming, SDSU and Air Force.

"We are pleased to announce our first recruiting class for 2006-07," said Burns, who is in her second stint as head coach at SDSU. "Through the efforts of many, we know that we've signed a terrific foundation of excellent student-athletes, who are excited about the opportunity to be an Aztec."

### Key Points For The Aztecs In 2005-06

**Offense** - Half of SDSU's top six scorers from the 2004-05 squad return this season, including senior Michelle Strawberry, who averaged a team-best 12.9 points per league game. Guards Kate Eveland and Veronica Shaw chipped in 6.0 and 5.1 points per game, respectively, but the remaining returnees combined to average just 2.1 points per outing.

**Defense** - San Diego State experienced extremes on the defensive side of the ball a year ago. The Aztecs led the conference in both steals and turnover margin, but on the flip side, struggled on the boards.

Returnees contributed over half of the Aztecs' 281 steals, including 52 by Eveland and 50 by Shaw. Freshmen Tamika Lipford and LaSandra Dixon, as well as transfer Shanna Demus add instant foot speed and athleticism to the line-up.

The Aztecs will look for immediate help in the rebounding department from front court newcomers Desiree Johnson, Jana Heinrich and Audrey Green, as well as redshirt sophomore Erin Jackson.

**The Schedule:** The most dramatic change in SDSU's 2005-06 schedule comes with the addition of a ninth team, TCU, to the Mountain West Conference ... league games will be played on Wednesdays or Thursdays and on Saturdays from Jan. 5 through March 4, but will no longer feature the travel partner format ... SDSU opens league play on Jan. 5, the earliest the Aztecs have played a conference contest since 1997-98 ... just two of the 10 non-conference foes appeared on last season's schedule (USD, UC Riverside) ... five schools - Auburn, Boise State, Loyola (Md.), Wichita State, UC Davis - are first-time Aztec opponents ... the Aztecs will face schools from as many as eight different conferences ... SDSU plays host to a tournament for the first time since 2000.

### SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa on April 8, 2005. In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02) and has an overall record of 234-154 (.603). Her current SDSU record stands at 153-89 (.632).
