San Diego State Aztecs (0-5, 0-0 MWC) vs. Portland State Vikings (5-3, 0-0 Big Sky)

► **When & Where:** Fri., Dec. 16, 2005, Cox Arena (12,414), San Diego, Calif., 7 p.m. (PST)

► **The Records:** The San Diego State women's basketball team (0-5) kicks off a five-game homestand Friday night with a match-up with visiting Portland State (5-3) at 7 p.m. at Cox Arena. The Aztecs, who are still in search of their first victory of 2005-06, opened the season with four of their first five games on the road.

SDSU renews its series with Portland State after a two-year break. The Vikings travel to San Diego having won five of their first six outings of the year before dropping their last two on the road at Cal Poly and Oregon State.

► **SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the first year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She coached the Aztecs from 1989 to 1997 and has a school record of 151-88 in nine seasons. Her 14-year head coaching record stands at 232-153.

► **Portland State Head Coach Charity Elliott:** Elliott is in her second year at Portland State and owns a school record of 8-26. The former Charity Shira was an assistant coach under Beth Burns in 1993-94, and has a career head coaching record of 36-60.

► **Portland State Series History:** SDSU leads the series, 3-2, and is 2-0 in games played in San Diego (Last: Portland State def. San Diego State, 59-55, on Jan. 9, 2003 in Portland).

SDSU Women's Basketball Begins Five-Game Homestand Friday Versus Portland State

After playing four of its first five contests on the road, the San Diego State women's basketball team returns to Cox Arena for the start of its longest homestand since 1994, beginning Friday night versus Portland State. The five-game span will round out both the Aztecs' non-conference schedule, as well as the 2005 calendar year.

SDSU has yet to crack the win column in 2005-06, but looks to do so against the Portland State Vikings, who claimed the two schools' most recent meeting back in January of 2003. The Vikings are 5-3 this season and are under the direction of former SDSU assistant Charity Elliott, who worked with Aztec head coach Beth Burns in 1993-94.

Second-Half Run Lifts Pepperdine Past San Diego State, 70-56

Pepperdine used a 15-0 run midway through the second half to break open an otherwise close game, handing San Diego State its fifth loss of the season, 70-56, last Saturday evening at Firestone Fieldhouse. With the loss the Aztecs dropped to 0-5 on the year, while the host Waves improved to 2-6 following the two

schools' first meeting since 1996.

Aztec senior **Veronica Shaw (Phoenix, Ariz.)** scored 10 of her season-high 17 points in the first half, while classmate **Michelle Strawberry (Corona, Calif.)** had eight of her 10 points in the second half. Junior **Desiree Johnson (Kahuku, Hawaii)** scored eight points and tallied a career-high 12 rebounds, the most by an Aztec since the 2003-04 season.

The first nine minutes of the game saw a pair of lead changes and a pair of ties, as the Aztecs erased an early 0-3 deficit with a 4-0 run. The Waves jumped back ahead following five straight points by Jasmane Clarendon and were up by as many as eight points at 23-15, before an 8-0 SDSU run, capped by a pair of steals and buckets by Shaw.

Pepperdine broke the 23-23 tie with the first three-pointer by either squad and went into the locker room up by that many at 28-25, SDSU's smallest halftime deficit of the season.

The Aztecs outscored the Waves 5-2 in the first minutes of the second half for the fourth tie of the game at 30-30, and later took their second lead of the night at the 14:44 mark, when Strawberry rebounded Jana Heinrich's (Fischbach, Germany) miss at the left block to go up by one at 37-36.

The SDSU advantage would be its last as Pepperdine immediately went on a 15-0 run, before freshman **Tamika Lipford (Oceanside, Calif.)** could end the dryspell at 51-39. The Aztecs rallied with under three minutes remaining with a 5-0 streak to cut the deficit to 10 points at 60-50, but the Waves made nine of their 11 free throw attempts with two minutes left to secure the 70-56 victory.

Other Pepperdine Notes

With eight steals, San Diego State's streak of consecutive games with 10 team steals or more came to an end at six... The Aztecs were outrebounded by seven, the first time they have not owned a positive margin in that category since the opener... Freshman **Audrey Green (San Marcos, Calif.)** had a career-high of eight points, beating her previous best by seven... SDSU was held without a three-pointer, going 0-for-4 from the field. The four attempts are the team's fewest since trying three against Northern Arizona on Dec. 30, 2000.

Desiree Gets It Done

Aztec senior Desiree Johnson pulled down a team season-high 12 rebounds against Pepperdine, including seven on the offensive glass. Johnson's 12 boards are the most by an SDSU player in a game since Candace Mattson also had 12 at Utah on March 6, 2004.

So far this year, two Aztecs have reached double-figures in rebounds in a game on three occasions. Senior Michelle Strawberry turned the trick twice with 10 against USD and UC Davis. Last year, only one player, then freshman Ashley Cheesman, recorded 10 or more boards in a game twice.

Straw Strikes Back

With 10 points at Pepperdine, SDSU forward Michelle Strawberry's streak of contests in double-figures restarted after a one-game break. Strawberry was limited to just two points at UC Davis on Dec. 3, ending an eight-game span with 10 or more points, dating back to last season. The senior has scored in double-figures in four of five contests in 2005-06, including a career-high 29 points at Wichita State, followed by a 19-point effort against USD.

Strawberry has scored 10 or more points in 16 of her last 20 outings, after doing so only 11 times in her first 40 career contests.

Seniors Rule

Michelle Strawberry hasn't been the only senior to carry the offensive load for the Aztecs in 2005-06. Classmate Veronica Shaw scored a season-high 17 points versus Pepperdine. The 17 points were just two shy of her career-best of 19 versus

Ten of Shaw's 17 points came in the first half, marking the second time this year that an Aztec has reached double-figures in the first 20 minutes of a game. For the season, an SDSU player has scored 10 or more points in one half of action on six occasions.

Foul Trouble

With Pepperdine's 28 trips to the free-throw line, Aztec opponents have been to the charity stripe an amazing 162 times in just five games. The mark is 65 greater than SDSU's total in the same category (97) and if they continue to stay on their per game pace of 32.4 attempts, then Aztec opponents will go to the line 842 times during the team's 26-game regular season. The SDSU opponent record for free throw attempts in a season is 743 in 1994-95.

The advantage in free throw attempts has led to a 113 to 57 margin in free throws made, as Aztec opponents are converting on 69.8 percent of their opportunities.

Positive Turnovers

San Diego State's aggressive defense, which ranks first in the MWC in steals per game (4.00), has also led to a lot of opponent turnovers. SDSU has forced 118 turnovers in the five games this season and ranks second in turnover margin in the Mountain West Conference (+4.00). Opposing squads have reached the 25-mark in three of five outings with a high of 26 by San Diego and UC Davis.

A year ago, the Aztecs set a MWC season record for turnover margin in both overall (+4.36) and conference contests (+4.07) and for most turnovers caused per league game (21.0 avg.).

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over the Portland State will mean:

- ▶ SDSU has each of its three meetings with Portland State in San Diego.
- ▶ SDSU avoids its first 0-6 start since 1989-90.
- ▶ SDSU head coach Beth Burns improves to 1-0 all-time versus the Vikings.

Portland State Tid-Bits

Portland State is 5-3 overall this season, winning five of its first six outings before dropping its last two on the road at Cal Poly and against in-state rival Oregon State this past Tuesday... PSU has wins over Nevada, Portland, Arkansas, San Jose State and Santa Clara... SDSU and PSU have played one common opponent in UC Davis, which came out victorious in both meetings... UC Davis defeated SDSU 58-36 and edged PSU 67-64 in Portland... The Vikings have been led by freshman Kelsey Kahle, who is averaging 18.3 points and 8.1 boards per game... She has been helped by sophomore Brianna Thompson, who is the team's leading rebounder (8.9/g) and second-leading scorer (13.3)... Portland State has started the same five players in all eight contests.

Another Game, Another Coaching Connection

For the third straight game, San Diego State will see a familiar face on the opposing bench. Portland State head coach Charity Elliott-Shira was an assistant coach under Beth Burns during the 1993-94 campaign, which saw the Aztecs go 26-5 overall and 13-1 in conference play, earning their first WAC title and advancing to the second round of the NAAs.

Before Shira and her staff took over the PSU program in 2004-05, former Aztec great Falisha Wright was an assistant coach for the Vikings, and was on hand to see Jamey Cox break her career three-point record in the two schools' last meeting in 2003.

Other 2005-06 Aztec Notes Thus Far

- SDSU's 79 points at Wichita State are the program's most in a season-opener since scoring 101 versus McNeese State in 1990. The Aztecs have scored 79 points or more just six times in their first previous campaigns with two of those coming a year ago.
- Wichita State attempted an SDSU opponent record 50 free-throws beating the previous mark of 48, held by Louisiana Tech on Jan. 19, 1986 (L, 87-43).
- Michelle Strawberry's 29 points at Wichita State are the most by an SDSU player since Jamey Cox had 30 against Cal State Fullerton in 1999. Her 12 field goals are the most since Jodi Nowlin-Tres had 12 versus Air Force in Feb. 1997, while her 21 attempts are the most since Nowlin-Tres had 25 at Fresno State in Feb. 1996.
-The SDSU-USD game attracted 971 fans to Cox Arena, the largest Aztec home crowd since 1,062 people saw the Aztecs beat Air Force back on Jan. 26, 2002. It is the best attendance for a non-conference home game since Dec. 11, 1998, when there were 972 fans to watch SDSU play UCLA.
-The Aztecs' 93.8 percent free-throw percentage against USD is the team's best when attempting 10 or more in a game since the 1988-89 campaign. The Aztecs made 22 of their 23 attempts (95.7) in a 78-56 win over Tennessee Tech on Dec. 3, 1988, in the second game of the SDSU Classic in Peterson Gym.

Pick Eight

The San Diego State women's basketball team has been predicted to finish eighth in the Mountain West Conference in a preseason poll released Oct. 13, at the league's basketball media day in Salt Lake City, Utah. The voting panel consisted of the league's nine head coaches and select media.

The Aztecs, who finished tied for seventh with Air Force in the 2004-05 regular season, earned 45 votes from the panel, 13 more than the Falcons (32) and 45 behind Wyoming (90) for seventh place.

Utah, which tied for the 2004-05 regular season crown with New Mexico, was tabbed as the clear-cut preseason favorite, marking the third time the Utes have been picked to finish atop the conference. Utah received 23-of-26 first-place votes and 214 total points. New Mexico had two first-place votes and finished second with 180 points, followed by MWC newcomer TCU with one first-place vote and 164 points. UNLV (137 pts.) placed fourth, followed by Colorado State (117 pts.), BYU (107 pts.), Wyoming, SDSU and Air Force.

SDSU alum Bill Earley and Dan Lawton will rotate play-by-play and travel duties, while former Aztec women's basketball standout Tammy Blackburn provides analysis at home games. Blackburn and Earley are in their 12th year of covering SDSU women's basketball, while Lawton is in his 11th season with the Aztecs.

Aztecs Sign Five To National Letters Of Intent

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signings Nov. 9 of four high schools seniors and one junior college sophomore to national letters of intent. Center Kendra Calvin (Perris, Calif.), forward Shannon Clay (Inglewood, Calif.), guard Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.), forward Allison Duffy (Lakeside, Calif.) and forward Lauren Hoisington (Las Vegas, Nev.) will join the Aztecs in the fall of 2006.

"We are pleased to announce our first recruiting class for 2006-07," said Burns, who is in her second stint as head coach at SDSU. "Through the efforts of many, we know that we've signed a terrific foundation of excellent student-athletes, who are excited about the opportunity to be an Aztec."

A pair of starters and five letterwinners return for SDSU in 2005-06. Senior Michelle Strawberry was the only Aztec to start all 28 contests a year ago, averaging 10.3 points per game, including a team-leading 12.9 in league outings. Strawberry is also SDSU's top returning three-point threat, converting 22 of her 33 threes during MWC play.

Besides Strawberry, sophomore Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas) was in the starting five 20 times at the point guard position, averaging six points a game and tallying a team-best 59 assists. Senior Veronica Shaw also started 16 times in 2004-05, and is the team's lone player with three years of collegiate experi-

Other letterwinners returning include sophomore forward **Jordie Smith (Fort Collins, Colo.)** and senior walk-on **Lindsay Goldblatt (West Hills, Calif.)**, while **Courtney Fritz (Newberg, Ore.)** and **Erin Jackson (Sparks, Nev.)** will be in the line-up after redshirting a year ago due to injury.

Noting The Newcomers

Five freshmen and four transfers will wear the scarlet and black for the first time in 2005-06, as newcomers account for more than half of the Aztec roster.

One of the team's most talented players, sophomore forward Shanna Demus, sat out last year after transferring from Cal State Los Angeles. Demus averaged 16.3 points and 6.3 rebounds with the Golden Eagles to earn conference freshman-of-the-year honors and should see a lot of minutes in her first competitive season at SDSU.

Three newcomers signed letters of intent in the fall of 2004, including two San Diego-area natives in point guard Tamika Lipford and center **Audrey Green (San Marcos, Calif.)**. Lipford should see immediate playing time in her first season, while Green will provide depth in the front court.

A third fall signee, combo guard **LaSandra Dixon (Azusa, Calif.)**, was her league's player of the year as both a junior and senior.

Burns looked to fill an immediate need in the front court with the addition of freshman forward **Jana Heinrich (Fischbach, Germany)** and junior center Desiree Johnson during the spring signing period.

Johnson has two years of community college experience under her belt, averaging 13.7 points and 8.1 rebounds as a sophomore to earn first team all-South Coast Conference honors. Her power and strength in the middle should complement Heinrich's inside-outside game.

Also joining the Aztecs are walk-ons freshman **Brittany Santos (Paso Robles, Calif.)** and junior transfers **Ijlal Barnes (San Diego, Calif.)** and **Taryn Milburn (Moorpark, Calif.)**, who will provide key depth off the bench if called upon.

Key Points For The Aztecs In 2005-06

Offense - Half of SDSU's top six scorers from the 2004-05 squad return this season, including senior Michelle Strawberry, who averaged a team-best 12.9 points per league game. Guards Kate Eveland and Veronica Shaw chipped in 6.0 and 5.1 points per game, respectively, but the remaining returnees combined to average just 2.1 points per outing.

Defense - San Diego State experienced extremes on the defensive side of the ball a year ago. The Aztecs led the conference in both steals and turnover margin, but on the flip side, struggled on the boards.

Returnees contributed over half of the Aztecs' 281 steals, including 52 by Eveland and 50 by Shaw. Freshmen Tamika Lipford and LaSandra Dixon, as well as transfer Shanna Demus add instant foot speed and athleticism to the line-up.

The Aztecs will look for immediate help in the rebounding department from front court newcomers Desiree Johnson, Jana Heinrich and Audrey Green, as well as redshirt sophomore Erin Jackson.

The Schedule: The most dramatic change in SDSU's 2005-06 schedule comes with the addition of a ninth team, TCU, to the Mountain West Conference ... league games will be played on Wednesdays or Thursdays and on Saturdays from Jan. 5 through March 4, but will no longer feature the travel partner format ... SDSU opens league play on Jan. 5, the earliest the Aztecs have played a conference contest since 1997-98 ... just two of the 10 non-conference foes appeared on last season's schedule (USD, UC Riverside) ... five schools - Auburn, Boise State, Loyola (Md.), Wichita State, UC Davis - are first-time Aztec opponents ... the Aztecs will face schools from as many as eight different conferences ... SDSU plays host to a tournament for the first time since 2000.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa on April 8, 2005. In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02) and has an overall record of 232-153 (.603). Her current SDSU record stands at 151-88 (.632).
