STORYLINES

The San Diego State Aztecs close the 2004 football season by hosting the UNLV Rebels Saturday at Qualcomm Stadium. Kickoff time is set for 7:05 p.m. PT.

The Aztecs will be trying to win two straight games for the first time this season and improve to 2-5 in conference play. San Diego State will also be trying to defeat UNLV three straight times for the first time in the history of the series between the two schools.

Saturday's game will be the final in the career of UNLV head coach John Robinson, who had two stints as the head coach at Southern California and spent nine seasons as the head coach of the Los Angeles Rams.

The Aztecs will also say goodbye to a senior class of 20 Aztecs and at halftime, the 2004 Aztec Hall of Fame class will be honored.

Thanks to victories each of the last two seasons, San Diego State holds the series lead against UNLV. The two schools played their first football game back in 1977 and became conference foes in 1996 in the old WAC. The two teams met just six times prior to UNLV joining the Western Athletic Conference. SDSU's 7-0 victory last year marks the only shutout in series history.

TEAM NOTES

The Game

The San Diego State Aztecs close the 2004 football season Saturday by hosting the UNLV Rebels at Qualcomm Stadium. The contest will mark the final game for 20 San Diego State seniors. It is also the final game for legendary UNLV head coach John Robinson, formerly the head coach of the USC Trojans and the Los Angeles Rams.

Crowd Noise

San Diego State enters the final home game of the season with an average home attendance of 38,614 fans. The Aztecs have not averaged more than 30,000 fans in a season since 1995, when an average crowd of 30,769 paid to see San Diego State in Mission Valley. In 1994, SDSU averaged 31,879 and in 1993, that number was 38,477. Last season, SDSU's average attendance was 22,626.

Senior Night

The last home game of the season serves as Senior Night with 20 Aztecs playing their last college game at Qualcomm Stadium. Especially hard hit will be The Dark Side defense. The following is a quick look at the Aztec seniors.

The Aztec defense is likely to always be known as The Dark Side. But there is little doubt that the personality of The Dark Side defense has been defined by players in the starting lineup the last two seasons. The senior members of that crew includes safeties Marviel Underwood and Josh Dean, linebackers Kirk Morrison, Stephen Larsen and Heath Farwell, and lineman Blake Lobel. Seniors who are in their first years as Dark Side starters include defensive end Aloalii Lealofi and cornerback Hubert Caliste. Returning to The Dark Side next year will be starters nose tackle Jonathan Bailes, defensive end Kurt Kahui, linebacker Matt McCoy and defensive back Marcus Demps.

Legends Watch

The UNLV football game is part of Hall of Fame Weekend at San Diego State. The official induction ceremony will take place Friday night with the Aztec Hall of Fame Class of 2004 to be recognized Friday night at halftime of the San Diego State-UC Santa Barbara men's basketball game and again at halftime of the football game.

Hall Of Famers

The new class of Aztec legends includes baseball player Travis Lee, the Golden Spikes Award winner and former Olympian, former Aztec and Green Bay Packer Mike Douglass, who set a school record with 21 quarterback sacks in a single season and former Aztec quarterback and SDSU assistant coach Rod Dowhower. Dowhower went on to become the head coach at Vanderbilt and Stanford in the college ranks and the head coach of the Indianapolis Colts in the NFL. The rest of the class includes former head coach Claude Gilbert, second at San Diego State to Don Coryell in wins and winning percentage, Carrie McLaughlin, SDSU's first three-time All-American in women's track and field, and the late Ron Reina, who was the voice of San Diego State from 1969 to 1986.

Aztecs and Rebels

The Aztecs hold a 7-6 series advantage thanks to victories the last two seasons. San Diego State has never won three straight in the series against the Rebels, although the history between the teams dates back only to 1977, and the schools met a total of just six times prior to the 1996 season. The Aztecs hold a 4-3 advantage in San Diego and a 4-2 lead when the two teams have faced each other as conference foes (SDSU leads 3-2 in Mountain West play). Tom Craft is 2-0 against UNLV. The Aztecs' 7-0 win last year marked the only shutout in the series by either team.

Last Year In Las Vegas

San Diego State's defense was the dominant unit on the field as the Aztecs escaped Las Vegas with a 7-0 victory. The Dark Side limited the Rebels to just 175 yards of total offense, including just 80 yards in the first three quarters of the game. Adam Hall's 18-yard touchdown pass to Robert Ortiz in the first quarter was the game's only score. Lynell Hamilton ran for 94 yards but saw his season end prematurely with a broken ankle. Matt Dlugolecki played in relief of an injured Hall and was 3-for-3 through the air for 69 yards. He helped the Aztecs escape the shadow of their own goal on their final possession after the defense held the Rebels off the scoreboard on four tries inside the 10-yard line. Dlugolecki's 37-yard, third-down completion to Kyle Conerly from inside the SDSU 10 was the key play of the fourth quarter.

Last Time In San Diego

In the 2002 game against UNLV, the Aztecs turned in a dominant performance in registering a 31-21 victory at Qualcomm Stadium. Freshman running back Frederick Collins ran for 106 yards, Adam Hall passed for 319 yards and J.R. Tolver had 151 receiving yards with a pair of touchdowns. San Diego State had 475 yards of total offense, including a 98-yard touchdown drive. The Aztecs also held the ball for 38:44.

Conerly's Favorite Team

Over the past two seasons, San Diego State's Kyle Conerly has come up big against the Rebels. In 2002, in his first game as San Diego State's punt returner, Conerly broke open a tight game with an 87-yard punt return for a touchdown in the third period as San Diego State overcame a 14-10 halftime deficit. Last year, with the Aztecs facing a third down inside its own 10 on its final possession, Conerly hauled in a 37-yard pass from Matt Dlugolecki to help San Diego State hold off UNLV for a 7-0 victory.

Rebel Connections

Two of San Diego State's freshman starters in the offensive line call Nevada home. Brandyn Dombrowki is from Henderson and attended Green Valley High School. Mike Kravetz is from Las Vegas and attended Durango High School. On the Aztec staff, Assistant Director of Football Operations Steve Irvin earned a varsity letter at UNLV in 1998 and is a Rebel alum. SDSU tight ends coach Matt Irvin is a former UNLV graduate assistant and holds a master's degree from the university.

Scouting The Rebels

UNLV will arrive in San Diego with a 2-8 overall mark and a 1-5 record in conference play. The Rebels are coming off a 45-10 loss at Colorado State. UNLV has lost four straight games since picking up a 24-20 win at Brigham Young. The Rebel's Dominique Dorsey is the nation's 12th-leading rusher, averaging 121.4 yards per game. Receiver Earvin Johnson averages 5.4 catches and 71.3 receiving yards per game. The Rebels are 32nd nationally in rushing offense and are 112th nationally in turnover margin (-1.40 per game).

Returning Points

San Diego State's freshman class was ultra-busy in the win at Air Force. Freshmen accounted for 31 of San Diego State's 37 points on Saturday, including two rushing touchdowns by freshman Brandon Bornes, two passing touchdowns by freshman Kevin O'Connell, three field goals and four extra points by freshman kicker Garrett Palmer, and a touchdown reception by freshman tight end Eric Miclot.

Six Freshmen, One Unit

Six freshmen were in the starting offensive unit when the Aztecs took the field at Air Force. That group included offensive linemen Brandyn Dombrowski and Mike Kravetz, quarterback Kevin O'Connell, running back Brandon Bornes, and tight ends Eric Miclot and Lance Louis. A seventh rookie could have been in that unit, but lineman Will Robinson was sidelined after suffering a concussion at Brigham Young last week.

Still Better

Despite the huge youth movement on offense, the Aztecs have shown improvement in every major offensive category from a year ago. And that bodes well for the future as the Aztecs will lose only senior starters Mike Kracalik, tight end Jeremy Justice and receiver Devin Pitts from the first-team offense.

Three-Week Roll

The San Diego State offense enters the UNLV game on a bit of a roll. Over the last three weeks, San Diego State has averaged 27 points, 421 yards of total offense and 183 rushing yards per game. San Diego State has rushed for at least 162 yards in all three games, marking the first time SDSU has broken the 150-yard mark three straight times since 2001.

Century City

Thanks to Brandon Bornes' 103 rushing yards at Air Force, San Diego State has had a 100-yard rusher in three consecutive games. Bornes ran for 112 yards vs. Utah and Kevin O'Connell rushed for 101 yards at Brigham Young. The Aztecs have not had a 100-yard rusher in three straight games in the same season since Larry Ned ran for more than 100 yards in three straight games during the 2001 campaign. For consecutive 100-yard rushing games, Michael Franklin broke the barrier in three straight games when combining the final two games of last season and the 2004 opener.

Efficient Attack

San Diego State was a perfect 6-for-6 in the red zone against Air Force. It was the Aztecs' most efficient outing in scoring territory since they went 7-for-7 in the red zone on Dec. 7, 2002, in a 41-40 loss at Hawai'i. San Diego State was also 6-of-15 on third-down conversions against the Falcons, including 4-of-6 on third and five yards or less.

Fielding The Position

Field position continues to be an important factor when determining success. For the season, San Diego State is 3-0 and has scored 34 points per game when its average field position is the 35 yard line or better for its average field position.

Finally The Turn

San Diego State picked up a victory at Air Force despite being outgained (486 yards to 456 yards). That result marked the first time since a Nov. 4, 2000, victory at New Mexico (17-16) that SDSU has won despite being outgained. Since that game in Albuquerque, San Diego State has lost 10 times

By The Numbers

During the good times and bad times of the 2004 season, the Aztecs have spread the wealth. Ten Aztecs have been credited with a rush, four have completed a pass and 16 players have caught a pass. Eight Aztecs have picked off a pass this season.

Single-Season Watch

Linebackers Kirk Morrison and Matt McCoy will likely have their names in place on San Diego State's single-season solo-tackles list by the end of Saturday night. McCoy has 66 unassisted tackles this season and Morrison has 65 entering the UNLV game.

Career Stuff

Kirk Morrison will enter Saturday's game as San Diego State's second all-time career tackler with 386 stops. He trails only Whip Walton's 407 tackles. Matt McCoy will enter the season finale with 270 career tackles. He needs just seven tackles to reach the all-time top 10 in that category. Receiver Jeff Webb has 137 career receptions to rank ninth all-time. He is 10 catches behind Az Hakim for eighth in that category.

Farewell To Farwell

No where to be found on the career lists but a player who is having a stellar senior season is senior linebacker Heath Farwell. He leads the Mountain West in fumbles caused with five and is second with six sacks. He is third at State this season with 62 tackles. At Air Force, he had a career-best 19 tackles, an interception and two fumbles caused.

Farwell And Morrison

Linebackers Heath Farwell and Kirk Morrison both had 19 tackles in the win at Air Force. The combined total of 38 ties as the best ever by two Aztec teammates in the same game. Ty Youngs (21) and Bill Ferguson (17) also had 38 tackles in a game on Nov. 27, 1971, against Iowa State. Individually, the 19 total tackles by both players ties for the fifth best single-game total in school history.

Farwell And Morrison, Part II

At Air Force, San Diego State's combination of Heath Farwell and Kirk Morrison produced historic results. Both players had seven solo tackles and 12 assisted stops for a total of 19 tackles each. Morrison had a game-clinching interception and recovered a fumble, while Farwell had an interception and forced two fumbles.

Farwell And Morrison, Part III

Heath Farwell and Kirk Morrison shared the Mountain West Conference defensive player of the week award for their 19-tackle efforts vs. Air Force. It was historic in the sense that teammates had never shared a league player of the week honor. Freshman kicker Garrett Palmer was the Mountain West special teams player of the week.

Air Force Rewind

In closing the book on the victory at Air Force, it's worth noting that San Diego State has won three straight against the Falcons for the first time ever. SDSU now has four wins at Falcon Stadium all time, including two in its last two visits. SDSU is the first team to win at Falcon Stadium in consecutive visits since Notre Dame (1995 and 2002). The last team to win at Air Force twice in three years was

Comebacks and Rejections

In Colorado Springs, San Diego State snapped a 10-game losing streak when trailing at halftime, dating back to the 38-34 win at Air Force in 2002. The win was the eighth straight for San Diego State when leading after three quarters.

A First In Provo

At Brigham Young on Nov. 6, San Diego State freshman quarterback Kevin O'Connell became the first player in Aztec history to run for 100 yards and pass for at least 100 yards in the same game. Against the Cougars, O'Connell ran for 101 yards on 15 carries, despite being sacked three times. He passed for 229 yards and a touchdown.

A Second In Provo

When Kevin O'Connell ran for 101 yards at Brigham Young, he became just the second Aztec quarterback to reach triple digits in rushing since Matt Kofler ran for 102 yards in a 1980 victory over New Mexico (24-22). Kofler passed for just 18 yards in the game.

Webb Watch

Jeff Webb enters the UNLV contest as the Mountain West leader (17th nationally) with 6.60 catches per game (66 receptions for the season). He is fifth in the league and 26th in America with his 83.1 receiving yards per game.

Signing Day To Game Day

For the past two seasons, San Diego State's recruiting classes have been ranked as the best in the Mountain West Conference. It's a good thing because, due to injury, many of the younger players on the squad now play key roles. The Aztecs are playing no fewer than nine freshmen on offense (offensive linemen Brandyn Dombrowski, Mike Kravetz and Will Robinson, receivers Brett Swain and Chazeray Schilens, running back Brandon Bornes, quarterback Kevin O'Connell and tight ends Lance Louis and Eric Miclot). O'Connell has started the last four games, Bornes has led the team in rushing in three of the last four weeks with two, 100-yard rushing games and Louis had his first career reception against Utah and caught three passes at Air Force. Miclot had his first career reception at Air Force, which was good for a touchdown. All three offensive linemen have started at least one game this season. On defense, redshirt freshmen linemen Antwan Applewhite and Nicholas Osborn have been the biggest contributors.

Special Teams, Too

However young the offense may be, its players still have seniority over the special teams crew. San Diego State's long snapper is true freshman Tyler Schmitt, its ranking punters are redshirt freshmen Garrett Palmer and Michael Hughes and true freshman Sean Henschel. Palmer handles the kickoff and placekicking duties and redshirt freshman Brandon Bornes is on the kickoff return team.

Young Dark Siders

The youth movement on offense has been obvious for the Aztecs. Some younger players however are also making a mark on The Dark Side. Redshirt freshman Antwan Applewhite is eighth in the conference with 4.5 sacks per game. Sophomore defensive back Donny Baker is third in the conference with 12 pass break-ups.

Season Advantage

Unlike most other 2-7 teams, San Diego State continues to hold a season advantage in first downs, rushing yards, passing yards and total offense over its opponents. The Aztecs outgained the opposition (through 10 games) by an average of 383 to 373 yards per game.

Musical Linemen

The San Diego State offensive line story will likely see yet another verse this week. Seven different combinations have started the 10 games this season, including a combined 18 starts among the three redshirt freshmen linemen. Frosh Will Robinson has made starts at right tackle and left tackle and has been utilized up front at every position but center. The status of Chris Pino, who has missed the last

Butkus Please

San Diego State senior linebacker Kirk Morrison was named as one of 12 Butkus Award semifinalists on Oct. 14 when the watch list was trimmed from 68 names. The Butkus Award is presented annually to the nation's top linebacker. Earlier this season, Morrison reached double figures in tackles in six straight games (that streak ended in Provo). Morrison was named Mountain West Conference defensive player of the week after his 14-tackle effort against Colorado State and again for his 19-tackle effort at Air Force.

They Know Nagurski

Kirk Morrison and Matt McCoy, perhaps the most productive linebacking duo in the America, were also named to the Bronko Nagurski Watch List, presented to the nation's top defensive player. McCoy was the Nagurski national defensive player of the week after his 18 tackles in the 24-21 loss at No. 17 Michigan.

Semi-Good

Kirk Morrison's selection as a Butkus semifinalist marked the third time since 2001, that the Aztecs have had a semifinalist for a national honor. In 2001, Larry Ned's 1,549 rushing yards landed him on the Doak Walker Award semifinalist list. In 2002, J.R. Tolver was a semifinalist for the Biletnikoff Award, presented to the nation's top receiver. Tolver's year included 128 catches and 1,785 yards.

Quiet Kyle Moves Up

Steady return man Kyle Conerly has moved up to third all-time at San Diego State in punt return yards with 599 in his career. He entered the season seventh all-time at State with 404 yards. San Diego State receivers coach Ray Peterson is the all-time leader in that category with 1,201 yards. Second all-time is Monty Galbreath with 835 yards.

Good Morning, Aztecs

San Diego State is likely the only program in the country that will practice in the mornings throughout the football season. Due to class conflicts in the afternoon, SDSU will have morning practices, beginning at 7 a.m., throughout the season. Players will return to the football offices for late afternoon film and meetings. Only the Friday walkthrough is scheduled for a traditional mid-afternoon time.

San Diego State is coming off its best offensive performance since the season opener... At Air Force, the Aztecs scored 37 points, had 456 yards of total offense, 224 yards rushing and 232 yards passing... The result was big jumps in the national rankings, with the Aztecs moving up 10 spots in scoring, eight notches in rushing offense and seven positions in total offense... SDSU's 37 points were the most since the opener and the most against a Division I-A opponent since Nov. 23, 2002... The total offense and rushing offense figures were the highest for SDSU since the season-opening game against Idaho State (Sept. 6)... The Aztecs have now scored 50 points in their last five quarters of action... San Diego State has produced a 100-yard rusher in three consecutive games... In the last three games, SDSU has 81 points, 1,262 yards, 549 rushing yards, 713 passing yards and an average gain of 5.39 yards per offensive play... The Aztecs have produced three consecutive games with more than 150 yards of rushing for the first time since the 2001 season (Sept. 22 through Oct. 6) ... SDSU was 6-for-6 in red zone opportunities against Air Force (three touchdowns and three field goals)... The six conversions and 100 percent conversion with at least six red zone attempts were the most since the Aztecs were 7-for-7 at Hawai'i on Dec. 7, 2002... The Aztecs were 6-for-15 (40 percent) on third down against the Academy (including 4-for-6 on 3rd down and five yards or less)... Want to know how many points SDSU will score, take a look at average field position... In games when the Aztecs have an average field position of the 35-yard-line or better, SDSU averages 34.0 points... With an average field position of 25-34-yard-line, SDSU averages 18.2 points and with an average field position of the 24-yard-line or less, the Aztecs average 10.0 points... San Diego State has 14 touchdown drives of 60 or more yards this season, 12 scoring drives of 71 or more yards and four touchdown drives of 80 or more yards... DEFENSIVE NOTES

The San Diego State defense has given up some large numbers in recent weeks, but helped San Diego State snap a six-game losing streak in the win at Air Force... The defense forced six turnovers, the most since Sept. 13, 2003, including an interception by senior linebacker Kirk Morrison on the goal line in the final minute of the game... Morrison and Heath Farwell were each credited with 19 tackles in the game, which matched the school record for most tackles by teammates in a contest (ties a record set on Nov. 27, 1971)... Individually, the 19 stops rank as the fifth-highest total in school history... The Dark Side Defense allowed just 10 points after intermission, as the Aztecs outscored the Falcons 20-10... The Aztecs have forced 22 turnovers this season, good for 24th nationally... With 12 interceptions this season, the Dark Side ranks 31st in that category, while the 10 fumble recoveries are good for 30th in the nation... The opponents scoring total is a bit misleading as SDSU foes have scored three touchdowns on returns and have two other touchdowns and four field goals on drives of nine yards or less... The defense has been sensational when put under pressure... Aztec opponents have started 20 drives on SDSU's side of the field and have scored a total of 44 points off the strong field position ... Through 10 games, The Dark Side has 73 tackles for loss, 25 sacks, 12 interceptions and has forced 22 turnovers... The Aztecs allowed just 172 points in their last 10 games (17.2 ppg) before allowing 51 against Utah, 49 at Brigham Young and 31 at Air Force... In addition, opponents have been able to cross the goal line in just 31 of their last 75 opportunities when at or inside the Aztec 20 (TD conversion percentage of just 41.3 percent) ... Last year San Diego State allowed 17 offensive touchdowns, tied with co-national champion Louisiana State for the best figure in the country... In 2003, SDSU held four opponents to nine points or less marking the first time an Aztec squad had done that since 1977... Last season the Aztecs allowed 207 points, the fewest SDSU has allowed since 1977... In the 25 seasons between 1977 and 2003, the Aztecs allowed more than 300 points 14 times and more than 400 points twice... The Dark Side defense scored four touchdowns last season off turnover returns and helped the Aztec offense to five scores on drives of four yards or less setup by turnovers deep in opposition territory.

Game Notes

With the Aztec win: SDSU has claimed victories in two straight season-openers for the first time since claiming five straight from 1993-97 ... Aztecs have won 15 straight non-conference home games against teams from outside the BCS Conferences ... SDSU is 1-0 all-time against Idaho State and improves to a perfect 9-0 versus schools in the Big Sky Conference ... The Aztecs moved to 44-33-5 all-time (9-4-1 in last 14 years) in season openers and 2-1 under Tom Craft ... In home openers, SDSU is 27-7-1 in its last 35 home openers ... SDSU has won four of its last five games dating back to 2003 ... The Aztecs have won three straight home games for the first time since the 1998 squad won its final four contests at Qualcomm... **The announced attendance** of 57,216, is an SDSU record for a home game... **On the opening play** of the game, Aztec Michael Franklin ran 67 yards for a touchdown ...the 67-yard run was the longest by an SDSU player since Larry Ned ran for 77 yards at Utah on Oct. 23, 1999 ... the 67-yard run is the longest of Franklin's career, topping his previous high of 55 yards in 2002, at Hawaii'... **The Aztec defense** kept Idaho State off the scoreboard in the first quarter, marking the fifth straight game in which an SDSU opponent has failed to score in the first quarter. Aztec opponents have also gone scoreless in the first 15-minute period in six of the last seven and nine of the last 11 outings dating back to the 2003 campaign... **SDSU's Robert Miller** blocked Idaho State kicker Jaret Johnson's field-goal attempt to close out the first half. The block was the Aztecs' first since Jeff Shoate blocked kicker Scott Parker's 32-yard attempt at Wyoming on Oct.19, 2002. The block is Miller's first of his career.

SAN DIEGO - In front of a record crowd of 57,216, the 2004 Aztecs made a stirring debut as they systematically disposed of Idaho State, 38-21, at Qualcomm Stadium.

Aztec running back Michael Franklin scampered 67 yards for a touchdown on the first play of the season and San Diego State was on its way to a near-perfect first half. The Aztecs jumped to a 24-0 first quarter lead and extended the advantage to 31-0 at the break and eventually 38-0 before ISU dented the scoreboard. SDSU completed the first half without a turnover and without a penalty.

The first quarter was the prolific for SDSU since it scored 24 points in the second quarter of a 1995 romp over UTEP.

The game would last just over four hours, thanks in part to an Idaho State offense that attempted 69 passes while rushing for just 46 yards.

Junior Matt Dlugolecki won the fall camp quarterback derby and he was strong in his debut, completing 16 of his 27 attempts for 233 yards and two touchdowns, one each to Robert Ortiz and Wesley Williams.

The star of the game, however, was Franklin. He rushed for 101 yards, marking his third straight game over the 100-yard mark. He also led the Aztecs with 84 receiving yards. Franklin ended the game with 233 all-purpose yards despite seeing limited action in the second half.

The Dark Side was its dominating self in the first half when the game was being decided. The first 14 Idaho State possessions resulted in just one drive that lasted more than six plays. The Aztec defense forced four turnovers, including interceptions by Heath Farwell, Josh Dean and Donny Baker. Farwell was also credited with a quarterback sack and caused a fumble.

Redshirt freshman quarterback Kevin O'Connell saw his first collegiate action and found Robert Ortiz for a 32-yard touchown pass. Ortiz, who entered the game with two career TD grabs, had two more against the Bengals.

The home crowd was the largest in San Diego State history and the 20th largest crowd in college football on the first full Saturday of the weekend.

game 2 - No. 17 Michigan 24, San Diego State 21



Game Notes

For the second consecutive season San Diego State played a nationally-ranked Big Ten team to the final moments before losing... Last season, the Aztecs lost at second-ranked Ohio State, 16-13, on Sept. 9... This season, the Aztecs fall to 17th-ranked Michigan, 24-21... Two weeks after setting a school-record for home attendance with 57,216 vs. Idaho State at Qualcomm Stadium, San Diego State played in front of the largest crowd in school history. **Today's attendance** at Michigan Stadium of 109,432, eclipses the crowd of 104,433 that witnessed the Ohio State-SDSU game last season in Columbus... The Aztecs' last **two losses to nationally-ranked teams** (last season Ohio State and Michigan today) have been by a total of six points... San Diego State's **1-1 record** matches its best mark after two games in the last 10 seasons. The Aztecs have not opened 2-0 since victories over Navy and California to open the 1994 campaign... Despite the loss, SDSU has still **won four of its last six games** dating back to last season... Although not outgained by much 327-311, the Aztecs total yardage disadvantage of 16 yards, snaps a streak of six consecutive games in which SDSU has outgained its opponent... Prior to today, the last time an Aztec opponent had more total yardage was at Utah on Oct. 11, 2003... San Diego State's **Dark Side Defense** put on another impressive showing... Despite allowing 24 points, the defense yielded just one scoring drive of more than 51 yards on the afternoon... The defense also forced four turnovers, two of which set up short scoring drives for the Aztec offense (17 and 39 yard touchdown drives). The Aztecs had seven tackles for loss.

ANN ARBOR, Mich. - Another reigning Big Ten champion as an opponent resulted in another near miss for the San Diego State Aztecs Saturday afternoon.

With a national television audience watching (ESPN), SDSU and No. 17 Michigan went toe-to-toe for more than three hours before the Wolverines escaped The Big House with a 24-21 win over up and coming San Diego State.

In the process, SDSU appeared to show dramatic gains on offense and special teams and The Dark Side defense showed a new taste for creating turnovers.

Michigan shocked the Aztecs early, scoring on a 54-yard touchdown pass on its first play from scrimmage. Following an interception, the Wolverines looked to be in total control with possession deep in SDSU territory. However, safety Josh Dean flattened UM quarterback Chad Henne on a pass attempt and Antwan Applewhite picked the ball out of the air and returned it 75 yards, setting up a Michael Franklin TD.

Following a Michigan field goal, the Aztecs turned the ball over again when Lawrence Reid picked up a fumble and returned it five yards for a touchdown.

With SDSU trailing 17-7 and on the ropes, Robert Ortiz turned the game. His 61-yard reception set up a Jeff Webb touchdown and the 109,000 plus in Ann Arbor settled in for nailbiter.

By halftime, SDSU had taken the lead when Matt Dlugolecki found Ortiz for a 14-yard score. That drive was set up by a Kurt Kahui fumble recovery. In all, SDSU forced four turnovers after Michigan entered the game second nationally in turnover margin.

The final lead change of the day took place on the first drive of the second half as the Wolverines drove the field and registered the last lead change of the day.

It was SDSU's second three-point loss in two years to the reigning Big Ten champion. In 2003, SDSU was a 16-13 loser to No. 2 Ohio State.

Game Notes

With the SDSU victory: San Diego State has won five of its last seven games dating back to last season. That is the best seven-game mark for SDSU since posting a similar seven-game mark from Oct. 24, 1998 through Sept. 4, 1999 ...San Diego State is 2-0 at home this season and has won four straight games at Qualcomm Stadium. The four-game home field winning streak is the longest since claiming five straight in 1998-99 (last four home games of '98 and first game of '99). From the end of the five-game winning streak in 1999, until the current four-game winning streak, the Aztecs were 7-17 at Qualcomm ... San Diego State is 2-1 after the first three games of the season for the second consecutive season. The last time SDSU had a winning record after the first three games of consecutive seasons was 1993 and 1994... **With tonight's attendance** of 33,429, SDSU has surpassed the 30,000 mark in back-to-back home contests for the first time since the 1999 season. SDSU drew 30,508 versus New Mexico (Oct. 9, 1999) and 40,836 fans against Brigham Young (Nov. 6, 1999).... SDSU **linebacker Kirk Morrison** became just the fourth player in SDSU history to record more than 300 career tackles. Morrison, who tallied his 13th career game in double-figure tackles, now has 308 tackles in his career to rank fourth in the Aztec record books. Morrison's 15 tackles tonight matches his career high (15 vs. BYU in 2003, vs. Utah in 2001), while he had a career best for most solo tackles in a game with 10 (prev. nine at Hawai'i)... With nine catches for 101 yards tonight, SDSU's **Jeff Webb** has at least one reception in each of his last 13 outings and at least two catches in his last nine games. Webb also recorded his fourth career game with 100 or more yards .

SAN DIEGO - On a dangerous night against a dangerous opponent, San Diego State went to work in business-like fashion to dismiss Nevada, 27-10, Saturday night at Qualcomm Stadium in front of 33,429 fans.

A week before the UCLA game and a week after a near-miss at Michigan, the more than capable Wolf Pack were in a position to derail SDSU's early-season momentum. However, Michael Franklin rushed for 100 yards for the second time this season and The Dark Side kept the visitors out of the end zone until their final possession of the night to cruise to the win.

As they have all season, the Aztecs were effective in the first half. The Aztecs led 17-3 at intermission thanks to a 23-yard TD reception by Jeff Webb and a 35-yard touchdown run by Brandon Bornes.

Both of those scoring drives were of the cross-country variety, covering 79 and 81 yards with both taking 12 places to execute.

The youth movement continued for SDSU with sophomore Ramal Porter scoring his first career touchdown and redshirt freshman Brandon Bornes scoring on a career-best 35-yard touchdown run.

The Aztec special teams had a good night as well with Garrett Palmer connecting on field goals of 50 and 43 yards, and punt returns by Franklin and Kyle Conerly that covered 29 and 23 yards, respectively.

Senior linebacker Kirk Morrison reached a new milestone with his 15 tackles, pushing him over 300 for his career. In all, it was a strong night for The Dark Side with three quarterback sacks, two interceptions, 12 pass break-ups, and two forced fumbles. Senior playmaker Heath Farwell continued to show up in the stat column. He had all three Aztec sacks and forced both fumbles.

Game Notes

With his 45 yards on 11 carries, Aztec junior **Michael Franklin** reached the 1,000-yard plateau in career rushing with 1,002 yards. Franklin had 346 yards as a red-shirt freshman in 2002, 371 yards as a sophomore in 2003, and has 285 yards as a junior in 2004. Franklin also tallied a career game high in receptions with 10 (45 yards), besting his previous high of eight at Wyoming in 2002... Linebackers **Kirk Morrison** and **Matt McCoy** both reached double-figures in tackles tonight. Morrison had 11 tackles and reached double-figures for the second straight game and the 13th time in his career. Morrison's 11 tackles included eight solos and two tackles for loss. McCoy, meanwhile, had 10 tackles (6 solo) and reached double-figures for the second time this season, the fourth time in the last six games and the eighth time in his career.... With the 402 yards tonight, SDSU has reached the **400-yard mark** in total offense three times in four games in 2004... The **Aztecs were outgained** in total offense (410-402) for the second time this season and the second time on the road. But in those two games, SDSU has been outgained by just a total of 24 yards (vs. Michigan - outgained by 16 (327-311)) ... In the four games this season, SDSU has combined to outgain its opponents by 212 yards... **SDSU rushed** for 139 yards tonight, despite being tagged for -23 yards on the muffed punt in the first half... Seven players combined for the 139 yards and four accumulated at least 12 yards... The Aztecs ran for 137 of those yards in the second half after recording 2 net yards in the first half... With his 23 completions on 42 attempts for 215 yards, SDSU quarterback **Matt Dlugolecki** logged his third straight game with at least 23 completions and at least 40 attempts.

PASADENA, Calif. - In 2002, UCLA generated 23 points off of Aztec miscues to blow out SDSU, 43-7. Last year it was a 3-3 game at the half when two interceptions helped the Bruins to a 20-10 victory.

Saturday night, Spencer Havner's 52-yard interception return for a touchdown gave the homestanding Bruins a 14-3 lead. And for good measure, SDSU dropped a snap on a punt inside its own 15 to provide the Bruins with three more points and an insurmountable 20-3 halftime lead. The Bruins would eventually win by a 33-10 count.

After UCLA scored on its first possession (64-yard drive), the Aztecs limited the Bruins to 62 yards of total offense on five possessions, before the two critical second-quarter mistakes.

Any hopes of an Aztec comeback ended on the first series of the third quarter when UCLA marched 65 yards for a touchdown that staked UCLA to a 27-3 lead.

Two more field goals would close the scoring for UCLA. SDSU grabbed some momentum with its own touchdown drive, covering 80 yards on seven plays and capped by Brandon Bornes' third rushing TD of the season. However, after holding UCLA on its next possession, SDSU gave up the ball on an interception and UCLA cruised through the final quarter to defeat SDSU for the 19th time in 20 all-time meetings.

Michael Franklin ran for 45 yards in the game and crossed the 1,000-yard rushing mark for his career.

Game Notes

With his seven receptions today, junior wide receiver **Jeff Webb** has now caught at least one pass in 15 straight games... The **Matt Dlugolecki** to Jeff Webb 47-yard TD play was the longest scoring pass of the season. The longest play through the air was the 61-yarder from Dlugolecki to **Robert Ortiz** at Michigan... The game featured the fifth different offensive line combination to start a game this season... Wide receiver **Devin Pitts'** six receptions for 60 yards were both season highs... With the loss, San Diego State had its five game winning streak snapped, including two consecutive in Laramie. SDSU has never won three in a row at War Memorial Stadium... The Aztecs are now 4-9 all-time in Laramie... San Diego State falls to 3-3 in Mountain West openers and 1-2 in conference openers under head coach Tom Craft.

LARAMIE, Wyo. - San Diego State's five-year domination of Wyoming came to a screeching halt Saturday afternoon in Laramie.

The Aztecs found a way to lose a game in which their quarterback set a career high in completions and passing yards, the opposition was limited to just 264 yards of total offense, a full 99 shy of SDSU's total, and the opposition was just 3-of-16 on third-down conversions.

Here is how it happened. The Aztecs suffered four meltdowns in the kicking game, some red-zone misfires and eventually wilted in the fourth quarter to fall to the Cowboys by a 20-10 count in the Mountain West opener for both schools.

SDSU held a 10-3 lead at halftime, thanks to a 47-yard touchdown pass from Matt Dlugolecki to Jeff Webb. The TD pass was the only exclamation point in a game that saw SDSU hold a tiny advantage in total offense, 161-126 at the break. At intermission, the two teams had combined for 45 rushing yards.

In the third quarter, the Aztec wheels came off in a most unconventional fashion. On the first possession of the third period, SDSU's three-and-out offensive possession was followed by a 10-yard Sean Henschel punt. One play later, Wyoming had a 29-yard touchdown pass to draw even in the game and wipe out SDSU's halftime advantage.

SDSU's second possession lasted just one play as SDSU suffered its first turnover on a fumble. This time, The Dark Side limited the Cowboys to a missed field goal.

But the quarter wasn't over. Another three-and-out by SDSU was followed by a seven-yard punt to set up the Cowboys at the SDSU 33.

Wyoming managed just eight yards but was close enough to result in a field goal and suddenly SDSU was down 13-10 despite virtually no offense by the opposition.

SDSU turned the ball over again on an interception on its next possession but the Cowboys again found the going tough and was forced to punt.

SDSU's next possession resulted in just an eight-yard punt by stand-in Adam Gray-Hayward, who punted for the first time.

SDSU was trailing 20-10 midway through the fourth quarter when the offense found its rhythm for the first time. A 37-yard field goal attempt by Garrett Palmer, however, missed to the right. It ended SDSU's 74-yard drive and effectively killed the Aztecs' chances to win the game.

SDSU would penetrate the red zone again late in the game but was held on downs.

game 6 - Colorado State 21, San Diego State 17



Game Notes

Colorado State defeated SDSU for the fifth straight time in San Diego ... the Aztecs suffered their first loss at home this season and their first in their last five opportunities in San Diego ... SDSU's three home games in 2004 have each exceeded the 30,000-mark in attendance ... The last time the Aztecs had three straight home games with 30,000 or more fans was in 1999 ... SDSU limited Colorado State to a season-low 196 yards of total offense, the second straight game in which the Aztecs have kept their opponent to under 300 yards ... The 196 yards by CSU is the fewest allowed by SDSU since the 2003 UNLV game, when the Rebels had just 175 yards ... With a 366-196 advantage in total offense, SDSU has outgained its opponent by more than 90 yards three times this year ... This was the seventh straight MWC game in which the Aztecs have owned an advantage in total offense ... The Aztecs converted their first two-point conversion opportunity of the year (first conversion since 2002) ... SDSU linebacker Kirk Morrison recorded double-figure tackles (14) for the fourth straight game and the 15th time in his career ... Aztec Jeff Webb has caught at least one pass in each of his last 16 games and has at least three catches in each of his last 11 outings. Webb went over 100 yards receiving (7 catches, 129 yards) for the third time this season and the fifth time in his career ... the 58-yard TD is the Aztecs' longest scoring pass of the season ... SDSU's Garrett Palmer connected on a pair of 48-yard field goals in the first half, marking the second straight season in which an Aztec kicker has converted on two, 45+-yard field goals in one game ... Brandon Bornes' 40-yard kick-off return is the Aztecs' longest since 2001 ... SDSU had a season high 15 tackles for loss and six sacks.

SAN DIEGO - For two teams in dire need of a victory, Saturday's San Diego State-Colorado State match-up seemed like a good place to start for the Aztecs.

After all, SDSU had claimed both of its wins in 2004 by easy margins in the safe confines of Qualcomm Stadium and had come out victorious in each of its last four home conference match-ups. Plus, traditional MWC power Colorado State also found itself in a similar place in its season, dropping four of its first five games.

Saturday, however, would not be the start of a new chapter for SDSU in 2004, as the Aztecs rallied from an eight-point, fourth-quarter deficit to surge ahead, 17-14, only to have the win fall out of their grasp in the final minutes.

Following Garrett Palmer's third field goal of the night which gave SDSU the lead, the Aztec defense held firm, forcing a Colorado State punt from its own 44-yard line with only 2:13 left in the game. The SDSU offense then took over with the mission of keeping the ball safe, gaining a first down and running out the clock. On its second play of the drive, however, CSU recovered a fumble at the Aztec 10-yard line.

Two plays later, the Rams took advantage of the fumble as Jimmy Green scored from one-yard out and just 1:10 remaining in the game. A stunned SDSU offense was forced to try to go 79 yards to get the win back, but was only able to get as far as the Colorado State 45-yard line as quarterback Kevin O'Connell's final desperation heave into the end zone fell to the ground.

SDSU opened the game with a 3-0 lead on one of two 48-yard Palmer field goals on the day. The lead would last only a tad over four minutes, as CSU's Luke Adkins intercepted SDSU quarterback Matt Dlugolecki's pass and ran it back for a touchdown. The interception return marked the second straight season in which the Rams had returned one for a score against the Aztecs.

Palmer had his second field-goal chance of the day blocked, but made up for it with another 48-yarder on the team's next drive to draw the Aztecs to within one point, 7-6, at the 7:52 mark of the second quarter.

Colorado State back-up quarterback Caleb Hanie, playing for injured starter Justin Holland, then engineered a 12-play, 80-yard drive capped by a four-yard pass to Joel Dreessen to increase the Ram lead to 14-6 entering the half.

After a scoreless third, O'Connell hit Jeff Webb on a 58-yard touchdown pass on the first play of the fourth quarter and then tacked on the two-point conversion on another O'Connell pass, this time to Robert Ortiz, to knot the score at 14-14.

An interception by Reggie Grigsby set up the go-ahead Palmer field goal from 27 yards out and 5:36 left on the clock.

Game Notes

Both teams recorded a safety in the game, marking a first for the Aztecs and their opponent in two years, since SDSU last visited New Mexico...Kirk Morrison had 10 tackles, marking his fifth straight game in double figures in tackles...Kevin O'Connell became the first freshman to start at quarterback at San Diego State since Spencer Britton started the final five games of the 1997 season...New Mexico became the fourth consecutive Mountain West opponent to be held to less than 300 yards of total offense...Lobos running back DonTrell Moore was limited to 70 yards rushing after entering the game with an average of 101 yards per game...Robert Ortiz caught seven passes to give him 35 for the season, one year after he caught 33 passes in 12 games...Eight freshmen saw action on the offensive side of the ball, including three linemen...SDSU has now scored just two touchdowns in the last 15 quarters of play against New Mexico.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. - In a battle of swarming defenses, the New Mexico Lobos held off San Diego State, 19-9, before 37,287 fans at University Stadium.

The Lobos struck first with an impressive 65-yard opening drive, capped off by a 21-yard touchdown pass from Kole McKamey to DonTrell Moore.

Kevin O'Connell got his first start as the Aztec quarterback and his first effort was impressive but did not result in any points. The Aztecs drove 58 yards on nine plays with their first possession. However, a missed field-goal attempt by Garrett Palmer ended SDSU's best chance at first-half points.

The Lobos added 10 points in the second quarter to take control of the game. Those points were set up in part by field position. San Diego State twice started drives inside its own five. New Mexico, after gaining possession in Aztec territory, picked up a field goal on a drive that covered just 15 yards. However, the Lobos also covered 80 yards for a score, capped by a McKamey run.

The 17-point lead seemed safe as SDSU struggled with the aggressive Lobos defense. But momentum changed just a bit when Matt McCoy nailed DonTrell Moore for a 14-yard loss and an Aztec safety to get SDSU on the board.

In the fourth quarter, O'Connell got the Aztecs serious about a comeback. The freshman supervised a 10-play drive that covered 51 yards in the fourth period. It ended with the quarterback finding receiver Robert Ortiz for a 14-yard touchdown pass on a fourth-down play.

That score, with 8:02 remaining in the game, drew the Aztecs to within 10 at 19-9. The ensuing defensive possession kept Aztec hopes alive when New Mexico was forced to punt from deep in its own territory.

The Aztecs took over on the New Mexico 28 following a Kyle Conerly punt return and after a first-down scramble by O'Connell for nine yards, the Aztecs came up empty on three straight snaps.

The final play saw O'Connell throw a pass to Devin Pitts in the end zone that went off the senior's fingertips and squelched SDSU's comeback hopes.

The Lobos, although limited to a total of just 220 yards, managed to milk the final 5:53 off the clock to clinch the victory.

The Aztecs managed just 146 yards of total offense and were held to minus-19 rushing yards.

game 8 - No. 9/10 Utah 51, San Diego State 28



Game Notes

With the Utah win, SDSU fell to 11-12-1 all-time versus the Utes ... SDSU still has a 6-5-1 advantage in games played in San Diego .. With the attendance of 32,683, each of SDSU's four home games this season have exceeded the 30,000-mark. The last time the Aztecs had four straight home games with 30,000 or more fans was in 1994 ... With his 10 tackles, SDSU linebacker **Kirk Morrison** recorded double-figure tackles for the sixth straight game and the 17th time in his career. He now has 363 career tackles to move from third to second in the Aztec record books, passing Rico Curtis, who had 355 tackles. Morrison still trails Whip Walton (407), the school record-holder ... Jeff Webb went over 100 yards receiving (9 catches, 138 yards) for the fourth time this season and the sixth time in his career ... Webb moved into the Aztec career top 10 for catches with 129. Webb jumped past Darius Durham (127) for 10th place and tied Craig Scoggins (129) for ninth place ... Brandon Bornes recorded career highs for both carries (17) and rushing yards (112). He also had a career long 41-yard run in the first quarter. The run was SDSU's second-longest of the year behind Michael Franklin's 67-yarder in the season-opener with Idaho State .. Bornes' 112 rushing yards is an Aztec season high. He becomes the second Aztec to rush for 100 or more yards in a game this season .. Blake Lobel's fumble return for a touchdown was the Aztecs' first defensive TD this season .. The 21 first-half SDSU points are the most allowed by Utah since also giving up 21 in the first half of a 28-26 loss at Texas A&M Sept. 6, 2003 (a span of 17 games) ... Quarterback Kevin O'Connell threw for 252 yards, completing 21 of his 43 passes - all career bests. O'Connell logged his first career rushing TD in the second quarter.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State entered its game with Utah knowing a mistake-free effort would be required to upset the nation's ninth-ranked team. And it probably would have.

San Diego State slugged it out with the Utes for all of the first half and appeared headed to the locker room down by a 27-21. But the Utes blocked a punt and turned it into a three-yard touchdown drive in the final seconds before intermission. It turned out to be the deciding series as Utah cruised to a 51-28 victory at Qualcomm Stadium.

San Diego State displayed new strength on the offensive side of the ball behind 112 rushing yards by freshman Brandon Bornes and 414 yards of total offense. The Aztecs scored 21 points in the second period to stay within striking distance of Utah and trailed just 41-28 in the fourth period with only a 14-yard difference in total offense.

However, Utah's run-pass mixture and big-play ability kept San Diego State at bay and allowed the Utes to scoot away at the end as they improved to 8-0 on the season.

The Aztecs got another flashy effort from receiver Jeff Webb, who had nine catches for 138 yards and a stunning one-handed touchdown grab for SDSU's last score of the game.

Kevin O'Connell continued to make the transition into the starting quarterback role as he passed for 252 yards and a pair of touchdowns and ran for another score.

The firepower of Utah was too much, however, as the visitors scored in every quarter and accumulated 548 yards of total offense.

Game Notes

San Diego State quarterback Kevin O'Connell became the first player in Aztec history to pass and rush for more than 100 yards in the same game... Freshman kicker Garrett Palmer's 47-yard field goal in the second quarter was his fourth conversion of the year of at least 45 yards... This marks San Diego State's first six-game losing streak since 1988.

PROVO, Utah - San Diego State held the ball for more than 10 minutes of the first quarter and still trailed 7-3 at the end of the period.

It was not a good sign.

Brigham Young fought off the Aztecs to hold a 13-3 half-time lead and then used a 23-point third quarter to cruise to a 49-16 victory and send SDSU to its sixth straight loss.

The Aztecs opened the game with five freshmen on offense, but still trailed just 7-3 with five minutes left in the first half. The Cougars, however, tacked on a pair of field goals to lead 13-3 at the intermission. BYU then took the opening kickoff of the second half 73 yards for a touchdown to gain complete control of the game. The key play came on a third and goal when an incomplete Cougar pass was turned into a first and goal via penalty.

The Cougars utilized the big play with Todd Watkins scoring on a 68-yard pass from the Cougs' second play from scrimmage. In the fourth period, Austin Collie caught an 82-yard touchdown pass from John Beck for another score.

Kevin O'Connell started his third straight game at quarterback and became the first player in San Diego State history to rush and pass for more than 100 yards in a game. He ran for 101 yards on 15 carries and passed for 229 yards on 47 attempts with 21 completions.

Ten different Aztecs caught passes in the game, including Alex Thompson, who scored his first career touchdown on a 10-yard pass from O'Connell late in the game.

Matt McCoy led the Aztec defense with 11 tackles, marking the 14th time in 16 games that at least one Aztec linebacker reached double figures in tackles. Eight Aztecs were credited with a tackle behind the line of scrimmage.

Game Notes

The victory was the second straight for the Aztecs at Air Force but just the fourth in Colorado Springs overall... The win was the third straight for San Diego State in the series... Prior to the current winning streak, SDSU had never beaten Air Force in two straight meetings... For their efforts, SDSU's Kirk Morrison, Heath Farwell and Garrett Palmer were all named Mountain West Conference players of the week... The six turnovers forced by the Aztecs were their most since the 34-0 win at UTEP in 2003 when they also forced six turnovers... San Diego State's freshman class scored 31 of the team's 37 points... Freshman tight end Eric Miclot made his first catch as an Aztec in the game and it went for a 17-yard TD in the first quarter... San Diego State started six freshmen on offense... Heath Farwell's two caused fumbles gave him a Mountain West-best five on the season... Freddie Keiaho's blocked punt was the third blocked kick of his career... San Diego State had a 100-yard rusher for the third straight game in the same season for the first time since 2001 when Larry Ned accomplished the feat... San Diego State's 37 points marked its best output against a Division IA program since it scored 38 points in a 38-34 win at Air Force in 2002.

AIR FORCE ACADEMY, Colo. - A San Diego State team that gets younger by the day did some growing up on Saturday, holding off Air Force for a 37-31 victory.

The victory ended a six-game losing streak for San Diego State and gave the Aztecs their first conference victory of the season.

In wind and snow and dropping temperatures, the Aztec offense came to life with points in every quarter. The defense forced Air Force to cough up the ball on six occasions and the Aztec special teams came up with three field goals, a blocked punt and a strong punting game.

Despite all the positives, San Diego State still had to hang on for the win. The victory wasn't clinched until Kirk Morrison intercepted a pass at the Aztec goal line with just 13 seconds remaining in the game.

San Diego State started fast with a 53-yard touchdown drive, topped off by the freshman-to-freshman combination of Kevin O'Connell to tight end Eric Miclot for a 17-yard score.

However, the Falcons answered on quarterback Adam Fitch's 63-yard touchdown run. It was the longest run of the season by a Falcon and the longest allowed by the Aztecs.

The back-and-forth game picked up speed in the third period when Brandon Bornes capped off a 74-yard drive with a one-yard run to give SDSU a 14-7 lead.

But despite the muddy track, the scoring was far from over. Fitch would engineer two more scoring drives and the Aztecs would add a late field goal to trail 21-17 at the break.

In the third period, San Diego State took control. The Aztecs forced a fumble on the Academy's first possession of the second half and SDSU capitalized one play later when O'Connell found Robert Ortiz for a 27-yard score.

When Jared Cleaver recovered a Falcon fumble on the ensuing kickoff, the Aztecs turned it into another three points and a 27-21 lead.

SDSU appeared to be in complete control when Freddie Keiaho blocked a punt to set up the Aztecs at the Air Force 15. SDSU covered the distance in three plays with Bornes scoring from four yards out.

The 34-21 lead, however, wasn't safe as Air Force put together scoring drives from 65 and 80 yards, followed by Palmer's third field goal.

On the last possession of the day for the Falcons, Air Force took over at its own 17 and moved inside the Aztec 15 before Morrison ended the threat with his first interception of the season.

Morrison and Heath Farwell had 19 tackles each in the win. Morrison recovered a fumble to go with his interception and Farwell forced two fumbles and had an interception on the first play from scrimmage.
