Aztecs Look to Extend 12-Game Homecourt Winning Streak in MWC Opener vs. TCU on Saturday Night

San Diego State (10-3 overall, 0-0 MWC) opens up conference play in its 10th season in the Mountain West Conference on Saturday night when the Aztecs play host to TCU (8-5, 0-0 MWC) at Cox Arena. Game time is set for 7 p.m. PT.

The game will be televised live on The Mtn. (San Diego Cox cable channel 320) and can also be heard on the Aztec radio flagship station AM 600 KOGO.

The Aztecs enter Saturday's contest with a Cox Arena-record 12-game homecourt winning streak and a seven-game MWC winning streak at Cox Arena. The Aztecs have not lost a home game since a 66-65 setback against Wyoming on Jan. 3, 2007.

San Diego State has quietly compiled an impressive non-conference resume. The Aztecs are 10-3, matching the second-best start in 38 seasons at the Division I level. SDSU has done so despite having to blend six new players with seven returning letterwinners to this season's squad. SDSU has also played just five home games to date, with two of the three losses coming to the number two-ranked RPI team (Arizona) and the number three-ranked RPI squad (Saint Mary's), nationally. The Aztecs currently have the top RPI ranking in the MWC at number 30 (through Tuesday's games).

The Aztecs are coming off their most impressive victory of the season, knocking off previously unbeaten Sam Houston State (currently 11-1 and 33rd in the RPI), 79-78, in overtime. The Aztecs rallied from three points down with 14 seconds to play in regulation, and once again from three points down in the extra session to claim the victory.

Forward Billy White, who earned Mountain West Conference Co-Player of the Week honors, helped the Aztecs win by getting an offensive put-back with :00.2 seconds remaining to force overtime. The freshman followed that up by converting an offensive rebound for a score with 11 seconds remaining in overtime to provide SDSU with the game-winning basket. For the game, White scored 12 points and added six rebounds, with 10 points and all six boards coming after intermission.

Junior forward Lorenzo Wade scored a career-high 23 points and added a team-high four assists, four steals and three rebounds. He was 8-for-11 from inside the arc in the contest. Freshman guard D.J. Gay came off the bench to convert a career-best four three-point field goals en route to 12 points and four assists in the game.

The Horned Frogs have won four of their last six games despite a 67-59 loss at 14th-ranked Texas on Wednesday. TCU is +5.4 in turnover margin this season, forcing nearly 20 turnovers a game (19.5).

This marks the eighth all-time meeting between the teams with the Aztecs owning a 4-3 series lead. The Aztecs have won all four games since the Horned Frogs joined the MWC prior to the 2005-06 season, although both games at Cox Arena have been decided late in the game. On Feb. 18, 2006, SDSU rallied from an 11-point deficit to claim an 83-71 victory, while on March 3, 2007, the Aztecs won a closely contested affair, 56-51.

Saturday's game concludes an odd scheduling stretch for San Diego State. The contest against TCU marks just the third game for SDSU since Dec. 17, meaning Saturday will mark SDSU's third game in the last 19 days. The Aztecs will play their final regular-season non-conference opponent on Wednesday night when they face Northern Colorado (6-7). The Bears own a 13-point victory over MWC-member Colorado State. Game time is set for 7 p.m. PT, with no live television coverage.

Storylines and Tidbits

► At 10-3, San Diego State has matched its second-best start in its 38-season Division I history. The last time an Aztec squad opened a season with a better record, was in 1984-85 when SDSU owned an 11-2 record after 13 games. This marks the second consecutive season SDSU has been 10-3 after 13 games and just the sixth time in the Division I era that an Aztec squad has won at least 10 of its first 13 games.

► As previously noted, San Diego State has a Cox Arena-record 12-game homecourt winning streak. It is the fifth longest streak in SDSU's 87-season history of basketball, the longest streak in 27 years (since 1981) and the 11th-longest active streak in the country (complete list is located to the right). San Diego State, which has won eight consecutive homecourt MWC games, is 29-3 in its last 32 home games dating back to Dec. 17, 2005.

► As good as SDSU has been at home of late, the Aztecs have been a bit vulnerable in the MWC home opener. In the nine previous seasons in the league, SDSU is 4-4 in the conference home opener, including an overtime loss to Wyoming in the 2005 home opener (after road wins at Brigham Young and UNLV) and a one-point loss to the Cowboys last season.

► Steve Fisher has turned San Diego State not only to a Mountain West Conference contender, but into one of the top program's in the country. Since Dec. 31, 2005, San Diego State has posted a 50-18 record. As of Jan. 2, the 50 victories in that time frame rank 20th nationally. San Diego State is coming off consecutive seasons with 22 or more wins and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2006 and the second round of the NIT in 2007.

► At 10-3, San Diego State has clinched its eighth consecutive season with at least 10 victories. Now that doesn't sound like a major accomplishment, but it serves as a great reminder of where the program was prior to Fisher's arrival. In the 15 seasons between 1985-86 and 1999-2000, the Aztecs failed to win more than 10 games in a season six times. By comparison, SDSU is halfway toward reaching the 20-win plateau for the third consecutive season, which equals the number of 20-win campaigns in the 37 seasons prior to the 2005-06 campaign.

► Although the Aztecs have won their most recent game, SDSU has done an excellent job of avoiding losing streaks, going 27 consecutive games without a two-game losing streak and 80 games without dropping three in a row. The Aztecs have followed their last eight defeats with a victory in the next game and are 21-4 in the contest following their most recent 25 defeats. San Diego State has been victorious in its first home game following its last 13 losses.

Player Tidbits

► Junior forward **Lorenzo Wade** is coming off a career-high 23-point performance against Sam Houston State (12-28-07)... He has scored in double figures in seven of his last eight games and led the Aztecs in scoring in three of the last five games... He is shooting 52.8 percent (57-of-108) from inside the arc and has converted 20 of his last 28 free throw attempts (71.4 percent)... He has four games with three or more steals... Wade has 534 career points as an Aztec and 672 in his college career.

► Junior forward **Kyle Spain** has three career 20-point scoring games, including two this season... Posted a team-high 20 points (two short of his career high) at 19th-ranked Arizona (12-22-07)... Has 26 rebounds in his last three games (8.7 rpg)... "Only" had nine points and nine rebounds in the win over Sam Houston State (12-28-07), although he did have a three-point play late in regulation and connected on a trey with 46 seconds left in overtime to give SDSU the lead... Earned MWC Player of the Week honors earlier this year and has won the award twice in his career.

► Freshman forward **Billy White** earned MWC Player of the Week honors after providing SDSU with the shot that forced overtime (:00.2) and game-winning shot (0:11 in OT) against Sam Houston State... He is just the sixth player in league history to earn the honor as a freshman, joining Evan Burns (SDSU), Andrew Bogut (Utah), Kyle Spain (SDSU), Brandon Ewing (Wyo.) and Trent Plaisted (BYU)... He has shot 60 percent or better from the field in three of his last four games... Pulled down six or more rebounds in three straight games for the first time in his career... Reached double figures in three of his last four games (11.5 ppg)... Gone 60 consecutive minutes without a turnover dating back to the Navy game.

► Freshman guard **D.J. Gay** is expected to make his 10th career start Saturday and his first since Navy (12-17-07)... One of five players to see action in all 15 games this season... Broke out of an 0-for-12 slump from three-point range by making 4-of-7 attempts against Sam Houston State (12-28-07)... The four treys are a career high as is his 12 points against the Bearkats... Four games with four or more assists... Five assists and one turnover in his last 35 minutes... One turnover or less in 10 of his 13 games this season.

► Junior center **Ryan Amoroso** has eight or more rebounds in three of his last four games... He has yet to foul out of a game this season and has collected four fouls in a game just once this season... Has 18 points in his last two games, two less than the total of the four previous games combined (20).

► Junior guard **Kelvin Davis** is shooting an impressive 58.0 percent from inside the arc (29-of-50)... He is making threes at a 43.4 percent clip (23-of-53)... Has a steal in nine of his last 10 games (16 total)... Eight double-figure scoring games this season.

► Junior forward **Jon Pastorek** has made nine of his last 13 field goal attempts (69.2 percent)... Made seven consecutive free throws... Has seven assists and one turnover in his last four games (57 minutes)... Has five offensive rebounds in the

last three games and has 14 offensive rebounds on the team (fourth most)... Played in eight straight games (10 or more minutes in each contest).

► Junior guard **Richie Williams** will miss the next four weeks with a broken left wrist... Suffered the injury in the final moments of regulation against Sam Houston State... Played in 76 career games and made 68 starts... Has a steal in seven consecutive games (17)... Recorded three or more steals in five games... Attempted 34 free throws on the season (second most on the team).

Aztecs Rally to Defeat Previous Unbeaten Sam Houston State in OT, 79-78

SAN DIEGO - Freshman forward Billy White converted an offensive rebound with :00.2 seconds remaining in regulation to force overtime and had an offensive putback basket with 11 seconds left in overtime to lift San Diego State to a 79-78 victory over Sam Houston State on Friday night at Cox Arena.

Neither team led by more than six points in a game that featured eight ties and 13 lead changes.

The Bearkats led by three points with 10 seconds to play in regulation when SDSU's Lorenzo Wade made the first of two free throws to cut the deficit to two points. Wade missed the second and SDSU immediately fouled. Following a pair of misses from the line for Sam Houston State, Aztec guard Richie Williams drove the length of the floor and missed a layup in traffic that White rebounded to tie the game.

In overtime, the Aztecs went up by a point when Kyle Spain drained a three off the dribble to give SDSU a 77-76 lead with 42 seconds left. John Gardiner put the Bearkats back up as he sank a baseline jumper with 30 seconds to play. That set the stage for White's heroics.

D.J. Gay, who had a career-high 12 points and four three-point field goals in the game, missed a trey that White rebounded and followed with a basket with 11 seconds left that proved to be the game-winner.

Wade had a career-high 23 points and added four steals, four assists and three rebounds. In addition to his career-high 12 points, Gay added a team-high tying four assists.

But the night belonged to White, who became the first Aztec player in the 12 years of records of game-winning shots to tie a game to force overtime and provided the game-winning shot in the extra session. The freshman had 12 points and six rebounds, with 10 of his points and all six of his boards coming after intermission.

White became the third Aztec freshman and just the sixth freshman in Mountain West Conference history to earn league player of the week honors and the first to do it since BYU's Trent Plaisted won the award on Jan. 30, 2006. The other SDSU freshmen players to earn the honor are Spain and Evan Burns.

Noting the Sam Houston State Game

► San Diego State snapped Sam Houston State's 10-game winning streak. The Bearcats entered last Friday's game as one of only nine undefeated teams in the country. Sam Houston State's 10-game winning streak was the eighth-longest active streak in the country.

► The Aztecs have responded from their last eight losses with a victory in the next game and are 21-4 in the contest following their last 25 losses. SDSU has gone 27 consecutive games without dropping two straight games and 80 straight games without suffering a three-game losing streak.

► At 10-3, San Diego State owns its second best record after 13 games in the 38 seasons at the Division I level. The 1984-85 squad team is the only one to open with a better record (11-2). The current 10-3 record matches SDSU's record after 13 games last season and is two games better than the 2005-06 NCAA squad that opened 8-5.

► San Diego State extended its Cox Arena record winning streak to 12 games. According to NCAA stats, that is the ninth-longest active streak in the nation and is the fifth longest in 87 seasons of basketball on The Mesa. The last time SDSU owned a longer consecutive homecourt winning streak was 1982, when the Aztecs put together a 17-game win streak from March 7, 1981 to March 6, 1982.

► The win is San Diego State's fourth straight overtime win and first since Feb. 20, 2007, at New Mexico.

► Billy White's tip in in 0:00.2 seconds left was SDSU's first game-tying shot since Kyle Spain made the first of two free throws to knot the game at 70 to force overtime at New Mexico last season (Feb. 20, 2007).

► Billy White's basket in overtime is the first game-winning shot for SDSU since Brandon Heath's three-point field goal off the dribble to break a 70-all tie (:05.3) at Missouri State last season in the first round of the postseason NIT.

► **Lorenzo Wade** set a new career high with 23 points; his point total is a season best. His previous career high was 21 vs. Campbell last year. ... He recorded his 33rd career game with 10 or more points and it is the 11th time this season that he has accomplished the feat. ... Wade made his first five free throw attempts of the game, giving him nine straight makes going back to the Arizona game... The nine consecutive makes tied a career long streak set while at Louisville. ... His seven free throws was also a career high.

► **D.J. Gay** scored a career-high 12 points. It is his third career double-figure scoring effort of his career. ... He connected on multiple three-point baskets for the first time since hitting three at Loyola Marymount on Nov. 28. Prior to making his first two, he was zero for his last 10 three-point field goal attempts. ... Gay's four field goals from behind the arc is a career best.

► **Jon Pastorek** began the season shooting 25 percent (2-for-8) from the field in his first five games. Since then, the sophomore has gone 9-for-13, including 2-for-3 tonight, covering five outings. ... He has made his last seven free throws, a career best.

► **Kyle Spain** recorded his third straight game with at least eight rebounds tonight. He finished the game with nine. It marked the first time in his career that he has accomplished three consecutive eight-plus rebounds games.

► **Billy White** posted his sixth double-figure scoring game of his career. He ended the game with 12 points.

San Diego State-TCU: The Series

► This is the eighth meeting between TCU and San Diego State, with the Aztecs owning a 4-3 series lead. The Aztecs have won the last four and are 2-1 vs. the Frogs in Cox Arena and 2-2 in games played in San Diego.

► The teams first meeting was in 1984, when TCU played in San Diego State's Cabrillo Classic at the San Diego Sports Arena. The teams played in the opening round of the four-team tournament with the Horned Frogs claiming a 72-70 victory. TCU finished second in the tournament, falling to Boston College the next day, 92-75, while SDSU finished fourth, falling to Michigan State, 77-61.

► The next two meetings came when the teams crossed paths as members of the Western Athletic Conference in 1997-98. TCU swept the season series that year, as part of an undefeated WAC title run. The Frogs won 105-61 in San Diego on Jan. 17, 1998. The 41-point loss is still the largest margin of defeat suffered by the Aztecs in Cox Arena. On Feb. 14, TCU completed the season sweep with a 91-69 victory. The Horned Frogs ended the season with a 27-6 record, 14-0 WAC record and lost to Florida State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

► The four most recent meetings and only Aztec wins came the last two seasons. On Jan. 18, 2006, SDSU defeated the Frogs, 76-57, in Fort Worth, Texas. That game Marcus Slaughter recorded 23 points and 18 rebounds. The Aztecs' other win came at home in an 83-71 victory that saw Brandon Heath go for 20 points and Slaughter put up 19 points and nine rebounds. Last season, on Jan. 31, 2007, SDSU pulled out a 76-71 victory in Fort Worth in a game where Heath posted his first career double-double. Last season in San Diego, the Aztecs sent seniors Brandon Heath, Mohamed Abukar and current SDSU director of player development David Velasquez out in style, but not before receiving a stiff challenge from TCU in a 56-51 victory at Cox Arena on March 3, 2007.

► The Horned Frogs and Aztecs are in the same conference for the second time. TCU previously competed in the Southwest Conference (1951-1995), Western Athletic Conference (1996-2000) and Conference USA (2001-04). San Diego State's previous Division I era conference stops include the Pacific Coast Athletic Association (1969-1975), Western Athletic Conference (1978-1998) and the Mountain West Conference (1999-present).

► The schools competed in the same league in 1996, 1997 and 1998, but faced each other only during the 1997-98 season as the Aztecs competed in the Pacific Division and the Horned Frogs were in the Mountain Division of the WAC.

► With Richie Williams expected to miss Saturday's game against TCU, current San Diego State players have combined to score a total of 75 career points against the Horned Frogs. The Aztecs will miss Williams, who has posted averages of 11.0 points, 3.8 assists, 2.5 steals and 2.5 rebounds in four games against TCU. That leaves Lorenzo Wade as the active leader in scoring, at 8.0 ppg and 4.3 rpg. Wade has shot 54.5 percent from the field, including 4-for-8 from three-point range against TCU.

► In the last three games played between the teams, San Diego State has enjoyed a 23.3-10.0 edge in points off turnovers. In the two games last season, SDSU forced 36 turnovers in the two games against the Horned Frogs, while committing just 21 miscues.

LAST MEETING & LAST MEETING IN SAN DIEGO

San Diego State 56, TCU 51 | March 3, 2007 | Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State survived a poor shooting game and sent its seniors out with a win as the Aztecs downed TCU, 56-51, at Cox Arena in the Mountain West Conference regular-season finale.

The contest marked the final home game for seniors Brandon Heath, Mohamed Abukar and David Velasquez.

The game was closely contested throughout as SDSU enjoyed a lead of eight early in the second half, while TCU's biggest lead was four midway through the first half.

Despite allowing the Horned Frogs to shoot better from the field, from three-point distance and from the free-throw line, the Aztecs used its rebound, turnover and free-throw advantage to pull out the victory.

Balance was another reason San Diego State won its 21st game as four players scored in double figures. Heath and Abukar led the way with 12 points each, with Jerome Habel adding 11 and Richie Williams contributing 10.

Lorenzo Wade was a jack of all trades as he recorded seven rebounds, four assists, four steals and a block, while Kyle Spain came off the bench to score seven points and grab a game-high nine rebounds.

The Horned Frogs were led by Brent Hackett's team-high 16 points on 6-of-12 shooting. Joining him in double figures was Alvarado Parker, who scored 12 points and added a team-high eight rebounds.

With 8,692 fans in attendance, San Diego State averaged a school-record 7,821 fans. The 2006-07 season marks the third straight basketball campaign in which the average attendance has increased from the year before.

LAST SEASON IN FORT WORTH

San Diego State 76, TCU 71 | Jan. 31, 2007 | Daniel-Meyer Coliseum

FORT WORTH, Texas - San Diego State senior guard Brandon Heath recorded his first career double-double and was joined by two other Aztecs in double figures as SDSU earned its first conference road victory with a 76-71 effort over TCU at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum.

Heath, who scored 22 points and pulled down 10 rebounds, scored nine of SDSU's first 11 points to help the Aztecs jump out to an 11-2 lead.

On multiple occasions, San Diego State held a nine-point advantage over the Horned Frogs until TCU used a 9-2 run of its own to get within two points with 6:07 left in the first. After exchanging buckets over the next couple of minutes, SDSU ended the half on a 6-2 spurt to go into the locker room ahead, 40-34.

As the second half got underway, the Frogs scored seven straight points to take a 41-40 lead and increased its lead to three thanks to an 11-2 run over the course of the initial seven minutes of action.

However, the Aztecs responded by scoring 11 unanswered points to regain control of the game and found themselves leading 53-45.

It appeared that San Diego State would earn its first Mountain West Conference road win comfortably, but TCU made it interesting in the end.

With 23 seconds left in the game, Frog guard Brent Hackett nailed a three to cut the SDSU lead to 74-71. On the ensuing inbounds play Lorenzo Wade turned the ball over with 18 seconds on the clock, but Wade redeemed himself by forcing Ryan Wall to turn it over eight seconds later. Following a TCU foul, Kyle Spain hit both free throws to provide the final margin.

Wade finished the game with 19 points and three blocks, while Mohamed Abukar scored 17 off the bench for the Aztecs.

San Diego State 83, TCU 71 | Feb. 18, 2006 | Cox Arena

SAN DIEGO -- Junior guard Brandon Heath scored 20 points and made a career-best six 3-pointers to pace four Aztec players in double figures and help lead SDSU to an 83-71 victory over TCU at Cox Arena.

TCU held a five-point halftime advantage and increased its lead to as many as 11 points with 17:58 remaining the in the second half and still led by four with 6:42 to play.

the season.

Junior forward Marcus Slaughter was one of five Aztecs to shoot at least 50 percent for the game, going 6-12 from the field for 19 points. He also added nine rebounds. Junior Mohamed Abukar chipped in with 17 points and seven rebounds while freshman point guard Richie Williams dished a career-high six assists to go along with 13 points.

The win was SDSU's 10th in its last 11 games and reduced its magic number to one for a share of the MWC crown. A crown the Aztecs later won outright.

San Diego State Cliff Notes

Having lost the all-time leading scorer in school history (Brandon Heath - 2,189 points) and possibly the single most-successful player in school history (Mohamed Abukar (compiled a 39-15 record, 72.2 percent)), not many people expected much from San Diego State in 2007-08.

Yet the Aztecs have used a deep bench and used full-court defensive pressure to jump out to an 10-3 record. The Aztecs, currently ranked 29th in the RPI, have four players averaging in double figures (one injured) and seven players averaging 7.5 points or more (two injured). Eight Aztec players are currently averaging 22.8 minutes or more per contest (two injured).

This edition of the SDSU squad has had more success than what most people would have expected. With a roster made up of one senior, six juniors, two sophomores and four freshmen, the Aztecs have posted five road/neutral victories to date.

The Aztecs are led by junior forwards Lorenzo Wade and Kyle Spain.

Wade, 6-6, who played on Louisville's 2005 NCAA Final Four team, is averaging 14.5 points, 2.9 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game. He is shooting 49.0 percent from the field and an impressive 37.8 percent from three-point range. An athletic left-handed player who is one of the top defensive players on the West Coast, he is averaging a team-high 30.1 minutes per game.

Spain, 6-5, is in his third season with the Aztecs, averaging 13.5 points and 6.1 rebounds. The junior has played the last four games after missing two of the previous three due to an ankle injury. Spain looked like himself vs. Navy as he recorded 14 points, nine rebounds and three steals and then followed it with 20 points and eight rebounds at Arizona. The Newark, Calif., native had a phenomenal freshman season when SDSU won the MWC regular season and postseason championships en route to the NCAA Tournament. Spain connected on 51.7 percent from three-point range in 2005-06 and made 25 starts before struggling through an injury-plagued sophomore campaign. This season, Spain has returned to the phenom freshman form. He has attempted a team-high 59 free throws this season, and is shooting 76.3 percent from the charity stripe.

Junior point guard Richie Williams has played himself back into the starting lineup. After missing the first three games of the season serving a team suspension, Williams has started four of the last five games and reached double figures in three straight games for the first time in his career before being held to seven vs. Navy. The 5-10 guard had 16 points against Western Michigan, 13 vs. UC Riverside and 11 against Saint Mary's. He currently leads the team in assists with 37 in nine games. (3.7 apg).

In a year of big impact newcomers, no player has had a bigger impact than 6-8 center Ryan Amoroso. Amoroso, who played for two seasons at Marquette, is averaging 8.9 points, 6.1 rebounds, but his real impact is on the defensive end where his 257-pound frame has given SDSU a wide body in the paint.

Another newcomer who has found his way into the starting lineup is freshman Billy White. White, who may rival Wade for athleticism, is averaging 9.2 points and 5.6 rebounds having played in all 13 games and making 10 starts. The freshman is 51-of-85 from the field for an amazing 60.0 field goal percentage. He also has a team-high tying 21 steals and 10 dunks this season.

Junior forward Kelvin Davis, who played in the 2005 NCAA Tournament while at UTEP, has needed little time to adjust after sitting out a year. Davis is averaging 10.9 points (third on the team) and 3.3 rebounds, while shooting 50.5 percent from the field and 43.4 percent from three-point range.

Freshman point guard D.J. Gay started the first eight games of the season (nine total) and will continue to see plenty of action. Through 13 games, he has 27 assists and just 15 turnovers to go along with a 4.5 scoring average. Known as a great shooter, Gay has connected on 14 treys to date.

With the season-ending knee injury to Tim Shelton, Jon Pastorek and Jer'Vaughn Johnson have both seen increased playing time. Pastorek has played in 10 games, making his first career start vs. Navy, and is averaging 2.9 points and 2.5 rebounds. He had a career-best four assists against Saint Mary's and followed it with 10 points (3-3 FG, 4-4 FT) and two rebounds against the Midshipmen. Johnson, meanwhile, has played in 10 games, averaging 1.3 points and 1.2 rebounds.

San Diego State has been a handful for opponents this season. Aztec opponents are shooting 44.6 percent from the field, 34.6 percent from three-point range and are averaging 17.4 turnovers to date.

White Named MWC Player of the Week

San Diego State freshman forward Billy White has been named Mountain West Conference men's basketball co-player of the week, the league announced Monday morning. The award is White's first of his career and shares the honor with UNLV's Wink Adams.

In SDSU's only game of the week, White helped the Aztecs beat Sam Houston State, 79-78, in overtime at Cox Arena. The Bearcats visited Montezuma Mesa as the No. 28-ranked RPI team, one of nine unbeaten teams in the country at 10-0 and had the eighth-longest active win streak in the country.

In what was a close game throughout with no team enjoying a lead larger than six points, White had 12 points on 6-of-10 shooting and six rebounds, including four on

the offensive end. The freshman came up big in the clutch as he scored 10 of his 12 points and grabbed all six of his rebounds after halftime.

With the Aztecs down by two, the Las Vegas, Nev., native forced overtime when he followed Richie Williams' miss with an offensive put-back with 0:00.2 remaining in regulation. Later in the extra session, White provided the game-winning bucket when he rebounded a D.J. Gay miss and followed it with a basket with 11 seconds remaining in overtime.

With his two huge field goals, White became the first SDSU freshman since the beginning of the 1996-97 season to hit a game-winning shot and the first Aztec to make a shot to force overtime and make a game-winner in the same game.

White joins Kyle Spain as the only two Aztecs to win conference player of the week honors this season. White is also the first Aztec freshman since Spain to earn weekly league and is the first freshman this season to win the award in the MWC.

Fast Starts on The Mesa

At 10-3, San Diego State is off to its second-best start to a Division I season. The 1984-85 team opened 11-2 en route to a 23-8 record and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. This year's squad matches the 2006-07, 2000-01, 1996-97 and 1971-72 teams to start a season at 10-3.

A victory on Saturday would:

- ▶ Mark just the fifth time in the Division I era that San Diego State has won at least 11 of its first 14 games and would continue the second best start to a Division I season (the 1984-85 team won 12 of its first 14 contests).
- ▶ Mark the first time in the Division I era that the Aztecs have won 11 of their first 14 games in back-to-back seasons.

Owning the Boards

In their game vs. Navy, the Aztecs were monsters on the boards as they collected 39 while limiting the Mids to just 21 total rebounds. SDSU's plus-18 margin was a season-best and was the fifth-best in Cox Arena history. Navy's five offensive rebounds also tied Fresno State for the lowest by an opponent this season.

At Arizona, SDSU outrebounded the Wildcats as it won the rebounding battle, 36-35, and had 18 offensive boards.

The Aztecs have outrebounded their opponent 10 times this season, including each of the last seven games.

Robbery Suspects

The Aztecs have been making the art of stealing a regular thing this season. In 12 of 13 games this year, SDSU has recorded at least seven steals, including 15 at San Diego and a season-high 19 at Loyola Marymount. Of the 226 turnovers San Diego State has forced, 56.2 percent or 127 total thefts have come via the steal. As of Thursday, the Aztecs were 21st nationally in steals per game (9.8).

Steady Force

Prior to making his first start at LMU as an Aztec, Kelvin Davis had been a steady force off the bench for the Aztecs this season. The transfer from the College of Southern Idaho had scored in double figures in each of the previous five games, including a career-high 17 points at California. In those five games, Davis posted a field goal and three-point field goal percentage of at least 50 percent and connected on at least two three-pointers in each of those contests.

As a starter, Davis struggled with his shot in his first two starting assignments, but contributed with his rebounding as he averaged 4.5 boards a game, including a career-best six at LMU. Against UC Riverside, Davis regained his shooting stroke and led the team with 16 points on a then career-high six field goals.

Versus Saint Mary's, Davis returned to his familiar role coming off the bench and exploded for a team-high 19 points on a personal-best eight field goals. He also added five rebounds, two steals and one assist in 25 minutes. For the season, he ranks third on the team in scoring and seventh in minutes played.

Obviously Davis' offensive numbers are better when he comes off the bench, but his averages as a starter is nothing to look down upon especially since his rebounding improves when earning the starting nod.

Triple Threat

San Diego State has four players averaging double figures and three more boasting an average of at least 7.5 points per game so it comes as no surprise that the Aztecs have had at least three players score in double figures in 12 of 13 games this year, including 12 straight. Against Navy, SDSU had five players in double figures for the second time this year and for the third time in which at least six scored 10 points or more. In addition, last year's NIT team never had at least three players reach double figures in nine consecutive games at any point during the campaign.

A Victory Almost Guaranteed

Kyle Spain has scored in double figures in nine of the 11 games he has played this season and the Aztecs have won seven of them. History says that when Spain scores at least 10 points, the Aztecs are almost guaranteed a win. As a freshman, San Diego State was 11-2 when the junior scored in double figures and 5-0 last season. For his career, Spain and the Aztecs boast a outstanding record of 23-4 when he reaches double digits in the scoring column.

Shutting Down the Bigs

San Diego State has faced three big men this season that have received national attention in Cal's DeVon Hardin, Western Michigan's Joe Reitz and Saint Mary's Omar Samhan and have had decent success against both. In the game against the Golden Bears, the Aztecs used a fierce double team to limit Hardin, an NBA prospect, to five points on 1-of-5 shooting. Against WMU, San Diego State held the two-time all-MAC selection to two points on 0-of-8 from the field. Lastly, the Aztecs limited Samhan to just 10 points and three rebounds. Going into the contest, Hardin was averaging 10.5 points, while

Reitz was averaging a team-best 14.4 points. Samhan had numbers of 14.5 points and 8.5 rebounds going into the game vs. SDSU.

Winning By Double Digits

The Aztecs' season-opening four wins, before its five-point win at USD, were all by double-digit margins. It was the first time since the 2002-03 season SDSU had accomplished such a feat. During their NIT in 2002-03, the Aztecs won at Houston (71-61) and defeated Florida Atlantic (91-75), IPFW (74-58) and Loyola Marymount (79-69) at home. In fact, prior to its game at Houston, SDSU beat Hawai'i at home by 11 (60-49) making the win over the Lions its fifth in a row by at least 10 points. Before losing to Saint Mary's, the Aztecs had another run of their own as they had won three in a row by double figures.

Shooting the Lights Out

San Diego State is shooting 45.9 percent from the field. More impressive is the fact that six players are shooting at least 49 percent. Compared to last season, only two SDSU players finished the season with a field-goal percentage above 50 percent.

After 13 games, San Diego State has shot over 50 percent six times and at least 46 percent from the field in eight games. All eight of those games resulted in wins.

Contributions from the New Guys

Five of the top eight players when looking at minutes played and points scored are newcomers. Those five include Ryan Amoroso, Kelvin Davis, D.J. Gay, Tim Shelton and Billy White. Their contributions have certainly been felt early on. Between the five of them, they put up a triple double vs. Portland and at Fresno State. The quintet is responsible for 47.6 percent of the team's points, 57.5 percent of rebounds and 31.9 percent of assists.

74 is the Magic Number

Reaching the 74-point plateau seems to bring good fortune for the Aztecs as they have done so 41 times since the beginning of 2005-06, including six times this year. In those 41 games, San Diego State has a record of 38-3. The 22 times SDSU didn't hit the 74-point mark the past two seasons, it wound up losing 13 of them. Coincidentally, 12 of the 22 occurrences have happened away from Cox Arena. Of the six times San Diego State didn't reach the magic number and won, seven were at home. The only time it happened away from San Diego and won was this year's opener vs. Liberty and at San Diego.

Freshmen in Starting Lineup

With junior point guard Richie Williams serving a team suspension earlier this year, true freshman D.J. Gay earned the starting nod in the season-opening game against Liberty. Tim Shelton, another true freshman, also found himself in the starting five as well vs. the Flames. Gay and Shelton became just the 10th and 11th freshmen to start a season opener under Steve Fisher. Only four times before had a freshman started a season opener under Fisher at SDSU and that oddly was Williams in 2005 at Alaska Fairbanks. Gay and Shelton joined elite company as only Juwan Howard, Jalen Rose, Chris Webber, Jerod Ward, Albert White, Bradley Jackson, Steve Sir, Brandon Heath and Williams have received the starting nod from Fisher as freshman to open a season.

Locking Down

San Diego State has used a stifling defense for the better part of 40 minutes in each game this year. Dating back to last season, the Aztecs have held 25 of their last 29 opponents to 74 points or less and have held 18 of their last 28 opponents to less than 45 percent from the field.

Just this year alone, the Aztecs have held 10 of 13 opponents to 74 points or fewer and six to under 42.2 percent shooting. SDSU opponents are also averaging 17.4 turnovers a game.

As you might imagine, holding opponents to less than 40 percent from the floor has been a good sign for the Aztecs. San Diego State is 56-9 in the Steve Fisher era when the opponent is held below that field goal percentage.

Making it Rain

The Aztecs have made at least six three-pointers in eight of 13 games this year. This season's squad became the first team in Steve Fisher's tenure to knock down at least six three-pointers in the first six games of a season after it made a season-best 11 at California. SDSU made it seven straight games until it only connected on four vs. Western Michigan.

White's House Party

Billy White, making his first appearance at Cox Arena on Nov. 17 vs. UCSD, found himself in the starting lineup and did not disappoint. The Las Vegas native connected on his first nine shots before missing with under six minutes left in the game and went on to put back his missed attempt. For the game, White was a 10 of 11 from the field for a game- and career-high 20 points, had a game-high tying nine rebounds, a game- and career-best three blocked shots and one steal in a team-best 29 minutes.

White became the first Aztec to make at least 10 field goals in a game this season. His three blocks are also a 2007 team best. The freshman's 20-point performance was the first by an Aztec freshman since the 2004-05 season when Matt Thomas scored 20 vs. Air Force on Feb. 28, 2005. White's nine rebounds were also the most by an SDSU freshman since Kyle Spain grabbed 12 in the championship game of the MWC tournament vs. Wyoming on March 11, 2006.

White's 10-11 shooting exhibition ranks in a tie for fifth place on San Diego State's individual game records list for best field-goal percentage in a game (min. 6 FGM) during Steve Fisher's tenure.

Shelton Out

Freshman forward Tim Shelton will miss the rest of the 2007-08 season after undergoing surgery to his left knee on Tuesday, Nov. 20. The Fresno, Calif., native started the first three games of the season, missed the UCSD game due to swelling in his knee, but returned for the game at San Diego in a reserve role. In four games, Shelton was averaging 10.0 points on 55.2 percent shooting and 4.8 rebounds.

Ziegenfuss Passes

On Saturday, Dec. 1, longtime Aztec basketball coach George Ziegenfuss passed away in San Diego. He was 90 years old. Ziegenfuss coached on Montezuma Mesa for 21 seasons and guided the Aztecs to the Division II quarterfinals twice and to the second round. Prior to moving into Division II, Ziegenfuss took SDSU to the NAIA tournament on two occasions, going as far as the third round. During his tenure, he posted a record of 316-229 (114-73 CCAA) and finished in first or second place in the California Collegiate Athletic Association 11 times.

Increasing the Margin

In its three wins at the World Vision Classic, the Aztecs increased their margin of victory in each game. Against Liberty, SDSU won by 12 and then followed it with a 14-point victory over Portland. In the finale, the Aztecs dominated Fresno State and defeated the Bulldogs by 17. The feat marked the first time since the 1984-85 season that the Aztecs have increased their margin of victory in three consecutive non-conference wins. In '84-85, SDSU beat Long Beach State on the road by two, 62-60, and followed it with neutral-site wins over McNeese State by six (91-85) and Southwest Louisiana by 13 (86-73).

Aztecs Win World Vision Classic

The Aztecs won their sixth in-season event victory of the Division I era last weekend in Fresno Calif., with three wins in three days. San Diego State claimed tournament titles in the 1977 Cabrillo Classic (San Diego, Calif.), 1981 Cabrillo Classic (San Diego, Calif.), 1984 UNLV Roundup (Las Vegas, Nev.), the 1987 Holiday Bowl Classic (San Diego, Calif.), the 2006 Shamrock Invitational and this season's World Vision Classic.

Aztecs Picked to Finish in Tie for Fourth

San Diego State has been picked to finish in a tie for fourth place in the Mountain West Conference's 2007-08 pre-season men's basketball media poll released Oct. 17, at the league's media day being held at The Mtn. studios in Littleton, Colo.

The Aztecs, 2007 NIT participants, earned 128 points along with New Mexico (two first-place votes) and also received one first-place vote. Brigham Young was picked to win the league with 181 points and 15 first-place votes, followed by UNLV (146 pts; 2 first-place votes) and Utah (142; 2).

After SDSU and New Mexico in sixth place was Wyoming (120), with TCU (7th, 58), Air Force (8th, 54) and Colorado State (9th, 33) rounding out the poll.

San Diego State junior forward Ryan Amoroso was the lone Aztec to garner individual accolades as he was voted as the league's top newcomer. Amoroso, a transfer from Marquette who sat out last season, becomes the second SDSU player in the last three years to earn that distinction. Recently departed senior Mohamed Abukar earned the same recognition heading into the 2005-06 campaign.

Not So Newcomers

Even though they are classified as "newcomers," Ryan Amoroso and Kelvin Davis are anything but that. The pair make up for 33 percent of the team's newcomers, but it is their experience prior to arriving on Montezuma Mesa that would dispute their classification.

Amoroso played in 57 games, while making eight starts in his two-year stint at Marquette. During his time there, the Golden Eagles went 39-23 and advanced to the 2005 National Invitation Tournament and the 2006 NCAA Tournament. Davis, meanwhile, played in 24 games his freshman season at UTEP and was a part of a Miner team that 27-8 and earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament. And although he redshirted the following season, Davis was a part of a UTEP squad that ended the season at 21-10 and advanced to the second round of the NIT.

When compared to last year's five newcomers, only Lorenzo Wade had prior Division I college experience. Wade saw action in 35 games at Louisville as a freshman and helped lead the Cardinals to a 33-5 record and a spot in the NCAA Final Four.

Experience Counts

With only one senior on the roster some may think the Aztecs are young. Although there is some truth to that, the players San Diego State has returned are definitely battle-tested. The seven returners, along with the additions of Ryan Amoroso and Kelvin Davis, have all been a part of winning teams that have won at least 20 games and squads that have advanced to postseason play. Of the nine to advance to the postseason, seven have been to an NCAA Tournament and eight have been on teams to win at least one game in the postseason. Last year, SDSU only had eight players who had tasted the postseason and were part of 20-win ballclubs. Of the eight, only Lorenzo Wade experienced winning a postseason game.

Steve Fisher has guided the Aztec basketball program to unparalleled heights. In eight seasons, he has taken a program that regularly missed out on the *conference* postseason tournament, to one which has become of the best programs on the West Coast and has the Aztecs knocking on the door of the elite teams in the country.

The best news for SDSU fans is that Fisher signed a new five-year contract prior to the start of the 2006-07 season that will keep him in San Diego for the foreseeable future.

When Fisher arrived on the scene in March of 1999, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were set. The Aztecs were expected to lose. The year before Fisher's arrival on campus, San Diego State won just four games.

Now those days are a distant memory. Fisher guided San Diego State to the NCAA Tournament in 2002, the postseason NIT in 2003, the 2006 NCAA Tournament and the NIT last season. In addition, the Aztecs have a solid core returning and an exciting incoming class, both freshmen and newcomers, that will keep SDSU competitive this season and seasons ahead.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene in the form of a news conference to introduce its new coach, Steve Fisher. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Steve Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching

career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Co., raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, ranking him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to the championship of the NIT as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great recent turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led SDSU back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

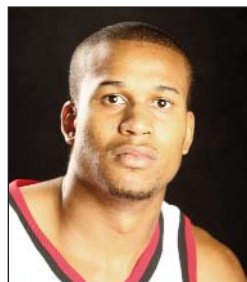

FRESNO, Calif. - San Diego State defeated Liberty, 62-50, in the opening game of the World Vision Classic.

SDSU shot 46.7 percent from the field and held Liberty to 34.0 percent shooting. The Aztecs outrebounded Liberty, 32-28, thanks to a game-high nine rebounds from Billy White.

Kyle Spain led the Aztecs with 14 points, while White had 13 points and Lorenzo Wade had 12.

The game was close early as Liberty led 10-9 with 8:55 left in the first half following a layup by Rell Porter. SDSU then scored six straight points to take a 15-10 lead following a dunk by White with 5:59 until halftime.

San Diego State outscored Liberty 8-2 in the final two minutes to lead 27-19 at halftime. To open the second half, the Aztecs went on a 16-3 run to lead 43-22 with 12:50 left in the game. Ryan Amoroso, playing in his first game as an Aztec, contributed nine points and five rebounds in a starting role.

San Diego State maintained the double digit lead the rest of the game.

With freshmen D.J. Gay and Tim Shelton earning the starting nod, the duo became the 10th and 11th freshmen to start a season-opening game under Steve Fisher and the fifth and sixth under Fisher while at SDSU.

The win improves the Aztecs' record in season-opening games to 7-2 under Fisher and SDSU has now won three consecutive season openers for the first time since doing it in 1999-00, '00-01 and '01-02.

FRESNO, Calif. - San Diego State used a swarming defense and had six players score in double figures as the Aztecs defeated Fresno State in the championship game of the World Vision Classic.

Ryan Amoroso scored a team- and Aztec career-high 19 points and was followed by Lorenzo Wade's second straight game with 18 points.

Kelvin Davis had his best game at SDSU with 15 points on 6 of 8 shooting from the field in a reserve role, while Kyle Spain added 12. True freshmen Tim Shelton and D.J. Gay rounded out the double-figure scorers with 11 and 10 points, respectively. Shelton also had a game- and career-high eight rebounds.

The Aztecs' six double-figure scorers marked the first time they accomplished the feat since the 2006-07 season when they did it against Campbell.

San Diego State shot 55 percent and hit on nine of 15 three-pointers while limiting the Bulldogs to 47 percent from the floor.

SDSU led from the opening tip and jumped out to a 25-8 lead nine minutes into the game. The Bulldogs went on a run to come within 10 at 27-17 with 8:14 to play in half.

San Diego State then extended its lead to 38-21 and led 48-33 at halftime. Fresno State got no closer than 12 points in the second half.

With the win, the Aztecs snapped a 12-game losing streak to Fresno State in Fresno and delivered the Bulldogs' worst defeat in the history of their five-year old arena, Save Mart Center. It was also Fresno State's largest margin of defeat in a regular-season home game since Dec. 3, 1994.

The Aztecs' third in win in as many days marked the first time in the school's Division I history in which they started consecutive seasons at 3-0.

San Diego State, which had four players score in double figures, was led by Lorenzo Wade's 14 points and six assists. Spain added 11, while Ryan Amoroso and Kelvin Davis each had 10.

The Aztecs forced 25 Torero turnovers, 15 of which were SDSU steals and shot 60 percent from both the field and behind the arc.

In the second half, Western Michigan methodical-ly went to work and eventually tied the game at 42 with 12:41 remaining in the game following a three by Derek Fracalossi. Then on consecutive possessions, Richie Williams made four free throws to spark a 10-0 run and gave the Aztecs a lead it would not relinquish.

Williams and Kyle Spain both came off the bench to score a game-high 16 points. Joining the duo in double-figure scoring column was Billy White (13), Lorenzo Wade (12) and Ryan Amoroso (11).

White, a freshman, also added a team-high eight rebounds and four assists.

David Kool led the Broncos with 14 points, while Derek Drews scored 11. WMU's All-America candidate and leading scorer, Joe Reitz, was limited to two points and held without a field goal in eight attempts.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State matched its best start to a season as a Division I school and won its 10th straight game at Cox Arena with a 59-46 decision over UC Riverside.

The Aztecs' improved to 8-1 despite shooting just 34 percent from the field and being held to their lowest point total of the season. On the flipside, SDSU was superb on defense as it held the Highlanders to 46 total points, including 18 in the first half, and 38.3 percent from the field.

The contest was a struggle for both teams especially in the first half when San Diego State missed nine of its initial 12 shots, while UCR connected on just 7-of-24 from the floor. But as the half came to a close, the Aztecs found their rhythm and went on an 8-2 run to go ahead, 26-18, after one period.

In the second half SDSU slowly pulled away, despite posting a 30.8 field goal percentage. The difference in the game came at the free throw line where the Aztecs were 17-for-21 after intermission and 20-for-25 for the game. In comparison, UCR went to the line eight times, making just five in the second half, and was 7-for-11 overall.

San Diego State was led by a trio of juniors in Kelvin Davis, Lorenzo Wade and Richie Williams.

Davis made a career-high tying six field goals to lead the team in scoring with 16 points, while Wade added 14 points. Williams, who made his first start of the season, contributed 13 points, a game-high seven rebounds and a season-best five steals.

Sophomore Jon Pastorek provided a spark off the bench with a season-high nine points and career-high seven boards.

ANAHEIM, Calif. - San Diego State was unable to overcome an 8-for-18 performance from the free-throw line as it fell to Saint Mary's, 69-64, at the 14th annual John R. Wooden Classic.

The Aztecs had four players score in double figures, enjoyed a five-point halftime lead, outrebounded the Gaels and were even in turnovers. However, SDSU could not hit free throws down the stretch, which enabled SMC to pull away in the final minutes.

In the first half, the game was close with the Gaels owning a five-point advantage in the early going until SDSU went on a 17-4 run over the course of nearly 11 minutes. By the time SMC's Tron Smith earned his way to the free-throw line with 2:57 to go in the half, the Aztecs were up by eight points.

San Diego State was unfazed and fought back to make the game close as neither team led by more than three points and the score was tied on five different occasions.

Despite taking a five-point lead on a layup by Smith, SDSU trimmed the deficit to one with 3:22 left. From that point on, however, the Aztecs went 0-for-5 from the line to let the game slip away.

Kelvin Davis led SDSU in scoring for the second straight game with 19 points. Wade and Williams finished with 11 points, while Billy White added 10.

But the night belonged to White, who became the first Aztec player in the 12 years of records of game-winning shots to tie a game to force overtime and provided the game-winning shot in the extra session. The freshman had 12 points and six rebounds, with 10 of his points and all six of his boards coming after intermission.
