San Diego State Carries Five-Game Winning Streak into Saturday Night City Showdown Against USD at Cox Arena

Having matched its second-best start in the last 23 seasons, San Diego State (6-1), winners of five consecutive games, plays its only home contest in a stretch of seven games on Saturday night when it welcomes San Diego (4-3) to Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl.

The city's two Division I schools, separated by 9.4 miles, are meeting for the 40th time overall and the 11th consecutive season. Tip-off is set for 7:05 p.m. PST with the game being televised by The Mtn. (simulcast by Channel 4 San Diego). AM 600 KOGO, the flagship station of San Diego State athletics, will have the radio call.

For the first time in 37 years, San Diego State has won four consecutive games without the benefit of a home game. The Aztecs, which won three consecutive games during Thanksgiving week to claim the Great Alaska Shootout title, improved to 4-0 in road/neutral games this season with a 73-62 victory at Northern Colorado on Wednesday night.

Game Tidbits:

► San Diego State has won the last two meetings with USD and has been victorious in five of the six most recent encounters. The Aztecs have won three straight over the Toreros at Cox Arena.

► San Diego State is looking to win at least seven of its first eight games to open a season for just the sixth time in 39 Division I seasons. However, a win Saturday would give the Aztecs their third consecutive season with at least seven wins in their opening eight games. That is something that has never happened in 88 seasons of Aztec Basketball.

► SDSU is 38-7 in its last 45 home games and has won seven straight home games in December.



Butler-Hancock Brings Out Best in Shelton

It may have been below 20 degrees outside of Butler-Hancock Sports Pavilion on the campus of Northern Colorado, but Tim Shelton's shooting certainly wasn't. The freshman was perfect in all aspects when it came to shooting as he finished with a stat line that read: 6-6 FG, 2-2 3FG, 3-3 FT.

All of that led to a career-high 17 points, 12 of which came in the first half to help the Aztecs to a 34-30 lead at the half. Besides establishing a new personal best in scoring, Shelton set new career highs in field goals and three-pointers.

Considered as the team's sixth starter by coach Steve Fisher, Shelton played a season-high tying 26 minutes and added two rebounds, an assist and five charges drawn.

Impressive to Start the Year

The Aztecs have six wins in seven games this season marking the seventh time in the school's Division I history that an SDSU squad has had at least a 6-1 record after seven contests. It is the third straight season San Diego State has accomplished the feat.

Just Get to 70

San Diego State has had tremendous success when scoring at least 70 points in a game. Dating back to the 2006-07 season, SDSU has won 19 straight games when reaching 70 points. Since the beginning of that campaign, the Aztecs have won

34 of 36 when scoring 70. This season, the Scarlet and Black is undefeated in four tries this season when hitting the 70 mark and has reached the number in four of its last five games.

Something to Hang Your Hat On

In the first NCAA statistical report for games through Nov. 30, San Diego State was tied for 10th in scoring defense after allowing 52.7 points through six games. Ohio State was the NCAA Division I leader after allowing just 40.3 points. The Buckeyes, however, played only three games at the time of the Nov. 30 report. Among teams that have played at least six games, SDSU was tied for second behind Washington State and its average of 43.8. The Aztecs were tied with unbeaten Dayton (6-0). Since the initial report, San Diego State is now allowing 54.0 points per outing.

Individually, Kyle Spain ranked 17th in free-throw percentage at 94.9 percent (minimum 2.5 free throws made per game). Among players with at least 20 attempts, Spain was seventh. Additionally, the senior ranked first in free-throw attempts (39) among those players who rank in the top 49 in free-throw percentage. Since the first NCAA official report, Spain is now shooting 93.6 percent (44-47).

Spain Named MWC Player of the Week

Kyle Spain was named Mountain West Conference Player of the Week, the league office announced Monday. The award is the third of Spain's

Spain helped the Aztecs win the Great Alaska Shootout tournament title by averaging 18.0 points, 6.3 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 2.0 steals in just 25.0 minutes per game in a starting role. Spain was also named the Great Alaska Shootout Most Outstanding Player.

In the first game of the tournament against Western Carolina, Spain tied his career-highs in points (22) and assists (five) while pulling down a team-best eight rebounds and collecting a season-high two steals. With 11 seconds to go, Spain knocked down the game-tying and go-ahead free throws to give the Aztecs the 59-58 victory.

In game two of the event, Spain led the team with 15 points on 6-of-9 shooting from the floor, while going 3-for-3 from behind the arc. He also tallied three rebounds and two steals in the Aztecs' 75-56 semifinal win over Seattle.

In the championship game against Hampton, Spain scored 17 points while recording a game-high tying eight rebounds and two steals in only 17 minutes of action. His two steals matched a season high and marked the third game in a row that he reached that total. Spain also went a perfect 8-for-8 from the line in the Scarlet and Black's 76-47 victory. The Aztecs posted the largest margin of victory (29) in a Great Alaska Shootout title game.

On the week, Spain shot 50 percent (15-for-30) from the field, including 6-for-13 (46.2 percent) from three-point range and 18-of-19 (94.7 percent) from the charity stripe.

A Look at the Toreros

► San Diego is 4-3 on the season having most recently defeated CS Bakersfield on the road, 77-65. The Toreros, who have won their last two, have been tested early this season falling at MWC member UNLV in their season opener and dropping

two games at the U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam against No. 25 Wisconsin (49-64) and No. 22 Miami (45-80).

► Head coach Bill Grier is in his second season at USD and has a career record of 26-17. Last season, Grier helped the Toreros win the West Coast Conference tournament title on their home floor and guided them to an NCAA Tournament first-round upset of 15th-ranked UCONN.

► The Toreros have three players averaging 10 or more points in seniors Brandon Johnson (14.0), Gyno Pomare (12.8) and sophomore Rob Jones (10.7). Jones leads the team in rebounding at 5.7, while Pomare averages 5.2 a game.

San Diego State-USD Series History

► Saturday night's meeting between the Aztecs and Toreros marks the 11th consecutive season in which the two teams have squared off and it will be the 40th meeting between the two teams since their first game back in 1962. The Aztecs hold a 22-17 advantage overall, and the Aztecs are 16-8 as the home team.

► SDSU is 3-2 versus USD at Cox Arena, having won the last three games between the teams at the venue. The Aztecs are 7-4 all-time against the Toreros in games played on the San Diego State campus (3-2 at Cox Arena and 4-3 at Peterson Gym).

► The games have been particularly close of late, with 10 of the last 15 games decided by six points or less. Of the eight games played this decade, six have been decided by six points or less. The last four games have been decided by a total of 17 points.

► Although the overall series is close, the history can be broken into four periods: the early years (in which SDSU owned a 4-3 advantage), the Aztec dominance (SDSU was 11-2 from 1975-84), the Torero dominance (USD was 11-2 from 1985-2001) and recently with the Aztecs winning five of the last six games.

► This marks just the second time that the teams are facing each other after both teams advanced to postseason the year before. The other time was in 2003, when USD advanced to the NCAA Tournament the previous season and the Aztecs went to the second round of the postseason NIT.

► In four of the last seven meetings, the loser of the city showdown and has gone on to advance to the NCAA Tournament. In 2001-02 and 2005-06, the Aztecs lost to USD only to make the NCAA Tournament, while in 2002-03 and 2007-08, the Toreros lost the city game but ended the season in the NCAA Tournament.

► San Diego State's active roster is comprised of seven players which have faced the Toreros. Seniors Kyle Spain, Richie Williams and Matt Thomas have faced USD three previous times. Spain has the most impressive numbers against San Diego, with active highs of 32 points and 14 rebounds. The current Aztecs roster has combined to score 85 points, 43 rebounds and 24 assists. This Aztec team has significantly more experience against their crosstown foe than the 2007-08 edition, which returned players that had accounted for 49 points,

► 2007-08 Meeting at Jenny Craig Pavilion

San Diego State 69, San Diego 64 | Nov. 19, 2008
SAN DIEGO - San Diego State traveled west to Jenny Craig Pavilion and handed San Diego a 69-64 defeat for the Aztecs' second win on the USD campus since 1975.

SDSU used hot shooting, especially from behind the arc, and a stifling pressure defense to down the Toreros for the second consecutive season and the sixth time in the last seven meetings.

Despite shooting 66.7 percent from the field, the Aztecs only held a four-point lead, 38-34, at half-time thanks to USD's Brandon Johnson's 16 first-half points.

Coming out of intermission, San Diego came out on fire, while SDSU struggled to get itself going. Five minutes into the half, the Aztecs' four-point lead turned into a four-point deficit, but San Diego State stayed close for the next few minutes before going on a 13-4 run to go ahead by nine with four minutes left in the game.

The Aztecs stretched their lead to 10 with 1:26 remaining in regulation before a combination of SDSU missed free throws and USD buckets cut the Aztecs' lead to four with 30 seconds left. Kyle Spain, however, put the game out of reach with his free throw and SDSU emerged with the win.

San Diego State, which had four players score in double figures, was led by Lorenzo Wade's 14 points and six assists. Spain added 11, while Ryan Amoroso and Kelvin Davis each had 10.

The Aztecs forced 25 Torero turnovers, 15 of which were SDSU steals and shot 60 percent from both the field and behind the arc.

► 2006-07 Meeting at Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl

San Diego State 79, San Diego 76 | Nov. 29, 2006
SAN DIEGO - Senior guard Brandon Heath scored eight of his 21 points in the final 28 seconds of the game to help San Diego State hold off San Diego, 79-76, at Cox Arena.

The victory was the third straight in the series at home for the Aztecs, who also tied the school-record for the best start to a season and gave head coach Steve Fisher the best start of his career.

San Diego State led 41-40 at intermission, and took the lead for good on a dunk by Jerome Habel with 15:22 to play in the second half. The Aztecs built the advantage to 10 points, leading 67-57 with 6:51 to play. A frantic San Diego rally cut the SDSU advantage to three points with 2:42 remaining.

Heath extended the advantage to five points with a jumper, and made six consecutive free throws in the final 15 seconds to clinch the victory for San Diego State.

Senior forward Mohamed Abukar led the way for the Aztecs with 22 points, seven rebounds and three assists. He connected on 8-of-14 shots from the field, including a straightaway 24-foot three-point field goal to tie the game in the first half.

Sophomore Lorenzo Wade came off the bench to contribute 14 points and six rebounds and classmate Kyle Spain added 12 points and four rebounds for the Aztecs.

San Diego was led by Ross DeRogatis with 23 points on the strength of five three-point field

goals.

Heath scored in double figures for the 33rd consecutive game to set a new school record.

► 2005-06 Meeting at Jenny Craig Pavilion

San Diego 90, San Diego State 80 | Nov. 30, 2005
SAN DIEGO -- Ross DeRogatis scored 20 points, including a go-ahead three-pointer in the second half to lift the University of San Diego to a 90-80 victory over SDSU at Jenny Craig Pavilion.

The loss ended the Aztecs' three game winning streak against the Toreros, who connected on 11-of-21 shots from beyond the arc, including a 7-for-10 clip in the second half.

USD grabbed a 27-19 lead in the first half, before SDSU stormed back with 15 unanswered points and took a 38-35 lead into the half. The Aztecs, however, could not sustain the momentum in the second half as DeRogatis' trey put the Toreros ahead to stay 42-41 with 16:30 left.

SDSU kept it close, pulling to within 56-55 after Brandon Heath nailed a jumper with 9:50 remaining. USD then went on a 15-4 run over the next four minutes to build a 71-59 cushion.

The Aztecs never got closer than eight points the rest of the way and were denied a fourth straight victory in the crosstown rivalry.

Heath led all scorers with 24 points. Marcus Slaughter tallied 23, marking the 30th time in the last 31 games the junior forward has reached double figures.

John Sharper added 12 points off the bench, while Mohamed Camara had his first career double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds.

Due to injury, Trimaine Davis missed his first game action since March 11, 2004, a span of 33 contests.

Three Honored at Great Alaska Shootout

Three Aztecs, Kyle Spain, Ryan Amoroso and D.J. Gay, were named to the Great Alaska Shootout All-Tournament team.

Spain was named the tourney's most outstanding player after averaging 18.0 points and 6.3 rebounds in 25.0 minutes in the three games.

Gay and Amoroso were all-tournament selections after averaging 9.7 and 8.0 points, respectively. Gay tied the tournament record for most three-pointers made with six in the title game vs. Hampton.

Amoroso: A Great Alaska Shootout Trivia Question Answer

Question: Who is the only player in the 31-year history of the Great Alaska Shootout to win two tournament titles?

Answer: Ryan Amoroso.

With the Aztecs winning the Great Alaska Shootout, Amoroso became the first player to have won two GAS championships after already winning the 2005 title while at Marquette.

In six Great Alaska Shootout games (three with Marquette, three with San Diego State), Ryan Amoroso scored 67 points and averaged 11.2 points in those contests. He finished his GAS career just outside the all-time scoring average leaders top-20 list for those players who have played in at least two Shootouts.

More from the Shootout

► Steve Fisher became one of 10 coaches in the history of the Great Alaska Shootout to have won a national championship and win a Shootout title.
► The Aztecs won their first tournament-style event under Steve Fisher. Prior to the win, SDSU had been 0-for-3 in such tournaments, finishing in third place at the 2005 BP Top of the World Classic and the 2003 EA Sports Maui Invitational and in second at the 2001 Ford Red Raider Classic.
► San Diego State gave up just 161 points in the three games and that total places them third all-time in fewest points allowed behind Kansas' 1984 total of 155 and the 1984 Maryland team (159).

Notes From Great Alaska Shootout Championship Game vs. Hampton

► SDSU set a tournament record for fewest points allowed in a championship first half when it gave up 16 Hampton points. The 16 points also ranks third for the fewest points allowed in the first half of any game.
► D.J. Gay put up a game-high 20 points, to post his second career 20-point game... The sophomore hit a career-high tying five three-pointers in the first half and finished a new personal best of six... Gay also had three assists, marking the fifth straight game in which he has finished with at least three assists.
► Kyle Spain scored 17 points to reach double figures for the sixth straight game... The Aztecs improve to 32-8 when scores at least 10 points in a game... His two steals matched a season high and marked the third game in a row that he has reached that total... Spain also collected a game-high tying eight rebounds and went 8-for-8 from the line for the second time this season.
► Ryan Amoroso grabbed a season-best eight rebounds and led the team in the category for the second time this year.
► Billy White, who scored 12 points, reached double figures in scoring for the first time since logging 12 against Arizona State in the second game of the year.

Multiple-Game In-Season Events Good for SDSU

With the Great Alaska Shootout win, San Diego State ran its winning streak in multiple-game in-season events to 10. Prior to going 3-for-3 in Anchorage, the Aztecs swept the three games at the World Vision Classic (2007-08) and Shamrock Invitational (2006-07). The first game of the streak actually occurred in Alaska, when the Scarlet and Black defeated Southern Miss in the third-place game of the BP Top of the World Classic in Fairbanks.

During the Steve Fisher era, the Aztecs have fared well in multiple-game in-season events as Fisher's team have gone a combined 14-3.

Spain Emerging as a Top Player in the West

Kyle Spain has been a man on a mission so far this season. Coming into his senior season, Spain had never averaged more than 13.2 points per game, but this year he has scored at least 14 points in each game and has his scoring average up to

18.0.

A main reason for the scoring increase is his improved three-point and free-throw shooting. He is much improved from beyond the arc (44.0 percent) and is shooting 93.6 percent from the stripe.

Against Fresno State, Spain had one of the best games of his career as he posted his third career double-double and his fourth career game with at least 20 points after he went for a personal-record tying 22 points and 11 rebounds. Contributing to his 22 points was an 8-for-8 performance from the free-throw line.

For an encore, Spain went for another 22 points and added eight rebounds vs. Western Carolina. The senior also dished out five assists and made 10 free throws to match his career high in both categories. His two steals were a season best and one of them came on a crucial play in the second half when he stole the ball and took it in for an And-1 dunk.

Adding to his impressive season stats, Spain was named the Great Alaska Shootout Most Outstanding Player and was named Mountain West Conference Player of the Week two days later for his efforts.

Finding His Rhythm

Senior Ryan Amoroso is finding his rhythm after missing the season opener vs. UC San Diego with a sore back.

In his first game back, Amoroso was in the starting lineup and went for seven points and seven rebounds vs. 15th-ranked Arizona State. He followed that performance with his first double-figure scoring effort of the season with 11 points, while grabbing three rebounds against Fresno State. In the semifinals of the Great Alaska Shootout vs. Seattle, Amoroso scored a season-best 13 points on 4-of-5 shooting and came back with a team-high tying eight rebounds in the championship game vs. Hampton.

Through six games played, Amoroso is shooting 42.9 percent from the field, just a few percentage points lower than last season when he earned all-Mountain West Conference third-team honors.

Dead On

Sophomore forward Billy White has been dead on when it comes to shooting, not only this season, but last year as well. Through seven games, the Las Vegas native is shooting 52.9 percent from the field (first on team), which equates to 27-for-51 from the field. In the Mountain West Conference, he is among the league leaders. Last season as a freshman, White set the school record for field-goal percentage at 61.5 percent.

Free-Throw King

Through seven games this season, Kyle Spain has been almost perfect from the free-throw line. At 6-5, Spain has made 44-of-47, is shooting 93.9 percent from the stripe and is third the Mountain West Conference (as of Dec. 3). However, the two players that hold down the top two positions are both just 15-of-16. In other words, Spain has almost three times as many makes and attempts than Andre McFarland (CSU) and Sean Ogirri (Wyoming).

Against Western Carolina, Spain tied his career high with 10 free-throws, marking just the second

time he has accomplished the feat. The last time he nailed 10 was vs. Portland at the World Vision Classic in Fresno, Calif.

When it counted the most in the championship game of the Great Alaska Shootout, Spain went 8-for-8 from the line to prevent any sort of Hampton comeback.

Against Fresno State, Spain went 8-for-8 from the free-throw line, equaling the most free-throw makes without a miss in a game in his career. The last time he went 8-for-8 was during his freshman year against Wyoming on March 1, 2006.

Spain's numbers are not surprising considering he came into the season as a career 73.7-percent shooter and was coming off a junior campaign where he shot 80.0 percent.

Aztec Signing Class of 2009 Ranked No. 15; Tops Among Non-BCS Schools

San Diego State's recruiting class of 2009 has been ranked No. 15 in the nation and No. 1 among non-BCS schools by The HOOP SCOOP Online in their exclusive rankings.

The Aztecs signed five players, which included Eric Lawton, Kawhi Leonard, Chase Tapley, Malcolm Thomas and Alec Williams, during the early signing period.

Additionally, Paul Biancardi of ESPN.com said that San Diego State was one of the non-BCS schools that made the most noise in the early signing period.

"Consistently and quietly, Steve Fisher keeps bringing talent to the Aztecs," Biancardi said. "His four-man class is led by wing Kawhi Leonard, who is a tough player and gifted scorer."

Also included in the 2009 incoming class are a pair of Division I transfers in Tyrone Shelley (Pepperdine) and Brian Carlwell (Illinois), who are currently sitting out the 2008-09 campaign due to NCAA transfer guidelines. If HOOP SCOOP were to include transfers in their rankings, which would then include 6-10 Carlwell and 6-5 Shelley, the Aztecs would have had a top-five nationally ranked recruiting class.

SDSU Picked to Finish Third in MWC

San Diego State was picked to finish in third place in the Mountain West Conference's 2008-09 preseason media poll released in October during the league's media day in Las Vegas. Below is the balance of the poll:

Steve Fisher

18th-Full Season • 10th Season at SDSU • Illinois State, 1967

Steve Fisher has guided the Aztec basketball program to unparalleled heights. In eight seasons, he has taken a program that regularly missed out on the conference postseason tournament, to one which has become of the best programs on the West Coast and has the Aztecs knocking on the door of the elite teams in the country.

The best news for SDSU fans is that Fisher signed a new five-year contract prior to the start of the 2006-07 season that will keep him in San Diego for the foreseeable future.

When Fisher arrived on the scene in March of 1999, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were set. The Aztecs were expected to lose. The year before Fisher's arrival on campus, San Diego State won just four games.

Now those days are a distant memory. Fisher guided San Diego State to the NCAA Tournament in 2002, the postseason NIT in 2003, the 2006 NCAA Tournament and the NIT the last two seasons. In addition, the Aztecs have a solid core returning and a nationally ranked recruiting class, that will keep SDSU competitive this season and seasons ahead.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene in the form of a news conference to introduce its new coach, Steve Fisher. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Steve Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Co., raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, ranking him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to the championship of the NIT as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great recent turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led SDSU back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

In 2006-07, he led SDSU to the MWC regular season and tournament crowns and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. That team finished with a Division I school-record 24 wins. And the last two seasons, Fisher has led the Aztecs to two additional 20-win seasons and postseason appearances and he doesn't look like he is stopping anytime soon.

In only allowing Hampton to score 47 points, San Diego State held its sixth straight opponent to 59 points or less. It was the first time an Aztec squad has accomplished the feat since the 1949-50 season.

SDSU became the first MWC team to win the Great Alaska Shootout allowed just 161 points over the course of three games to rank third all-time in Shootout history.

Kyle Spain scored 17 points and had a game-high tying eight rebounds as he was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player. Joining Spain on the all-tournament team were Gay and Ryan Amoroso.

GREELEY, Colo. - San Diego State avenged a 2007-08 home loss as the Aztecs downed Northern Colorado, 73-62, at Butler-Hancock Sports Pavilion.

The Aztecs and the Bears battled closely throughout the first half trading baskets until a Ryan Amoroso layup gave SDSU a 30-25 lead with 2:49 to go. From there, the Scarlet and Black would not look back, but had to hold off numerous Bear second-half runs.

Northern Colorado kept the game close in the final eight minutes of the game and got as close as three points, but the Aztecs countered each time to keep them at an arms-distance length.

San Diego State went a perfect 13-for-13 from the line in the second half to seal the victory. The Aztecs would close out the game with a 7-1 run to win by 11.

Kyle Spain scored 19 points to lead the team, reaching double figures for the seventh time in seven games.

Tim Shelton added a career-high 17 points for the Aztecs, after tying his personal best of 12 points in the first half alone. His effort was his first double-figure scoring performance of the season and third of his career. Overall for the game, Shelton went 6-for-6 from the field, 2-for-2 from three-point range and 3-for-3 from the free-throw line.

Billy White grabbed a game-high seven rebounds for SDSU.

The Bears were led by John Pena's 12 points on 5-of-6 shooting, including two three-pointers.
