2006 Season Recap




Heading into last season, all the pieces seemed to be in place for a highly successful 2006 campaign for the San Diego State women's soccer team. SDSU returned 17 letterwinners from the previous year's squad that capped off back-to-back winning seasons and scored the school's most goals (28) since 2004.

Though the season started out on a high note with the Aztecs winning the Purdue Boilermaker Challenge Cup, injuries, which cost 17 players at least one game, and a inconsistent offense derailed the promising season. The Aztecs finished with a 6-11-3 overall record and tied for fifth in the Mountain West Conference.

The season started out with the Aztecs firing on all cylinders. In West Lafayette, Ind., SDSU posted back-to-back shutouts on its way to claiming the Boilermaker Challenge Cup.

In the season-opener against Butler, it didn't take long for the Aztecs to tally their first goal of the year as sophomore Erika Sutton scored 19 minutes into the game. Freshman Cat Walker notched the first goal of her Aztec career in the second half, helping secure SDSU's 2-0 victory. San Diego State's offense overpowered the Bulldogs with a 24-9 advantage in the shots on goal statistic and junior goalkeeper Cat Burson made three saves en route to picking up her fifth career shutout.

Two days later, San Diego State returned to the field to upset No. 21 Purdue, 4-0, on the Boilermakers' home field. Sutton added two more goals to her weekend's tally and an assist on her way to being named the tournament's offensive MVP. Sophomore Jen Mello, the team's leading goal scorer in 2005, and freshman Heather Vandevanter recorded their first goals of the season, as SDSU once again out shot its opposition, 22-14. Burson made six more saves for her sixth career shutout and gained



all-tournament honors along with junior Jessica Girdner and sophomore Mariko Strickland.

San Diego State would return to the West Coast the following weekend when it traveled to eventual national semifinalist and fifth-ranked UCLA in Los Angeles. Though the Aztecs hung tough, the Bruins were able to make their lone goal nine minutes into the match hold up. SDSU missed out on its best chance to score in the 80th minute when freshman Lauren Leslie's shot from 25 yards out hit the cross bar and bounced out of bounds.

The Aztecs would then follow that loss by falling, 2-0, in the team's home opener against UC

With its record knotted at 2-2, San Diego State traveled to face UC Irvine and UC Riverside at the UC Irvine Puma Classic. The first match saw the Aztecs secure a much-needed 3-1 victory against the Anteaters, but also saw them suffer the loss of defender Millie Allen for the season, as the sophomore tore the ACL in her right knee.


Without their emotional leader, who had started the previous 26 matches, the Aztecs were defeated in the final match of the tournament, 1-0, by UC Riverside. Despite owning the 13-5 shot advantage over Highlanders, SDSU was unable to find the back of the net.

SDSU returned to the SDSU Sports Deck with a 3-3 overall record and split its following two-game homestand versus Cal State Fullerton and Creighton. Against the Titans, the Aztecs held tough in the first half holding CSF scoreless, before giving up three goals in a 12-minute span in the second half. SDSU snapped its two-game skid by defeating the Bluejays, 2-0, behind goals from Girdner and

The Aztecs then made an extremely tough threegame road trip to finish out non-conference action. The trip started at Cal Poly, where the Mustangs out shot SDSU, 14-4, on their way to a 3-0 victory. The Aztecs then traveled to face No. 19 Pepperdine, where they were blanked, 1-0, before ending the trip with a 4-0 loss at Stanford.

As the schedule turned to MWC action, the Aztecs were able to regroup going 2-0-2 in their first four games. In the conference opener, SDSU tied Air Force, 2-2, with sophomore Becky Ryan and Girdner supplying the goals. Against UNLV in the following match, SDSU played one of its best games of year by tying a season high in goals scored in a 4-1 victory over the Rebels. Mello supplied two of the goals and Walker and Vandevanter each chipped in one apiece. At No. 15 Brigham Young, the Aztecs secured a 2-2 tie in double overtime behind Burson, who made 10 stops while playing all 110 minutes. Burson would continue her strong play in the Aztecs' next game at Wyoming, where she made nine saves, helping SDSU record the 2-0 victory.

The Aztec offense stalled down the stretch as



SDSU lost four consecutive games - all shutouts - to end the regular season. New Mexico took advantage of the Aztec scoring deficiencies by notching a 2-0 win in Albuquerque. San Diego State returned to Montezuma Mesa to face No. 15 Utah, who handed the Aztecs their lone conference home loss, 2-0. The regular season ended with a pair of losses at San Diego (2-0) and TCU (1-0).

The season would end in the first game of the MWC tournament in Salt Lake City, Utah, as the No. 5 seeded Aztecs fell in a shootout (4-3) after the the game was tied at 1-1 after two overtimes against fourth-seeded New Mexico. Despite the loss, the Aztecs witnessed the potential of freshman Jessica Gordon, who scored a goal, had two shots on goal and was named to the conference's all-tournament team.

Mello would end the season leading the team in scoring for the second straight campaign with eight goals and 19 points. The Pleasanton, Calif., native took home one of the team's three MWC Player of the Week awards (Oct. 16), with Sutton and Leslie also garnering honors for their play at the Boilermaker Challenge Cup (Oct. 28).

Mello was named first team All-MWC, while Sutton earned second-team all-MWC accolades for the second consecutive season. Sutton finished the season with three goals and six assists for 12 points.
