NEWS AND NOTES (Through games of Saturday, Feb. 3)

- San Diego State opens a challenging week featuring road games against teams that are a combined 21-4 at home this season. That stretch begins Tuesday night at Fresno State with the game shown nationally by CBS Sports Network and heard on radio on 101.5 KGB, XTRA 1360 and FOX Sports IE 1350 in Southern California, and on the iHeart Radio app.
- After Saturday's game at Nevada, SDSU will end the regular season with four of its final six games at home.
- San Diego State and Fresno State will meet for the 115th time. It is the most frequently played game in school history and SDSU's 61 series victories are the most against any opponent.
- The games in Fresno have been particularly close with the last three contests decided by a total of six points. Last season, SDSU snapped a two-game losing streak at Save Mart Center with a 70-67 win (Trey Kell scored 22 points and Jeremy Hemsley added 13 points).
- Tuesday's game features two of the teams in a crowded area of the conference standings. Fresno State (6-5; tied for 5th place) and San Diego State (5-5; tied for 7th place) are part of a group of six teams, between 3rd and 8th place, separated by just a game and a half in the standings.
- On Tuesday, first-year head coach Brian Dutcher is looking for his 14th victory
 as the SDSU head coach, but the 400th as part of the Aztec coaching staff. He
 has been on the sidelines for 399 of the program's 1,455 victories (27.4 percent).
- San Diego State continued its dominant play at home last Saturday, posting a 31-point victory over Air Force (81-50). The Aztecs led wire-to-wire and won for the 63rd straight time when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- In its last six home games, the Aztecs have gone 5-1 and have outscored its opponents by 104 points (17.4 ppg). The lone blemish during that stretch was a 77-73 setback to Fresno State on Jan. 17.
- The Aztecs limited Air Force to 50 points (17.4 points below its season average) and to just 32.8 percent shooting from the field.
- Freshman Jalen McDaniels recorded his fifth double-double of the season, with a game-high 16 points and a career-high-tying 13 rebounds. He was 7-for-10 from the field.

- SDSU started two freshmen (McDaniels and Matt Mitchell) and only one senior (Malik Pope) in the game. It marked the first time the Aztecs started more freshmen than seniors in a conference game since Feb. 24, 2010, when SDSU started two freshmen (Kawhi Leonard and Chase Tapley) and no seniors.
- The Aztecs are 5-5 in conference play despite having a scoring margin of +81 in conference games. San Diego State's average scoring margin in Mountain West play of +8.1 is third in the league.
- Of San Diego State's eight losses this season, five have come in games in which SDSU was tied or led at halftime, four have come by four points or fewer, and four have come when SDSU led with five minutes to play in the game.
- With five of SDSU's eight losses coming in games in which the Aztecs were tied or led after 20 minutes, only five teams in the nation have a higher percentage of losses in games in which they have been even or ahead after 20 minutes — Tennessee. Old Dominion. Tennessee. Florida State. New Mexico State and Towson.
- Junior guard Jeremy Hemsley is playing his best basketball of the season. He has tied a season-best by scoring in double figures in three consecutive games, averaging 14.7 points and 2.3 assists during that span. He has connected on 17-of-26 shots (65.4 percent) from the field and 4-of-9 (44.4 percent) from three-point range. The career 1,000-point scorer is expected to make his second straight start, sixth start of the season and 62nd start of his career for injured Trey Kell (ankle) on Tuesday night.
- McDaniels has reached double figures in scoring in eight of his past nine games. During that stretch, he is averaging 13.8 points, 8.3 rebounds and is 47-70 (67.1 percent) from the field and 30-of-37 (81.1 percent) from the free-throw line.
- McDaniels is one of six freshmen nationally to average 9.5 points, 7.0 rebounds and shoot 60 percent or better from the field, and among those six players, he has the fewest turnovers per game (0.8). In addition, his inaugural year productivity is reminiscent of legendary Aztec and NBA Finals MVP Kawhi Leonard. See right box on page 1
- Junior forward Max Montana has scored in double figures in three consecutive games for the first time in more than a year. In his last three games, he has 44 points (highest three-game total in his 74-game career) and 13 rebounds. He has at least one trey in eight straight games, connecting on 20-44 attempts (45.5 percent) from beyond the arc during that stretch.
- Senior forward Malik Pope has scored eight or more points in 13 consecutive games (13.7 ppg) and is 70-of-132 from the field (53.0 percent) from the floor during that span. He needs just 29 points to reach 1,000 for his career.
- Junior guard **Devin Watson**, the team leader in scoring, assists and steals, has scored in double figures in 10 of his last 11 outings

- (13.0 ppg). In his last 10 contests, he is 21-of-39 (53.8 percent) from three-point range. The only SDSU player in the last 14 years to average at least four assists a game in a season was Xavier Thames (4.1 apg in 2011-12). Watson is looking to become the first Aztec player to average at least 13 points and four assists per game in the Brian Dutcher/Steve Fisher era (since 1999-00).
- The Aztecs' freshman class of McDaniels, Mitchell and Jordan Schakel has had a tremendous season and put together a string of impressive performances. For the season, the trio is averaging 23.3 points, 13.5 rebounds and 3.3 assists. In conference play, the classmates are averaging 25.9 points, 14.3 rebounds and 3.7 assists. See right box previous page
- The freshmen class accounted for a season-high total of 78 minutes against Air Force on Saturday.
- San Diego State has been extremely unfortunate this season. The Aztecs have lost five games in which SDSU had a lead in the final five minutes of the game and is 1-5 in games decided by four points or less.
- San Diego State is 11-2 this season when owning an advantage in field-goal percentage and 11-1 when attempting more free throws.

SERIES HISTORY VS. FRESNO STATE

- The game between San Diego State and Fresno State will mark the 115th in the series. The 114 previous meetings is the most against any opponent in school history, easily outdistancing itself from the 93 all-time meetings with UC Santa Barbara.
- The Aztecs hold an eight-game edge over the Bulldogs in the all-time series, 61-53, and have won 11 of the last 16. San Diego State owns a commanding 39-19 lead in games played in San Diego, including wins in six of the last eight meetings. In games played in Fresno, however, SDSU is 21-31, but has won five of the last seven meetings, including last year.
- Five of the last seven meetings in Fresno have been decided by 10 points or less. The Aztecs had won last three straight games at Save Mart Center by a total of 22 points before losing two in a row by three combined points. Last year proved more of the same with the Aztecs claiming a 70-67 win to snap Fresno State's 13-game home conference winning streak and nine-game overall home
- The series has been one of streaks. The Aztecs started the series in 1940 by winning the first eight meetings and 15 of the first 16. As the series progressed, SDSU went on to win 29 of the first 33 contests, going up to 1956. Beginning with the second game of the season series in 1956, the Bulldoas won three straight and 15 of the next 18, During that 18-agme span, Fresno State ran off six consecutive victories as well. After trading wins for a few seasons, in 1969, the Aztecs lost five in a row and then won the next eight. It wasn't until 1985 that another streak began as the Bulldogs won seven straight and 17 of 18 before SDSU pulled the upset in 2001, which was the first of the Aztecs' eight-game series winning streak, which was stopped in Fresno in 2015. Since that loss, the Bulldogs own a 4-3 edge.

ILL-TIMED INJURIES TAKING THEIR TOLL

■ Entering Tuesday's game, San Diego State student-athletes have missed 11 games this season due to injury or illness. However, that does not begin to tell the story of the impact injuries have had during the 2017-18 season. In addition to the 11 man-games missed this season, there have been five other times, all in losses, that a significant Aztec player has been unable to finish the game due to injury. Below is a look at how these injuries and illnesses have come into play in losses during the season.

HEMSLEY REACHES SCORING MILESTONE

- Jeremy Hemsley needed 14 points to reach 1,000 points for his career and the junior hit the mark plus-one when he converted a layup with 15:07 left in the second half at UNLY on Jan. 27. The basket gave him 15 points before he finished with a team-high 19.
- He is the 32nd member of the Aztecs' 1.000-point club and the first to join it since Trev Kell (Feb. 12, 2017).

- San Diego State boasts three 1,000-point scorers in Devin Watson (1,133), Trey Kell (1,292) and Jeremy Hemsley (1,005).
- Kell and Hemsley have scored all 1,000 points while in an SDSU uniform, marking the ninth time a pair Aztecs have had at least 1.000 points and been on the same team at the same time. It's the first occurrance since 2012-13, when Jamaal Franklin and Chase Tapley both hit the milestone.
- SDSU has never had a trio of 1,000-point scorers (all points scored while at San Diego State) on the same team in school history.

POPE CLOSING IN ON A GRAND

■ Malik Pope is quickly closing in on the 1,000-point scoring plateau for his career having scored 971 points in 114 games. He is looking to become the 33rd member on SDSU's list.

■ He is trying to follow in the footsteps of Jeremy Hemsley, who accomplished the feat at UNLY on Jan. 27.

BALANCED SCORING

- San Diego State currently has four players averaging double figures in scoring (Devin Watson 13.2, Malik Pope 12.9, Matt Mitchell 10.3, Trey Kell 10.2). The Aztecs have not finished a season with four double-digit scorers since the 2010-11 campaign (Kawhi Leonard 15.5, Malcolm Thomas 11.4, D.J. Gay 10.3, Billy White 10.3). That team won the Mountain West championship, advanced to the Sweet 16 and finished with a 34-3 record.
- Jalen McDaniels is getting close to reaching a double-figure average in scoring at 9.5 points per game. Only twice has SDSU had five players average at least 10 points in its Division I history (1970-71, 1972-73).

IMPRESSIVE FIRST-YEAR CLASS

SDSU's freshman class of Jalen McDaniels, Matt Mitchell and Jordan Schakel is close to joining the top 10 list of highest scoring freshman classes in the program's Division I history. The trio has scored 489 points and needs 502 to own the 10th-place slot.

HELPING HAND

Devin Watson is currently averaging 4.2 assists, which would be the highest assist average since Richie Williams dished out 4.6 per game during the 2006-07 season. If the season ended today, Watson's average would rank third at SDSU since at least the 1996-97 campaign.

PIN-POINT ACCURACY

Jalen McDaniels is shooting 60.2 percent from the field (64.6 percent on two-point field-goal attempts) and that is after an 8-for-24 start to his career (33.3 percent). His current shooting percentage would rank fifth in SDSU single-season history and is the highest since Leon Carter made 60.5 percent of his attempts as a freshman in 2006-07.

SHARING IS CARING

- San Diego State had 25 assists on 35 baskets in the home game vs. San José State. It marked the Aztecs' most in a Mountain West game. The MW is in its 19th season.
- The Aztecs equaled that performance at home vs. Colorado State when they had another 25 assists on 35 buckets.
- SDSU's first 25-assist effort this season was its most since recording 27 vs. St. Katherine College on Dec. 27, 2013, and its most vs. a Division I foe since Dec. 12, 2006, vs. Campbell. It was the fifth highest total vs. any opponent since at least the 1996-97 campaign.
- With San Diego State's 25-assist performance vs. CSU, it became the third program to have two 25-assist games in the 2018 calendar year, joining Oakland and Wichita State.

GONE-ZAGA

- San Diego State's win vs. then No. 12/15 Gonzaga snapped the Bulldog's 12-game road winning streak, which was the longest among all Division I schools.
- It was also the highest-ranked AP Top 25 team the Aztecs had defeated since Jan. 14, 2012, when they downed No. 12 UNLV, and it was the highest-ranked non-conference AP Top 25 fee they had beaten since they won at No. 11 Gonzaga on Nov. 16, 2010.

SDSU VS. THE AP TOP 25

- SDSU is 8-8 over the last five seasons vs. teams ranked in the AP Top 25 Poll.
- In home games vs. teams ranked in the AP poll, the Aztecs are 6-2 in their last eight.
- San Diego State is 2-2 over the last four seasons on the road vs. AP-ranked teams.

SECRET SOCIETY

Malik Pope is one of 12 players nationally, and the only one in the Pacific Time Zone, that is averaging at least 12.5 points and 6.5 rebounds, while shooting at least 53.0 percent from the floor and 39.0 percent from three (min. 25 3FGA), through Feb. 3 games.

MATT MITCH311

Matt Mitchell has 32 three-pointers to his credit and that comes after an 0-for-10 start from behind the arc to begin his college career. Among true freshmen nationally, standing at least 6-6, his season total is the 16th most nationally, through Feb. 3 games.

CRASHING THE BOARDS

- Jalen McDaniels' 13-rebound effort vs. Sacramento State occurred in the freshman's fifth game of his career. It marked the fastest double-figure rebounding performance to start a career since Skylar Spencer accomplished the feat in his fifth game in 2012-13.
- McDaniels' two double-digit rebounding efforts in his first nine games of his career is the best performance by a freshman since Kawhi Leonard had three in his first nine games back in 2009-10.

CASHING IN

- The Aztecs are shooting 73.0 percent from the free-throw line, which would break the Division I school record of 72.8 (2005-06).
- SDSU is 321-for-440 from the line compared to its foe's effort of 245-for-342.

THREE AMIGOS

- Devin Watson's 26-point, 5-steal effort at San Diego put him in a select group in recent SDSU history. The junior joined Jason Richey (Dec. 3, 1996) and Jamaal Franklin (Dec. 30, 2011) as the only players to put up at least 25 points and five steals in a single game.
- At the end of the night in Linda Vista, Watson was the ninth Division I player to accomplish the feat this season.

QUICKER TEMPO

San Diego State ranks 105th nationally in adjusted tempo, according to KenPom.com (through Feb. 3). That number is a huge improvement over the last several seasons when the Aztecs ranked 309th last year (2016-17) and 321st the season before (2015-16). Since 2007-08, SDSU's average ranking in adjusted tempo had been 263rd nationally.

PART OF THE LEGACY

- Devin Watson and Trey Kell etched their names in the Wooden Legacy record book with their all-tournament team appointment. Watson in three games averaged a team-best 17.0 points, while adding 3.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 1.3 steals. Kell, meanwhile, averaged 14.3 points, 4.7 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 1.7 steals. Combined, they were 20-for-26 from the free-throw line.
- Jalen McDaniels (7.0 ppg, 7.3 rpg), Matt Mitchell (12.0 ppg, 4.7 rpg) and Malik Pope (6.7 ppg, 4.3 rpg) were named to the Wooden Legacy honorable mention list.

QUIETING UGA

- SDSU defeated Georgia in the semifinals of the Wooden Legacy and in the process, picked up its first win over a current SEC school since Dec. 21, 1985, when it beat Florida in Las Vegas.
- SDSU rallied from a 12-point first-half deficit to earn the hard-fought 75-68 victory 18 hours after beating Sacramento State.
- The win marked the Aztecs' third vs. a current SEC school. They also defeated Missouri in San Diego on Dec. 21, 1978.

TOURNAMENT SUCCESS

- San Diego State, which won the 2016 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic last season, has experienced success in 8-team tournament events. SDSU is 15-3 in those type of events since the start of the 2008-09 campaign after going 2-1 at the 2017 Wooden Legacy.
- During the current run, Aztecs have played for the title all six times, winning the 2009 Great Alaska Shootout, the 2013 Wooden Legacy and the 2016 Diamond Head Classic. SDSU fell short in the '12 Diamond Head, the '14 Maui Invitational and the '17 Wooden.
- Next season, the Aztecs will be part of the 2018 Maui Invitational field that includes Arizona, Auburn, Duke, Gonzaga, Illinois, Iowa State and Xavier.

NEW TO YOU, BUT NOT TO SDSU

- Although new to head coaching at SDSU, Brian Dutcher is no stranger to the university or the program. The 19th-year Aztec coach experienced 386 victories and 10 Mountain West titles while atop Montezuma Mesa in the 18 seasons with Steve Fisher at the wheel.
- In those 18 years, Dutcher also helped the Aztecs to 13 postseason tournaments, including eight NCAA appearances and a pair of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014).

ALL-AROUND PERFORMANCE

- Jeremy Hemsley turned in 10 points, six assists and three steals, while committing just one turnover in 22 minutes vs. San Diego Christian. He is the 11th Aztec to have at least that stat line in a game since at least 1996-97, and the first to do so since Chase Tapley vs. Bryant on Nov. 11, 2011.
- He is the second Aztec to accomplish the feat while playing less than 30 minutes, joining Chad Nelson, who did it on Jan. 25, 1997, in 25 minutes vs. Hawai'i.

STAR-STUDDED COMPANY

- Matt Mitchell received the starting nod for Brian Dutcher, making him the first true freshman since Jeremy Hemsley to start in their debut. Hemsley was later named Mountain West Freshman of the Year and is a two-time all-conference selection. Prior to Hemsley, Trey Kell earned the nod in his first game at SDSU and has become a two-time all-MW performer.
- Mitchell is just the 15th freshman to start a season-opening game with Dutcher on the bench, dating back to the 1988-89 campaign, and the 10th while Dutcher has been at SDSU. The others are Juwan Howard, Jalen Rose, Chris Webber, Jerod Ward, Albert White, Bradley Jackson, Steve Sir, Brandon Heath, Richie Williams, D.J. Gay, Tim Shelton, Kawhi Leonard, Kell and Hemsley.

POINTS ON POINTS ON POINTS

- San Diego State scored 98 points in the exhibition vs. UCSD. The Aztecs scored more than that once last season (100 vs. Savannah State). Outside of that, SDSU scored more than 80 points three other times (SD Christian, vs. Tulsa, vs. Boise State) in 2016-17.
- So far this season, the Aztecs have hit the 75-point plateau 15 times.
- The last three seasons, the Aztecs have averaged 61.8 points per game in 2014-15, 68.6 in 2015-16, and 68.5 in 2016-17.
- The school record for points per game for an entire season is 86.9, which occurred in SDSU's first season as a Division I member (1970-71). San Diego State is currently averaging 78.8 points.

TOUGH OUT AT HOME

■ SDSU has been one of the hardest teams to beat at home since the start of the 2005-06 campaign.

Included in that stretch are victories at Kansas, at Arizona, at Gonzaga, at New Mexico (four times), at UNLV (nine times), at California, at Utah State (twice), at Utah and at USC. Also included are neutral court victories over UCLA, California (twice), Marquette, Creighton, Georgia, New Mexico, BYU (twice), Oklahoma, Pittsburgh and St. John's.

STREAKING THROUGH CALIFORNIA

- SDSU had won 47 straight games vs. teams from the state of California, a streak that dated to Dec. 2, 2009, before falling at Fresno State, 59-57, on Jan. 3, 2015.
- The Aztecs are now 66-8 in their last 74 vs. California schools and 53-2 in their last 55 vs. non-league California teams (53-1 in last 54 in games played indoors).
- San Diego State has also beaten seven Pac-12 schools during this remarkable run.
- The 47-game winning streak vs. California schools was the longest active streak in the country ahead of second-place BYU (22 straight vs. Colorado teams) and Pittsburgh (22 straight vs. Pennsylvania teams).

NICE RUN

- San Diego State is a member of the California State University system and it had won 22 straight home games against CSU schools dating to the 2000-01 campaign. The streak ended on Feb. 22, 2017, when Fresno State earned a 63-55 victory. Prior to the defeat, the Aztecs' last loss to a Cal State school at home happened back on Jan. 5, 2000, against Cal State Fullerton.
- The Aztecs are now 23-2 in their last 25 games vs. CSU teams.
- SDSU has also won 22 consecutive non-conference games vs. its fellow CSU institutions. The Aztecs have not suffered a loss since Nov. 27, 2000, at Fresno State (WAC).

PRETTY GOOD WHEN LOW ON TIME

The Aztecs have been good at preparing when short on time. When there is less than 24 hours to prepare, SDSU is 18-2 in its last 20 regular-season tries.

ATOP THE MOUNTAIN

■ Since the beginning of the Mountain West in 1999-00, San Diego State has the most men's basketball championships than any other current member of the league, which is a remarkable feat considering the Aztecs went 0-14 in league play the first season (1999-2000) and 4-10 the second year (2000-01). Here is the list of current Mountain West schools with their regular-season championships (includes ties) and tournament championships: 1. San Diego State 10, 2. New Mexico 8, t-3. UNLV 3, t-3. 



1st Season ● 19th Season Overall at SDSU ● Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher, a long-time San Diego State men's basketball assistant coach, is entering his first season as head coach following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017. Dutcher, who was on Montezuma Mesa for all of Fisher's 18 seasons, held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting the previous six years and is the program's 15th head coach.

Over the course of his time at San Diego State, Dutcher helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 13 times, including eight trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 10 Mountain West titles and record 12 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games seven times and captured seven MW championships (five regular season, two tournament).

Dutcher arrived at SDSU shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 season that produced the school's first Mountain West regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories.

The run to the NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11 when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and a freshman named Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher from associate head coach to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2011-12 NCAA tournament as an at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next season, SDSU was again an at-large selection to the 2013 NCAA tournament, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the season by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an atlarge invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, San Diego State won three games and qualified for the NIT national semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

More recently, San Diego State completed the 2016-17 slate with a 19-14 record despite experiencing a rash of injuries. The 2016 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic champions will enter 2017-18 as one of 12 teams to have won at least 19 games in 12 consecutive seasons.

Before Dutcher arrived at San Diego State, he served as assistant coach and later associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher. He spent 10 seasons on the Wolverine staff, establishing himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches. His first year in Ann Arbor was 1989 and resulted in a national title for Michigan as he assisted then-interim head coach Fisher on the bench.

The Bloomington, Minn., native led UM's recruiting efforts in 1990-91 when the Wolverines inked Juwan Howard, Ray Jackson, Jimmy King, Jalen Rose and Chris Webber. The "Fab Five" is considered perhaps the best recruiting class in NCAA history. Dutcher helped lead that group to nearly 100 wins, two berths in the NCAA championship game and a regional final over a four-year period. He was also on the Michigan staff for an NIT championship (1997).

Dutcher's recruiting prowess, however, was demonstrated by more than just the "Fab Five" haul. Michigan had the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1993-94 and in 1994-95, with a group that included Maurice Taylor and Jerod Ward. The accomplishment marked the first time that a university had the nation's top class in consecutive years, according to recruiting analyst Bob Gibbons.

Dutcher was born Oct. 30, 1959, in Alpena, Mich. He attended Jefferson High School in Bloomington, Minn., and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1982. While an undergraduate, he worked for his father, then-Gopher head coach Jim Dutcher. He then spent one season in the prep ranks at Apple Valley (Minn.) High School before becoming a graduate assistant at Illinois, where he earned his master's degree in physical education and athletic administration.

While in Champaign, Dutcher helped Lou Henson lead the Illini to a Big Ten championship, two appearances in the Sweet 16 and one regional final.

Dutcher's first full-time coaching job came at South Dakota State, where he spent three seasons helping turn around the Division II program before departing in 1988 for Michigan.

His final season in Ann Arbor ended with the Wolverines claiming the first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship.





SAN DIEGO - San Diego State opened the Brian Dutcher Era with a 91-52 victory over San Diego Christian at Viejas Arena. The game marked the first of Dutcher's head coaching career after serving as an assistant under Steve Fisher for 18 seasons.

The Dutcher-led Aztecs opened the night by scoring 14 unanswered points and were never threatened the rest of the night. SDSU kept the Hawks from reaching double digits for almost 10 minutes. A basket by Derrick Novsek gave San Diego Christian its ninth and 10th points with 10:43 left in the first half to make it a 27-10 game.

The Aztecs led at halftime, 46-24, thanks to 56.7-percent shooting. On two-point attempts alone, SDSU was connecting at a 76.2-percent clip (16-21).

The second half was more of the same from San Diego State as it made 55.6 percent from the floor and made 11 of 13 attempts from the charity stripe. Defensively, SDSU did not allow the Hawks to get to the free-throw line. For the game, San Diego Christian was 3-for-4 from the charity stripe.

SDSU had two players reach double figures in scoring, but had six others score at least six points. Malik Pope made nine of his 11 shot attempts for a game-high 20 points. Jeremy Hemsley chipped in 10 points to go with a game-high six assists.

Pope received the starting assignment and was joined by three players who had never suited up for the Aztecs in graduate transfer Kameron Rooks, junior transfer Devin Watson and true freshman Matt Mitchell. Senior Trey Kell filled out the group.

TEMPE, Ariz. - San Diego State rallied from a 10-point first-half deficit to lead at halftime, but could not hold its advantage as Arizona State stormed back in the second half to defeat the Aztecs, 90-68, at Wells Fargo Arena.

SDSU scored the first five points of the game and enjoyed a three-point lead through the first media timeout. The tide began to turn with a De'Quon Lake layup, which led to another by Kodi Justice, but Devin Watson and Malik Pope connected for an alleyoop to help the Aztecs regain the lead at 11-10 with 13:41 left.

With the Aztecs up, 47-45, the Sun Devils outscored the Aztecs, 31-5, over the next 10:11, to take a 76-52 lead with 6:56 left in the game. SDSU never got closer than 18 points the rest of the

Trey Kell led the Aztecs with 16 points and 10 rebounds with Pope adding 14 points and eight boards. Montana finished with 15 points.

Tra Holder had 24 points for an ASU side that featured five double-figures scorers.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State bounced back from its first loss of the season and handled McNeese, 83-52, at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs scored the first nine points of the game and never looked back, leading from wire-to-wire. The Cowboys, however, made it somewhat of a game shortly after SDSU's ninth point, rallying to get within 13-11. From there, San Diego State put up seven unanswered points to lead by nine again.

The 7-0 run was a glimpse of what was to come the rest of the first half as it was a part of an opening-period-ending 26-8 blitz of McNeese, which trailed at halftime, 46-19. The Cowboys made just eight of their 32 attempts from the field, including a 1-for-11 effort from three-point distance in the first 20 minutes.

The second half was more of the same from the Aztecs, so much so that head coach Brian Dutcher sat all five of his starters with 10:47 left in the game. SDSU led by as many as 32 points in the final 10 minutes to cruise to the 31-point win.

Three of the Aztecs' five starters reached double figures in scoring and the group was led by Devin Watson's season-high 20 points. The junior added eight assists and just one turnover, giving him 17 assists and three miscues in his last two games.

SAN DIEGO - Freshman Matt Mitchell totaled 31 points on 10-14 shooting, including a 7-11 mark from three-point range as SDSU defeated Eastern Illinois, 94-63, at Viejas Arena on Monday night.

The Aztecs never trailed in the contest, and jumped out to an 18-point lead (26-8) just 9:54 into the first half. SDSU went into halftime with a 40-25 lead.

After Malik Pope nearly had a double double in the first half alone with 13 points and seven rebounds, Mitchell stole the show in the second half, recording 26 of SDSU's 54 second-half points in just 16 minutes of action.

SDSU used a 20-4 run in the second half to build a 76-45 lead with 8:25 left. During the run, Mitchell erupted for 16 points in only four and a half minutes, while the Aztecs as a team converted on seven of its eight shot attempts.

Pope finished with his first double double of the year and eighth of his career, tallying 17 points and 11 rebounds. Trey Kell and Devin Watson reached double figures with 14 and 10 points, respectively, while Kell tied his career-high with seven assists.

Mitchell's 31 points were the most by a freshman since Evan Burns scored 31 vs. New Mexico in 2003. With seven three-pointers on the night, Mitchell set a new freshman record, while his 31 points were the fourth most by any freshman in the nation this season. The seven converted three-pointers were also tied for second most nationally and the fourth most by an Aztec since 1996-97.

Eastern Illinois was led by Jajuan Starks' 17 points and seven rebounds.

FULLERTON, Calif. - San Diego State led Sacramento State, 12-0, before the game was three minutes old and cruised to victory in the quarterfinal round of the Wooden Legacy, 89-52, at Titan Gym on the campus of Cal State Fullerton.

The Hornets committed three turnovers and missed both of their shots, each of which were three-point attempts, and the Aztecs made five of their first six shots to race out to the 12-0

Both teams went scoreless for the next 1:42 before Sacramento State snapped its scoreless streak with a Izayah Mauriohooho-Le'afa free throw with 15:24 left. SDSU ended up closing the half on a 37-13 run to take a 49-14 lead at halftime.

In the first half, San Diego State limited Sacramento State to 23.1-percent shooting, including an 0-for-13 effort from behind the three-point arc. The Aztecs, meanwhile, knocked down seven three-pointers and were 12-of-15 from the charity stripe.

When action resumed, SDSU grew its lead to 47 points, leading 65-18, with 15:12 to play. Soon thereafter, all of the Aztecs' starters were out of the game.

The Hornets nearly outscored San Diego State in the second half, putting up 40 points and allowing 38 to the Aztecs. Despite the nearly equal half, SDSU never let the Hornets get closer than 37 points.

Devin Watson led the Aztecs with 12 points and Jalen McDaniels grabbed a career-high 13 rebounds. Kell and Matt Mitchell each had 11 points and Jeremy Hemsley added 10.

FULLERTON, Calif. - San Diego State rallied from a 12-point firsthalf deficit and defeated Georgia, 75-68, in the semifinals of the Wooden Legacy.

The Aztecs won by doing the little things, such as outrebounding the Bulldogs, 48-44, taking and making more free throws, and committing a season-low five turnovers. All of that, however, was not present during an opening-game run that saw Georgia jump out to a 16-4 lead nearly eight minutes into the game.

The Bulldogs led 6-0 before Trey Kell ended SDSU's 0-for-8 start from the field to begin the contest. On the Aztecs' second possession following the Kell bucket, Malik Pope was issued a foul and then a technical, giving him three personal fouls with 15:11 left. He did not return until the second half.

SDSU, meanwhile, plugged away without its leading scorer and rebounder, and went on a 7-0 run to get within five points. Georgia, however, answered with back-to-back threes to push its lead back to double figures.

The Aztecs later went on an 18-3 run to take a 31-27 lead with four minutes to go and eventually went into halftime down, 34-

The second half was a back-and-forth affair and the score was tied at 61 with 5:12 remaining after Matt Mitchell made two free throws. Georgia moved ahead, 64-63, on a trey by William Jackson II, but the Aztecs responded with a Pope tip-in and a Mitchell three. The four points were part of a larger 13-3 run that put SDSU ahead by eight in a game it won by seven.

Devin Watson had a team-high 16 points, Kell turned in 13 points and a game-high nine rebounds, and Mitchell finished with 13 points. Jalen McDaniels added a career-high 11 points and eight rebounds.

FULLERTON, Calif. - San Diego State fell short in its bid for a second Wooden Legacy championship, dropping a 93-86 decision in the title game to Washington State.

The Aztecs took a 73-64 lead after Matt Mitchell knocked down a three-pointer with 8:25 left in the second half, but the advantage soon evaporated. An 11-2 Cougar run buoyed by a trio of three-pointers, including a pair from Viont'e Daniels, leveled the score at 75.

The game was tied twice more, but only briefly, as Malachi Flynn made his first free throw to make it 79-79 and then converted the second with 3:58 to play. From there, Washington State scored five straight points to move ahead by six.

The Aztecs got to within three points on two different occasions in the final 1:23 only to have WSU answer with two points of its own each time to end the threat.

The first-half was a see-saw battle with Washington State taking threes on every other shot. Of WSU's 30 field-goal attempts, 16 were from behind the arc. Its effort, however, helped it take a 46-43 lead at halftime after it connected on eight treys.

As for the Aztecs, they struggled to shoot the three, making eight for the game, with six coming in the first half. Half of their threes came from SDSU's starting backcourt of Devin Watson and Trey Kell as both made a pair en route to 23 and 19 points, respectively. Watson added six assists and Kell had four steals.

San Diego State, however, suffered a pair of big blows, losing leading scorer and rebounder Malik Pope, and Kell to ankle injuries. Pope played 14 first-half minutes and was unavailable in the second. Kell, meanwhile, suffered his injury with 6:38 left in the game before returning with 3:58 to go. The Aztecs were up by five when Kell left the game and were down one when he returned.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State, playing without two of its top six players, defeated San Diego, 66-57, at Jenny Craig Pavilion to notch its 11th win in its last 12 series meetings.

The Aztecs, who were without Max Montana and Trey Kell due to injuries, rode the back of Devin Watson. The junior guard knocked down all six of his shot attempts in the first half to lead SDSU offensively, while the defense collectively shut down the Toreros attack.

USD took a 7-6 lead with 16:11 left in the first half after Isaiah Pineiro connected on a jumper. After that, the Aztec defense forced the Toreros into missing eight straight shots before a Juwan Gray snapped San Diego's scoring drought. By then, the Aztecs were ahead, 13-8, and then responded by making USD miss an additional six shots in a row.

The Aztecs only led, 30-22, at halftime as a result of seven first-half turnovers, but it was their defense that stole the headlines. SDSU limited USD to just 27.3-percent shooting, including a 2-for-15 effort from behind the three-point line, in the first half.

Despite its shooting woes, San Diego stuck with it and cut its deficit to four points on two different occasions, the last coming with 15:23 left in regulation. The Aztecs, however, answered with seven consecutive points to keep the Toreros at bay.

USD later trailed by nine points with just over 10 minutes to play, but that would be as close as it would get until the waning moments when it decided to send the Aztecs to the free-throw line.

With Montana out with a knee injury and Kell unable to go due to an ankle injury despite giving it a go during warm-ups, Watson scored a season-high 26 points to go with five steals. Matt Mitchell was a perfect 4-for-4 from the floor en route to 13 points and Jeremy Hemsley added 11 points in just his second start of the year.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State rallied from a 14-point second-half deficit, but let the game slip away in the final minutes, falling to California at home, 63-62.

The Aztecs trailed by their largest margin with 16:53 left in the second half (48-34) and found themselves down, 53-40, with 13:10 to go in the game. A methodical comeback by SDSU, one that saw it outscore the Golden Bears, 18-3, over an 8:43 span, gave the home side a 58-56 lead with 4:27 to play.

The Aztecs scored the game's first 11 points and never looked back in winning in wire-to-wire fashion. SDSU received three straight treys from Matt Mitchell, Devin Watson and Mitchell once again to move ahead, 9-0. Malik Pope capped the run with a jumper before the game was four minutes old.

The pace was rapid so much so that the first media timeout came with 11:27 left and the Aztecs up, 16-10. SDSU later pushed its lead to 22-10, before the Bulldogs closed the final eight minutes on a 13-3 run. At halftime, San Diego State found itself ahead, 25-23.

SDSU led by no more than four points for the first nine minutes of the second half and held onto a one-point lead on four different occasions. The Aztecs, however, had an answer in the form of a defensive stop or a basket.

San Diego State created some breathing room when Jeremy Hemsley hit one of his two three-pointers with just under 11 minutes to play. The bucket was a part of a 9-3 spurt that helped the Aztecs extend their lead to seven.

SDSU later led by eight, but withstood two more Gonzaga runs, both of which got the Bulldogs to within two points, once with 2:26 to go and the other with 1:36 left.

The latter was answered by Trey Kell, who did not get a full practice in during the 12-day break due to a thigh bruise. The senior scored four consecutive points and Mitchell added a pair of free throws to put the home side ahead, 68-60, with 37 seconds left.

Gonzaga made a trio of threes and a free throw to close out the game, but SDSU made four of its last five from the charity stripe to emerge with the win.

LARAMIE, Wyo. - San Diego State allowed Wyoming to shoot 55.2 percent from the field in the second half, including a 7-for-12 performance from three-point distance, which helped the Cowboys erase a three-point halftime deficit and turn it into an 82-69 home win

Wyoming received a huge performance from Hayden Dalton, who hurt the Aztecs nearly every time he touched the ball. The forward scored 36 points on 10-of-17 shooting and an 11-for-14 effort from the charity stripe to go with 15 rebounds, five assists, two blocked shots and one steal in 37 minutes. In the first half alone, he had 17 points and seven assists.

Despite the impressive showing by Dalton, the Aztecs managed to lead, 40-37, at halftime thanks to Malik Pope and a solid team defensive effort. Pope had 13 points and six rebounds at intermission, and the defense held the Cowboys to 36.7 percent shooting and a 5-for-17 performance from behind the arc. In fact, SDSU forced Wyoming into missing nine of its final 10 three-point shots to end the half.

Things, however, changed once play resumed. As cold as the Cowboys were to end the half, they were the opposite in the second period, hitting seven of their first 11 threes. SDSU, which led by five points with 17:03 left, all of sudden found itself down, 71-57, with 9:54 to play.

Wyoming later led by as many as 19 points before the final media timeout and ultimately settled for the 13-point victory.

Pope led SDSU with a season-high 21 points on a career-best 10 made field goals. Devin Watson added 13 points and Matt Mitchell for the third straight game made three treys en route to 11 points. Jalen McDaniels, meanwhile, pulled down a team-high 10 rebounds in his first career start.

SAN DIEGO - Juniors Devin Watson (15) and Max Montana (14) paced four San Diego State players with at least 13 points as the Aztecs defeated Utah State for a 10th consecutive time, 79-59.

San Diego State never trailed in handing the Aggies their worst loss of the season and tied the largest margin of victory for the Aztecs in a regular-season game against Utah State.

The Aztecs had comfortable advantages in rebounds (36-27) and turnovers (10-19) in improving to 6-1 at home and 1-1 in Mountain West Conference play this season.

In the first half, the Aztecs used an aggressive defense to get Utah Sate out of its half court execution game. SDSU forced 13 first half miscues by the Aggies and enjoyed a 17-0 lead in points off of turnovers after 20 minutes.

Having built a 14-point halftime advantage, the Aztecs remained in complete control in the second half and did not have a lead of less than 10 points in the final 23 minutes of the contest.

Watson reached double figures for the second game in a row and the ninth time this season with 15 points.

Montana snapped out of an O-for-15 three-point field goal slump by connecting on three treys en route to 14 points.

Senior Malik Pope scored nine or more points for a fifth straight game, tallying 13 points and pulling down seven rebounds.

True freshman Jalen McDaniels continued his stellar play with 13 points and eight rebounds. He led the team on the galss for a third consecutive game and has averaged 8.8 boards in his last five contests.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. - San Diego State used timely baskets and hot shooting in the second half to pull away from home-standing Colorado State, 77-68, at Moby Arena.

The Aztecs shot 60.0 percent in the second half, including 60.0 percent from behind the three-point arc, to help aid 11 miscues in the final 20 minutes

The 11 turnovers led to SDSU giving away an eight-point lead and the Rams moved out front, 61-60, with 5:35 left. Jalen McDaniels, however, scored on a layup and Jordan Schakel knocked down a trey on the Aztecs' next possession to give the visitors a four-point lead.

Later, Trey Kell gave SDSU a five-point cushion with a jumper and then provided the Aztecs their next points, this time a threepointer to put San Diego State ahead, 71-66, with 1:14 to go.

CSU's last effort translated into a J.D. Paige bucket to bring the Rams to within three points with 58 seconds to play. Malik Pope, however, made a jump hook to extend the Aztecs' lead and Colorado State would get no closer.

McDaniels led San Diego State with a career-high 19 points and pulled down a game-high 10 rebounds. The redshirt freshman made 8-of-11 from the field and added two steals in 29 minutes.

Jeremy Hemlsey came off the bench to provide 13 points after he made all three of his three-point attempts. Kell and Devin Watson each scored 11 points and between the two of them, had nine of SDSU's 15 assists.

Paige led Colorado State with 22 points. Anthony Bonner added 13 points and Prentiss Nixon scored 11 for a Rams side that trailed at halftime, 34-31.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State used a 16-2 second-half-opening run to break open what was a nine-point halftime lead to ultimately defeat visiting San José State, 85-49, at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs' 16-2 outburst was a part of a larger 26-4 run that spanned the final 4:31 of the first half and the first 5:11 of the second period. The Spartans cut SDSU's lead to 22-21 only to have Jalen McDaniels make the second of three straight baskets to put the home side in front by one.

The McDaniels dunk sparked a 10-2 first-half-ending spurt that put San Diego State out in front, 32-23, at intermission. SJSU answered by scoring on its first possession once play resumed before succumbing to the Aztec full-court press and giving up 16 straight points, the last of which came on a Malik Pope trey. At this point, San Diego State enjoyed a 48-25 lead with 14:49 to go.

The Aztecs pushed their lead to as many as 40 twice down the stretch before settling for the 36-point win, which was their second-largest margin of victory in Mountain West history.

Pope led a balanced San Diego State attack with a game-hightying 17 points on 8-of-10 shooting. Max Montana hit a flurry of three-pointers late to also finish with 17 points. Junior classmate Devin Watson put up 15 points and six assists, and McDaniels chipped with 13 points, a team-high seven rebounds and a game-high four steals. Trey Kell, meanwhile, added a career-high-tying seven assists.

As a team, SDSU held the Spartans to just 30.8 percent from the field, which included a 1-for-11 performance from three-point range. Keith Fisher led SJSU with 14 points, but Ryan Welage, the team's leading scorer, had just eight points on 3-for-14 shooting.

BOISE, Idaho - SDSU overcame an 11-point first-half deficit and nearly overcame 44 points from Boise State's Chandler Hutchison in what turned out to be an 83-80 road loss to the Broncos.

Hutchison scored Boise State's first 16 points to carry the home team to a 16-9 lead with under 11 minutes to play in the first period. The Broncos' lead swelled to 11 with 6:37 left after a Zach Haney three-pointer and once again with 4:11 to go before half-time after a Chris Sengfelder triple.

The Aztecs, however, cut their deficit to six points by halftime after Max Montana nailed a trey and Matt Mitchell hit a lay-up in the final minute.

SDSU used that momentum once play resumed and scored six straight points, including four off Malik Pope dunks, to level the score at 40 apiece. Boise State moved out in front again, leading by six points with 10:44 to go, but San Diego State used a 9-0 run to take a 64-61 lead.

It was a see-saw battle down the stretch with SDSU tying the score, 77-77, with 2:11 to play after a Mitchell bucket. With just over a minute remaining, the Broncos led by four only to have Pope slash the deficit in half with 59 seconds to go.

San Diego State forced a turnover on Boise State's next possession and Jalen McDaniels made one of two free throws to help the Aztecs get to within one point. Mitchell, however, made a play on the ball in the inbounds play, but the officials ruled it an intentional foul, sending Hutchison to the free throw line where he made both attempts and giving the ball back to the Broncos.

Down by three points with 15 seconds left, SDSU fouled Hutchison, who this time missed the front end of a 1-and-1 situation.

Then with 12 seconds left, both Devin Watson and Mitchell missed game-tying threes to send the Aztecs home with the loss.

Wason led the team with 19 points and eight assists. Pope has 18 points and nine rebounds. McDaniels added 16 points.

SAN DIEGO - SDSU missed 12 free throws and let a 10-point second-half lead slip away in a 77-73 home loss to Fresno State.

The first half was a hotly contested battle with the entire 20 minutes featuring a score that was no bigger than a two-possession contest. The Aztecs, however, ended the first half on a 7-0 run to take a 40-36 lead.

When the game resumed, SDSU came out firing on all cylinders thanks to Matt Mitchell's hot hand. First, the freshman made two free throws to open the half and went on to make back-to-back jumpers to help keep the Aztecs' lead at four.

Mitchell's final basket helped spur an 8-0 run to move SDSU out in front, 52-42, with 15:46 to go. Fresno State briefly halted the Aztecs with a Nate Grimes lay-up, but Devin Watson converted a pair of free throws to get SDSU's lead back to 10.

The Bulldogs stayed within striking distance, ultimately taking a 63-62 lead with 6:49 left. Just over 90 seconds later, Mitchell cashed in on a three-point play to put the Aztecs up, 68-65. Fresno State, however, leveled the score on a Sam Bittner triple and took a four-point lead thanks to four Ray Bowles free throws.

Trey Kell (three-pointer) and Jalen McDaniels (two free throws) helped the Aztecs get back to within one in the final 1:21, but each time Jaron Hopkins extended the Bulldogs' lead, once on a jumper and the other time on a free throw.

SDSU had a chance to tie the game with 30 seconds left, but Watson's lay-up attempt was blocked by Grimes and Deshon Taylor made two free throws to provide the final margin.

McDaniels led the Aztecs with 14 points and 13 rebounds. Kell finished with 14 points and Mitchell added 13.

Grimes, meanwhile, had 15 points, 10 rebounds and four blocked shots for Fresno State. Deshon Taylor poured in a gamehigh 22 points.

The Aztecs led by as many as 13 points in the first half thanks to a 7-1 run that started with a Malik Pope jumper with 6:16 left in the first half. He later went on to convert a three-point play before Max Montana capped the run with basket of his own.

New Mexico ended the spurt with a lay-up by Makuach Maluach, but Nolan Narain made two free throws to push SDSU's lead back to 13 with 4:09 left in the first half.

The Aztecs led by 13 twice more down the stretch, the last of which came on a Montana trey with 1:51 left. By the time the half-time horn went off, SDSU led, 48-38.

New Mexico closed to within four points with 12:35 left in the second half, but Jordan Schakel silenced the crowd with one of his two three-pointers. Not a minute later, the Lobos cut their deficit to three only to have Matt Mitchell follow Schakel with a three of his own to put SDSU ahead, 63-57.

New Mexico launched 29 threes, making 13, and used it to stay close to the Aztecs. After Mitchell's three, the Lobos surrounded two Pope free throws with treys to get to within two.

With the clock showing 2:59, Antino Jackson connected on a three-pointer that gave New Mexico a 75-73 lead. Devin Watson connected with Pope on an alley-oop to level the score, but Jackson answered with a jumper with 22 seconds left to propel the Lobos to a two-point advantage.

Watson then brought the ball up and missed his jumper with three seconds to go. Joe Furstinger provided the final margin with a pair of free throws to put the game out of reach.

Pope and Watson led SDSU with 16 points. Jalen McDaniels added 13 for a team that made 13-of-15 from the free-throw line.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State had seven players reach double figures in scoring and collectively shot 55.6 percent from the field to help it beat Colorado State in wire-to-wire fashion, 97-78.

Max Montana tied his career high with five three-pointers as he finished with a team-best 20 points. Trey Kell battled pneumonia to score 17 points, Matt Mitchell had 15, Jalen McDaniels and Devin Watson each turned in 11, and Malik Pope added 10.

The score was tied at 14 in the early going before Montana made a pair of threes to spark a 14-2 run to put the Aztecs up, 28-16, with 7:48 left in the first half.

The Rams managed to cut their deficit to five points with 3:16 remaining in the period, but SDSU closed the half by outscoring the visitors, 11-2, to take a 47-33 lead at halftime.

Both teams traded points in the opening minutes of the second half, but the Aztecs surrounded the first media timeout with an 8-O run to push their lead to 20 points. Then, in about 80 seconds, SDSU watched its lead balloon to 27 points after a Watson trey.

Colorado State would not get closer than 20 points the rest of the way. In fact, the three times the Rams closed to within 20, San Diego State had an answer on its next possession.

The Rams, who were without the services of their top scorer (Prentiss Nixon), were led by Anthony Bonner's 22 points and Nico Carvacho's 14 points and 12 rebounds.

San Diego State's 97 points represented a season high and the second-most scored in a Mountain West game in school history. The Aztecs had 25 assists on 35 baskets, marking the second time this season they set a school record for most assists in an MW game. SDSU also connected on 13 three-pointers for the second time this season, which was also the second most in a Mountain West game for any Aztec team in the 19-year history of the league.

LAS VEGAS - San Diego State could not extend its 11-game series winning streak over UNLV, falling to the Runnin' Rebels, 88-78, at Thomas & Mack Center.

The Aztecs, who had won seven straight games over UNLV at Thomas & Mack Center, started slow out of the gates and lost Trey Kell all within the first 3:20.

The Rebels scored the first four points, all in the paint by Brandon McCoy, and led, 9-2, when Kell rebounded a Jovan Mooring three-point misfire and turned his ankle while completing the play. He was replaced by Jeremy Hemsley and did not return.

Hemsley scored four of SDSU's next six points to help the Aztecs trim their deficit to 15-8, but the home team answered with four consecutive points to extend its lead to 11.

A 10-2 run capped by a pair of Hemsley free throws got the Aztecs to within a pair, but UNLV answered and moved out in front by six. SDSU thrice took a one-point lead with under 2:30 to go and ultimately went into the locker room tied at 38.

Similar to the start of the game, the Rebels were hot after halftime, outscoring the visitors, 10-3, to pull ahead, 48-41. SDSU leveled the score, but UNLV responded with six straight points.

The Rebels enjoyed a comfortable lead as the clock wound down and led, 75-63, with 6:31 left. SDSU, however, had one last run in them, answering with a 12-2 spurt in a matter of 1:38, helped by back-to-back-to-back threes from Malik Pope, Devin Watson and Max Montana.

Six consecutive points scored by UNLV extinguished the potential fire and the Rebels went on to claim the 10-point victory.

Hemsley finished with a season-high 19 points and Pope turned in 14 points and eight rebounds. As for UNLV, which shot 58.6 percent from the field, it was led by Shakur Juiston's 12 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and four blocked shots, and McCoy's 21 points and seven boards.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State had four players reach double figures in scoring and shot 51.9 percent from the field to defeat Air Force, 81-50, at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs were led by Jalen McDaniels' 16 points and careerhigh 13 rebounds, and Jeremy Hemsley's 14 points. Hemsley started for the fifth time this season due to Trey Kell's left ankle injury suffered at UNLV. Devin Watson and Max Montana both added 13 points and were a combined 6-for-11 from three-point

San Diego State never trailed in the game and enjoyed a 35-21 lead at halftime. After 20 minutes of action, SDSU was 12-for-24 from the field, including an 8-for-16 effort from behind the three-point arc.

In the second half, McDaniels got going offensively after making his only attempt from the field in the first period. Over the last 20 minutes, the freshman was 6-for-9 from the floor and collected seven boards to post his fifth double-double of the season.

SDSU took a 63-40 lead into the final five minutes and scored nine points in 58 seconds, the last four of which were posted to McDaniels' stat line. The Aztecs later enjoyed their biggest lead, 36 points, after Montana made his third three-pointer with 1:31 remaining before settling for the 31-point victory. The winning margin matched the Aztecs' largest over the Falcons in a home game in series history.

Air Force was led by Lavelle Scottie's 16 points. Ryan Swan added a team-high seven rebounds.
