NEWS AND NOTES (all notes through Dec. 14 games)

- Following semester exams, San Diego State plays its first game in a week on Wednesday night at Cincinnati.
- The game is the first for the Aztecs against the American Athletic Conference, which is in its second year of existence.
- Although the San Diego State and Cincinnati programs are meeting for the first time, Aztec head coach Steve Fisher and associate head coach/head coach in waiting Brian Dutcher own a victory over the Bearcats. The duo (Fisher as the head coach and Dutcher as an assistant coach) handed Cincinnati a 76-72 loss on April 4, 1992, in the Final Four in Minneapolis, Minn. Two days later, Michigan lost to Duke in the 1992 national championship game.
- The game features one of the nation's best road teams against one of the country's best at home. Since the beginning of the 2010-11 campaign, San Diego State is 33-14 (70.2 percent) in road games, which is the third-best winning percentage in the nation during that span (see list below). During that stretch, SDSU has impressive road wins at Kansas, Arizona, Gonzaga, California, Utah, USC, UNLV (four times) and New Mexico (twice).
- Cincinnati, meanwhile, has won 25 of its last 26 home games and since March 2, 2013, owns the nation's seventh-highest home winning percentage (96.2 percent). The lone loss during that span was to No. 11 Louisville last season, 58-57.
- In addition, Wednesday's game features two of the top programs in the nation this decade. Since the start of 2010-11, SDSU is seventh in winning percentage (121-29, 80.7 percent), while UC is 25th in the category (107-41, 72.3 percent).
- San Diego State is off to a 7-2 start, despite playing the nation's 26th-most difficult schedule to date (RPI strength of schedule) and having 24 missed games due to injury.
- The Aztecs have lost twice this season - vs. No. 3/3 Arizona (10-0) in the finals of the EA Sports Maui Invitational and at No. 16/16 Washington (8-0). The two losses have come to teams with a combined record of 18-0.
- SDSU is ranked in the Associated Press Top-25 Poll for the 22nd straight week, just one week short of the school record. The Aztecs' streak is the eighth-longest in the nation.
- San Diego State has attempted more free throws than its opponents in eight of nine games this season (SDSU had the same number of attempts in the loss to Arizona). The Aztecs are 91-11 in the last 102 times they have had an advantage in the category. For the season, SDSU has made more free throws (144) than its opponents have attempted (119).
- Once again this season, San Diego State is one of the top defensive teams in the nation. The Aztecs rank 14th in scoring defense (55.0), 18th in field-goal percentage defense (36.0), 11th in fewest fouls per game (15.1) and 1-25th in blocked shots per game (5.7). KenPom has SDSU fifth nationally in defensive efficiency (7.1 points allowed per 100 possessions).
- According to Synergy, through the first nine games of the season, SDSU opponents score just 0.642 points per possession and are shooting just 32.8 percent from the floor in 579 half-court opportunities this season. The 0.642 points per possession ranks third nationally, behind Louisville and Kentucky.
- Both teams field excellent football and men's basketball programs. San Diego State is one of only five programs nationally (the others: Kansas State, Louisville Michigan State and Wisconsin) to advance to each of the last five NCAA tournaments and five straight bowl games (includes 2013 season). Cincinnati has played in four straight NCAA tournaments and four consecutive bowl games.
- Since the beginning of the 2010-11 campaign, San Diego State ranks third nationally in combined men's basketball and football record (162-52, 75.7 percent). Cincinnati is 12th nationally over the same span (148-62, 70.5 percent).

It marked the Aztecs' 45th consecutive victory against teams from California, 19th consecutive home win and 49th consecutive home victory against unranked non-conference opponents.
- With the victory, San Diego State improved to 37-12 since the beginning of the 2010-11 campaign in games decided by six points or less or in overtime (second-best record in the nation) and Steve Fisher improved to 24-9 in his career in games decided by one point.
- Senior forward Dwayne Polee II scored a team-high 16 points and added five rebounds in 28 minutes of action. Junior forward Winston Shepard reached double figures with 10 points, four rebounds, three assists and senior forward JJ O'Brien added eight points (4-4 field goals), six rebounds and three steals.

UP NEXT

- San Diego State opens a four-game homestand on Saturday with a meeting with Ball State. The Cardinals lead the all-time series 3-1 and have won the last two encounters, including an 82-65 decision at Viejas Arena on Dec. 27, 1999. Other games on the homestand include, UC Riverside (Monday), San Diego Christian (Dec. 27) and the Mountain West opener against Air Force (Dec. 31).
- San Diego State has won 19 consecutive home games, which is the Aztecs' longest streak in the Division I era and the second-longest streak in school history (22 from 1966-68). It is tied for the sixth-longest active streak in Division I.

SDSU VS. CINCINNATI/AMERICAN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE HISTORY

- San Diego State has never faced Cincinnati.
- The Aztecs have never faced a team under the AAC umbrella.
- Against the current membership, SDSU is 5-10 (Houston 2-0, Temple 2-0, Tulsa 1-6, Memphis 0-1, UConn 0-1, SMU 0-2).
- Under Steve Fisher, the Aztecs are 3-1 against current members of the league. The Aztecs beat Houston in 2001 and 2002, Temple in 2011 in the second round of the NCAA tournament and fell to UConn, the eventual national champion, in the 2011 Sweet 16.

- Winston Shepard was named to the Naismith Trophy Top-50 Watch List on Dec. 3.
- The junior is the third Aztec since 2010-11 to appear on the top-50 list, joining Kawhi Leonard (2010-11) and Jamaal Franklin (2012-13).

■ The Houston, Texas, native is the third Aztec in as many seasons to be on the Naismith Trophy radar joining Xavier Thames and Franklin. Thames was on the top-30 list one season after Franklin was on the top-50 and -30 lists.

SHEPARD NAMED MW PLAYER OF THE WEEK

■ Winston Shepard was named Mountain West Player of the Week for the first time of his career on Monday, Dec. 1.

■ At the EA SPORTS Maui Invitational, he averaged team highs in points (15.0), rebounds (7.0), three-point percentage (.500), and minutes played (33.7). He also ranked second on the team in field-goal percentage (.500; min 25 attempts), free-throw percentage (.722; min 15 attempts) and assists (2.0) en route to being selected to the all-tournament team.

■ The junior forward had his best game of the tournament vs. BYU, recording 18 points, eight rebounds and three assists in a career-high 40 minutes played. He also scored 13 points with seven rebounds and three assists in a win against Pittsburgh, and closed tournament play with 14 points, six rebounds and a steal against No. 3/4 Arizona on Nov. 26.

■ Shepard's 45 total points in the three contests were his most since scoring 47 points in a three-game stretch in January of last season. In addition, his three-game double-figure scoring output is his longest since a four-game double-digit scoring streak from Feb. 22-March 5 of last season.

KELL'S COMING OUT PARTY

■ Trey Kell had a coming out party of sorts in Maui after scoring in double figures in all three games and averaging 14.3 points.

■ His stat line the first three games: 3.0 points (.125 FG, 0-7 3FG, 5-9 FT), 3.7 rebounds, 1.3 assists, 1.3 steals.

■ His stat line in Maui (three games): 14.3 points (.538 FG, 2-6 3FG, 13-17 FT), 3.3 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 1.0 steals.

■ In his first game back from Maui, Kell turned in 10 points (2-3 3FG), a career-high five rebounds and zero turnovers in 27 minutes vs. San Diego.

A LITTLE BIT OF EVERYTHING

■ JJ O'Brien has done a little bit of everything this season, from scoring to rebounding to handing out assists.

■ The senior has led the team in scoring once (four double-figure scoring efforts this year), but has also led the team in rebounding and assists four times.

■ To date, the 6-7 forward has the team's top rebounding effort (11 vs. Utah) and the top assist performance (6 vs. BYU) this season.

S.W.A.T. RIM

■ Several opponents have suffered from S.W.A.T. Rim (Spencer Waits At The Rim) in the early going.

■ Skylar Spencer ranks among the top-16 nationally in total blocked shots (27) and blocked shots per game (3.0), through Dec. 7 games.

■ The junior has blocked at least four shots five times this season and recorded at least one rejection in all but one game (at Washington).

■ He turned away a career-high-tying six shots vs. CSUN and had five blocked shots against both BYU and Pittsburgh.

RECORD-BREAKING PACE

■ Skylar Spencer set the single-season school record for blocked shots last season with 89.

■ This season, he is averaging 3.0 blocked shots per game, which puts him on pace for 96 (regular season and one conference tournament game).

■ If this pace keeps up, Spencer will have 236 career blocked shots in three seasons, which would surpass the school record of 214 set by Leonard Allen from 1982-85.

PASSING MARKS IN NON-CONFERENCE ACTION

■ San Diego State has won 54 of its last 55 non-conference games vs. unranked foes in the regular season.

■ SDSU's last regular-season loss to an unranked non-conference opponent prior to the Dec. 7 defeat at Washington came on Dec. 19, 2009, at Arizona State.

■ Since that Dec. 19, 2009, loss, the Aztecs have gone 62-7 in non-conference action vs. all foes.

THE DEFENSE DOES NOT REST

■ SDSU has held its last 25 non-conference opponents to 70 points or less in games played at home.

■ In those 25 games, San Diego State is 24-1 with the only loss coming to No. 6/5 Arizona last season.

■ In the aforementioned 24 games, only four teams have shot above 40.0 percent from the field (UC Santa Barbara in 2012-13; No. 6/5 Arizona in 2013-14, CSUN and Long Beach State in 2014-15).

- San Diego State truly has a homecourt advantage and its record inside Viejas Arena speaks for itself. The Aztecs are 82-6 in their last 88 home games.
- Since the start of 2005-06, the Aztecs are 132-15 inside Viejas and have suffered just one three-loss season at home (2007-08).
- Only 10 teams have won inside Viejas Arena since the start of 2005-06. Of the 10, five were non-conference foes.

CLASS OF THE MOUNTAIN WEST

- SDSU was picked to win the Mountain West in the league's preseason poll.

PASSING THE TWO-MILLION MARK

- This is the 18th season of SDSU men's basketball inside Viejas Arena and its total attendance surpassed two million vs. Utah back on Nov. 18.
- The 12,414 fans inside Viejas for the Utah game brought the men's hoops total to 2,002,355.

NO. 1 ALL-TIME

- Steve Fisher is SDSU's all-time winningest coach.
- The 16th-year head coach earned victory No. 317 at San Diego State after the Aztecs dismissed Pittsburgh at the Maui Invitational. The former leader was George Ziegenfuss, who won 316 games in 21 seasons.

PROGRAM NOTES

- SDSU finished 2013-14 with a 31-5 record (16-2 MW), its second 30-win effort in the last four seasons (34-3 in 2010-11).
- The Aztecs won the 2014 Mountain West regular-season title, their league-best eighth conference championship.
- San Diego State has won 20 or more games and advanced to the postseason nine straight years.
- SDSU is one of 13 schools to have won 20 or more games nine straight years. The others are Akron, Brigham Young, Duke, Florida, Gonzaga, Kansas, Louisville, Memphis, North Carolina, Ohio State, Pittsburgh and Syracuse.
- San Diego State has appeared in five consecutive NCAA tournaments, which is a school record.

- The Aztecs own five of the Mountain West's last seven NCAA tournament victories (current members only).




JEFF JACOBS JAM CENTER



STEVE FISHER

24th-Full Season • 16th Season at SDSU • Illinois State, 1967

Steve Fisher has guided the Aztec basketball program to unparalleled heights. In 15 seasons, he has taken a program that regularly missed out on the conference postseason tournament, to one which has become one of the best programs in the country.

When Fisher arrived on the scene in March of 1999, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were set. The Aztecs were expected to lose. The year before Fisher's arrival on campus, San Diego State won just four games.

Now those days are a distant memory. Fisher has guided San Diego State to the NCAA Tournament seven times, including five straight with at least one victory in three of the last four years. In 2011, he led SDSU to a 34-3 record and a berth in the Sweet 16. In 2014, the Aztecs nearly matched the 2011 squad by going 31-5 and also reaching the Sweet 16. Fisher has also taken the Aztecs to the NIT four times, including their run to the national semifinals in 2009. San Diego State has currently been to the postseason nine straight years.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene when it introduced Fisher as its new coach. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed a NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Co., raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, which put him fourth

among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket after his stint in Ann Arbor. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just six that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to a NIT title as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led SDSU back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

In 2006-07, he led SDSU to the MW regular season and tournament crowns and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. That team finished with a Division I then-school-record 24 wins. And the last eight seasons, Fisher has led the Aztecs to eight additional 20-win seasons, including six straight 23-win campaigns, and eight consecutive postseason appearances. In 2011-12, in what was perceived as a rebuilding year, Fisher led SDSU to a 26-8 record, a spot in the NCAA Tournament and its second straight Mountain West regular-season title. Then in 2012-13, Fisher and the Aztecs advanced to the third round of the NAAs for the second time in three years with their third-ever NCAA tournament win. And then in 2013-14, in what also called a rebuilding season, SDSU won the Mountain West and reached the Sweet 16 before finishing 31-5.

Then on Nov. 19, 2014, San Diego State added three more years to Fisher's current contract, which was set to expire at the end of the 2014-15 campaign. With the additional three seasons, Fisher is set atop Montezuma Mesa through the 2017-18 season.





SAN DIEGO - No. 16/17 San Diego State had four players reach double figures in scoring and shot 50.0 percent field the field to defeat CSUN, 79-58, to win its second straight season opener.

The Matadors took an early 4-0 lead to open the game, while the Aztecs were slow to get started. Dwayne Polee II recorded the first points of the new season when he was left open in the corner where he proceeded to knock down a three-pointer.

The game remained a two-possession-or-less contest for more than 12 minutes. After SDSU went ahead by six, CSUN trimmed its deficit to two with 8:11 to go.

The Aztecs, however, responded by closing the first half on a 24-6 run, which covered 7 minutes, 52 seconds, to take a 41-21 lead into halftime and never let the Matadors get any closer than 12 points the rest of the way.

Aqeel Quinn, who was playing a school in which he spent his first two seasons, led the Aztecs with 15 points off the bench. Winston Shepard scored 14 points and JJ O'Brien added 13 points, seven rebounds and a team-high four assists. Polee finished with 11 points and frontcourt teammate Skylar Spencer filled the stat sheet with four points, a team-high eight rebounds, a career-high three assists, a personal-best six blocked shots and three steals.

Trey Kell, who was in the starting lineup with O'Brien, Polee II, Shepard and Spencer, became the 13th freshman, and eighth Aztec, to start a season opener for head coach Steve Fisher.

With the starting five and the rest of the Aztecs earning the victory, SDSU pocketed its 42nd consecutive win over schools from California. San Diego State also secured its 121st straight decision when leading with five minutes to play.

CSUN was led by Stephen Maxwell's 15 points and 10 rebounds. Stephan Hicks added 16 points.

SAN DIEGO - No. 16/16 San Diego State engaged No. 25/rv Utah in a defensive battle and prevailed, 53-49, in front of a sold-out crowd inside Viejas Arena and a nationally televised audience on ESPN.

The teams combined to shoot 11-for-44 from the floor in the first half and even though the Aztecs outscored the Utes, 9-2, in points off turnovers, Utah made 6-of-10 free throws to take a slim 18-17 lead into halftime.

The second half featured slightly better shooting and the first 10 minutes the score remained close. Angelo Chol, however, sparked San Diego State by scoring six straight points to help the Aztecs jump out to a 30-24 lead. The spurt was continued by a free throw from Dwayne Polee II and the 9-0 run was capped by a JJ O'Brien layup.

Utah immediately cut its deficit to six points, but a Polee II triple extended SDSU's lead back up to nine. The Utes continued to stay close, getting to within five points with 5:01 to go, but the Aztecs, once again, had an answer and were up, 40-31, three possessions later.

Utah found itself trailing by seven points with 2:34 left in the game and began to send SDSU to the free-throw line. San Diego State accepted the challenge and calmly knocked down 13 of its last 14 attempts, including its first nine to squash the Utes' furious rally that featured a trio of three-pointers in the final 1:54. Utah's Delon Wright was also fouled on a three with 10 seconds left and made all three attempts, which brought the Utes to within two points before Polee II made both of his free throws on the Aztecs' next possession to ice the game.

O'Brien led SDSU with 12 points and 11 rebounds. Aqeel Quinn, meanwhile, held Utah's top returner, Wright, to seven points on 2-of-13 shooting.

SAN DIEGO - No. 16/16 San Diego State countered its poor shooting night by playing stifling defense to beat Bakersfield, 51-27, to win its 43rd straight game vs. schools from California.

The 27 points allowed were the fewest allowed in Division I in 2014-15. It was also the fewest allowed by SDSU in its Division I history, which dates to the 1970-71 campaign, and the fewest allowed by an Aztec team since Dec. 3, 1949.

In the first half alone, San Diego State limited the Roadrunners to 18.8-percent shooting and 12 points overall. Bakersfield's point total was tied for the fifth fewest scored in a first half in 2014-15 and was the second fewest allowed by the Aztecs since 1996-97.

SDSU was not much better in the opening 20 minutes, shooting 20.8 percent from the floor, including a 1-for-12 effort from behind the three-point arc. San Diego State, however, held the Roadrunners scoreless for the first 12 minutes, 16 seconds and owned an 11-0 advantage from the charity stripe, to go into half-time ahead, 22-12.

In the second half, the offensive struggles continued for both teams, but moreso for Bakersfield as it went through long stretches without scoring including a 9-minute, 20-second span to close the game where it scored only three points -- on a three-pointer with 25 seconds left.

Dwayne Polee II scored 13 points to lead all players and Winston Shepard pulled down six rebounds to lead the Aztecs, who shot 24.6 percent for the game. Five-star recruit Malik Pope saw his first action of the season after recovering from two leg injuries suffered in high school. The forward played 14 minutes and finished with four points and a pair of rebounds, blocked shots and steals.

LAHAINA, Hawaii - No. 15/15 San Diego State met an old foe in Brigham Young at the EA SPORTS Maui Invitational and the date did not disappoint as the Aztecs earned a 92-87 double-overtime victory in the quarterfinal round.

Sharing the hardwood for the first time since 2011 when both schools were members of the Mountain West, SDSU looked poised to win with ease in the early going.

The Aztecs jumped all over the Cougars, building an 11-0 lead and later led by 10 with under 14 minutes to play. BYU rallied to tie the score at 26 with 7:31 left in the half, but San Diego State closed the frame on a 15-7 run to go into the locker room ahead, 41-33.

The Aztecs continued to lead by eight with under 10 minutes left in the second half only to have Brigham Young close the gap as the game rolled on. Trailing by three points with under two minutes to go, Tyler Haws knocked down a three with 1:38 remaining. SDSU had a chance to win the game in regulation when JJ O'Brien swooped down the lane and missed a contested layup. Winston Shepard, however, tried a put-back dunk, but came up short.

In overtime, BYU turned a two-point deficit into a five-point lead with 1:35 left. The Aztecs would not be denied, though, getting a layup from O'Brien and game-changing play from Aqeel Quinn. LAHAINA, Hawaii - No. 15/15 San Diego State met Pittsburgh in the first-ever meeting between the programs in the semifinals of the EA SPORTS Maui Invitational and cruised to a 74-57 victory.

The Panthers scored first, but it would be the only time they would lead. Trey Kell answered with six straight points and Skylar Spencer capped an 8-0 run with a layup to propel SDSU to an 8-2 lead.

The Aztecs kept Pittsburgh at a safe distance for the middle portion of the first half before closing on a 9-2 run in the final 3 minutes, 15 seconds to open up a 39-25 lead at intermission.

San Diego State continued to get what it wanted as the second half got underway and led by 20 points after a three-pointer from Kell and a three-point play from Winston Shepard.

Pittsburgh responded by getting two easy buckets inside the paint and a three-pointer from Ryan Luther to get the Panthers to within 13 points. The Aztecs, however, pulled away by converting their free-throws and locking down defensively, which led to many offensive chances.

One of those chances was created by D'Erryl Williams, who knocked the ball away from a Panther near midcourt and raced down the floor for the layup. The basket gave San Diego State its biggest lead at 68-43 with 3:41 to go in regulation. SDSU enjoyed a lead of at least 20 points the rest of the way before Pittsburgh scored five unanswered points to end the game.

San Diego State, which was led by a career-high 15 points from Kell, shot a season-high 58.7 percent from the field and was 17-for-22 from the charity stripe. Pittsburgh, meanwhile, was limited to 37.7 percent shooting and forced into committing 17 turnovers.

Much like the previous three meetings, the game lived up to the hype between the only two nationally ranked programs in the field.

The game was a see-saw battle, with the Aztecs enjoying a lead for much of the game. Arizona was within two and the Aztecs got a three-pointer from Dwayne Polee II. The Wildcats cut their deficit to one, only to have Polee II knock down a jumper. In the second half, the teams traded figurative punches as the score was tied four times and changed hands seven times in the first 15 minutes. Arizona, however, took minor control of the game as the clock dipped under 5:00, scoring six of the next eight points to take a 57-51 lead.

Down six, Trey Kell was fouled while taking and making a three-pointer, and made his one free-throw, to bring SDSU to within two points. Stanley Johnson kept Arizona out in front by making a pair of free-throws, with JJ O'Brien answering by converting 1-of-2 on the other end. Trailing by three, the Aztecs fouled T.J. McConnell, who made both of his free-throws, and Shepard knocked down a three-pointer with three seconds left to provide the final margin.

SDSU raced out to an 8-0 lead and never looked back. San Diego cut its deficit to five when Johnny Dee knocked down a three-pointer to stop the early 8-0 run, but did not get any closer the rest of the game.

The Aztecs went into halftime ahead, 31-19, and led by as many as 14 points as a result of 46.4-percent shooting. In the first 20 minutes alone, three SDSU players had at least seven points and nine logged seven minutes or more.

In the second half, San Diego State let the Toreros hang around as they eventually cut their deficit to single digits. The two glaring reasons USD was within striking distance was SDSU's inability to make shots and make free-throws. For the half, the Aztecs were 6-for-23 from the floor and 12-for-24 from the charity stripe.

The difference in the game for San Diego State, however, was its ability to guard without fouling. The Aztecs committed a season-low 13 fouls, which led to USD attempting six free-throws for the game, four of which it made.

Dwayne Polee II led SDSU with 14 points and JJ O'Brien chipped in 13 points after making a career-high two three-pointers. Trey Kell, meanwhile, continued his scoring spree, reaching double figures for the fourth straight game with 10 points. On the glass, Angelo Chol grabbed a team-best seven rebounds.

Dee led all players with 16 points, while Jito Kok pulled down a game-high 10 rebounds.

Shepard led San Diego State with seven points and Skylar Spencer grabbed a career-high 13 rebounds. As a team, the Aztecs shot 20.4 percent from the field.

Caffey ended up stealing the inbound pass and later missed a jumpshot. Polee II, meanwhile, was fouled and knocked down both free-throw attempts to give the Aztecs a 60-56 lead with 14 seconds remaining.

LBSU had a breath of life left when Caffey hit the 49ers' 11th three-pointer of the game with five seconds left and promptly fouled O'Brien, who air-balled his first free-throw and missed the second on purpose with two seconds remaining. Long Beach State's three-quarter-court desperation shot was off the mark and SDSU beat a California school for the 45th straight time.
