### 14-TIME MOUNTAIN WEST CHAMPIONS

#### PRESEASON NOTES

- San Diego State embarks on its 102nd season in 2022-23. In 101 seasons, the Aztecs are 1,561-1,141-1 overall and, in its 52 seasons at the Division I level, has posted a 873-696 mark.
- San Diego State preps for the 2022-23 campaign after finishing last season 23-9, 13-4 mark in league play, and was the championship runner-up in the 2022 Mountain West Tournament. The Aztecs have captured a league-high 14 conference titles, have finished champion or runner-up in 14-of-23 Mountain West Tournaments. Since 2006, SDSU's 13 appearances in its conference championship game are tied for the second most in the nation (also: New Mexico State).
- Entering the 2022-23 season, SDSU will look to return to the NCAA tournament for the fourth time in the last five years in which a champion is crowned (the 2020 NCAA Tournament was canceled due to COVID-19). The Aztecs' appearance in 2022 was their 14th postseason berth (10 NCAA, 4 NIT) in the last 16 years in which a national champion was crowned.
- Head coach **Brian Dutcher** is set for his sixth season after guiding San Diego State to a 23-9 record in 2021-22, and now has a career mark of 119-40. He is the only head coach in program history to record 20+ wins in each of his first five seasons. In addition, among head coaches whose first season guiding his current program was 2017-18, his 119 victories lead the nation and are eight more than the next highest total.
- In 2018, Dutcher was the only first-year head coach to lead his team to the NCAA Tournament and in the previous 96 seasons of SDSU basketball, no other coach had won more games and/or won a conference title in his initial season.
- Dutcher is the only coach in program history (since 1921-22) to lead his team to 119 or more victories in his first five seasons. Tim Vezie (1974-75 through 1978-79) ranks second with 77 wins. In addition, Dutcher and Vezie are the only coaches to lead their teams to the NCAA Tournament in their first season coaching at San Diego State.
- Dutcher's .748 winning percentage (119-40) is the highest in program history and last season became just the fifth coach in program history to reach 100 career wins. In addition, his .600 winning percentage (9-6) against top-25 competition is the best for any Aztec coach and he is the only Aztec coach to post a winning record against the top-25.
- Dutcher welcomes back four returning starters in senior guard and 2021 Mountain West Newcomer of the Year **Matt Bradley**, MW Defensive Player of the Year senior forward **Nathan Mensah**, junior guard and MW All-Defensive Team designee **Lamont Butler** and senior forward **Keshad Johnson**, who was a league Player of the Week honoree in 2021-22. Bradley, Mensah and Johnson started all 32 games a year ago, with Butler earning starts in 25 of the games in which he appeared.
- In 2022-23, SDSU will only have to replace its leader from last year's team in assists (**Trey Pulliam** - 3.4).
- SDSU loses one starter (**Trey Pulliam**) from its 2021-22 squad that went 23-9 and appeared in the NCAA tournament. Pulliam ranked second among the 2021-22 Aztecs in scoring (8.7 ppg), steals (34) and minutes (30.9/g) and led the team with 3.4 assists per game.
- SDSU has four Division I transfers on the 2022-23 roster, all of whom are available to compete. **Matt Bradley** (California), the MW Newcomer of the Year in 2021-22 has one year of eligibility. **Jaedon LeDee** (TCU) redshirted the 2021-22 season, and is eligible to compete for the Aztecs in 2022-23, while newcomers **Darrion Trammell** (Seattle U) and **Micah Parrish** (Oakland) are immediately available and have one and three years of eligibility, respectively.
- When the season tips off, the Aztecs will have six players on the roster who have never played a game in an SDSU uniform. **Jaedon LeDee** (TCU) sat out last year due to NCAA transfer rules and has one year of eligibility. **Darrion Trammell** (Seattle U) and **Micah Parrish** (Oakland) are transfers who have one and three years of eligibility, respectively. **Demarshay Johnson Jr.** (Salesian College Prep, Richmond, Calif.) is a redshirt freshman while **Miles Byrd** (Stockton, Calif., Lincoln High) and **Elijah Saunders** (Phoenix, Ariz., Sunnyslope High) are true freshmen.
- In addition to **Nathan Mensah** (forward) and **Matt Bradley** (guard), SDSU welcomes back seniors **Aguek Arop** (forward), **Adam Seiko** (guard), **Keshad Johnson** (forward) and **Jared Barnett** (guard). In addition, juniors **Lamont Butler** (guard), **Cade Alger** (forward), **Triston Broughton** (guard), and **Tyler Broughton** (guard) return to the Aztecs in 2022-23. In 2020-21, among scholarship players, Arop averaged 3.5 points and 3.3 rebounds, Seiko (5.3 ppg., 2.0 rpg.), Johnson (7.2 ppg., 4.5 rpg.), Butler (7.3 ppg, 2.1 rpg.), are all forecast to play larger rolls and make larger contributions in 2022-23.

## San Diego State 2022-23 Way-Too-Early Rankings

### No. 11 - Bart Torvik (T-Rank - June 2)

### No. 14 - Kevin Sweeney (Sports Illustrated - June 18)

"The Aztecs sported the nation's second-best defense, per KenPom, in 2021-22, and the return of defensive anchor Nathan Mensah means SDSU will be nearly impossible to score on yet again. What held Brian Dutcher's team back this past season was an anemic offense, as evidenced by the fact that the Aztecs lost five games where they allowed fewer than 60 points (all five against top-50 KenPom teams). Enter Seattle U transfer point guard Darrion Trammell, a diminutive dynamo who's proficient operating in ball screens and gets to the free throw line with regularity while fitting into SDSU's defense-first mindset. Trammell and Oakland transfer Micah Parrish provide a much-needed jolt offensively to a team that didn't have enough consistent shot-makers to take the next step last season. If San Diego State becomes a top-75 offense this season, it could be special."

### No. 16 - Jon Rothstein (College Hoops Today - June 2)

### No. 19 - Jeff Borzello (ESPN - June 1)

"The Aztecs are the most consistent program in the state of California and will be steered by Matt Bradley again — the Mountain West newcomer of the year. Lamont Butler and Keshad Johnson along with the possibility of Nathan Mensah back means the Aztecs will have the defensive ability to lock down again. The recruiting picked up, and Brian Dutcher has had the Aztecs in the Mountain West title chase every season."

### No. 23 - Andy Katz (NCAA.com - June 2)

"The Aztecs are the most consistent program in the state of California and will be steered by Matt Bradley again — the Mountain West newcomer of the year. Lamont Butler and Keshad Johnson along with the possibility of Nathan Mensah back means the Aztecs will have the defensive ability to lock down again. The recruiting picked up, and Brian Dutcher has had the Aztecs in the Mountain West title chase every season."

### No. 23 - Seth Davis (The Athletic - June 2)

"The Aztecs got a huge break . . . when Nathan Mensah, the 6-10 center who was the Mountain West's defensive player of the year, decided to return for a super senior season. Matt Bradley, the 6-4 senior transfer from Cal who led the team in scoring at 16.9 points per game, chose that same option before the season ended. Brian Dutcher has also since added a pair of transfers in 5-10 junior guard Darrion Trammell (Seattle) and 6-6 sophomore forward Micah Parrish (Oakland)."

### No. 23 - Jon Wilner (Mercury News - April 4)

"The Aztecs' presence in our rankings was secured last month when senior guard Matt Bradley (17 ppg) announced he would return. This might be the last team standing after what should be another solid season for the Mountain West."

### TEAM NOTES

- The Aztecs finished last year with a 23-9 record and a 13-4 mark in the Mountain West. SDSU posted its 17th straight season with at least 19 victories, which is tied for the third most consecutive seasons with at least 19 wins in the nation.
- San Diego State was one of the most dominant defensive teams in the nation in 2021-22, finishing No. 2 in scoring defense (58.1 ppg) and in the last 12 years, beginning in 2010-11, has finished in the top-10 in the nation six times. In addition, the Aztecs were No. 4 in field-goal percentage (.384), No. 25 in 3-point field goal percentage defense (.300), No. 39 in blocks (152), No. 79 in steals (239) and led the Mountain West in each of those categories.
- According to KenPom, the Aztecs were No. 2 in defensive efficiency, No. 5 in effective field goal percentage defense, No. 7 in two point percentage defense, No. 15 in block percentage, No. 23 in 3-point percentage defense and No. 27 in turnover percentage defense. No other program in the MW could equal or surpass SDSU's four top-20 rankings. Boise State was the only other team in the league to appear in the top-20 of any of aforementioned categories.
- San Diego State has done a good job in close games last three seasons, going 13-9 in games decided by five points or less. In addition, SDSU was 24-9 in games where the margin of victory was 10 points or less.
- Last year when the Aztecs won, it was usually by a wide margin. In the team's 23 victories in 2020-21, 14 were decided by 10 or more points...nine by 15 or more, six by 20 or more and five by 25 or more points.
- In the last three seasons, the Aztecs have posted 51 double-digit margin of victory wins among its 76 total victories... 51 came by 10 or more points, 36 by 15 or more, 22 by 20 or more and 17 by 25 or more points.
- Six Aztecs (Matt Bradley, Nathan Mensah, Lamont Butler, Keshad Johnson, Trey Pulliam & Adam Seiko) made 159 of a possible 160 starts last season. Entering the 2022-23 season, San Diego State will have to replace 32 starting

assignments (31 from Pulliam & 1 from Keith Dinwiddie Jr.).

- The Aztecs were once again the top defensive team in the Mountain West in 2022-23, ranking first in scoring defense (58.1 ppg), field goal percentage defense (.384), 3-point field goal percentage defense (.300), blocked shots (4.75/g), steals (7.47/g) and with a pair of 13-steal games and in total, seven games with double digit steals, also led the conference. In addition, SDSU ranked second in the league in turnover margin (+1.69) and third in scoring margin (+7.28). In conference games only, San Diego State ranked first in scoring defense (58.1 ppg), field goal percentage defense (.374), scoring margin (+9.2), blocked shots (4.71/g) and steals (7.76/g), was second in turnover margin (+2.0) and third in 3-point field goal percentage defense (.306).
- SDSU has posted at least 20 wins 16 times in the last 17 years, 19 times in its Division I history (51 years) and 26 times overall. Head Coach Brian Dutcher has on the San Diego State bench for 17 of those 26 seasons.
- San Diego State has appeared in the NCAA Tournament 11 times and played 17 games (6-11) in the last 21 seasons, in which a national champion was crowned. All 17 of those games have occurred with Brian Dutcher on the sideline and are the most in Mountain West history.
- SDSU has claimed a Mountain West-leading 14 conference titles, including six MW Tournament crowns (2002, 2006, 2010, 2011, 2018 & 2021). In 2022, the Aztecs played in their eighth Mountain West championship game in the last 10 seasons and advanced to the postseason for the 11th time in the last 13 years.
- San Diego State has been one of the elite programs in the nation since the start of the 2010-11 season, posting a cumulative record of 307-100. SDSU's 307 wins & .754 winning percentage are the ninth-best nationally over the last 11 seasons.
- SDSU enters the 2022-23 season having won at least 20 games and advancing to the postseason in 14 (10 NCAA, 4 NIT) of the last 17 years, in which a national champion was crowned. In the last 17 seasons (since the start of the 2005-06 campaign), the Aztecs have won 424 games (tied for ninth most in Division I & one of three teams on the list not in a men's basketball power conference: also Gonzaga & Memphis), an average of 24.9 victories per season.
- The Aztecs have won the Mountain West regular-season crown (outright or shared) seven times (2010-11, 2011-12, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16, 2019-20 & 2020-21) in the last 11 years.

## PLAYER PERSONNEL

- In senior forwards **Nathan Mensah** and **Keshad Johnson**, senior guard **Matt Bradley**, and junior guard **Lamont Butler**, San Diego State returns four of its five starters from its 2021-22 squad. The foursome figures to be included in the team's first five from the outset of the 2022-23 season. Bradley, Mensah and Johnson started all 32 games last year, while Butler finished with 25 starts in 27 appearances due to a mid-season wrist injury.
- **Matt Bradley** returns to The Mesa in 2022-23 with one year of eligibility, after transferring from California prior to last season and taking advantage of the NCAA's offer of an extra year of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The high-scoring guard from San Bernardino, Calif., who **Andy Katz** named one of the **top-25 returners in 2022-23**, earned Mountain West Newcomer of the Year, first-team All-Mountain West, second-team NABC All-District 17, as well as Mountain West All-Tournament honors last season. He was named a national player of the week by both *ESPN* and NCAA March Madness (Andy Katz) for the week ending on March 6 when he averaged 26.7 points, 7.0 rebounds and 2.3 assists in wins at Wyoming, at Nevada and against Fresno State. For the campaign he averaged a team leading 16.9 points on 43.8 percent shooting from the floor, including 40.1 percent from the bonus distance, and made his free throws at a 77.9 percent clip. He was one of six players nationally to average those points and rebounds while at least shooting those percentages. A starter in all 32 games, he reached double figures 26 times, including a career-high 30 points at Wyoming, handing the Cowboys their only home loss during the 2021-22 season. For his career, he has averaged 15.6 points, 4.7 rebounds and 2.0 assists in 100 starts among 117 total appearances.
- **Nathan Mensah**, the reigning Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year, member of the Mountain West All-Defensive Team, and a third-team All-Mountain West honoree, returns to The Mesa as one of the nation's premier defensive players, regardless of position. Last year, he grabbed 6.9 rebounds per contest, totaled 27 steals and rejected 71 shots, all career-bests, **and has been recognized by Andy Katz as one of the top-25 "super seniors" in 2022-23**. A starter in all 32 games last season, he enters 2022-23 just 68 points, 33 rebounds and 29 blocks from becoming only the second player in program history to amass 800 points, 700 rebounds and 200 blocks in his Aztec career. The Accra, Ghana, native currently ranks No. 3 on program's career blocks list with 171 and combined with his 732 points and 667 rebounds is one of six active Division I players who have amassed those three stats, and the only one playing for the same school at which he started his college career. He finished the year in the top-three rankings in 10 categories, including, games, minutes, field goals, field goal attempts, field goal percentage, offensive, defensive and overall rebounding, and blocks.
- **Keshad Johnson**, a 6-7 forward, was the lone scholarship junior on the roster a year ago and was one of three players who started all 32 games. A prototypical Aztec wing, Johnson has strength, is long, gets off the floor quickly, plays above the basket and has worked diligently to improve his shooting this summer. He returns in 2022-23 as the team's third leading rebounder and continues to improve that aspect of his game from his freshman season through last year (30-to-86-to-144 total rebounds). From his freshman to junior campaigns his numbers have improved in points (1.9-to-4.0-to-7.2/game), blocks (1-to-13-to-20), assists (4-to-16-to-32), and field goal percentage (.353-to-.452-to-.553). He is expected to continue his upward trend in 2022-23. Johnson was rated by *ESPN* as a four-star prospect and one of the top-25 high school players in California when he arrived at SDSU.
- **Lamont Butler** is a 6-2 junior point guard, who due to an early season wrist injury appeared in 27 games and started 25. Was the first Aztec true freshman to start back-to-back games since Nathan Mensah on March 15 & 16, 2019 and was just the third freshman in the last five seasons to start a game for SDSU (also: Matt Mitchell & Nathan Mensah). Was playing his best basketball in the seven games prior to his wrist injury scoring 9.7 points on 45.8 percent shooting from the floor, including 47.1 percent from distance, 2.1 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game. A physical guard, he has one of the team's highest vertical leaps and is a nightmare to stop when he gets downhill both on the floor and at the rim. For his career, he averages 5.8 points, 1.9 rebs., 1.8 assists and 1.3 steals, but with a clean bill of health and nearly a year removed from his injury, a big jump in his game is expected in 2022-23.
- **Adam Seiko** returns after taking advantage of the NCAA's offer of an additional year of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic. One of the team's best on-ball defenders, he appeared in 29 of the team's 32 games last season, including seven starts. The 6-3, guard competed for the Ugandan National Team in FIBA AfroBasket 2021 and did again in the 2023 FIBA World Cup qualification Africa in Kigali, Rwanda. Seiko continued to show he is a reliable shooter from the perimeter making 41.3 percent of his shots from the floor (50-of-121), as well as 38-of-94 from three-point range (40.4 percent) last season and has shot 39.8 percent and 37.6 percent from the floor and 3-point range, respectively, for his career. In the last three seasons, he has made multiple treys in 23-of-49 games in which he scored from beyond the arc and when his scores multiple threes, the Aztecs are 20-3. The Boston, Mass., native has committed just 72 turnovers in 1,963 minutes of action, which works out to 1.5 turnovers per 40 minutes played. For his career 99-of-129 buckets (76.7 percent) have been three-pointers.

- **Aguek Arop** returns after taking advantage of the NCAA's offer of an additional year of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The native of Omaha, Neb., and pound-for-pound the strongest player on the roster, averaged 3.5 points, while grabbing a career-high 3.3 rebounds in 15.0 minutes of action per contest. Projecting his stats from last season per 40 minutes played, he averaged 9.4 points, 8.8 rebounds, 1.4 assists and 2.7 steals. For his career (98 games), he has collected nearly as many offensive rebounds (129) as defensive boards (132). Coach Dutcher calls him a "Swiss Army Knife," in that he can do so many different things and does all the things that don't show up in the box score, but that you need to win games.
- With the graduation of Trey Pulliam, Joshua Tomaic and Tahirou Diabate, and the loss of Chad Baker-Mazara head coach **Brian Dutcher** will replace major parts of his roster in 2022-23. The four combined to average 20.0 points, 8.7 rebounds and 4.4 assists last season, but look for transfer guards **Darrion Trammell** from Seattle U and Oakland's **Micah Parrish**, as well as forward **Jaedon LeDee**, a transfer from TCU who sat out last season due to NCAA transfer rules, to replace some of the productivity which has been lost. That trio combined to average 35.3 points, 13.7 rebounds, and 6.8 assists in their last season of Division I competition.
- **Jaedon LeDee** is a 6-9 senior forward who sat out last season due to NCAA transfer rules. The native of Houston, Texas, originally competed for Ohio State in the 2018-19 season, his freshman year. He then transferred to TCU and played for the Horned Frogs in each of the past two seasons. In 79 collegiate games, LeDee has averaged 5.2 points and 3.1 rebounds in 11.0 minutes per game. He has gone 90-of-182 (49.5 percent) from the floor and 112-of-156 (71.8 percent) from the line in his college career. In addition, he has 15 assists, 21 blocks and 23 steals in 869 total minutes. Per 40 minutes played, LeDee averages 13.4 points and 10.2 rebounds. After competing immediately after he transferred from Ohio State to TCU, LeDee will sit out the 2021-22 season due to NCAA transfer rules.
- **Darrion Trammell** is a 5-10 senior guard who transferred to San Diego State over the summer and is immediately available. In two seasons at Seattle U, he was twice named a first team NABC All-District 6, garnered two first-team All-Western Athletic Conference (WAC) and two WAC All-Tournament Team honors to go along with inclusion on the 2020-21 WAC All-Newcomer and 2021-22 All-Defensive Teams. While competing for the Redhawks, he averaged 18.7 points, 5.1 assists, 3.8 rebounds, 3.8 steals in just under 35 minutes per game. He shot 40.6 percent from the floor (309-of-761), 34.6 percent from the bonus distance (101-of-292), and 84.0 percent from the line (289-of-344). In addition, he reached double figure scoring in 49-of-54 career games and scored at least 20 points in 22 of those contests and 30 or more in five, including a career-best 39 in his final game for the Redhawks in the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) tournament. It was also in that game that he surpassed the 1,000-career point plateau.
- **Micah Parrish** is a 6-6 junior wing who joined the Aztecs via the transfer portal from Oakland and has three years of eligibility available. In two seasons at Oakland (Rochester Minn.), he earned inclusion on the Horizon League All-Defensive Team and was twice named the league's freshman of the week in 2020-21. While competing as a Golden Grizzly, he averaged 10.5 points, 5.9 rebounds, 1.3 assists and 1.7 steals in just under 32 minutes per game. He shot 48.4 percent from the floor (207-of-428), 35.2 percent from the bonus distance (62-of-176), and 76.2 percent from the line (141-of-185). In addition, he reached double figure scoring in 33-of-59 career games and scored at least 15 points in 16 of those contests and 20 or more in three, including a 20-point effort in the 2022 Horizon League tournament quarterfinal, his final game for the Golden Grizzlies.
- **Jared Barnett** is a 6-1 non-scholarship senior guard out of Los Angeles' Westchester High, who walked on to the team in 2019-20 and has appeared in 26 contests in three seasons. He has a total of 11 points, seven assists and five steals in a total of 51 minutes of action. At Westchester, he earned second-team All-Western League honors as a senior after averaging 13.0 points, 6.0 assists and 3.0 rebounds per game. As a senior, he helped guide the Comets to a 24-5 record and a birth in the Los Angeles City Section finals.
- **Cade Alger** is a 6-9 non-scholarship junior forward who has averaged 1.1 points and 0.3 rebounds while shooting 50.0 percent (7-of-14 FG) from the floor for his career. Prior to the 2020-21 season, he transferred from Seattle U.
- **Triston Broughton** is a 6-4 non-scholarship junior guard, who was a member of the 2019-20 practice squad which helped the team to a 30-2 record and a final national ranking of No. 6/6 and whose twin brother Tyler is also a member of the Aztecs program. In two seasons he has appeared in eight games, all off the bench. He is the son of former NBA player Chris Mills.
- **Tyler Broughton** is a 6-4 non-scholarship junior guard, who was a member of the 2019-20 practice squad which helped the team to a 30-2 record and a final national ranking of No. 6/6 and whose twin brother Triston is also a member of the Aztecs program. In two seasons he has appeared in nine games, all off the bench. He is the son of former NBA player Chris Mills.
- **Demarshay Johnson Jr.** is a 6-10 forward redshirt freshman out of Salesian College Prep in Richmond, Calif. In four seasons, he helped his team to a 101-12 record, including a 37-0 mark in Tri-County Athletic League (TCAL) play. The program won three TCAL championships and back-to-back (2017-18 & 2018-19) CIF North Coast Section Division III titles. In each of his first three years, Salesian finished the season nationally ranked No. 16 (2017-18), No. 14 (2018-19) and No. 31 (2019-20) according to maxpreps.com. As a junior, Salesian posted a 25-7 record, were TCAL champions with a 10-0 mark, and reached the semifinals of the CIF North Coast Section Open Division playoffs. As a sophomore earned honorable mention All-TCAL distinction as Salesian went 31-1, including 10-0 in league play. A three-star recruit according to Rivals and 247Sports, who also had him rated as the No. 27 center in the nation.
- **Miles Byrd** is a 6-7 guard out of Lincoln High School in Stockton, Calif. and a 4-star rated recruit. At the time of his signing, nationally rated as the No. 162 recruit, the No. 20 shooting guard and No. 15 in California. The lefty is the prototypical Aztec shooting guard. Led Lincoln to a 26-6 record while averaging a team-best 17.2 points, 5.2 rebounds, 2.8 steals, and 1.2 blocks and ranked second with 3.3 assists. His team won the Tri-City Athletic League title and reached the second round of the state Division I tournament.
- **Elijah Saunders** is a 6-8 freshman forward out of Sunnyslope High School in Phoenix, Ariz. and a 4-star rated recruit. At the time of his signing, nationally ranked No. 115 at his position and No. 23 at power forward as well as No. 8 in Arizona according to 247Sports. He has a big body and is equally comfortable down on the block as well as beyond the 3-point line. Saunders can run the floor, has a quick release, and scores with his back to the basket as well as off the bounce. He has shown the ability to attack closeouts, handle the ball, & finish through contact. Led his team to a 25-3 record while averaging a team-high 22.3 points, 8.4 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 0.8 steals. His team won the 6A Southwest League and advanced to the quarterfinal round of the state tournament.
- **Cameron Lawin** is a 6-3 freshman shooting guard who is a non-scholarship player out of Chicago's Orr High. He was a fourth-team *Chicago Sun-Times* All-City Team performer as a senior.

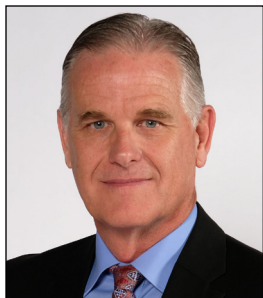

# BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach

Sixth Season • 24th Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher enters his sixth season as San Diego State head men's basketball coach, building on the previous five years in which he led the Aztecs to five title games in Mountain West tournament, its conference-record 11th, 12th, 13th & 14th Mountain West crowns, and to a bid to the NCAA tournament three times. He is the only coach in the 101-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first five seasons. His 119 victories in five seasons (119-40) are the most for any Division I head coach whose first year guiding his current program was 2017-18 and the accompanying win percentage, 74.8 percent, is the highest for any head basketball coach in San Diego State history.

Dutcher has been recognized twice, following the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons, with Mountain West Coach of the Year honors and was the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year in both those years as well. In addition, Dutcher earned USA Today National Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year distinction following the 2019-20 campaign and was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naimsmith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

His teams have faced top-25 ranked opponents on 15 occasions and posted a 9-6 record (60.0 percent) and includes wins over Gonzaga, UCLA and Arizona State as well as Nevada (four times) and Colorado State (twice). Since the start of the 2018-19 season, his Aztecs are 4-2 against Pac-12 opponents and 8-4 in multi-team events in season. Since the start of the 2017-18 season, SDSU has the 14th best home win percentage in the nation (88.3 percent), and in the last three years, San Diego State has posted a 91.1-win percentage (41-4) in Viejas Arena, the ninth best in the nation.

The team's success on the court is reflected in the honors his players have earned under his tutelage. In 2020 Malachi Flynn was a consensus All-American, the third Aztecs to earn that honor and the following season Matt Mitchell was recognized by the Associated Press with the All-American moniker.

San Diego State put a player on the USBWA's All-District IX first team in 2020 (Flynn) and 2021 (Mitchell). The NABC has bestowed its All-District 17 honors seven times to an Aztec in the last five years. In 2019, Jalen McDaniels earned first team designation. Flynn, Yanni Weitzell were first team and Mitchell was second team in 2020. In 2021, Mitchell and Jordan Shakel earned first team and second team honors, respectively and in 2022 Matt Bradley was a second team performer.

Within the Mountain West, Flynn was named the 2020 Mountain West Male Athlete of the Year, Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, Newcomer of the Year and a member of the All-Defensive Team. In the same season, KJ Feagin was named to the all-defensive team and one year prior, Jeremy Hemsley was included on the league's all-defensive team. In 2021, Mitchell earned Mountain West Player of the Year, first team All-Mountain West and inclusion on the all-defensive team along with Nathan Mensah. In 2022, Mensah was the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year and a member of the all-defensive team. Bradley was the Newcomer of the Year. Chad Baker-Mazara was named the Sixth Man of the Year and Lamont Butler garnered all-defensive team honors.

His players have earned 14 all-Mountain West designations and 15 player of the week honors. Two Aztecs, Trey Kell in 2018 and Mitchell in 2021, were named Mountain West tournament MVP among 10 SDSU players who have been included on the league's all-tournament team. In his five seasons, his charges have garnered 14 league all-academic team distinctions with Flynn being named to the 2020 NABC Honors Court.

The 2021-22 campaign featured a 23-9 record and SDSU's second straight appearance in the NCAA tournament and its second consecutive single-digit seed, No. 8. Six of its nine losses were by 6 points or less and after Dec. 8, 2021, five of the team's six defeats were by six points or less. Twice during that stretch, the Aztecs defeated nationally ranked Colorado State.

The team's No. 2 ranking in KenPom's adjusted defensive efficiency was the best for a Dutcher coached team and matched the program's best rating since the start of the 2006-07 season (the team was No. 2 following the 2010-11 campaign). Among its national rankings, SDSU was No. 2 in scoring defense, No. 4 in field goal percentage defense, No. 25 in 3-point field goal percentage defense and No. 32 in blocks per game.

The defensive success was in part due to Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year Nathan Mensah. The Accra, Ghana native averaged 2.2 blocks per game to lead the Mountain West, totaled a career-high 71 blocks for the season, and was No. 5 in offensive rebounds, No. 7 in total rebounds and No. 13 in defensive boards.

Offensively, the team was led by first year player Matt Bradley, who transferred into the program in the summer of 2021. The Mountain West Newcomer of the Year and first-team all-league designee, led the team in virtually every offensive statistical category, including points (542), field goals (186), 3-pointers (57) and free throws (113).

In 2020-21, he guided San Diego State to the Mountain West regular-season and tournament crowns and earned a No. 6-seed in the NCAA tournament. The Aztecs went 23-5 and finished the regular season ranked No. 7 in field goal percentage defense (.387), No. 8 in scoring defense (60.6), No. 12 in scoring margin (+13.5), No. 14 in total steals (233), and No. 16 in turnover margin (+3.9) nationally. Among the Mountain West teams, San Diego State led the league in turnovers forced (15.15), steals per game (8.19), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.25:1), three-point field goal percentage (.381), field goal percentage defense, scoring defense, scoring margin, turnover margin and total steals. The team posted a 14-game win streak, which is the fourth longest in school history and is the third of at least nine games under Dutcher.

The 2019-20 squad ripped off a program-record 26-straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both national polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2, including 17-1 in Mountain West play.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the third most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game

winning streak, which set a new Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus second-team All-American Malachi Flynn, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blowout victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the championship game. A month later, three days after Utah defeated then No. 6 Kentucky, the Aztecs handed the Utes a 28-point drubbing in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic.

With the expected return for the postseason of forward Nathan Mensah, who had been sidelined for the final 19 games of the year, San Diego State was poised for a deep run in the NCAA Tournament. The Aztecs were projected to be either a No. 1 or No. 2 seed and some felt were a Final Four team, but the coronavirus pandemic put an end to the postseason and fans were left to wonder what could have been.

In 2017-18, his first season as head coach, he was the only Division I coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament after going 22-10 in the regular season, including winning the 2018 Mountain West Tournament championship.

Over the course of his 23 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 16 times, including 11 trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 14 Mountain West titles and record 17 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, SDSU has twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games eight times and captured 11 MW championships (seven regular season, four tournament).

In his first year on The Mesa (1999-00) the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the program's first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 campaign that produced the school's first MW regular-season and tournament title sweep. The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.
