►TV/Radio/Stats: The game will be televised live on The Mtn. with Ann Schatz (play-by-play) and Andrea Lloyd (analysis) calling the action, while Jerry Weinstein is producing. The contest will also be carried live locally on Xtra Sports 1360 AM with Chris Ello from Cox Arena. Live stats are available via SDSU's official website www.goaztecs.com. There will be <u>no</u> video streaming for Friday's contest.

► The Records: With a current five-game win streak and an unbeaten record at home, the Aztec basketball team faces its toughest challenge thus far, as San Diego State entertains second-ranked Connecticut Friday at Cox Arena, beginning at 8 p.m. SDSU is coming off its third win of 25 or more points, cruising to a 91-33 victory over Navy on Tuesday in its third of six home games slated for the month of December. At 8-1, the Aztecs are off to their best start since the 1992-93 season, but face an undefeated UConn squad that has notched wins over a pair of top 15 teams and leads the nation six stat categories, including scoring margin (41.6 ppg.).

► SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns: Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the third year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 255-189 in 15 seasons, while she is 174-124 in her 10 previous campaigns at SDSU.

► Connecticut Head Coach Geno Auriemma: Auriemma is in his 23rd season at UConn, boasting a school and career record of 629-120. He is 0-1 all-time versus San Diego State.

► Connecticut Series History: San Diego State claimed the only prior meeting between the two sides, beating Connecticut, 69-64, on Nov. 27, 1987, in a tournament hosted by the University of Maine in Orono, Maine.

Aztec Basketball Entertains No. 2 Connecticut Friday At Cox Arena

The San Diego State women's basketball team ends its pre-holiday slate with its toughest challenge thus far this season, as the Aztecs play host to the No. 2 ranked team in the nation in the Connecticut Huskies Friday at 8 p.m. PST at Cox Arena. The game will be televised live on The Mtn., while Xtra Sports 1360 AM will also be carrying the contest live on the radio.

San Diego State logged its fifth straight victory and improved to a perfect 4-0 at home with a 91-33 rout of Navy Tuesday in the Aztecs' first game since a 13-day break for final exams. SDSU is 8-1 on the year, but faces an undefeated Connecticut team that is beating its opponents by more than 40 points a game.

vincing fashion, posting a 91-33 victory over Navy Tuesday at Cox Arena. With the win, the Aztecs claimed their fifth straight and improved to 8-1 on the year, while the Midshipmen, who suited up a depleted squad due to illness, fell to 2-10 in 2007-08.

San Diego State had three players finish in double-figure scoring, including senior Shanna Demus (Palmdale, Calif.), who scored a team-high 15 points on 7-for-8 shooting in just 16 minutes of action. Freshman center Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.) chipped in 12 points. while sophomore quard **Kim Spinardi** (Merced, Calif.) came off the bench to add a career-high 11 points, including a 3-for-3 performance from beyond the arc.

The Aztecs, who are entered the week ranked second in the nation in steals per game, had 20 against the Mids, with five of those coming via redshirt frosh Allison Duffy (Lakeside, Calif.). Senior Shannon Clay (Inglewood, **Calif.)** had a game-high nine rebounds and sophomores Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.) and Jené Morris (San Francisco, Calif.) each added five assists.

After the two-sides traded buckets to open the evening, San Diego State went on a 20-0 run just over five minutes into the game for the 20-2 advantage. The Aztecs led by as many as 31 in the opening half, including at intermission, 45-14.

SDSU scored the first 11 points coming out of the locker room to go up by 42 at 56-14 at the 16:13 mark. The Aztec lead would grow to as many as 58 points before securing the 91-33 victory.

Other Navy Notes

All 11 players saw action for SDSU for the fourth time this season ... The Aztecs have had 11 players score at least a point in the same game twice in 2007-08 (also vs. Southern Utah) ... SDSU made 80 percent or more of its free throws for the third time this year and for the second game in a row. The Aztecs only shot above 80 percent in two games all of last year ... San Diego State has allowed three or fewer three-pointers in seven of nine outings, including each of its last five games ... Sophomore Kim Spinardi is the eighth different SDSU player to log a double-figure scoring game this year ... SDSU has not trailed at any point in four of its nine contests.

The Numbers Game

San Diego State produced several notable numbers in Tuesday's game with Navy including: -The Aztecs' 91 points are a season-high and the program's most since also scoring 91 versus Utah Valley State in 2005.

- The 58-point margin of victory is San Diego State's highest since a 97-35 win over Fresno State in 1995.
- Navy's 33 points are the fewest the Aztecs have allowed since a 57-30 victory against Air Force in 2001.
- SDSU's 46 points in the second half were a season high, as was its 31-point halftime advantage.
- SDSU tallied a season-best 10 turnovers, 38 field goals, 56.7 field-goal percentage and 28 assists.

What The W's Mean

▶ SDSU is 8-1, the team's best start since also opening the 1992-93 campaign with a 8-1 mark. The 1992-93 squad went 9-1, before falling in its next outing.

With eight non-conference wins, San Diego State has already surpassed its season total from a year ago. The eight non-conference victories are the program's most since the 2001-02 squad also claimed eight. The Aztecs are 15-5 in games played at Cox Arena over the last two campaigns.

SDSU recorded its first victory on a neutral court since Nov. 29, 2002, when the Aztecs defeated Murray State in Fresno, 59-54. The Aztecs had dropped their previous seven outings in neutral site games.

The Aztecs have won three road games, its most in a season since the 2003-04 squad won four times in opponent's arenas.

SDSU won its season-opener for the first time 2002, and claimed its home-opener for the first time in the last three years.

► The Aztecs are 5-0 against teams it also faced last season. SDSU was 3-2 versus Nevada, Saint Mary's, USD, Southern Utah and Cal Poly a year ago.

The Aztecs are 14-2 in their last 16 games against non-conference opponents with the lone losses coming earlier this year versus Indiana State and in the championship game of the 2006 Surf 'N Slam tournament against No. 17/16 George Washington.

Since head coach Beth Burns' return, San Diego State is a combined 11-5 in games played during the

month of December, with four of those losses coming during the 3-24 campaign in 2005-06.

Aztecs At No. 2

San Diego State entered the week ranked first in the Mountain West Conference and second in the nation in steals per game. With its 20-steal performance against Navy Tuesday, the Aztecs have 144 steals (16.0/g) on the year, tallying at least 13 in all nine contests.

The team's 23 steals versus Southern Utah and 20 steals against Navy are the two best performances by an MWC school thus far in 2007-08. The 23 steals are the team's most since also posting 23 versus Long Island University on Dec. 27, 1996. The total is second all-time in the MWC since the league began, trailing only Colorado State's 24-steal effort in 2001 against Sacramento State.

Individually, Jené Morris (3.4) and Quenese Davis (3.0) are first and second in the conference and entered the week 15th and 33rd nationally in steals per game. Teammate Allison Duffy isn't far behind with 2.89 thefts per outing to rank her third in the league and 75th in the nation.

A year ago, San Diego State had 10 or more steals in a game 13 times. The school record for most steals in a season is 555 by the 1983-84 team.

Offensive Production 101

In a stark contrast from a year ago when the Aztecs averaged just 56.1 points per game and shot only 37 percent from the field, SDSU is leading the Mountain West with 74.7 points per outing and is second with

a 46.9 field-goal percentage thus far in 2007-08. The Aztecs have scored 60 or more points in all but one contest, reaching the 80-point barrier on four occasions. They have shot above 40 percent from the field in all but two outings, barely missing in the wins over Cal Poly and Jackson State (39.7 percent).

Below are a few notes about the Aztecs' offensive number so far this season:

► SDSU's 91 points versus Navy are its most since also tallying 91 in a win over Utah Valley State on Feb. 10, 2005. The Aztecs have record-

ed four games with 80 or more points for the first time since 1996-97, when SDSU had five such outings. SDSU also has three wins of 30 points or more for the first time since 1996-97.

► SDSU has shot above 50 percent three times and above 40 percent from the field in seven of nine games. The Aztecs only reached the 40 percent mark 11 times a year ago, posting an 8-3 record in those outings. The last time San Diego State shot over 40 percent from the field in four straight games was in 2001, when the Aztecs opened the campaign with five straight performances. SDSU's 56.7 shooting percentage versus Navy is the second-best in the league this year and the program's highest since the Utah Valley game (57.1). ► San Diego State scored 60 or more points in seven consecutive games for the first time since also post-

ing a seven-game stint in 1995-96 from Dec. 27-Jan. 13.

The Aztecs have scored 40 or more points in a half eight times after reaching the barrier twice a year ago.
 SDSU has 20 or more assists in three outings, including a league-high 28 against Navy. The 28 assists are the team's most in a game since it also had 28 on Feb. 1, 1997 vs. San Jose State. San Diego State ranks first in the MWC (18.6) and began the week 18th nationally in that category.

Turnover Town

Another category in which the Aztecs continue to lead the conference is in turnover margin. SDSU is aver-

aging 7.44 fewer turnovers per game than its opponents, forcing 254 overall (28.2/g). The Aztecs have forced at least 23 turnovers in all nine contests, including highs of 37 against Nevada and 35 versus Southern Utah. A year ago, San Diego State opponents had 20 or more turnovers on 11 occasions. On the flip side, SDSU committed just 10 turnovers in the win over Navy, the team's fewest since it had nine versus Canisius in Jan. 2005.

Another Block Party?

After leading the MWC in blocks per game in both overall and league-only outings in 2006-07, San Diego State looks like it is well on its way to doing the same again this season. In the opening nine games, the Aztecs has 48 total blocks by eight different players, ranking first in the league (5.3) and 19th nationally. True freshman Paris Johnson has provided the bulk of the work with 16 to her credit, including five at

Nevada, which tied for eighth in school single-game history.

San Diego State ranked 35th nationally with 4.6 blocks per game a year ago. The team's 129 blocks were the program's most since tallying 159 in 1994-95.

Accuracy Beyond The Arc

While SDSU may average just 4.8 three-pointers per game, the Aztecs have been more accurate than in recent seasons from beyond the arc, making 36.4 percent of their shots, which ties for first in the conference. SDSU has made more than 50 percent of its shots from beyond the arc in three outings this season. Senior Shanna Demus ranks first in the league in three-point field goal percentage, converting 10 of her 20 attempts. Demus shot just 25.3 percent from three-point land last year (21-for-83).

On The Glass

The Aztecs have owned an advantage in the rebounding column in six games so far this season. For the year, the team is +2.9 in rebounding margin and has posted 20 or more boards on the offensive glass twice. San Diego State outrebounded its opponent only eight times in 28 outings in 2006-07.

Winning ... The Second Half

The Aztecs have won the scoring battle in the second half in each of their nine contests thus far. SDSU is outscoring its opponents, 336-235, in the second 20-minute period. In 2006-07, San Diego State was 9-1 when scoring more points in the second half, with the lone exception being against BYU in late January.

Young Guns

SDSU has started two freshmen, two sophomores and one senior in its first nine games of 2007-08. The Aztecs' starting lineup in its season opener with Nevada was the program's youngest since the 1983-84 campaign, when the team had three freshmen, one sophomore and one junior among the starting five.

This year's group has just five years of experience, with only four coming at the Division I level as Shanna Demus played her first season at Div. II Cal State Los Angeles. The Aztecs' four newcomers, **Coco Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)**, Allison Duffy, Paris Johnson and Jené Morris, have combined for 51.5 percent of the team's scoring and 47.4 percent of its rebounding.

What A Crowd

San Diego State has already broken one home attendance record this season and is looking to improve on

that one and break another this Friday against Connecticut. The Aztecs had 2,397 fans turn out for their game with Cal State Fullerton back on Dec. 2, which established a new Cox Arena record with the previous high being 1,280 against Hawai'i on January 23, 1999.

Aztecs Ink Four In Front Court

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Wednesday of four prep standouts to National Letters of Intent. Candace Chambers (Seattle, Wash.), Gabrielle Clark (Los Angeles, Calif.), Lindsay Leo (San Jose, Calif.) and Kalena Tutt (Long Beach, Calif.) will join the Aztecs in 2008.

Preseason Points

SDSU women's basketball center Paris Johnson was picked as the Mountain West Conference's top freshman for the upcoming season in a vote by the league's nine head coaches and select media members released Oct. 17, at the conference's annual media day in Littleton, Colo. As a team, the Aztecs were tabbed to finish seventh for the third year in a row in the MWC preseason poll. SDSU, which ended up seventh during the 2006-07 regular season, earned 93 points from the panel. Wyoming was tabbed as the preseason favorite for the first time in MWC history after winning the WNIT championship a year ago, receiving 24 of 30 first-place votes and 203 total points.

Listen/Watch Live

For the seventh straight year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live playby-play of nearly every regular season game (home and away) over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU alum Chris Ello will take over the play-by-play duties both at home and on the road, with former Aztec women's basketball standout Tammy Blackburn providing analysis at selected home games. Blackburn is in her 13th year of covering SDSU women's basketball.

Again in 2007-08, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of the two televised games, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Cox Arena on **www.goaztecs.com**.

SDSU's game with Connecticut on Dec. 21, will be carried live on Xtra Sports 1360 AM. There will be no live video for the contest with the Huskies, as the outing will be shown live on The Mtn.

Burns Gets New Contract

Beth Burns, the winningest head coach in Aztec women's basketball history, signed a new five-year contract, San Diego State Director of Athletics Jeff Schemmel announced Sept. 12. The contract is effective immediately and runs through the 2011-12 campaign.

Pair Added To Aztec Coaching Staff

SDSU head coach Beth Burns added a pair to her staff this past summer. Heidi VanDerveer, who has over 20 years of experience on both the collegiate and professional levels, was named associate head coach on Aug. 29. VanDerveer comes to San Diego State from the Seattle Storm, where she recently completed her second season as an assistant coach. Tara Morrison joined the staff as the team's head manager after two seasons as an assistant coach at Binghamton University in New York and four at the University of Maine.

Last Year's Team Milestones

SDSU finished as the 11th most-improved team in Division I, going from 3 to 12 victories in 2006-07.

► The Aztecs posted the biggest turnaround in back-to-back seasons in league history, claiming five Mountain West Conference victories after going winless in 2005-06.

► SDSU's 12 wins are the program's most since 2000-01 ... The team's 11 victories at home are the most since 1996-97 ... The five conference victories are the most since 2000-01 ... The Aztecs' six-game win streak is the team's longest since 2000-01 ... Its seven non-conference wins are its most since 2001-01.

SDSU led the MWC in blocks in both overall and conference only contests, ranking 35th nationally.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 2005. In just two short years, she already has the program headed in the right direction, as the Aztecs' were the 11th-most improved team in the nation in 2007, and recorded the school's most wins since 2000-01.

In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 15-year overall head coaching record of 255-189, while her school record stands at 174-124 over 10 seasons. Burns recently earned her 250th career victory with the team's win vs. Southern Utah.

San Diego St. 67, Nevada 61

RENO, Nev. - In a game featuring two schools with high pressure defenses, the San Diego State women's basketball team survived a stern test in its 2007-08 opener, defeating host Nevada, 67-61, Sunday afternoon at the Lawlor Events Center. The Aztecs claimed their first game of a campaign for the first time since 2002, to improve to 1-0, while the Wolf Pack dropped to 1-1 overall.

San Diego State got a huge game from a pair of players making their collegiate debuts. Freshman center Paris Johnson had 16 points, nine rebounds and five blocks in 38 minutes. Redshirt frosh Allison Duffy scored 10 of her 14 points in the second half, while sophomore Quenese Davis was the third Aztec in double-figures with a team-best 17 points.

Sophomore Jené Morris , who played her first game in an Aztec uniform, notched a game-high seven steals. Junior guard Tamika Lipford provided a solid performance off the bench, recording six points, two steals and two rebounds, one of which came on a critical play with 12 seconds left in the game.

SDSU started off the year by scoring the first basket on a jumper by Morris. Nevada countered with a pair of free throws, but the Aztecs answered again in a back-and-forth first half.

The visitors led by as many as five points at the 7:53 mark at 26-21, but the host went into the locker room on a 15-8 run to end the half with a two-point 36-34 advantage.

The Aztecs struggled to find their offensive rhythm coming out of the break, taking five and a half minutes to hit their first field goal. SDSU used that bucket to start a 9-0 run to knot the game at 43-43 and take a two-point lead at 45-43 with 11:32 remaining.

The two sides were tied again at 45 points, but the Aztecs maintained an advantage the rest of the way. SDSU was up by five points on four occasions, including as late as 59-54, but Nevada came to within a pair with 2:39 left and again with 45 seconds remaining. The Aztecs made six of their final eight free-throw attempts to preserve the 67-61 victory.

Nevada was led by Cherlanda Franklin's 12 points and seven rebounds. The Aztecs avenged a loss to the Wolf Pack in last year's season-opener in San Diego.

MORAGA, Calif. - The San Diego State women's basketball team had five players score in double-figures in a 83-60 victory over Saint Mary's in Moraga, Calif. SDSU is now 2-0 for the first time since the 1992-93 season, while the Gaels fell to 2-2.

Five players reached double-figures in scoring for the Aztecs, who jumped out to a 46-29 lead at the half.

Sophomore Jené Morris led the way with a game-high 17 points on 7-of-12 shooting, including 2-of-3 behind the 3-point arc.

Redshirt freshman Allison Duffy, playing in her second career game, had 13 points and a game-high 10 rebounds for her first double-double. Senior Shanna Demus had 13 points and three steals, while sophomore Quenese Davis chipped in with 12 points, five rebounds, five steals and three assists in just 24 minutes. Senior Shannon Clay added 10 points off the bench.

The Gaels never got closer than 12 in the second half, as San Diego State won its second road game of the season for the first time since it won four away from Montezuma Mesa in the 2003-04 campaign.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team forced 35 turnovers and had all 11 of its players score points, as the Aztecs cruised to an 86-52 victory over Southern Utah in their home opener Tuesday at Cox Arena. SDSU improved to 3-0 on the season, giving head coach Beth Burns her 250th career win, while the Thunderbirds fell to 1-3 overall in 2007-08.

San Diego State had three players finish in double-figure points, including leading scorer freshman center Paris Johnson, who had 14 points and a team-best six rebounds and two blocks. Senior forward Shanna Demus recorded 10 of her 12 points in the first half, while freshman forward Allison Duffy contributed 10 points off the bench.

The Aztecs logged a season-high eight 3-pointers, 23 steals and 26 assists. Sophomore Jené Morris led the defensive effort with a career-tying seven steals to go with her team-high nine assists and no turnovers in just 21 minutes of action.

SDSU got off to a quick start and never looked back, jumping out to an early 12-0 lead, before Southern Utah could get on the board with a layup at the 16:21 mark. The Aztecs went on an 18-7 run over the next seven minutes to go up by 21 at 30-9, and led by 25 at the break, 43-18.

The Thunderbirds cut their deficit down to as few 17 points with 9:19 remaining at 59-42, but the Aztecs responded with a 4 0 run with back-to-back baskets from Duffy and finished on a 21-8 scoring streak to claim their fifth-straight in the series, 86-52.

Southern Utah's Anne Westwood had a double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds, while Erin Heuett contributed 11 points and four assists in the losing effort.

LOS ANGELES - The San Diego State women's basketball team cut a 19-point second-half deficit to just four, but was unable to complete the comeback as the Aztecs dropped their first game of season to Indiana State, 75-68, at Gersten Pavilion. SDSU fell to 3-1 on the year, while the Sycamores improved to 3-0 following the first game of the LMU Ayres Hotel Thanksgiving Tournament.

Aztec freshman Paris Johnson had a career-high 27 points and 13 rebounds for her first career double-double. Johnson's 27 points are the most by an SDSU player since Michelle Strawberry had 29 in the 2005-06 season-opener. Sophomore Jené Morris was the only other Aztec in double-figures with 11 points, including a pair of three-pointers, to go with her three steals.

SDSU had four of its five starters foul out by the end of the game, including point guard Quenese Davis, who was limited to just four points in 20 minutes, but still managed to contribute four steals and four assists.

The Sycamores got off to an early lead, making six of their first seven shots from the field including a 3-for-3 effort from beyond the arc to jump ahead by eight at 15-7 heading into the first timeout. The Aztecs rallied to get back to within three at 15-12 on a triple by Demus at the 14:51 mark and trailed by four with 12:38 remaining in the first half. Indiana State, however, went on a 10-0 run, hitting two more three pointers to go up 28-18.

ISU boasted its largest lead at the break, heading into the locker room up by 18 at 45-27, after shooting 55.2 percent from the field and making 7-of-8 three-point attempts.

The Aztecs got off to a quick start in the second half, scoring four straight points on a pair of lay ups by Johnson and limiting the Sycamores to just six points in the first six minutes of play. SDSU was able to make a further dent into its deficit with the help of a 9-0 run to get to within 10 at 54-44.

After the two sides traded trips to the free-throw line, San Diego State continued to stalemate the Indiana State offense, going on another 3-0 run to get to within seven at 56-49.

ISU countered with a 5-0 outburst of its own and was leading by 14 points as late as 66-52. A three-pointer by Morris sparked the Aztec rally again, as SDSU closed to within just four with 26 seconds left in the game. The Sycamores closed out the win by making three of their four free throws to claim the 75-68 victory.

San Diego State owned the advantage on the boards (40-36), in the steals department (13-6) and in the turnover column (23-19), but the Sycamores made eight three-pointers and converted 23 of their 35 trips to the charity line.

The San Diego State women's basketball team outscored Cal Poly 42-27 in the second half to rally from a nine-point deficit, as the Aztecs improved to 5-1 overall with an 80-70 victory over the Mustangs Thursday at Mott Gym. SDSU owned a 20-12 advantage on the offensive glass and made eight three-pointers for its seventh consecutive win over Cal Poly, which dropped to 3-4 in 2007-08.

Aztec point guard Quenese Davis scored 14 of her team-high 21 points in the second half, matching the best offensive output of her career. Davis converted 11 of her 12 free-throw attempts and added four rebounds and four steals. Three other SDSU players finished in double-figure points, including freshman center Paris Johnson (17 points), sophomore guard Jené Morris (11 pts.) and freshman forward Allison Duffy (10 pts.).

The Aztecs shot 39.7 percent from the field for the second game in a row, but countered with 26 second-chance points and recorded a season-best 88 percent performance (22-for-25) at the stripe. SDSU matched its best start since 1995-96 with five wins in its first six outings following its final non-conference road game of 2007-08.

After Cal Poly scored the first bucket to begin the night, the Aztecs reeled off six straight points to jump ahead 6-2. The Mustangs ended the run with a pair of free throws, but SDSU scored four more on back-to-back baskets by Johnson. Cal Poly put together its own offensive string, recording eight straight points to take a 12-10 advantage.

The schools traded leads four more times, before Cal Poly jumped ahead for the rest of the half, going up by as many as nine at 39-30, before heading into the locker room up five, 43-38. The Mustangs ended the half shooting 58.3 percent from the field and made 13 of their 14 free-throws (92.9 percent).

After Cal Poly once again opened the half with the first two points, SDSU responded with a triple by Davis, followed by two straight lay ups from Johnson to tie the game at 45-45.

Trailing by one, the Aztecs nailed back-to-back three-pointers to gain their first lead since early in the first half at 53-49. SDSU would go up by six on two occasions, before running out to the largest advantage of the night by either side at 67-57, following two Davis free throws.

Cal Poly made it interesting by getting to within six at 67-61 with just over three minutes left, but SDSU got four straight points from Allison Duffy and made 7-of-8 free-throws in the final 1:28 to secure the 80-70 win.

San Diego St. 76, CS Fullerton 45 Game 7 = Dec. 2 = Cox Arena = San Diego, Calif.

SAN DIEGO - In front of a Cox Arena record crowd of 2,397, the San Diego State women's basketball team kicked off its monthlong homestand with a 76-45 victory over visiting Cal State Fullerton at Cox Arena. The Aztecs had five players score in double-figures to help the team move to 6-1 on the season for its best start since the 1992-93 campaign. The Titans, meanwhile, dropped to 1-5 on the year, losing their sixth straight against the Aztecs.

SDSU sophomore point guard Quenese Davis posted her first double-double of the season and the third of her career with 10 points on 4-for-5 shooting, and a career-high 12 assists. Her 12 assists are the most by an Aztec since Shannon Lee had 14 helpers against Illinois State on Nov. 24, 2000.

Four other Aztecs logged double-figures in points, including redshirt freshman Allison Duffy, who matched her career-best with 15 points, and freshman center Paris Johnson, who added 12 points and a team-high seven rebounds. Sophomore guard Jené Morris was the fourth starter in double-figures with 10 points, while junior LaSandra Dixon matched her career-high with 10 points off the bench.

Cal State Fullerton owned three, one-point advantages in the opening two minutes of the game, including at 5-4 on a layup by Ashley Richie. The Aztecs took the lead on a Quenese Davis bucket, but a Toni Thomas free-throw equalized the game at six points apiece. SDSU broke out of that tie with a 13-0 run and led by as many as 21 points, before heading into the locker room up 19 at 41-22.

Duffy opened the second half with each of San Diego State's first three baskets, as the host led by 25 with 17:47 remaining. The Aztec advantage reached 30 points on a three-pointer from Coco Davis at the 9:37 mark and peaked at 38 points at 76-38, before SDSU finished the afternoon with its second victory of 30 points or more this season at 76-45.

San Diego State shot a season-best 55.7 percent from the field and limited Cal State Fullerton to an opponent season-low 45 points. The Aztecs also forced 27 turnovers, had 21 assists and made four of their seven shots from beyond the arc.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team won their fourth straight and remained perfect at home following a tough 58-53 victory over rival University of San Diego at Cox Arena. The Aztecs won for the first time in their last six meetings with the Toreros to improve to 7-1 on the year, while the visitors fell to 4-4 on the season.

SDSU redshirt freshman Allison Duffy led the Aztecs in both scoring and rebounding with 14 points and six boards. Freshman center Paris Johnson and sophomore guard Quenese Davis both reached double-figures with 10 and 11 points, respectively. Davis had a game-high seven assists, while classmate Jené Morris contributed four of the Aztecs' 13 steals in just 18 minutes of action.

USD's Sam Child began the game with the hot hand, scoring each of her team's first nine points as the Toreros led by four early at 9-5. The visitors were up by as many as five at 16-11, before the Aztecs came storming back with an 8-2 run to take their first lead of the night at 19-18. The advantage changed hands two more times, before SDSU headed into the locker room up four at 29-25. After a bucket by Torero Kiva Herman to open the second half,

After a bucket by lorero kiva Herman to open the second han, SDSU scored 11 unanswered points to build its largest lead of the evening at 40-27. USD would get to within three points on two occasions, including as late as 39 seconds remaining and the score 56-53. After securing a critical defensive rebound, Davis made both of her free-throw shots with 10 seconds left, as the Aztecs claimed the 58-53 win.

San Diego State held USD without a three-point field goal, as the Toreros were 0-for-4 from beyond the arc, compared to the Aztecs' 4-for-9 performance, three of which came in the second half. USD is the second SDSU opponent this season to fail to record a three-pointer, as Southern Utah also went without a triple.

SAN DIEGO - After a 13-day break for final exams, the San Diego State women's basketball team retook the court in convincing fashion, posting a 91-33 victory over Navy Tuesday at Cox Arena. With the win, the Aztecs claimed their fifth straight and improved to 8-1 on the year, while the Midshipmen, who suited up a depleted squad due to illness, fell to 2-10 in 2007-08.

San Diego State had three players finish in double-figure scoring, including senior Shanna Demus, who scored a team-high 15 points on 7-for-8 shooting in just 16 minutes of action. Freshman center Paris Johnson chipped in 12 points, while sophomore guard Kim Spinardi came off the bench to add a career-high 11 points, including a 3-for-3 performance from beyond the arc.

The Aztecs, who are entered the week ranked second in the nation in steals per game, had 20 against the Mids, with five of those coming via redshirt frosh Allison Duffy. Senior Shannon Clay had a game-high nine rebounds and sophomores Quenese Davis and Jené Morris each added five assists.

After the two-sides traded buckets to open the evening, San Diego State went on a 20-0 run just over five minutes into the game for the 20-2 advantage. The Aztecs led by as many as 31 in the opening half, including at intermission, 45-14.

SDSU scored the first 11 points coming out of the locker room to go up by 42 at 56-14 at the 16:13 mark. The Aztec lead would grow to as many as 58 points before securing the 91-33 victory.

The Aztecs' 91 points are a season-high and the program's most since also scoring 91 versus Utah Valley State in 2005. The 58-point margin of victory is San Diego State's highest since a 97-35 win over Fresno State in 1995, while the Midshipmen's 33 points are the fewest the Aztecs have allowed since a 57-30 victory against Air Force in 2001.
