# AZULAY SPEARHEADS A CROSS COUNTRY REVIVAL IN 2005

Bolstered by a crop of talented newcomers, the San Diego State women's cross country team fashioned one of its best seasons ever in 2005. Fielding perhaps its deepest squad in recent years, several individual and team milestones were reached during a memorable

campaign. Aztec runners repeatedly established careerbest times while helping SDSU make its first-ever appearance in the regional polls.

"We had a tremendous season," SDSU coach Jennifer Nanista said. "We never once backed off during any meet this year. We went up against some tough competition and we now know that we can run with some of the best teams in the country."

The Aztecs' first team title in two years was among the many highlights for the scarlet and black in 2005. SDSU cap-Santa tured the Clara Invitational and finished no worse than seventh place in its six other scoring meets. The strong performances did not go unnoticed as the Aztecs were ranked as high as eighth in the west region according to the Women's Intercollegiate Cross Country Aztecs' best-ever showing at a regional meet as SDSU placed

seventh out of 30 teams at the NCAA West Regional championships. Individually, Lital Azulay quickly established herself as one of the elite runners in school history. In her first cross country season on The Mesa, the sophomore transfer from Coastal Carolina was SDSU's top finisher in all six races she ran, including an individual title at the Santa Clara Invitational. She posted three of the school's top-10 fastest times in the 6K distance and two of the school's top-10 times in the 5K. For her efforts, Azulay was twice named Mountain West Conference Runner of the Week, becoming just the second Aztea along with Marie Nilsson to be honored twice with the award in the same season.

At the MWC championships, Azulay earned first-team all-conference honors, becoming just the second SDSU runner other than Nilsson to receive first-team honors. The Holon, Israel, native capped off the year at the NCAA regional meet by recording the school's second-fastest 6K mark (21:05.80), garnering all-region honors with her top-25 finish.

Azulay was not the only Aztec to play a significant role in 2005. After finishing as the team's top runner at the Fullerton Season Opener, junior Lisa Crampton cemented herself as the team's No.2 runner, trailing only Azulay in five of the next six races. The transfer from Belmont University finished second overall at the Santa Clara Invite and recorded personal bests at the Willamette Invitational (5K - 17:32.60) and NCAA West Regional (6K - 21:32.30), with the latter ranking fourth on the school's all-time list.

Senior Christal Cuadra made her final cross country race as an Aztec a memorable one, setting a 6K career best (21:50.90) at the NCAA regional meet which ranked as the sixth-fastest time in school history. Cuadra was also the team's second finisher at the Aztec Invitational.

Sophomore Lisa Naucler and junior Sarah Belger were another pair of newcomers who enjoyed a productive season. Naucler posted two

of the team's top-10 5K times of 2005 and finished in the top five on the team in six of seven races, while Belger was the squad's No. 3 finisher at the MWC meet.

SDSU also received steady performances from juniors Celeste Tyson and Sara Cates. Tyson logged career bests in both the 5K (18:28.33) and 6K (22:20.60) at the Santa Clara Invitational and NCAA regional meet, respectively. Cates, meanwhile, recorded a career-best mark of 23:15.10 at the MWC championships, a two-minute improvement from the same meet in 2004.

### SDSU Cross Country Takes Fifth At The 2005 MWC CHAMPIONSHIPS

The San Diego State women's cross country team recorded its best finish in five years, placing fifth overall (134 points) at the 2005 Mountain West Conference championships on Oct. 29, at Collindale Golf Course in Fort Collins, Colo. Eighthranked Brigham Young won the 6,000meter race with 23 points, easily outdistancing runner-up New Mexico (74 pts.)

"I was pleased with the way we raced today," SDSU coach Jennifer Nanista said. "The effort was certainly there and I couldn't be happier for our runners. We had some excellent times, so I think we'll be in good shape heading into regionals."

Sophomore Lital Azulay recorded the best-ever 6K time by an Aztec at the MWC championships, coming in fifth out of 66 runners in 21:14.20 eclipsing Marie Nilsson's 21:53 clocking set at the 2003 meet. As a result of her finish, Azulay became just the second SDSU runner joining Nilsson to ever earn first-team all-MWC honors. Her 21:14 effort was also a careerbest and ranks third all-time in school histo-

Azulay was helped by junior Lisa Aztec to cross the finish line at the 2005 Crampton, who came in 21st overall with a personal-best time of 22:05.40. Fellow

classmates Sarah Belger (33rd - 22:37.10) and Sara Cates (42nd - 23:15.10) also logged career bests for the Aztecs. Rounding out the SDSU contingent was senior Christal Cuadra (44th - 23:19.40), sophomore Lisa Naucler (49th - 23:36.00) and junior Celeste Tyson (54th - 23:57.60).

BYU's Heidi Magill claimed the individual title with a winning effort of 20:42.40. She was followed by teammate Chelsea Smith-McKell (20:59.20), who helped the Cougars win their seventh straight MWC title in as many chances.

Junior Lisa Crampton was the second Mountain West Conference championships.
