AZTECS OPEN ROCKY LONG ERA IN PRIME-TIME HOME GAME AGAINST CAL POLY

San Diego State opens its 89th season of inter-collegiate football, its 43rd at the Division I level and first under head coach Rocky Long on Saturday night against Cal Poly at Qualcomm Stadium. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. PT and will mark the first regular-season game played at Qualcomm Stadium in 2011.

When the Aztecs last left Qualcomm Stadium, 254 days ago on gameday, they were putting the finishing touches on a magical season by comfortably defeating Navy, 35-14, in the 2010 Poinsettia Bowl. The bowl game victory, the school's first since 1969, capped a nine-win season, its' most victories since the 1977 campaign.

Shortly after the completion of the season, the Aztecs named Long as the school's 18th head coach. Long served the previous two seasons on Montezuma Mesa as the defensive coordinator and ushered in the program's dramatic turnaround on that side of the ball.

Joining Long are 37 returning letterwinners, including 14 returning starters, from the 2010 squad. Among that group are four student-athletes who appear on national watch lists - senior linebacker **Miles Burris**, sophomore running back **Ronnie Hillman**, senior quarterback **Ryan Lindley** and senior place-kicker **Abelardo Perez**. Additionally, senior cornerback **Leon McFadden** and senior punter **Brian Stahovich** were preseason all-conference selections as voted on by the league's media.

Burris, a first-team all-conference selection as a junior last season, is on the preseason watch list for the Nagurski Award (top defensive player), Butkus Award (outstanding linebacker) and Lombardi Award (top down lineman). He led the team in nearly every defensive category in 2010, including tackles (80), tackles for loss (20), sacks (9.5) and forced fumbles (4). The 2010 SDSU Student-Athlete of the Year and Granite Bay, Calif., native ranked in the nation's top 25 in tackles for loss, sacks and forced fumbles.

Hillman, a first-team all-league pick as a freshman, is on the preseason watch list for the Maxwell Award (college player of the year), Walter Camp Award (college player of the year) and Doak Walker Award (top running back). He finished the 2010 campaign as the nation's 10th-leading rusher and led the freshman class with 1,532 yards. The La Habra, Calif., product logged six games with at least 150 yards rushing, including two 228-yard efforts, to earn Mountain West Freshman-of-the-Year accolades.

Lindley, who is on the preseason watch lists for the Maxwell Award (college player of the year), Manning Award (top quarterback) and Davey O'Brien Award (outstanding quarterback), returns for his fourth year as SDSU's starter and has already amassed 9,537 career passing yards and 67 touchdowns in 36 contests.

The Alpine, Calif., product had his best season a year ago, throwing for 3,830 yards and 28 TDs to lead the Mountain West in passing (294.6 ypg.) and total offense (292.2 ypg.). Lindley enters 2011 within striking distance of the school's all-time career passing record which is currently held by Todd Santos (11,425).

Perez, a member of the Lou Groza Award (best place-kicker) Watch List, was a second-team all-Mountain West selection in 2010. A season ago, the place-kicker posted a league-best 28 touchbacks and converted 17 of 22 field-goal attempts, including his final eight. He also led the league in field goals per game (1.42) and in scoring (8.3 ppg.).

McFadden was tabbed a first-team all-league selection in 2010, when he led the MW in passes defended per game (1.08). He ranked third on the team in tackles with a career-high 55 with seven of those stops behind the line of scrimmage. The Inglewood, Calif., native also had a pair of interceptions, started every contest and returned punts.

Stahovich (Solana Beach, Calif.), a first-team all-conference selection a year ago, led the Mountain West and ranked eighth nationally in punting as a junior with a 45.4 yard average. He is a two-time nominee for the Ray Guy Award (top punter) and has 41 career punts of 50 yards or more, including a school-record 89-yard punt last season in the victory at Wyoming.

San Diego State owns a 13-11 lead in the series with Cal Poly, but the Mustangs have won the last two games - 16-14 on Oct. 28, 2006 and 29-27 on Aug. 30, 2008. Although the Aztecs have won seven of the last nine, Saturday will mark 16,044 days since SDSU's last victory over the Mustangs (26-20, Sept. 30, 1967). The No. 1 song in the country that day was The Letter by The Box Tops.

NEED TO KNOW

- San Diego State has won five consecutive home games against teams outside the top 25. That is the longest such winning streak since a seven-game streak during the 1998-99 seasons.
- San Diego State, which won its season-opening game last season against Nicholls State, 47-0, is looking to win consecutive season openers for the first time since 2003 and 2004.
- Three players have current starting streaks of 21 or more games. Entering the season, senior quarterback Ryan Lindley has started 31 straight games (a school record for the position), senior linebacker Miles Burris has started 25 contests in a row and junior right guard Nik Embernate has started 21 consecutive outings.
- The previous 17 Aztecs head coaches are 9-5-3 in their first game in the position. Each of the last three head coaches lost their debut contest - Brady Hokjavane at UCLA (14-33) in 2009, Chuck Long vs. UTEP (27-34) in 2006, and Tom Craft at Fresno State (14-16) in 2002. The last head coach to win his inaugural game with San Diego State was Ted Tollner, when his team defeated Navy, 56-14, on Sept. 3, 1994.
- San Diego State enters the season having won five consecutive games against unranked teams, regardless of location. That is the longest such winning streak since a six-game winning streak in 1997-98.
- San Diego State's coaching staff has a combined 17 years of NFL experience which ranks fourth nationally behind Colorado (25), North Carolina (25) and Syracuse (25). The Aztecs' total benefits from 1980 NFL Most Valuable Player Brian Sipe's 12 years of experience.
- Despite suffering through a 2-10 freshman campaign, senior quarterback Ryan Lindley has compiled 15 victories as a starter. That is the 12th-highest active total nationally (Boise State's Kellen Moore is the national leader at 38). Lindley is just seven victories short of reaching the school's all-time leader, Todd Santos (22 wins from 1984-87).

SDSU-CAL POLY: THE SERIES

- Saturday will mark the 25th all-time meeting between Cal Poly and San Diego State, with the Aztecs owning a 13-11 series lead.
- SDSU has won seven of the last nine meetings in the series, with the Mustangs winning the last two encounters by a combined four points.
- San Diego State has won four of the past six games in San Diego, dating back to Oct. 3, 1959.
- The teams met consistently from 1942 to 1967, with the first 22 meetings falling in that 26-year span. During a majority of that time, the two schools were in the same conference, the California Collegiate Athletic Association. In 1968, San Diego State played football as an independent while transitioning to the PCAA.
- Although the teams have played just twice since Sept. 30, 1967 (a 26-20 San Diego State victory), historical data suggests this could be a close game. The last four have been decided by a total of 11 points. Eight of the last 14 meetings have been decided by seven points or fewer.

■ Cal Poly's Director of Athletics, Don Oberhelman, served as the Chief Operating Officer and Senior Associate Athletic Director at San Diego State from 2007-2011.

■ Legendary NFL coach and broadcaster John Madden played on both sides of the ball for Cal Poly in 1957 and 1958 before becoming the defensive coordinator at SDSU from 1964-66.

■ Aztec senior defensive lineman Jerome Long (Morro Bay High) and sophomore linebacker Nick Tenhaeff (Atascadero High) both hail from the San Luis Obispo area.

■ Junior Mustang Deonte Williams was a part of the SDSU 2010 signing class, but did not end up playing with the Aztecs.

■ Four Mustangs are from the San Diego area, including kicker Paul Hundley (St. Augustine HS), wide receiver Roland Jackson Jr. (Francis Parker HS), linebacker Keaton Taylor (Mt. Carmel HS), defensive back Chris Fletcher (Eastlake HS) and wide receiver Jordan Hines (Eastlake HS).

■ Cal Poly's football athletic trainer Jim Eggen graduated from SDSU with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology in 2000. Eggen was a student athletic trainer at SDSU for three years (1998-2001).

SDSU-CAL POLY: THE LAST MEETING

■ **Aug. 30, 2008 - Cal Poly 29, SDSU 27**
 SAN DIEGO – Despite overcoming a nine-point deficit in the second half, San Diego State’s five turnovers proved to be too costly as the Aztecs fell to Cal Poly, 29-27, at Qualcomm Stadium.

SDSU took its first lead of the game at 27-26 in the fourth quarter and held the one-point advantage until the Mustangs converted a 21-yard field goal with the clock winding down, dashing the Scarlet and Black’s hopes of securing a season-opening win for the first time since 2004.

In his first collegiate start, Aztec redshirt freshman quarterback Ryan Lindley racked up an impressive 352 passing yards and three touchdowns, but it was Cal Poly who held a lopsided advantage in rushing yards (263-27) and won the battle in total offense (483-379).

On Cal Poly’s second drive of the game, SDSU senior linebacker Russell Allen forced a fumble and also recovered it at the Aztec 3-yard line, but three plays later, sophomore running back Brandon Sullivan was tackled in the end zone for a safety, giving the Mustangs a 2-0 lead.

Cal Poly gained momentum from there, going up 9-0 on a 22-yd touchdown pass from Jonathan Dally to Ramses Barden with 3:07 left in the first quarter. Barden finished the evening with a game-high 161 yards on seven catches.

San Diego State was able to get on the board and cut its deficit to two at the 5:41 mark in the second quarter on a 16-yard TD reception by Sullivan, but the Mustangs would eventually tack on one more score before the end of the half to take a 16-7 lead.

The Aztecs came out of the break on fire, putting together a 7-play, 66-yard drive that ate up 2:12 on the clock and ended with a 30-yard touchdown catch by Roberto Wallace.

After Cal Poly got back on the board, SDSU closed out the third frame with a 23-yard TD pass from Lindley to Vincent Brown, and the Aztecs trailed by just two points (23-21) heading into the final 15 minutes of action.

The Mustangs opened the fourth quarter with a field goal, but the Aztecs would eventually take their first lead of the game on Sullivan’s 5-yard touchdown run with 6:51 on the clock. Unable to convert an extra two-point attempt, SDSU held a narrow 27-26 advantage. After a successful defensive effort on Cal Poly’s subsequent drive, the Scarlet and Black took control of the ball with 4:24 left to play, but were unable to maintain possession, allowing the Mustangs to start their final drive at the 3:39 mark. Cal Poly took advantage of the opportunity, using up the clock to set up Andrew Gardner’s game-winning field goal.

Lindley finished the evening 27-for-45, while Brown led the way on the receiving end with 98 yards and a touchdown on seven catches. Sullivan also had a strong showing with two touchdowns, a team-leading 43 yards on the ground and nine catches for 64 yards.

AZTECS IN OPENERS

■ San Diego State is 45-38-5 in season-opening games, including a 20-21-1 record in the Division I era. The Aztecs won last season’s lidlifter (47-0 over Nicholls State), their first season-opening win since Sept. 4, 2004 (38-21 over Idaho State). SDSU had lost its previous five season-opening games prior to last year.

■ SDSU will be looking to win its second consecutive season-opening game for the first time since

- ▶ San Diego State is an amazing 61-23-4 in home openers and owns a 71.6 winning percentage. In the Division I era, the Aztecs are 31-10-1 (75.0 percent) in their first home game of the season.
- ▶ After claiming a 47-0 victory over Nicholls State in the home opener last year, the Aztecs will try and win their home opener in three consecutive seasons for the first time since 1995-97.
- ▶ San Diego State won its home debut in 17 consecutive seasons, from 1963 through 1979. That covers the final 10 seasons of the Don Coryell era and the first seven campaigns of Claude Gilbert's tenure.

THE IMPORTANCE OF GAME ONE

The opener may count the same as all the other games, but over the past 20-plus years, it has been a good indicator of the type of season San Diego State will have.

Beginning with the 1986 Holiday Bowl season (excluding the 1992 season-opening 31-31 tie with USC), the Aztecs have won their season-opening game on 10 occasions. In those seasons, they have gone on to post a 62-54-1 record. That is a winning percentage of 53.4 percent and an average of 6.2 wins per season.

During that same time frame, San Diego State has dropped the lidlifter on 13 occasions, posting a record of 55-97-1, for a 36.3 winning percentage. The Aztecs have averaged 4.2 wins per season and have been unable to finish .500 or better the last eight times they have opened a campaign with an L.

If you are planning to win a conference title, winning the opener is important. In San Diego State's 18 championship seasons, the Aztecs opened with a victory 15 times. In 1962, 1974 and 1998, SDSU overcame a loss in game one to earn a conference championship.

FOUR AZTECS ON WATCH LISTS

San Diego State has already placed four student-athletes on preseason national award watch lists in 2011. Senior linebacker Miles Burris, senior quarterback Ryan Lindley, senior place-kicker Abelardo Perez and sophomore running back Ronnie Hillman are on the initial short list for their positions' top honors.

Burris (Granite Bay, Calif.) is one of 51 players on the Butkus Award Watch List (top linebacker), one of 125 on the Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List (top lineman) and one of 87 on the Bronko Nagurski Trophy Watch List (top defensive player). The last Aztec to be on all three of the same pre-season watch lists was another linebacker in Kirk Morrison in both 2003 and 2004.

Burris is coming off a breakout 2010 campaign in which he led San Diego State in tackles (80), tackles for a loss (20) and sacks (9.5). He was also the Mountain West's sack and tackles-for-a-loss leader and was named a MWC first-team selection.

Lindley (Alpine, Calif.) is one of 38 players on the Davey O'Brien Award Watch List (top quarterback), one of 66 players on the Maxwell Award Watch List (most outstanding player) and one of

31 players on the Manning Award Watch List (top quarterback).

Lindley returns for his fourth year as SDSU's starter and has already amassed 9,537 career passing yards and 67 touchdowns in 36 contests. Last year, Lindley threw for 3,830 yards and 28 TDs to lead the Mountain West in passing (294.6 ypg.) and total offense (292.2 ypg.). Lindley was a second-team all-conference selection as a junior and enters 2011 within striking distance of the school's all-time career passing record currently held by Todd Santos (11,425).

Hillman (La Habra, Calif.) is one of 40 players on the Walter Camp Award Watch List (player of the year), one of 51 players on the Doak Walker Award Watch List (top running back) and one of 66 players on the Maxwell Award Watch List (most outstanding player).

Hillman rushed for 1,532 yards and 17 touchdowns a year ago en route to earning freshman All-America and conference freshman-of-the-year honors. He ran for more than 150 yards six times in 2010, including a career high of 228 yards at No. 25 Missouri and then again vs. Navy in the Poinsettia Bowl. Hillman led the Mountain West in rushing and ranked first among all freshmen (10th overall) nationally in that category.

Perez (Tijuana, Mexico) is one of 30 players on the Lou Groza Award Watch List (top place-kicker). He was a second-team all-Mountain West selection in 2010, posting a league-best 28 touchbacks and converting 17 of 22 field-goal attempts, including his final eight. He also led the league in field goals per game (1.42) and in scoring (8.3 ppg.).

SDSU TABBED TO FINISH FOURTH IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

For the first time in seven seasons, the San Diego State football team is picked to finish in the upper division of the Mountain West, coming in fourth place with 160 points in the 2011 preseason poll, which is voted on by media representatives who cover the conference.

Released at the league's annual media day in Las Vegas, the MW preseason poll has the Aztecs picked for fourth place, their highest projected finish since being pegged for third in 2004. Last season, San Diego State was projected to come in sixth place, but ended up in a tie for third after posting a 9-4 overall record and a 5-3 mark in Mountain West play. It marked the fifth time in the last six seasons that SDSU has finished at or higher than its projected finish.

MW newcomer Boise State was picked to win the league title in 2011, capturing 28 of the 31 first-place votes and earning 236 points overall. The Broncos were followed by TCU, Air Force, San Diego State, Colorado State, Wyoming, UNLV and New Mexico.

FOUR AZTECS NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-MOUNTAIN WEST TEAM

San Diego State senior linebacker Miles Burris, sophomore running back Ronnie Hillman, junior cornerback Leon McFadden and senior punter Brian Stahovich were all named to the preseason all-conference team. This marked just the second time in league history that the Aztecs placed a student-athlete on the all-conference offensive, defensive and special teams and is the program's most preseason all-league picks since 2004, when it also had four honorees.

McFadden was tabbed a first-team all-league selection in 2010, when he led the MW in passes defended per game (1.08). He ranked third on the team in tackles with a career-high 55 with seven of those stops behind the line of scrimmage. The Inglewood, Calif., native also had a pair of interceptions, started every contest and returned punts.

Stahovich (Solana Beach, Calif.), a first-team all-conference selection a year ago, led the Mountain West and ranked eighth nationally in punting as a junior with a 45.4 yard average. He is a two-time nominee for the Ray Guy Award (top punter) and has 41 career punts of 50 yards or more, including a school-record 89-yard punt last season in the victory at Wyoming.

SDSU ANNOUNCES TEAM CAPTAINS

Aztec head coach Rocky Long announced Monday that seniors J.J. Autele (Waipahu, Hawaii), Miles Burris and Ryan Lindley have been named football team captains for the upcoming 2011 season. The three were selected in a vote by their teammates.

Autele has played in 28 games in his three seasons as an Aztec. Last season, he played in all 13 contests and was tied for fifth on the team in sacks. Burris has started 25 of his 37 career appearances, and is coming off a year in which he led the Mountain West in sacks and tackles-for-a-loss. Lindley, who enters his fourth year as SDSU's starting quarterback, has already amassed 9,537 career passing yards and 67 touchdowns in 36 games.

FAULK INDUCTED INTO PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

Former San Diego State running back Marshall Faulk was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame on Aug. 6 in Canton, Ohio, along with Deion Sanders, Shannon Sharpe, Richard Dent, Ed Sabol, Les Richter and Chris Hanburger.

A three-time All-American (1991-93), Faulk holds the SDSU record for most 300-, 200-, and 100-yard rushing performances by a player and the record for the most 200-yard rushing efforts in a single season. He led the nation in rushing as a freshman in 1991 with 1,429 yards and in 1992 as sophomore with 1,630 yards. Faulk finished in the top nine of the Heisman Trophy balloting in all three of his seasons, including second in 1992 and fourth in 1993. In his time as an Aztec, he rushed for 4,589 yards and 57 touchdowns.

San Diego State's all-time career leading rusher was the second overall pick by the Indianapolis Colts in the 1994 NFL Draft. A seven-time NFL Pro Bowl selection, he rushed for 1,000 yards in seven of his first eight seasons. Faulk was named NFL Most Valuable Player in 2000, after setting a single-season record for touchdowns (26) that included a league-leading 18 rushing scores. He also won the world championship with the St. Louis Rams in Super Bowl XXXIV on Jan. 30, 2000.
