Aztecs Claim 20th Conference Title; Reach Bowl Game For Sixth Consecutive Season

San Diego State overcame a 1-3 start to capture the 20th conference championship in program history. The Aztecs steamrolled through their Mountain West schedule, posting an unblemished 8-0 record, before edging Air Force, 27-24, in the title game. In addition, SDSU made its school-record sixth straight postseason appearance with a decisive 42-7 triumph over Cincinnati in the Hawai'i Bowl on Christmas Eve. With the victory, the Aztecs became just the second team in the nation since at least 1980 to win their remaining games, including a bowl, after opening the year with a 1-3 record or worse.

Another Year to Remember

San Diego State tied a school record by winning 11 games last year, matching the 1966 (Division II) and 1969 (first year of Division I) squads for the highest victory total in a single season.

In addition, the Aztecs finished the 2015 campaign with 10 consecutive victories, marking the program's longest winning streak since a similar 10-game stretch between the 1976 and 1977 seasons.

SDSU defeated all eight Mountain West opponents during the regular season by an average of 19.9 points per game, becoming one of just six teams since 1996 to complete an undefeated league slate with each victory recorded by double digits. The Aztecs joined the elite company of Miami (Fla.) (2000), Boise State (2002), Oklahoma (2003), Utah (2004) and Florida State (2013).

With its conquest of Cincinnati in the Hawai'i Bowl, SDSU remained one of 25 teams nationally to play in a bowl game in six straight seasons (2010-15) and one of just three from the "Group of 5" conferences, joining Boise State and Northern Illinois.

The Aztecs extended their school Division-I era record to 12 straight games and 208 passes without throwing an interception, which marks the longest-active streak in the country entering the 2016 season.

The SDSU offense did not turn the ball over in its final 285 plays from scrimmage, dating back to the third quarter of the Wyoming game on Nov. 14, 2015.

Ground Control

Last year, San Diego State set a school record with 3,266 yards rushing and established a Division I program standard with 32 touchdowns scored on the ground.

With their total, the Aztecs have now rushed for at least 2,000 yards as a team and have produced a 1,000-yard running back in each of the last six seasons.

Donnel Pumphrey, a *Sports Illustrated* honorable mention All-American, ran for 1,653 yards, which ranked seventh in the nation, while Chase Price added 1,008 yards of his own, giving the Scarlet and Black two 1,000-yard backfield mates for the first time in school history.

Since 2010, San Diego State ranks 18th nationally in rushing yards (15,605), 19th in rushing yards per game (197.5), and tied for 19th in rushing touchdowns (175).

Defense Dominates

In 2015, San Diego State posted one of the finest defensive seasons in school history. The Aztecs ended the year ranked among the top 10 nationally in the four main statistical categories, including yards allowed (287.3, 5th), rushing yards allowed (108.7, 7th), scoring defense (16.4, 7th) and passing yards allowed (178.6, 10th).

SDSU did not allow any opponent to reach 400 yards of total offense in its final 10 games of the 2015 campaign, which is the second-longest active streak in the country behind Wisconsin (12). Likewise, the Aztecs have not yielded 400 yards of offense in 16 consecutive conference games, which leads the nation entering the 2016 season.

In Long We Trust

Rocky Long earned his league-record third Mountain West Coach of the Year award last season and now has more conference coach of the year honors than the rest of the

league's active coaches combined (2).

In his five seasons on Montezuma Mesa, Long has already amassed 43 victories, which is tied for fourth on the school's all-time list.

Long is one of just 13 active coaches nationally to guide their current school to a bowl game in each of their first five seasons.

Aztecs Honored

San Diego State became just the second school to sweep the three major Mountain West awards last year when running back Donnel Pumphrey (offensive), cornerback Damontae Kazee (defensive) and kick returner Rashaad Penny (special teams) garnered conference player of the year accolades. The Aztecs were the only team in the country to claim all three of the aforementioned awards.

In addition, SDSU placed seven student-athletes (including six non-seniors) on the official all-MW first team in 2015, which trailed only Oklahoma (9) for the most first-team all-league selections in the country.

SAN DIEGO - Calvin Munson returned two interceptions for touchdowns and Damontae Kazee picked off another three passes as San Diego State forced six turnovers in a 37-3 victory over San Diego in the 2015 season opener at Qualcomm Stadium.

Munson picked off Trey Wheeler on the Toreros' second play of the game and returned it 19 yards for the score. He later intercepted Anthony Lawrence and took it back 67 yards for another score with 3:35 left in the game.

Kazee, meanwhile, picked off Chris Willson in the first quarter, Wheeler in the second and Wheeler again in the third to become the first SDSU player with three interceptions in a game since 1951.

In all, USD (0-1) managed just 188 total yards against the Aztecs - 109 passing and 79 rushing - despite winning the time of possession battle by almost 10 minutes (34:39-25:21). San Diego was just 4-of-16 on third-down conversions and its six turnovers led to 27 points by SDSU (1-0).

Later in the first quarter after Munson's 19-yard interception return for a touchdown, the Toreros challenged for the first time after picking off San Diego State quarterback Maxwell Smith at the Aztec 49-yard line. USD got to the 37 before Willson tried a deep pass toward the left side where Kazee outjumped a San Diego wide receiver at the 9-yard line and tried to run it back before getting tackled at the 2. There, the Aztecs marched 98 yards on 12 plays over 5:05, ending with a 5-yard touchdown run by Donnel Pumphrey.

SDSU made it 17-0 midway through the second quarter when Donny Hageman made the first of three field goals, this time from 33 yards out.

The Toreros got the ball back on their own 35, but on their first play Jake Fely forced a fumble and Munson pounced on the loose ball. San Diego State, however, was unable to get in the end zone, settling for a 36-yard field goal by Hageman for the final score of the half.

The Aztecs wasted no time getting back in the end zone as Rashaad Penny took a kickoff back 97 yards untouched for his first career touchdown.

USD finally got on the scoreboard midway in the third quarter, using a 15-play, 77-yard drive and having Jake Flatau convert on a chip shot 23-yard field goal.

San Diego State used a 12-play, 57-yard drive over 5:21 early in the fourth quarter, ending with Hageman's third field goal of the game, this time from 37 yards, to give the home team a commanding 30-3 lead.

The Toreros got into the Aztec side of the field on their ensuing drive, but Munson picked off Lawrence at the 33 and returned it 67 yards into the end zone for the final score of the game.

Chase Price led SDSU with 66 yards on 10 carries (6.6 avg.), while Pumphrey chipped in with 62 yards and a touchdown.

BERKELEY, Calif. - San Diego State was unable to stop Jared Goff and California's potent offensive attack in a 35-7 loss at Memorial Stadium.

The Aztecs (1-1) jumped out to the early lead as they used an 8-play, 71-yard drive over 3:52, punctuated by a 29-yard pass from Maxwell Smith to Daniel Brunskill. On the game's opening drive, Smith was 4-for-4 for 58 yards and the touchdown, while Donnel Pumphrey and Rashaad Penny combined to rush for the other 13 yards.

It would be SDSU's only points in the game, however, as the Bears (2-0) scored the final 35 points in the game.

San Diego State held Cal at bay early, forcing two punts, a missed field goal and a turnover over the first five drives.

California, who defeated Grambling State, 73-14, in the opener the week before, finally got on the scoreboard with 12:22 left in the second quarter when Goff found Darius Powe with a quick 4-yard catch-and-run.

It appeared the Bears would go into halftime tied at 7-7 as the Aztecs were burning the clock (4:53 on 10 plays). However, Christian Chapman, who replaced Smith, was intercepted by Darius White at the Cal 35. The Bears responded with a quick score right before halftime (0:12) as Goff threw three straight completions to Bryce Treggs (28 yards), Kenny Lawler (24 yards) and Maurice Harris (13 yards), the latter for a touchdown and putting California up, 14-7, at the half.

Goff followed with a 75-yard touchdown strike to Trevor Davis on the first play of the third quarter, extending the Bears' lead to 21-7.

A 3-yard rushing score by Daniel Lasco put Cal up by 21 at 28-7 late in the third quarter.

SDSU got into California's territory, thanks to a key 33-yard completion from Smith to Eric Judge on 3rd and 15. Three plays later, however, Smith was intercepted by Evan Rambo, ultimately ending San Diego State's final threat.

A 17-yard rushing touchdown by Vic Enwere early in the fourth quarter rounded out the scoring for the Bears.

The Aztecs dominated the possession time by almost 10 minutes (34:10-25:50), but Cal's quick strikes on offense and 12 SDSU penalties (136 yards) ultimately ruined any chance of a road win.

Smith (10-for-19, TD, INT) threw for 136 yards, while Chapman (4-for-13, INT) passed for 37 yards off the bench. Pumphrey rushed for 85 yards on 21 carries, averaging 4.0 yards per attempt, while Mikah Holder had three catches for 27 yards.

Jake Fely had a game-high 11 tackles, including 1.0 TFL, and 0.5 sacks to pace the San Diego State defense. The 11 stops were his most since Nov. 24, 2012, at Wyoming. Malik Smith added eight tackles, while Damontae Kazee and Na'im McGee recorded seven tackles apiece in a losing effort.

Goff finished 17-for-24 for 321 yards and three touchdowns, leaving him 15 yards short of the school's all-time passing record. Lasco ran for 123 yards on 19 carries (6.5 avg.) and Davis had 138 receiving yards on three catches.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State saw its nine-game regular-season home winning streak snapped in a 34-27 overtime loss to South Alabama at Qualcomm Stadium.

The Aztecs (1-2) appeared to take control of the game late in the fourth quarter when Donnel Pumphrey scored on an 8-yard touchdown run with just 2:05 left to put SDSU back on top at 27-24. Pumphrey was the key cog of the 8-play, 61-yard drive that lasted 3:46 as he caught two passes for 26 yards and ran four times for 21 yard, totaling 47 yards in all.

The Jaguars (2-1), however, responded with a 9-play, 42-yard drive to set up a 46-yard field goal attempt by Aleem Sunanon with just two seconds left. Sunanon, who earlier in the fourth quarter had missed from 38 yards, split the uprights to force overtime.

USA got the ball first in the extra period and used a 15-yard pass from Cody Clements to Gerald Everett on 3rd and 2 to get to San Diego State's 2-yard line. Xavier Johnson punched it in on the very next play to put the visitors up, 34-27.

The Aztecs were unable to do much on its overtime possession. Pumphrey ran for a yard and Dakota Gordon fumbled on the ensuing play, which SDSU quarterback Maxwell Smith was able to recover. After an incomplete pass to Pumphrey, Smith was forced out of the pocket on fourth down and heaved a pass to the right side of the end zone, which went through the hands of a diving Daniel Brunskill, sealing the win for South Alabama.

Johnson ran for a career-high 142 yards and two touchdowns for the Jaguars, while Clements finished with 270 yards passing and two scores. Everett set career bests with eight catches and 164 yards as USA outgained San Diego State, 511-305.

The game featured five lead changes and just one turnover - a Chase Price fumble late in the second quarter - which led to a 46-yard touchdown pass from Clements to Magee to bring South Alabama to within a touchdown at 17-10 at the break.

Johnson tied the game up for the Jaguars on the second snap of the third quarter, scampering outside for a 74-yard touchdown run down the left side of the field.

Donny Hageman broke the 17-17 tie with 4:24 left in the third quarter when his 54-yard field goal attempt just cleared the crossbar. It was tied for the second-longest field goal in Aztec history and the longest not at 6,621 feet in Colorado Springs, Colo. (SDSU's No. 1 (57 yards) and No. 2 (also 54) field goals came at Air Force in 1985 and 1980).

USA got deep into San Diego State territory on its next drive, but Sunanon's 38-yard field goal attempt missed left.

Hageman looked to make it 23-17 Aztecs later in the fourth quarter, but his 41-yard field goal attempt just missed the left upright by inches.

South Alabama answered when Clements connected on a 57-yard touchdown strike to Everett as a SDSU cornerback fell down on the play.

Down, 24-20, Pumphrey worked his aforementioned magic to give San Diego State the lead, only for Sunanon to tie the game as regulation expired.

Pumphrey rushed for a hard-earned 102 yards and a touchdown on a career-high 28 carries (3.6 avg.), while Price went over 1,000 yards for his career with 41 yards on four attempts (10.2 avg.). Smith was 12-for-26 for 158 yards and one touchdown and Pumphrey led the receivers with a career-high-tying five catches for a personal-best 55 yards.

In addition to his touchdown pass, Mills returned five punts for 106 yards (21.2 avg.), while four SDSU players - Damontae Kazee (11), Malik Smith (11), Na'im McGee (11) and Ryan Dunn (10) - each set a career high with double-digit tackles.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - San Diego State was unable to overcome three crucial turnovers in a 37-21 loss to Penn State at Beaver Stadium. The three turnovers - all fumbles - led to 21 of the Nittany Lions' (3-1) 37 points.

The Aztecs (1-3) took the lead at 14-13 with 10:23 left in the second quarter when Maxwell Smith's 19-yard pass found Mikah Holder in the left corner of the end zone. PSU got into SDSU territory on its ensuing possession, but Kyle Kelley blocked Joey Julius' 55-yard field goal attempt. San Diego State stopped Penn State again, but Chris Gulla's punt bounced off the leg of Aztec punt returner Lloyd Mills, which gave the Nittany Lions the ball on the SDSU 27-yard line. Four plays later, Christian Hackenberg connected on a 19-yard touchdown strike to Mark Allen with 1:03 remaining in the first half.

On SDSU's very next play, Donnel Pumphrey fumbled and Anthony Zettel pounced on it, giving the Nittany Lions the ball on San Diego State's 23-yard line. PSU took advantage again as Hackenberg found Chris Godwin for an 11-yard touchdown, giving Penn State 14 points in just 46 seconds and extending the lead to 27-14 at halftime intermission.

At the half, the Nittany Lions had piled up 297 total yards, including 234 in the air, and 15 first downs, while dominating the time of possession, by more than 13 minutes (21:44-8:16).

The Aztecs rallied in the second half, both on offense and defense, beginning with a bit of luck when DeAndre Thompkins muffed a punt and Luke Bussey jumped on it for his first career fumble recovery. Pumphrey punctuated a 6-play, 26-yard drive with a 1-yard rushing score, bringing SDSU to within one score at 27-21.

Late in the third quarter, San Diego State mounted another charge, getting all the way to the 25-yard line, thanks mainly to a 31-yard pass from Smith to Holder. On 3rd and 11 from the PSU 25, however, Smith was sacked by Carl Nassib and Austin Johnson picked up the loose ball and returned it 71 yards to put Penn State up by 13 again at 34-21 early in the fourth quarter.

The Nittany Lion defense forced the Aztecs to a 3 and out and the PSU offense used a trick play - a 32-yard pass by running back Nick Scott - to get into field goal range, where Julius converted a 26-yarder for the final points of the game.

Penn State got on the scoreboard with 4:20 left in the first quarter when Hackenberg tossed a screen pass to Saquon Barkley, who broke numerous SDSU tacklers and dove into the end zone from 22 yards out.

Rashaad Penny tied it up for San Diego State when he took the kickoff 100 yards for his second touchdown return of the year, tying Colin Lockett (2012) for the most kick returns for a score in Aztec single-season history.

Julius made field goals of 40 yards in the first quarter and 24 yards in the second to round out the scoring.

SDSU turned the tables in the second half, out-gaining the Nittany Lions, 161-103, earning six more first downs (10-4) and holding the ball 17:10 of the 30 second-half minutes.

Penny amassed a game-high 192 all-purpose yards on just three touches (64.0 yards per play), and Pumphrey added 56 yards on the ground with a touchdown on 18 attempts (3.1 avg.) and five catches for 53 yards (10.6 avg.). Holder set career highs in receptions (4) and receiving yards (78) with his second touchdown in as many weeks, while Smith threw for 141 yards and a touchdown without throwing an interception.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State limited Fresno State to just 89 yards of total offense in a 21-7 victory at Qualcomm Stadium. The Aztecs (2-3, 1-0 Mountain West) reclaimed "The Oil Can" trophy with the win, dominating on both sides of the ball.

SDSU held the Bulldogs (1-4, 0-2 MW) to 12 rushing yards and 77 passing yards in the game, and did not allow a third-down conversion (0-for-12) for only the second time since at least 1996. The 89 total yards allowed by San Diego State was the third-fewest given up nationally in an FBS game (FBS vs. FBS) all season and the program's lowest since 1970.

Fresno State had just six first downs in the game as the Aztec defense pressured quarterback Zack Greenlee all night, sacking him three times and forcing him out of the pocket on numerous other occasions. The Bulldogs averaged just 0.5 yards per rush, carrying 22 times for 12 yards, and only 1.9 yards per play for the game. Fresno State's 89 yards were its fewest in a game since at least 1996.

On the other side of the ball, Maxwell Smith threw two second-half touchdowns, and SDSU received a pair of 100-yard rushing games from Donnel Pumphrey and Chase Price.

Smith attempted only 12 passes, completing five, including a 33-yard pass to a wide-open Rashaad Penny in the third quarter and a 44-yard strike to Eric Judge in the fourth period.

Pumphrey rushed 23 times for 124 yards and a touchdown before leaving the game with an injury midway through the third quarter, while Price set career highs in both attempts (27) and rushing yards (151). San Diego State improved to 18-1 in the Division I era when having multiple 100-yard rushers.

The Aztecs scored on their opening drive as Pumphrey capped a 10-play, 78-yard drive with a 33-yard run down the left side of the field.

Fresno State got to the SDSU 34-yard line on its ensuing drive, but the San Diego State defense stuffed Greenlee on a 4th and 10, keeping the visitors off the scoreboard.

Early in the second quarter, it appeared the Aztecs would get the ball back after forcing a 3-and-out, one of SDSU's nine (out of 13 drives) in the game. The ensuing Bulldog punt, however, was mishandled and Stratton Brown pounced on it at the San Diego State 28. Three plays later, Greenlee found KeeSean Johnson for a 16-yard touchdown pass, tying the game at 7-7, which would remain the score at halftime.

The Aztecs took the lead back with 8:15 left in the third quarter on Smith's 33-yard pass to Penny, set up by a play-action pass.

After two more 3 and outs, SDSU mounted a 9-play, 72-yard drive, culminating in Smith's 44-yard TD pass to Judge, which would be the final points of the game.

Penny had a good all-around game with two catches for a career-high 48 yards, a 18-yard kick return and a 17-yard rush, while Dakota Gordon rushed for 34 yards on five attempts (6.8 avg.) and added a 6-yard catch.

San Diego State, which missed two field goals in the game (50 and 42 yards), was led by Alex Barrett on the defensive side with seven tackles, including a 5-yard tackle for loss and 0.5 sacks. Jon Sanchez (1.0 sack, 2.0 TFL) and Jake Fely (0.5 sacks, 2.0 TFL) contributed five tackles apiece.

The Aztecs won their seventh consecutive conference home game and 13th straight at home against an unranked conference opponent. They also won their conference opener for the third consecutive season.

HONOLULU - Donnel Pumphrey rushed for 148 yards and three touchdowns to lead San Diego State to a 28-14 victory over Hawai'i at Aloha Stadium.

Pumphrey, who missed most of the second half in the Aztecs' (3-3, 2-0 Mountain West) win over Fresno State on Oct. 3 with a high ankle sprain and was limited in practice leading up to the game, scored on rushes of 34, 8 and 4 yards as SDSU outgained the Rainbow Warriors (2-4, 0-2 MW), 218-53, on the ground for the game.

Pumphrey also had two catches for 49 yards, giving him 197 of the team's 402 yards in all. The 148 rushing yards, which came on a career-high 30 carries (4.9 avg.), were a season high, his second straight 100-yard rushing game, third of the season and 16th of his career.

For the second straight game, San Diego State scored on its opening drive, all on the ground. Pumphrey rushed four times on the drive for 67 yards, culminating with a 34-yard touchdown to give the Aztecs the early 7-0 lead.

SDSU got the ball right back as Christian Heyward hit UH wide receiver Quinton Pedroza on its third play of the game, forcing the ball to the turf and pouncing on it, giving San Diego State the ball on the 32-yard line.

Four plays later, Pumphrey scored from eight yards out, putting the Aztecs up, 14-0, just 5:50 into the game.

Hawai'i halved the SDSU lead early in the second quarter when Melvin Davis scored on a 1-yard run, the first against San Diego State in three games.

Later in the quarter, Maxwell Smith connected on a 58-yard touchdown pass to a wide-open Eric Judge to put the Aztecs back up by 14 at 21-7.

The score would remain 21-7 until the Rainbow Warriors capitalized on a SDSU fumble midway through the third quarter, giving UH the ball on the San Diego State 26. Six plays later, quarterback Max Wittek scored on a sneak on 3rd and 1 to close the gap to 21-14.

The Aztecs had arguably their best drive early in the fourth quarter, grinding away with 85 yards on 11 plays over 4:49, ending with a 4-yard touchdown run by Pumphrey. Key plays on the drive included a 36-yard pass from Smith to Pumphrey on 3rd and 6, an offside penalty by Hawai'i on 4th and 1 and a holding penalty on the Rainbow Warriors on 3rd and 4.

SDSU sealed the victory with back-to-back interceptions of Wittek by the cornerback tandem of Darnontae Kazee and J.J. Whittaker on UH's final two plays, making San Diego State the only undefeated team in the West Division of the MW.

Smith was 11-for-15 for a season-high 184 yards and a touchdown, and extended his streak to 86 passing attempts without an interception. Judge had season highs of four receptions and 92 receiving yards, while Chase Price added 60 rushing yards on 16 carries and a 14-yard reception.

The Aztec defense continued their solid play, holding Hawai'i to just 251 yards of total offense and forcing three turnovers. Calvin Munson tied a career high with 12 tackles, including 1.5 sacks (and tackles for loss) for 13 yards, while Kameron Kelly added eight stops. Altogether, SDSU totaled a season-high four sacks, seven tackles for loss, two forced fumbles, a fumble recovery, two interceptions, 10 pass breakups and four quarterback hurries.

San Diego State outgained the Rainbow Warriors, 402-251, for the game and dominated the time of possession by almost 13 minutes (36:17-23:43).

SAN JOSE, Calif. - Donnel Pumphrey finished with 207 yards from scrimmage and two touchdowns and San Diego State added impressive performances on defense and special teams in a convincing 30-7 victory over San José State at Spartan Stadium. The win gave the Aztecs (4-3, 3-0 Mountain West) their third consecutive victory and a two-game lead in the loss column in the West Division of the MW.

Pumphrey rushed for 152 yards and one touchdown while adding three catches for 55 yards and another score to lead a balanced SDSU offensive effort. It was his third straight 100-yard rushing game and 17th of his career, the second most in MW history.

Pumphrey scored on a 13-yard run in the first quarter and later on a 38-yard pass from Maxwell Smith early in the second to put San Diego State up, 14-0.

The Spartans (3-4, 2-2 MW) took advantage of three Aztec penalties - two personal fouls and an un-sportsmanlike conduct - on its ensuing drive, culminating in a 1-yard sneak by quarterback Kenny Potter with 4:27 left in the first half.

SDSU ended the scoring in the first half when Donny Hageman nailed a 31-yard field goal attempt with just 18 seconds left giving San Diego State a 17-7 lead at intermission.

Damontae Kazee got the Aztecs back into business early in the third quarter when he intercepted a Potter pass at the San José State 33-yard line. Seven plays later, Hageman made his second of three field goals on the night, this time from 25 yards to give SDSU a 20-7 advantage.

Potter was picked off once again on the Spartans' second play of their next drive, this time by defensive end Alex Barrett. Chase Price followed with a 15-yard rush and a 1-yard touchdown score, putting San Diego State up, 27-7, early in the third quarter.

The Aztecs made it five straight drives with a score as Hageman converted a 39-yard field goal, ending an 11-play, 54-yard march, for the final points of the contest.

For the game, SDSU held SJSU to just 148 total yards, San José State's fewest in a game since putting up 121 at USC on Sept. 5, 2009, tied for the fifth fewest in a game since 1996 and tied for the second fewest in a home game since 1996. Additionally, the Spartans' 113 passing yards was their third fewest in a home game since 1996.

It was the 10th straight conference game that San Diego State held an opponent below 400 yards of total offense and the fourth consecutive contest that the Aztecs held an opponent under 100 yards rushing.

The SDSU defense finished with 11 tackles for loss, four sacks, two forced fumbles, two interceptions and two pass breakups, led by Calvin Munson. Munson recorded his second straight double-digit tackle game, compiling 10 tackles, three sacks, four tackles for loss and a forced fumble. He became the first San Diego State player with four tackles for loss in a game since 2004 and the first with three sacks since 2010.

Kazee added nine tackles (seven solo), a tackle for loss and his fifth interception of the season, while Malik Smith came up with seventh stops, a TFL and a forced fumble.

Maxwell Smith threw for 144 yards and the 38-yard touchdown pass to Pumphrey, connecting on 10 of his 14 pass attempts. He completed his first eight passes in the game and stretched his consecutive pass attempts without an interception to 100. It was the fifth straight game that the Aztecs did not throw an interception, the program's longest streak in their Division I history (since 1969).

Hageman's matched his career high with three field goals for the fifth time of his career, while all three of Tanner Blain's punts landed inside the 20-yard line, including two inside the 10.

Chase Price added 47 yards on the ground on 10 attempts (4.7 avg.) and had two catches for 13 yards.

SAN DIEGO - In a battle between the Mountain West's only unbeaten teams in league play, Donnel Pumphrey rushed for 181 yards and two touchdowns, and San Diego State forced four turnovers in a 48-14 victory over Utah State at Qualcomm Stadium.

After a punt of their opening drive, the Aztecs (5-3, 4-0 MW) scored on each of their next six possessions to open up a commanding 34-7 lead at halftime. After an Aggie (4-3, 3-1 MW) touchdown run in the third quarter, SDSU tacked on two more running scores in the fourth period to hand USU its largest margin of defeat since a 36-point setback at No. 9 Boise State (50-14) on Dec. 4, 2010.

Against a team that came into the game ranked sixth (90.8) in FBS in rush defense, San Diego State rushed for 218 in the first half and 336 total. It was the most rushing yards allowed by Utah State since 2010 and ninth most allowed since 1996.

The Aztecs scored five rushing touchdowns in all, including runs of 4 and 62 yards by Pumphrey in the second quarter, quarterback Maxwell Smith (1 yard) in the first quarter, and Rashaad Penny (7 yards) and Chase Price (1 yard) in the fourth quarter.

Smith added an 18-yard touchdown pass to Mikah Holder to get SDSU on the scoreboard. The Aztec signal-caller finished 6-for-10 for 93 yards and the touchdown and stretched his consecutive pass attempts without an interception to 111.

Chase Price had 97 yards on the ground as San Diego State opened up a two-game cushion in the West Division of the MW, remaining the only undefeated team in league play.

After trading three-and-outs, the Aztecs finished a 7 play, 78-yard drive when Smith found Holder in the end zone for the 7-0 lead. Alex Barrett then sacked Utah State quarterback Kent Myers and knocked the ball loose before Calvin Munson pounced on it. Price ran the ball 13 yards to the Aggie 1, setting up Smith's first career rushing touchdown.

SDSU forced another 3 and out and used up 4:37 of the clock on 10 plays over 45 yards before Donny Hageman converted a 41-yard field goal, making it 17-0 San Diego State in the first quarter.

USU threatened to get on the scoreboard, getting all the way to the Aztec 17 before Myers' pass was intercepted by Malik Smith and returned eight yards to the Utah State 23. SDSU capitalized with an 11-play, 77-yard drive over 6:04, ending with a 4-yard TD run by Pumphrey and making it 24-0 San Diego State.

The Aggies finally got on the scoreboard with 5:14 left in the second quarter when Myers found Hunter Sharp for a 45-yard touchdown pass.

The Aztecs answered with a 62-yard touchdown run by Pumphrey on the second play of the drive, giving SDSU a 31-7 lead.

On USU's first play of its ensuing drive, Jake Fely forced a fumble on a quarterback keeper by Myers and Jon Sanchez recovered it on the Utah State 22. San Diego State got to the Aggie 4, but had to settle for a 21-yard field goal by Hageman, making it 34-7 Aztecs at the half. It was the first time in SDSU's Division I history (since 1969) that it scored 17-plus points in each of the first two quarters.

USU tried to make a game of it in the second half, scoring on its opening drive on a 26-yard run by Davante Mays.

The score would remain 34-14 SDSU until Price capped an 8-play, 59-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown with 8:47 left in the fourth quarter. Penny scored his first career rushing TD on San Diego State's next drive from seven yards out to complete the scoring and give the Aztecs their most points in a game (48) since scoring 49 in the 2013 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl win over Buffalo.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. - Donnel Pumphrey rushed for two touchdowns and caught a third, and San Diego State forced four turnovers for a second straight game in a 41-17 victory over Colorado State at Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium. The win was the fifth straight for the Aztecs (6-3, 5-0 Mountain West), who have outscored the opposition, 168-59, during the streak.

Pumphrey scored on runs of 1 and 64 yards, and caught a 32-yard touchdown pass from Maxwell Smith as SDSU outscored the Rams (3-5, 1-3 MW), 34-7 over the final 38:48 of the game.

Trailing 10-7 when Wyatt Bryan connected on a 44-yard field goal, San Diego State tied it as Donny Hageman nailed a 20-yard field goal with 3:22 left in the second quarter.

Later in the period, after the Aztecs were forced to punt, CSU took over possession with just 22 seconds left in the half. The Rams completed a 14-yard pass to the SDSU 48 and called timeout. On CSU's next play, SDSU defensive back Kameron Kelly picked off quarterback Nick Stevens and returned it to the SDSU 48 with just eight seconds remaining.

Smith then found a wide-open Pumphrey, who ran it 15 yards to the Ram 37, quickly fell down and called a timeout to set up a 54-yard field goal attempt for Hageman. Hageman drilled it through the uprights, tying a career-long make and giving the Aztecs a 13-10 lead at the half.

After forcing Colorado State to a 3 and out on the opening drive of the third quarter, SDSU punctuated a 13-play, 89-yard drive with a 32-yard pass from Smith to Pumphrey to put San Diego State up, 20-10. The Aztecs made it 27-10 on the Rams' next drive when Damontae Kazee picked off Stevens and returned it 55 yards for his first career touchdown.

CSU responded with a 9-play, 75-yard drive, culminating with a 14-yard touchdown pass from Stevens to Danny Nwosu to make it a 10-point game early in the fourth quarter. It took only two plays for SDSU to answer as Pumphrey ran for 11 yards and then 64 yards into the end zone for his third score of the game and a 34-17 advantage.

San Diego State capped the scoring for the game on its next possession as Chase Price rumbled into the end zone from 16 yards out. The Aztecs had 81 yards on the drive, all via the ground, including 50 from fullback Dakota Gordon and 31 from Price. Pumphrey finished with 168 total yards - 121 rushing and 47 receiving - and three overall touchdowns (two rushing) in the game. It was his fifth straight 100-yard rushing game and 19th of his career. In game he passed Larry Ned into second place on the school's all-time rushing list and broke 1,000 yards for the season for the second straight year.

Three other SDSU players had 50-plus running yards, including 54 by Rashaad Penny (nine carries), 50 by Price (12 rushes) and 50 by Gordon (four attempts). Smith, meanwhile, was 11-for-14 for 180 yards and a touchdown, with no interceptions for a seventh straight game. Smith finished with a season-best pass efficiency rating of 210.14 and stretched his streak to 125 passes without an interception. Mikah Holder led a group of four San Diego State players with two catches, including a team-high 72 receiving yards.

J.J. Whittaker had a team-high eight tackles, while Kazee recorded seven stops (five solo), a 55-yard interception returned for a touchdown and a forced fumble in the end zone, keeping Colorado State off the scoreboard on its opening drive of the game. Na'im McGee added seven tackles and two pass breakups.

SAN DIEGO - Chase Price ran for 152 yards and two touchdowns, and Donnel Pumphrey had his sixth straight 100-yard rushing game with 140 yards to lead San Diego State to a 38-3 victory over Wyoming at Qualcomm Stadium. The win made the Aztecs (7-3, 6-0 Mountain West) bowl eligible for a sixth consecutive season.

Maxwell Smith threw three touchdown passes, including two to Mikah Holder, as SDSU outgained the Cowboys (1-10, 1-6 MW) by 240 yards (431-191) with a 231-yard advantage on the ground (293-62).

It was the sixth straight win for San Diego State - all by double-digits - and fourth consecutive triumph by at least 23 points.

The Aztecs scored the first 24 points of the game before Wyoming got on the scoreboard with a 31-yard field goal with 13:30 left in the fourth quarter. The Cowboys had twice kept the drive going by successfully converting back-to-back fourth-down attempts, but settled for the field goal and its only points of the game.

SDSU answered with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Smith to Daniel Brunskill on its ensuing drive and, after Malik Smith picked off Cameron Coffman at the San Diego State 1-yard line, tacked on another score, a 2-yard run by Price for the final points of the contest. On the Price scoring drive, he had all 89 yards on the ground, starting with a 20-yard scamper and a career-long 56-yard jaunt.

Price put the Aztecs on the scoreboard with a 4-yard touchdown run on their second drive of the game. After forcing Wyoming to punt, SDSU got the ball back and went to work, grinding out 79 yards on 10 plays over the next 4:44, culminating with a 7-yard pass by Smith to Holder.

The score would remain 14-0 until late in the second quarter when a Tanner Blain punt was muffed by the Cowboys' Andrew Wingard and recovered by San Diego State long snapper Jeff Overbaugh at the Wyoming 24. Four plays later, Smith found Holder again from four yards out, giving the Aztecs a 21-0 lead at the half.

Donny Hageman hit a 26-yard field goal midway through the third quarter for SDSU's other points, setting up Wyoming's lone score (the 31-yard field goal). San Diego State had multiple 100-yard rushers for the 20th time in program history with Price gaining his 152 yards and two touchdowns on 17 attempts (8.9 avg.) and Pumphrey rushing for 140 on 29 carries (4.8 avg.).

Smith was 12-for-19 for 138 yards and an Aztec-high three touchdown passes. It was his third career game with at least three touchdown passes and first since Sept. 7, 2013 when he played at Kentucky. He also extended his streak to 144 passes without throwing an interception.

Defensively, SDSU racked up a season-high five sacks after recording just two over its last two games combined to go along with 10 tackles for loss, five pass breakups and two interceptions. Additionally, San Diego State limited the Cowboys to just a 1-for-13 effort on third-down attempts.

Alex Barrett had a career-high three tackles for loss and tied a collegiate-best with two sacks, while Calvin Munson had a team-high seven stops. J.J. Whittaker joined Smith with an interception (each for 10 yards).

The Aztecs won for the sixth consecutive game overall, their longest streak since a seven-game winning streak to close out the 2012 regular season en route to capturing their 19th conference championship in program history. It was also the eighth straight conference win for SDSU, the ninth consecutive home conference victory and 15th straight home win against an unranked conference opponent.

LAS VEGAS - Hours after clinching the West Division of the Mountain West with a Nevada loss at Utah State, San Diego State defeated UNLV, 52-14, at Sam Boyd Stadium.

The Aztecs (8-3, 7-0 MW) forced four turnovers, turning those into 21 points, and outrushed the Rebels (3-8, 2-5 MW) by more than 200 yards (286-80) en route to their seventh straight victory. The seven consecutive wins marked the fifth-longest active streak in FBS play to date.

Donnel Pumphrey rushed for 139 yards and two touchdowns, despite not playing the team's final four drives and 23 plays over a span of 25:39. It was his seventh straight 100-yard rushing game, which ranks in a tie for second among active FBS players and third in program history.

Rashaad Penny added 81 yards and a rushing touchdown on 18 attempts, while Chase Price had 54 yards on the ground and caught a 17-yard touchdown pass. Quarterback Maxwell Smith (3 yards) and fullback Dakota Gordon (1 yard) also rushed for touchdowns in SDSU's fifth straight win by at least 23 points, the longest active streak in FBS play.

SAN DIEGO - Donnel Pumphrey and Chase Price each surpassed 100 yards rushing, and San Diego State scored the final 17 points of the game in a 31-14 victory over Nevada on Senior Night at Qualcomm Stadium. The win gave the Aztecs (9-3, 8-0 Mountain West) their first undefeated conference season since 1974.

Pumphrey rushed for 154 yards and two touchdowns on 23 carries (6.7 avg.), while Price added 112 yards and a score on 19 attempts (5.9 avg.). Rashaad Penny also scored a rushing touchdown for SDSU, which outgained the Wolf Pack (6-6, 4-4 MW), 320-35, on the ground.

San Diego State forced three turnovers and held Nevada to 263 total yards, including just 52 yards in the second half.

The Aztecs got on the scoreboard first on their opening drive when Pumphrey finished a 9-play, 67-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown run.

The Wolf Pack answered, however, with a 72-yard pass from Tyler Stewart to Jerico Richardson on its first play of the game. It appeared that SDSU was going to hold the Nevada to a field goal, but the Wolf Pack pulled off a trick play and holder/backup quarterback Hunter Fralick ran it in from four yards out to tie the game at 7-7.

San Diego State took back the lead on its next drive, marching 82 yards on eight plays over 4:04, ending with a 14-yard touchdown run by Penny. Price did most of the work on the drive, rushing four times

for 62 yards, setting up Penny's sixth overall touchdown of the year.

Nevada threatened early in the second quarter, getting all the way to the Aztec 8-yard line. SDSU's Malik Smith, however, picked off Tyler Stewart in the end zone, keeping San Diego State ahead by seven points.

The Wolf Pack later took advantage of a missed field goal by the Aztecs with a 9-play, 80-yard drive, ending when Richardson recovered Don Jackson's fumble in the end zone to tie the game at 14 apiece.

After facing a 3rd-and-20 after multiple penalties late in the second quarter, Pumphrey broke away for a season-long 72-yard touchdown to give SDSU a 21-14 lead at the break. The 72-yard run made Pumphrey just the second player in school and Mountain West history with 4,000 rushing yards.

A 29-yard field goal by Donny Hageman with 2:58 left in the third quarter put San Diego State up, 24-14.

Price closed the scoring early in the fourth quarter with a 2-yard rushing touchdown by Price.

Pumphrey posted his eighth straight 100-yard rushing game, ninth of the season and 22nd of his career. The eight consecutive games with at least 100 yards rushing tied George Jones (1995) for the second-longest streak in program history, matched the longest active stretch in FBS play and marked the longest streak in MW history.

Meanwhile, Price notched his third 100-yard game of the year and fourth of his career, giving the Aztecs a pair of 100-yard rushers in the same game for the third time this season and for the 21st time in program history (SDSU is 20-1 in those games).

Smith and Calvin Munson led San Diego State with eight tackles apiece, while Jake Fely recorded seven stops with a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. The Aztecs finished the game with four sacks, six tackles for loss, three forced fumbles, five pass breakups, two interceptions and a fumble recovery.

SDSU became the first team to go undefeated in Mountain West play since TCU in 2011.

San Diego State also became one of just six schools in the last 20 seasons (since 1996) to complete an undefeated league season with each victory coming by double-digits. Additionally, the Aztecs held Nevada to just 35 yards rushing, its fewest in a game since Sept. 6, 2004.

San Diego State jumped out to a 31-0 lead at the half, scoring on five of its six drives (four touchdowns and a field goal) in the first 30.

Smith got the Aztecs on the scoreboard with a 3-yard run on their first possession of the game.

UNLV got into field goal range on its ensuing possession, but Randy Ricks sacked quarterback Kurt Palandech and the ball popped out to a waiting Jon Sanchez. SDSU capitalized with a 10-play, 49-yard drive, culminating with a 2-yard rushing score by Pumphrey.

After losing another fumble, the Rebels made it three straight drives with a turnover when Kameron Kelly picked off Palandech and returned it 15 yards to the San Diego State 40-yard line. Gordon capped an 8-play, 45-yard drive with a 1-yard rushing score, the first of his career, putting the Aztecs up, 21-0.

After UNLV failed on a fourth-and-2, SDSU got the ball back on its own 36-yard line. Pumphrey took San Diego State's first snap 60 yards to the Rebel 4 and then bounced outside for his second rushing touchdown of the game.

The Aztecs ended the scoring in the first half with a 29-yard field goal by Donny Hageman as time expired and a 31-0 advantage.

UNLV finally got on the scoreboard on its first possession of the second half when Palandech found Kendal Keys from 14 yards out.

After forcing a 3 and out for the second straight drive in the second half, the Rebels got the ball back with 10:39 in the third quarter. Palandech, however, was picked off by Parker Baldwin and returned 28 yards to the UNLV 21. Three plays later, Smith found Price on a screen for a 17-yard touchdown strike.

Damontae Kazee made it 45-7 SDSU when he returned a punt 66 yards back for his second touchdown in three weeks (also an interception return for a score a Colorado State).

The Rebels doubled their score with a 6-play, 58-yard drive over 2:45, ending with a 6-yard touchdown pass from Palandech to Xavier Campbell.

In the fourth quarter, Penny went to work with 13 rushes for 58 yards and a 2-yard catch, accounting for all of San Diego State's 60 yards, including a 3-yard touchdown and the final points of the game.

Smith passed for 107 yards and a touchdown, completing 11 of 17 attempts.

Calvin Munson paced a defense that had 12 tackles for loss and seven sacks with a team-high eight tackles.

SAN DIEGO - Redshirt freshman quarterback Christian Chapman passed for 203 yards and a touchdown in his first career start and Donny Hageman nailed 46-yard field goal with 5:10 left in the game to give San Diego State a 27-24 victory over Air Force in the 2015 Sports Authority Mountain West Championship game at Qualcomm Stadium. The win gave the Aztecs (10-3) their 20th conference championship in program history and first outright league title since 1986.

In a game that featured five tie scores, SDSU took its first lead of the game with 14:22 left to go on Rashaad Penny's 28-yard run. The Falcons (8-5) tied it again at 24-24 on their ensuing drive on Timothy McVey's third rushing touchdown of the game, this time from two yards out.

After back-to-back 3 and outs, San Diego State got the ball back with 8:08 to play on its own 25-yard line. On the second play of the drive, Chapman connected on a 48-yard pass to Mikah Holder to get the Aztecs to the AFA 25. Facing a 3rd and 27 after a holding penalty and a 6-yard loss that had SDSU on the Air Force 42, San Diego State got back into field goal range on a 13-yard pass from Chapman to Eric Judge. Hageman then cleared the uprights from 46 yards out for the game-winning score.

The Aztec defense stood tall, forcing the Falcons to another three-and-out and, after SDSU had to punt the ball, knocked down Karson Roberts' Hail Mary pass as time expired.

San Diego State only led for 7:43 during the game, rallying back from 7-0, 10-7 and 17-10 deficits. After the Falcons took advantage of a muffed punt and McVey scored from 10 yards out, the Aztecs tied it up first at 7-7 on Chapman's 24-yard pass to Donnell Pumphrey on the first play of the second quarter.

AFA made it 10-7 midway through the second quarter on a 21-yard field goal by Luke Strebel, before Hageman answered for SDSU with a 22-yard make, making it 10-10 at the half.

Air Force went ahead for a third time on its opening drive of the second half, ending with a 3-yard run by McVey.

San Diego State answered with a 13-play, 80-yard drive over 6:36, before Gordon punched it in from 1-yard out to tie it at 17-17. The Aztecs amassed 67 of the 80 yards on the ground on the drive, including a 23-yard run by Gordon on 4th and 1 at the Falcon 29.

After forcing AFA to punt, Penny gave SDSU its first lead at 24-17 on the 28-yard run.

Chapman, who was named the game's offensive most valuable player, finished 9 of 14 for 203 yards and a touchdown, while adding 32 yards on the ground on six attempts (5.3 avg.). Pumphrey ran for 90 yards on 16 attempts (5.6 avg.) and caught two passes for a career-high 64 yards and a touchdown. Jemond Hazely set career highs with five catches and 78 yards in the win for San Diego State.

Na'im McGee finished with a team-high and game-high-tying 10 tackles en route to being named the game's defensive most valuable player. Malik Smith, Calvin Munson and Alex Barrett each added 10 tackles apiece.

The Aztecs' 10 wins are their most since winning 10 as an independent team in 1977 and are one off a school record of 11 in 1966 (as a Division II member) and 1969 (first year of Division I play). Additionally, it was SDSU's ninth straight win, its longest streak since a 10-game winning streak during the 1976 and 1977 seasons.

San Diego State also extended its DI school records of consecutive games with 200 rushing yards (nine) and consecutive games without throwing an interception (11).

HONOLULU - San Diego State completed one of the most successful seasons in program history with a convincing 42-7 triumph over Cincinnati in the 2015 Hawai'i Bowl at Aloha Stadium. The Aztecs (11-3) employed a strong rushing game, timely special teams play and a dominating defense to secure their first 11-win campaign since 1969.

Fullback Dakota Gordon caught a 16-yard touchdown pass and ran for another score to earn the game's Most Valuable Player award. Donnell Pumphrey, the Mountain West Offensive Player of the Year, had 99 yards on 25 carries as SDSU matched a school record with its 10th straight victory.

Collectively, the Aztecs rushed for 207 yards, while the defense limited the potent Bearcat attack to 279 total yards and intercepted three passes.

SDSU received an instant boost when Rashaad Penny returned the opening kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown. It was the third score on a kickoff return this season for the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Year, who broke the Hawai'i Bowl record for the longest return in the process.

After forcing a three-and-out, the Aztecs marched 85 yards in nine plays on their first offensive possession, punctuated by Christian Chapman's 14-yard touchdown pass to Mikah Holder with 9:08 elapsed in the first quarter.

SDSU subsequently increased its lead to 21-0 late in the second period when Pumphrey lofted a 16-yard option pass to Gordon, who bowled over a defender before crossing the goal line. The 4-play, 56-yard drive was set up by Damontae Kazee's eighth interception of the season. On the first play following the turnover, Pumphrey put the Aztecs in striking distance with a 33-yard scamper down the right sideline before getting pushed out of bounds at the Cincinnati 23.

The Bearcats, who failed to score in the first half for the first time in 35 games, threatened on their second drive of the third quarter. However, SDSU thwarted a fake field-goal attempt, taking over possession at its own 33-yard line.

Shortly thereafter, Chapman directed an 8-play, 67-yard march, capped by Gordon's 1-yard touchdown plunge, which put the Aztecs in command at 28-0 with 5:14 left in the frame. Chapman keyed the drive with a 16-yard completion to Jemond Hazely, followed by a 19-yard toss to Pumphrey.

SDSU consumed nearly seven minutes on its next foray down the field when Pumphrey put the finishing touches on a methodical 11-play, 85-yard advance with a short TD run from two yards out, giving the Scarlet and Black an insurmountable 35-0 advantage early in the fourth quarter.

Minutes later, the Aztec defense got into the act when Alex Barrett registered the third interception of Cincinnati quarterback Hayden Moore and rumbled 43 yards for a score with 9:04 to play.

The Bearcats finally got on the board after Mike Boone's 1-yard dive with 3:21 remaining.

Cincinnati entered the game ranked first nationally in passing yards per game (373.1) and total offense (559.4), but was limited to just 279 yards overall in the loss.

In addition to its three interceptions, including a first-quarter pick by Malik Smith, SDSU recorded six tackles for a loss, including four sacks, to go with six quarterback hurries and one pass break-up.

Individually, Na'im McGee and Kameron Kelly tied for the team lead with nine tackles each, along with Kyle Kelley, who finished with 3.5 sacks.

On the other side of the ball, Chapman completed 8 of 11 passes for 113 yards and no interceptions in just his second collegiate start since taking over for Maxwell Smith, who was injured in the regular-season finale against Nevada.

The Aztecs also received 68 yards rushing from Chase Price, who finished the season with 1,008 yards on the ground, combining with Pumphrey (1,653 yards) to give SDSU two 1,000-yard running backs in the same year for the first time in program history. Gordon, meanwhile, had four catches for 58 yards, including a 35-yard reception in the third quarter.
