Game 17 • New Mexico vs. San Diego State Saturday, Jan. 12 • 7:05 p.m. MST • The Mtn. The Pit/Bob King Court • Albuquerque, N.M.

Playing at home for the first time in nearly three weeks, New Mexico (14-2, 1-0 MWC) entertains San Diego State (11-4, 1-0 MWC) on Saturday night. ***It's Pack The Pit night with all tickets just \$10.*** Game sponsors include Alltel, KOB TV and Citadel Communications. **The first 15,000 fans will receive Howl Towels courtesy of Alltel.**

Tipoff is 7:05 p.m. from The Pit/Bob King Court in Albuquerque. The Lobos' last home game was Dec. 23 against Weber State. San Diego State fell 62-56 to Northern Colorado on Wednesday.

The game can be seen on The Mtn. with Bill Doleman and Dave Bollwinkel, plus live audio is available via All Access at golobos.com.

New Mexico is 10-0 in The Pit this season, winning by an average of 22.8 points a game. San Diego State is 5-3 away from Cox Arena this season, 3-2 in true road games and 2-1 at neutral sites.

LOBO BRIEFING

Winners of 7 straight games for the second time this year, UNM is coming off one of its more exciting weeks in a long, long time.

The Lobos prevailed 86-85 in overtime at UTEP last Wednesday, followed by a grinding 99-92 double-overtime thriller at Wyoming on Saturday. UNM trailed the Cowboys 48-32 at halftime. More tidbits about the Lobos:

- New Mexico and San Diego State were picked to finish in a tie for fourth place in the 2007-08 Mountain West Conference race
- San Diego State has won 4 straight against New Mexico overall and 2 in a row in The Pit...the last time the Lobos lost 5 straight conference games to one opponent was to UNLV between 2002-04...only 4 opponents have beaten UNM at least 3 straight times in The Pit: UTEP won 4 in a row from 1983-86; Arizona 3 straight from 1975-77; San Diego State 3 consecutive from 1982-84; and Utah 3 in a row from 1995-96
- New Mexico has not started 2-0 in the MWC since 2001-02

UNM STUDENT TICKET PICK-UP

Tickets for Lobo men's basketball are free for all full-time UNM students (enrolled in 6+ hours) during the 2007-08 season. Students can pick up tickets on six distribution dates and student guest tickets will be available for \$10. The UNM student seating is in sections 26 and 27 on the north end of The Pit.

- Tickets are available at the Center for the Arts ticket window outside of Popejoy Hall on each distribution date from 7:30-10 a.m. After that time, tickets can be picked up at the UNM Bookstore or the Lobo Ticket Office at The Pit. Student tickets will be available from the distribution date until the start of the game, subject to availability.

- Full-time UNM students must show a valid student ID to pick up tickets and must show their ID and ticket when entering The Pit. The student section will be assigned seating, not general admission. The earlier you get your tickets, the better your seats.

- One student can get up to four tickets per game. For example, on the first distribution date, one student can bring four valid student IDs and get four tickets for all four games being distributed on that date, totaling 16 tickets. One student can use any combination of student IDs and student guest tickets, but may only get four tickets for any game at one time.

- Sections 26 and 27 include approximately 1,100 seats. If the demand for student tickets exceeds the capacity of these sections for any given game, additional seating will be in other bench and standing room sections, up to the capacity of The Pit. Students will not be turned away as long as there are available seats for a given game.

- Student entrance is door 12 on the north side of The Pit.

- New Mexico has never played 3 straight overtime games...5 of the Lobos' last 14 Mountain West Conference games have gone into overtime...UNM is 2-3 in those games

- Before last week, UNM had played back-to-back overtime games three times in school history...last week, however, was the first time the Lobos won both of the OT contests

- Just 1 win shy of matching last season's total, UNM is 14-2 for only the second time in the past 9 seasons...the 2004-05 squad - led by Danny Granger - also started 14-2...the Lobos started 16-2 in 1998-99

- A win Saturday would give Steve Alford his best 17-game record in 13 years as a Division I head coach...his 2000-01 Iowa team began 14-2 before losing its next two games

- New Mexico's last 8-game winning streak was a 9-game run from Feb. 14-March 12, 2005...the last three games of that streak were against BYU, San Diego State and Utah to claim the MWC Tournament championship in Denver

- The Lobos' current 7-game winning streak began Dec. 8 when Chad Toppert and Roman Martinez were inserted into the starting lineup...UNM is 7-0 with Martinez, Toppert, Daniel Faris, Dairese Gary and J.R. Giddens as starters

- Opponents are shooting just 35.6% (87-244) against UNM the past 4 games

- At UTEP on Jan. 2, senior J.R. Giddens fell 1 rebound short from becoming the first Lobo in 31 seasons to notch 20 points and 20 rebounds in a game...Jimmy Allen had 21 points and 20 boards in a 112-103 loss at New Mexico State on Dec. 1, 1976...Giddens scored 20 points and set career-highs with 19 rebounds and 7 assists in the overtime victory over the Miners...the 19 rebounds are the most in the MWC this season

- After going 3-19 in true road games the past two seasons, UNM is 4-2 this year and has won 3 in a row for the first time since 2000-01 (at New Mexico State, Gonzaga and San Diego State)...the losses this year have come at Ole Miss and New Mexico State...Ole Miss is 13-0 and ranked No. 16 in the AP poll heading into this week's showdown at Tennessee

NEW MEXICO-SAN DIEGO STATE SERIES

UNM has a 35-25 lead in a series that started Jan. 2, 1976. SDSU has won 4 straight and seeks its first 5-game winning streak over the Lobos in 24 years, since taking 7 in a row between 1981-84. The winning team has scored at least 70 points in each of the past 10 games. The last four games - all SDSU wins - have all been decided by 7 points or less.

Last year, the Aztecs won 73-68 in San Diego and 81-74 in overtime in The Pit. The Lobos have a 23-6 advantage in The Pit. It's tied 8-8 in MWC contests.

AZTEC ALLEY

San Diego State is 11-4 overall and 1-0 in the MWC after slipping past TCU 64-57 last Saturday at Cox Pavilion. The Aztecs led 32-13 at halftime. SDSU is starting an all-underclassmen lineup with three juniors and a pair of freshmen. The only senior on the roster is guard Matt Thomas, who has scored just 8 points in 10 games played.

The Aztecs list four forwards and a point guard among their starters. Like the Lobos, SDSU has a lot of balance in the scoring column. Junior Lorenzo Wade is averaging 14.7 ppg, while fellow junior Kyle Spain is at 13.3 ppg and also leads the team in rebounding at 6 a game. San Diego State is last in the MWC in FG% defense, allowing 44%.

Steve Fisher is in his 17th season as a head coach and 9th year at San Diego State, which makes his tenure the longest among MWC coaches. He is 322-202 overall, 138-120 at SDSU. Fisher has an 8-9 record against UNM, 3-5 in The Pit.

LAST YEAR IN ALBUQUERQUE

Brandon Heath scored 30 points and Jerome Habel's back-to-back layups in overtime put San Diego State in front for good in an 81-74 win.

San Diego State won for the sixth time in the last seven games. New Mexico lost its fourth conference game at home for the first time since 1981.

New Mexico had a chance to win in regulation, but Chad Toppert missed on a 3-pointer with just over two seconds left. San Diego State couldn't control the rebound and the Lobos got the ball back with half a second left. Guard Darren Prentice found center Aaron Johnson open, but Johnson missed the easy layup. Johnson gave New Mexico its last lead (74-72) with two free throws with 3:40 left in overtime.

Habel, who got his first career double-double with 18 points and 12 rebounds, scored inside, then intercepted a New Mexico pass and went in for another layup to make it 76-74.

New Mexico's Tony Danridge, who tied his career-high with 24 points, had his short jumper in the lane partially blocked and Heath countered with a 10-foot baseline jumper, his first field goal since the 11:45 mark of the second half.

Lobo guard Ryan Kersten had his shot deflected and Heath then added two free throws for a 78-74 lead with 1:21 left.

Aztec forward Lorenzo Wade scored 16 points, had 9 rebounds and a career-high 8 assists.

New Mexico led 33-24 with 2:22 left in the first half after a 12-2 run, but the Aztecs scored the final nine points. Wade scored seven of the nine, including a 3-pointer with 19 seconds left. Heath found his shooting touch over a 2 1/2 minute early in the second half, during which he hit three 3-pointers, the last one giving the Aztecs a 47-41 lead with 15:58 left.

New Mexico steadily cut into the deficit and two free throws by Danridge tied it at 62 with 3:55 left in regulation. A 3-pointer by Richie Williams put the Aztecs up 69-65 with 2:10 left but Danridge got a short jumper to roll in with 37.7 seconds left to put the Lobos up 70-69.

San Diego State reserve forward Kyle Spain hit the first of two free throws with 17.1 seconds left for the final point in regulation. Prentice scored 15 points for New Mexico and had 7 assists.

BRANDON HEATH: LOBOS SAY GOOD RIDDANCE

Former San Diego State standout Brandon Heath scored 62 points in his final two games against UNM in The Pit, both Aztec victories. He made 20-of-43 FGs and 13-of-27 attempts from 3-point.

HEAD COACH STEVE ALFORD

Steve Alford was named UNM's 19th head coach on March 23, 2007, after spending eighth seasons at the University of Iowa.

Alford is 322-185 (63%) into his 17th season. His teams have qualified for postseason play 11 times, produced 13 winning seasons and reached 20 wins on eight occasions.

This is Alford's first game against San Diego State.

In eight seasons at Iowa, Alford compiled a 152-106 record with a school-record seven consecutive winning seasons, and six postseason appearances. The Hawkeyes won two Big Ten Conference tournament titles (2001 and '06). Iowa was 17-14 in 2006-07. It was 9-7 in the Big Ten, tied with NCAA teams Illinois and Purdue for fourth place.

Prior to Iowa, Alford posted a 78-29 record in four seasons (1992-95) at NCAA Division III Manchester (Ind.) College and a four-year

(1996-99) record of 78-48 at Southwest Missouri State (now Missouri State). The Bears defeated Wisconsin and Tennessee to advance to the Sweet 16 of the 1999 NCAA Tournament before losing to top-ranked Duke in the regional semifinals. In 1997 Alford led the Bears to a 24-9 record (second in the Missouri Valley Conference) and a trip to the National Invitation Tournament.

In somewhat of a rarity, Alford has never been anything but a head coach at the collegiate level. His first position came at Manchester at the age of 27.

UNM PREDICTED FOR 4TH-PLACE FINISH IN MOUNTAIN WEST

New Mexico and San Diego State were picked to finish in a tie fourth in the 2007-08 Mountain West Conference race during the league's preseason media gathering in Denver on October 17. Voters were a combination of head coaches and media. BYU was the favorite to win the league.

UNM ALL-TIME IN THE MWC

New Mexico has a 53-64 record in the Mountain West Conference, 39-19 in The Pit and 14-45 on the road. UNM is 8-37 in league road games since 2001.

NEW MEXICO LAST YEAR IN THE MWC

Picked to finish fifth in last year's MWC preseason poll, New Mexico finished 4-12, tying TCU for eighth - or last - place. UNM lost 12 conference games for the first time since 1959 when it finished 1-13 in the Skyline Conference.

UNM endured its fifth MWC losing record in the past seven seasons. The Lobos' only winning mark in league play since 2000 was 10-4 in 2005. UNM was 8-8 in 2005-06. New Mexico never had a losing league record from 1984-2000, a span of 17 seasons.

SEASON NO. 105

The 2007-08 season is the 105th in school history. The Lobos first laced up the hightops on Feb. 2, 1900, when they lost 8-6 to the Albuquerque Guards. While this season is actually the 106th anniversary of that inaugural year, UNM did not field a team for various reasons in 1900-01, 1903-04, 1917-18 and 1920-21.

The Lobos have been on the hardwoods continuously since the 1921-22 season and have compiled an all-time record of 1,278-999 (.560). New Mexico was 420-498 (.457) from 1900-62, but has gone 858-501 (.630) over the past 44-plus seasons, an average of nearly 19 wins per year.

The Lobos have made 27 trips to the postseason during that span, including 11 appearances in the NCAA Tournament and 16 showings in the NIT.

DANRIDGE OUT

Lobo senior Tony Danridge suffered a broken left fibula during a game with teammates on Oct. 4. He had surgery on Oct. 8 and is expected to miss three months. Danridge, a 6-5 senior from San Ber-

nardino, Calif., posted 12.5 points and 2.5 rebounds per game last season and was named 3rd team All-MWC. He was the only Lobo to play in all 95 games over the past three seasons, not missing a game to this point in his Lobo career. He does have a redshirt year available.

WYOMING RECAP AND POSTGAME NOTES

Jamaal Smith scored 24 points, including 11 in overtime, to lead New Mexico over Wyoming 99-92 in double overtime Saturday.

Smith hit three 3-pointers in the second half to help the Lobos overcome a 16-point halftime deficit.

J.R. Giddens scored five straight points to put New Mexico ahead 73-71 with 22 seconds remaining in regulation, but Wyoming's Joseph Taylor banked in a turn-around jumper on the ensuing possession to send the game into overtime.

Giddens scored four more points in the first overtime to give the Lobos an 82-81 lead with 22.2 seconds left, but a Taylor free throw with 17.9 seconds left tied the score at 82, forcing a second overtime. Giddens finished with 16 points, and Darren Prentice added 12 points for New Mexico. Ryan Dermody led Wyoming with 24 points.

Taylor finished with 17 points and 14 rebounds, and Brad Jones and Brandon Ewing each scored 15 for the Cowboys.

Dermody hit three 3-pointers during a 19-4 run that gave Wyoming a 26-15 lead with 11:25 remaining in the first half. New Mexico pulled within 39-32 10 minutes later, but Wyoming scored the final nine points of the period to take a 48-32 lead into halftime. The Lobos got back into the game with a 16-2 run to open the second half.

• **UNM staged the largest second-half comeback in a road game in school history, and it's the 5th biggest rally overall...New Mexico's largest comeback on the books was Jan. 15, 1993, at Hawai'i when it came back from 20 points (31-11) to win 61-58**

• New Mexico snapped a 10-game losing streak to Wyoming in Laramie...the last win was 62-61 on Feb. 18, 1995...in that game 13 years ago, the Lobos trailed the Cowboys 30-12 with 3:26 left in the first half

• UNM is 4-2 away from home and has won 3 straight road games for the first time since the 2000-01 season (at New Mexico State, Gonzaga and San Diego State)

• New Mexico has won 3 straight uninterrupted road games - no home games in between - for the first time since 1989 (at Wyoming, Hawaii and San Diego State)

SUPERLATIVES IN O-T WIN AT UTEP

The Lobos established some new standards in the 86-85 overtime win over UTEP on Jan. 2:

- J.R. Giddens' 19 rebounds were the most by a UTEP opponent since Nevada's Richard Stirgus collected 19 boards in Reno on Jan. 27, 2001...Giddens' 19 rebounds were also a Haskins Center record by an opposing player
- The Lobos' 52 free throw attempts were the most by a Miner foe since Missouri shot 55 on Dec. 8, 1973 in Columbia...the 52 free throw attempts were a Haskins Center record, and the 37 free throws made were a Haskins Center opponent record

- UNM's 56 rebounds were a Haskins Center opponent record, and the most boards by a UTEP opponent since Washington also collected 56 in a preseason NIT game in Denver on Nov. 22, 1985

NON-CONFERENCE STREAK IN THE PIT

The Lobos have won 31 consecutive non-conference home games, and 47 of the past 48. The last loss was 81-64 to 5th-ranked Wake Forest on Dec. 22, 2004.

BIG-TIME DEFENSE AGAINST WEBER STATE

New Mexico side-swiped Weber State 62-32 at home on Dec. 23. The 32 points ties for the fewest by a Lobo opponent in The Pit, which opened in December of 1966. UNM beat BYU 74-32 on Feb. 3, 1997.

It also ties for the fewest points allowed by a Steve Alford-coached team during his 17-year coaching career. On March 12, 1999, Alford's Southwest Missouri State squad beat Wisconsin 43-32 in the 1st round of the NCAA Tournament in Charlotte N.C.

It was 34-12 UNM at halftime. The 12 points are the fewest by a UNM opponent in the first half since Dec. 29, 1972, when the Lobos had a 40-9 halftime lead over Dartmouth.

HOLDING DOWN SOME OF THE BIG GUNS

New Mexico really put the clamps on the opponents' top scorers in a couple of non-conference games:

- University of San Diego: USD's top-2 scorers – Brandon Johnson and Gyno Pomare – were held to a combined 14 points and 4 rebounds...they came into the game averaging 31.6 points and 10.7 rebounds...Pomare had a season-low 4 points

- Texas Tech: Martin Zeno and Alan Voskuil had just 5 points and 0 rebounds...the duo was averaging 30.3 points and 10.1 rebounds...Zeno was held scoreless and had just 1 FG attempt in 5 minutes, while Voskuil (1-6 FGs, 2-2 FTs) didn't score until 3:31 into the second half on a pair of FTs

- UTEP: Stefon Jackson had 17 points on 5-15 shooting, 7-8 FTs, and 1 rebound...Jackson came into the game 6th in the nation in scoring, averaging 25.5 points, and a team-high 5 rebounds...he scored just 2 points and had no rebounds in the 1st half

IT'S A REAL T.E.A.M.

Some pretty interesting facts about the 10-man Lobos team through the first 16 games of the season:

- All 10 Lobos have played in every game this season, and all 10 are averaging at least 10 minutes a game

- With 16 games in the books, you could say there have been a total of 160 opportunities to score: 16 games x 10 players...amazingly, only 14 times has a Lobo not gotten into the scoring column this season...it's the same with rebounding: just 15 times has a Lobo failed to get a carom

- Eight different players - out of 10 on the roster - have led the team in scoring, and that happened in the first 14 games

NICE BENCH

And, since everyone plays the Lobo bench has made huge contributions. The reserves contributed 49 points in the 86-58 win over Loyola Marymount, including 19 of the first 23 and 26 of 43 in the first half.

UNM's reserves have scored 40.9% (504 of 1,232) of the points and pulled down 38.3% (208 of 543) of the individual rebounds this season. That's averages of 31.5 points and 13 rebounds a game.

FREE THROWS IMPROVING

The Lobos opened the season by shooting a chilly 60.4% from the free-throw line in the first 6 games. The past 10 contests, the accuracy is 71.4% (187-262), raising the season percentage to 68.1%. UNM has attempted a whopping 120 free throws the past 3 games - an average of 40 a game - making 83 (69%).

3-POINT RECORD FALLS

The Lobos' 81.8% (9-11) accuracy from 3-point against Texas Tech is a school record and it tied the Mountain West Conference record (San Diego State - Dec. 15, 2006). The previous UNM record was 72.2% (13-18) vs. San Francisco State in 2003.

TOPPERT NO. 1 FROM 3

Junior Chad Toppert continues to swing back and forth for the top spot as UNM's most accurate 3-point shooter. He has made 45.07% (142-315) of his tries, No. 1 on list. Troy DeVries is 2nd at 44.95% (147-327).

Toppert is 2nd in the league in 3-point shooting (2.69 a game) and accuracy (48.3%) this season.

IT'S A FIRST FOR LOBO HOOPS

For the first time since the 3-point shot was introduced into college basketball before the 1986-87 season, UNM canned at least 13 3-pointers in three straight games. The historic feat came during the Basketball Travelers Invitational when the Lobos were 13 of 28 against Presbyterian, 13 of 28 against St. Bonaventure and 13 of 26 against Loyola Marymount. That's a 47.6% clip for the 3-game tournament.

3s AND COUNTING

UNM has made a 3-pointer in 564 straight games, the 12th-longest active streak in NCAA Div. I. UNLV is 1st at more than 660 games. The last time UNM failed to connect from long range was Jan. 3, 1991, missing on 8 attempts against Colorado State in The Pit.

DISHIN' IT

The 28 assists in the 92-57 win over Eastern Washington is UNM's highest total in 10 years, since it had 32 in a 112-61 victory over Holy Cross on Dec. 29, 1997.

The Lobos are averaging 17.3 assists a game compared to 15.1 in 2006-07.

PERSONNEL PICTURE

The Lobos return seven lettermen, including four starters, from last year's team that posted a 15-17 overall record and finished tied for eighth in the MWC with a 4-12 mark. UNM returns more than 77% of its scoring, 67% of its rebounding and 71% of its minutes.

Returning starters include seniors J.R. Giddens, Tony Danridge, Darren Prentice and Jamaal Smith. Giddens led the team in scoring at 15.8 ppg while Danridge was second on the team at 12.5 ppg. Prentice led the squad with 101 assists while Smith was tops from the FT line at 82.5%. Danridge was a 3rd team All-MWC selection while Giddens and Prentice were both honorable mention honorees.

New Mexico lost just two seniors in Aaron Johnson and Kellen Walter. Johnson led the team in rebounding, grabbing 7.3 rpg while scoring 6.3 ppg. Walter was the only four-year player on the team, averaging 2.0 ppg as a senior.

Junior Jeffrey Henfield (2.2 ppg), sophomore Ryan Kersten (5.5 ppg) and freshmen Sean Imadiyi (1.1 ppg), David Kanyinda (1.5 ppg) and Derek Oestreicher (redshirt in 2006-07) all decided to leave the program following the season.

Other returning players include juniors Chad Toppert and Daniel

Faris and sophomore Roman Martinez. Toppert was No. 9 in the nation in 3-pt. FG% at 43.8%. He was also third on the team in scoring at 9.5 ppg. Faris started 10 games as a sophomore, averaging 4.8 ppg and 3.4 rpg.

Alford and his staff will welcome five new faces to the team in 2007-08, two junior college transfers (Johnnie Harris and Monquel Pegues) and three freshmen (Dairese Gary, Kem Nweke and Jonathan Wills).

42ND SEASON IN THE PIT

One of college basketball's most famous and recognizable buildings, University Arena is the home of New Mexico basketball.

The 2007-08 season is the 42nd year that University Arena has served as home for Lobo hoops. The first game was played on Dec. 1, 1966, with New Mexico beating Abilene Christian 62-53. A total of 732 games have been played overall. The Lobos have come away the victor in 592 of those – good for a stunning .809 winning percentage.

What is even more impressive about UNM's home court is that more than 11 million fans have flocked into this sunken edifice to see their beloved Lobos play basketball. The Lobos have averaged more than 15,500 fans the past 42-plus years, an amazing 95% of capacity.

The Lobos have finished second in the nation in attendance five times, third on four occasions and fourth six times.

UNM hosted NCAA men's basketball tournament action nine times, including the NCAA Championship in 1983 and the 1988 McDonald's High School All-American basketball game.

The Pit is built in a 37-foot hole on Albuquerque's southeast mesa. First the roof was constructed, then the hole was dug and the Arena built. That all happened in 1966. The unique Behlen roof (338 by 300 feet) was set up by contractors and then 55,000 cubic yards of earth were removed. About 28,000 yards of concrete were poured in the initial construction, which allowed a seating capacity of 14,831. The cost – an incredibly economical \$1.4 million.

Arena expansion was undertaken when it became apparent that fan interest was too great even for the original structure. The expansion in 1975 cost near \$2.2 million and involved the extension of a cantilevered deck above the existing facility. There are six rows in the deck, with a seating capacity of 2,300. Reserved standing-room-only spots increase The Pit's capacity to 18,018.

PIT TO GET BIG-TIME MAKEOVER

Major renovations to The Pit could start in the summer of 2008. The cost of the project could range from \$50-60 million. The University of New Mexico Board of Regents recently gave preliminary approval for a \$20-25 million bond. The rest of the funding will come from the state and private sources. Gov. Bill Richardson pledged fund-

ing for Pit renovations in January of 2006. The venerable arena opened Dec. 1, 1966. All renovations in the past 40 years have been limited to locker rooms and offices. Although specific details are being finalized, the scope of work is expected to include the following:

- new entrances, ticket office and novelty store
- new men's and women's locker rooms
- expanding the north, east and west concourses to allow for the construction of new restrooms and concession stands
- building suites on the mezzanine level of the east and west sides
- connecting the Davalos Center to The Pit
- possibility of adding a third floor to the north end of the arena for a restaurant
- videoboards

SEASON TICKETS SURPASS 10,000

Season tickets climbed above 10,000 for the first time since the 2003-04 season when UNM sold 10,598. The final count for 2007-08 is 10,096. UNM sold at least 10,000 season tickets for 30 consecutive seasons between 1974-75 and 2003-04.

RIO GRANDE RIVALRY DEBUTS IN 2007-08

The University of New Mexico and New Mexico State University announced July 13 the formation of the Rio Grande Rivalry presented by Route 66 Casino. The Rio Grande Rivalry is not only for current student-athletes, but also to help build school spirit and pride in the alumni and fans that cheer for the Lobos or the Aggies.

The Rio Grande Rivalry begins in the 2007-08 academic year. UNM and NMSU are scheduled to conduct competitions in 11 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, football, men's golf, softball, women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, women's track and field and women's volleyball. Points will be awarded to the winner of each competition with a total of 24 points possible. The school with the most points will be the winner.

The first competition of 2007-08 was Sept. 4 when the women's volleyball teams met in Las Cruces

The winner of the Rio Grande Rivalry will receive a trophy that is currently being designed with input from both institutions. The traveling trophy will remain in possession of the winning school for one academic year.

A news conference will be held at the end of each season to present the trophy to the winning institution. The winner will also be officially recognized at the first home football or basketball game of the upcoming season.

An updated tally of who's leading the competition will be available on each school's website: golobos.com and nmstatesports.com.

"I have been part of big rivalries and there is nothing more exciting," said University of New Mexico president David Schmidly. "The Bedlam Series between Oklahoma State and the University of Oklahoma is a great example, and there is no reason why New Mexico-New Mexico State can't be as big and exciting."

The athletics rivalry between the Lobos and Aggies dates back more than 110 years. The first competition between the two institutions was a football game in Albuquerque on Jan. 1, 1894. That was 18 years before the territory of New Mexico was granted statehood in 1912. The first men's basketball game was played Dec. 22, 1904, in Las Cruces.

"New Mexico-New Mexico State already is a great college rivalry," said UNM director of athletics Paul Krebs. "This effort will bring added exposure to both universities and will be a great point of pride for alumni from both schools."

2006-07 SEASON RECAP

The New Mexico Lobos ended their 104th season in the first round of Mountain West Conference Tournament with a 62-54 loss to TCU. UNM finished 15-17 overall, just the program's second losing season in the past 24 years.

After starting 5-0, the Lobos ended the season on a five-game losing streak, something that had not happened since the last five games of the 1979-80 season. New Mexico had not lost five straight games at any point of a season since 1995.

Picked to finish fifth in the conference's preseason poll, New Mexico was 4-12 in the MWC regular season, tying TCU for eighth - or last - place. UNM lost 12 conference games for the first time since 1959 when it finished 1-13 in the Skyline Conference.

New Mexico endured its fifth losing record in the MWC in the past seven seasons. The Lobos' only winning mark in league play since 2000 was 10-4 in 2005. UNM was 8-8 in 2005-06. New Mexico never had a losing conference record from 1984-2000, a span of 17 seasons.

UNM was 2-12 away from home, 1-10 in true road games. The lone win was 70-66 at Colorado State on Feb. 3.

POSTSEASON HONORS

After being the only program in the Mountain West Conference with a first team all-league pick from 2002-06, the Lobos were shut-out this year. Junior Tony Danridge was a third-team pick while juniors J.R. Giddens and Darren Prentice received honorable mention.

First team Lobos in the past were Ruben Douglas in 2002 and '03, Danny Granger in 2004 and '05 and Mark Walters in 2006.

LOBOS TIE SCHOOL RECORD FOR OVERTIME GAMES

New Mexico tied a single-season school record by playing four overtime games, and they came in an 11-game stretch in Mountain West Conference play. UNM was 1-3 in OT games.

The Lobos edged Utah at home 86-82 on Jan. 13. Two weeks later, UNLV got past the Lobos 76-72. On Feb. 20, New Mexico had a chance to beat San Diego State in regulation but UNM missed a lay-up at the end of regulation. The Aztecs prevailed 81-74 in the extra period. The very next game, Utah got revenge with a 93-91 double-OT triumph in Salt Lake City.

UNM played four overtime games in a season on three other occasions: 1989-90, 1994-95 and 2000-01.

3s FELL AT NEAR RECORD PACE

The Lobos averaged 9.34 treys a game and 11 of the 13 players on the roster connected from long range. UNM ranked 1st in the MWC and finished 10th nationally. New Mexico's top 3-point shooting teams:

New Mexico opened the season by canning 16 of 39 3s in a 91-54 victory over Abilene Christian. The 16 treys tie for 5th-most in school history. It's the most 3s since 16 against Penn State on Dec. 29, 2004. Current Lobo Aaron Johnson was a member of that PSU team.

The 39 attempts are the most by the Lobos in a non-overtime game. UNM threw up 42 in a 112-104 double overtime loss to New Mexico State on Dec. 11, 1993. UNM stroked 17 in a 93-91 double overtime loss at Utah, tied for the 4th-most in a game in school history. The Lobos were 9 of 15 in the two overtime periods.

Lobos Sign Highly-Rated Five-Member Recruiting Class

New Mexico's 2008 incoming class ranked No. 9 in the nation by ESPN.com

University of New Mexico men's basketball head coach Steve Alford announced the signing of five highly touted student-athletes to National Letters of Intent to attend UNM in the fall of 2008. This recruiting class, put together by Alford and his staff, has been rated as high as No. 9 in the nation by ESPN.com.

"This is a very exciting class," stated Alford. "I appreciate the work the staff has put in to it. To get five kids from Texas, which is a very important state for us to recruit, is an excellent accomplishment for our program. The caliber of both the student and the player we are getting keeps Lobo basketball moving in a positive direction. I couldn't be more excited about this recruiting class."

Making up the 2008 class of recruits are: Will Brown, a 6-9 forward from Dallas, Texas (Patterson (N.C.) Prep); Curtis Dennis, a 6-4 guard/forward, from Bronx, N.Y. (Findlay (Las Vegas, Nev.) Prep); Nate Garth, a 6-3 point guard from Dallas, Texas (Hamilton (Tenn.) HS); Phillip McDonald, a 6-5 shooting guard from Cypress, Texas (Cypress HS); and Isaiah Rusher, a 6-10 forward from Houston, Texas (Genesis One (Mendenhall, Miss.) Prep).

All five of the Lobo signees have ties to the state of Texas, a major recruiting target for the Lobo men's basketball staff. Brown, Dennis, McDonald and Rusher all played for the Houston area T-MAC All-Stars AAU Team. Nate Garth is a Texas native and played his junior season for Dallas's Woodrow Wilson High School.

Will Brown - F - 6-9 - 225 - Dallas, Texas (Patterson (N.C.) Prep)

Rated a three-star recruit by Rivals.com and Scout.com...strong power forward who is an excellent rebounder...named the top power forward signee in the Mountain West Conference by Rivals.com...currently attending the Patterson Prep School in Lenoir, N.C...Patterson School enters the season as the second ranked prep school in the nation according to Scout.com...ranked in the top-10 by TexasHoops.com before transferring to Patterson...**PERSONAL**...full name is William Ben Brown...born October, 3, 1989.

Coach Alford on Will Brown - "Will gives us a presence inside because he has very good strength. He will come in as a freshman with the ability to impact the team immediately. He's got a great body, but he is also a big man that can play inside out."

Rated a three-start recruit by Rivals.com and Scout .com...very physical player who can score inside...averaged 12 points, 10 rebounds and four blocks per game at Kashmere High School in Houston last season...will play this season at Genesis One Christian school in Mendenhall, Miss...rated as a top-10 player by TexasHoops.com before transferring to Genesis One...**PERSONAL**...Full name is Isaiah Nathaniel Rusher...born April 14, 1988.

Coach Alford on Isaiah Rusher - "Isaiah is a lot like Reggie Evans, who I coached at Iowa. He is just a warrior. He is one that will immediately demand respect and get a lot of attention inside because of the way he goes about playing. He's extremely athletic and will add to our size up front."

HEAD COACH STEVE ALFORD

Steve Alford was named the school's 19th head men's basketball coach on March 23, 2007. Alford spent the past eight seasons as the head coach at the University of Iowa.

Alford, 43, has a 322-185 (63%) career record in his 17th season as a collegiate head coach. His teams have qualified for postseason play 11 times, produced 13 winning seasons and reached 20 wins on eight occasions.

In eight seasons at Iowa, Alford compiled a 152-106 record with a school-record seven consecutive winning seasons, and six postseason appearances. The Hawkeyes won two Big Ten Conference tournament titles (2001 and '06). Iowa was 17-14 in 2006-07. It was 9-7 in the Big Ten, tied with NCAA teams Illinois and Purdue for fourth place.

Prior to Iowa, Alford posted a 78-29 record in four seasons (1992-95) at NCAA Division III Manchester (Ind.) College and a four-year (1996-99) record of 78-48 at Southwest Missouri State (now Missouri State). The Bears defeated Wisconsin and Tennessee to advance to the Sweet 16 of the 1999 NCAA Tournament before losing to top-ranked Duke in the regional semifinals. In 1997 Alford led the Bears to a 24-9 record (second in the Missouri Valley Conference) and a trip to the National Invitation Tournament.

The Bears were 16-12 in Alford's first season at the Division I level in 1995-96. In 1997-98 Southwest Missouri won 12 of its final 18 games, posting a final record of 16-16 while advancing to the title game of the MVC postseason tournament for the second straight season. Alford joined the collegiate coaching ranks at Manchester College in 1992, taking over a team that had lost its first eight games. After winning four of 20 games that season, Alford led Manchester to a 20-8 mark in his first full year of 1992-93.

The following season Manchester was 23-4 followed by a 31-1 mark in his fourth and final season. Manchester won three straight conference tournament titles from 1993-95, advancing to the NCAA Division III Tournament all three seasons.

Manchester advanced to the 1995 NCAA Division III championship game before suffering its first defeat in 32 games to place second in the nation. Alford was named Indiana Collegiate Conference coach of the year in 1993, 1994 and 1995 and his record was 74-13 over his final three seasons.

A native of New Castle, Ind., Alford was a prep standout for his father, Sam Alford, at New Castle Chrysler High School. He earned Indiana's Mr. Bas-

ketball Award in 1983 after averaging 37.7 points per game as a senior.

During his collegiate career at Indiana, Alford started all but five of 125 games, helping the Hoosiers post a four-year mark of 92-35. Alford served as head coach Bob Knight's team captain in 1987 when Indiana posted a 30-4 overall record and won the national championship.

Alford concluded his college career as Indiana's all-time scoring leader with 2,438 points and he became the first player to win the Indiana MVP award four times. He is also Indiana's career leader in steals and three-point field goal percentage. Alford was a consensus first team all-America selection and the Big Ten MVP as a senior.

Alford earned first team all-Big Ten honors in each of his final three seasons and also earned all-America honors as a junior. He was named to the NIT all-tourney team as a sophomore when the Hoosiers finished second to UCLA. His career free throw percentage of .897 (535-596) ranks fourth best in NCAA history and he led the nation in free throw percentage as a freshman.

Alford was named to the all-tournament team at the 1987 NCAA Final Four and to the NCAA tournament all-decade team for the 1980s. He set an NCAA Final Four record when he made 7 of 10 3-point baskets in the 1987 championship game victory over Syracuse. In 1997, Alford was inducted into the Indiana University Athletics Hall of Fame and in 2001 he was one of 15 players selected to Indiana's all-Century team. He was one of five players named to ESPN's Big Ten Conference Silver Anniversary team in 2004. The Sporting News recently published Legends of College Basketball, a publication that recalled the careers of the 100 greatest Division I college basketball players. Alford was No. 35 on the list.

Following his freshman season at Indiana, Alford was selected to play for the United States basketball team at the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles. Alford shot 64.4% percent from the field, averaged 10.3 points per game and was second on the team in assists as the U.S. collegians won the gold medal.

Alford was born Nov. 23, 1964, in Franklin, Ind. He holds a bachelor's degree in business from Indiana University. Alford is married to the former Tanya Frost, whom he has known since the two were schoolmates in grade school in New Castle. The Alfords have three children: Kory, Bryce and Kayla.
