THE ELON GAME

- San Diego State heads into its final pre-Christmas game against an Elon side it has never faced. This is SDSU's 91st year of playing basketball.
- The Aztecs have won their last three games that have come right before the Christmas break. In fact, in the final game right before the Christmas holiday, SDSU has won its last six when the game

has occurred at home.

- Elon is the first Eastern Time Zone school to visit Montezuma Mesa since Navy made the trip west in December of 2007.

- The Aztecs have defeated the last four schools that have left the Eastern Time Zone to come play inside Viejas Arena.

San Diego State and Elon Take the Viejas Arena Hardwood Thursday Afternoon

- San Diego State puts its three-game winning streak on the line against Elon on Thursday in a rare afternoon game at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs, who are looking to extend its winning streak to a season-long four games, and Phoenix will tip at 4:30 p.m. PT.

- SDSU, which is 51-5 at Viejas Arena since the beginning of the 2008-09 campaign, is looking to move to 8-1 inside the building this season. The Aztecs are also looking to extend its winning streak to 52 against unranked teams and to 38 vs. unranked opposition at home.

- The Aztecs are in search of their 11th victory of the season. With a win over Elon, San Diego State would have at least 11 wins in its first 13 games for the second consecutive season, something that has never been accomplished in SDSU's Division I history, which dates to the 1970-71 campaign. A year ago, the Aztecs were 13-0 after 13 outings.

- SDSU sits at 10-2 after its 80-55 victory over UC Riverside on Monday. The Aztecs, who had 11 days in between games, received a game-high 19 points and a career-high five three-pointers from junior James Rahon. Classmate Chase Tapley added 17 points on 7-of-8 shooting and was one of nine players to score in the game. San Diego State also shot a season-high 55.4-percent from the floor, committed a season-low nine turnovers and outrebounded the Highlanders by 11. Defensively, the Aztecs limited UCR to 36.8-percent shooting, including a 1-for-10 effort from three, and just five free-throw attempts.

Defense Wins

- After giving up a season-high 85 points to nationally ranked Creighton, San Diego State has buckled down defensively and not allowed more than 63 points. Since the loss, the Aztecs have allowed an average of 60.0 points per game. The last three games, SDSU has allowed, in order, 63 points to nationally ranked California, 62 to San Diego on the road and 55 to UC Riverside.

A San Diego State Win Would...

- Extend San Diego State's winning streak to 52 games against unranked opponents.
- Extend the Aztecs' December winning streak to 16 games.
- Extend the Aztecs' December home winning streak to 24 games.
- Give the Aztecs at least 11 wins through the first 13 games for the second year in a row. It will also mark the first time SDSU has accomplished the feat in its Division I history.
- Give the Aztecs at least 11 wins through the first 13 games for just the third time in San Diego State's Division I history, which starts with the 1970-71 campaign.
- Give San Diego State an overall record of 45-5 since the start of the 2010-11 season.

Tough Out

- San Diego State has had great success over the years inside Viejas Arena. Since 2005-06, the Aztecs are 88-12 (.880) at Viejas, including 35-3 since the beginning of 2009-10.
- San Diego State has won 37 straight against unranked teams at home.
- SDSU has won 29 of its last 30 home games vs. non-league foes.

California Livin'

- San Diego State has been one of the best programs in the West, having won 20 or more games six straight seasons, including three consecutive with 25 or more, and advancing to the postseason in each of those years as well.
- Last year's 34-3 record and NCAA Sweet 16 appearance solidified its spot as one of the top West Coast programs and the top team in the state of California. The Aztecs have currently won 21 straight games against California universities, a streak that spans two-plus seasons.
- Including the Dec. 30 game vs. Redlands, the Aztecs have two more games against California universities (Redlands, San Diego Christian). SDSU is already 7-0 this season vs. schools that call California their home.

Series History vs. Elon

- San Diego State is meeting Elon for the first time in school history.

San Diego State vs. the Southern Conference

- San Diego State is 2-0 all-time vs. the Southern Conference.
- SDSU vs. current Southern members: 1-0 vs. Appalachian State, 1-0 vs. Western Carolina.
- The last time the Aztecs played a member of the SoCon was back in 2008 at the Great Alaska

First meeting

Shootout. That game saw the Catamounts earn an eight-point lead at halftime and it took a 10-0 SDSU run mid-way through the second half just for the Aztecs to tie the score. With a minute left, Kyle Spain stole the ball, converted a fastbreak dunk and connected on an And-1 to put SDSU up by one. Then with 36 seconds left, WCU missed two free throws and Spain later made both of his with 0.2 seconds left to lift San Diego State to a 59-58 win in the quarterfinal round of the Shootout. The Aztecs eventually went on to win the tournament.

- Prior to the outing vs. Western Carolina, one would have to go back to March 13, 1940, to see the last time San Diego State played a current member of the SoCon. The Aztecs defeated Appalachian State, 48-46, at the NAIA Tournament in Kansas City, Mo.

Steve Fisher vs. the SoCon

- Steve Fisher has won all four meetings against current Southern Conference institutions. The only time he has coached against a member of the league while at the helm of the SDSU program was in 2008 vs. Western Carolina.

- Steve Fisher vs. current SoCon members (4-0 overall): 2-0 vs. Chattanooga, 1-0 vs. Davidson, 1-0 vs. Western Carolina.

Rahon Being Rahon

- Since injuring his left foot just prior to the season opener, James Rahon has struggled with his perimeter shot. In the eight games leading up to the UC Riverside game, the junior was just 6-of-28 from beyond the arc (21.4 percent). Everything changed against the Highlanders, however, as he hit a career-high-matching five threes (5-8 3FG) and finished with a game-high 19 points. His scoring output was just his fifth double-figure scoring game of the campaign.

Charge!

- Steve Fisher has said the charge is this year's team's blocked shot. To date, Tim Shelton has taken a team-high 16, while Jamaal Franklin has taken three and Xavier Thames one. A game-by-game breakdown is located in the statistics section of these game notes.

Dropping Dimes

- Xavier Thames had an incredible game in the road game at San Diego with his second career double-double. What made it more impressive was the fact it was a points-assists double-double. The sophomore had 11 points and a career-high 11 assists.

- The 11 dimes were tied for the most in the Steve Fisher era. Deandre Moore accomplished the feat twice, while Lorenzo Wade and Richie Williams did it once apiece.

- The points-assists double-double was the first since Wade went for 25 points and 11 assists vs. Colorado State on March 1, 2008.

- The 11 assists were the most by an Aztec in a road game since Dec. 1, 1986, when Tracy Dildy had 11 at UC Santa Barbara.

Breakout Game

- Junior DeShawn Stephens had his finest game as an Aztec at San Diego when he went for a career-high 16 points and a career-high-matching nine rebounds. He played a personal-best 32 minutes.

- The double-figure scoring performance was his second of the season and his 7-of-8 shooting exhibition was a personal-record.

Thames Makes History

- At UC Santa Barbara, Xavier Thames exploded for a then-career-high 20 points and a personal-record 10 rebounds. With his performance, Thames became the first point guard during the Steve Fisher era, which is in its 13th season, to record a 20-point, 10-rebound game.

- Thames is the first SDSU point guard to register a double-double since Richie Williams went for 14 points and 11 rebounds at TCU on Feb. 28, 2009.

- Thames followed his historic performance with a career-high 21 points the next game vs. No. 22 Creighton.

Making an Early Case for Sixth Man of the Year

- Jamaal Franklin is certainly making his case as one of the top sixth men in the country. The sophomore is averaging 14.1 points, 5.7 rebounds and 1.1 steals in 24.5 minutes. His scoring and rebounding averages rank second on the team.

- Franklin has scored at least eight points in all but one game this season and has reached the double-figure scoring plateau eight times. To date, he already has a 31- and 21-point scoring effort this season.

20-Point Efforts

- So far this season, San Diego State has received 10 20-point scoring efforts from four different players, which is a lot through 12 games considering last year's 34-3 squad enjoyed 21 such performances by five different Aztecs.

- The Aztecs had at least one 20-point scorer in a season-long four straight games before the streak was broken vs. UC Riverside. In the game vs. UCR, James Rahon finished with a game-high 19.

- Chase Tapley has five 20-point games, Jamaal Franklin and Xavier Thames have two, and James Rahon has one.

Winning the Close Ones

- San Diego State has lived on the edge at times this season as it has played six games that have been decided by four points or less, with two going into overtime. Additionally, the Aztecs had one road outing, at San Diego, where they were forced to rally from a 12-point first-half deficit.
- Since the beginning of last season, the Aztecs have been hard to beat in games decided by three points or less, posting an 9-1 record.
- San Diego State's overtime record over the last 13 games has been quite impressive as well. The Aztecs have won three consecutive OT games and are 12-1 in their last 13.

Wily Veteran

- Tim Shelton has been around the block being a fifth-year senior and his court savvy proves it.
- His effectiveness will never be shown on the stat sheet as he does things that head coach Steve Fisher says, "Wins games for you."
- Fisher's statement was never more true than in the game vs. Long Beach State as Shelton took four charges, which changed the complexion of the game, especially in the second half.
- If you thought the four charges taken vs. LBSU was impressive, Shelton one-upped himself at No. 23/23 Arizona by taking six more charges and adding six points, six rebounds and three assists in 33 minutes.
- To date, Shelton has taken 16 charges, which is an average of 1.45 per game.

Shooting the Lights Out on the Road

- Chase Tapley has been lights out on the road this season averaging 20.3 points. The junior is shooting 51.1 percent from the floor and a remarkable 58.3 percent from beyond the arc (14-for-24). More impressive is the fact that two of the three games have come against two nationally ranked foes in Baylor and Arizona.

Taking the "Free" in Free Throws Literally

- Jamaal Franklin is making a living at the free-throw line and is a major reason why he is averaging 14.1 points an outing.
- The sophomore started the season by missing his first two, but since then, he has been nearly automatic as he has gone on to sink 46 of his last 58, including 20 in a row at one point, to get his average up to a team-best 76.7 percent.
- Entering the Elon game, 29.7 percent of his scoring production has come from the charity stripe.

Held in Check

- San Diego State is pretty much a lock to win when holding opponents to less than 60 points. The Aztecs extended their winning streak to 36 games when they limited USC to 54 points, No. 23/23 Arizona to 57 and UC Riverside to 55.
- SDSU is 109-10 in the Fisher era when its opponents score less than 60 points.

Wearing Out the Nylon

- Junior Chase Tapley, the lone returning starter, has been a consistent scoring option for SDSU, averaging 17.7 points on 52.3 percent shooting and an even better 52.4 percent from beyond the arc.
- Tapley has five 20-point efforts already this season, including a career-high 28 at No. 11/12 Baylor, 25 vs. No. 24/23 California and 23 at San Diego.
- After going 0-3 from three-point range in the opener vs. Bryant, Tapley gone on to make 33 of his last 60 attempts (55.0 percent).
- Tapley, who had three 20-point games in four games earlier this season, is the first player to accomplish the feat since Kawhi Leonard did it in the first four games of last season, while averaging 20.5 points. Tapley and Leonard arrived at San Diego State together in time for the 2009-10 campaign. Leonard went on to become the 15th overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft.

I See You

- The starting backcourt and childhood friends from Sacramento, Chase Tapley and Xavier Thames, are piling up the assists.
- Thames is averaging a team-best 5.4 assists after a career-high eight vs. Bryant and another seven vs. Southern Utah, UC Davis and No. 24/23 California. Tapley, meanwhile, is averaging 2.1 assists.
- The tandem is also getting it done in the scoring column as Tapley leads the team at 17.7 and Thames ranks third, scoring at a 12.0 clip.

Thief!

- Not only has Chase Tapley done work in the scoring and assist columns, the junior has made a living as a thief this season. Entering the Elon game, Tapley is averaging 2.3 steals, which ranks second in the Mountain West through games of Dec. 20.
- Against Bryant, Tapley had three steals and followed it with five in the 33-point blowout of Southern Utah. Then against UC Davis, the Sacramento native had a Steve Fisher-era-record seven. The aforementioned games were in consecutive days to open the season.

Drastic Improvement

- Steve Fisher has said his team is a good free-throw shooting team. In the first two games, the Aztecs shot a combined 44.4 percent (20-for-45). Since then, San Diego State is connecting at a 68.9-percent clip (155-for-226). At No. 11/12 Baylor, SDSU finished at 85.0 percent (17-for-20) for the game and

then followed it with an even-better 92.9-percent effort (13-for-14) vs. USC. Against No. 24/23 California, San Diego State went 14-for-20 from the stripe, but was an impressive 12-for-14 in the second half.

Turning Heads

- Jamaal Franklin is having a breakout sophomore season. As a true freshman, people saw flashes of it, like when he went for 13 points and 10 rebounds in 17 minutes vs. Utah.
- The Hawthorne, Calif., native ranks second on team in scoring and rebounding, and is first in free-throw percentage (77.8 percent, min. 20 FTA).
- Franklin has scored in double figures eight times and had a career-high 31-point outburst against UC Davis and 21 vs. Long Beach State.

Green Giant

- Garrett Green has been huge in the middle for the Aztecs as he is averaging a team-best 6.9 rebounds.
- His top performance to date include a game-high 11 rebounds vs. Bryant and Southern Utah. Against No. 24/23 California, Green finished with a game-high 10 boards.
- He has had at least seven rebounds seven times this season and in five of his last seven outings.

Tapley Named Co-MW Player of the Week

- Junior Chase Tapley is a two-time Mountain West Co-Player of the Week this season.
- Tapley earned the award on Dec. 5, after he averaged 20.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 1.0 blocks and 2.5 steals, while shooting 53.3 percent from the floor and 55.6 percent from three-point distance in games vs. nationally ranked Creighton and California.
- On Nov. 14, Tapley won his first career weekly award after averaging 19.7 rebounds, 5.0 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 5.0 steals, while shooting 54.3 percent from the field, 50.0 percent from three-point range and 77.8 percent from the charity stripe. The Aztecs defeated Bryant, Southern Utah and UC Davis that week.

Holding Its Own

- San Diego State went 10-73 in its first 83 games vs. teams ranked in the AP Top-25. Things have certainly turned as SDSU is a respectable 10-11 in its last 21 against AP-ranked squads. In home games vs. Associated Press Top-25 squads, SDSU is 5-3 in its last eight, which includes the decision over No. 24 California. In road/neutral games vs. AP-ranked foes, meanwhile, the Aztecs have gone 4-4 in their last eight, which includes this season's victory at No. 23 Arizona.

Among the Nation's Best

- San Diego State has seen its name associated with the AP Top 25 for the last 26 polls.
- The Aztecs were in all 19 polls a season ago, peaking as high as No. 4 in 2010-11, and have seen their name in the preseason and weeks 1-6 polls.
- SDSU is receiving 67 votes in the AP, which is good for 27th, and 32 in the coaches poll, which puts them in 26th place.

The Lowdown on the Arizona Game

- San Diego State defeated No. 23/23 Arizona earlier this season at McKale Center to snap the Wildcats' 22-game home winning streak. The Aztecs never trailed in the 61-57 victory.
- As a ranked team, Arizona had won 62 straight games at McKale Center against unranked competition until San Diego State held them to a season-low 33.3-percent shooting performance to emerge with the four-point victory.
- SDSU defeated Arizona for the second consecutive time for just the second time in school history.
- The Aztecs made eight of their 12 three-point attempts. The 66.7-percent accuracy marked a season high.

Duo With Diplomas

- Seniors Tim Shelton and Garrett Green are in their final year having already obtained their bachelor's degrees.
- The frontline tandem is currently enrolled in graduate school and is pursuing their master's degrees in education leadership.
- Shelton graduated from San Diego State last May, while Green earned his degree from LSU in August.

Coaching Stability

- Steve Fisher is the longest tenured head coach in the 13-year history of the Mountain West. In fact, he is the only men's basketball coach to be in the league from the conference opened its doors.
- Associate head coach/head coach in waiting Brian Dutcher has also been with Fisher for all 13 years.

Mountain West Preseason Predictions

- San Diego State was picked to finish in third place in the 2011-12 preseason Mountain West media poll. The Aztecs received 158 points to finish behind New Mexico (203 points; 22 first-place votes) and UNLV (183; 4).
- Sophomore Xavier Thames was selected as the preseason Mountain West Newcomer of the Year by the league's voting media. Thames is eligible this season after sitting out 2010-11 following his transfer from Washington State.







STEVE FISHER

21st FULL SEASON • 13th SEASON AT SDSU • ILLINOIS STATE, 1967

Steve Fisher has guided the Aztec basketball program to unparalleled heights. In 12 seasons, he has taken a program that regularly missed out on the *conference* postseason tournament, to one which has become of the best programs on the West Coast and has the Aztecs routinely mentioned among the elite teams in the country.

The best news for SDSU fans is that the school exercised its contract option on Fisher prior to the 2011-12 season, which keeps the coach on Montezuma Mesa through 2014-15.

When Fisher arrived on the scene in March of 1999, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were set. The Aztecs were expected to lose. The year before Fisher's arrival on campus, San Diego State won just four games.

Now those days are a distant memory. Fisher guided San Diego State to the NCAA Tournament in 2002, 2006, 2010 and 2011, the last of which culminated with a 34-3 record and an appearance in the Sweet 16. Fisher has also taken the Aztecs to the NIT in 2003, 2007, 2008 and 2009. In 2009, SDSU advance to the national semifinals. San Diego State has currently been to the postseason six straight years.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene in the form of a news conference to introduce its new coach, Steve Fisher. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Steve Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips

to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Co., raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, which put him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket after his stint in Ann Arbor. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to a NIT title as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great recent turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led SDSU back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

In 2006-07, he led SDSU to the MWC regular season and tournament crowns and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. That team finished with a Division I then-school-record 24 wins. And the last five seasons, Fisher has led the Aztecs to five additional 20-win seasons and postseason appearances, including a school-record 34 wins, both the MWC regular season and tournament championships, and a NCAA Sweet 16 berth in 2011.







SAN DIEGO - On a night where San Diego State unveiled its 2011 Mountain West regular-season championship banner, its 2011 MWC tournament title banner and its NCAA Sweet 16 appearance banner, the Aztecs ultimately treated 11,734 fans to a 75-63 season-opening victory over Bryant at the Basketball Travelers Classic inside Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs dressed just seven scholarship players as projected starters Jamaal Franklin and James Rahon were out due to a team suspension and foot injury, respectively. With all the emotion surrounding the banners and the short bench, SDSU started the game sluggishly.

The contest was tied at 4-4 with just under two minutes having gone by. The Bulldogs, however, caught fire and stymied the Aztecs to lead, 22-15, with 6:32 remaining in the half. A 13-5 run to end the frame got San Diego State back into the game and it carried a 28-27 lead into the locker room.

The Aztecs continued their surge as play resumed and promptly went on a 15-7 run to go up 43-35. All told, SDSU used a 28-12 spurt to take control of the game.

San Diego State's offensive attack was grounded momentarily when Frankie Dobbs hit back-to-back three-pointers to bring the Bulldogs to within four. SDSU, however, went on another 13-5 run to move ahead by 12 and Bryant failed to get any closer than eight points the rest of the way.

The Aztecs received three stellar efforts, including two double-doubles by Garrett Green and Chase Tapley. Green finished with 14 points and 11 rebounds, while Tapley racked up a game-high 20 points, a career-high 11 rebounds, six assists and three steals. Xavier Thames added a career-high 16 points, four rebounds and eight assists. Between Tapley and Thames, they combined for 14 assists and two turnovers.

SAN DIEGO - Chase Tapley led a group of four Aztecs who scored in double figures as San Diego State built a huge first-half lead en route to a 70-37 rout of Southern Utah in front of 11,765 fans at Viejas Arena at the Basketball Travelers Classic.



SAN DIEGO - San Diego State wrapped up its home tournament, the Basketball Travelers Classic, with its third consecutive double-figure victory, this time an 89-74 victory over UC Davis.

Chase Tapley continued his outstanding play by scoring 23 points and adding a career-high seven steals. As good as Tapley's performance was, Jamaal Franklin's was equally impressive. The sophomore came off the bench to score a career-high 31 points on 10-of-17 shooting, including a 4-for-7 performance from beyond the arc and a 7-for-7 effort from the charity stripe.

The Aggies scored the first four points of the game and it was all Aztecs after that. Franklin fueled an 11-3 scoring run, which included back-to-back threes, to give SDSU a 15-9 lead with 12:25 left in the first half.

Franklin nailed a jumper and Xavier Thames added a free throw to thwart the comeback as the Aztecs emerged with the 15-point victory.

At the end of the game, Tapley was named most valuable player and to the all-tournament team. Thames joined Tapley on the all-tourney squad along with UC Davis' Josh Ritchart, Bryant's Alex Francis and Southern Utah's Ray Jones, Jr.

WACO, Texas - San Diego State, playing its fourth game in five days, had its rally come up short in falling to No. 11/12 Baylor, 77-67, at Ferrell Center. The mid-afternoon game was a part of ESPN's College Hoops Tip-Off Marathon.

The Aztecs received a game- and career-high 28 points from Chase Tapley, who made 10-of-17 shots, including 8-of-10 from three-point distance. The eight three-point field goals were a career high, one off the school record and equaled the Steve Fisher-era record.

The game was the first of the season for James Rahon, who missed the first three games of the campaign due to an injured left foot. The junior scored 10 points and added a career-high seven rebounds. Also scoring in double figures for SDSU was Jamaal Franklin (11 points) and Xavier Thames (10 points).

SDSU led by five midway through the first half thanks to eight unanswered points. Minutes later, Tapley hit a three to give the Aztecs a 23-21 lead, but an 11-1 Bear run put the home side up by eight with 1:42 left in the half.

Just when the game could have got out of hand, Tapley hit a three and Thames added two free throws to help SDSU pull to within two, 32-30, at halftime.

Tapley tied the game with the first bucket of the second half, but Baylor used a fullcourt press, which rattled the Aztecs.

San Diego State trailed, 36-34, with 15:45 to play and in just 2 minutes, 23 seconds, Baylor enjoyed a 10-point cushion. The Bears' lead eventually swelled to 16 with 9:20 left in regulation.

SDSU used a 9-2 run, with the final seven coming from Franklin, to trim the deficit to seven with 93 seconds left in the game. The Bears, however, went on to score seven straight points to put the game out of reach and improve to 3-0.

SAN DIEGO - Xavier Thames went the length of the floor and scored the game-winning lay-up with 1.8 seconds remaining in the game to lift San Diego State past USC, 56-54, in front of a sold-out Viejas Arena crowd.

The victory was just the second over the Trojans in 12 tries and snapped a five-game losing streak vs. USC. It was SDSU's first win in the series since Dec. 9, 1989.

Holding a 54-45 lead with 2:46 left in regulation, the Aztecs looked as if they were going to cruise to the win. The Trojans, however, received back-to-back three-pointers from Garrett Jackson to bring USC to within three with 97 seconds left.

After two empty San Diego State possessions, the Trojans came out of a timeout and promptly received a banked-in three-pointer from Maurice Jones to knot the score.

Then with seven seconds remaining, Thames took the ball the length of the court, with the help of a Tim Shelton screen, and connected on the game-winner.

SDSU trailed, 25-21, at halftime and took the lead with 11:44 left in the game when Chase Tapley knocked down a three. The Aztecs, who trailed by as many as six, never trailed the rest of the way en route to their sixth straight win over the Pac-12 Conference.

Jamaal Franklin led San Diego State with 14 points and Thames finished with 12 of his own. DeShawn Stephens, meanwhile, grabbed a game-high nine rebounds. As a team, led by Franklin's 5-for-5 effort from the free-throw line, the Aztecs made 13 of their 14 free-throw attempts.

Jones led all scorers with 15 points and was one of four Trojans in double figures. Jackson added 13 points, Aaron Fuller chipped in with 12 and a team-high seven rebounds, and Dewayne Dedmon contributed 10.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State rallied from a halftime deficit, but could not hold off Long Beach State as the 49ers forced overtime in the final seconds of the second half. The Aztecs, however, responded in overtime to defeat upstart LBSU, 77-73.

The Aztecs were led by Jamaal Franklin's 21 points and nine rebounds off the bench and James Rahon's 20-point effort. Xavier Thames, meanwhile, added 12 points.

Long Beach State, which was coming off a road win at No. 9 Pittsburgh, jumped out to a 10-point first-half lead less than five minutes into the game. The 49ers held a 40-30 lead with 1:50 left in the first half before the Aztecs closed the frame on a 7-0 run.

In the second half, LBSU hung on to its lead for the first 10 minutes. SDSU, however, was able to take its first lead of the game with 9:37 left in regulation. Long Beach State momentarily took the lead back, 51-50, 14 seconds later, but the Aztecs received back-to-back threes from Franklin and Tapley to take a five-point lead.

Down the stretch, LBSU rallied and was down 65-63 with three seconds remaining in regulation and Franklin fouled Casper Ware before the ball was inbounded. Ware, who finished with a game-high 26 points, stepped to the free-throw line and calmly made both free throws to send the game into overtime.

In the extra session, Thames hit three straight baskets at one point, the third of which resulted in a five-point Aztec lead. Then with SDSU ahead by two with four seconds left, Franklin sealed the game with a pair of free throws to send the Aztecs home with a win.

TUCSON, Ariz. - San Diego State jumped on No. 23/23 Arizona early and never looked back as it snapped the Wildcats' 22-game homecourt winning streak with its 61-57 decision at McKale Center.

The Aztecs won in Tucson against Arizona for just the second time in the history of the series, but won for the third consecutive outing overall. A year ago, SDSU won its 2011 NCAA Tournament second- and third-round games inside the building.

San Diego State scored first and the Wildcats responded on the next trip down. Chase Tapley returned the favor and the Aztecs were on their way to a 16-2 lead and ultimately a 21-4 advantage with 13:24 left in the first half. During its game-opening surge, SDSU received four three-pointers, including a pair from Tapley, who finished with 17 points.

Later with San Diego State ahead by 15 on an Alec Williams basket, Arizona stormed back with seven consecutive points while keeping SDSU scoreless for 4 minutes, 34 seconds. James Rahon stopped the drought with two free throws and the Aztecs were clinging to a 31-29 halftime lead.

In the first 8 minutes, 38 seconds of the second half, San Diego State, again, pounced on the Wildcats, outscoring them 23-12 to open a 13-point lead. The lead was pushed to double figures thanks to back-to-back threes by Jamaal Franklin to up the cushion to 11.

Arizona rallied and the Aztecs went cold as time wound down. The Wildcats trimmed the lead to six with 3:41 left in regulation and they found themselves down nine with 34 seconds to play. But a series of missed SDSU free throws and baskets by Arizona made the game close before the Aztecs eventually emerged with the four-point victory.

The Aztecs had their 27-game non-conference home winning streak snapped and had their 10-game November home winning streak halted after relinquishing a 17-point first-half lead and a four-point advantage at halftime.

With five seconds on the clock, Jahenns Manigat hit his first free throw to put the Jays up by two, but missed the second. The loose rebound, however, went to CU and it called timeout and eventually won the game.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State continued its dominance over the Pac-12 Conference, this time defeating No. 24/23 California, 64-63, in front of a sold-out Viejas Arena crowd.

The victory was SDSU's ninth straight over the league and improves its record to 3-0 vs. the conference this season. Two of this year's wins against the Pac-12 were against nationally ranked programs.

After California scored the first six points of the game, rest of the first half was a back-and-forth affair. It was not until the final five minutes of the half the game opened up. The Bears answered with a basket and then with eight seconds remaining, Tapley, who was fouled, knocked down both free throws to put San Diego State up four before settling for the one-point victory.

Tapley finished the game with 25 points on a career-high 10 field goals. The junior also added a game-high three steals.

California was led by Allen Crabbe's 23 points and nine rebounds.

SAN DIEGO - Behind three impressive individual performances, San Diego State was able to rally from a 12-point first-half deficit to upend San Diego, 74-62, at Jenny Craig Pavilion.

For the second straight game, Chase Tapley scored more than 20 points as he finished with a game-high 23. Xavier Thames, meanwhile, registered 11 points and a career-high 11 assists to post SDSU's first points-assists double-double since 2008. DeShawn Stephens added a career-high 16 points and nine rebounds to help the Aztecs defeat USD for the sixth consecutive time.

SDSU's winning streak looked to be in jeopardy in the first half after it fell behind, 14-2, after five-plus minutes of action. The Aztecs were being outplayed in every facet of the game early before finding any type of rhythm. Even when they were successful on offense, San Diego found ways to score and led by five with 2:47 left in the first half.

The Aztecs then scored seven straight points to take a 35-33 lead and finished the half on a 9-3 run head to the locker room up, 37-36. Tapley spearheaded the San Diego State rally with 16 first-half points.

SDSU opened the second period on a 9-2 run to open an eight-point lead, but USD chipped away and eventually took a 54-53 lead with 12:35 remaining.

San Diego State answered with eight consecutive points to retake the lead, 61-54, and never looked back. The Toreros got as close as five points with 4:11 to play, but a three-pointer by Jamaal Franklin, who finished with 11 points, sealed USD's fate as the Aztecs went on to record the 12-point win. The final margin was SDSU's largest at San Diego since winning by 23 on Feb. 25, 1975.

The Toreros were led by Chris Manresa's 14 points and 10 rebounds off the bench.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State led wire-to-wire and enjoyed a lead as large as 27 points before settling for an 80-55 victory over UC Riverside at Viejas Arena.

Nine of 10 Aztecs who saw the floor scored and seven recorded at least six points. SDSU was led by James Rahon's 19 points. The junior matched his career high with five three-pointers and ultimately finished 7-for-11 from the floor. Chase Tapley, meanwhile, added 17 points on 7-of-8 shooting.

San Diego State came out with its third starting lineup of the season as Jamaal Franklin was inserted into the rotation for Tim Shelton, who was given the night off due to a sore knee. The move paid off as Franklin got his teammates involved and had four assists in a first half where the Aztecs found themselves up 13-2 before the first media timeout. SDSU led by as many as 21 in the first half before entering the locker room ahead, 45-25.

The Highlanders scored seven straight points at the start of the second period to get within 13 points, but Aztecs would not allow the visitors to get any closer the rest of the way.

Midway through the second half, San Diego State went on an 11-0 run highlighted by five Rahon points and the Aztecs were up by 25 points and were well on their way to victory No. 10.

Franklin finished with a career-high five assists and most of the starters were on the bench in the final minutes, which gave two walk-ons, Narbeh Ebrahimian (1 points, 1 rebound) and Jeremy Castleberry (1 minute), the opportunity to play.
