► **When & Where:** Saturday, Dec. 10, 2005, Firestone Fieldhouse (3,104), Malibu, Calif., 5 p.m. (PST)

► **Webcast:** Dan Lawton (play-by-play) will have the live audio broadcast on www.goaztecs.com.

► **The Records:** The San Diego State women's basketball team (0-4) plays its final road non-conference game of the 2005-06 campaign, when it heads up to Malibu, Calif., for a 5 p.m. contest with the Pepperdine Waves. The Aztecs are winless so far this season, with four of their first five games being played away from home.

SDSU will face a member of the West Coast Conference for the second time this year on Saturday, when it renews its rivalry with Pepperdine for the first time since 1996. The Waves have already played three more games than the Aztecs, boasting a 1-6 record, including a loss to No. 25 UCLA on Thursday evening in Westwood, Calif.

► **SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the first year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She coached the Aztecs from 1989 to 1997 and has a school record of 151-87 in nine seasons. Her 14-year head coaching record stands at 232-152.

► **Pepperdine Head Coach Julie Rousseau:** Rousseau is in her second year with the Waves. She boasts a school and career record of 13-23.

► **Pepperdine Series History:** SDSU leads the series, 11-5 and is 5-3 in games played at Pepperdine (Last: SDSU def. Pepperdine, 66-51, on Dec. 7, 1996).

SDSU Women's Basketball Seeks First Win In Final Non-Conference Road Game

The San Diego State women's basketball team hits the road one last time in non-conference play, as it travels to Pepperdine for a 5 p.m. match-up with the host Waves at Firestone Fieldhouse. The Aztecs are playing their fourth straight Saturday road contest and would like to put their first mark in the win column before rounding out the 2005 calendar year with five home games.

Pepperdine has found its way into the win column just once in 2005-06, bringing a 1-6 mark into the two schools' 16th all-time meeting. SDSU will have history on its side, having come out victorious in each of the last five games with the Waves and in 10 of the last 11.

Aztecs' Offense Silenced In Loss At UC Davis, 58-36

The San Diego State women's basketball team came up empty handed last Saturday afternoon in its attempt to secure its first victory of the 2005-06 campaign, falling to host UC Davis, 58-36, at The Pavilion. With the loss, the Aztecs dropped to 0-4 on the season, while the Aggies improved to 3-3 after the two schools' first-ever meeting.

Freshman **LaSandra Dixon (Azusa, Calif.)** had a career-high nine points for the Aztecs off the bench,

while freshman **Tamika Lipford (Oceanside, Calif.)** and senior **Veronica Shaw (Phoenix, Ariz.)** each added six points apiece. Junior **Michelle Strawberry (Corona, Calif.)** reached double-figures in rebounding for the second time this season, pulling down a team-high 10.

After UC Davis logged the opening bucket of the afternoon, SDSU scored the next four points on a lay-up by Strawberry and a jumper by Jana Heinrich. The 4-2 advantage would be the Aztecs' final lead of the game, as a pair of starters, Strawberry and center Desiree Johnson, each picked up two fouls just 4:18 into the contest.

While foul trouble caused SDSU head coach Beth Burns to juggle the line-up, UC Davis took what was a four-point lead at 14-10 out to a 15-point advantage with an 11-0 run over a five-minute span at 25-10, before a Lipford lay-up broke the Aztecs' scoreless streak.

SDSU closed out the first half with a 6-1 scoring run of its own, coming to within eight points at 29-21, before going into the locker room down by nine at 30-21.

The Aztecs poor shooting continued into the second half, as they managed just 15 points in the final 20 minutes, before falling 58-36.

SDSU ended the game with a 25.8 field-goal percentage, including a 19.4 mark in the second half. UC Davis, meanwhile, shot 48.9 percent from the field and outscored the Aztecs 28-15 in the final 20 minutes.

Other UC Davis Notes

Freshman Jana Heinrich started her first career game as an Aztec, replacing sophomore Shanna Demus... Senior Lindsay Goldblatt saw her first action of the year against the Aggies... Senior Michelle Strawberry saw her streak of consecutive games in double-figure points come to an end at eight... All 12 available SDSU players saw the court for the first time in a game in 2005-06... SDSU went 0-for-5 from the free-throw line, marking the first time the Aztecs have not tallied a free throw in a game since March 6, 2004 at Utah.... Aztecs Are A Steal

For the fourth time this season, San Diego State reached double-figures in team steals, logging 13 at UC Davis last Saturday. The Aztecs opened the year with 16 versus Wichita State and 10 each against the University of San Diego and UC Riverside. Dating back to the 2004-05 campaign, SDSU has 10 or more steals in six straight outings.

San Diego State currently leads the Mountain West Conference in steals per game with a 12.25 mark and is tied for 23rd nationally.

Positive Turnovers

The Aztecs' aggressive defense has not only led to a lot of steals, it has also led to a lot of opponent turnovers. SDSU has forced 95 turnovers in the four games this season and ranks second in turnover margin in the Mountain West Conference (+4.00). Opposing squads have reached the 25-mark in three of four outings with a high of 26 by San Diego and UC Davis.

A year ago, the Aztecs set a MWC season record for turnover margin in both overall (+4.36) and conference contests (+4.07) and for most turnovers caused per league game (21.0 avg.).

On The Rebound

The Aztecs continued another trend in the game with UC Davis, outrebounding an opponent for the third straight outing. SDSU owned a season-best plus-five margin versus the Aggies, including an 18-5 advantage on the offensive glass.

With three games on the plus side in rebounding margin this season, the Aztecs have already exceeded the total from all of last year by one. The last time SDSU outrebounded an opponent in three straight games was in 2003, when it opened the campaign with four straight positive margins.

Straw On The Boards

For the second time this year, senior Michelle Strawberry collected 10 rebounds in a game, matching her

career high which she also posted versus San Diego. Strawberry currently leads the conference in offensive boards per game with a 3.25 mark, while she is fifth in overall rebounding (8.5 rpg.).

Only one Aztec, Ashley Cheesman, reached double-figures in rebounding in a game last year, doing so versus Washington State (11 reb.) and Air Force (10 reb.)

Straw For Three

Despite being shutout from beyond the arc last Saturday for the first time in her last eight outings, forward Michelle Strawberry still managed to move closer to jumping another slot in the Aztec career record book. Strawberry remains 10th all-time in career three pointers made (47) and attempted (156), but is within striking distance of moving up to ninth in the attempts department. The senior attempted four against the Aggies and now trails Charley Murray for ninth place by just eight.

Pepperdine Tid-Bits

Pepperdine is 1-6 overall this season and is coming off a loss on Thursday night at No. 25 UCLA (95-56)... the Waves lone victory came on No. 22 at home against UC Riverside (51-44), a team which beat the Aztecs (71-66) on Nov. 26... the Waves have been led by sophomore guard Daphanie Kennedy, who is averaging 12.1 points per game... two other Pepperdine players average in double-figures, with one of them, Jasmine Clarendon, leading the team in rebounding (10.4 ppg., 5.1 rpg.) ... Kennedy has a team-best 14 steals, while Sherriel Boyd is the Waves top three-point threat, converting 10 on 35 attempts this season... SDSU and Pepperdine have not faced one another since Aztec head coach Beth Burns was in her first stint at the helm, back in 1996. In that outing, the Aztecs came out victorious, 66-51, and tied a program record by committing just eight turnovers.

Paye Back Time

Aztec assistant coach Kate Paye will see some familiar faces on the other bench this Saturday, as Paye held the same position with the Waves last year, under head coach Julie Rousseau. Paye also was a teammate of Pepperdine assistant coach Vanessa Nygaard's at Stanford, as the two led the Cardinal to the Final Four

Other 2005-06 Aztec Notes Thus Far

- SDSU's 79 points at Wichita State are the program's most in a season-opener since scoring 101 versus McNeese State in 1990. The Aztecs have scored 79 points or more just six times in their first previous campaigns with two of those coming a year ago.
- Wichita State attempted an SDSU opponent record 50 free-throws beating the previous mark of 48, held by Louisiana Tech on Jan. 19, 1986 (L, 87-43).
- Michelle Strawberry's 29 points at Wichita State are the most by an SDSU player since Jamey Cox had 30 against Cal State Fullerton in 1999. Her 12 field goals are the most since Jodi Nowlin-Tres had 12 versus Air Force in Feb. 1997, while her 21 attempts are the most since Nowlin-Tres had 25 at Fresno State in Feb. 1996.
-The SDSU-USD game attracted 971 fans to Cox Arena, the largest Aztec home crowd since 1,062 people saw the Aztecs beat Air Force back on Jan. 26, 2002. It is the best attendance for a non-conference home game since Dec. 11, 1998, when there were 972 fans to watch SDSU play UCLA.
-The Aztecs' 93.8 percent free-throw percentage against USD is the team's best when attempting 10 or more in a game since the 1988-89 campaign. The Aztecs made 22 of their 23 attempts (95.7) in a 78-56 win over Tennessee Tech on Dec. 3, 1988, in the second game of the SDSU Classic in Peterson Gym.

Pick Eight

The San Diego State women's basketball team has been predicted to finish eighth in the Mountain West Conference in a preseason poll released Oct. 13, at the league's basketball media day in Salt Lake City, Utah. The voting panel consisted of the league's nine head coaches and select media.

The Aztecs, who finished tied for seventh with Air Force in the 2004-05 regular season, earned 45 votes from the panel, 13 more than the Falcons (32) and 45 behind Wyoming (90) for seventh place.

Utah, which tied for the 2004-05 regular season crown with New Mexico, was tabbed as the clear-cut preseason favorite, marking the third time the Utes have been picked to finish atop the conference. Utah received 23-of-26 first-place votes and 214 total points. New Mexico had two first-place votes and finished second with 180 points, followed by MWC newcomer TCU with one first-place vote and 164 points. UNLV (137 pts.) placed fourth, followed by Colorado State (117 pts.), BYU (107 pts.), Wyoming, SDSU and Air Force.

For the fifth straight year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of every regular season game (home and away) over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU alum Bill Earley and Dan Lawton will rotate play-by-play and travel duties, while former Aztec women's basketball standout Tammy Blackburn provides analysis at home games. Blackburn and Earley are in their 12th year of covering SDSU women's basketball, while Lawton is in his 11th season with the Aztecs.

Aztecs Sign Five To National Letters Of Intent

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signings Nov. 9 of four high schools seniors and one junior college sophomore to national letters of intent. Center Kendra Calvin (Perris, Calif.), forward Shannon Clay (Inglewood, Calif.), guard Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.), forward Allison Duffy (Lakeside, Calif.) and forward Lauren Hoisington (Las Vegas, Nev.) will join the Aztecs in the fall of 2006.

"We are pleased to announce our first recruiting class for 2006-07," said Burns, who is in her second stint as head coach at SDSU. "Through the efforts of many, we know that we've signed a terrific foundation of excellent student-athletes, who are excited about the opportunity to be an Aztec."

in league outings. Strawberry is also SDSU's top returning three-point threat, converting 22 of her 33 threes during MWC play.

Besides Strawberry, sophomore **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)** was in the starting five 20 times at the point guard position, averaging six points a game and tallying a team-best 59 assists. Senior Veronica Shaw also started 16 times in 2004-05, and is the team's lone player with three years of collegiate experience.

Other letterwinners returning include sophomore forward **Jordie Smith (Fort Collins, Colo.)** and senior walk-on **Lindsay Goldblatt (West Hills, Calif.)**, while **Courtney Fritz (Newberg, Ore.)** and **Erin Jackson (Sparks, Nev.)** will be in the line-up after redshirting a year ago due to injury.

Noting The Newcomers

Five freshmen and four transfers will wear the scarlet and black for the first time in 2005-06, as newcomers account for more than half of the Aztec roster.

One of the team's most talented players, sophomore forward Shanna Demus, sat out last year after transferring from Cal State Los Angeles. Demus averaged 16.3 points and 6.3 rebounds with the Golden Eagles to earn conference freshman-of-the-year honors and should see a lot of minutes in her first competitive season at SDSU.

Three newcomers signed letters of intent in the fall of 2004, including two San Diego-area natives in point guard Tamika Lipford and center **Audrey Green (San Marcos, Calif.)**. Lipford should see immediate playing time in her first season, while Green will provide depth in the front court.

A third fall signee, combo guard **LaSandra Dixon (Azusa, Calif.)**, was her league's player of the year as both a junior and senior.

Burns looked to fill an immediate need in the front court with the addition of freshman forward **Jana Heinrich (Fischbach, Germany)** and junior center Desiree Johnson during the spring signing period.

Johnson has two years of community college experience under her belt, averaging 13.7 points and 8.1 rebounds as a sophomore to earn first team all-South Coast Conference honors. Her power and strength in the middle should complement Heinrich's inside-outside game.

Also joining the Aztecs are walk-ons freshman **Brittany Santos (Paso Robles, Calif.)** and junior transfers **Ijlal Barnes (San Diego, Calif.)** and **Taryn Milburn (Moorpark, Calif.)**, who will provide key depth off the bench if called upon.

Key Points For The Aztecs In 2005-06

Offense - Half of SDSU's top six scorers from the 2004-05 squad return this season, including senior Michelle Strawberry, who averaged a team-best 12.9 points per league game. Guards Kate Eveland and Veronica Shaw chipped in 6.0 and 5.1 points per game, respectively, but the remaining returnees combined to average just 2.1 points per outing.

Defense - San Diego State experienced extremes on the defensive side of the ball a year ago. The Aztecs led the conference in both steals and turnover margin, but on the flip side, struggled on the boards.

Returnees contributed over half of the Aztecs' 281 steals, including 52 by Eveland and 50 by Shaw. Freshmen Tamika Lipford and LaSandra Dixon, as well as transfer Shanna Demus add instant foot speed and athleticism to the line-up.

The Aztecs will look for immediate help in the rebounding department from front court newcomers Desiree Johnson, Jana Heinrich and Audrey Green, as well as redshirt sophomore Erin Jackson.

The Schedule: The most dramatic change in SDSU's 2005-06 schedule comes with the addition of a ninth team, TCU, to the Mountain West Conference ... league games will be played on Wednesdays or Thursdays and on Saturdays from Jan. 5 through March 4, but will no longer feature the travel partner format ... SDSU opens league play on Jan. 5, the earliest the Aztecs have played a conference contest since 1997-98 ... just two of the 10 non-conference foes appeared on last season's schedule (USD, UC Riverside) ... five schools - Auburn, Boise State, Loyola (Md.), Wichita State, UC Davis - are first-time Aztec opponents ... the Aztecs will face schools from as many as eight different conferences ... SDSU plays host to a tournament for the first time since 2000.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa on April 8, 2005. In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02) and has an overall record of 232-152 (.604). Her current SDSU record stands at 151-87 (.634).
