Welcome Home

After three consecutive road contests the San Diego State men's soccer team returns to San Diego for a six-match homestand starting with UC Riverside at 4 p.m. on Friday followed by a 1 p.m. match with Brown Sunday. The Aztecs come off a 1-2 week, including a, 3-0, win at Christian Heritage on Wednesday followed by losses to Gonzaga and Oregon State over the weekend in the Diadora Classic.

SDSU Lately

The Aztecs started last week off with their first road match and first win of the season, a 3-0 decision to Christian Heritage in nearby El Cajon. A day later the team embarked on its first true road trip of the season, heading to Oregon for the Diadora Classic at Oregon State. While there, the team suffered a pair of losses, 3-2 to Gonzaga on Friday and 4-1 to Oregon State two days later.

Setting The Tone

Setting the tone of the Aztec offense this season has been a local product, sophomore midfielder Kevin Sapanli. Sapanli scored a goal in each of the Aztecs matches this past week bringing his season total to three. Coupled with his one assist, he leads the team in points (7).

The New Class

SDSU has gotten plenty of help from its newcomers thus far this season. The Aztecs' first score of the year came courtesy of the frosh duo of Eric Wohl and Paul Szefler. Wohl recorded his first collegiate goal (off a pass from Szefler) versus Notre Dame de Namur on Sept. 2. The new players have also provided familiar faces to the starting lineup with Szefler, defender Aaron Frimkess, forward Mauricio Soler and forward/defender Patrick Strait receiving the starting nod at least once thus far. Frimkess picked up his first assist against Christian Heritage.

Barnes Watch

Returning for his junior season is All-America candidate goalkeeper Brian Barnes. The 2000 first-team all-MPSF and all-academic team pick, who holds the single-season school record for saves (90) and is third in career saves (163), serves as team captain in 2001. He is the only player listed in the school's top three in career saves with only two seasons of experience.

Coaching Staff

San Diego State is led by second-year head coach Lev Kirshner. Kirshner is assisted by Matt Hall, in his second season, and Dave Siracusa, in his first year. Hall, who serves as goalkeeping coach, holds SDSU's record for saves in a career with 213 and is listed second on the program's saves in a season list (89). Former Aztec Rene Miramontes serves as volunteer coach and advises the team on technical aspects of the

game. Miramontes played for the scarlet and black in 1976-77 and '79-80.

Home Field Advantage

To say SDSU has a home field in 2001 would be an understatment. The team plays 12 matches at the Sports Deck this season, including three straight to start the year. Five of the team's eight matches in September and six of nine in October come on its home turf.

Strength Of Schedule

Not only is the Aztecs' schedule full of home dates it also brings some of the nation's most competitive teams to San Diego. The non-conference slate sees them host 2000 NCAAtournament participants UCLA, Brown, CSU Fullerton and San Diego. Brown advanced to the round of eight in last year's national championship. USD is currently ranked 13th in the NSCAA/adidas rankings along with UCLA(20).

More Polling

Several Aztec opponents are also listed in this week's *College Soccer News* rankings. USD is the highest at No. 8, followed by UCLA(12), conference opponent San Jose State (21) and Santa Clara (29). UCLA, USD and CSU Fullerton are also ranked 11th, 13th and 20th respectively in the *Soccer Times* poll.

Scouting UC Riverside

The Highlanders (0-4-1) come off a, 4-0, loss to Loyola Marymount on Sept. 18 and open their conference slate against CSU Fullerton on Thursday before traveling to San Diego. The Aztecs post a 4-0-1 all-time series record against Riverside, with the two programs last meeting in the 1975 season. The 2001 season marks the team's reinstatement as a Division I program. The squad competes in the Big West Conference.

Scouting Brown

Ivy League member Brown enters the week after a, 5-0, win over Tulsa on Sunday and posts a 2-2-0 mark on the year. The Bears play at USD on Friday before heading to the Mesa to face the Aztecs on Sunday. This weekend's matches serve as the team's first true away contests of the season after going 1-1 at neutral sites thus far. SDSU and Brown have never met on the soccer field.

Things To Come

The Aztecs homestand continues with non-conference matches against Christian Heritage (Oct. 4) and UCLA(Oct. 7). SDSU gets its conference slate underway with home matches against Denver (Oct. 12) and Air Force (Oct. 14). The Aztecs continue their conference schedule on the road with matches at San Jose State (Oct. 19) and Fresno State (Oct. 21).

This Week

The Aztecs head north to participate in the adi das Classic at Santa Clara University's Buck Shaw Stadium. SDSU begins tournament action on Friday, Sept. 28, when it faces seventhranked Stanford at 5:00 p.m. On Sunday, the Aztecs will take on the host Santa Clara Broncos, ranked sixth in this week's NSCAA poll, at 1:00 p.m.

Series Records

San Diego State has never defeated Stanford, compiling a mark of 0-4-1 vs. the Cardinal over the years. The teams have not met since 1995. The lone tie in the series, a 0-0 affair, came during the 1993 season in San Diego. The Aztecs also have an 0-4-1 mark against Santa Clara. The sides last met in 1998 in San Diego, with the Broncos claiming a 1-0 win. SDSU's record against SCU in Santa Clara is 0-1-1 with their last meeting at Buck Shaw Stadium (1997) ending in a 1-1 draw.

Most Recently

SDSU dropped a 3-1 decision to 13th-ranked California last Sunday at the SDSU Sports Deck. The Aztecs took a 1-0 lead on Kim Castellanos' sixth goal of the season in the 50th minute, but the Golden Bears came back to score three times in the game's final 10 minutes to snatch the victory. Earlier last week (Sept. 18), the Aztecs defeated UC Riverside on goals by Castellanos and Fay deLeon.

Clegg Reaches Milestone

Chuck Clegg is his ninth season in charge of the SDSU women's soccer program with a record of 100-56-5 (.637). His 100th career win as coach of the women's squad came in SDSU's 2-0 win at UC Riverside last Tuesday. He joins Clive Charles (Portland) and Anson Dorrance (North Carolina) as the only other NCAADivision I coaches to accumulate at least 100 wins as both a men's and women's collegiate head coach. Clegg compiled 194 victories as head coach of the Aztec men from 1982-99.

Scouting Report

Stanford enters the weekend with a record of 5-0-0 and a No. 7 ranking in the NSCAApool. The Cardinal are ranked as high as third (Soccer Buzz) and fifth (Soccer America) in the nation this week as well. Two of the team's five wins have come in overtime: at Florida (3-2) and at Texas (2-1). Stanford is led by junior Marcia Wallis (6g, 1a) and Marcie Ward (3g, 5a). Goalie Carrie Walsh has played every minute this season and has a goals against average of 1.12. Santa Clara carries a mark of 5-1-0 into the tournament and is ranked sixth by the NSCAA. The Broncos' lone loss came at the hands of Cal, 2-1, in Santa Clara last week. The Bronco offense is led by U.S. National team player Aly Wagner (5g, 5a) along with Leslie Osborne (3g, 3a) and

Taline Tahmassian (3g, 3a). SC has allowed only four goals in its six matches, and goalie Alyssa Sobolik has a 0.82 gaa.

She Shoots. She Scores

Sophomore forward Kim Castellanos has scored in six of the Aztecs' seven matches this season. She is currently working on her second threegame goal-scoring streak of the season. With her goal vs. Cal on Sunday, Castellanos has moved into a tie for the No. 7 spot on the SDSU career goal list with 16. She needs two goals to move into a tie for sixth (with Elicia Petre, 1997-2000), and three more to move into a tie for fifth (with Sufia Wali, 1996-98). She need six points to move into the Aztec top 10 list for career points. That position is currently occupied by Susan Mendez (1995-98) with 40 points.

deLeon Moves Up

With two goals and two assists last week, senior Fay deLeon has moved into the sixth spot on the SDSU career points list. Her point total entering the week is 52 (14 goals, 25 assists). The No. 5 position is held by Elicia Petre (1997-2000) with 58 points. deLeon's 25 career assists (third on the career chart) is 10 behind Catherine McGuire (1995-98), who had 35 during her four seasons at SDSU.

Conference Leaders

Forward Arinda Alvarez leads the Mountain West Conference with four assists on the year. She picked up her fourth last Sunday, putting Kim Castellanos through for a goal early in the second half. Castellanos is second in the MWC in goals scored (6) and points (13). Despite missing four matches with injury, Nicole Findlay is tied for fourth in the league with three goals. As a team, San Diego State ranks second in the MWC in shots (114), goals (13), assists (1) and shutouts (3).

Second Half Blues

The Aztecs have not allowed a goal in the first half through the first seven matches of the season. However, the second half has proved their undoing in their three losses this fall. In two of those three defeats, the Aztecs have led in the second half only to see their opponent come back to win.

On The Horizon

Following their games at Santa Clara, the Aztecs will return to San Diego to begin a four-match homestand that begins with a game against Pepperdine on Friday, Oct. 5, at 3:00 p.m. at the SDSU Sports Deck. Included in those matches are SDSU's opening conference games against Utah (Oct. 11) and Brigham Young (Oct. 13). The BYU match on Oct. 13 will be the team's final regular-season home game as they finish with four MWC road games prior to the conference tournament in Las Vegas.

This Week

The San Diego State women's cross country team will be back in action this week when it travels to Palo Alto for the 28th-annual Stanford Invitational. Race time is set for Saturday at 4:50 p.m., at the Stanford Unversity Golf Course. Forty-six teams are scheduled to compete on the women's side including UC San Diego and USD.

About The Stanford Invite

Saturday's race will be the first 6,000-meter course the Aztecs have run this season. The course is mostly grass with some areas of dirt and short stretches of asphalt. The course has been the home of the District-8 Championships for six seasons and the Pac-10 Championships since 1972.

A Year Ago

SDSU finished 15th out of 21 teams at the last year's Stanford Invitational. The Aztecs' top finisher was Sophia Hawker who crossed the finish line 36th at 18:41. Kylie Edwards, fresh off her Mountain West Conference runner of the week performance at the Hawai'i Invite, ran the course in 19:20, finishing 71st. Invite host Stanford won the event with Washington, Kansas State, Wisconsin and Arkansas rounding out the top five. SDSU finished behind Southern Utah.

SDSU Lately

The Aztecs come off a 10th-place finish in a 25team field at the UC Riverside Invite last Saturday. SDSU was led by junior Alicia Stewart, who placed 29th with a time of 19:34 and junior Jennifer Stakiw's 30th-place finish of 19:35. The scarlet and black got its 2001 campaign started with an eighth-place finish at the

Aztec Invite Canceled

The 58th annual Aztec Invitational, scheduled for Sept. 16 in Balboa Park, was canceled due to the terrorist attacks in New York and Washington D.C. and will not be rescheduled. The event was the Aztecs' lone home contest of the season. The team will get a chance to compete in San Diego, with UC San Diego holding its invite on Oct. 13.

Coaching Staff

The Aztecs are led by the coaching staff of Rahn Sheffield and Jennifer Nanista. A 1990 graduate of SDSU, Nanista is one of the best middle distance runners to don the scarlet and black. She finished second in the 800 meters at both the 1989 and '90 Big West Conference Championships. She continues to compete as a member of the Sheffield Elite Track Club.

Looking Ahead

The Aztecs get the October portion of its schedule underway on the sixth when they travel to the Long Beach Invitational. On Oct. 13 the team will be in action at the UC San Diego Invite, before heading to Albuquerque, N.M. for the Mountain West Conference championships on Oct. 27.

World TeamTennis/ITA Championships

In the first event of the fall season for the Aztecs, San Diego State, along with cross-town rival San Diego, will co-host the third annual World TeamTennis Championship at the Barnes Tennis Center Friday through Sunday. Sixteen of the nation's premiere men's and women's tennis programs will compete in a unique format in which the men's and women's programs play together. Matches are at 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. on Friday and Saturday, with the tournament concluding on Sunday with play beginning at 9 a.m. Admission to the tournament, which makes its first appearance in Southern California, is free.

The Schedule

On Friday and Saturday, all 16 teams will be in action in matches beginning at 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. The championship concludes on Sunday with matches set to begin at 9 a.m., except for the championship match that will start at 10:30 a.m. All matches will be played at the Barnes Tennis Center and are free to the public.

The Field

The field for the World TeamTennis Tournament is made up of qualifiers from regional tournaments held last season, national at-large selections based on combined season-ending Intercollegiate Tennis national rankings and the champion from last season's WTT National Small College Championships. In addition to the Aztecs and Toreros, the other 14 teams that will make up the field for the three-day event are: Alabama, Arizona, Brigham Young, Fresno State, Loyola Marymount, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma State, Princeton, Santa Clara, South Alabama, SMU, Texas A&M, UC Irvine and Winthrop.

The Format

The teams will use the WTT format during the event. The team tennis concept, originated by Billy Jean King and Larry King, features teams comprised of at least two men, two women and a coach. Each team match consists of five sets, with one set each of men's singles, women's singles, men's doubles, women's doubles and mixed doubles. One point is awarded for each game won. A nine-point tiebreaker is played if a set reaches five all. If necessary, overtime and a super-tiebreaker are played to determine the outright winner of the match.

Level Of Competition

Some of the nation's top players are scheduled to appear including San Diego State's Oliver Maiberger, ranked 13th in the country in the preseason ITA rankings. Arizona's Steven Capriati, younger brother of Jennifer Capriati, is one of 12 nationally ranked men's singles players represented in the 16-team field. Fresno State's Kim Niggemeyer is ranked 18th in the

women's singles rankings and leads a list of 10 nationally-ranked players on the women's side. Billy Jean King is scheduled to attend this weekend's championship.

Noting The Aztecs

Junior Oliver Maiberger, who earned All-America status last season after advancing to the third round of the NCAAsingles championship, opens the season ranked 13th in the ITA preseason singles rankings. He is one of two singles players and three doubles teams from San Diego State to be ranked in the preseason ITA rankings.

Maiberger, the 2001 Mountain West Conference player of the year, posted a 29-6 record last season. He ended the 2001 season ranked 27th nationally, and was named the ITA region player to watch.

Also earning a spot in the preseason singles rankings is Valentino Pest. Last season, the junior became the first Aztec to win a match at the Rolex Indoor Championships and advanced to the quarterfinal round in the grand slam event.

Two Aztec men's doubles teams are ranked among the top 50 nationally to open the 2001-02 season. Maiberger teams with Ryan Redondo as the 46th-ranked duo, while Pest joins Travis Hassen as the 49th-ranked doubles team. San Diego State is one of 10 schools nationally to have multiple men's doubles teams ranked.

On the women's side, the doubles team of juniors Lindsey Hedberg and Silvia Tornier open the season as the No. 29 doubles team. Hedberg and Tornier posted a 20-10 record while playing a majority of the season as the Aztecs' top doubles team in 2000-01.
