THE STARTING LINEUP

SETTING THE SCENE

- Central Michigan (8-5, 6-2 MAC) faces San Diego State (9-3, 5-3 MAC) in the New Mexico Bowl at Branch Field at Dreamstyle Stadium in Albuquerque, N.M.
- The contest is scheduled for a noon ET kickoff and will be broadcast on ESPN2 with Clay Matvick (play-by-play), Ryan Leaf (analyst) and Dr. Jerry Punch (reporter) calling the action.
- Central Michigan captured its fifth MAC West Division title this season. CMU's previous titles came in 2006, 2007, 2009 and 2015. This is the first outright title since the 2009 season.

RECORD WATCH

- Jonathan Ward is the 27th player in CMU history to rush for at least 1,000 yards in a season. He produced the 38th 1,000-yard season in program history when he rushed for 88 against Toledo. He has 1,082 yards for the season. Ward, who rushed for 1,019 yards in 2017, is the ninth player in program history to have put together multiple 1,000-yard rushing seasons. With 977 rushing yards, sophomore Kobe Lewis needs 23 to reach 1,000, giving the Chippewas two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season for the first time in program history.
- Ward also ranks on both CMU's single-season and career rushing touchdown lists. The senior ranks eighth on the career list with 28 and needs three TDs to move into a tie for seventh with Brian Pruitt (1992-94). Ward is tied with Curtis Adams (1983) for sixth on the single-season list with 15 scores. He needs one more to tie Silas Massey (1996) and Eric Flowers (1998) for fourth.
- Kalil Pimpleton broke into CMU's single-season top 10 for receptions at Ball State. Pimpleton has 79 grabs, which is good for sixth all-time. He needs four more to tie Cody Wilson (2012) for fifth. Pimpleton leads the MAC in receptions and has 18 more catches than the next closest conference player.
- The Chippewas have scored 415 points this season, which is the fifth most in program history. The rankings are:
 - 2007 - 487 points (14 games)
 - 2009 - 475 points (14 games)
 - 1974 - 450 points (13 games)
 - 2006 - 416 points (14 games)
 - 2019 - 415 points (13 games)

CENTRAL MICHIGAN-SDSU SERIES

- This is the first meeting between CMU and San Diego State.
- Central Michigan is 7-8 against current members of the Mountain West Conference. That includes Boise State (3-2), San Jose State (1-1), UNLV (2-3) and Wyoming (1-2). In bowl games, CMU is 0-3, falling to SJSU (1990), UNLV (1994) and Wyoming (2017).
- Coach McElwain is 0-1 against San

Diego State, falling at SDSU in 2012, 38-14. He is 14-10 against Mountain West foes while at Colorado State.

BOWL HISTORY

- This is the 12th Division I bowl game in Central Michigan history. The Chippewas are 3-8. CMU was victorious in the:
 - 2006 Motor City Bowl (31-14 over MTSU)
 - 2010 GMAC Bowl (44-41 in 2OT over Troy)
 - 2012 Little Caesars Pizza Bowl (24-21 over WKU)
- Central Michigan lost the:
 - 1990 California Raisin Bowl (48-24 to SJSU)
 - 1994 Las Vegas Bowl (52-24 to UNLV)
 - 2007 Motor City Bowl (51-48 to Purdue)
 - 2008 Motor City Bowl (24-21 to FAU)
 - 2015 Quick Lane Bowl (21-14 to Minnesota)
 - 2016 Miami Beach Bowl (55-10 to Tulsa)
 - 2017 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl (37-14 to Wyoming)
- Coach McElwain is 2-1 in bowl games. His squad was victorious in the 2013 New Mexico Bowl (48-45, Washington State) and in the 2017 Outback Bowl (30-3, Iowa), and lost the 2016 Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl (41-7, Michigan).

COACH MAC RETURNS TO NEW MEXICO BOWL

- Central Michigan head coach Jim McElwain has taken part in this bowl before, leading his Colorado State squad to a 48-45 victory over Washington State in 2013.
- The Rams trailed 45-30 with three minutes left in the game, scoring two touchdowns to tie it up and a hitting 41-yard field goal as time expired to win the game. CSU forced two fumbles in the last two minutes to aid the comeback.
- The bowl game was CSU's first since 2008.

NEWS & NOTES

HONORING A TEAMMATE

- Central Michigan teammates JaCorey Sullivan and Kalil Pimpleton honored fellow Chippewa Andrew Ward by wearing Ward's No. 43 jersey this season.
- Ward, a sophomore linebacker, suffered a career-ending injury in the game at Bowling Green. Before getting hurt, Ward started four games and had 14 tackles, 2.0 tackles-for-loss, a forced fumble, and a pass breakup.
- Sullivan, a junior wide receiver, wore the jersey at Buffalo, and Pimpleton, a sophomore wide receiver, wore it against Northern Illinois.
- All three grew up and played together at Muskegon High School.

MCLEWAIN HONORED BY MAC

- Head Coach Jim McElwain was named the MAC Coach of the Year.
- McElwain is the third CMU coach to earn the MAC Coach of the Year Award and the first since Dick Flynn in 1994. Herb Deromedi was named the league's top coach in 1980 and in 1990.
- It marks the third time in his career that McElwain has earned a league coach of the year award. He was named the Mountain West Coach of the Year while leading Colorado State in 2014 and he earned the Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year Award at Florida in 2015.
- McElwain is just the fourth individual to earn COY honors in three Division I conferences. The others are:
 - Brady Hoke (2008 MAC - Ball State, 2010 MWC - SDSU & 2011 Big Ten - Michigan). Hoke is a defensive assistant coach at SDSU.
 - Gary Patterson (2005 C-USA - TCU, 2005 & 2009 MWC - TCU & 2014 Big 12 - TCU).
 - Dennis Stolz (1974 Big Ten - Michigan State, 1982 & 1985 MAC - Bowling Green & 1986 WAC - SDSU).

EIGHT INDIVIDUALS EARN ALL-MAC HONORS

- Eight Central Michigan football players earned individual accolades from the Mid-American Conference.
- CMU sophomore Kalil Pimpleton was named to the first team at two positions, wide receiver and punt returner. Also named to the first team were wideout JaCorey Sullivan, a junior, linebacker Troy Brown, and defensive lineman Sean Adesanya.
- Tight end Tony Poljan and linebacker Michael Oliver were each named to the second team, while running back Jonathan Ward and

defensive lineman Robi Stuart each earned a spot on the third team.

NATION'S TOP TURNAROUND

- Central Michigan has the biggest turnaround in the nation, both overall and in conference action. Last season, CMU went 1-11 overall, 0-8 MAC.
- CMU is plus-seven in the win column overall, a mark that is one better than Navy's mark of six
- The Chippewas also finished the MAC schedule plus-six, which is one better in terms of conference improvement than Navy (American) and Louisville (ACC).
- This also matches the biggest turnaround in program history. The 1909 team went 7-1, a seven-game improvement from the previous year.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- The Chippewas have spread the ball out well among their receiving corps, with six players tallying at least 20 catches this season. Kalil Pimpleton leads the way with 79 grabs while JaCorey Sullivan has 54, Ty Scott has 34, and Tony Poljan and Jonathan Ward have 33 each, and Kobe Lewis has 23. Only two players caught more than 20 balls last season with the team leader at 28 receptions.
- Ty Scott has become a solid playmaker for CMU, leading the squad with 17.9 yards per reception. That is the fourth-best mark in the conference. Scott, a redshirt freshman, has caught 34 balls for 609 yards and five touchdowns this season.
- Central Michigan's streak of having the same five starters on the offensive line came end in the MAC Championship Game as Oge Udeogu missed the game with an injury. The last time CMU had the same five starters on the O-line for a regular season was 2014 with Ramadan Ahmeti (LT), Andy Phillips (LG), Nick Beamish (C), Kenny Rogers (RG) and Kevin Henry (RT). The Chippewas have allowed just 18 sacks this season, which is third in the MAC and 20th nationally.
- CMU is 17 for 29 on fourth down conversions this season. In comparison, Central Michigan was just 6 for 13 last year. The Chippewas rank third in the MAC.
- CMU had 615 yards of total offense against Northern Illinois, just the fourth time in the last 15 years the Chippewas hit that mark. The total yardage was the most since the squad had 639 yards at Akron in 2007.

CHIPPÉWA NAME

The Central Michigan University Board of Trustees has approved the continued use of the nickname "Chippewas" in association with CMU. The university's goals are to use the name with honor and respect, increase supportive connections between CMU and Native Americans, and improve efforts to sensitize students, faculty, and staff to Native American traditions and cultures.

Media representatives have been extremely cooperative as we have worked to address this important issue. In nearly all cases, print and broadcast reporters have supported CMU's efforts to eliminate the use of symbols, headlines, and copy that present inappropriate and inaccurate images of Native Americans.

Central Michigan University is grateful for your help, and we ask for your continued cooperation and sensitivity. With your assistance, we can continue to use the Chippewa name with dignity and respect.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Central Michigan's rush defense has been outstanding this year, giving up 115.1 yards per game, the second-best mark in the MAC and 20th in the nation. CMU allowed just 22 yards versus Northern Illinois (0.9 yards per carry), 45 yards against Albany (2.0 ypc), 47 yards to Akron (1.6 ypc), 51 at Miami (1.5 ypc), 63 versus EMU (2.2 ypc). The rush total by NIU was the least amount of rushing yards allowed since CMU gave up 21 at Eastern Michigan in 2014. The opponent single-game rushing low last year was 82 by Maine.
- CMU has 28 sacks over the past nine games and 90 tackles-for-loss after starting slow with just one sack in the first two games. It had eight sacks against Akron, tied for the most in a single game over the past 15 years, and 14.0 tackles-for-loss, the fourth most in the last 15 years. Central Michigan added four sacks and 9.0 tackles-for-loss at Miami (Fla.), five sacks and 10.0 TFLs against EMU and three sacks and 11.0 TFLs versus Miami (Ohio). The Chippewas rank fourth in the MAC in sacks (26.0). The squad has 100.0 tackles-for-loss this year, which is the 13th-best mark in the country and the second-best mark in the MAC.
- Chippewas hold three of the top five spots in the MAC rankings for tackles-for-loss. Troy Brown leads the conference with 16.0 TFLs while Sean Adesanya is second with 15.5, and LaQuan Johnson ranks fifth with 13.0. Adesanya also is second in the conference in sacks with 7.0. Brown ranks 20th in the country in TFLs while Adesanya is 25th.
- The Chippewas have made a MAC-best 11 interceptions in conference action this year. Those picks have come from seven different players. CMU tallied just one interception in nonconference action this year.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Central Michigan has two of the top return men in the MAC. Sophomore Kalil Pimpton is averaging 9.0 yards per punt return, which ranks second in the MAC. Sophomore Kobe Lewis is seventh in the MAC in kick returns with 23.7 yards per return.
- Sophomore punter Brady Buell ranks sixth in the MAC with 42.0 yards per punt. Buell is on pace to record the fifth-best season punting average in program history.

MAC RECOGNITION

- Central Michigan has had student-athletes recognized eight times this season by the Mid-American Conference.
- Punter Brady Buell was named the MAC West Division Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance at Wisconsin. Buell averaged 45.2 yards on his nine punts for a total of 407 yards. His longest punt went for 50 yards and

he had one punt downed inside the 20-yard line.

- Senior Sean Adesanya was named the MAC West Division Defensive Player of the Week for his play against Miami (Fla.). Adesanya had two sacks and forced a fumble. He helped spearhead a defense that held the Hurricanes to a season-low 51 yards rushing, and 301 total yards, which matched their season low.
- Running back Jonathan Ward has been recognized three time this season. The senior was named the MAC West Division Co-Offensive Player of the Week after tallying 205 all-purpose yards against Eastern Michigan. Ward had 132 yards on 12 carries and three catches for 73 yards. He had touchdown runs of 86 and 3 yards, and caught a TD for 64 yards. Ward received the honor again for his play against NIU. He had 138 yards on 20 carries and a touchdown in that game along with three catches. He was also honored after scoring four touchdowns and rushing for 105 yards at Ball State.
- Senior defensive back Da'Quaun Jamison was named the MAC West Division Defensive Player of the Week after his performance at Bowling Green. Jamison collected two interceptions, six tackles, and three quarterback hurries in the 38-20 win. His two interceptions was double his previous career total of one.
- Senior linebacker Michael Oliver was named the West Division Defensive Player of the Week for his play against NIU and Toledo. Oliver was CMU's leading tackler in the NIU game with five stops and also had his first career interception. He had eight tackles (4 solo) and 1.5 TFLs versus Toledo.

A BIG RUSH

- The Chippewas have rushed for over 1,669 yards as a team in their last six wins. CMU had 308 yards rushing against Eastern Michigan, 352 yards on the ground versus New Mexico State, 254 yards at Bowling Green, 327 against NIU, 180 at Ball State and 289 versus Toledo. CMU's average of 278.2 yards per game over the past six wins is a significant increase over its first five games, when CMU averaged 117.2 ypg.
- This is the first time since 1994 that CMU has had back-to-back games with at least 300 team rushing yards. The Chippewas did it in the 1994 season with 345 yards at Akron (10/15/94) and 300 yards versus Miami (10/22/94).
- The 352 yards rushing against NMSU is the most by a CMU squad since it tallied 352 against New Hampshire in 2003.

Central Michigan won that game, 40-33, in Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

- Central Michigan had a pair of 100-yard rushers in the NMSU, BGSU and NIU games. Kobe Lewis had 161 and Jonathan Ward had 131 against NMSU, Ward had 130 and Lewis tallied 125 at Bowling Green, and Lewis recorded 143 and Ward had 138 against NIU. It is the first time in at least the last 20 years that has happened for the Chippewas.
- CMU was limited to 73 rushing yards in the loss to Buffalo and 99 in the defeat to Miami (Ohio). CMU is averaging 262.8 yards per game in victories compared to 65.0 yards per game in its losses.

HOME, SWEET HOME

- Central Michigan played well at home this season, outscoring opponents, 264-106.
- At home, CMU's offense was dynamic, averaging 44.0 points per game (20 rushing TDs, 14 passing TDs), 550.3 yards per game (284.8 rushing, 265.5 passing) and 25.3 first downs per game. CMU allowed just two sacks at home including zero against Akron, EMU, NMSU, NIU and Toledo.
- The defense was also strong at home, especially against the run. The Chippewas allowed just 62.7 rushing yards per game, an average of 2.3 yards per carry, and only three rushing touchdowns. Opponents averaged 291.5 yards per game and converted on 24.1 percent of their third downs. The CMU defense had 51 tackles-for-loss and 19 sacks.

- CMU scored 264 points at home this season, the most in program history. The previous top mark was 253 points by the 2009 squad with the 1984 team second at 235 points and the 1974 group third at 225 points.
- Central Michigan was 6-0 this season at Kelly/Shorts Stadium for the first time since the 1980 season.
- Kelly/Shorts Stadium began hosting CMU football games in 1972. Since, the Chippewas have posted a 173-81-4 record (.676 winning percentage) at home.

WARD RETURNS TO FORM

- Jonathan Ward has had a great senior season despite missing almost three games due to injuries.
- In Ward's 10 full games, he has rushed for 1,079 yards on 173 carries, an average of 6.2 yards per carry. He has rushed for over 100 yards in seven of the 10 games.
- Ward also has 33 receptions for 322 yards, giving him an average of 140.1 all-purpose yards per game. His 16 touchdowns (15 rushing, one receiving) leads the squad.
- Ward ranks fifth in the MAC in rushing yards per game (98.4), is second in all-purpose yards (127.6), and third in total touchdowns with 16.
- Nationally, the senior is 12th in rushing TDs (15), 18th in yards per carry (6.2), 20th in all-purpose yards (134.0) and 26th in rushing yards per game (105.6).
- Ward had 212 rushing yards all of last season and averaged 2.8 yards per carry.

MAKING AN IMPACT

- Kalil Pimpleton has made an immediate impact on the CMU offense. The sophomore, who sat out last season due to transfer rules, leads the MAC in receptions with 6.1 per game and ranks 26th nationally.
- He had seven catches for 116 yards against Akron, CMU's first 100-yard receiving game since Jonathan Ward had 109 yards against Wyoming in the 2017 Idaho Potato Bowl.
- His 11 receptions against Miami were the most by a CMU student-athlete since Cody Wilson had 11 against Northern Illinois (10/23/10). Pimpleton's mark is also the most by a MAC player this season..
- Pimpleton has 79 catches for 823 yards and six touchdowns this season. CMU's leading receiver last year finished with 28 catches for 313 yards and four touchdowns.

BROWN BREAKOUT

- Sophomore linebacker Troy Brown has had a breakout season, leading CMU with 85 total tackles including 72 solo stops. He is first in the MAC in solo tackles, 16th in the nation, and the second highest-ranked sophomore in the country.
- Brown also ranks first in the conference in tackles-for-loss with 16.0. He ranks 20th in the nation and fourth among all freshmen/sophomores.
- Brown also leads the team with three interceptions. That is tied for second in the nation among linebackers
- Last season, Brown was a safety, playing mostly on special teams. He finished the season with 19 tackles (13 solo) and an interception.

EXPLOSIVE PLAYS

- Explosive plays were a big part of Central Michigan's last six victories. In those games, the Chippewas had 12 plays over 40 yards including eight touchdowns.
- Against EMU, the first explosive play was an 80-yard pass from David Moore to Kalil Pimpleton. It was CMU's longest touchdown pass since Cooper Rush threw to Corey Willis for an 85-yard TD at Virginia in 2016.
- Moore connected with Jonathan Ward for a 64-yard touchdown catch midway through the second quarter.
- The longest play against EMU came when Ward broke through the middle and hit an 86-yard touchdown run in the third quarter. The career-long rush for Ward is the longest for CMU since Zurlon Tipton also had an 86-yard TD against Eastern Michigan in 2013. Ward's run is the seventh-longest in FBS action this year and the longest in MAC play.
- It was the first time in at least 15 seasons that CMU has had two 80-yard plus

touchdowns in the same game.

- Versus NMSU, the Chippewas had a 44-yard TD reception by Pimpleton, a 57-yard touchdown run by Lewis, and a 75-yard scoring rush by Ward.
- At Bowling Green, Tony Poljan tallied a 53-yard reception, Lewis had a 51-yard touchdown run and Ward had a 40-yard rush
- Versus NIU, Poljan had a 40-yard reception and Lewis tallied a 75-yard run.
- Against Toledo, Ty Scott connected with Quinten Dormady for a 48-yard touchdown.
- Jonathan Ward is tied for the national lead with a pair of 70-plus yard runs.

FIRST TIME

- Central Michigan has had 20 first-time starters this season: CB Norman Anderson, CB Darius Bracy, CB Montrae Braswell, NT Jacques Bristol, DL Mohamed Diallo, QB Quinten Dormady, LB George Douglas; OL Luke Goedeke, DE Troy Hairston, S Gage Kreski, CB Kyrion McKinnie-Harper, QB David Moore, OL Danny Motowski, WR Keonta Nixon, WR Kalil Pimpleton, DB Willie Reid, WR Tyrone Scott, DE Amir Siddiq, OL Oge Udeogu and LB Andrew Ward.
- For Braswell, Bristol, Diallo, Dormady, Goedeke, Moore, McKinnie-Harper, Motowski, Pimpleton, Reid, Nixon and Udeogu, it was their first action ever as a Chippewa. Joining them were LB Nick Apsey, DL Tico Brown, P Brady Buell, OL Tyden Ferris, DL Darrick Gibson, DB Demarcus Governor, LB Cory Gildersleeve, WR Adam Jones, DB Trey Jones, LS Franklin Lama, RB Lew Nichols, LB Ke'Shon Parker, DL Evan Plate, OL Deiyantei Powell-Woods, QB Daniel Richardson, DL Max Saylor and LB Justin Whiteside.
- CMU had 13 true freshman see action: Bristol, Gildersleeve, Governor, Adam Jones, Trey Jones, McKinnie-Harper, Motowski, Nichols, Parker, Powell-Woods, Richardson, Saylor and Whiteside .

TICE NAMED TO GROZA AWARD WATCH LIST

- Kicker Ryan Tice has the longest field goal by a MAC kicker this year. Tice nailed a 55-yarder at Miami (Fla.), which is also the seventh longest field goal in NCAA FBS action this season. He also had a 50-yarder against Albany.
- The senior now has two of the four longest field goals in program history. The 55-yarder at Miami is the second longest, behind Rade Savich's school record 57-yard boot in 1975. Tice also had a 53-yard field goal against Ball State last year, which ranks fourth.
- Kevin Nicholl's 54-yarder in 1989 is the third longest. Tice's kick against Ball State was the longest by a MAC kicker last year and tied for

the 16th-longest in FBS. It was also the first 50-yard plus field goal by a CMU kicker since David Harman hit a 50-yarder in the 2012 Little Caesars Pizza Bowl against Western Kentucky.

- The senior is 12-for-20 in field goals this year with four misses over 50 yards. Tice is also 47-for-47 in PATs.
- Tice had an interesting journey to Central Michigan. He spent three seasons at Michigan before transferring to Tennessee as a graduate in May, 2018. The Saline, Mich., native made the decision to return in-state in mid-August and was granted a waiver to play the day before CMU's 2018 season opener at Kentucky.
- He saw action on kickoffs in the first two games before stepping in as the Chippewas' field goal/PAT kicker midway through the third game.
- Tice was 10-12 on field goals and 14-15 on PATs in 2018. He led the conference in field goal accuracy (83.3 percent) and ranked 19th nationally. He earned Second Team All-MAC honors. Seven of his field goals were 40-plus yards, top 10 in the nation.

WALDERZAK RECOGNIZED

- Central Michigan's Clay Walderzak has been named a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, which goes to a senior or graduate student in his final year of eligibility who combines on-field and academic success as well demonstrates strong character, leadership and citizenship.
- The award, presented by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame, goes to the student-athlete determined

by the organization to be the best football scholar-athlete in the nation.

- Walderzak is a graduate student from Standish who has overcome several injuries throughout his career at CMU. He is the Chippewas' starting left tackle, anchoring a much-improved offensive line, and is pursuing a master's degree after earning a Bachelor of Science with a major in engineering technology, graduating with a 3.25 grade point average.
- In 2018, Walderzak earned the Chippewas' Derrick Nash Unsung Hero Award and was named to the Academic All-Mid-American Conference Team.
- Walderzak rejoined the squad over the summer after being granted a sixth season due to a medical hardship.
- Walderzak came to CMU in 2014 and missed his first two seasons due to injuries.
- After moving to offensive tackle from tight end in 2017, Walderzak started 20 games the last 2 years.

BOISE, Idaho. - CMU gave the ball away a season-high eight times in falling to Wyoming, 37-14, before 16,512 in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl at Albertsons Stadium. The Chippewas finished 8-5 and saw their win streak end at five games.

Wyoming intercepted CMU quarterback Shane Morris three times, sacked him five times, and the Chippewas fumbled the ball away five times. Twenty-three of Wyoming's points - two TDs and three field goals - came after CMU turnovers.

Cowboy quarterback Josh Allen, projected to be a top-five pick in the NFL Draft in April, was as efficient as he needed to be, completing 11 of 19 pass attempts for 154 yards. He threw three touchdown passes, all in the first quarter, to stake the Cowboys to an early 21-7 lead and force the Chippewas to play catch-up all game long.

CMU's defense surrendered just three field goals over the final three quarters, but the Chippewas offense could not produce consistently against a Wyoming defense that came into the game ranked 21st in the country.

Yohanna Ghaifan sacked Morris, forcing a fumble, and Carl Granderson scooped up the loose ball and raced 58 yards for a TD early in the fourth quarter to make it 37-14 and snuff out CMU's last legitimate hope.

Johnathan Ward finished with a combined 138 yards in rushing and receiving and scored two touchdowns to lead CMU. He took a short pass from Morris and turned it into a 74-yard TD that kept the Chippewas in the game in the first quarter. He later scored on a 3-yard run.

The Chippewas' final yardage total, 364, looked respectable, but the five sacks, the six turnovers and 61 yards in penalties were more than enough to keep the Chippewas from mounting a serious threat.

- Ward and Tyler Conklin each caught seven passes against Wyoming; Ward finished with 109 yards in receptions, Conklin with 98.

- Junior middle linebacker Malik Fountain and sophomore linebacker Michael Oliver shared the team lead with eight tackles apiece against the Cowboys. Ostman and safety Darwyn Kelly made six stops each.

- Ostman was credited with two sacks and he finished the season with 14, the second most for a single season in program history behind Dan Bazuin, who made 16 in 2005. Ostman finished his career with 28 sacks, which is second in program history behind Bazuin (35.5).

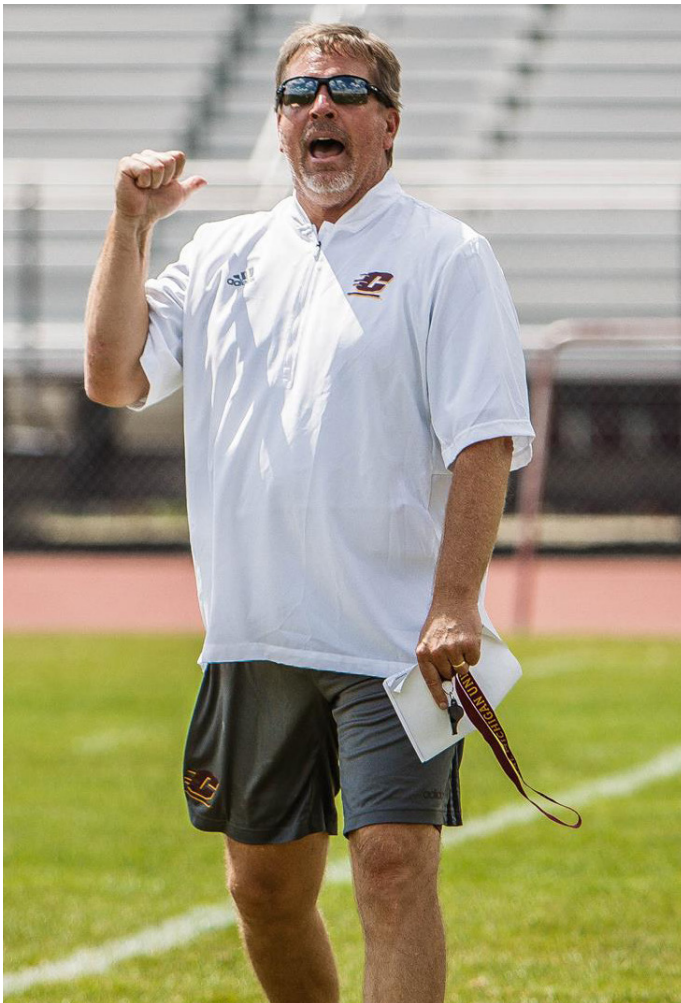

programs at Florida and at Colorado State, and he has been a member of coaching staffs on national-championship teams.

- McElwain led Florida to 19 wins and back-to-back SEC East titles during his first two seasons in Gainesville.
- Those titles made him the first coach in league history to reach the SEC Championship Game in his first two seasons as head coach. Just two other coaches reached the title game in their first season.
- He was named the SEC Coach of the Year in 2015.
- He led Colorado State to a 10-3 finish in 2014, earning the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year Award.
- He earned American Football Coaches Association regional coach of the year awards in both 2014 and 2015.
- As the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach under Nick Saban at Alabama from 2008-11, McElwain helped the Crimson Tide to two national championships and coached 2009 Heisman Trophy winner Mark Ingram.
- McElwain served as an assistant at Michigan under Jim Harbaugh during the 2018 season, helping the Wolverines to a 10-2 regular-season finish and a top-10 ranking.

In nearly 30 years of collegiate coaching, McElwain has consistently displayed an ability to build winning teams with a focus on academic success, an eagerness to engage fans and the community, and a determination to maintain integrity throughout the program.

McElwain is a native of Missoula, Mont. He played quarterback at Eastern Washington from 1980-83

and began his climb up the coaching ladder at his alma mater, first as a graduate assistant and then as the quarterbacks/wide receivers coach from 1987-94.

He moved on to Montana State in 1995, serving as the Bobcats' offensive coordinator, their wide receivers coach, and as their special teams coordinator.

McElwain served as the wide receivers coach/special teams coordinator at Louisville from 2000-02 and at Michigan State as the assistant head coach, wide receivers coach, and special teams coordinator from 2003-05.

In 2006, McElwain moved on to the NFL, working as the quarterbacks coach for the Oakland Raiders. He remained on the west coast in 2007, serving as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Fresno State as the Bulldogs finished 9-4.

In 2008, McElwain joined Saban's staff at Alabama, and he helped lead the Crimson Tide to an incredible 48-6 combined record in his four years on staff as they claimed national titles in 2009 and 2011.

In 2012, McElwain took the reins at Colorado State, leading a program that had won just nine games combined in the three years prior to his arrival, to a combined 22 victories from 2012-14. The McElwain-led Rams won 10 games in 2014, tying for the second highest in program history.

McElwain coached at Florida from 2015-17, compiling a 22-12 overall record, two SEC East titles and two SEC Championship Game appearances.

McElwain and his wife, Karen, have three children: JoHanna, Elizabeth and Jerret.

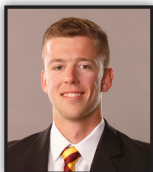

MOUNT PLEASANT, Mich. – Quarterback Quinten Dormady threw for 285 yards and three touchdowns in his Central Michigan debut and the Chippewa offense rolled up 529 total yards as CMU downed Albany, 38-21, in the season opener at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

The victory and the Chippewas' performance was important on several fronts, not the least of which is that it came on opening night as CMU attempted to put a one-win 2018 season permanently in the rearview mirror in Jim McElwain's first game as the Chippewa coach.

The start of the game was delayed for nearly two hours by lightning, but that did little to slow a Chippewa team eager to return to the field.

"Really want to thank the people who stayed and got to see the Chips get a win," McElwain said. "That was something. The smiles in the locker room were long overdue. It's been awhile for them to get a win and for our team, I'm just really proud of them."

"It's great to be here, I love these players, they're a bunch of great kids and they really want to do what's right and this was a step in the right direction."

It was a coming-out party for Dormady, a graduate transfer who made stops at Tennessee and then at Houston before landing in Mount Pleasant, along with wide receivers Tyrone Scott and Kalil Pimpleton, each of whom caught their first touchdown passes in a CMU uniform.

It was also a redemptive performance for CMU senior running back Jonathan Ward, whose 2018 production fell off dramatically from 2017, when he amassed nearly 1,500 combined yards in rushing and receiving. On Thursday, he finished with 211 yards from scrimmage – 158 on 22 carries; 53 on three receptions – and scored twice.

The Chippewas finished with 285 yards passing and 244 on the ground and gained 31 first downs.

Dormady found Scott twice for touchdown passes and then Ryan Tice added a 50-yard field goal for a 17-0 lead midway through the second quarter.

Albany cut its deficit to 17-7 with 5:27 to play in the half, and then missed a 39-yard field goal attempt. The Chippewas took over at their own 22-yard line, and Dormady engineered an eight-play, 78-yard drive that ended with a 4-yard TD toss to Pimpleton with just 2 seconds left in the half and upped CMU's lead to 24-7.

Ward scored on runs of 7 and 12 yards in the second half, sandwiching those scores around a 52-yard fumble return for a TD by Albany's Eli Mencer.

MOUNT PLEASANT, Mich. – Jim McElwain did not sugar coat it after his Central Michigan football team took a 61-0 loss from Wisconsin before 74,437 fans at the Badgers' Camp Randall Stadium.

"It was a heck of a football team we played," the first-year coach said. "Obviously disappointed in, not our effort, but in how we played. I thought we'd play better, we didn't. It is what it is. Now we've got to pick ourselves back up."

Wisconsin, ranked 16th nationally in the Coaches Poll and 17th by the Associated Press, scored touchdowns on six of its seven first-half possessions and added a safety in building a 44-0 lead at the break.

That made the second half a time for the Chippewas (1-1) to play backups and begin looking ahead to next week, when they entertain Akron in the Mid-American Conference opener.

There is no need for long-range philosophic soul searching in the CMU camp. Wisconsin, behind running back Jonathan Taylor, a legitimate Heisman Trophy candidate, is just that good and is likely to remain a top-20 team throughout the season.

"I've said from the start I really like this football team, I like our guys, a bunch of good kids," McElwain said. "They're hurting in there right now, disappointed. We'll pick them back up and we'll move forward and get ready to play a conference opponent next week at home."

Taylor ran for 102 yards and three touchdowns and Wisconsin quarterback Jack Coan threw for 363 yards and three scores. Wisconsin (2-0) finished with 599 yards in total offense and held CMU to 58.

"It's a great learning experience for our guys," McElwain said. "A great atmosphere for our guys to be in, and I know they're disappointed in how they performed. You know what, that's OK. Sometimes you've got to put yourself out there and you learn a lot from failure. We're going to do that and come back and be a better team next week."

MOUNT PLEASANT, Mich. – David Moore threw for 316 yards and two touchdowns and Kobe Lewis amassed 183 yards and three scores on 30 touches as the Chippewas topped Akron, 45-24, before 18,641 at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

“Just can’t tell you how proud I am of our football team and this coaching staff,” first-year CMU coach Jim McElwain said. “It goes back to me feeling so good for these players, who maybe didn’t feel great about themselves (before) and yet understanding that the work you put in to it is what’s going to help you in whatever you do in life, and they saw that.”

“The guys went out and played the game the way it was supposed to be played, and I thought they were physical too.”

The Chippewas amassed 533 yards in total offense, surpassing by four yards the total they posted in their season-opening win over Football Championship Subdivision Albany. Their point total was their highest in 19 games, dating to 56-9 victory over Ball State midway through the 2017 season.

The Chippewas built a 17-0 lead early in the second quarter and were never seriously threatened after that.

“I looked at this game, to me it was going to be a measure,” McElwain said. “A measure of where we are at. To play someone in conference, to see where that kind of matches up. I thought our guys took it to them. I think we imposed our will at times, which is something that really good teams learn to do and it’s something we need to continue to move forward with.”

Moore, subbing for injured starter Quinten Dormady, completed 20 of his 31 pass attempts and tossed TD passes to Tony Poljan and Kalil Pimpleton. He was not sacked and the Chippewas turned the ball over just once.

Lewis, a sophomore, made the most of his first career start as well, subbing for injured Jonathan Ward. He carried 27 times for 146 yards and three TDs, and caught three passes for 37 yards.

Pimpleton led the receiving corps with seven catches for 116 yards, while Poljan made five grabs for 90.

The Chippewa defense posted seven sacks among 13 tackles-for-loss and held the Zips to 47 yards rushing.

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. – The Chippewas stood toe-to-toe with Atlantic Coast Conference member Miami (Fla.) on Saturday at Hard Rock Stadium, never backing down in what turned into a battle of defenses.

The Hurricanes got a 17-12 win; the Chippewas, perhaps, some respect and a level of self-discovery – maybe belief -- as they head into next weekend's battle with archrival Western Michigan in Kalamazoo.

"I'm really proud of those kids in that locker room," first-year CMU coach Jim McElwain said. "They made a decision and a choice this week to go out and really play hard, and I'll tell you what, we played hard, which was great to see.

"Anytime you lose it hurts; for the first time I kind of felt in that locker room there was a little bit of pain and that's not a bad thing."

It was, perhaps, a barometer for how far the Chippewas have come in McElwain's four games in charge of the program. They lost in their last game with a Power 5 opponent, Wisconsin, 61-0, two weeks ago.

No, Miami is not Wisconsin, which is a top-10 team and certainly in the national-championship conversation. But Miami is out of a Power 5 conference and the Hurricanes certainly have the pedigree and the talent to rate among college football's storied programs.

Miami (2-2) scored touchdowns on its first possession of the game and its first of the third quarter and then added a field goal in building a 17-5 lead early in the fourth quarter.

The Chippewas (2-2), who got a first-half safety and then a career-long 53-yard field goal from Ryan Tice, never packed it in against a stubborn Miami defense ranked among the best in the nation.

CMU finally broke through with a touchdown on a David Moore quarterback sneak, pulling to within 17-12 with just over three minutes to play and keeping them one play away from taking the lead.

Miami had enough in its offensive tank to milk the clock and leave the Chippewas with just 39 seconds to go 95 yards for the game-winning score. That proved too tall a task, and the end came on an interception with 6 seconds remaining, the Chippewas still swinging.

"That was a great effort," defensive tackle Robi Stuart said. "We really looked inside ourselves and really saw what we had to do. I respect every single one of the guys on my team. They all put everything they had out on the line today. Proud to call them my teammates."

KALAMAZOO, MICH. – It would have taken a Central Michigan team at its best to beat Western Michigan on Saturday.

The Chippewas were far from it, committing three turnovers and 95 yards in penalties in falling to the archrival Broncos, 31-15, in the annual Cannon Trophy game before 20,476 at Western's Waldo Stadium.

The bitterly disappointing loss dropped the Chippewas to 2-3, 1-1 Mid-American Conference. Western is 3-2, 1-0. CMU entertains Eastern Michigan in a MAC game on Saturday, Oct. 5 (3 p.m.).

"They took it to us and beat us in every phase of the game," first-year CMU coach Jim McElwain said. "Obviously I'm disappointed, disappointed because I let a lot of people down. I take the responsibility for us not being able to get a yard, for us jumping offside, not getting in the right formation in the game.

"Those are all things that go directly through me and I let a lot of people down in this rivalry game, a lot of Chippewas out there. Very disappointed."

Western Michigan's offense lived up to its billing as the MAC's best and one of the best in the nation as the Broncos built a 24-0 lead early in the fourth.

While the Chippewas actually finished with statistical advantages in first downs and total yardage, they squandered a pair of early opportunities that, had they cashed in, would unquestionably have changed the complexion of the game.

Twice in the first half the Chippewas came up short on fourth down deep in Western territory, the first time at the Bronco 9-yard line and the second at their 15. Western led 17-0 at halftime.

"If you can't get a yard, you don't deserve to win a game."

Western quarterback Jon Wassink threw for 244 yards and a touchdown and running back Levante Bellamy ran for 105 yards and a score.

Jonathan Ward, who sat out the Chippewas' past two games with an injury, ran for 107 yards on 19 carries for his second 100-yard game of the season. Quarterback David Moore completed 33 of 48 pass attempts for 330 yards and a touchdown. He was intercepted twice.

MOUNT PLEASANT, MICH. – Jonathan Ward rolled up 205 combined yards in rushing and receiving and scored three touchdowns as the Chippewas posted a resounding 42-16 Mid-American Conference victory over Eastern Michigan before 15,235 at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

“Heck of a win,” first-year CMU coach Jim McElwain said. “(Eastern) was a good football team that’s been playing really good. I don’t think we left any doubt (about) kind of where our program is.

“Complete win, offensively and defensively. My hat’s off to our guys. I can tell you, this team has come light years. Can’t tell you how much I like this team and how proud I am of them.”

The win lifted the Chippewas to 3-3, 2-1 MAC and came one week after they lost, 31-15, at rival Western Michigan. EMU is 3-2, 0-1.

The Chippewas used the big play in rolling up season-highs in rushing yards (308) and total yards (587).

Among Ward’s three TDs were a 64-yard pass play and an 86-yard run. The Chippewas also got a 28-yard TD run from Kobe Lewis and an 80-yard TD pass play from Kalil Pimpleton.

The Chippewas built a 21-3 halftime lead and increased it to 28-3 midway through the third quarter.

“One of the things that we have been lacking are early scores and explosive plays,” McElwain said. “We’ve moved the ball pretty well throughout the year at times. We needed to get some explosives in; today we finally got some.”

Ward finished with 132 yards on the ground, while Lewis added 81. Both carried 12 times. Ward caught three passes for 73 yards. Pimpleton led the Chippewas with 112 yards on five catches. CMU quarterback David Moore completed 15 of his 24 pass attempts for 279 yards and two TDs.

The early lead helped to make the Eagles one-dimensional, and the Chippewa defense teed off, collecting five sacks among 10 tackles-for-loss. They held Eastern to 77 yards rushing.

The victory could be a turning point for the Chippewas, who won just one game a season ago and now stand at .500 at midway through the regular season.

“You’ve got to go out and prove if it’s turned the corner,” McElwain said. “I believe in this team, I really do, and yet we’ve got to continue to grow, we’ve got to continue to understand how to go about your daily business to be successful.”

MOUNT PLEASANT, MICH. – Central Michigan football coach Jim McElwain likes explosive plays.

He got them – and a lead -- in the first half on Saturday. Then he settled for some good old-fashioned ball-control football in the second.

Either way, McElwain and the Chippewas will happily take the result, a 42-28 nonconference victory over New Mexico State before 15,764 on homecoming at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

“We’re starting to learn, there’s some things we’re going to get better at from this game as well, but at the same time it’s about getting wins and we got a win today,” McElwain said. “We ran the ball well at times, I think our explosive plays, second week in a row, kind of set the tone and that was good to see.”

Jonathan Ward and Kobe Lewis once again proved to be a potent one-two punch as the running backs combined for 328 yards in rushing and receiving and three touchdowns on 45 touches.

Ward continued his senior-season resurgence, rushing for 131 yards on 18 carries and catching four passes for 36 yards. Lewis, a sophomore, had 161 yards and scored twice on 23 carries.

The Chippewas finished with a season-high 352 yards on the ground, averaging 6.3 yards per attempt. They held a 10-plus-minute edge in possession time on a day when a strong southerly wind was clearly a factor.

Quinten Dormady returned to quarterback for the Chippewas after missing the better part of five games with an injury. The graduate transfer completed 14 of his 24 pass attempts for 134 yards and two touchdowns.

Dormady’s first scoring pass went for 44 yards to Kalil Pimpleton on CMU’s first possession of the game. Lewis bolted 57 yards for a touchdown the next time the Chippewas had the ball, increasing their lead to 14-0 midway through the first quarter.

The Chippewas never relinquished the lead.

Lewis scored on a nifty 20-yard spinning run midway through the second quarter, and Ward ripped off a 75-yard TD run with under four minutes to play in the half. The Chippewas led at the break, 28-21.

The second half featured nowhere near the highlight-reel plays as did the first, but the Chippewas were plenty good enough, getting a pair of Ryan Tice field goals in the third quarter when the wind was at their backs, and a 7-yard Dormady-to-Tony Poljan TD pass as they kept the Aggies (0-7) at arm’s length.

BOWLING GREEN, OHIO – Jonathan Ward ran for 130 yards and a career-high three touchdowns, and Kobe Lewis added 125 yards and one score as Central Michigan defeated Bowling Green, 38-20, in a Mid-American Conference game before 15,100 at the Falcons' Doyt Perry Stadium.

"That's a heck of a win," first-year CMU coach Jim McElwain said. "Our guys had to learn how to win at home and we've kind of done a decent job of that. The next step in the program was to go on the road and figure out how to get a win."

The Chippewas not only answered the win-on-the-road question, but they had an answer for everything that Bowling Green threw at them on Saturday.

The Falcons returned a CMU fumble 100 yards to tie the game 7-7 late in the first quarter. Minutes later, the Chippewas were back in front after a 7-yard Ward TD run. The Falcons scored on a 75-yard drive to open the third quarter, drawing to 21-14. Again, the Chippewas responded with another Ward TD run, this one from 9 yards, less than two minutes later to restore their lead to two TDs, 28-14.

That spelled the beginning of the end for Bowling Green (2-5, 1-2) as once again, Ward and Lewis proved to be a potent one-two punch. Chippewa quarterback Quinten Dormady, in his second game back after missing four with an injury, was relatively sharp and efficient, completing 22 of 36 pass attempts for 295 yards and one touchdown.

The Chippewas finished with 553 yards, 299 through the air, 254 on the ground and held a 10-plus minute possession time advantage.

The Chippewas contained Bowling Green's Grant Loy, holding the dual-thread quarterback to 166 passing yards and 67 on the ground. He was intercepted three times.

The Falcons finished with 344 total yards, and converted on just one of their 11 third-down opportunities. CMU also stopped the Falcons on three of their five fourth-down tries.

Loy had been the catalyst in Bowling Green's 20-7 victory last week over rival Toledo. It was the Falcons' first win over their archrivals in a decade.

The key to slowing Loy, as it is with any dual-threat signal-caller, is to take away one aspect. The Chippewas chose to limit his running, and take their chances with the junior's arm.

"Their quarterback is a great competitor and they're a good overall team," said safety Da'Quaun Jamison, who had two of the Chippewas' interceptions. "We knew they were coming in with momentum. We knew if we could make them one dimensional we would have a chance to win."

BUFFALO, N.Y. – Central Michigan turned the ball over five times and never got much traction in its run game going in falling to Buffalo, 43-20, in a Mid-American Conference game at Buffalo’s UB Stadium.

The Chippewas fumbled the ball away to Buffalo (4-4, 2-2) on back-to-back possessions in the first half. Both gave the Bulls very short fields to work with, and they cashed in both times in building a 24-7 lead.

“That team took it to us today,” first-year CMU coach Jim McElwain said. “The opponent beat us in every phase it was pretty plain and simple. It’s disappointing and yet there’s a lot still out there to play and we’ll learn from it. I like this locker room, I like these guys.

“I don’t care who you are, if you’re going to do that kind of stuff you’re not going to give yourself a chance to win. All things we can learn from, that’s the important piece. We’ve got a lot ahead of us.”

CMU trailed 24-14 at halftime and had one last good chance to remain in the game when it drove to the UB 18-yard line, trailing 30-14, and still with plenty of time to mount a comeback. But Bulls stopped CMU on fourth down.

CMU finished with 73 rushing yards against a defense that entered the game ranked first in the MAC and 13th nationally against the run. The Chippewas had run for an average of more than 300 yards per game during their win streak.

“They took us out of our game,” McElwain said. “We didn’t get any rhythm, we didn’t have explosive plays.”

CMU quarterback Quinten Dormady put up respectable numbers, completing 25 of 37 pass attempts for 272 yards and two touchdowns, but he was intercepted twice and one of the picks was returned for a Buffalo TD.

CMU also struggled to stop a potent Buffalo run game that produced 197 yards, 149 of which came from Jaret Patterson on 28 carries.

Dormady’s TD passes went to JaCorey Sullivan (14 yards) and Kalil Pimpleton (5 yards). Jonathan Ward scored CMU’s other TD on a 1-yard plunge.

MOUNT PLEASANT, MICH. – In a show-me game, Central Michigan showed up, big-time.

The Chippewas scored touchdowns on their first three drives en route to a 28-point halftime lead on Saturday as they rolled past Northern Illinois, 48-10, in a Mid-American Conference game before 10,438 at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

The win kept the Chippewas, 6-4, 4-2 MAC, in the hunt for the West Division title and it came one week after they took a 43-20 beating in a league game at Buffalo.

“Pretty awesome,” first-year CMU coach Jim McElwain said. “Can’t tell you how proud I am and how happy I am for that locker room. That team that is in that locker room, in the beginning of the season, was picked dead last in the conference (poll).

“We kind of used the term judgement. This was an opportunity to find out exactly who we are, and the guys responded. I think we learned something about our team today.”

CMU goes to division-leading Ball State on Nov. 16. The Cardinals are 3-1 in the league and play at Western Michigan on Tuesday, Nov. 5.

The Chippewas rolled through the Huskie defense to the tune of a season-high 615 yards. They did not commit a turnover after giving it away five times a week ago.

With six wins, CMU is bowl eligible for the 11th time in the last 14 seasons and is 5-0 at home for the first time since 2009, when they won the MAC championship.

Kobe Lewis ran for 143 yards and Jonathan Ward had 138 to lead a Chippewa ground game that churned out 327 yards. CMU quarterback Quinten Dormady had 288 yards and three touchdowns on 18-of-24 passing.

Dormady capped CMU’s opening drive with a 14-yard TD pass to Kalil Pimpleton, then Tommy Lazzaro scored on a 3-yard run to give CMU a 14-0 lead.

After an NIU field goal, Lewis scored on a 16-yard run and Ryan Tice kicked a 32-yard field goal to up CMU’s lead to 24-3 just three minutes into the second quarter. Dormady tossed a 39-yard TD pass to Tony Poljan and then hit Tyrone Scott for a 16-yard score as CMU took complete control, leading 38-10 at halftime.

The 38 points was the most a Chippewa team has scored in the first half of a game since 2006.

The Chippewa defense forced four turnovers and limited NIU running back Tre Harbison to 17 yards on 10 carries. Harbison had run for a combined 500 yards in the Huskies’ previous four games. The Huskies finished with 251 total yards, just 22 of which came on the ground.

MUNCIE, IND. – A signature win in a turnaround season that still could end in a championship.

Tommy Lazzaro scored from 2 yards out with 1:01 to play and then the Central Michigan defense slammed the door on Saturday to complete an improbable and unforgettable comeback as the Chippewas stunned Ball State, 45-44, in a Mid-American Conference game at the Cardinals' Scheumann Stadium.

It was CMU's fifth victory in its last six starts as it improved to 7-4, 5-2 MAC after winning just one game in 2018.

The Chippewas overcame a 17-point deficit late in the third quarter. They turned the ball over on three consecutive second-quarter possessions in falling into a 20-3 deficit. It was the first of three times they would trail by 17 on the day.

"Signature wins sometimes happen when adversity hits," said CMU coach Jim McElwain, whose team was picked to finish last in the MAC West. "We had a lot of it today. For a team that was picked dead last, as this group was, to be where they're at right now, credit goes to those players."

The Chippewas got 356 passing yards from quarterback Quinten Dormady and 105 rushing yards and four touchdowns from Jonathan Ward in keeping their MAC West Division title hopes alive.

CMU trailed 41-24 when Ward scored on a 1-yard run with just over a minute to play in the third quarter, cutting the deficit to 41-31. The Chippewas drew to 41-38 when Lazzaro scored on a 5-yard run with 13:10 to play.

After a Ball State field goal made it 44-38, the Chippewas drove 72 yards in 10 plays, capped by Lazzaro's 1-yard TD plunge. Ryan Tice's extra point was the difference.

"The message I had the last drive was, 'Let's go be great,'" said Dormady, who completed four passes on the game-winning drive, including an 18-yarder to Ward to convert on third-and-7 from the CMU 31-yard line. "It came down to that. Big games are going to come down to the last drive; you've got to go out and execute and we did that."

"To come back from three turnovers in the first half and then win it on the last drive, and the defense goes out and gets a big stop. That's huge."

CMU linebacker Troy Brown intercepted Ball State's final fourth-down desperation pass with 31 seconds remaining to ice it.

MOUNT PLEASANT, MICH. – CMU dominated an old nemesis on Friday, hammering Toledo 49-7 at Kelly/Shorts Stadium to improve to 8-4 and finish atop the West at 6-2 for its first outright divisional championship since 2009.

“What we accomplished today,” CMU senior linebacker Michael Oliver said, “I waited four years to do. It’s a great feeling right now. A great, great feeling.”

It is yet another amazing milestone for the Chippewas under first-year coach Jim McElwain, who took over the program a year ago after it had won just one game in 2018.

The Chippewas scored on all five of their first-half possessions for a 35-7 halftime lead in ending a nine-game losing streak against Toledo, the team that was picked to win the MAC West.

It was CMU’s third-consecutive victory and its sixth in its last seven starts. CMU won all six of its home games this season, becoming the first Chippewa team to go 6-0 at Kelly/Shorts since 1980.

CMU finished with 552 yards in total offense in its most-lopsided victory over the Rockets since a 44-0 win in 1977. CMU finished with 30 first downs to the Rockets’ 15, and it held Toledo to 83 rushing yards.

The Rockets entered the game averaging a MAC-best 237.4 yards per game rushing.

The Chippewas dominated from the opening kickoff as Kobe Lewis ran for 131 yards and two touchdowns on 22 carries, and Jonathan Ward had 88 and a TD on 13 attempts. CMU finished with 289 yards on the ground, an average of 6.1 per carry.

Dormady completed 15 of 19 pass attempts for 250 yards and two scores.

His first TD pass went for 48 yards to a wide-open Tyrone Scott less than six minutes into the game, and the Chippewas were on their way.

Quarterback Tommy Lazzaro ran for two TDs and Ward and Lewis both scored on short runs as CMU held a 28-point halftime lead. Dormady connected with Tony Poljan for a 9-yard TD pass in the third quarter and Lewis capped the scoring with an 8-yard TD run midway through the fourth quarter.

DETROIT, MICH. – Central Michigan's worst-to-first dream season came up short on Saturday as the Chippewas fell to Miami (Ohio) in the Mid-American Conference Championship Game, 26-21, at Ford Field.

CMU, which won just one game in 2018, was the most-improved team in college football in '19, winning six of its final seven regular-season games to capture its first outright MAC West Division title and earn its first bid to the league championship game since 2009.

"I know one thing, as I told the guys in the locker room, I probably have never been more proud of a group that I've been associated with in my coaching career," first-year CMU coach Jim McElwain said. "What they did is just short of amazing."

"Obviously, we didn't finish it the way we would like to. And yet, at the end of the day, as I told them, let's all hold our heads up. Let's be proud to be Chippewas. Let's learn from it. ... Just really proud of these players and they mean so much to us."

CMU led 14-10 at halftime but was outscored 16-7 in the final two quarters. Miami's Sam SLOMAN kicked three field goals in the fourth quarter to keep the Chippewas at bay.

The Chippewas failed to produce the offensive fireworks which had become part of their identity during the regular season, and they could not sustain much offensive traction, particularly on the ground.

"I thought they had a great game plan," McElwain said. "Their line movement, how they play, (is something that) has given us troubles all year. I thought up front they did a really good job handling what we were trying to do. They just beat us."

"We're a lot better when we get a couple of (explosive plays) and they sure took them away."

Miami (8-5), which won its first MAC title since 2010, held CMU to 99 yards rushing.

Tommy Lazzaro led the Chippewas with 48 yards rushing and two touchdowns, and quarterback Quinten Dormady completed 26 of 41 passes for 232 yards and a touchdown.

His one interception was a back-breaker as it came on first down with CMU threatening at the Miami 27-yard line, trailing 20-14 with more than 10 minutes remaining.

Miami's Maurice Thomas returned the opening kickoff 98 yards to set up the RedHawks' first score, a 1-yard Jaylon Bester plunge.

CMU got a 21-yard TD run from Lazzaro and an 11-yard Dormady-to-Ty Scott TD pass in building its 14-10 halftime lead.

California Raisin Bowl

San Jose 48, CMU 24

The Central Michigan University Chippewas played in their first Division I bowl game in 1990 – California Raisin Bowl X.

San Jose State defeated CMU, 48-24, in Fresno.

CMU entered the game as one of the top defenses in the nation, allowing only 8.9 points per game during the season. The Chippewa defense would be tested as it faced a powerful San Jose State offense in quarterback Ralph Martini and running back Sheldon Canley.

The only scoring in the first quarter would come on the opening drive as San Jose scored on a 5-yard run by Canley.

The Spartans added a field goal after pinning CMU deep in its own territory and forcing the Chippewas to punt from the end zone. A surprise on-side kick attempt by San Jose then failed, and the Chippewas started a drive at the CMU 45-yard line. On the first play of that drive, Jeff Bender hit Ken Ealy along the sideline for a 55-yard touchdown. Central then had a great opportunity to take the lead when San Jose fumbled the kickoff at its own 14-yard line. However, on a fourth-and-1 at the 5-yard line, tailback Billy Smith was stopped for a loss of 1 yard. San Jose would manage to put 16 more points on the board in the quarter to take a 26-7 halftime lead.

After a CMU field goal early in the third quarter, Canley added two more rushing touchdowns and one receiving to give San Jose a 48-10 lead early in the fourth. Bender and Ealy later connected for touchdown strikes of 48 and 17 yards after the outcome had already been decided. Canley was named San Jose's game MVP, and Ealy earned the honor for CMU.

Las Vegas Bowl III marked the second time in 1994 that the Central Michigan University Chippewas and the University of Nevada-Las Vegas Rebels met. The Chippewas won the earlier contest 35-23 in Mount Pleasant.

CMU could not capture the second meeting as the Chippewas fell to the Rebels, 52-24.

CMU entered the bowl game on a high note after defeating Bowling Green in a winner-take-all game for the MAC title. In preparing for the bowl game, however, All-American tailback Brian Pruitt suffered a bruised knee and was unable to play in the second battle with UNLV.

The Rebels jumped out to an early lead, scoring on their first two possessions. A Brad Blasy 20-yard field goal put CMU on the scoreboard with 3:44 left in the first quarter. On the last play of the quarter, Erik Timpf hit Terrance McMillan with a 53-yard touchdown pass, cutting the UNLV lead to 14-10.

The second quarter belonged to UNLV as three CMU turnovers resulted in 17 Rebels points. UNLV took a 31-10 lead into the locker room at halftime. The CMU offense struggled in the third quarter as starting quarterback Timpf was forced out of the game with an injury. The Chippewas were held scoreless while UNLV added two touchdowns.

The Rebels expanded the lead to 52-10 by scoring on the first possession of the fourth quarter. Chad Darnell then threw a 24-yard TD pass to Terrance McMillan with 8:10 left in the game. Damon Tolbert added a four-yard rushing TD with 1:33 left in the game before it ended, 52-24.

The Central Michigan University Chippewas won their first Division I-A bowl game in impressive fashion, and picked up their second victory at Ford Field in less than a month with a resounding 31-14 triumph over Middle Tennessee State in the Motor City Bowl in Detroit, Mich.

A Motor City Bowl-record crowd of 54,113, most of them clad in maroon and gold, saw CMU score touchdowns on its first two offensive possessions to grab a 14-0 lead less than 10 minutes into the game.

Ontario Sneed scored on a 1-yard run and on a 29-yard pass from redshirt freshman quarterback Dan LeFevour, the first of two scoring strikes from the record-setting Chippewa signal-caller.

After MTSU narrowed the lead to 14-7 on a touchdown run by Eugene Gross, LeFevour needed only 35 seconds to put CMU back up by two scores, capping a quick scoring drive with a 9-yard TD run of his own. CMU led, 21-7, at the half.

The defense took care of putting the game away early in the third quarter. Senior defensive end Dan Bazuin, who was named the game's UAW Most Outstanding Lineman, hit MTSU quarterback Clint Marks, forcing a wobbly pass that was easily intercepted by CMU linebacker Doug Kress. Kress raced up the left sideline and went 56 yards with the return for a touchdown, bumping the lead to 28-7 and burying MTSU's hopes for a comeback.

LeFevour was the Motor City Bowl MVP, going 16-of-26 for 162 yards and a TD through the air and adding another 69 yards and a score on 15 carries on the ground.

Bazuin led the defense with a pair of sacks among his eight tackles, while Kress and Red Keith both had nine tackles for CMU.

Chris Summers' 40-yard field goal on the final play lifted Purdue to a 51-48 win over CMU in the highest scoring Motor City Bowl in history.

An MCB record crowd of 60,624 took in an offensive shootout that featured 1,022 yards of offense and saw the Chippewas twice tie the score after trailing by 21 points three times.

Dan LeFevour hit Bryan Anderson for a 19-yard touchdown with 1:09 remaining. Andrew Aguila's point-after evened the score at 48-48.

Curtis Painter then completed 4-of-5 passes to set up the game-winning kick.

Nick Bellore, who finished with a game-high 11 tackles, intercepted a pass on the game's opening possession that led to a 27-yard Aguila field goal and a 3-0 CMU lead just over two minutes into the contest.

The Boilermakers scored on six straight possessions to close the first half. CMU, meanwhile, mustered a 47-yard field goal and a 49-yard scoring pass from LeFevour to Anderson and trailed 34-13 at halftime.

Antonio Brown scored on a 76-yard catch-and-run on the second play of the third quarter, but Painter threw a scoring pass to Jake Standeford with 12:53 remaining in the period.

LeFevour threw a 10-yard TD pass to Anderson and scored on runs of 9 and 4 yards to tie the score at 41 with 10 seconds left in the third quarter.

Purdue went back in front on Jaycen Taylor's 13-yard run with 8:19 left.

CMU took over on its own 34-yard line with 2:15 left. Facing third-and-16 from the 28, LeFevour hit Duane Brooks for 24 yards, Anderson for 13 yards, ran for 16 yards and connected with Anderson for 19 yards in succession to draw the Chippewas even on the scoreboard for the final time.

Rusty Smith threw for 306 yards and two touchdowns to lead Florida Atlantic to a 24-21 win in the Motor City Bowl.

Smith threw touchdown passes of 52 yards to Chris Bonner and 18 yards to Cortez Gent to give the Owls a 24-13 lead after the game was tied 10-10 at halftime.

The Chippewas drew within 24-21 on a 15-yard touchdown pass from Dan LeFevour to Antonio Brown and two-point conversion pass from LeFevour to Kito Poblah with 3:09 left. FAU, however, recovered the onside-kick and picked up three first downs to erase the clock.

Nick Bellore recovered a Smith fumble on the Owls' second possession to set up the Chippewas at their own 42-yard line, but LeFevour was intercepted on the next snap. Dilvory Edgecomb scored on a 1-yard dive six plays later to give FAU a 7-0 lead.

After the teams traded punts, CMU covered 75 yards in eight plays to tie the score. Poblah made a one-handed catch of a LeFevour throw for the score.

Brown's 29-yard punt return on the ensuing possession set up a 35-yard Andrew Aguila field goal that gave the Chippewas a 10-7 lead with 9:30 left in the half. Ross Gornall tied the score with a 36-yard field goal in the half's final minute.

The Chippewas punted to open the second half, and FAU went in front for good on the following possession. A roughing the passer penalty on third-and-5 extended the drive, and on the next snap Smith hit Bonner with a 52-yard scoring toss.

CMU drove inside Florida Atlantic's 20-yard line on the next possession, but had to settle for a 33-yard Aguila field goal.

Florida Atlantic was forced to punt, and Brown turned a reverse into a 72-yard touchdown on the final play of the third quarter that momentarily gave the Chippewas the lead. An offsides penalty against FAU and a facemasking penalty against CMU negated the play, and CMU eventually had to punt. Smith's touchdown pass to Gent nine plays after the punt gave FAU a double-digit lead with 10:17 left.

CMU then drove to the FAU 1-yard line, but a penalty and two incompletions ended the threat. The CMU defense forced a three-and-out to set up LeFevour's touchdown pass to Brown, but it was as close as the Chippewas would get.

The school-record tying 38th victory by Central Michigan's senior class may have been its most memorable.

Senior quarterback Dan LeFevour threw for a career-high 395 yards, and a trio of clutch special teams plays lifted the No. 25 Chippewas to a 44-41 double-overtime victory over Troy.

Andrew Aguila's school-record fifth field goal--a 37-yarder in the second overtime--capped a comeback that saw the Chippewas rally from a 12-point fourth-quarter deficit.

A game that featured two of the top statistical offenses in the country turned into a defensive slugfest in the first half. Levi Brown's 9-yard scoring pass to DuJuan Harris was the only touchdown in the first 30 minutes, and Troy took a 10-9 lead into halftime.

CMU's only punt of the game opened the fourth quarter, and Troy appeared to have taken control of the game when Harris scored on a 1-yard run with 8:01 remaining. His score stretched the Troy lead to 31-19.

Brown returned the ensuing kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown to jump-start the Chippewas' rally.

CMU regained possession at its own 15-yard line with 4:22 remaining, and LeFevour directed one of the most memorable drives of his career to give the Chippewas the lead. He hit Brown for 27 yards on second-and-15, Brown for 8 yards on third-and-2, Cody Wilson for 7 yards on third-and-4 and Brown again for 30 yards on the next snap before connecting with Bryan Anderson on a 4-yard touchdown pass. LeFevour then tossed a two-point conversion pass to Kito Poblah to give CMU a 34-31 lead with 1:17 remaining.

Jernigan returned the kickoff 32 yards to the Troy 37-yard line, and Brown completed a pair of passes to move the Trojans to the CMU 29-yard line. Michael Taylor's 46-yard field goal with 31 seconds remaining forced overtime.

CMU needed just three plays to score in the first overtime period. LeFevour rushed for no gain, threw to Anderson for 12 yards and scrambled for a 13-yard touchdown to put the Chippewas in front.

Brown hit Jason Bruce for 18 yards on third-and-5 from the 20-yard line on Troy's first possession, and two plays later Shawn Southward tied the score on a 1-yard run.

Troy's offense remained on the field to begin the second overtime period. After stalling the Chippewas' 14-yard line, and Taylor lined up for a 31-yard field goal attempt. CMU's Vince Agnew raced untouched around Troy's right end and blocked the field goal attempt, giving the Chippewas an opportunity to win the game.

Three-yard runs by Brown and Bryan Schroeder moved the ball to the Troy 19-yard line, and Aguila booted the game-winning field goal from 37 yards out.

LeFevour was named the GMAC Bowl Most Valuable Player. Brown was selected offensive MVP, Agnew defensive MVP and Aguila special teams MVP.

Quarterback Ryan Radcliff threw a perfect strike to senior receiver Cody Wilson midway through the fourth quarter and Central Michigan's defense got a late fourth down stop to lead the Chippewas to a 24-21 victory over Western Kentucky to win the 2012 Little Caesars Pizza Bowl.

Radcliff was named the game's Most Valuable Player while junior linebacker Shamari Benton was named the Outstanding Lineman. Benton led CMU in tackles for the seventh time this season, recording nine.

The winning touchdown came on a second and goal with 5:11 left in the game. Radcliff threaded the needle between two WKU defenders to find Wilson in the corner of the end zone. The senior signal caller finished the game 19-of-29 for 253 yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions while Wilson had 10 catches for 101 yards and the one touchdown.

After CMU scored, the Hilltoppers drove the ball down to the CMU 19-yard line where they faced a fourth and two with 51 seconds remaining. Western Kentucky ran a play-action pass to tight end Jack Doyle, but he was blanketed by CMU defenders and the pass fell incomplete. CMU then ran out the clock.

CMU's winning touchdown drive began at the WKU 26-yard line after a blocked punt by junior safety Avery Cunningham. The blocked punt capped off a string of controversial plays that began with a reversal of a Zurlon Tipton touchdown. The officials first ruled that Tipton had scored on a one-yard drive on fourth down but the replay official reversed the call. That gave the Hilltoppers the ball at the CMU half-yard line. CMU's defense tightened up, allowing just two yards to force a three-and-out. Cunningham blocked the punt after a low snap and the Chippewas were in business.

Central Michigan got off to a fast start after Radcliff connected on a 69-yard touchdown strike to redshirt freshman receiver Andrew Flory at 10:54 of the first quarter. Western Kentucky answered with a six-yard quarterback run by Kawaun Jakes after he connected with Rico Brown for 70 yards on a trick play on the first offensive play of the game for the Hilltoppers.

CMU responded with another Radcliff-to-Flory touchdown connection, this time from 29 yards out with 5:46 to go in the first quarter. After three straight punts, CMU got the running game going as Tipton had 40 yards on a drive that led to a 50-yard Davis Harman field goal, making it 17-7 CMU. The field goal set the CMU bowl record and tied the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl mark.

CMU's special teams played an important part in the victory. Junior punter Richie Hogan averaged 57.3 yards per punt including a bowl-record 82-yard boot in the first quarter. CMU also limited WKU's Antonio Andrews to just 40 kick return yards and four yards on punt returns. Andrews entered the game leading the FBS in all-purpose yards and was within reach to break Barry Sanders' NCAA record all-purpose yards but was held short of the record by CMU.

Cooper Rush threw a Football Bowl Subdivision-record seven touchdowns passes including five in the fourth quarter as Central Michigan came nearly all the way back from a 35-point deficit before falling to Western Kentucky, 49-48, in the inaugural Popeyes Bahamas Bowl at Thomas A. Robinson Stadium.

The game wasn't decided until Rush's two-point conversion pass to Jesse Kroll fell incomplete, one play after the Chippewas drew to 49-48 on a dazzling 75-yard pass play – triggered with just 1 second remaining – during which four CMU receivers touched the ball and Titus Davis won a footrace to the pylon against several Western Kentucky defenders.

Western Kentucky dominated and scored at will behind quarterback Brandon Doughty and a bevy of talented receivers. The Hilltoppers were in front, 42-14, at halftime, and 49-14 after three quarters.

Rush started CMU's thrilling fourth quarter with a 12-yard TD pass to Davis with 11:37 to play. Just over four minutes later, the same duo delivered again, this time on a 23-yard TD pass, cutting it to 49-28.

With 3:06 left, Rush found Courtney Williams for a 10-yard TD pass, shrinking the Chippewa deficit to 49-35. Less than two minutes later, Anthony Garland scored on a short pass, making it 49-42, setting the stage for Ron Coluzzi's onside kick, which the Hilltoppers covered at the CMU 43.

With just 1:09 left, all WKU had to do was gain a first down and run out the clock. The Chippewas burned their remaining two timeouts and senior defensive tackle Leterrius stuffed Leon Allen for no gain on third-and-10, forcing a punt.

The punt went for a touchback and WKU was penalized on the play, putting the ball on the CMU 25 with 1 second remaining and setting the stage for all the fireworks.

Rush dropped to pass and heaved the ball 50 yards to a leaping Kroll at the WKU 30-yard line. Kroll then lateraled to Deon Butler. A falling Butler fumbled the ball in the direction of the trailing Williams, who scooped it up, took a few frantic steps, then lateraled to Davis who did the rest.

Rush completed 28 of 45 pass attempts for 493 yards. His attempts, completions, yardage and TD passes were all career highs, and his seven TD passes is a school record and ties a Mid-American Conference record, and the 493 passing yards broke the school mark set by Brian Brunner against Indiana in 2008.

Central Michigan was held to a season-low 249 total yards Monday as the Chippewas fell to Minnesota, 21-14, in the Quick Lane Bowl before 34,217 at Ford Field.

CMU finished 7-6 in John Bonamego's first year as the Chippewas' coach, and it brought to an end an emotional season for the entire program.

Freshman Romello Ross ran for 100 yards and a touchdown on 19 carries to lead a CMU offense that, outside of two scoring drives, struggled to find its footing.

"It was pretty well-documented that they have a very good secondary," Bonamego said. "I think that was the strength of their defense. We thought we moved the ball against them pretty well. We stalled a few drives, got in some long-yardage situations, but they're a good defense and a talented defense."

CMU quarterback Cooper Rush completed 15 of 29 attempts for 145 yards. All three numbers were season lows for the junior who entered the game having thrown for a CMU single-season record 3,703 yards.

His one interception was extremely costly. With CMU trailing 21-14 and facing a third-and-7 at the Minnesota 42, Rush was pressured and falling when he let a pass go. It was intercepted by Briean Boddy-Calhoun at the Gopher 35 with just over 2 minutes to play.

That ended CMU's last legitimate chance to tie the game.

"Just trying to make a play," Rush said. "Looking back I probably should have just ate it."

Ross gave the Chippewas a 14-13 lead when he fought his way into the end zone on a bullish 13-yard run early in the fourth quarter. That capped a four-play, 56-yard drive.

Minnesota (6-7) responded with a 13-play, 74-yard drive that ended with quarterback Mitch Leidner dashing 13 yards for a TD. Leidner found KJ Maye on the two-point conversion pass and Minnesota was back in front with 6:36 left.

Tulsa rolled up 581 total yards, as it routed the Chippewas, 55-10, at Marlins Park in the 2016 Miami Beach Bowl.

The loss ended CMU's season at 6-7, its first sub-.500 season since 2011.

Tulsa (10-3) entered the game averaging 522.8 yards per game. It built a 27-3 halftime lead, then hit the gas in the second half and scored nearly at will.

Central Michigan quarterback Cooper Rush, vying to become the all-time Mid-American Conference leader in passing yardage, finished with 241 yards. He needed to throw for 253 yards to supplant former Chippewa Dan LeFevour atop the list.

Rush, a senior from Lansing, finished his four-year career as the CMU starter with 12,894 yards and 90 touchdown passes.

Tulsa quarterback Dane Evans completed 28 of 38 pass attempts for 304 yards and five touchdowns and was named the game's most valuable player.

CMU simply could not match Tulsa's high-octane and quick-paced offensive attack, which produced 34 first downs. The Golden Hurricane never huddled on offense and the Chippewas never forced a punt all game long.

Jahray Hayes scored CMU's lone touchdown on a 13-yard run in the fourth quarter, long after the game had been decided. Brian Eavey kicked a 26-yard field goal to account for the Chippewas' other points.

Central Michigan made a living forcing turnovers this season. On Friday, the Chippewas found out what it is like to be on the other side, and the consequences were devastating.

CMU gave the ball away a season-high eight times in falling to Wyoming, 37-14, before 16,512 in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl at Albertsons Stadium. The Chippewas finished 8-5 and saw their win streak end at five games.

The eight wins is CMU's highest total since 2009, but that didn't ease the sting of a fourth consecutive bowl loss.

Wyoming intercepted CMU quarterback Shane Morris three times, sacked him five times, and the Chippewa fumbled the ball away five times. Twenty-three of Wyoming's points – two TDs and three field goals – came after CMU turnovers.

Cowboy quarterback Josh Allen, projected to be a top-five pick in the NFL Draft in April, was as efficient as he needed to be, completing 11 of 19 passes for 154 yards. He threw three touchdown passes, all in the first quarter, to stake the Cowboys to a 21-7 lead.

CMU's defense surrendered just three field goals over the final three quarters, but the Chippewas offense could not produce consistently against a Wyoming defense that came into the game ranked 21st in the country.

"They have a great defense," CMU senior tight end Tyler Conklin said. "They did a good job. We didn't make the plays we should have made."

Yohanna Ghaifan sacked CMU quarterback Shane Morris, forcing a fumble, and Carl Granderson scooped up the ball and raced 58 yards for a TD early in the fourth quarter to make it 37-14 and snuff out CMU's last hope.

Jonathan Ward finished with a combined 138 yards in rushing and receiving and scored two touchdowns to lead CMU. He took a short pass from quarterback Shane Morris and turned it into a 74-yard TD that kept the Chippewas in the game in the first quarter. He later scored on a 3-yard run.

The Chippewas' final yardage total, 364, looked respectable, but the five sacks, the six turnovers and 61 yards in penalties were more than enough to keep the Chippewas from mounting a serious threat.
