Both teams currently boast .500 records and have yet to play any common opponents. SDSU, which begins a three-game homestand Saturday, earned the victory over WSU a year ago, 63-56, in Pullman.

SDSU Women's Hoops Returns For Start Of A Three-Game Homestand

The San Diego State women's basketball team looks to bounce back from a 74-55 loss to Nevada Tuesday, as it opens a three-game homestand against Pac-10 member Washington State at 2 p.m. in Peterson Gym.

The Aztecs are unbeaten at home thus far, claiming victories over Cal State Stanislaus and Northern Colorado last week. SDSU (2-2) defeated Washington State, which will bring a 3-3 record into Saturday's contest, last season, 63-56, in a game which saw the two sides combine for 70 free-throw attempts in Pullman, Wash.

Aztecs Fall To Nevada, 74-55

The San Diego State women's basketball team got off to a quick start, but was unable to match a hot shooting performance by Nevada, as the Aztecs dropped a Tuesday evening non-conference contest to the host Wolf Pack, 74-55, at the Lawlor Events Center in Reno, Nev. The loss snapped a two-game SDSU win streak, dropping the Aztecs to an even 2-2 on the season, while Nevada improved to 3-3 overall, with all three wins coming on its home court.

SDSU sophomore Jessica Huettl (Eau Claire, Wis.) led the team with a season-best 14 points. including a 4-for-6 performance from beyond the arc. Junior Michelle Strawberry (Corona, Calif.) also finished in double-figure scoring for the first time this season, tallying 11 points and a career high six assists. Freshman Ashley Cheesman (Orem, Utah) was first on the team in rebounds for the fourth straight outing, finishing with eight for the Aztecs, who shot 30.5 percent from the field and committed 20 turnovers.

The Aztecs began the game with the hot hand, jumping out to a nine-point advantage at 13-4 on a lay-up by Lindsey Casey (Odessa, Texas) at the 16:22 mark. Nevada responded with a 14-2 run to take an 18-15 lead, before Huettl ended the dry spell with a three-pointer to knot the score at 18-18. The Wolf Pack, which ended up shooting 57 percent from the field in the first half, would break the tie and take advantage of the Aztecs' 13-first half turnovers to head into the locker room up by 11 points at 35-24.

The Wolf Pack continued its momentum into the second half, as SDSU managed just four points to Nevada's 17 with the deficit growing to as many as 24 points at 52-28. The Aztecs then put together a run of its own, beginning with a pair of free throws by Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas) and continuing with two straight baskets by freshman Marin McCue (Calgary, Alberta).

The Aztec deficit fluctuated between 17 and 19 points, before dwindling it down to as few as 15 points on two occasions, including at 64-49, when Courtney Fritz (Newberg, Ore.) made three straight foul shots with 3:34 remaining.

The 15 points would be as close as SDSU would get, as Nevada earned its first win in the three-game series, 74-52.

Other Nevada Notes:

SDSU is 2-2 to start a season for the second time in the three-year Jim Tomey era ... the Aztecs are 0-2 on the road and against teams they faced a year ago ... SDSU has led during some point in each of its four games ... the Aztecs did not record a block after tallying 13 through their first three contests ... the only time SDSU was held without a block a year ago was at Washington State on Dec. 22 ... the home team has come out victorious in each of the three alltime games between the two schools.

Fritz, Jackson To Miss Rest Of Season Due To Injury

San Diego State women's basketball players Courtney Fritz and Erin Jackson (Sparks, Nev.) will miss the remainder of the 2004-05 season due to injury, Aztec head coach Jim Tomey announced Friday. In addition, sophomore quard/forward Michelle Elliott (Pasco, Wash.) is expected to be out the next two to three weeks with an injury to her right knee.

"We feel horrible about the injuries to our three returning players," Tomey said. "Their experience and on-court leadership will be hard to replace, but I think we're going to be up for the challenge. This will be an excellent opportunity for the rest of the team, including some of our younger players, to step up and play a more significant role."

Both in their sophomore campaigns, Fritz tore her anterior cruciate ligament in her right knee in the second half of the Aztecs' game at Nevada on Tuesday evening, while Jackson will have ankle reconstruction surgery to repair a subluxing peroneal tendon in her left ankle, which she suffered during pre-game warm-ups prior to the team's contest versus Northern Colorado last Saturday.

Fritz will have surgery to repair the ACL in San Diego the last week in December with at least five months of rehabilitation to follow. A year ago, she was an honorable mention all-Mountain West Conference selection, averaging 10 points per game and tallying 63 three-pointers to rank fourth in Aztec history. This season, Fritz started all four contests and averaged 9.0 points per game.

Jackson will also have season-ending surgery at the end of the month in her home state of Nevada. Her injury is similar to the one Boston Red Sox pitcher Curt Schilling suffered this past

year. The injury involves the peroneal tendons - tendons that allow the foot to flex and turn. The sheath that covers the tendons becomes torn, allowing one or both to pop in and out, rubbing against the bone.

Jackson, who will be out approximately five months, has seen action in all four games this season, but has only been able to play a combined three minutes in the last two outings.

Elliott is expected to miss the next two to three weeks with a contusion and a non-displaced lateral tibial plateau fracture in her right knee. A third team all-conference pick a year ago, she suffered the injury in the team's win over Cal State Stanislaus on Nov. 30.

Elliott sat out the Dec. 4, game against Northern Colorado and played three minutes at Nevada on Dec. 7, scoring two points and adding an assist and two steals.

With the injuries, SDSU will be down to just nine eligible players on its 2004-05 roster. Of the nine, five are in their first seasons playing at the NCAA Division I level.

Depth Is The Key

On Tuesday night, sophomore Jessica Huettl and junior Michelle Strawberry became the sixth and seventh Aztecs to finish a game in double-figure scoring so far this year. Michelle Elliott and Courtney Fritz have each scored in double-figures twice, while Lindsey Casey, Ashley Cheesman and Kate Eveland have done so on one occasion.

To further accentuate the SDSU's depth in 2004-05, three different players have led the team in scoring in each of the last three outings. The Aztecs have also had five different players finish with a team game-high in assists (Elliott and Fritz tied with three assists apiece at USD).

A Rain Of Threes

San Diego State has attempted 20 or more three-pointers in each of its first four games, including a school-record 27 in a victory against Northern Colorado last Saturday. The Aztecs have 3-Point Field Goals made at least five threes in every contest. 1. Jamey Cox (2000-03)

Christopher Holland (Arizona State, 2000) third year

So far this season, the Aztecs have attempted 90 threes, making 26 of them. Last season's squad posted a pair of school records with 130 three-pointers on 418 attempts.

More On The Three

Eight different players have attempted threes this year with seven converting on at least one opportunity ... SDSU is second in the Mountain West

Conference in three-pointers made per game (6.50) ... sophomore Courtney Fritz finished the year with 69 threes in 32 career games, ranking fourth in Aztec history ... Sophomore Michelle Elliott is 10th in Aztec history with 40 career threes.

From The Line

One of the biggest improvements so far this season for SDSU has been its performance at the free-throw line. The Aztecs hit 75 percent (12-for-16) of their free throws at Nevada, following an 86.7 percent (13-for-15) outing against Northern Colorado last Saturday. The team's freethrow performance against the Bears is SDSU's best since making 88.9 (8-for-9) percent from the stripe on Nov. 25, 2000, versus Tennessee-Chattanooga.

For the season, San Diego State has made 72.5 percent of its free throws (58-for-80) compared to just 63.4 percent a year ago. The last time an Aztec squad finished the season with a free-throw percentage above 70 percent was 1998-89 (.742).

The Aztecs continue to lead the conference in steals per game (10.75) and turnover margin (+4.50) ... Lindsey Casey is second in blocks per game (1.75) and third in field-goal percentage (.556) ... Jessica Huettl is second in three-pointers per game (2.25) and tied for third in three-point field goal percentage (.500) ... Courtney Fritz is third in free-throw percentage (.909).

Plaving In The Pete

Due to the San Diego Slam men's basketball tournament at Cox Arena, the SDSU women's basketball team returns to its old home, Peterson Gym, for the second year in a row.

Last season, the Aztecs played two games at Peterson, beating Air Force on a last-second shot and nearly upsetting New Mexico. Prior to that, the last time SDSU played at Peterson Gym was in 1996-97

Peterson Gym served as the home of the Aztecs since the program's inception in 1976. The team's all-time record in the building is 203-87 (.700), including a 58-9 mark in the last five full campaigns. SDSU was a perfect 13-0 in Peterson in 1995-96, and had a nine-game winning streak in the building, before falling to the Lobos in 2004.

The facility, which opened in May 1961, is named after former athletic director and coach C.E. Peterson.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over Washington State will mean:

- ▶SDSU is 3-2 to start a year for the third time in the last four seasons.
- ▶SDSU has won its first three home games to start a season for the first time since 1995-96, when the team was a perfect 13-0, en route to a 20-8 overall record.
- ▶The three victories are just one shy of the team's win total at home all of last season when the Aztecs went 4-10.
- The Aztecs earn their first win of the season over a school which they also faced a year ago.
- ▶SDSU improves to 49-68 all-time against Pac-10 schools and owns a .500 record or better versus six of the nine Pac-10 members it has faced.

Washington State Tid-Bits

Washington State boasts a 3-3 overall record with wins over Boise State (61-48), Saint Mary's (70-58) and Portland State (69-39) ... the Cougars are led by sophomore guard Adriane Ferguson, who averages 14.4 points per game and has hit 11 threes ... sophomore forward Kate Benz is second on the team in scoring with 11.8 ppg., and first in rebounding with 7.8 per contest ... the Cougars were 6-22 a year ago and 2-16 in the Pac-10 ... Saturday's game pits a pair

of coaches in their third seasons at their respective schools ... SDSU's meeting with Washington State is only its second against a Pac-10 school since playing California on Nov. 18, 2001 ... last year's victory was the Aztecs' first over a Pac-10 school since beating Cal on Dec. 22, 2000 ... It was the first win at a Pac-10 school since a 67-66 victory at USC on Dec. 6, 1995, a span of six games.

Flashback: Versus Washington State, 2003

The San Diego State women's basketball team held on to claim a 63-56 victory at Washington State in a non-conference game at Friel Court on Dec. 22, 2003.

Three Aztec finished in double-figures, including Washington native Michelle Elliott, who had 11 points before fouling out, and sophomore Michelle Strawberry, who tallied a career-high 13 points.

The Aztecs led by as many as 14 points in the first half, but the advantage would whittle down to three points at 25-28 as WSU went on a 15-4 run in the final three and a half minutes heading into the locker room.

The Cougars continued their momentum into the second half, taking their first lead since the opening point with a 4-0 run at 29-28. The Aztecs retook the lead on their next trip down the court and were up by nine at 54-45 at the 5:48 mark.

The last few minutes of the game turned into a

Other 2004-05 SDSU Highlights So Far

- ▶The Aztecs' 80 points against Cal State Stanislaus are the team's most in 61 contests since scoring 83 in a win over Air Force on Feb. 21, 2002.
- ▶SDSU had 16 steals in its victory over Cal State Stanislaus,the Aztecs most in a game since tallying 17 on two occasions during the 2002-03 season.
- ▶SDSU trailed Cal State Stanislaus by 11 points, its biggest deficit in a victory since beating Air Force, 73-55, on Feb. 1, 2003. In that game, the Aztecs fell behind 14-2 to the Falcons at the 15:01 mark of the first half, but later went on to lead by as many as 23 points.

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Jim Tomey announced the signings Nov. 15, of three high school seniors, including two San Diego-area natives, to national letters of intent. Guard Lasandra Dixon (Azusa, Calif./Azusa HS), center Audrey Green (San Marcos, Calif./San Marcos HS) and point guard Tamika Lipford (Oceanside, Calif./The Bishop's School) will join the Aztecs in the fall of 2005.

"We tried really hard to improve our team speed, size and physical strength with this year's signees," said Tomey about his third recruiting class at SDSU. "Tamika and Lasandra are quick, explosive guards, who have the ability to push the basketball up the floor and defend 94 feet. Audrey brings a nice package of skills and is someone who we know down the road will be a real force for us in the middle."

Green and Lipford are the first players from the San Diego-area to sign with the Aztecs since Tomey took over as head coach in time for the 2002-03 campaign. The duo also will be the first local players on the SDSU roster since Sophia Sledge (Santee, Calif./Santana HS), who finished out her career in 2001-02.
