**S**an Diego State made it known early on that it was a force to be reckoned with on a national scale in 2013-14. After being picked to finish in fourth place in the Mountain West preseason poll and not earning any points in either of the major top-25 polls, the Aztecs opened the season with a 21-1 record, which included 20 consecutive wins and three victories over nationally ranked teams away from home, and vaulted into the top-5. SDSU later went on to claim the MW regular-season crown before advancing to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA tournament.

## A Look at the 2013-14 Aztecs

The 2013-14 campaign was painted by outsiders as a rebuilding year, but it was anything but that. The players knew all along, and said it publicly plenty of times, that they were going to be good.

It was, however, not a stretch of the imagination that 2013-14 would be a bridge year to 2014-15 when San Diego State would welcome a top-15 recruiting class and a high-profile transfer. Consider: the Aztecs lost three starters, which included an NBA Draft pick and All-American (Jamaal Franklin), a four-year and 1,000-point scorer (Chase Tapley), and a player who saw action in every game in his two seasons on The Mesa (DeShawn Stephens). SDSU also lost a three-year letterwinner who was a part-time starter in James Rahon. In total, the Aztecs lost eight letterwinners from a 23-11 team that reached the third round of the NCAA tournament.

Despite outside low expectations, San Diego State quickly put everyone on notice. After its season-opening win vs. UC Riverside, SDSU found itself down just four points with 80 seconds to play against No. 6/5 Arizona before eventually falling by nine. How did the Aztecs respond to the rare home loss? By winning 20 straight games.

San Diego State made its we-are-here statement at the Wooden Legacy where it beat No. 20/18 Creighton and No. 25/rv Marquette in consecutive

outings. Then a little more than a month later, SDSU went into Allen Fieldhouse and beat No. 16/17 Kansas, snapping the Jayhawks' 68-game home winning streak against non-conference foes.

En route to the Mountain West regular-season title, the Aztecs rose to as high as No. 5 in both major top-25 polls and had some thrilling wins along the way. There was the overtime victory at Utah State, which was highlighted by Xavier Thames' career-high 31 points, and the come-from-behind

win at Boise State that featured Dwayne Polee II's game-winning three-pointer with 4.2 seconds left. Then in the regular-season finale, SDSU rallied from a 16-point second-half deficit to beat No. 21/21 New Mexico and claim the MW title.

The Aztecs later reached the title game of the MW championship and was ultimately awarded a 4-seed in the NCAA West Region.

SDSU needed overtime to beat its second-round foe, New Mexico State in Spokane, Wash., before ousting cin-

derella North Dakota State to advance to the Sweet 16 in Anaheim, Calif., for the second time in four seasons.

It was in Orange County that the Aztecs saw their season come to an end as top-seeded Arizona defeated them for the second time despite SDSU leading for more than 32 minutes.

Below are some notes on the 2014 NCAA Sweet 16 squad:

► San Diego State finished the 2013-14 season with a 31-5 record, marking the first time in school history that an Aztec team has recorded nine straight 20-win seasons. SDSU basketball dates back to the 1921-22 campaign.

► The Aztecs extended a school record by winning at least 23 games for the sixth straight year.

► SDSU's 31 victories were the second-most in school history.

► The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament for the fifth straight season, which marked the first time the feat has been accomplished in school history.

► SDSU became one of 17 teams in the nation to make to the Sweet 16 twice in the last four seasons.

► San Diego State became one of 11 teams nationally, and the only team in California, to advance to five straight NCAA tournaments.

► SDSU became one of seven teams in the nation to advance to five straight NCAA tournaments and win at least 23 games in each of those seasons.

► San Diego State was ranked in the *Associated Press* Top-25 Poll for the

final 16 weeks. The Aztecs rose to as high as No. 5 in the nation where they sat for three straight weeks (Jan. 27, Feb. 3, Feb. 10). SDSU ended the regular-season at No. 13.

► SDSU was ranked in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll the final 15 regular-season editions of the rankings. The Aztecs were ranked as high as No. 5 (Jan. 27, Feb. 3, Feb. 10). San Diego State was ranked No. 12 in the postseason coaches poll.

► The Aztecs earned a berth in the NCAA tournament, marking the ninth season in a row in which they participated in postseason play.

► The Aztecs won their Mountain West-leading eighth conference title. It was SDSU's second outright MW championship (2006).

► Last season marked the 10th time a Steve Fisher-coached San Diego State team recorded 20 or more wins.

► SDSU was dominant at home as it went 15-1 inside Viejas Arena. The Aztecs posted their ninth straight season and 13th overall with at least 11 victories at Viejas Arena. SDSU's nine-year total of 127 wins is an arena record.

► The Aztecs defeated four nationally ranked opponents in one season, which set a Division I school record. SDSU defeated No. 20/18 Creighton and No. 25/rv Marquette in Anaheim, Calif., No. 16/17 Kansas on the road, and No. 21/21 New Mexico at home.

► After going 8-0 against schools from the state of California, SDSU improved to 41-0 against programs based in the Golden State. The unblemished record dates back to Dec. 2, 2009.

► Xavier Thames was named the MW Player of the Year and voted to the all-conference first team, defensive team and all-tournament team. The senior became the third Aztec to be named the MW's top player.

► For the third time in four seasons, Steve Fisher was

named Mountain West Coach of the Year. Fisher guided a team that was picked to finish fourth to a 16-2 conference record and regular-season title.

► Prior to the start of the campaign, SDSU sold out the entire home slate, attracting 12,414 fans to each one of its 16 home dates.

► San Diego State matched a single-season attendance record by averaging 12,414 fans (2012-13).

## Thames Earns All-America Honors

Xavier Thames was named a 2014 *Associated Press* Honorable Mention All-American. The award was the first of his career.

Thames is the fourth Aztec in the last four seasons to earn All-America recognition from the AP. Kawhi Leonard was a second-team honoree in 2011 and was followed by Jamaal Franklin, who picked up honorable mention accolades, in 2012 and 2013. Overall, Thames is the 16th player in school history to be an All-American, the eighth to pick up AP honors and the fifth during Steve Fisher's tenure at SDSU.

The MW Player of the Year led San Diego State in nearly every statistical category, including scoring (17.6), assists (3.2), steals (1.6), three-point field-goal percentage (.372), free-throw percentage (.834) and minutes played (31.3), while also pulling down 2.9 rebounds.

In 36 games, all starting assignments, Thames scored in double figures 31 times and broke the 20-point barrier 12 times, including his final three games, which all took place in the NCAA tournament. In three NCAA tournament games, Thames averaged 26.0 points.



Josh Davis averaged 13.7 rebounds in three NCAA tournament games and finished his final collegiate season with averages of 7.7 points and a team-best 10.1 rebounds.

**SAN DIEGO** - San Diego State used a stifling defense and a balanced offensive attack to defeat UC Riverside, 77-41, at a sold-out Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs held the Highlanders to 30.8-percent shooting and just 11.1 percent from beyond the three-point arc. In addition, SDSU forced UC Riverside into 21 turnovers, which ultimately led to 18 Aztec points.

Offensively, San Diego State used all 12 players in uniform with all finding their way into the scoring column led by Xavier Thames' game-high 15.

The senior guard jumpstarted the Aztecs with a three in the opening moments of the game and by scoring seven of SDSU's first nine points as the home side jumped to a 9-2 lead.

The Highlanders answered by scoring five of the game's next seven points in the to cut its deficit to four. The Aztecs, however, went on a 10-0 run to open a 14-point lead and shortly thereafter led by 22 points with 2:38 left before entering the locker room up, 38-13.

After scoring the last five points of the first half, San Diego State used an 8-0 burst to open the second to increase its lead to 46-13. The run was temporarily stopped when Chris Patton knocked down a jumper, but the Aztecs utilized their size and length to keep the Highlanders at a comfortable distance the rest of the way.

SDSU found itself ahead by its largest margin, 43 points, with 4:32 left in regulation before settling for the 36-point victory.

Joining Thames in double figures was newcomer Josh Davis, who posted 11 points and a game-high eight rebounds, and Winston Shepard, who turned in 10 points, six rebounds and a game-high five assists.

Taylor Johns led UCR with 14 points and nine rebounds.

**SAN DIEGO** - San Diego State welcomed the highest-ranked opponent in 11 seasons to Viejas Arena, but was unable to pull the upset as No. 6/5 Arizona escaped with a 69-60 victory.

The Aztecs, who trailed by as many as 14 points in the first half and found themselves down by 11 at half-time, went on a furious rally late in the game and cut their deficit to four points with 1:22 left in the game.

With Arizona ahead 62-58, Nick Johnson attempted a three-pointer that hit nothing. San Diego State, however, could not come up with the rebound and was the last to touch the ball, awarding possession to the visitors. Following a timeout, the Wildcats drew a baseline out-of-bounds plays that resulted a lob dunk by Aaron Gordon on which he was fouled.

Gordon ended up missing the free-throw, but SDSU's Josh Davis' jumper was unsuccessful on the other end and the Aztecs fouled T.J. McConnell. The Arizona point guard made one of two free-throws to put it up 65-58 with 54 seconds left in the game.

The Aztecs had three looks at the rim before finally being fouled, which sent JJ O'Brien to the line where he made both free throws. But in the final 38 seconds, Johnson converted all four free-throw attempts to seal the nine-point win for Arizona.

SDSU found itself in position to score the upset when D'Erryl Williams was inserted into the game in the second half and began defending Arizona's primary ball-handler. The freshman disrupted the Wildcats' offensive flow and San Diego State began to roll offensively.

Winston Shepard jumpstarted the Aztecs with a pair of free throws en route to an SDSU 7-0 run to get with seven points with 6:17 to play. San Diego State ended up going on a 16-4 run to get within the aforementioned four points with 82 seconds to play before the game unfolded in Arizona's favor.

O'Brien and Shepard carried SDSU in the first half with eight points apiece before finishing with 19 and 12 points, respectively. O'Brien's 19 points marked a career high and were tied with Xavier Thames' 19 for the team high.

**SAN DIEGO** - San Diego State's defense put on an impressive display, as the Aztecs topped San Diego Christian, 93-41, for their largest margin of victory in the Steve Fisher era (52 points) and second-largest victory in Viejas Arena history.

It was also SDSU's most points scored in a game since March 2012, while SDC's 18 second-half points were the fewest allowed by the Aztecs in a half since Jan. 26, 2013, against UNM. In addition, SDC shot just 22.2 percent from the field, which marked the lowest percentage allowed by the Aztecs in the Fisher era.

San Diego State started strong from the opening tip, as the Aztecs made their first five field-goal attempts during a 21-0 run to begin the game. A dunk by Dwayne Polee II extended the advantage to 25-2 with 11:58 remaining in the first half, and Winston Shepard's three-pointer pushed SDSU's lead to 41-17 with just under five minutes left before halftime.

Josh Davis capped off the sharp first-half performance with a jumper to help the Aztecs take a 49-23 lead into intermission. Davis was one point shy of a double-double in the first half alone, recording nine points and 10 rebounds in the game's first 20 minutes.

SDSU began the second half on a 12-1 run, finished by JJ O'Brien's tip-in to extend the advantage to 61-24. A three-pointer by Matt Shrigley put the Aztecs ahead, 67-26, with 12:50 remaining.

Dakarai Allen's dunk put the Aztecs in front by a game-high 58 points, 93-35, as San Diego State cruised to its 35th-consecutive victory against teams from California, and 42nd-straight regular-season win against unranked, non-conference opponents.

O'Brien led all scorers with 16 points to go with six rebounds, while Davis posted his first double-double as an Aztec with 15 points and 13 rebounds. Shrigley established a career-high in scoring with 14 points, while Polee II added 14 points and seven rebounds.

FULLERTON, Calif. - Winston Shepard scored 15 points and Matt Shrigley added 12 to lead SDSU to a win over the College of Charleston, 72-52, in the first round of the Wooden Legacy at Cal State Fullerton.

Senior Xavier Thames scored 11 points for San Diego State and junior J.J. O'Brien added 10. Shrigley scored a game-high four 3-pointers and the Aztecs shot 57.4 percent from the field.

The Aztecs (3-1) could do no wrong in the game's opening minutes, and the Cougars (2-4) had trouble doing anything right.

San Diego State scored 17 of the game's first 18 points, forcing the pace with their speed and shooting well from long range. Their 17-1 run ended with 13:22 left in the first half, when David Wishon scored Charleston's first three-point.

The Aztecs kept the pressure on and took their biggest lead of the half (29-7) on a 3-pointer Shrigley.

Theo Johnson hit a 3-pointer from the right corner with seven minutes left, cutting the Aztecs' lead to 29-16, but that was the closest that the Cougars got and San Diego State led 37-21 at halftime.

The Cougars Tried but couldn't consistently hit 3-pointers. They entered the game with a 34.3 success rate from behind the 3-point line this season, but shot just 12.5 percent (1 for 8) in the first half.

The Cougars had a chance to creep to within nine points with just over 14 minutes to play, but Joe Chealey missed on his three-point attempt. Anthony Thomas picked up the rebound for Charleston but Chealey missed on his ensuing shot as well.

SDSU countered with a basket by Thames, increasing its lead to 48-34. Charleston got back to within 12 points at 12:47 on a layup by Thomas, but the Aztecs found their second wind and pulled away with a 15-2 run and a 63-38 lead that put the game out of reach.

FULLERTON, Calif. - SDSU withstood an early blitz by No. 20/18 Creighton and rallied to defeat the Bluejays, 86-80, in the semifinals of the Wooden Legacy.

Before SDSU could break a sweat, it found itself behind, 14-2, after Doug McDermott scored 11 straight points following a game-opening Jahenns Manigat three-pointer.

The Aztecs began to find their stride after staring at a 19-7 deficit with 12:59 left in the first half. Xavier Thames got things going for SDSU with a lay-up which in turn led to nine straight points to bring the Aztecs to within three points.

Austin Chatman temporarily stopped San Diego State's run with a trey, but the Aztecs closed the final 10:04 on a 24-8 tear to head into the locker room ahead, 40-30. In the first half alone, Thames was a perfect 3-for-3 from behind the arc en route to 13 points. Matt Shrigley, meanwhile, knocked down both of his attempts from three-point range.

An 11-2 run to open the second half extended San Diego State's lead to 19 points before the first media timeout, but Creighton kept chipping away at the deficit. The Aztecs were able to keep the Bluejays at a healthy distance for the most of the half, but their 12-point lead with 5:49 left nearly evaporated.

A 7-0 Creighton spurt made the score 70-65 with under four minutes to play, but JJ O'Brien converted a lay-up to put the lead back to seven. The Bluejays cut their deficit to three points on four different occasions, with the last coming with 27 seconds left on the clock.

With CU looking to mount a game-winning rally in the final moments, Josh Davis came up with a blocked shot and the Jays sent Thames to the free-throw line where he made 1-of-2 to put SDSU ahead, 81-77. Then after a Creighton turnover, Dwayne Polee II converted a three-point play that secured the win for the Aztecs. Thames scored a career-high 26 points and Winston Shepard posted 16 points and a career-high 10 boards.

McDermott finished with 30 points, but only had 19 in the final 35:52 after scoring 11 in the first 4:08.

ANAHEIM, Calif. - Xavier Thames scored a career-high 29 points and San Diego State held off a late rally to beat No. 25/rv Marquette, 67-59, in the championship game of the DIRECTV Wooden Legacy.

The game was tied at 53 with 3:54 remaining, but the Aztecs closed with a 14-4 run to knock off their second straight ranked foe.

Thames, who was named most outstanding player, shot 7-of-16 from the field, including 5-of-6 from three-point range. He also made six free throws in the final 40 seconds to help SDSU secure the win.

Thames averaged 22.0 points and shot 56.3 percent from the field, including 11-of-15 from three-point range, in the tournament.

Josh Davis had a game-high 11 rebounds and joined Thames on the all-tournament team, while Dakarai Allen and Winston Shepard each scored eight for SDSU.

The win marked the first time in program history the Aztecs beat a ranked opponent in consecutive games. They were coming off a victory over No. 20/18 Creighton in the semifinals.

Deonte Burton scored 15 points for Marquette, while Jamil Wilson scored nine points and was named to the all-tournament team. Derrick Wilson also scored nine for the Golden Eagles.

The Aztecs shot 39.3 percent from the field (22-56), but made up for it with solid performances from three-point-range (6-12) and from the free-throw line (17-23). SDSU had a 44-37 lead with 12:56 remaining, but Burton and the Eagles charged back to forge a 53-53 tie. Burton, a freshman forward, scored 11 points in the spurt.

The Aztecs didn't let it stay tied for long. Shepard hit a pair of free throws and followed with a jumper that began a 12-2 Aztecs run and ended the Golden Eagles' comeback attempt.

Marquette was held without a field goal from the 4:32 mark until there were 14 seconds left in the game, a cold stretch that allowed SDSU to pull away.

SAN DIEGO - Senior guard Xavier Thames scored 17 points, while senior forward Josh Davis finished with 10 points and 15 rebounds, as No. 24/rv San Diego State held off a late rally to defeat San Diego, 65-64, to win its fifth straight game.

With the Aztecs ahead by one, Thames was tied up on the in-bounds pass, giving possession back to USD with 3.2 seconds remaining. San Diego forward Duda Sanadze got a clean look from three-point range with time winding down, but it bounced off the rim as SDSU won its 36th-consecutive game against schools from California.

Sophomore center Skylar Spencer scored a career-high 12 points on 6-of-7 shooting to go along with six rebounds and two blocks for SDSU, while junior forward Dwayne Polee II recorded 12 points.

San Diego State outrebounded USD, 44-29, and had a 29-2 advantage in second-chance points. In addition, the Aztecs' bench outscored the Toreros', 19-5, as SDSU beat USD for the eighth straight time.

The Aztecs led, 25-19, after Thames' baseline jumper with just over five minutes remaining in the first half, before San Diego responded with a 13-7 run to knot the score at halftime, 32-32.

Consecutive threes by Thames and Polee put SDSU ahead by six with 13 minutes left. After an alley-oop dunk by Polee and a free throw by Thames, the Aztecs had their largest lead of the night, 57-47, with 6:30 remaining.

But the Toreros wouldn't go away, as Johnny Dee made two-straight three-pointers to cut SDSU's lead to one, 61-60, with 1:39 to go.

Dee finished with 21 points, while point guard Christopher Anderson scored a game-high 22 points and Sanadze added 12 points.

SDSU improved to 28-17 all-time against USD, and is now 9-8 in meetings at USD. The Aztecs won their 98th consecutive game when leading with five minutes to play, and improved to 6-1 for third time in as many seasons.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State rallied from a nine-point halftime deficit to defeat Washington, 70-63, at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs began the second half on a 17-2 run, eventually taking the lead on senior Xavier Thames' jumper with 14:59 remaining. After Washington briefly regained the lead, 42-41 with 11:21 left, San Diego State scored six straight points, capped off by freshman forward Matt Shrigley's 3-pointer to go ahead by five.

The Huskies cut the Aztecs' lead to 65-63 with 29 seconds remaining, but two free throws from sophomore forward Winston Shepard helped SDSU hang on for its sixth straight win.

Thames led San Diego State with a game-high 19 points to go with six assists, while Shepard finished with 17 points and three steals. Junior forward JJ O'Brien scored 10 points and sophomore center Skylar Spencer recorded six points and a career-high five blocks.

The Aztecs shot just 27 percent in the first half, including 1-of-7 from 3-point range, en route to its lowest first-half scoring output and second-largest halftime deficit of the season. Washington led by as many as 10 points in the first half, as guard C.J. Wilcox scored nine of his team-high 17 points before intermission.

SDSU finished with a 32-24 advantage in points in the paint and a 13-6 edge in fastbreak points as the Aztecs forced 16 Husky turnovers. San Diego State shot 60.0 percent in the second half and led by as many as nine points in the final 20 minutes of play.

With the victory, SDSU extended its home winning streak against unranked non-conference opponents to 42 straight, and has won 12 of its last 14 games against current members of the Pac-12 Conference.

For Thames, it was the fifth-straight game he scored in doubles figures, which is marked a career-long streak. Meanwhile, senior forward Josh Davis finished with eight points, 10 rebounds, three steals and two assists. It was the fourth time this season Davis has grabbed at least 10 rebounds, while his three steals matched a career high.

SAN DIEGO - Xavier Thames scored a game-high 16 points to go with four assists and Josh Davis finished with 14 points and 13 rebounds, as San Diego State knocked off Southern Utah, 76-39, for its seventh-consecutive victory.

The Aztecs' 39 points allowed were the fifth-fewest amount given up by SDSU during Steve Fisher's tenure. In addition, Southern Utah's 11 first-half points were the fewest allowed by San Diego State in one half in the Fisher era, and second fewest given up in a Division I game this season.

SUU scored only five points through the first 15 minutes of play, as San Diego State built an early 21-2 advantage on Dakarai Allen's layup, and pushed its lead to 37-4 with Skylar Spencer's easy bucket off a pass from Thames with 5:19 left before halftime.

A jumper by Davis with less than three minutes left in the half put the Aztecs ahead by 34, as SDSU took a 41-11 lead into intermission.

Aqeel Quinn set an Aztec career high with 14 points on 5-of-11 shooting, including 2-for-5 from three-point range. It was his first double-figure scoring game in an Aztecs' uniform, while he also had an overall career-high seven rebounds.

Thames scored in double figures for his career-best sixth-straight game, as he led the team in scoring for the seventh time this season and 13th time in his career. Davis, meanwhile, posted his third double-double of the season and 34th of his career. Davis also led the team in rebounding for the seventh time this season.

With the victory, the Aztecs won their 100th consecutive game when leading with five minutes to play.

**SAN DIEGO** - Short-handed San Diego State overcame a tough shooting first half to defeat McNeese State, 65-36, for its eighth straight victory.

The Aztecs went into the game without the services of Dwayne Polee II (illness) and D'Erroll Williams (back). JJ O'Brien, meanwhile, suited up for the game and was available on an emergency-basis only due to a sore right hand.

SDSU struggled mightily in the first half with its shooting stroke, connecting on just 7-of-29 from the floor (24.1 percent). Thankfully for the Aztecs, their defense never wavered as it limited the Cowboys to 7-of-31 shooting (22.6 percent) and the home side carried a 21-18 lead into halftime.

McNeese State scored five unanswered points to open the second half to take a 23-21 lead. In the first 4:58 of the period, SDSU missed its first five shots, but only trailed by two until Aqeel Quinn broke San Diego State's 0-for-13 effort from behind the arc with a corner three-pointer.

The bucket woke the Aztecs up, specifically Winston Shepard, who scored seven straight points to open an eight-point lead. San Diego State capped a 13-0 run with a Xavier Thames three and SDSU led, 36-25.

In the final nine minutes, San Diego State outscored McNeese State, 25-3, to emerge with the 29-point victory.

Shepard finished with a game-high 14 points, including 11 in the second half. Quinn and Josh Davis each had 12 points, with Davis grabbing a career-high 17 rebounds. Matt Shrigley added 11 points.

## Game 11

**SAN DIEGO** - San Diego State posted its largest margin of victory in its Division I history after it defeated St. Katherine College, 118-35.

The 83-point margin surpassed the record of 60, which stood for 29 years. The 118 points, meanwhile, were the fifth-most in Aztec Division I history.

Defensively, SDSU held its third straight opponent to under 40 points. The Aztecs became the first Division I school to accomplish the feat since 2000 and just the second school to do it in the last 18 seasons (Oregon State).

San Diego State opened the game with a Matt Shrigley three-pointer and never looked back. The Aztecs were up, 13-0, before Alex Perez got St. Katherine on the board with a free-throw nearly five minutes into the game.

SDSU upped its lead to 27-3 with just over 11 minutes left in the first half and kept pulling away. By halftime, San Diego State enjoyed a 63-17 lead. The 63 points were the most in a half in school history and the 46-point lead was the largest of the Steve Fisher era.

In the second half, it was more of the same with the Aztecs reaching the 100-point plateau with 6:09 left in the game after Aqeel Quinn knocked down a three-pointer.

A season-high six Aztecs reached double figures in scoring, led by Winston Shepard's career-high 21 points. The sophomore also added eight rebounds, a season-high five assists and a career-high five steals.

Dwayne Polee II had 19 points and 12 boards with Quinn adding 14 points. Shrigley finished with 12, and Skylar Spencer and Xavier Thames each had 10.

**FORT COLLINS, Colo.** - San Diego State opened Mountain West action with a New Year's Day contest at Colorado State and won in wire-to-wire fashion, 71-61.

The victory was the Aztecs' 10th in a row, marking the program's fifth-longest streak in 93 seasons of basketball and just the fifth winning streak of at least 10 games.

SDSU open the game by scoring the game's first six points and never trailed the rest of the way.

The Aztecs led by as many as eight points midway through the first half and ultimately carried a nine-point lead into the locker room after finishing the half on an 11-2 run.

In the first half, San Diego State received a balanced effort across the board as Winston Shepard scored 10 points and Xavier Thames and JJ O'Brien added nine and seven points, respectively. Josh Davis, meanwhile, had six first-half boards.

The Rams opened the second half by scoring four straight points to whittle the Aztecs' lead down to five points, but three minutes later, the visitors found themselves ahead by 11 minutes with 13:35 to play after an Aqeel Quinn three and a Skylar Spencer baby jumper.

SDSU kept Colorado State at a safe distance for the duration of the game, only allowing the Rams to get within six points once and that was with 10:06 left in regulation. On the Aztecs' next trip down the floor, Thames knocked down a three-pointer and followed it with a jumper, a three and a lay-up to cap an 11-6 run to put SDSU up, 62-52, with 6:26 left on the game clock.

At the final horn and with a 10-point victory in the books, Thames led all players with 23 points and a career-high-tying five steals. Joining him in double figures was Shepard, who poured in 17 points and had zero turnovers, marking his third straight game with one turnover or less. Davis and Spencer, meanwhile, combined to grab a total of 24 rebounds, with Davis leading all players with 15.

CSU had three players score in double figures - Daniel Bejarano (22), J.J. Avila (15) and Jon Ocutus (10).

LAWRENCE, Kan. - In a battle of two nationally ranked teams, visiting No. 21/T19 SDSU pulled the upset and beat No. 16/17 Kansas, 61-57, at Allen Fieldhouse.

The Aztecs, who led by as many as 11 points in the second half and did not trail the final 32 minutes, 8 seconds of the game, snapped the Jayhawks' 68-game winning streak vs. non-conference foes inside their historic facility.

SDSU won the game with defense as it entered the game with the top field-goal percentage defense in the country and the second-best scoring defense. Kansas, meanwhile, ranked in the top five in field-goal percentage.

San Diego State's defense held true as it limited the Jayhawks to their lowest field-goal percentage since Dec. 1, 1998 (29.8 percent) and held them to 57 points, their lowest total for a home game since Jan. 14, 2006.

The Aztecs scored first and traded points before a Naadir Tharpe three-pointer lifted the home side to a 9-8 lead with 14:11 left in the first half. An alley-oop from Winston Shepard to Josh Davis helped SDSU regain the lead and the Aztecs were off, leading by as many as eight points before settling for a 29-23 halftime lead.

On three different occasions in the first 10-plus minutes of the second half, the Aztecs grew their lead to 11, but could not shake KU.

With just over two minutes to play, Kansas cut its deficit to three points, but a put-back dunk by Davis propelled the Aztecs to a 57-52 lead with 1:37 left. On the next trip down, however, Frank Mason hit a three and SDSU led by two with 81 seconds to play.

After two Aztec misses on the front end of a 1-and-1, San Diego State fouled Perry Ellis, who made his first free-throw and missed the second following an SDSU timeout.

Xavier Thames sealed the victory for the Aztecs after he made all four of his free-throw attempts in the final eight seconds to provide the final margin.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State nearly had its 18-point lead wiped away, but held on in the end as the Aztecs beat Boise State at home for the third straight season, 69-66.

Games between these teams that have occurred inside Viejas Arena have always been close and this meeting was no different. In the previous two get-togethers, SDSU won by a combined three points with the outcome coming down to the final seconds.

The Aztecs led by 18 points with 7:32 left in the first half, but found themselves clinging to a narrow advantage late in the game.

San Diego State found itself ahead, 62-50, with 4:39 left in regulation before the Broncos exploded with a 14-4 run to make it a 66-64 game with 1:08 to play.

After Derrick Marks made both free-throw attempts to make it a two-point game, the Broncos fouled Xavier Thames before the ball was inbounded and the SDSU senior guard made the front end of his pair at the charity stripe.

With San Diego State now up, 67-64, the Broncos gave Marks the ball again and he nailed a step-back jumper with 56 seconds to go. Following a Boise State timeout, the Aztecs found Aqeel Quinn, who made a trio of three-pointers earlier, in the corner, but his attempt from long distance was off the mark.

Boise State gathered the rebound and played for the last shot, which resulted with the ball in Marks' hand once again. This time, however, Thames was able to make it difficult for him to get a clean look on his jump-shot and the attempt was off the mark.

San Diego State believed it had won the game after Thames secured the rebound, but the officials put 0.2 seconds back on the clock after ruling he was fouled. Thames then knocked down two free-throws to put the finishing touches on the game.

Thames and Winston Shepard each scored 16 points for SDSU, which held BSU to 42.9-percent shooting for the game and 23.5 percent from three-point distance.

Josh Davis, meanwhile, added 10 rebounds, and Quinn scored nine off the bench.

USAFA, Colo. - San Diego State had five players score in double figures as the Aztecs defeated Air Force, 79-72, to snap a two-game losing streak at the Academy.

The win was SDSU's 13th straight and helped the Aztecs move to 3-0 in league play. San Diego State also stopped a five-game losing streak in day games at Air Force.

The Falcons played the Aztecs close for the entire first half and enjoyed a pair of five-point leads, with the second coming with 12:27 left before halftime. Air Force looked poised to take a lead into intermission after it was up, 27-24, with 3:01 to go. SDSU, however, answered with a 7-0 half-ending run to take a 31-27 lead as the clock hit triple zeros.

The Aztecs continued their momentum in the second half as they put up another seven unanswered points to increase their advantage to 11 points.

SDSU's lead eventually swelled to 14 points with 13:53 left on the clock before the Falcons went on a 10-4 spurt to get within eight points.

The Aztecs kept Air Force at a safe distance the rest of the way despite the Falcons making it a two-possession game (six points) with 40 seconds left in regulation. At that point, Xavier Thames was involved in three of San Diego State's four scoring plays, which included him making 3-of-4 free-throws in the final 27 seconds to put the game out of reach.

JJ O'Brien led the Aztecs with 18 points and a game-high-tying 11 rebounds, which marked his first double-double of the season. The 11 boards also matched his career best.

Frontcourt teammate Josh Davis also grabbed 11 rebounds and scored 13 points, and fellow senior Thames added 16 points and a game-high five assists.

Winston Shepard, meanwhile, chipped in with 14 points, six rebounds and three assists. Lastly, Matt Shrigley scored 13 points on 5-of-10 shooting in 17 minutes off the bench.

Air Force's Tre' Coggins led all players with 29 points.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State put a handful of lengthy streaks on the line and ultimately extended all of them after it beat Fresno State, 68-60.

The Aztecs, who led with five minutes to go, won their 107th straight game when leading with that much time left in regulation, posted their 38th consecutive victory over schools from California and won their 14th overall game in a row.

SDSU struggled mightily from the floor despite its hot start. The Aztecs found themselves ahead, 9-2, just over five minutes into the game, but cooled considerably after that.

The Bulldogs methodically erased the deficit and were all of a sudden up by eight points as late as 4:33 left in the first half. The Aztecs closed the frame on a 12-2 surge to take a two-point lead, but Fresno State's Marvelle Harris knocked down a three-pointer with 14 seconds left to propel the Bulldogs to a 32-31 lead at halftime.

The game remained tight with no team leading by more than three points for the first nine-plus minutes of the half until Matt Shrigley helped set off San Diego State with a free-throw and a three-pointer, which lead to another trey from Xavier Thames. The spurt led to a 12-2 run, highlighted by five straight points from Winston Shepard.

The Aztecs were able to keep the Bulldogs at a safe distance the rest of the way despite not making a field goal in the final 8:01 of the game. During that period, SDSU went 13-for-17 from the free-throw line while limiting Fresno State to just 12 points en route to its fourth Mountain West victory in four outings.

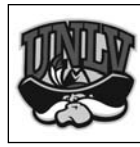
Thames led all players with 28 points and Shepard finished with 17 points and six rebounds for an Aztec side that shot just 33.3 percent from the floor.

Tyler Johnson turned in 24 points and 11 rebounds for the Bulldogs, who lost their seventh straight decision to the Aztecs. Harris, meanwhile, registered 11 points.

SAN DIEGO - SDSU continued its winning ways, capturing its 15th straight victory after dismissing UNLV, 63-52, in front of a raucous sold-out Viejas Arena crowd.

With the win, the Aztecs stopped a three-game losing streak to the Runnin' Rebels and stayed atop the Mountain West standings with a flawless 5-0 record.

SDSU won the game with a stellar defensive effort, holding UNLV to 30.0-percent shooting for the game, including a 2-for-18 effort from three-point distance. On the flip side, the Aztecs were not much better with their shooting stroke, making just 20-of-59 field-goal attempts and 2-of-11 from behind the arc. SDSU, however, marched to the free-throw line 27 times, making 21, and UNLV was only 8-for-11 in the category.

The Aztecs jumped all over the Rebels and led, 22-9, with 5:38 left in the first half. UNLV did not reach double digits in scoring until Roscoe Smith made a pair of free-throws with 5:16 left, which made the score, 22-11. SDSU eventually went into the locker room ahead, 34-20. The 20 Runnin' Rebels first-half points were their fewest in a first half since scoring 20 on March 4, 2009.

In the second half, the Aztecs led comfortably and at one point, were ahead by 12 with 12:29 left in the game. UNLV, however, scored six straight points, but SDSU answered with a pair dunks from Skylar Spencer and Josh Davis to thwart the comeback attempt.

Down the stretch, UNLV got to within five points with 5:48 left on the clock, but San Diego State scored the next four points, which spanned 1:21 and the Aztecs cruised to the double-digit victory.

UNLV was held to a season-low 52 points and its field-goal percentage was also its lowest of the season. SDSU's 11-point margin of victory was the largest by any team in the series since March 12, 2009, as the previous 10 meetings were decided by 10 points or less.

Xavier Thames led all players with 18 points and Josh Davis posted a double-double with 14 points and a game-high 14 boards.

Bryce Dejean-Jones led the Rebels with 15 points and Smith chipped in with 12 points and 10 rebounds.

SAN JOSE, Calif. - San Diego State made the short trip north following two home games and defeated San José State, 75-50, in what was the Spartans' largest home crowd in at least 10 years.

The Aztecs won their 16th straight game with their signature defense. SDSU struggled from the field in the first half, making just 29.0 percent of its shots, but held the Spartans to 6-of-29 from the floor and eventually took a 29-19 lead into halftime.

San Diego State continued to lock down defensively in the second half and its full-court pressure disrupted San José State's rhythm as many of the Spartans' turnovers led to easy buckets for the Aztecs.

SDSU led, 35-30, with 17:32 left in the game only to go on a 16-0 run, highlighted by three consecutive slam dunks. An SJSU jumper interrupted the Aztecs' mojo, but they quickly got it back after scoring another 16 unanswered points to cap a 32-2 run and move ahead 67-32 with 6:17 to go.

San Diego State never led by more than that margin the rest of the way en route to the 25-point win.

After the dreadful shooting performance by both teams, SDSU finished at 39.3 percent, while SJSU made 33.3 percent of its attempts after registering percentages of 50.0 and 48.0, respectively.

Four Aztecs scored in double figures, led by Xavier Thames' 15 points. Winston Shepard flirted with a triple-double with 12 points, nine rebounds and six assists, while Skylar Spencer matched Shepard's point total. Josh Davis added 10 points and 12 rebounds, which marked his 12th consecutive double-figure rebounding performance.

Devante Wilson led San José State with 14 points and Jalen James added 10 points of his own.

The win was SDSU's sixth in league play in six tries, marking the first time the Aztecs have started a league campaign 6-0 in their Division I history and for the first time since 1966-67.

LOGAN, Utah - Xavier Thames enjoyed a career night and the Aztecs won at a venue where few teams win as they earned a 74-69 overtime victory at Utah State inside Dee Glen Smith Spectrum.

A senior guard, Thames poured in a personal-best 31 points, including 10 in the extra session, to help propel San Diego State to its 17th straight win and an 18-1 overall record (7-0 Mountain West).

What was perhaps more impressive was the fact that SDSU won in Logan where the Aggies rarely lose. With the San Diego State victory, the Aztecs handed Utah State its 13th home loss in its last 137 home games dating back to March 2, 2006.

As expected, the game was a battle from start to finish minus a nearly eight-minute stretch that spanned the end of the first half and the start of the second.

SDSU held onto a one-point lead with under seven minutes to play in the first half until a JJ O'Brien layup spurred a 7-0 run, which eventually became a 11-8 period-ending run to put the Aztecs ahead, 28-24, at half-time.

San Diego State stretched its lead out to 32-26 within the first 90 seconds of the second period before the Aggies made it uncomfortable for the visitors.

USU took its first lead since 9:31 in the first half, when Preston Medlin knocked down a three-pointer with 12:59 left in the second period. The Aggies led by as many as four points, this time with 7:47 left in regulation, and held SDSU scoreless for more than three-and-a-half minutes. On the flip side, the Aztecs did not allow the home side to score either and cut its deficit to two after a pair of Aqeel Quinn free-throws.

With under two minutes to play, Thames found Josh Davis for a lay-up and then knocked down two free-throws to put SDSU ahead, 57-54. Then with two seconds left, Spencer Butterfield canned a trey to force overtime.

In the extra session, it was the Thames show as he scored 10 of SDSU's 17 points to lift the Aztecs to victory.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State defeated Colorado State at home for the 11th straight time, 65-56, and in the process gave Steve Fisher his 300th career win at SDSU.

The Aztecs won their 18th consecutive game despite not making a three-pointer for the first time since December 2010. But like many games this season, San Diego State got to the free-throw line a ton and used its advantage to win the game. All told, SDSU made 23-of-34 attempts from the charity stripe. In contrast, CSU was only 12-for-18 from the line.

San Diego State trailed 2-0 in the early going, but responded with a 25-6 run to move ahead, 25-8, with 7:03 left in the first half. SDSU eventually stretched its lead to 29-10 by the time the under-4-minute timeout rolled around and entered the locker room up, 32-20.

The Aztecs enjoyed a double-digit lead for the first 13 minutes of the second half, but a Joe De Ciman three-pointer cut the CSU deficit to nine with 6:43 to play.

The game was a back-and-forth affair until the Rams rattled off five unanswered points with just over one minute left to play. The run got Colorado State to within six points with 66 seconds left in the second half.

SDSU responded with Aqeel Quinn making the second of two free-throws and getting a defensive stop on the other end. On the Aztecs' next possession, Xavier Thames made two free-throws and would later make another pair to put the game out of reach.

Thames shared game-high honors with CSU's Jon Octeus as both turned in 24 points. The SDSU senior guard also had a season-high seven rebounds and a game-high two assists. Winston Shepard, meanwhile, had 17 points and JJ O'Brien corralled 10 rebounds while holding Rams leading scorer J.J. Ayton to nine points on 4-of-17 shooting.

Quinn received the starting nod for the first time of his Aztec career after Josh Davis was sidelined with a right knee injury. The senior forward and the team's leading rebounder was dressed and available, but did not see action.

BOISE, Idaho - SDSU rallied from a 14-point second-half deficit and Dwayne Polee II hit a three-pointer with four seconds left to propel the Aztecs to a 67-65 win at Boise State in front of a raucous 9,602 fans.

The Aztecs found themselves down 65-64 with 19 seconds left when Xavier Thames drove the right side of the lane and kicked it diagonally to Polee when the defense collapsed. The junior calmly caught the ball in rhythm and knocked down the trey.

BSU, which had a timeout remaining, elected to not take it and Derrick Marks pushed the ball and took a contested three that did not draw iron to complete SDSU's comeback and hand it its 19th straight victory.

The fact that San Diego State was in a position to win was nothing sort of extraordinary considering it trailed by 14 with 13:51 left and by five with just over six minutes to play. Then Thames happened.

The senior guard scored eight straight points to give SDSU its first lead since Thames opened with a three-pointer 21 seconds into the game. Boise State, however, scored five in a row to move ahead by three with 1:37 to go, only to have Thames make two free-throws, which set up the final sequence.

The Aztecs were able to erase the second-half hole thanks to a suffocating full-court and half-court press, which allowed them to get a handful of easy looks at the basket in the open floor.

It also helped having Josh Davis back in the lineup after a one-game hiatus due to a right knee bone bruise. The senior had 10 points. Thames finished with a game-high 23.

The Broncos built their lead on the strength of 51.0 percent shooting and eight three-pointers. In the first half alone, Boise State shot 54.8 percent from the floor (6-13 3FG) en route to a 42-33 lead.

Mikey Thompson led BSU with 16 points, and Marks and Thomas Bropleh each had 15. Anthony Drmic, meanwhile, finished with 13 points, but it was not enough to prevent SDSU from matching its largest second-half deficit overcome in a victory in the Fisher era.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State won its 20th consecutive game after it earned a 73-58 decision over Nevada in front of a sold-out and loud Viejas Arena crowd.

With its 20th straight win, the Aztecs tied the school record for consecutive victories. SDSU matched the record-breaking 2010-11 squad that opened the season with a 20-0 record en route to a 34-3 mark and NCAA Sweet 16 appearance.

The upstart Wolf Pack, which came into the game with a 7-3 Mountain West record, were up to the task of trying to snap the Aztecs' nine-game conference winning streak as the game was tied eight times and the lead changed hands six times in the first half.

The contest shifted the Aztecs' way in the final three minutes of the first half when SDSU ended on a 7-0 run to turn a one-point deficit into a 37-31 lead at the break.

San Diego State stretched its lead to nine points after opening the second half on a 5-2 spurt. Nevada got to within six points, but the Aztecs answered with a 9-1 run to lead by 14 points with just under 11 minutes to play.

SDSU enjoyed a double-digit lead for the rest of the game with the exception of a 26-second period when the Wolf Pack faced a nine-point hole with six minutes to go.

With its lead cut to single digits, San Diego State answered by ending the game on a 12-6 scoring spree. Nevada's six points came on a pair of three-pointers.

Xavier Thames and the Wolf Pack's Jerry Evans, Jr., shared game-high honors with 17 points apiece. Thames also added a game-high five assists, a figure Nevada's leading scorer, Deonte Burton reached. Burton, who was averaging 21.1 points entering the game, was limited to just 11.

Winston Shepard, meanwhile, added 16 points on a career-high seven field goals. Josh Davis posted nine points and a game-high seven rebounds, and Skylar Spencer led all players with four blocked shots.

LARAMIE, Wyo. - San Diego State had its bid to make history thwarted as Wyoming held on to defeat the Aztecs, 68-62, at Arena-Auditorium.

SDSU was looking to win its school-record and Mountain West-record 21st consecutive game, but could not overcome 37.9-percent shooting for the game. In addition to trying to extend their lengthy winning streak, the Aztecs were also looking to tie the MW record for best start to a conference campaign (11-0) and match the program record by winning their 11th straight road/neutral contest.

San Diego State started the game off on the right foot when Xavier Thames was fouled on a three-point attempt. The senior made all three free-throws, the second of which was his 1,000th career point as an Aztec.

SDSU later led, 11-4, only to have Wyoming tie the score at 20 with 6:34 left in the first half. The Cowboys then closed the first 20 minutes on a 12-3 tear that broke the game open.

Wyoming continued where it left off, outscoring the Aztecs, 7-2, in the first 3:18 to extend its lead to 14 points. San Diego State faced an uphill, double-digit hole for much of the second half before trimming the deficit to a manageable eight points with 2:20 left.

Twice SDSU cut the Cowboys' lead to four, but Wyoming answered with a dunk and a free-throw on both occasions to keep the Aztecs at bay.

San Diego State was able to get back into the game in the second half thanks to a suffocating full-court press that mystified Wyoming. But unfortunately for the Aztecs, the Cowboys were able to find a wide-open player a handful of times, which led to easy buckets, to take the wind out of SDSU's sails.

Dwayne Polee II provided a huge spark for the Aztecs off the bench as he finished with a team-high 15 points (3-6 3FG), while adding five rebounds and two steals in 20 minutes.

Thames turned in 13 points, JJ O'Brien had 11 points and six rebounds, and Winston Shepard and Josh Davis each had 10 points.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State rebounded from its second loss of the season with a 64-56 win over Air Force.

The Aztecs shot just 34.8 percent from the field in the first half, but limited the Falcons to an even-worse 34.6 percent en route to a 24-23 lead at halftime.

The second period was markedly better for both teams, especially for SDSU. The Aztecs shot 50.0 percent from the floor, which included a 4-for-8 effort from behind the arc. San Diego State also got to the free-throw line 22 times, converting 14.

Defensively for the Aztecs, they forced the Falcons into shooting 40.0 percent from the field and just 3-for-10 from three-point distance in the final 20 minutes.

Xavier Thames temporarily broke the game open at the four-minute mark of the second half with a trey, which gave San Diego State a 31-28 lead. The senior made another three, which later led to a tip-in by Dwayne Polee II and an alley-oop from Winston Shepard to Polee II to extend SDSU's lead to 38-28.

Air Force answered with a 10-3 run to cut San Diego State's advantage to three with 9:11 to go, but Aqeel Quinn knocked down a three to make it a two-possession game at 44-38.

After a DeLovell Earls layup, Shepard spurred a 9-0 outburst with a three-pointer and ended up scoring seven of SDSU's nine points en route to a 13-point cushion with 5:20 to play.

Air Force would not go away easily, cutting into San Diego State's lead and trailing 54-50 with 2:31 left in regulation. On the Aztecs' next possession, however, Shepard converted a three-point play and ultimately extended an SDSU lead that the Falcons were unable to overcome.

Shepard led the Aztecs with 16 points and nine rebounds. Thames and Polee II each scored 13 points, and Josh Davis pulled down a game-high 10 rebounds.

AFA's Max Yon was the game's high scorer with 20 points and Kamryn Williams added 12 points and 12 rebounds. The Falcons' leading scorer, Tre' Coggins was held to nine points on 2-14 shooting (0-9 3FG).

SAN DIEGO - Redshirt freshman Matt Shrigley broke out of a shooting slump to help San Diego State defeat Utah State, 60-45, to sweep the season series.

The forward from San Diego scored a career-high 15 points on the strength of a personal-best four three pointers off the bench to lead a balanced offensive attack for the Aztecs.

Coming into the contest, Shrigley had scored a combined eight points in his previous five games, but answered the bell against the Aggies with nine first-half points to help San Diego State take a 35-22 lead at half-time.

The Aztecs stretched their lead to 17 points thanks to a 6-2 second-half-opening run and never looked back. SDSU eventually would lead by 25 points with 3:28 to go before Utah State got on a roll and scored 10 unanswered points to end the game to provide the final 15-point margin.

Only three Aztecs reached double figures in scoring, led by Shrigley and followed by Josh Davis and Skylar Spencer. Davis connected on a season-high-tying six field goals en route to 12 points, while collecting a game-high eight boards. Spencer, meanwhile, added 10 points and led all players with four blocked shots. All told, all eight Aztecs who logged significant minutes scored before Steve Fisher substituted players in the final moments.

Defensively, San Diego State got back to its lockdown ways as it held Utah State to just 34.0 percent shooting from the floor, including 5-for-13 from behind the arc. In the first meeting, the Aggies shot 52.7 percent and made nine three-pointers, and the game moved to overtime before the Aztecs emerged with the win.

Utah State was led by Spencer Butterfield and Jarred Shaw, who both scored 10 points. Shaw led the team with seven rebounds.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. - In a game between the top two teams in the Mountain West, New Mexico got the better of No. 6/7 San Diego State, 58-44, at The Pit. With SDSU's loss, the Aztecs fell into a first-place tie with the Lobos at 12-2.

San Diego State led, 2-0, on a tip-in from Skylar Spencer, but a pair of Cameron Bairstow free-throws tied the game shortly thereafter. The Aztecs regained the lead on a Winston Shepard mid-range jumper on the next possession, but that would be the last time SDSU would enjoy a lead.

The Lobos then embarked on a 14-2 run, which included 10 straight points, to propel them to a 16-6 lead. Josh Davis converted a lay-up to end the run just before the under-12 media timeout and later scored SDSU's next bucket to bring the visitors to within six points with 10:58 to go in the first half.

An 8-0 Aztec run cut their deficit to three points, punctuated by a Dwayne Polee II dunk, but New Mexico closed the final 2:18 on a 6-2 spurt to take a 29-22 lead into halftime.

Much like the start of the game, SDSU opened the second half with a basket, this time receiving one from JJ O'Brien. The Lobos, however, responded with nine unanswered points to increase their lead to 38-24.

Another Polee II dunk silenced the crowd and the UNM run, but once again, New Mexico responded with a 12-0 statement, which included six points from Cameron Bairstow.

Trailing 50-26 with 10:50 to play, Aqeel Quinn knocked down a three-pointer to jumpstart the Aztecs a bit. SDSU scored nine of the game's next 11 points to get within 17, but its deficit proved to be too large as it fell into a first-place tie in the league standings.

Shepard led the Aztecs with 10 points and six rebounds for an Aztec side that attempted just three free-throws.

Bairstow was the game's top performer with 26 points and nine rebounds. Kendall Williams added 10 points and seven assists for the Lobos.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State rebounded from its third loss of the season in resounding fashion as the Aztecs beat San José State, 90-64, to stay atop the Mountain West standings.

SDSU had all 11 scholarship players score and 12 total for the game. JJ O'Brien, Dwayne Polee II and Winston Shepard led the Aztecs with 12 points apiece and Matt Shrigley added 11.

The Spartans led, 9-6, with 15:47 left on a three-pointer by Devante Wilson and then San Diego State took over. The Aztecs scored seven straight points on their way to a 16-5 run to move ahead by eight with 10:50 to go in the half.

SJSU was within striking distance, a two-possession game, heading toward the under-8 media timeout only to have the Aztecs go on a mini 6-0 run to increase its lead to 10. Then in the final seven minutes of the half, San Diego State methodically padded its cushion before taking a 44-30 lead at intermission.

Coming out of the locker room, the Aztecs continued to keep the Spartans at a safe distance. After San José State closed to within 15 points with 15:42 left in regulation, San Diego State slammed the door shut with a crippling 14-0 run to move ahead, 67-38. SDSU would later lead by as many as 33 points before settling for the 26-point win and first season sweep of the Spartans since 1978.

With the victory, the Aztecs won their 40th straight game vs. schools from the state of California. It is the longest active winning streak by any school against any one state and the longest active streak against schools from the Golden State.

For the Spartans, they were led by Jaleel Williams and Rashad Muhammad, who both scored 14 points.

FRESNO, Calif. - San Diego State cooled off the Mountain West's hottest team in Fresno State as the visitors earned an 82-67 victory in front of 14,801 fans at Save Mart Center.

With the win, SDSU won its 41st straight game vs. schools from California, which extended the nation's longest active winning streak vs. any one state.

The Bulldogs, who came into the game having won seven of their last eight games, were upset-minded on Senior Night and Jerry Tarkanian Night. Fresno State stayed within close range of the nationally ranked Aztecs for the entire first half and looked poised to trail by just two points heading into halftime after Cezar Guerrero knocked down a trey with 11 seconds left. SDSU senior guard Xavier Thames, however, had other things on his mind as he came down the court and nailed a three-pointer with a second left to give the Aztecs a 40-35 lead.

The teams traded baskets in the opening minutes of the second half, but a 9-2 spurt by San Diego State with just under 15 minutes to play opened up a 15-point cushion. Fresno State would not get closer than 13 points the rest of the way and faced a minimum 15-point hole for the final 8:32 of the contest.

The Aztecs were led by Thames, who broke out of a shooting slump by connecting on 7-of-12 field-goal attempts, 3-of 4 from three-point distance and 5-of-6 from the charity stripe to finish with a game-high 22 points. The senior also shared game-high honors with six rebounds.

Back-up Aqeel Quinn came up huge in the first half by knocking down all three of his three-point attempts en route to a career-high 17 points on a career-high six field goals and four treys, and six boards.

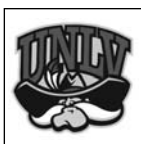
Winston Shepard also reached double figures for SDSU with 13 points, while adding four assists.

LAS VEGAS - Matt Shrigley and Dwayne Polee II combined for 27 points and eight rebounds off the bench to help San Diego State defeat UNLV, 73-64, in front of a season-high 16,030 fans at Thomas & Mack Center.

Shrigley caught fire in the second half, making his first five field-goal attempts, including his first four from behind the three-point arc, en route to 14 points. Polee II, meanwhile, was the beneficiary of a stifling SDSU press as it created turnovers, which led to multiple dunks and 13 points.

As important as Shrigley and Polee II's contributions were, Winston Shepard's three with 2:33 left in regulation may have been the dagger in helping San Diego State sweep the season series with the Runnin' Rebels.

The game was a see-saw battle all night as the lead changed hands 14 times. After a Polee II dunk with 4:42 to go gave SDSU a two-point lead, UNLV grabbed momentum back with three straight points to move the Rebels ahead, 62-61.

Xavier Thames converted an and-1 situation with just over three minutes to play to lift the Aztecs to a 64-62 advantage. On the other end, however, SDSU fouled Khem Birch to send him to the line. Fortunately for SDSU, the center missed both free throws and Thames found a wide-open Shepard on the left wing for the aforementioned three on the ensuing possession.

The Aztecs ended up scoring 11 unanswered points in taking a 10-point lead with 50 seconds to go before settling for the nine-point victory.

Joining Polee II and Shrigley in double figures were Thames and Shepard. Thames finished with a game-high 19 points, six rebounds, a season-high six assists and zero turnovers in 34 minutes. Shepard, meanwhile, turned in 13 points, five rebounds and four assists in 32 turnover-free minutes.

Birch led UNLV with 16 points, 10 rebounds and six blocked shots. Kevin Olekaibe scored 11 points on his Senior Night, while fellow classmate Carlos Lopez-Sosa had four points and five boards.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State won the 2014 Mountain West regular-season title outright after it rallied from a 16-point second-half deficit to defeat No. 21/21 New Mexico, 51-48.

The Aztecs won their conference-leading eighth league championship and kept Steve Fisher as the only active head coach in the league to win an MW crown.

The 16-point second-half deficit overcome for a victory was the largest in the Fisher era and the largest since the 1996-97 season. San Diego State was forced to dig itself out of nearly insurmountable hole thanks to a Cameron Bairstow fall-away jumper at the first-half buzzer, which gave the Lobos a 26-20 lead, and a 15-5 second-half-opening run.

Now facing a 41-25 deficit, the Aztecs switched from a man-to-man defense to a 1-3-1 zone. The change in philosophy proved fruitful as it thoroughly confused the Lobos. SDSU went on a 9-0 run to get within seven.

Bairstow interrupted San Diego State's flow with a basket, but the Aztecs kept their pressure up and scored another 10 unanswered points to overcome the deficit and take a 44-42 lead with 5:01 remaining.

SDSU's work was far from done as Deshawn Delaney knocked down the game's first three-pointer to lift UNM to a 45-44 lead with 4:30 to go. San Diego State, however, would not be denied on this night as it responded with seven straight points to move ahead, 51-45, and held the Lobos scoreless until a Kendall Williams three-pointer at the final horn provided the final margin.

Senior Xavier Thames, who was playing in his final home game, led all players with 23 points and a career-high five steals. SDSU's other senior, Josh Davis, added a team-high nine rebounds and a season-high three steals. Both also played 37 minutes.

For the Lobos, Bairstow finished with 20 points and seven rebounds, while frontcourt mate Alex Kirk had 14 points and a game-high 11 rebounds. In the second half, however, the Aztecs limited Bairstow to seven points and Kirk to five. The reigning MW Player of the Year, Williams, had seven points and five of UNM's 16 turnovers.

LAS VEGAS - Top-seeded San Diego State limited eighth-seeded Utah State to just 29.3-percent shooting, and shot 52.5 percent itself in beating the Aggies, 73-39, in the quarterfinal round of the 2014 Reese's Mountain West Championship.

All 11 Aztecs who dressed scored at least one basket with MW Player of the Year Xavier Thames leading all players with 15 points. The senior guard also added a season-high seven assists against one turnover in 22 minutes.

SDSU scored the first bucket of the game, a Josh Davis lay-up, and never looked back. The Aztecs did not allow a Utah State point until a Jarred Shaw jumper 6 minutes, 23 seconds into the game. By then, San Diego State led, 8-2. In fact, USU scored on consecutive possessions to get within four, but never got closer the rest of the way.

The Aztecs led by double digits with 7:41 left in the first half and increased their lead to 31-11 when Winston Shepard capped a 9-0 run with a free-throw. At the halftime horn, San Diego State led, 36-15.

The second half was more of the same for the Aztecs as they scored six unanswered points to move ahead by 27 points. SDSU's lead eventually swelled to 38 points before it settled for the 34-point victory.

Shepard joined Thames in double figures with 13 points on 6-of-12 shooting. Davis, meanwhile, posted eight points, a game-high 13 rebounds and a career-high six steals. The six thefts set a San Diego State Mountain West tournament record.

For the Aggies, who earned their spot in the quarterfinal game by beating ninth-seeded Colorado State in the MW first round a day earlier, Shaw led all USU players with 14 points. Spencer Butterfield and Kyle Davis each pulled down a team-high five boards.

LAS VEGAS - The Mountain West's No. 1 seed, San Diego State, beat fourth-seeded UNLV on its home floor, 59-51, in the semifinal round to earn a spot in the conference tournament championship game for the fifth time in the last six seasons.

The Runnin' Rebels jumped the Aztecs from the outset, scoring the first seven points of the game, which covered 3 minutes, 17 seconds, and forced San Diego State to call a timeout. Out of the break, SDSU drew up a successful play for Josh Davis and the Aztecs trailed, 7-2.

The Davis bucket jumpstarted a 17-6 run, with the last three coming from a Dwayne Polee II three-pointer, and San Diego State found itself ahead, 17-13, with 9:13 left in the frame.

As the first half came to a close, SDSU was unable to shake UNLV as the Rebels stayed within striking distance. Two Xavier Thames free-throws with just over a minute left gave the Aztecs a five-point lead at halftime.

The opening minutes of the second half was a two-possession game until Polee II and Matt Shrigley nailed back-to-back three-pointers to turn a four-point lead into a 10-point advantage with 13:49 left in regulation.

Five minutes later, Polee II knocked down another three-pointer to give the Aztecs a 48-33 lead, their biggest of the game. UNLV made a late charge with just over five minutes to play and cut its deficit to six points with 1:01 to go. San Diego State, however, used five Polee II free-throws in the final 56 seconds to put the game away.

Polee II finished with a game-high 18 points and added a team-high six boards, while leading all players with three steals. The junior knocked down a career-high-tying three three-pointers (3-for-5). Thames chipped in 17 points and a game-high six assists to run his two-game MW Championship total to 13 assists.

Deville Smith led the Rebels with 17 points and Bryce Dejean-Jones added 10. Khem Birch pulled down 15 rebounds for a Rebels side that dropped its fifth straight MW tournament game to the Aztecs.

The fourth-seeded Aztecs led by as many as 14 points in the first half, 12 at the break and seven with just 1:01 left in the second half, but 13th-seeded NMSU found a way to comeback and tie the game at 60-60 on a three by Kevin Aronis with six seconds left.

Xavier Thames had a chance to win it in regulation but his shot rimmed out as time expired forcing overtime.

SDSU, however, took control in the extra session as Thames and Dwayne Polee II scored five points apiece to move San Diego State into the third round against 12th-seeded North Dakota State.

The Aztecs, who never trailed in the game, made 7 of 10 free-throws in overtime to seal the win. SDSU won its eighth straight overtime game and improved to 17-1 over its last 18 overtime contests.

It was the defense that came through once again for San Diego State. The Aztecs had nine blocks, their most ever in an NCAA tournament, eight steals, forced 13 turnovers and held New Mexico State to a season-low 20 points in the first half.

Thames had game-highs of 23 points and five assists, to go along with three steals and two blocks in the win. Polee II had 15 points and six rebounds in 29 minutes off the bench, while Josh Davis recorded his ninth double-double of the season with 10 points and 14 rebounds.

Skyler Spencer added a career-high four steals and four blocks. His first block of the night gave him the single-season school record.

The win was SDSU's 30th of the season, its second 30-win season in school history and second in the past four campaigns (34 in 2010-11).

Daniel Mullings led a group of five in double figures scoring for the Aggies with 18 points and four assists. Sim Bhullar and Tshilidzi Nephawe combined for 26 points, 15 rebounds and three blocks.

SPOKANE, Wash. - Xavier Thames scored 30 points to lead fourth-seeded San Diego State past 12th-seeded North Dakota State, 63-44, and into a spot in the Sweet 16 for the second time in program history.

It was the second career 30-point game for Thames and the most-ever points in postseason (NCAA or NIT) by an Aztec player.

Thames was 9 for 19 from the field, including 4 for 9 from the 3-point arc and 8 of 9 from the free-throw line, with five assists. His 30 points were one off a career high of 31, set earlier in the year in an overtime contest vs. Utah State.

The win was the 31st for SDSU and propelled the team into the Sweet 16 to face top-seeded Arizona in the West Regional semifinals in Anaheim.

The San Diego State defense proved to be too much for the Bison, which came into the game with the top field goal percentage (51.0) in the country. The Aztecs held NDSU to its lowest point total of the year (44) and third-lowest total since it made the transition from Division II to Division I in 2005. Additionally, SDSU held North Dakota State to 15 field goals (second-lowest total in DI history), 31.9 percent shooting (sixth-lowest mark in its DI history) and two 3-pointers (tied for 10th-lowest total in DI history).

Kory Brown was the only Bison to reach double-figures in scoring with 13 points. San Diego State also held NDSU leading scorer and Summit League Player of the Year Taylor Braun to just seven points on 2 of 14 shooting. Braun had 28 in North Dakota State's upset over fifth-seeded Oklahoma two days earlier.

Dwayne Polee II was the only other SDSU player in double figures with 15 points and six rebounds in a season-high 30 minutes off the bench. Josh Davis added six points and a game-high 13 rebounds.

ANAHEIM, Calif. - Fourth-seeded San Diego State led top-seeded Arizona with under eight minutes to play, was tied with seven minutes left and trailed by one with 3:30 remaining in regulation, but could not pull the upset as the Wildcats came from behind to win, 70-64. The victory sent Arizona to the Elite 8.

The rematch from the second game of the season was a see-saw affair until SDSU turned a 22-20 deficit into a 29-22 lead. After a Rondae Hollis-Jefferson lay-up to break the 9-0 run, Dwayne Polee II canned a three-pointer to put San Diego State ahead by eight, 32-24.

The Aztecs had an opportunity to put the Wildcats away right before halftime, but missed their final three shots and committed two turnovers. Arizona, meanwhile, scored four points the rest of the way to trail San Diego State by just four at halftime.

Despite the missed chance to pull away, the Aztecs stuck to the game plan in the second half and eventually got their lead back up to eight points with 16:41 left in the second half thanks to six points from Xavier Thames.

In just over two minutes, however, Arizona was back within two points. A Thames jumper temporarily halted the Wildcats' momentum, but SDSU was now officially in a battle. The teams traded baskets over the next few minutes with Arizona taking its first lead, 50-49 (7:19), since 7:47 left in the first half.

Nick Johnson, the Pac-12 Player of the Year, missed his first nine shots, but with SDSU trailing by three points, Winston Shepard lost control of the ball near midcourt and Johnson was wide open for a lay-up to put Arizona up, 56-51, with 2:44 left. Johnson then went on to knock down a three and make eight straight free throws to put the game out of reach for SDSU. Including the aforementioned layup, Johnson scored 13 consecutive points for the Wildcats and 15 of the team's final 16.

SDSU was led by its seniors in Thames and Josh Davis. Thames finished with a game-high 25 points, while Davis finished his college career with six points and a game-high 14 rebounds.
