Aztecs Open 2013 Campaign Against Eastern Illinois At The Q

- San Diego State opens its 91st season of football, 45th at the Division I level, the 15th as a member of the Mountain West and the third under head coach Rocky Long on Saturday, Aug. 31 against Eastern Illinois.
- The Aztecs and Panthers have met once before on the gridiron, with San Diego State claiming a 40-7 victory on Oct. 6, 2001. Larry Ned rushed for 285 yards and three touchdowns and J.R. Tolver caught eight passes for 137 yards and two scores in the game.
- The Aztecs have advanced to a school-record three consecutive bowl games. San Diego State is one of just 39 schools nationally to appear in a bowl game each of the past three seasons and joins Stanford as the only schools in the state of California to appear in bowl games following the 2010, 2011 and 2012 seasons.
- After claiming a share of the 2012 Mountain West championship (tied with Boise State and Fresno State), its first league title since 1998, the Aztecs are picked to finish second in the Western Division of the MW this season behind Fresno State.
- The opener features a game between defending conference champions. Eastern Illinois claimed the 2012 Ohio Valley Conference title with a 6-1 record, while San Diego State tied for the Mountain West championship with a 7-1 record. For the Aztecs, it was the 19th league title in school history but the first since 1998.
- San Diego State returns 49 letterwinners, including 17 starters off of the 2012 squad, which won its final seven games of the regular season.
- Year three with Rocky Long in charge begins with three players on major national award watch lists, including senior Nat Berhe (Thorpe Award, Lott IMPACT Award), junior linebacker Jake Fely (Bednarik Award, Lombardi Award) and junior Adam Muema (Doak Walker Award, Maxwell Award).
- Junior running back Adam Muema is scheduled to make the 10th home start of his career. To date, he is averaging 122.78 yards per game and 6.17 yards per rush with six 100-yard rushing games at the Q.
- San Diego State has won four consecutive regular-season home games dating back to last season. The Aztecs are looking for their fifth consecutive win in a regular-season home games which would be the longest such streak since winning five in a row from Oct. 9, 1998 to Sept. 4, 1999.
- San Diego State enters the opener having won seven straight regular-season games. That is the longest stretch for the Aztecs since a seven-game streak from Nov. 15, 1980-Oct. 10, 1981. The last time SDSU had a longer regular-season win streak was a 10-game winning streak from Oct. 16, 1976 to Oct. 1, 1977.
- San Diego State owns a 46-39-5 all-time record in season-opening games, including a 21-22-1 mark during the Division I era. That record improves when those contests occur at home, as the Aztecs are 38-15-4 all-time and 18-6-1 in the Division I era when the lidlifter occurs at home. In the DI era, SDSU is 33-10-1 in its home opener. The Aztecs have won their last two season-openers played at Qualcomm Stadium.
- Eastern Illinois has four all-time victories over FBS schools.
- Saturday mark's the annual KGB SkyShow fireworks extravaganza. This marks the 10th consecutive year that the Aztecs will play host to the event in conjunction with a football game. In previous nine SkyShow games, San Diego State has averaged an attendance of 51,034. The Aztecs have posted a 7-2 record in those contests with an average margin of victory of 21.7 points.

Program Notes

- San Diego State has advanced to three consecutive bowl games. The Aztecs join Stanford as the only football teams in California – college or pro - to advance to the postseason in each of the past three seasons.
- With bowl game appearances in a school-record three straight seasons, San Diego State has equalled its total number of bowls played in the 40 prior seasons (1970 through 2009).
- Between 2000-09, SDSU was 38-80 and owned the nation's 106th highest winning percentage. Since 2010, the Aztecs are 26-13, with the nation's 23rd highest winning percentage.
- Since the beginning of the 2010 campaign, San Diego State has posted a 26-13 record (66.7), tied for the 25th-best record nationally. The only team in the state of California with a better record during that span is Stanford. The 26 wins during the past three seasons is the highest three-year total since the Aztecs went 28-5 in 1975-77.
- San Diego State owns 19 conference championships, but the 2012 Mountain West title was the school's first since claiming the 1998 Western Athletic Conference Pacific Division championship.

Eastern Illinois: The Series

- San Diego State and Eastern Illinois are meeting for the second time in school history. The Aztecs defeated the Panthers, 40-7, on Oct. 6, 2001 at Qualcomm Stadium.
- On game day, it will have been 4,347 days since the schools only meeting to date.
- Both teams won conference titles in 2012, with the Aztecs claiming a share of the Mountain West championship and Eastern Illinois winning the Ohio Valley Conference outright.
- San Diego State owns a 2-0-1 record against current members of the Ohio Valley Conference. In addition to the previous meeting against the Panthers, the Aztecs have a win and a tie against Tennessee State. The teams played during the 1967 and 1968 seasons. In fact, during a stretch in which SDSU went 30-0-1 (from Dec. 9, 1967 through Nov. 14, 1970), the only blemish was a 13-13 tie against the Golden Eagles.



Eastern Illinois-San Diego State Connections

- Eastern Illinois head coach Dino Babers is a San Diego, Calif., native and Morse HS grad and was the wide receivers coach at SDSU in 1994 under head coach Ted Tollner. Also, when Babers was an assistant coach for UCLA in 2007, current SDSU cornerbacks coach Tony White was a graduate assistant.
- Eastern Illinois defensive line coach Tom Freeman graduated from San Diego State and was the offensive line coach at SDSU from 1981-83 under head coach Doug Scovil. In addition, he began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at SDSU under head coach Don Coryell in 1969.
- Current Aztec strength & conditioning coach Adam Hall came off the bench to play quarterback in SDSU's 40-7 win over Eastern Illinois on Oct. 6, 2001. In that game, Hall was 4-for-4 for 107 yards and a touchdown. That adds up to a 407.20 NCAA efficiency rating and a perfect 158.33 NFL mark.
- San Diego State has two players on its roster from the "Land of Lincoln." Joe Morrow and Jordan Watson, a pair of freshmen on the defensive side of the ball are both from Chicago, Ill. Morrow and Watson both attended Hales Franciscan High. Chicago is located approximately 190 miles north of Charleston, Ill., the home of Eastern Illinois University.
- EIU offensive coordinator Kim McCloud (Los Angeles, Calif.) and running backs coach Mike Lynch (Roseville, Calif.) are both

EIU-SDSU Previous Meeting

San Diego State 40, Eastern Illinois 7 >> Oct. 6, 2001 >> Qualcomm Stadium >> San Diego, Calif.

With a group of contented alumni on hand for Homecoming, San Diego State ended a seven-game home losing streak with a 40-7 victory over Eastern Illinois.

A crowd of 20,064 watched the game and witnessed one of the best individual performances in San Diego State history. Larry Ned's 285 rushing yards represent the fourth-best outing in Aztec history with the only three better games all being recorded by reigning NFL MVP Marshall Faulk.

Ned, who climbed to third nationally in rushing with the performance, averaged an astounding 9.4 yards per carry. He also recorded the first three-touchdown game of his career. San Diego State was leading 17-7 at half-time when Ned took over in the third quarter with 122 yards on just nine carries.

However, it was a team effort for the Aztecs, as SDSU topped the 600-yard mark in total offense.

J.R. Tolver caught his first two TD asses of the season and San Diego State countered a 356-yard rushing effort with 273 yards through the air. San Diego State ran 81 plays to just 51 for the unbeaten visitors and one of San Diego State's most lethal weapon, punter Brian Simjanvoski, never saw the field.

The test for the defense was the lethal arm of Tony Romo, who had led the Panthers to near wins at Hawai'i and Toledo in the course of his career. The junior, however, struggled with the pressure as he was sacked five times and was intercepted twice.

Along with the usual headliners, the Aztec youth got into the action as well. Redshirt freshman quarterbacks Jon Stoner and Danny Armstrong combined to go 3-3 through the air for 32 yards in their first action at the collegiate level.

Redshirt freshman running back Justin Green rushed for 73 yards and redshirt freshman receivers Kyle Connerly and Lonnel Penman recorded their first career catches.

Let's Get It Started

- San Diego State owns a 46-39-5 all-time record in season opening games, including a 21-22-1 mark during the Division I era. The Aztecs are 5-9 in opening games since joining the Mountain West in 1999.
- That record improves when the season openers occur at home. The Aztecs are 38-15-4 all-time and 18-6-1 in the Division I era and 5-5 in the Mountain West Conference era when the lidlifter occurs at home. The Aztecs have won their last two season-openers played at Qualcomm Stadium.
- Rocky Long owns a 5-8 record in season-opening games, including a 1-1 mark at San Diego State. The winningest coach in Mountain West Conference history is 5-3 when the inaugural game of the season is at home.

Offensive Quick Hits

- For the second consecutive season, San Diego State returns seven offensive starters from the previous season. The current offensive players have accounted for 125 starts on that side of the ball.
- San Diego State scored 427 points last season and averaged 32.8 points per game. That total was third in the Mountain West and 36th nationally. The 427 points are the fifth most in school history.
- The three highest scoring seasons in the past 16 years have occurred during the past three seasons, 2010 - 455 points/35.0 ppg, 2011 - 387/29.8, 2012 - 427/32.8.
- The seven returning offensive starters for SDSU with career starts in parentheses: LT Bryce Quigley (25), WR Colin Lockett (18), FB Chad Young (18), RB Adam Muema (14), RT Zach Dille (13), TE Adam Roberts (8) and LG Japheth Gordon (7).
- Junior Adam Muema enters the campaign on the Doak Walker Watch List for the nation's top running back. He becomes the third different Aztec back to appear on the list in the last three seasons (Ronnie Hillman in 2011 and Walter Kazee in 2012).
- San Diego State's offensive line has combined for 46 career starts. That number sounds impressive, but keep in mind that Bryce Quigley's 25 starts, most among the o-line, only 13 came at left tackle.
- San Diego State has gone 77 games without suffering a shutout (Nov. 18, 2006 at TCU). That is the only time the Aztecs have been shutout in their last 172 games.

Defensive Quick Hits

- SDSU returns nine starters off a squad that continually gotten better under the direction of third-year head coach Rocky Long, who is in his fifth season as the defensive coordinator. Statistically one of the nation's worst units less than six years ago, Long has transitioned the San Diego State defense into one of the most feared units on the West Coast. Below is a look at the progress made under Long's direction.

- The defensive unit returns a combined 177 starts to their credit. A total of 11 players onto the defensive side of the ball have logged at least one career start, led by DB Nat Berhe (28) and Jake Fely (26).
- A pair of Aztec defensive players are on preseason watch lists as the nation's top player at their position. Senior defensive back Nat Berhe is on the Thorpe Award Watch List (best defensive back) and Lott IMPACT Trophy Award Watch List (impact on and off the field), while junior linebacker Jake Fely is on both the Bednarik Award Watch List (defensive player of the year) and Lombardi Award Watch List (top lineman)
- SDSU has forced three or more turnovers 11 times in the last 25 contests.
- San Diego State has allowed a total of 1,814 yards rushing in its last 15 games combined (120.9). The Aztec defense has held its opponent to 100 yards or less on the ground in seven of the last 18 games.

Aztec Football Picked Second in MW West Division

■ The San Diego State football team was picked to finish second in the West Division of the Mountain West in the 2013 preseason poll, the league announced July 22 in Las Vegas. The poll was voted on by media representatives who cover the conference. The second-place prediction is the Aztecs' highest in the 15-year history of the league, although this is the first year of two divisions in the MW. SDSU was picked to finish third in 1999 and 2004, and averaged a predicted finish of 6.5 from 2005-12. Last season San Diego State was selected fifth and finished in a three-way tie for the conference title with Boise State and Fresno State. It marked the fourth straight year and seventh time in the last eight seasons that the Aztecs finished at or higher than their projected finish. SDSU also picked up one of the 41 first-place votes in the West Division. San Diego State garnered 181 points, including the one first-place vote. Fresno State earned 39 first-place votes and 243 points total in the West Division. San Jose State had 168 points and the other first-place vote to come in third, while Nevada (132), UNLV (69) and Hawai'i (58) rounded out the West.

Boise State paced the Mountain Division with 245 points, including 40 first-place votes. Utah State came in second with 204 and the other first-place vote, followed by Air Force (143), Wyoming (116), Colorado State (90) and New Mexico (63). Additionally, senior Nat Berhe and juniors Jake Fely and Adam Muema each were named to the MW preseason all-conference team, giving the Aztecs three players on the team for the school-record fourth consecutive season.

This marks only the third time in the MW era that SDSU has had multiple players on the preseason all-conference defensive team (also 2004 in Matt McCoy and Kirk Morrison and 2011 in Miles Burris and Leon McFadden). San Diego State joined Fresno State and San Jose State as the only teams with multiple student-athletes on the preseason defensive team.

A two-time all-MW selection at defensive back, Berhe picked up his fifth preseason honor of the summer after earlier being named to the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List (best defensive back) and Lott IMPACT Trophy Watch List (Integrity, Maturity, Performance, Academics, Community and Tenacity), and a first-team all-MW pick by *Phil Steele* and *Athlon Sports*.

Last season Berhe led the Aztecs with 94 tackles, which ranked 10th in the MW and was the highest total for a SDSU player since head coach Rocky Long took over the defense in 2009. He also added five pass breakups, two interceptions and a fumble recovery.

Fely, who was a second-team all-MW pick as a linebacker in 2012, also picked up his fifth preseason honor of the summer. Fely has been named to the Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List (down end-to-end lineman (offense or defense) and linebackers) and Bednarik Award Watch List (Defensive Player of the Year), as well as first-team all-MW honors by *Phil Steele* and *Athlon Sports*.

Last year Fely ranked second on the team with 90 total tackles and 11.5 tackles for loss, while recording a team-high seven sacks.

A running back, Muema was a second-team all-MW selection in 2012. It was the fifth preseason honor of the summer for Muema, who also has been named to the Doak Walker Award Watch List (top running back) and the Maxwell Award Watch List (Player of the Year), and first-team picks by *Phil Steele* and *Athlon Sports*.

Muema rushed for 1,458 yards and 16 touchdowns on 237 carries in 2012, the third-highest yardage ever by a San Diego State sophomore behind Ronnie Hillman and Marshall Faulk. He ranked 17th in the nation with 112.2 rushing yards per game and third among sophomores. He had seven 100-yard performances, including a pair of 200-yard efforts vs. San Jose State and at Wyoming.

Three Aztecs on Watch Lists

- San Diego State has placed three student-athletes on preseason national award watch lists in 2012. Senior safety Nat Berhe, junior linebacker Jake Fely and junior running back Adam Muema are on the initial short list for their respective positions' top honors.

Berhe (Colton, Calif.) is one of 48 players on the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List (best defensive back) and one of 42 on the Lott IMPACT Trophy Watch List (impact on and off the field). Last season Berhe led SDSU with 94 tackles, which ranked 10th in the MW and was the highest total for an Aztec since head coach Rocky Long took over the defense in 2009. He also added five pass breakups, two interceptions and a fumble recovery, while earning second-team all-MW accolades and winning MW Defensive Player-of-the-Week honors on Sept. 10. Berhe was one of only four players to start all 13 games for SDSU last season, leading the Aztec defense to a No. 1 conference ranking in rushing defense, and a No. 3 ranking in both total defense and scoring defense. He has 200 total tackles in his three-year career, and has made 27 consecutive starts.

Fely (Oceanside, Calif.) is one of 75 players on the Bednarik Award Watch List (defensive player of the year) and one of 107

on the Rotary Lombardi Watch List (top lineman). Fely, also a 2012 second-team all-MW selection, was second on the team last season with 90 total tackles and 11.5 tackles for loss, while recording a team-high seven sacks. He also had two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and two pass breakups. Fely, who was named the MW Defensive Player of the Week on two occasions in 2012 (Oct. 13 and Oct. 27), also became just the second Aztec in the past 15 seasons with at least two fumble recoveries, two forced fumbles and 10 tackles for loss in the same season (also Kirk Morrison).

Muema (Covina, Calif.) is one of 63 players on the Doak Walker Award Watch List (top running back) and one of 76 on the Maxwell Award Watch List (player of the year). During the 2012 campaign, Muema rushed 1,458 yards and 16 touchdowns on 237 carries, which marked the third-highest yardage total ever by an SDSU sophomore behind Ronnie Hillman and Marshall Faulk. He was 17th in the nation and third among sophomores last year with 112.2 rushing yards per game. Muema's banner 2012 season also produced seven 100-yard performances, including a pair of 200-yard efforts against San Jose State and at Wyoming. He needs just 289 yards to become the 12th player in Aztec history with 2,000 yards and a 1,100 campaign in 2013 will put him among SDSU's top five.

SDSU Football Names Captains for 2013 Season

■ San Diego State head football coach Rocky Long announced Aug. 19 that seniors Nat Berhe, Colin Lockett and Bryce Quigley have been named captains for the upcoming 2013 season. The three Aztec players were selected in a vote by their teammates the previous week.

Berhe, a defensive back from Colton, Calif., led SDSU with 94 tackles during the 2012 campaign, which ranked 10th in the Mountain West and was the highest total for an Aztec since Rocky Long took over the defense in 2009. He also recorded five pass breakups, two interceptions and a fumble recovery and captured MW Defensive Player of the Week honors following SDSU's victory over Army.

Berhe was one of only four players to start all 13 games for the Aztecs last season, leading the SDSU defense to a No. 1 MW conference ranking in rushing defense and a No. 3 ranking in both total defense and scoring defense. He has compiled 200 total tackles in his three years on The Mesa and has made 27 consecutive starts.

Berhe has collected five preseason honors, earning a spot on the 2013 Jim Thorpe Award and Lott IMPACT Trophy watch lists to along with first-team all-MW recognition by Phil Steele and Athlon Sports. He also landed on the all-MW preseason team as voted by media representatives who cover the conference.

Lockett, a wide receiver/returner from Diamond Bar, Calif., posted the third-highest single-season kickoff return total in school history last year with 777 yards, moving into second place on the Aztec career list in that statistic (1,455 yards). In addition, he ranked 21st in the nation with an average of 25.9 yards per kick return and scored two touchdowns.

Lockett, who has amassed 78 career receptions for 1,163 yards and 11 touchdowns at wide receiver, enters the 2013 campaign with a pair of preseason accolades, garnering second-team all-MW preseason distinction by both Phil Steele and Athlon Sports.

Quigley, meanwhile, was an honorable mention all-MW pick in his first season on the offensive line in 2012, helping the Scarlet and Black rush for a school-record 2,869 yards. The Granite Hills High product started all 13 games at left tackle after playing his first 24 games in an Aztec uniform at tight end.

Earlier this summer, Quigley was selected to Athlon Sports preseason all-MW third team and was an honorable mention all-MW pick by Phil Steele.

Black Defeats Red, 24-14, at SDSU Fan Fest Scrimmage

■ Wide receiver Colin Lockett caught two early touchdowns on Aug. 17, as the Black Squad rolled to a 24-14 victory over the Red Team in San Diego State's annual Fan Fest Scrimmage at Qualcomm Stadium.

Adam Dingwell found Lockett for a 70-yard scoring strike on the first play of the evening and Quinn Kaehler later connected on a 55-yard touchdown pass to Lockett after the first-team defense forced a three-and-out on the ensuing series.

Lockett came up with four catches for 227 yards in the scrimmage, while Dingwell was 6-of-10 for 197 yards. In addition, the rushing attack was spearheaded by Dwayne Garrett, who ran for 60 yards on 8 carries, while De'Shaan Hardwick finished with 47 yards on 11 attempts.

Trailing 12-0, the Red Team finally got on the scoreboard when Billy Vaughn, Jr. intercepted a Jake Bernards pass and rambled 41 yards into the end zone with six-and-a-half minutes to go in the second quarter. However, the Black Squad quickly responded with Dingwell engineering a 10-play, 70-yard march, capped by a Chase Price 7-yard touchdown run. Dingwell overcame a sack and a false start penalty on the drive, connecting with Lockett for 55 yards and finding Tim Vizzi for another eight, before Price's scoring burst restored the 12-point cushion at 18-6.

On the first series of the second half, the Red Team recorded its second defensive score of the scrimmage when Rene Silvano picked off another Bernards pass and raced down the far sideline for a touchdown, trimming the deficit to 18-12.

The score remained unchanged until 11 minutes remaining in the contest when the Black Squad found itself pinned at its own 11-yard line. After a 4-yard loss and an incomplete pass, Cody Galea burst through and sacked Kaehler in the end zone for a safety, narrowing the gap to 18-14.

However, quarterback Chad Jefferies led the Black Squad on a nine-play, 70-yard drive that consumed over six minutes, culminating in an 11-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Jemond Hazely to close out the scoring.

In addition to its two touchdowns, the Aztec defense combined for 10 tackles for a loss to go with six pass break-ups, three sacks, three interceptions and a fumble recovery. Individually, Jake Fely logged five unassisted tackles, including two for a loss, while Vaughn, Jr. finished with five stops (four solos) of his own. The defensive effort also featured an interception by Tony Bell and a fumble recovery by Alex Barrett.

SDSU Completes Football Radio Broadcast Team

■ After switching its radio affiliation to The Mighty 1090 and its sister BCA stations earlier in the spring, San Diego State announced on Aug. 16 that it has filled its football broadcast lineup for the 2013 season. Joining veteran play-by-play announcer Ted Leitner in the booth as color analyst is former Aztec star linebacker Kirk Morrison, while Jeff Lasky assumes the role of sideline reporter. In addition, Ted Mendenhall will serve as host for the pregame, halftime and postgame shows.

Morrison was a four-year letterwinner at SDSU, earning All-America honors in 2003 and 2004. He was named the Mountain West defensive player of the year in 2003 and was the co-recipient of the award the following season. Morrison, who left Montezuma Mesa as the school's second all-time leading tackler, was a third-round selection of Oakland in the 2005 NFL Draft. He spent five seasons with the Raiders before playing the 2010 campaign with the Jacksonville Jaguars, followed by a two-year stint with the Buffalo Bills. During his eight years in the professional ranks, Morrison amassed 566 tackles, seven interceptions and five fumble recoveries.

Lasky, who is in his second year at The Mighty 1090, also covers the San Diego Padres for FoxSports San Diego as a feature producer and reporter to go along with his duties as associate news producer at KGTV Channel 10. In addition, he has broadcasted high school sports, worked on Padres pregame and postgame shows and provided updates as a studio anchor. Before his arrival in San Diego, Lasky served as play-by-play announcer for Montana State football and basketball contests for five years and also called minor league baseball games.

Mendenhall, meanwhile, has worked at The Mighty 1090 in a variety of roles since 2004, including his current stint as producer for Coach John Kentera's show, as well as play-by-play duties for the station's high school football and basketball broadcasts. He has also served as host for The Mighty 1090's College Football Gameday show and worked as a pregame and postgame host for the Padres.

Rocky Long and Bob Toledo: Together Again

■ Rocky Long does not dabble in double-speak. He does not suffer fools, cares not for what-ifs and cuts to the chase with all the subtlety of a samurai addressing a sirlion.

So when it came time to replace offensive coordinator Andy Ludwig in January, one can safely assume that San Diego State's third-year head football coach wasn't suddenly seized by indecision. Where candidates were concerned, Long had prepared a short list. Given its scope, it was a list that could have been penned on the back of a matchbook with room enough remaining for the opening chapter to *Gone With the Wind*.

"I only had two guys on it," Long said. "Thank God the first one took it."

If it was the safe choice, it was no less a sound one. In tabbing Bob Toledo to succeed Ludwig, Long wasn't merely continuing to forge a longstanding friendship, he was also drawing on the experience of a man now in his 40th season of dissecting defenses, a man who openly admits to a fondness for trick plays and an abhorrence for alibis.

Largely recognized for his tenure as head coach at UCLA from 1996-2002, Toledo, in his first season at the helm, hired Long to serve as the Bruins' defensive coordinator. Long spent only two seasons in Westwood, but rest assured that his decision to accept the head coaching position at New Mexico in 1998 had everything to do with opportunity and nothing to do with an oppressive boss.

"Not many people realize this, but when I first became the head coach (San Diego State), I tried to hire him," Long said of Toledo, who served as assistant head coach and offensive coordinator under Long at New Mexico in 2006. "He was still the head coach at Tulane then, but things weren't going so well and I thought maybe he'd like to come back to Southern California."

"He and I obviously have a history together. We have a good friendship. And since we love different sides of the ball (Long has always coached defense, Toledo offense), we've always fit well together. When he was the head coach (at UCLA) and I was the defensive coordinator, not one time did he tell me what to do on defense. There wasn't one time where he second-guessed me."

"The two times that I've hired him as a coach, guess what? He calls every offensive play, he calls every formation and I don't make any suggestions. The only time we talk (during a game) is on the headset when he asks me whether we're going for it or not going for it. That's the only thing that will ever be said between us."

"Maybe it's an age thing, but when you get to a certain level in this profession, whether you're a defensive coordinator or an offensive coordinator, you don't want the head coach in your business. That's the kind of respect we have for each other. I'm not going to bother him and he's not going to bother me. Besides that, he's a pretty good football coach."

The 67-year-old Toledo, once tabbed by Yahoo! Sports as the last "nationally relevant" head coach at UCLA, coached 11 first-team All-Americans while with the Bruins, including quarterback Cade McNown. With McNown, a first-team All-American, under center in 1998, UCLA ranked fifth nationally in scoring offense (40.5 points per game) and eighth in total offense (482.6 yards per game).

Toledo's one-year run as assistant head coach/offensive coordinator at New Mexico was followed by a four-year stint as head coach at Tulane (2007-11). In his first season, Green Wave running back Matt Forte, who became a second-round draft pick of the Chicago Bears, rushed for 2,127 yards, the seventh-highest single-season total in NCAA history.

With nearly four decades of coaching experience in his pocket, Toledo quietly slipped into retirement last year with little interest in extending a coaching career that began at UC Riverside in 1973. That thinking changed, however, when he and his wife of 45 years, Elaine, were watching last year's telecast of the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl, pitting the Aztecs against BYU.

"We're watching the game and she's looking at Rocky and says to me, 'If you ever got back into coaching, that's the only guy I'd want you to coach for,'" said Toledo, a native of San Jose. "A week later, Rocky called me. I'm on the phone and my face is red and she says, 'Oh, damn, it just happened.'"

"I wasn't going anywhere else. I wasn't about to go across the country again. I'm an old guy, but I've still got a lot of energy and I've got a little bit of knowledge. I get along so well with Rocky, we fit so well together. I wouldn't have done it for anyone else."

San Diego State is coming off the best single-season school history. Of its 19 intercollegiate sports, a school-record 11 advanced to NCAA championship play as the Aztecs won a Mountain West-best 12 league titles.

Under the direction of third-year head coach Rocky Long, San Diego State has made a dramatic turnaround.

■ SDSU is one of 39 schools nationally to appear in bowl games each of the last three seasons. San Diego State is one of only two California schools to appear in three consecutive bowl games (Stanford) and is one of only three current Mountain West schools to appear in bowl games in 2010, 2011 and 2012 (Air Force and Boise State).

■ Long's impact has been felt almost immediately, first as the defensive coordinator in 2009-10 and then as the head coach since 2011. SDSU went without a winning season for the nine straight years from 2000-09 when it won 32.2 percent of its games and owned one of the nation's worst records. Below is a look at the dramatic turnaround.

Since 2010, San Diego State is tied with three other teams - Florida, Michigan and Toledo - for 25th place nationally in winning percentage with a 26-13 record.

■ San Diego State owns a 26-13 record over the past three seasons. Prior to the 2010 campaign, it took the Aztecs 80 games to compile 26 victories. San Diego State was 26-54 in the 80 games from Sept. 20, 2003 to the conclusion of the 2009 campaign.

■ San Diego State has gone 41 games with losing three straight games. That period encompasses the entire Rocky Long era. That is the longest such streak without a three-game losing streak since a 46-game stretch spanning 1989 to 1993.



ROCKY LONG

Was one of four NCAA players who visited U.S. servicemen in Vietnam in the summer of 1971, spending two weeks visiting different U.S. bases

Bobby Knight paid Long a home visit and recruited the two-sport athlete to play basketball at Army

Left New Mexico as the all-time leading rusher (2,071 yards) and threw just 23 interceptions in 30 career games

COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

- Has the most all-time victories in the Mountain West with 79.
- Was named the Mountain West Coach of the Year in 2002 and again last season (2012).
- Has 13 years of head coaching experience and has spent 16 seasons as a defensive coordinator.

AT SAN DIEGO STATE:

- Became San Diego State's 18th head football coach on Jan. 12, 2011.
- Was the defensive coordinator at SDSU from 2009-10.
- In 2012, led the Aztecs to a share of the Mountain West title at 7-1. It was San Diego State's 19th conference title, first Mountain West championship and first league title since 1998. The Aztecs were picked fifth in the preseason poll.
- In his first year in 2009, helped SDSU improve defensive marks in points allowed, first downs, first downs, rushing, total defense, third-down conversion percentage, fourth-down conversion percentage, sacks, interceptions and red-zone conversion percentage, among other categories.

AT NEW MEXICO

- Compiled a school-record 65 victories and led the Lobos to five bowl game appearances in his final seven seasons. His teams were bowl eligible in seven of his last eight campaigns.
- In his final nine seasons in Albuquerque, Long's defensive units ranked among the top 30 in fewest yards allowed six times and among the top 40 against the rush every year. In both 2001 and 2003, New Mexico's defense ranked fifth nationally in fewest rushing yards allowed per game.
- While at New Mexico, he coached 13 players selected in the NFL Draft, 10 players who earned All-America honors and had a MWC-high 34 first-team all-conference selections since 2003.

OTHER COACHING EXPERIENCE

- Prior to accepting the head coaching position at New Mexico, Long served as defensive coordinator for 12 seasons at three different schools. He was the defensive coordinator for two years under Bob Toledo at UCLA in 1996-97, for five seasons at Oregon State from 1991-95, and for five campaigns at Wyoming from 1981-85.
- Also served as an assistant coach at TCU, with the CFL's British Columbia team and started his career at New Mexico as a graduate assistant coach in 1972.

PLAYING EXPERIENCE:

- Originally a defensive back, Long became a three-year starter at quarterback for the Lobos from 1969-71. He earned team most valuable player honors and was the Western Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year as a senior.
- Long played professionally in the CFL with British Columbia in 1972-73 and 1975-76. He also competed in the World Football League with the Detroit Wheels in 1974.
- Attended Alta Loma High School in Alta Loma, Calif.

PERSONAL:

- Both of Long's daughters are head coaches at the university level. Roxanne was hired in July of 2012 as the head women's basketball coach at Rogers State University (NAIA) in Claremore, Okla., after four years in the same position at Texas Lutheran (NCAA Division III). Hannah, meanwhile, is the head volleyball coach at Southwestern University, an NCAA Division III school in Georgetown, Texas. She is a four-time conference coach of the year, having compiled a 309-71 (.813) record in nine years, including a pair of regional finals appearances in 2008 and 2009.
