Aztecs To Start MWC Play This Weekend

• The San Diego State Aztecs travel to their lone away Mountain West Conference matches this weekend, playing Brigham Young (4-7-2) at 7 p.m. (MST) Thursday and Utah (7-3-0) at 1 p.m. (MST) Saturday.

Due to a mathematical quirk that does not allow all seven teams to play a balanced MWC schedule of three home games and three away, SDSU alternates between playing four away and two at home and vice versa from year-to-year.

Last Weekend With The Aztecs

• SDSU lost both matches last weekend to Pac-10 powerhouses Arizona State and No. 3 Washington. On Oct. 1, the Aztecs fell to the Sun Devils, 3-0, in Tempe, Ariz. Senior goalkeeper Sophia Perez played all 90 minutes and made four saves in the loss.

On Oct. 3, SDSU dropped a tough 1-0 decision to the third-ranked Huskies at the SDSU Sports Deck. Perez made three stops as the stellar defense of senior Noelle Jouglet, junior Amanda Swiader and freshman Ashley Young limited the Washington offense, who came into the match averaging 11.9 shots and 1.9 goals per game, to nine shots (four on goal).

Where's The Net?

• The Aztecs have been shutout for three consecutive games for the first time in the program's 16-year history. SDSU has gone 341:44 without scoring a goal, which is also the longest time in between goals.

Senior Courtney Burns scored SDSU's last goal 38:16 into the first half to lift the Aztecs to a 3-2 victory over Cal State Northridge on Sept. 24.

The Aztecs have also been shutout seven times in 2004. However, in those seven games, they have only given up seven goals.

Defense Wins Championships

• Offense wins games, but defense wins championships. Through 12 games, the Aztecs have given up 14 goals (1.17 goals per game). It is the least amount of goals allowed in the first 12 games for a SDSU team since the 1998 squad gave up nine goals to start their historic campaign. The 1998 Aztecs went on to finish the season with a 19-3-1 record and advanced to the third round of the NCAA tournament.

The 2004 defense has been led by the all-around play of senior Noelle Jouglet, junior Amanda Swiader and freshmen Kelly Carter and Ashley Young.

Goalkeepers Sophia Perez and Gricelda Alvarez have combined for 56 saves through 12 games (4.67 saves per game) in 2004. The 2001 squad made 98 saves in 18 games (5.44 SPG), the most in a single season by an Aztec team.

The Sophia Watch

• In 11 starts this season, senior goalkeeper Sophia Perez has made 54 saves, while recording a 84.4 save percentage in 1044:00. Perez is 3-5-3 with a 0.86 goals against average. The Aztec single-season record for

goals against average is 0.61 set by Katherine Judkins in 1998.

Scouting the Cougars

• Brigham Young is off to its worst start (4-7-2) in its 10-year history. The Cougars have won four of the five MWC regular season titles and have qualified for the last seven NCAA tournaments.

BYU has played a tough non-conference schedule to get them ready for MWC play, competing against top programs such as Kansas (L, 0-1), Arizona State (L, 2-3), USC (T, 1-1), Arizona (L, 0-1) Hawai'i (T, 0-0) and No. 6 Portland (L, 0-2).

Midfielder/forward Jaime Rendich leads the team in scoring with 12 points on five goals and two assists. Forward Annie Zwahlen (four goals, two assists) and midfielder Bobbi Tillotson (one goal, four assists) have also contributed offensively.

Defender Claire Thomas, a 2003 second-team all-MWC performer, and freshman goalkeeper Erika Woodbury (1.12 goals against average) are BYU's top defenders.

The Cougars lead the all-time series, 7-6. Last season, the Aztecs snapped a five-match losing streak when they shutout visiting BYU, 1-0.

Scouting the Utes

• The Utes are off to a 7-3-1 start and are receiving votes in last week's *Soccer Buzz* poll. Utah is the defending MWC regular season and tournament champions and have advanced to the NCAA tournament in each of its last two seasons.

The Utes' biggest win came on Oct. 1, when they took a 2-1 road victory over No. 7 UCLA. Utah has also played Oregon (W, 2-0), Colorado (L, 0-1) and San Diego (L, 0-3).

Forward Amanda Feigt leads a balanced Utah offensive attack with three goals and three assists for nine points. Forward Chelsea Card (four goals), forward Kim Lloyd (one goal, six assists) and midfielder Hailey Marsh (three goals, one assist) are the other offensive players.

Goalkeepers Ashley Mason (826:13 minutes, 1.20 goals against average) and Glennis Donnelly (200:00, 0.45 GAA) have split time in the net for the Utes.


The Aztecs are 3-7 all-time against Utah, with the Utes taking the last six meetings. SDSU's last win in the series was Oct. 22, 1998, when the Aztecs took a 4-0 road victory.

SDSU in the Mountain West Conference

• Head soccer coaches from the MWC have predicted the Aztecs to finish third in the league in 2004, the team's highest preseason ranking since the 2001 season. Utah was selected to repeat as MWC regular-season champions with 35 points, followed by BYU (32), SDSU (25), UNLV (21), Wyoming (14), New Mexico (11) and Air Force (9).

Did You Know?

• The Aztecs are 8-2 all-time after being shutout two consecutive games.
