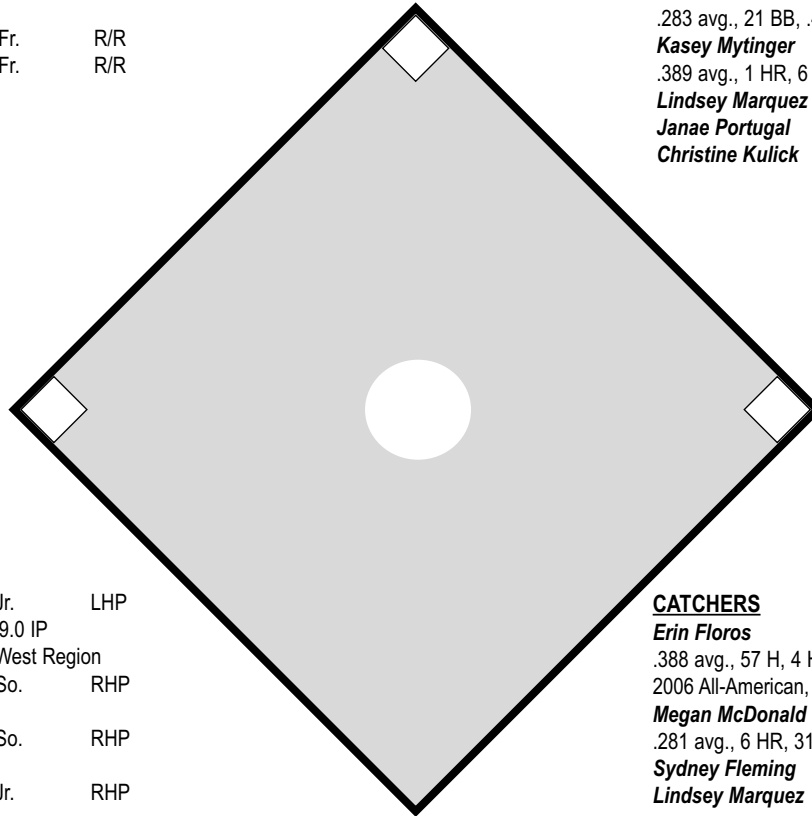

JUNIOR SEASON (2006)

Earned four starts and appeared in 22 games in 2006 ... Started first three games of the season against Cal Poly (Feb. 9), Massachusetts (Feb. 11) and No. 2 UCLA (Feb. 12) ... Drove in a career-high five runs ... Also starred defensively, setting career bests with 12 putouts and eight assists ... Earned an opening game start against the Mustangs (Feb. 9) and promptly hit a game-winning three-run double in the Aztecs' 9-4 victory ... Had an RBI single and scored a run against Western Kentucky on Feb. 23 ... Added an RBI in the second game of a doubleheader at New Mexico on April 23 ... Drove in five runs off her two hits after only recording one RBI her first two seasons ... Scored a career-high six runs for the season ... Runs came against Brigham Young (May 13), at New Mexico (April 23), at Colorado State (April 21), at Brigham Young (March 31), vs. Oregon (March 5), vs. Western Kentucky (Feb. 23) and against Cal Poly (Feb. 9) ... Earned a start at Hawai'i on March 16 and had a sacrifice hit ... Appeared in nine games in league play.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2005)

Saw action in 28 games and earned nine starts ... Batted .250, an improvement of 28 percentage points from her freshman season (.222) ... Had eight hits and scored three times ... Drew two walks for a respectable .294 on-base percentage ... Had a career-high two hits in her only at-bats in SDSU's opening game of a doubleheader against BYU on April 22 ... Had a hit in consecutive games for the first time in her career against Indiana (March 12) and

Longwood (March 19) ... Her double against the Hoosiers was the first of her career ... Had her first RBI in the Longwood game ... Went 4-for-9 (.444) over a stretch from March 12-April 22 and was 6-of-17 (.353) from March 12-April 23 ... Runs came against Longwood (March 19), Georgia Southern (March 18) and UC Santa Barbara (March 18) ... Recorded her first sacrifice hit against Kentucky on Feb. 11 ... Eight of her nine starts came in right field (the other was as a designated player) ... Batted a remarkable .364 when coming off the bench.

Lone freshman on the 2004 Aztec team ... Saw action in May 4 game against Louisiana Tech, her first since playing in March 7 game versus Cal Poly ... JUNIOR SEASON (2006)

Would have been third on the team in batting with a .385 average if she had enough at-bats to qualify ... Finished the season with five hits in 13 at-bats ... SOPHOMORE SEASON (2006)

Named to the Mountain West Conference all-tournament team after batting .556 (5-for-9) with a home run and a team-leading eight RBI ... Tied with four others for first on the team with her seven multi-RBI games ... Third on the team with 29 RBI ... Also was third in doubles (8) and home runs (3) ... Started 46 of the 48 games she appeared in, fourth most on the team ... Had three games with three or more RBI (the most she had in one game in her freshman season was two) ... Went 3-for-5 with a career-high five RBI in SDSU's 21-5, five-inning win over New Mexico on April 23 ... Also homered and scored two runs ... Was 5-for-6 on stolen base attempts ... Hit .450 (9-for-20) during a career-long six-game hitting streak from Feb. 23-March 1 ... Had two hits apiece in three consecutive games (vs. Colorado State - 4/9/06, vs. UNLV - 4/15/06, and vs. UNLV (game two) - 4/15/06) ... Batted .400 (14-for-35) in night games, the second highest night batting average on the team ... Was 11-for-32 (.344) in the month of February ... Over her first two seasons, Casillas is batting .342 (25-for-73) with 16 RBI in the year's shortest month ... Hit .389 (7-for-18) with two home runs and 11 RBI in six games against perennial MWC power Brigham Young ... Was 4-for-8 (.500) with the bases loaded ... Her two homers in MWC play was second most on the team, while her 13 RBI was third ... Aztecs were 14-3 when she scored a run and 13-3 when she had at least one RBI.

FRESHMAN SEASON (2005)

SDSU Single-Season Rankings: T-7th in home runs (4)

Tied Megan McDonald for the team lead with four home runs, despite playing in only 41 of the Aztecs' 57 games ... Four homers were tied for the sixth-most in a single season in SDSU history ... Led the squad with a .410 slugging percentage ... Tied for second on the team with seven doubles and was third in RBI (16) ... Batted .254 (31-of-122) with 15 runs scored ... Had eight multiple-hit games and four multi-RBI games ... Aztecs were 5-3 when she had at least two hits and 3-1 when she had two or more RBI ... SDSU was 8-4 when she batted No. 3 in the lineup ... Hit .324 (12-for-37) from the three spot with five doubles and eight RBI ... Had four-game hitting streaks on three occasions including the first four games of the year (Feb. 4-6) and the last four games of the season (May 8-13) ... Hit safely in 11 of her first 14 games ... Batted .341 (14-for-41) with 10 RBI in the month of February ... Was 4-for-13 (.308) with two RBI in the Mountain West Conference tournament ... Went 3-for-3 and added two RBI in a 3-0 Aztec victory over New Mexico on May 6 ... Recorded her first career three-hit game against BYU on April 22 ... Had two doubles and two RBI against St. Mary's (Feb. 6) ... Went 2-for-3 with two RBI in a SDSU 3-2 win over No. 20 Long Beach State on Feb. 5.

One of the most powerful hitters in school history ... Disciplined at the plate ... A vocal leader.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2006)

SDSU Single-Season Rankings: T-2nd in home runs (6), T-8th in walks (21), 10th in RBI (31)

Hit six home runs, one short of the Aztec single-season record set by Erryn Gutjahr (7) in 1999 ... Led the team with six home runs, tied for the team lead with 21 walks ... Also led the team in hit by pitches (5) and was second on the squad in RBI (31) ... The 21 walks were tied for the eighth-most in a single season, while the 32 RBI was the 10th-most in a season ... One of five Aztecs to record seven multi-RBI games ... Had three or more RBI on three occasions ... Reached base safely in 38 of the 48 games she



played in, including 14 of the 18 MWC games ... Her walk (21) to strikeout (15) ratio of 1.40 was tops on the team for the second consecutive year ... Was intentionally walked a team-high three times ... Led the team with

three MWC homers and was second with 15 conference RBI ... Reached base safely in a remarkable 13 straight games from Feb. 24-March 17 ... Went 1-for-3 with her first career grand slam in the Aztecs' 8-6 win over New Mexico (Game 1) on April 23 ... Had a three-run homer against Colorado State (first game) on April 21 ... After only earning four at-bats (1-for-4, .250) in SDSU's first four games, McDonald went on a tear over her next three contests, batting .778 (7-for-9) with a home run and seven RBI ... Reached base safely in seven consecutive plate appearances during the streak ... Finished 3-for-3 with an Aztec single-game record six RBI against Rider on Feb. 17 ... Went 3-for-4 with a home run, three RBI and two runs scored in the first game of SDSU's doubleheader against Brigham Young on March 31 ... Was 3-for-5 (.600) with the bases loaded ... The Aztecs were 20-4 when she got a hit, 15-1 when she had at least one RBI, 12-0 when she scored a run and 6-0 when she homered.

FRESHMAN SEASON (2005)

SDSU Single-Season Rankings: T-7th in home runs (4)

Tied for the team lead with four homers ... Led Aztecs with 19 walks (seventh in MWC) and two sacrifice flies (tied for fourth in MWC) ... Fell one walk shy of tying for 10th place on the all-time SDSU single season list ... Was second on the team in RBI (19), on-base percentage (.351) and times hit by pitch (five) ... Led the squad with six multi-RBI games and three-RBI games (two) ... Aztecs were 6-0 when she had at least two RBI ... Had eight multiple-hit games, tied for fourth most on the team ... Walk to strikeout ratio (1.0) was the best on the team ... Had a season-long four-game hitting streak from May 6-12 ... Batted a remarkable .583 (7-of-12) during the four-game

stretch, including three consecutive games with two hits ... Committed only four errors in 252 chances behind the plate for a .984 fielding percentage ... Had a home run and drove in two runs against Longwood (March 19) ... Had two hits, including a home run, and two RBI against Southern Utah on March 5 ... Went 1-for-3 with a homer and three RBI in a 4-1 SDSU upset win over then No. 21 Long Beach State ... Made her presence known on The Mesa in her first game, going 2-for-3 with a home run, three RBI and two runs scored.

Played four years for Cactus High School ... Cactus Cobras were the 2003 and 2004 Arizona 4A state champion ... Team posted an outstanding 38-0 record in 2004 ...
