QUICK LOOK

- Although hopes of a Mountain West championship are gone for Fresno State, there are still things on the line. One of those things being another 10-win season.
- With wins this weekend and in the bowl game, Fresno State would earn its third-straight 10-win season. It would be the first time in program history that the Bulldogs have three 10-win seasons in-a-row and Fresno State would have its fifth since 2017.
- Fresno State has had 13 double-digit winning seasons in its program history.
- Fresno State is playing in its third rivalry game of the season after having played for the Milk Can against Boise State (Nov. 4) and the Valley Trophy against San Jose State (Nov. 11). Fresno State won back the Milk Can this season, but lost the Valley Trophy to the Spartans.
- Fresno State wraps up its regular season this weekend in San Diego for its fifth-straight game in the State of California.
- Entering the 2023 season, Fresno State's defense came in with a goal of 25 turnovers gained for this year. And they're almost there. The Bulldogs total 22 turnovers gained with 16 interceptions and six fumble recoveries so far on the year. The 'Dogs are averaging one turnover gained per game, and have seven games with multiple.
- Fresno State's 16 interceptions lead the Mountain West and rank third in the FBS entering this week.
- Keene and Fife have connected with nine different receivers for touchdowns this season. All but two players with a catch have recorded at least one receiving touchdown.
- Malik Sherrod had Fresno State's first kickoff return for a touchdown since 2008 against Boise State (Nov. 4), returning the final kickoff of the first half 95 yards to the house as time expired before halftime.
- Through Week 12 of the college football season, Fresno State was the only school in the FBS who hadn't lost a fumble on the year. That changed last Saturday, but not in typical fashion. Linebacker Levelle Bailey picked off a New Mexico pass attempt, and returned it 41 yards before a Lobo player plucked it from behind and UNM recovered the loose football.

ABOUT THE MATCH UP

- Fresno State is also playing for another trophy this week - the Old Oil Can. Fresno State has had possession of the Old Oil Can Trophy since 2021, and looks to keep it for the third-straight year.
- The second-most played opponent for the Fresno State football program behind San Jose State is San Diego State, who will meet the Bulldogs for the 62nd time on Saturday evening.
- Fresno State plays in San Diego for the first time since 2019 on Saturday.
- Fresno State head coach Jeff Tedford is 3-1 against San Diego State with his only loss coming in 2019.
- Fresno State has four players on its roster from San Diego - Nathan Acevedo (WR), Ezra Christensen (DL), Landon Ogles (P) and Makei Thompson (DB).
- Saturday marks San Diego State head coach Brady Hoke's last game as head coach. Hoke announced his retirement on Nov. 13.
- For his career, Hoke is 104-90 (.536) with stints at his alma mater Ball State (2003-08), Michigan (2011-14) and with the Aztecs (2009-10, 2020-23).

ABOUT THE OPPONENT

Series History

The second-most played opponent for the Fresno State football program behind San Jose State is San Diego State, who will meet the Bulldogs for the 62nd time on Saturday evening.

The 'Dogs trail the all-time series 30-27-4 since the first-ever meeting in 1923. In games in Fresno, Fresno State leads the series 15-13-2.

After an eight-year pause, the Bulldogs and Aztecs renewed their rivalry in 2011 with a nonconference game and have played every season since with Fresno State joining SDSU in the Mountain West in 2012. Prior to 2011, the two schools played once in a nonconference game in 2002 after a stretch from 1992-98 playing as WAC league members. They also had intra-conference stints in the California Collegiate Athletic Association (1940-67) and Pacific Coast Athletics Association (1969-75).

Out of the 61 all-time meetings, 48 of them have been intra-conference battles. Since the 'Dogs moved to the Mountain West in 2012, the 'Dogs are 7-3 against SDSU with wins in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2017, 2018, 2021, and 2022.

Another new environment

Saturday marks Fresno State's first trip to San Diego since 2019, but its third against the Aztecs on the road in that span.

In 2019, the teams faced off at Qualcomm Stadium. Fresno State fell 17-7 that night – the last loss Fresno State has suffered to San Diego State.

In 2021, San Diego State relocated to Carson, Calif. and played its "home" games that season at Dignity Health Sports Park while its new stadium was being built. Fresno State defeated the Aztecs 30-20 that season to take back the Old Oil Can.

The 2023 matchup will be Fresno State's first visit to the new Snapdragon Stadium.

The comeback of all comebacks

The last time these two teams met, Fresno State scored 15 points in just 13 seconds of game time with a 3-yard touchdown run followed by a successful 2-point conversion, then a recovered onside kick, then a 37-yard touchdown pass followed by a PAT.

The quickness of the Bulldogs' efforts were just three seconds shy of the NCAA record for fastest time to score 15 points by one team in a game.

- Utah scored 15 points in 10 seconds to defeat Air Force in the final minute of their game on Oct. 21, 1995.
- The NCAA record for most points scored in a brief period of playing time by one team is 21 points scored in 1:00 of playing time by Miami (OH) against Akron on Oct. 15, 2005.

Three phases to a football game

If there is one thing to be said about the game against San Diego State last year, it's that there are three phases to a football game. For both teams, there were big plays on offense, defense and special teams. The Bulldogs had all three phases working when it mattered most in the win.

- **Offense:** The Bulldogs produced 391 yards of total offense with 394 yards passing and negative three rushing yards. Although the run game was not as prominent as it could have been, QB Jake Haener found a way through the air with a pair of wide receivers in Zane Pope and Nikko Remigio who each had 10 receptions in the win.
- **Defense:** Fresno State's defensive efforts produced five turnovers with three fumble recoveries and two interceptions. At the time, it was the most turnovers the Bulldog defense had in a game since Oct. 16, 2021 at Wyoming.
- **Special Teams:** The Bulldogs' special teams units were an underrated part of the win. First, Elijah Gilliam recovered a muffed punt return by the Aztecs that would set up Fresno State for a short field and successful scoring drive. The special teams play of the game was easily the onside kick by Dylan Lynch that was recovered by Pope to give Fresno State possession and lead to the game-winning drive.

To win 10, you have to win 9

Although hopes of a Mountain West championship are gone for Fresno State, there are still things on the line. One of those things being another 10-win season.

With wins this weekend and in the bowl game, Fresno State would earn its third-straight 10-win season. It would be the first time in program history that the Bulldogs have three 10-win seasons in-a-row and Fresno State would have its fifth since 2017.

Fresno State has had 13 double-digit winning seasons in its program history.

More hardware

Fresno State is also playing for another trophy this week – the Old Oil Can. Fresno State has had possession of the Old Oil Can Trophy since 2021, and looks to keep it for the third-straight year.

This is the 13th season* of the “Battle for the Old Oil Can” Trophy, given to the winning team in the rivalry series between San Diego State and Fresno State.

The trophy stems from the discovery of an old oil can from Fresno (circa 1935) that was recovered during a San Diego State campus building project, said Jacquelyn K. Glasener, executive director of the Fresno State Alumni Association.

“The old oil can,” she said, “likely came from a time when Aztec and Bulldog fans traveled to football games between the two schools via the old, twisting, precipitous Grapevine section of Highway 99 over Tejon Pass.”

“Cars in those days carried extra oil and water to be sure they could make it through difficult trips,” added Jim Herrick, former executive director of the San Diego State Alumni Association. The alumni associations of the two schools purchased an antique oil can to be the basis of the trophy to be awarded to the winner of the rivalry game each time the schools meet.

*This is the 12th game played for the trophy as the 2020 game was canceled due to COVID19.

- Fresno State is playing in its third rivalry game of the season after having played for the Milk Can against Boise State (Nov. 4) and the Valley Trophy against San Jose State (Nov. 11). Fresno State won back the Milk Can this season, but lost the Valley Trophy to the Spartans.

Home Sweet California

Fresno State wraps up its regular season this weekend in San Diego for its fifth-straight game in the State of California.

The Bulldogs' last game outside of California was Oct. 13 at Utah State. Since then, Fresno State has had three home games, a road game at San Jose State and now at San Diego State.

Guys up front looked a little different

Fresno State saw different looks in its offensive and defensive lines last week, missing key players to injuries.

Offensively, left tackle Jacob Spomer suffered a season-ending leg injury at San Jose State. His position was left to fill, and saw Kansas State transfer Kingsley Ugwu earn his first start and significant playtime on the offensive line as a Bulldog. At Kansas State, Ugwu played in one game in the 2022 season.

Defensively, the Bulldogs were missing both tackles in Johnny Hudson Jr and Gavriel Lightfoot who had both started every game of the season up until last week. In their place was Dupre Mendoza and Kavika Baumgartner, both first year Bulldogs as junior college transfers.

Climbing the turnover mountain

Entering the 2023 season, Fresno State's defense came in with a goal of 25 turnovers gained for this year. And they're almost there.

The Bulldogs total 22 turnovers gained with 16 interceptions and six fumble recoveries so far on the year. The 'Dogs are averaging one turnover gained per game, and have seven games with multiple.

- Fresno State leads the Mountain West and ranks sixth in the FBS in turnovers gained.

11 players on Fresno State's two-deep all have at least one thing in common, and that is that they all began their Fresno State careers as walk-ons.

Going from walk-on to two-deep to possibly a starter and even further, to scholarship is no easy path, but for Erik Brooks (WR), Jordan Brown (WR*), Elijah Gilliam (RB), Jake Boust (TE), Osmar Velez (OL), Campbell McHarg (OL*), Charles Remlinger (DE), Malachi Langley (LB), Phoenix Jackson (LB), Camryn Bracha (DB*) and Morice Norris Jr. (NKL) -- they did that.

Brooks, Langley and Norris Jr. are slated as starters in their respective positions. Brown, Gilliam, Boust, Velez, McHarg, Remlinger, Jackson and Bracha are each listed as the No. 2 at their positions.

The two new guys on staff

Tedford brought in two new coaching staff additions, both to the offensive side of the ball in offensive line coach Brian Armstrong and running backs coach Aaron Prier. Both coaches were added to the staff prior to the start of spring ball, so had a full spring, summer and fall to work with their position groups.

Armstrong comes to Fresno State from Montana State. With the Bobcats, Armstrong wore many hats in his seven-year tenure (2016-22) including offensive line coach, tight ends coach, run game coordinator and offensive coordinator.

Prier joins the Bulldog staff after spending two seasons (2021-22) at Eastern Washington as running backs coach and community relations coordinator. Prier got his collegiate coaching experience started at Idaho State, his alma mater.

- While not new to the staff, he is new to the role of quarterbacks coach. Matt Wade spent the 2022 season as an offensive quality control assistant and was promoted to quarterbacks coach in December 2022.

New guy in that spot, again

For the second-straight year and the fourth time since 2017, Fresno State has a new offensive coordinator calling plays. Head coach Jeff Tedford promoted Pat McCann to offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach in Jan. 2023 after just one year of working together. McCann is Tedford's fourth offensive coordinator that he has hired during his tenure as head coach at Fresno State. All three Fresno State offensive coordinators prior to McCann have current positions at Power 5 schools - Kalen DeBoer (head coach - Washington), Ryan Grubb (OC - Washington), and Kirby Moore (OC - Missouri).

The JuCo Route

Fresno State has had good success with recruiting junior college players, and helping them have great careers at Fresno State and beyond. With the new age of the transfer portal, Fresno State has still made a point to recruit players to The Valley out of junior college.

The Bulldogs have added 13 junior college additions for 2023 - Tim Grear Jr. (WR), Artis Cole (WR), Antoine Sullivan (WR), Jaceon Doss (WR), Tyler Carr (TE), Jake Tarwater (TE), Hayden Pulis (OL), Edward Fonua (OL), Kavika Baumgartner (DL), Camryn Bracha (DB), Ezra Christensen (DL), Dupre Mendoza (DL), and Landon Ogles (P).

The portal did good for us too, though

Sure Fresno State added in its fair share of junior college additions, but it also did some work in the transfer portal adding 12 Division I transfers for the 2023 season. QB Mikey Keene (UCF), DB Dean Clark (Kent State), WR Jaelen Gill (Boston College), OL Campbell McHarg (Oregon State), and OL Kingsley Ugwu (Kansas State) are all on the Bulldogs' two-deep.

Why not run it back?

Since the NCAA approved the waiver to allow an extra year of eligibility, several Bulldogs have been with the program for two Mountain West Championship runs - both under the direction of Tedford in 2018 and 2022. Erik Brooks, Steven Comstock, Emoryie Edwards, Isaiah Johnson, Carson King, and Tyrone Sampson Jr. have earned two Mountain West Championships in their careers, and have the chance at a third in 2023.

Fresno State has a total of 14 players who are using their extra year of eligibility in 2023 - Brooks, Comstock, Edwards, Johnson, King, Sampson Jr., Raymond Scott, Levelle Bailey, Morice Norris Jr., Johnny Hudson Jr., Nick D'Ambra, Daniel Taumalolo and Jacob Isaia.

Dudes with degrees

Fresno State has 21 student-athletes on its roster with a degree. Four of those 21 are graduate transfers into the program this season - Mikel Barkley (Psychology), Dean Clark (Management Information Systems), Jaelen Gill (Communications) and Tuasivi Nomura (Business Administration).

In addition to the four above, Levelle Bailey, Tanner Blount, Devo Bridges, Erik Brooks, Jordan Brown, Steven Comstock, Nick D'Ambra, Emoryie Edwards, Jacob Isaia, Isaiah Johnson, Carson King, Malachi Langley, Abraham Montano, Morice Norris Jr., Raymond Scott, Tyrone Sampson Jr. and Osmar Velez have their degrees and are currently in a master's program at Fresno State.

STUDENT-Athletes

Fresno State had a program record 53 football players who were named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team last season. To be eligible for 2022 Fall Academic All-Conference honors, student-athletes must have completed at least one academic term at the member institution, while maintaining a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better and must have competed in 50 percent of the team's completed varsity contests.

Orgullo del Valle (Pride of the Valley)

Fresno State's Sept. 9 home opener against Eastern Washington made history as the first exclusively Spanish-language television broadcast in FBS college football history. In partnership with Univision Fresno and Bakersfield, the game was broadcast on UniMás throughout the Central Valley, and it was the first American college football game to air on a Univision channel.

The broadcast featured six-time Emmy Award winning sportscaster Jessi Losada as the play-by-play announcer.

Fresno is the ninth most diverse city in the nation, with a Hispanic population of nearly 60%. Fresno State is designated by the U.S. Department of Education as a Hispanic-Serving Institution, with an enrollment of 57% Hispanic students.

Fans who were seeking an English-language broadcast could stream the game via the Mountain West Network, which incorporated the radio broadcast from the Bulldog Sports Network, featuring Paul Loeffler, Pat Hill and Cam Worrell. Fans could also utilize LEARFIELD's Varsity Network app to sync the Bulldog Sports Network radio broadcast with the UniMás television broadcast.

Shoutout the Red Wave

Fresno State has been on the rise when it comes to attendance numbers in the last few years, trending towards 40,000-plus crowds for nearly all six home games of the 2022 season. Fresno State averaged a conference-high 39,067 fans per game in 2022, nearly filling the 40,727 capacity stadium that is Valley Children's Stadium. Fresno State had three crowds of more than 40,000 fans in attendance last season, including two sellouts.

Fresno State's average attendance in 2022 was its highest in a season since 2005. Fresno State was third among all G5 schools for average attendance in 2022, while also having a higher average than several Power 5 schools including Cal, Boston College, Georgia Tech, Vanderbilt, Oregon State and others.

2023 was off to a hot start as Fresno State announced a sellout for its home opener against Eastern Washington (Sept. 9). It was the first time Fresno State sold out its home opener since hosting Nebraska in the 2014 opener. It was the first sellout for Fresno State against an FCS opponent since 2004.

In the Sept. 23 contest, Fresno State saw its most students in attendance at the stadium with 6,800 students there to watch the matchup with Kent State. FRESNO STATE TEAM NOTES

Taking "Family" to another level

Programs always preach "family" and "brotherhood", but at Fresno State it goes far beyond just a recruiting pitch or casual phrase. It's much more than that here. It's quite literal here.

Fresno State has two sets of brothers – Joe and Mac Dalena, and Augustus and Charles Remlinger – and a set of cousins – Seth and Steven Scheidt – on its current roster.

The program also welcomed son of former Bulldog great David Carr and nephew to Derek Carr in sophomore tight end Tyler Carr.

Legacy player Devon Rivers (RB) enters his freshman season and looks to follow in the footsteps of his father Ron Rivers (1991-93) and older brother Ronnie Rivers (2017-21) as greats in the program. Brother Ronnie left the program as the all-time leading scorer. Both Ron and Ronnie are among the top in rushing records in Fresno State history.

The Dalena duo just missed playing on the same team with older brother Frank who was a Bulldog wide receiver from 2016-19. Joshua Johnson, a current Bulldog wideout, is the younger brother of former Bulldog receiver Justin Johnson (2012-15).

Former Bulldog head coach Pat Hill remains around the program as the analyst on the Bulldog Sports Network, calling the games as a part of the radio crew for nine seasons. Hill's son Zak Hill, who was a Bulldog safety from 2008-11, is also around the program in 2023 as one of the team's doctors.

Ring of Honor

Fresno State Athletics announced in July that it will transition its football retired jersey recognition format to a Ring of Honor format. The adjustment will allow the department to appropriately honor the contributions of the deserving individuals throughout its history who have made a transformative impact on the Bulldog football program.

The inaugural 2023 Ring of Honor class will feature two Bulldog legends in former head coaches Jim Sweeney (1976-77, 1980-96) and Pat Hill (1997-2011). Jim Sweeney was inducted posthumously during halftime of the Sept. 9 home opener against Eastern Washington and Pat Hill was inducted during halftime of the Homecoming game against UNLV (Oct. 28).

The Fresno State football alumni who previously had their jerseys retired will continue to hold that distinguished distinction and are now also considered charter members of the Ring of Honor. Those include nine former players – #4 Derek Carr, #8 David Carr, #9 Kevin Sweeney, #12 Trent Dilfer, #14 Vince Petrucci, #15 Davante Adams, #21 Dale Messer, #22 Lorenzo Neal and #83 Henry Ellard.

FRESNO STATE OFFENSE NOTES

Mikey Keene: Year 1

The year hasn't gone perfectly for Keene, who has battled a plethora of different injuries throughout the season, but has still managed to be a playmaker, a winner and a leader for the Bulldogs.

Despite seeing significant action in only nine games this season, Keene ranks No. 3 in the MW in passing yards (2,406) and passing yards per game (240.60). As Fresno State's starter this season, Keene is 7-2. Keene did not finish the game in those two losses, coming out with injury at Wyoming and at San Jose State.

This season, Keene has thrown for 2,406 yards for a 66.6 clip, the best completion percentage in the Mountain West. He has completed 231-of-347 pass attempts, throwing eight interceptions and 21 touchdowns. His 21 passing touchdowns are the second-most in the MW and currently ties for 14th most by a Bulldog in a season in program history.

Keene has three games with four passing touchdowns, the most by any QB in the conference. No other QB has more than one. His three games with four passing touchdowns is already enough for fourth most in a career by any Bulldog QB in program history.

Everybody eats

Fresno State's offense isn't dependent on just one person, whether in the running game or in the passing game.

Both quarterbacks and OC Pat McCann have done a good job at spreading the offense as the season has progressed. McCann has been transparent about having a 50/50 run to pass ratio target in his play calling in games. Keene and Fife have connected with nine different receivers for touchdowns this season. All but two players with a catch have recorded at least one receiving touchdown.

In the run game, Fresno State has featured two backs in Malik Sherrod and Elijah Gilliam. Others with play time include Johnathan Arceneux and Devon Rivers. Sherrod leads the team in rushing yards and touchdowns.

Let Leek cook

Malik Sherrod has been Fresno State's featured back this season with the graduation of Jordan Mims, who was the program's first 1,000 yard rusher since 2013, a season ago. Sherrod stepped up big in those shoes, both on the field with his production and off the field with his leadership.

Sherrod ran for a career-high 132 yards on 21 carries and taking on one rushing score in Fresno State's 37-30 win over Boise State on Nov. 4. It was his third 100-yard rushing game in the last six games, with each of the three coming in conference play.

His performance against Boise State was special, running against one of the top run defenses in the country. Sherrod's 21 carries were the most attempted by a single player against the Broncos this season. He also recorded the most rushing yards by a single player against a team that ranked 25th in the country in rushing defense. He added a 52-yard touchdown run that was the longest run given up by the Broncos on the year.

Sherrod also added four receptions for 28 yards. With an additional 95 kickoff return yards, Sherrod totaled 255 all-purpose yards on the night, the 10th-most in a game in Bulldog football history.

The Youngin'

Entering college ahead of the 2022 season, wide receiver Jalen Moss was rated one of the Top 5 recruits from the Mountain West in his signing class.

Signing to the Bulldog program out of Menlo-Atherton High School in Northern California, Moss was following in the footsteps of some notable Bulldog alumni who left their mark on the program as two of the best to do it as Bulldogs in their positions out of Menlo-Atherton HS – receiver Davante Adams (2011-13) and running back Jordan Mims (2017-22). Adams is Top 5 in career receptions (2nd), receiving yards (4th) and receiving touchdowns (1st) in the program's history. Mims, who is newly out of the program following his graduation last season, finished his career in the Top 5 in career rushing yards (4th), rushing touchdowns (T3rd) and rushing attempts (2nd).

Moss is currently second on the team with 613 yards on 49 catches. He also adds five receiving touchdowns on the year. The redshirt freshman leads the team with two 100-yard receiving performances this season, becoming the first Bulldog freshman or redshirt freshman since Adams in 2012 to have multiple 100-yard receiving games in a single season.

Although having redshirted in 2022, Moss earned valuable game-like experience from an incredibly veteran wide receiver room a season ago with now-NFL players in Jalen Cropper (Dallas Cowboys) and Nikko Remigio (Kansas City Chiefs IR). Moss was the only true freshman receiver to see consistent time away from the scout team offense last season. That opportunity has translated into what we are seeing from the young 'Dog on the field this season.

FRESNO STATE DEFENSE NOTES

Interceptions. Interceptions. Interceptions.

Fresno State's 16 interceptions lead the Mountain West and rank third in the FBS entering this week.

The 16 picks are the most by the Bulldogs as a team since having 19 in 2018.

Everybody has been in on the action when it comes to the interceptions. Cornerback Carlton Johnson leads the team and the Mountain West with four picks, and linebacker Levelle Bailey adds three of his own. Six others have at least one interception this season, bringing the total to eight players with at least one.

The eight different players with an interception is the most for the Bulldogs since the 2019 team had eight. The 2019 team had nine. The 2004 team also had nine, and two years earlier, the 2002 team had 11 different players record an interception.

Fumbles are never ideal, but this one hurt

Through Week 12 of the college football season, Fresno State was the only school in the FBS who hadn't lost a fumble on the year. That changed last Saturday, but not in typical fashion.

Linebacker Levelle Bailey picked off a New Mexico pass attempt, and returned it 41 yards before a Lobo player plucked it from behind and UNM recovered the loose football.

Fresno State is still No. 1 in the FBS in fumbles lost, tying with five programs who have lost only one this season.

Have to stop the run

It's no secret that Fresno State's run defense has struggled the last two weeks, allowing both San Jose State and New Mexico to run for over 300 yards with individual rushers recording over 200 yards in both games.

San Jose State's Kairee Robinson was the first player to rush for over 200 yards against the Bulldogs since Boise State's Alexander Mattison in 2018. A week after allowing Robinson to get away for 200 yards, New Mexico's Jacory Croskey-Merritt hung 209 yards on the Bulldog defense.

Bailey called GAME.

Team Captain. Super Senior. Starting Linebacker. A lot of different terms can be used to explain Levelle Bailey, but one this year stands out among the rest – playmaker.

For the third time this season, it was Bailey who called GAME. As UNLV started a potential game-winning drive at their own 48-yard line on Oct. 28, the Rebels moved the ball down to the Bulldogs' 8-yard line with 19 seconds left. After two incomplete passes, the captain sealed the game, intercepting Jayden Maiava in the middle of the field.

In the season opener at Purdue (Sept. 2), Bailey batted down a fourth down pass attempt by Purdue late in the fourth quarter, forcing a turnover on downs on the Boilermaker's final offensive possession of the game.

Against Eastern Washington (Sept. 9), Bailey grabbed his first interception of the season and his first since 2021 in Eastern Washington's first play of its offensive drive in the second overtime period, ending the game and sealing the deal for a Fresno State victory.

The leader of the defense

Senior linebacker Levelle Bailey leads the defense, and has been one of its leaders for many years. The Sacramento, Calif. native has played in more Fresno State football games than anybody else on the roster, having played in every game of his career (56 games) and started in 47 over the years. As a true freshman in 2019, Bailey was one of the youngest players to see the field both on special teams and on defense. That season, he played in all 12 games and earned five starts. Recruited to Fresno State by Tedford, Bailey proved his talents quickly.

A trusted and respected leader of the defense, Bailey is starting to get recognition as one of the top linebackers in the conference. Elevating himself each season, Bailey has totaled 263 tackles, 22.5 tackles for loss, 4.5 sacks, five forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and six interceptions. This season, Bailey was named to a handful of watch lists. He is a three-time All-Mountain West honorable mention selection (2020, 2021, 2022), and looks to build on that in his final year of collegiate football.

- Bailey is just 16 tackles shy of cracking the Top 10 for career tackles at Fresno State. If he hits the 16 tackles this season, he would become the first Bulldog since Jeff Allison (2016-18) to make the Top 10.

FRESNO STATE SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

Dylan Lynch and the records

Sophomore kicker Dylan Lynch had a record-setting performance at Arizona State (Sept. 16), tying the program's record for most field goals made in a game (5) and setting a new record with 7 attempts in a game.

Lynch was 5-of-7 with a long of 50 yards in his FG attempts last weekend, scoring a total of 17 points with his leg. It was the most points scored kicking since 2017.

At Purdue, Lynch fired off a career-long 52-yard field goal for the first 50+ yarder for the Bulldogs since 2017. His 52 yarder was the longest by a Bulldog kicker since 2010.

- Lynch is the first Bulldog kicker to have two FGs of 50+ yards in a single season since Kevin Goessling in 2010.

Dylan Lynch: The Onside Kick Kicker

For the second time in his two-year career, sophomore kicker Dylan Lynch kicked an onside kick that was recovered by the Bulldogs.

In 2022, Lynch was the leg behind the kick sparked life in a Fresno State team that came back to defeat San Diego State in come-from-behind fashion as the Bulldogs scored 22 unanswered points against the Aztecs to close out the game, with 15 of those points coming in the fourth quarter and all within the final 70 seconds of play time.

At Wyoming, Lynch did it again. A perfectly executed kick found the hands of Al'zillion Hamilton on the left side to maintain possession with Fresno State in an attempt to close in on the Wyoming lead.

- Prior to the 2022 season, Fresno State had not had a successful onside kick recovery since 2015.

2023 was the year

The drought has ended.

Malik Sherrod had Fresno State's first kickoff return for a touchdown since 2008 against Boise State (Nov. 4), returning the final kickoff of the first half 95 yards to the house as time expired before halftime.

Fresno State had 647 kickoffs without a return for a touchdown until that Nov. 4 game. Sherrod had the 11th kickoff return for a touchdown in Fresno State program history.

Can your specialists say they did the same?

Seniors Nick D'Ambra (long snapper) and Carson King (punter) set a goal this offseason to row the length of the San Joaquin River – the longest river in California - on the team's rowing machine. The river is 366 miles long.

The duo was not asked to or assigned this workout, but held each other accountable. With some help from a handful of teammates, D'Ambra and King rowed a combined 366 miles on the weight room's rowing machine.

The man, the myth, the legend

When it comes to special teams, John Baxter is your go-to guy. Baxter. With nearly 40 years of coaching on his resume, he has experience coaching special teams, tight ends, wide receivers, running backs, linebackers and the defensive line. With the Bulldogs, he leads the special teams efforts and the tight ends. Baxter previously spent the 1997-2009 seasons on staff at Fresno State. In 13 years at Fresno State, Baxter was the associate head coach and special teams coach in addition to also handling either the tight ends (1997-01, 03, 09) or wide receiver (2002, 04-08) position groups.

The 2022 season showed just how special and critical special teams play can be for games. Baxter did just what he was expected with the special teams units in his first season back. Fresno State's special teams ranked No. 15 overall in the FBS, according to Football Outsiders and its efficiency index ratings.

Fresno State led the FBS, averaging 19.92 yards per punt return in 2022. Behind the legs of senior returner Nikko Remigio, Fresno State was able to cross something off its list that it hadn't done in nearly 10 years -- a punt returned for a touchdown. Remigio had two last season, and Fresno State was one of 14 schools from across the FBS to have multiple punt return TDs in that same season.

Fresno State led the Mountain West in kickoff returns. The 'Dogs ranked No. 26 in the FBS in kickoff returns last season. The 'Dogs also were in the Top 20 nationally in blocked kicks with two blocked punts and one blocked PAT. It was the first time since 2018 that Fresno State blocked a punt in a game.

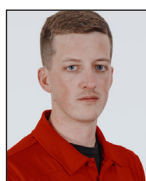

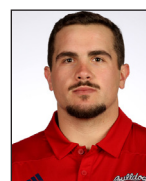

COACHING YEARS

The Fresno State coaching staff is loaded with former Bulldog players and coaches, and years of experience in coaching at the college and professional level. Below are some notes about the staff:

- Eight coaches on staff (including Tedford) have previously coached at Fresno State at one point in their careers.
- All but one coach from the defensive side of the ball (Nelson) coached together under Pat Hill in the late 90's.
- Notably, Tedford (OC), Kevin Coyle (DC) and John Baxter (ST) were all coordinators at Fresno State under Coach Hill.
- Tedford also coached under Jim Sweeney alongside Jethro Franklin as offensive coordinator while Franklin led the defensive line.
- Four members of the coaching staff are Fresno State alums, including Tedford. Joining Tedford as Bulldog alumni are Franklin (DL), Williams (DB) and Tim Skipper (LB).
- Since 1981, at least one member of the current coaching staff has been in the program each season outside of the four years from 2012-16.
- Combined, the staff has over 200 years of collegiate coaching experience and 36 years of professional football coaching experience.

Additional staff notes:

- Fresno State's Assistant Athletics Director for Football Operations and Chief of Football Staff Mike McHugh has ties to Coach Tedford that run far deeper than their time together as Bulldogs. The 2023 season is the 14th season that the pair has spent together dating back to 1999. Tedford and McHugh were together as Bulldogs in 2018 and 2019, as well as 10 seasons (2003-12) at California. The two were also on the same Oregon staff (1999-2000) when Tedford was the Ducks' offensive coordinator.
- Fresno State's offensive graduate assistant Matt Smith is in his second season in this role, having graduated as a Bulldog offensive lineman in 2021. Smith also played under Coach Tedford, as his six-year career span over the 2016-21 seasons.

Since taking over the reins of his alma mater, Jeff Tedford has taken the Bulldog football program to new heights. In four seasons as the head coach, Tedford led Fresno State to three West Division titles, two Mountain West Championship wins, three Bowl Game victories, and two Top 25 finishes to cap a season.

Tedford coached Fresno State to three 10-win seasons in his tenure (2017, 2018 and 2022). He has the second-most 10-win seasons as head coach in Fresno State football history, behind Jim Sweeney (1976-96). Tedford coached the Bulldogs to their winningest season in program history with 12 wins in 2018.

In his first stint as the Bulldogs' head coach, Tedford inherited a 1-11 football program when he was first announced as head coach. In four seasons as head coach, he has led the program to a 36-18 overall record and a 23-9 record in Mountain West play.

Summary:

Tedford, who coached the Bulldogs for the 2017-19 seasons, made his return to the helm of the program for his second stint as head coach of his alma mater. Tedford was hired as head coach of the program on Dec. 8, 2021.

The 2022 season was one that will be remembered for years to come. Fresno State became the first program in FBS history to begin its season 1-4, and finish with 10 wins. Fresno State closed the 2022 season with 9-straight wins to end the year with a 10-4 record, highlighted by a Mountain West Championship title and a dominant 29-6 win over Washington State in the Jimmy Kimmel LA Bowl. Fresno State's winning streak enters the 2023 season as the third-longest active winning streak in the FBS.

The Bulldogs finished the season ranked No. 24 in the final release of the AP Poll and the Coaches Poll for 2022. It was just the fourth time in program history that the Bulldogs closed out the year as a nationally ranked team, and the second time under Tedford. After finishing in the Top 25, Fresno State cemented itself as the only program in the Mountain West to appear in the Top 25 at any point in the season.

In 2022, Fresno State had 12 All-Mountain West selections, including first team honorees in quarterback Jake Haener, wide receiver Jalen Cropper, running back Jordan Mims and defensive end David Perales. Fresno State's four first team selections in 2022 were the most for the Bulldogs since the 2018 season. Also of note, Haener became the first Bulldog to earn a first team All-Mountain West nod since Derek Carr in 2013.

Tedford stepped away from coaching following the 2019 season due to health concerns, although still residing in the Valley.

In 2019, Fresno State finished 4-8. Five of Fresno State's eight losses that season were decided by one possession, notably falling by a small margin to both USC and Minnesota that season. The Bulldogs were highlighted by first team All-Mountain West linebackers Mykal Walker and Justin Rice in 2019. Six Bulldogs were honored by the conference that season, in addition to Walker and Rice, running back Ronnie Rivers earned second team honors, and defensive lineman Kevin Atkins, punter Blake Cusick and defensive back Juju Hughes were honorable mention selections. Rice was tabbed the preseason Defensive Player of the Year by the conference, entering the 2020 season. Walker and Hughes went on to have professional NFL careers.

In 2018, in addition to defeating Boise State on the road in overtime, 19-16, for Fresno State's first conference championship since 2013, the Bulldogs capped the season with a 31-20 triumph over Arizona State to win the Mitsubishi Motors Las Vegas Bowl. The bowl win left the Bulldogs with their first 12-win season in the 97-year history of the program. This, one season after engineering one of the greatest turnarounds in FBS history guiding the Bulldogs to a 10-4 record, an appearance in the MW title game and a Hawai'i Bowl win over Houston.

The renaissance under Tedford has led to FBS history being made as Fresno State became the first team to secure back-to-back double-digit winning seasons following a double-digit loss season.

The 2018 Bulldogs finished nationally ranked in the final rankings of the season for the first time since 2004. Fresno State finished ranked No. 18 in both the AP Top 25 and Coaches poll, announced Jan. 8, 2019. It was the best finish in the AP Top 25 in program history, besting No. 22 in 2004. The 'Dogs also held a No. 21 ranking in the final College Football Playoff poll released on Dec. 2, 2018.

Individual accolades in 2018 included Tedford being named an Eddie Robinson Award finalist and a Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award finalist. Fresno State sported 15 all-conference honorees in 2018, including the league's Defensive Player of the Year in linebacker Jeff Allison. In addition, 19 student-athletes were named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

With a 10-4 record in his first season, Fresno State became the third team in FBS history to turn a double-digit loss season (2016) into a double-digit win season (2017) the following year. The season included an appearance in the nation's top 25, clinching the Mountain West's West Division crown and leading the 'Dogs to their first appearance in the MW Championship game since 2014. He also guided the 'Dogs to the program's first bowl victory since 2007 with their win at the Hawai'i Bowl.

Great success brought great notoriety as Tedford was named the 2017 Mountain West Coach of the Year, was a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award presented by the Maxwell Football Club, a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award, and the AFCA Region-5 Coach of the Year.

While Tedford was honored as the league's coach of the year, the team had 16 student-athletes recognized with MW postseason honors - the most for the Bulldogs in a single-season since joining the conference in 2012. In the classroom, the 'Dogs also set a team-best number since joining the conference as they had 24 named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

Tedford, a former Bulldog quarterback and Fresno State assistant coach, returned to the Valley after holding the position of offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies - a 2016 College Football Playoff team.

Tedford assumed the role of acting head coach on Nov. 27, 2016, following the conclusion of the 2016 season as Eric Kiesau carried out interim head coaching duties for the remaining two games on the 2016 schedule following Tedford's introductory press conference. Tedford was officially hired on Nov. 10, 2016.

Tedford, who was an already proven winner on the West Coast, came to the Valley with 11 years of head coaching experience at the Division I level - having led the California Golden Bears to 82 wins from 2002-2012. He left as the school's all-time winningest coach.

Tedford's ties to the Valley and Fresno State run deep. He played quarterback at Fresno State in 1981-82 under Jim Sweeney and coached at Fresno State under Sweeney from 1987-88 and 1992-96, and under a then-first-year head coach Pat Hill in 1997.

Tedford's coaching career started at Fresno State, volunteering as an assistant for the 1987-88 seasons. From there he picked up his first full-time position as an assistant for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League - a familiar league in which he played quarterback for six seasons after his collegiate career at Fresno State.

He returned to Fresno State in 1992 as the quarterbacks coach and served as the offensive coordinator for the Bulldogs over the ensuing five seasons.

Tedford held the same position at Oregon (1998-2001) before he became the head coach at Cal. He was named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year twice, leading the Golden Bears to a school record seven consecutive bowl games and to a conference title in 2006.

Following Tedford's stint at Cal, he moved on to the NFL in 2014 as the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' offensive coordinator. The stop did not last long due to health issues during the pre-season that evolved into an indefinite leave of absence, which resulted in the two sides mutually agreeing to part ways.

Tedford made his return to the CFL in 2015 as he was named the head coach of the B.C. Lions. At the conclusion of the season, Tedford elected to exercise an option in his contract to resign and pursue opportunities in college football.

Tedford made his return to college football as an offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies under head coach Chris Peterson in 2016. A relationship rekindled after their time together as assistants at Oregon under then-coach Mike Belotti. Washington's staff also included associate head coach Bob Gregory, who served as Tedford's defensive coordinator at Cal for eight seasons.

Tedford graduated from Warren High School in Downey, California and attended Cerritos Junior College for two seasons before becoming the Bulldogs' quarterback in 1981.

He and his wife Donna have two children, Taylor and Quinn. Quinn and his wife Randi have two sons, Tanner and Tyce - Tedford and Donna's first grandchildren.

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. – In dramatic fashion, redshirt sophomore quarterback Mikey Keene led Fresno State to a 39-35 come-from-behind win in the final minutes against Purdue on Saturday afternoon at Ross-Ade Stadium. Trailing by three with 4:30 remaining, the signal caller led a 79-yard scoring drive in just over three-and-a-half minutes in his Bulldog debut.

Keene finished with 366 yards passing on 31-of-44 attempts while throwing four touchdowns. It was the most yards passing by a Fresno State quarterback in their first start in at least 25 years. Two of Keene's scores found the hands of Erik Brooks who had a career-high day with 170 yards on nine receptions.

Fresno State's win was its first on the road against a Big Ten opponent since Dec. 5, 2009 at Illinois (53-52).

How It Happened

Purdue was hot from the start, using a three-play 92-yard drive to get on the scoreboard. The Bulldog defense gave up an 84-yard touchdown pass on the Boilermakers' opening score.

Once settled, Keene and the Bulldog offense began to click. Keene connected with Mac Dalena and Tre Watson in back-to-back attempts to move the ball down the field. Keene found Brooks on a 29-yard touchdown pass to tie the game at seven with 7:26 left in the first quarter. The Bulldog defense held Purdue to six attempts at the 1-yard line to end the first quarter. Purdue opened the second quarter with the punch-in to take a 14-7 lead.

The shootout began as Keene led the offense to a game-tying drive on Fresno State's following possession. Keene found Brooks for a 49-yard completion. Three plays later, Keene scrambled and found a wide-open Jalen Moss in the back corner of the end zone to tie the game at 14.

Purdue scored on its following possession to take a 21-14 lead. Fresno State trekked down field, but couldn't find the end zone. Dylan Lynch's kick from 21 yards out was no good. The Bulldog defense forced a three-and-out, and the 'Dogs had 22 seconds of clock time before the halftime break. Lynch redeemed himself as he kicked a career-long 52-yard field goal to put the 'Dogs within four at the half, 21-17.

Purdue returned the second half's opening kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown, extending the Boilermakers' lead to 28-17.

The Bulldog offense had a glimpse of some new faces in its next scoring drive as freshman running back Devon Rivers had the first two carries of the drive, including a 14-yard gain. The Keene and Brooks connection stayed strong with a 24-yard reception to set the 'Dogs up at the Purdue 19-yard line. Jaelen Gill recorded his first touchdown as a Bulldog on an 18-yard completion from Keene. The 'Dogs were successful in their 2-point conversion attempt as Keene found Moss to make it a three-point game, 28-25.

The legs of Elijah Gilliam got the 'Dogs a total of 42 yards in their next offensive drive. The running backs continued the power as Malik Sherrod took the pitch from Keene and scampered in from one-yard out to take the lead 32-28 at the start of the fourth quarter.

Purdue answered with positive gain on its next drive, but the Bulldog defense stayed strong at the goal line. In a pass attempt to take the lead, Bulldog safety Dean Clark was there on the protection to force a fourth down for Purdue. The Boilermakers chose to go for it, but were met by a tough Bulldog front who kept them out of the end zone with 8:13 left on the clock.

Facing a third-and 8, Keene was intercepted at the Purdue 45-yard line. Two plays later, the Boilermakers took a 35-32 lead with 4:36 remaining.

That's when Keene took over. The Bulldogs' newest quarterback went 6-of-6 on Fresno State's final drive, culminating in a 22-yard strike to Brooks in the end zone giving the Bulldogs a 39-35 lead with 59 seconds remaining.

Purdue got down to its own 44-yard line, but on fourth-and-2, defensive captain Levelle Bailey got a hand on a Hudson Card's attempt to seal the game.

FRESNO, Calif. – Playing in its first double overtime game since 2019, Fresno State defeated Eastern Washington 34-31 in its home opener on Saturday night. Levelle Bailey ended the game with an interception on the Eagles' first play of the second overtime.

Elijah Gilliam finished the night with 86 yards rushing and a career-high two touchdowns. Mikey Keene finished with 233 yards passing on 23-of-39 attempts and two scores.

How It Happened

Fresno State's defense opened with a quick turnover on downs on the opening drive of the game, allowing the Bulldog offense to take over at the EWU 42-yard line. It took Fresno State just three plays to score as Mac Dalena opened with a 33-yard run. Keene connected with Jalen Moss on a short completion, then Gilliam ran in from five yards out to finish off the drive with a score.

EWU was held to a 23-yard field goal on its next drive to make it a 7-3 game, but ate 8:51 of clock time.

Eastern Washington fumbled on its first play of the second quarter, and Kemari Munier-Bailey recovered to bring possession to the Bulldogs. Fresno State used only four plays to find the end zone on its next drive with Devon Rivers totaling 14 yards on the ground before Keene found Jake Boust open in the end zone for a 6-yard touchdown pass.

Fresno State took a 14-3 lead into the break.

EWU scored its first touchdown of the game on its first drive of the second half, making it a 14-10 lead for the Bulldogs with 11:15 left in the third quarter. The Bulldogs answered back three minutes later, quickly moving the ball down the field, ending in a 29-yard touchdown from Keene to Erik Brooks.

The Eagles scored 14 unanswered to claim their first lead of the game, 24-21 with 10:01 remaining in the fourth quarter.

Lynch leveled the game at 24, with 6:44 to played with a 44-yard field goal. Following a stop, the Bulldogs had one last chance. Lynch lined up a 35-yard attempt with seconds left but his kick drifted wide right.

Opening the overtime period, it took Eastern Washington four plays to score a touchdown to go up 31-24. The Bulldogs answered back in five plays, finishing with a 1-yard plunge from Gilliam to tie it up at 31-31.

In the second overtime, Fresno State took a 34-31 lead on a 25-yard field goal from Lynch. On the Eagles' first play of their possession, Bailey intercepted Kekoa Visperas to seal the game.

TEMPE, Ariz. - Forcing eight turnovers in the desert night, Fresno State earned its first shutout over a Power-5 opponent since 1986, defeating Arizona State 29-0 on Saturday at Mountain America Stadium. It marked the first time the Sun Devils had been shutout at home since 1988.

For the Bulldogs, it is the most turnovers this century. The defense totaled five interceptions and three fumble recoveries. Carlton Johnson produced three of those INTs, the most by a Bulldog since Phillip Thomas in 2012.

Fifteen of Fresno State's points came on the foot of Dylan Lynch who tied Fresno State's program record with five made field goals, the most since Barry Belli in 1984.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Fresno State got out to an early 10-0 lead in the first quarter, sparked by Mikey Keene going 14-of-14 for 129 yards in the opening quarter. Keene led the 'Dogs to a successful scoring drive on the opening possession, finding Moss on a 19-yard post route through the Sun Devil secondary.

ASU starting quarterback Trenton Bourguet threw one pass attempt before Carlton Johnson grabbed his first interception of the season on the Sun Devil's second pass attempt. Keene would move the offense down the field again, but the 'Dogs had to settle for the leg of Dylan Lynch as he hit for a 39-yard field goal to make it 10-0 with 5:50 left in the opening quarter.

The Bulldog defense got their second turnover of the game on ASU's next possession as Morice Norris Jr. sacked quarterback Drew Pyne, forcing a fumble that was picked up by Kemari Munier-Bailey at the Fresno State 32-yard line. The 'Dogs took advantage again on the turnovers as Lynch was good for a 30-yard field goal to open the second quarter, and to put Fresno State ahead 13-0.

Munier-Bailey kept the pressure on the Sun Devil offense, forcing a turnover on their next play. This one was recovered by Jacob Holmes at the ASU 13-yard line. Lynch connected from 29 yards out to extend Fresno State's lead to 16-0 with 10:25 left in the second quarter.

Arizona State felt some momentum, using a handful of chunk yardage plays to find itself deep in Fresno State territory. The Bulldog defense stayed strong, keeping ASU off the scoreboard as the Sun Devils had a 1st-and-goal opportunity from the 3-yard line, but the 'Dogs forced a turnover on downs on fourth-and-1.

Fresno State would have its first punt of the game with just 24 seconds left in the second quarter. The Bulldog offense saw itself right back out on the field as Johnson intercepted his second pass of the night on a pass by Pyne. The offense attempted to add more points, but Lynch's 53-yard field goal attempt sailed wide left.

The Bulldogs' defense forced a three-and-out on the Sun Devil's opening drive of the second half. It would take only five plays before Fresno State found the end zone as Keene connected with Jaelen Gill who made a one-on-one play against the Sun Devil defender for a 42-yard touchdown play to put Fresno State up 23-0.

Cam Lockridge got in on the turnover action, intercepting Pyne and returning it 23 yards on the next Sun Devil drive to put the Bulldogs back in the driver's seat on offense.

Lynch hit on a 50-yard field goal to put Fresno State ahead 26-0 at the end of the third quarter.

Fresno State's defense stayed strong as Johnson grabbed his third interception of the night, against his third different Sun Devil quarterback. He picked off Jacob Conover at the ASU 15-yard-line to give possession back to Fresno State on the team's seventh turnover gained of the night.

With 14:31 remaining in the game, Lynch connected on his fifth-made field goal from 33 yards out to tie the program record for most made field goals in the game.

Al'zillion Hamilton got his hands on an Arizona State pass attempt, recording the Bulldogs' fifth interception of the night to hold the shutout victory over the Sun Devils.

FRESNO, Calif. - Fresno State finished the nonconference portion of its schedule with a 53-10 win over Kent State on Saturday night at Valley Children's Stadium. It was the third time in the last four seasons that the Bulldogs have scored 50-plus points in a game.

Fresno State has won 13 games in a row, its longest winning streak since 1960-62.

Mikey Keene led Fresno State's offense with 325 yards and four touchdowns on 24-of-31 passing. All four touchdowns were thrown to a different receiver, the first time a Bulldog quarterback has done that since 2021. Jalen Moss had one of those touchdowns to go along with a career-high 120 yards.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Fresno State's defense got things started with a quick three-and-out showing. The Kent State punt was downed at the Fresno State 45-yard line, and the offense took over with a quick six-play scoring drive that found Mikey Keene connecting with Erik Brooks on a 40-yard touchdown pass. Fresno State pulled its first trick play out of the bag, setting up for a point after formation but running Logan Fife in for the 2-point conversion to take an 8-0 lead early in the first.

The Bulldog defense saw another three-and-out as Kemari Munier-Bailey came up big on third down to force a punt.

After a shanked punt, and taking over at the Kent State 47-yard line, Fresno State took only two plays to find the end zone and extend the lead. Keene hit Brooks for a 15-yard completion. Then Jaelen Gill lined up to receive the snap and threw his first career pass, a 32-yard touchdown to Elijah Gilliam, hitting him wide open down the right side.

Kent State saw some offensive momentum, hitting a chunk play of 40 yards down field to enter Fresno State territory. The Golden Flashes ran in from 18 yards out to make it 15-7 with 5:41 left in the first quarter.

Keene and the offense strung together four-straight plays of 11 or more yards, first hitting Jalen Moss on an 11-yard completion. Malik Sherrod got away for a gain of 24 yards in his first carry of the game. Keene found Mac Dalena in back-to-back completions for 20 and 14 yards to set the 'Dogs up in the red zone. Gilliam punched it in from two yards out to extend the 'Dog lead to 22-7.

Kent State scored on a 46-yard field goal, after eating up nearly six minutes of clock time on its following drive. Fresno State had a 22-10 lead with 12:16 remaining before the halftime break.

Fresno State again scored on its next possession with another set of chunk plays. Keene hit Gilliam for a 23-yard completion to get things started, then found Dalena for a gain of 33. Moss scored his first TD of the game on a one-handed catch on a 12-yard pass from Keene.

The Bulldog defense kept the Golden Flashes off the board on their following drive. Kent State made it down to the Fresno State 34-yard line, and opted to go for it on fourth down but were met by Isaiah Johnson who forced the turnover on downs.

The scoring kept rolling for Fresno State. Keene opened up with a flashy deep ball to Moss for 47 yards. Gilliam would end the drive with a punch-in from a yard out for his third score of the game.

Fresno State led 36-10 at the half.

The Bulldogs received the opening kick of the second half, and cashed in for more points. With six complete passes and four rushes, Fresno State found itself back in the red zone. Keene hit a wide-open Tre Watson to his left to extend the Bulldog lead to 43-10 with 9:06 left in the third quarter.

Fresno State scored again on its next drive as Keene connected with Moss for 23 yards, but Moss would fumble at the one yard line and Gill was there for the recovery in the end zone to add points for the Bulldogs.

Following another Kent State three-and-out, Dylan Lynch tacked on a 40-yard field goal for the 'Dogs.

Fresno State saw its first offensive drive without points scored in the game as the 'Dogs turned over on downs at the 3:22 mark in the fourth quarter.

FRESNO, Calif. - Opening the game with 27 unanswered points, Fresno State won its Mountain West opener 27-9 over Nevada on Saturday night at Valley Children's Stadium.

The Bulldog defense held Nevada's offense scoreless for more than 59 minutes while holding the Wolf Pack to 220 yards of offense. The 'Dogs were relentless with their pressure, recording their most sacks in a game (7) since 2013.

Jaelen Gill and Malik Sherrod finished with career-high games. Gill collected eight catches for 126 yards and two touchdowns. Sherrod had 123 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries. Mikey Keene threw for 269 yards and two touchdowns on 26-of-34 attempts.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Nevada received the opening kick and strung together 18 plays to eat up just over nine minutes of play time, but Fresno State's defense was able to keep them off the board following a sack near midfield by Chrisawn Gordon.

Facing a third-and-1 at its own 35-yard line on its opening possession, Fresno State's Mikey Keene connected with Jaelen Gill in the flat on a screen pass. Gill did the rest, racing 65 yards down the sideline for a touchdown to put the Bulldogs up 7-0 with 2:12 remaining in the quarter.

Malik Sherrod ran for a 72-yard touchdown, playing to the whistle after not being ruled down on a tuck-and-roll play. Sherrod's score put Fresno State up 14-0 with 4:15 left in the opening half.

Fresno State carried the 14-0 lead into the locker room at the half.

Following an interception on their opening drive of the third quarter, the Bulldogs scored on their next three possessions. Dylan Lynch scored the first two with his leg, connecting from 48 and 40 yards. With 12:37 remaining in the game, Gill caught his second touchdown of the night, a 12-yard reception from Keene.

Nevada scored its first points of the game on a safety with 8:22 left and added a touchdown with 11 seconds on the clock to make the score 27-9.

HOW IT HAPPENED

After Fresno State went three-and-out in its first offensive possession, Wyoming trotted down the field but was held to only a field goal once put in a third-and-long situation. Wyoming led 3-0 with 6:59 left in the first.

Wyoming extended its lead to 10-0 with a 14-yard touchdown pass by Andrew Peasley to Wyatt Wieland right at the start of the second quarter.

Jalen Moss got the offense sparked with a 50-yard reception to move the ball downfield. It was Moss who capped the drive with a six-yard reception from Keene to get Fresno State on the board with 11:17 left in the second quarter. Wyoming responded after stringing together an eight-play, 75-yard drive to extend its lead to 17-7 with 6:42 left until the halftime break.

Wyoming tacked on one more score before the half, growing its lead to 24-7 at halftime.

Fresno State scored the only points in the third quarter behind a 39-yard field goal by Dylan Lynch.

After forcing a three-and-out, the Bulldogs put together another long drive. But on a third-and-4 at the Wyoming 13-yard line, Keene was sacked for a 13-yard loss and left the game injured. Lynch came on for a 38-yard field goal to make it a 24-13 score with 8:31 on the clock.

Fresno State went for trickery on the kickoff with Lynch hitting a high pop up that Al'zillion Hamilton caught in front of the Wyoming sideline. Logan Fife moved the 'Dogs 48 yards in just over three minutes. On third-and-8, the signal caller rolled away from pressure and connected with Mac Dalena to make it 24-19 with 5:17 remaining.

Wyoming worked three-and-half minutes of the clock, moving into a field goal range. Jon Hoyland's 47-yard attempt hit the right upright to give the Bulldogs 1:48 remaining to work with.

Fresno State got to midfield but on second-and-6, Fife was intercepted by Cole Godbout.

LOGAN, Utah – Behind career games from Malik Sherrod and Tre Watson, Fresno State outlasted Utah State on Friday night at Merlin Olsen Field at Maverik Stadium, defeating the Aggies 37-32.

Sherrod helped the Bulldogs' offense stay balanced rushing for a career-high 129 yards on 23 carries while scoring three touchdowns. Watson added career highs of five receptions, 76 yards and two touchdowns. One of those touchdowns came from Logan Fife, who in making his first start in nearly a year, threw for a career-high 291 yards.

Fresno State improves to 6-1 on the season, and 2-1 in Mountain West play.

HOW IT HAPPENED

After both teams were held to three-and-outs on their opening possessions, Fresno State got into a rhythm on the third possession of the evening. Starting from their own two-yard line, the Bulldogs strung together a 14-play drive that ended in a five-yard touchdown run up the middle by Malik Sherrod.

The Aggies answered with a 10-play drive, tying the game at 7-7 with a 29-yard pass from Cooper Legas to Jalen Royals with 3:14 on the clock in the first quarter.

Midway through the second quarter, Erik Brooks set the Bulldogs up on the Utah State side of the field with a 12-yard punt return on a 38-yard punt. The Bulldogs worked the ball down inside the 10. On third-and-7, Logan Fife stepped up into the pocket and found Tre Watson wide open over middle in the end zone to go up 14-7 with 2:45 remaining in the half. Like the first quarter, Utah State answered the Bulldogs' touchdown. With 60 seconds on the clock, Legas linked up with Royals for a 52-yard score to tie the game going into the half.

Beginning the third quarter with the ball, the Aggies took their first lead of the game on a 37-yard field goal from Elliott Nimrod.

Following a big return from Jaalen Gill, it took the Bulldogs just four plays to regain the lead. After back-to-back three-yard runs, Sherrod found a hole up the middle and got to the outside, running 46 yards to the end zone to put the 'Dogs up 21-17.

The defense held the Aggies on the ensuing possession, coming up with a stop on fourth-and-6 at the Fresno State 34-yard line. The Bulldogs took advantage, quickly moving the ball into the red zone. The 'Dogs went trickery to extend their lead to 28-17 with Gill throwing a 19-yard pass to Watson in stride in the back of the end zone.

Utah State cut the lead to 28-25 30 seconds into the fourth quarter on a 43-yard touchdown pass from Legas to Terrell Vaughn. Fresno State took 4:33 off the clock on its next drive, extending its lead to 31-25 with a 26-yard field goal from Dylan Lynch.

The Aggies regained the lead with 4:42 remaining in the game. Following a 38-yard pass to get down to the 24-yard line, Rahsul Faison had a 24-yard run up the middle to give Utah State a 32-31 advantage. The lead was short-lived as the Bulldogs scored in just five plays. With 2:19 left on the clock, Sherrod scored his third touchdown of the night from 11 yards out to put the 'Dogs up 37-32.

Utah State managed to move the ball to the Fresno State 43-yard line with a minute to go but on second-and-9, Morice Norris Jr. sealed the victory with a diving interception.

FRESNO, Calif. – In a battle of 6-1 teams, tricks and treats came just days before Halloween at Valley Children's Stadium. Three UNLV turnovers in the third quarter led to 24 points for Fresno State but the Bulldogs were twice forced to come up with stops deep in their territory in the fourth, the second resulting in a game-ending interception by Levelle Bailey to seal a 31-24 victory.

Fresno State had four takeaways on the night against a Rebels' team that had not had more than two turnovers in a game this season. Dean Clark accounted for two of them coming up with an interception and a fumble recovery on back-to-back UNLV drives.

In his first game since Oct. 7, Mikey Keene passed for 256 yards and four touchdowns. Jalen Moss led the receivers with 99 yards but Keene spread the TDs around, finding four different receivers in the end zone.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Bulldogs' defense had the momentum on the first offensive drive for UNLV, holding the Rebels off the board.

With Keene back under center for the first time in two weeks, the Bulldogs were able to score on their first offensive possession of the game for the eighth time this season. Keene connected with Tim Grear Jr. for a 31-yard touchdown, Grear's first TD as a Bulldog.

UNLV responded on its following drive with a 10-play, 80-yard scoring drive capped by a 40-yard touchdown pass from Jayden Maiava to Ricky White to tie the game at seven with 2:20 left in the first quarter.

UNLV's Jaxen Turner intercepted a pass by Keene and cashed it in for points. The Bulldog defense held UNLV to only a field goal from 30 yards out with 11:15 left in the first half.

The Rebels tacked on seven more with 33 seconds remaining in the half on a three-yard run from Jai'Den Thomas. It capped a nine-play, 72-yard drive in just over a minute to give UNLV a 17-7 lead at the break.

After being forced to punt on their opening possession of the second half, Carson King's punt bounced off the knee of Jacob DeJesus and was alertly pounced on by Steven Comstock to shift the momentum back into the Bulldogs' favor.

Five plays later, Keene hit Mac Dalena from two yards out to cut the deficit to 17-14.

The Bulldogs forced a three-and-out on UNLV's offensive possession following a sack on third-and-7 by Tuasivi Nomura. Keene went deep on the first play of the drive and found Jalen Moss down the sideline for 60 yards to get to the Rebels' 20-yard line. Fresno State converted twice on third downs, the second resulting in a 10-yard touchdown over the middle from Keene to Erik Brooks to retake the lead for the Bulldogs at 21-17 with 5:59 on the clock.

Facing third-and-8 on his next drive, Maiava was picked off by Dean Clark at the UNLV 41-yard line. Fresno State turned it into three with a 36-yard field goal from Dylan Lynch to extend the lead to 24-17.

On the Rebels' next offensive play, Isaiah Johnson forced a fumble that was recovered by Clark at the UNLV 31-yard line. The Bulldogs moved the ball into the red zone and on fourth-and goal from the 2-yard line, Keene found Malik Sherrod along the right sideline to give the 'Dogs a 31-17 advantage with three seconds left in the quarter.

UNLV answered back with a seven-play, 70-yard scoring drive as Maiava finished it off with a 15-yard touchdown pass to White.

The Rebels started their next drive at Fresno State's 46-yard line following an interception by Cameron Oliver. UNLV marched down to the two-yard line but could get no further as the Bulldogs came up with a fourth-down stop.

Stuck deep in their own end, Fresno State was forced into a three-and-out, giving the Rebels the ball back at their own 48. UNLV moved the ball down to the Bulldogs' 8-yard line with 19 seconds left. After two incomplete passes, Levelle Bailey sealed the game, intercepting Maiava in the middle of the field.

FRESNO, Calif. - The Milk Can returned to the Central Valley on Saturday night as Fresno State knocked off Boise State 37-30 in front of a sold out Valley Children's Stadium.

Malik Sherrod racked up 255 all-purpose yards, the 10th-most in a single game in Bulldog history. The junior running back rushed for 132 yards and a touchdown on 21 carries, had four receptions for 28 yards and returned a 95-yard kickoff for a touchdown.

MIKEY KEENE passed for 290 yards and a touchdown on 24-of-38 attempts. Mac Dalena had a team-high six catches for 85 yards.

The defense came away with two takeaways on interceptions from Al'zillion Hamilton and Phoenix Jackson.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Fresno State opened the game with a seven-play, 78-yard drive, finding the end zone in just over two minutes. MIKEY KEENE gave the Bulldogs a 7-0 lead, finding Tre Watson for a 25-yard touchdown.

After holding Boise State to a three-and-out, Fresno State extended the lead on the leg of Dylan Lynch as the kicker connected on a 48-yard field goal. The Broncos answered back with a 45-yard field goal from Jonah Dalmas with 2:16 on the clock in the first quarter.

Until the final seven seconds of the half, the defenses owned the quarter with three combined interceptions. The Bulldogs had interceptions on back-to-back Boise State possessions with Phoenix Jackson picking off Maddux Madsen and Al'zillion Hamilton intercepting a deep pass by Taylen Green in the endzone. With the Bulldogs holding a 13-3 lead, Boise State cut into it with a 12-play, 64 yard drive. Madsen ended the possession with a two-yard touchdown pass to Billy Bowens.

With Boise State set to receive the kick to open the second half, Malik Sherrod answered the Broncos' score with one of his own with no time left on the clock, returning his kickoff back 95 yards to put the 'Dogs back up 20-10. It was the first kickoff return touchdown for Fresno State since 2008.

The Bulldogs and Broncos traded touchdowns on the ground in the third quarter with Elijah Gilliam scoring for Fresno State and George Holani for Boise State, both from one yard out. Field goals for each early in the fourth gave the 'Dogs a 30-20 advantage with 10 minutes remaining following a 24 yarder from Lynch.

With 4:40 left in the game, Madsen scrambled for a 27-yard touchdown to bring the Broncos within three.

On second-and-11 from the Fresno State 48, Sherrod broke through the line and outran the secondary for a 52-yard score to extend the Bulldogs' lead to 37-27 with 1:49 on the clock.

Dalmas connected on a 52-yard field goal with 31 seconds to make it 37-30 but the Bulldogs recovered the ensuing outside kick to seal the win.

The Bulldogs were outgained 459-308 in total yards. Fresno State lost the turnover battle with the Spartans cashing in both for touchdowns.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Fresno State won the toss, and kicked off to start the game. San Jose State took just six plays over 75 yards to find the end zone and take an early 7-0 lead. The Bulldogs responded with a 31-yard field goal by Dylan Lynch to get on the board in their first drive.

San Jose State pieced together a seven-play, 60-yard scoring drive to extend their lead to 14-3 with 2:55 left in the first quarter.

On Fresno State's following drive, Keene threw an interception to Matthew Tago deep in Fresno State territory. The Spartans cashed the turnover in for points, extending their lead to 21-3 in the first quarter.

The Bulldog defense allowed another big San Jose State drive, giving up 77 yards on eight plays to extend the SJSU lead to 28-3 with 9:55 before halftime.

Following a 15-yard rush from Malik Sherrod on third-and-5, the Bulldogs scored their first touchdown of the night on a 39-yard connection from Keene to Mac Dalena, bringing the score to 28-10 with 7:57 remaining in the half. Fresno State's defense was playing to a better standard, getting SJSU into a third-and-very long situation following a big hit and pass breakup by Phoenix Jackson.

With Logan Fife in at quarterback for the Bulldogs in place of an injured Keene, the 'Dogs saw their second turnover of the game on the opening drive of the second half. Fife threw short of the goal line and it was intercepted by Michael Dansby who returned it 98 yards to give the Spartans a 35-10 advantage with 10:17 on the clock.

SJSU made it 42-10 through Kareem Robinson. After a 47-yard run, the Spartan back punched it in from five yards out. The Bulldogs responded with a seven-play, 71-yard drive that Fife finished off with an 11-yard touchdown pass to Jalen Moss with 9:01 remaining in the game. Opting for the two-point conversion, Fife connected with Jake Boust for two.

FRESNO, Calif. – Allowing a season-high 528 yards, with 345 coming on the ground, Fresno State suffered its second-straight loss, falling 25-17 to New Mexico on Saturday evening at Valley Children's Stadium.

The Lobos controlled the clock throughout the contest, more than doubling the Bulldogs' time of possession (40:19-19:19). The result was Fresno State being outgained by nearly 300 yards.

HOW IT HAPPENED

New Mexico came out firing, connecting on a 46-yard completion down field. New Mexico nearly scored a touchdown, but an offensive pass interference call moved the ball back. On second-and-19, Dupre Mendoza sacked Dylan Hopkins for a loss of one to force a Lobo field goal from 38 yards out.

Fresno State countered with a big play of its own that saw Logan Fife hitting Jalen Moss for 53 yards to set the 'Dogs up at the UNM 5-yard line. Three plays later, Fife scrambled and dove for the pylon for the touchdown.

Malik Sherrod extended the Bulldogs' lead early in the second quarter with a six-yard touchdown run. The running back accounted for the final 13 yards of the drive following a 26-yard reception by Mac Dalena that put the 'Dogs in the red zone.

The Lobos cut into the Bulldogs' lead on the leg of Luke Drzewiecki. The kicker connected from 38 yards for the second time in the game to make it 14-6.

New Mexico forced a three-and-out on Fresno State's possession, getting the ball back at its own 8-yard line. After moving the ball to midfield in three plays, the Lobos made it 14-12 on a 50-yard rushing touchdown from Jacory Croskey-Merritt with 2:19 remaining.

New Mexico took control of the game in the second half with back-to-back 90-plus yard drives to take a 25-14 lead.

Dylan Lynch cut the deficit to eight with a 44-yard field with 1:49 left in the game.
