SDSU Men's Golf Set to Defend MW Title

The San Diego State men's golf team will be aiming for its second straight conference title and fourth in the last six years this weekend when it travels to the desert for the Mountain West Championship, April 22-24, in Tucson, Ariz, For the 10th consecutive season, the 54hole event will be contested on the Catalina Course at the OMNI Tucson National Golf Club, which will play as a par-72, 7,194-yard track.

The 11-team field will complete 18 holes on each of the three days, following a practice round on Thursday. The Aztecs, who have been idle since April 13, earned the No. 1 seed are slated to tee off with No. 2 UNLV in the first group on Friday, starting at 7 a.m. PT, while the pairings for the final two rounds with be based on team standings. A live scoring link courtesy of Golfstat will be available on GoAztecs.

SDSU, which received a No. 22 national ranking in the latest Golfstat team index, will be traveling to Tucson without having played the Catalina Course in a regular-season tournament prior to the MW Championship for the first time since the 2010-11 campaign.

Aztec Lineup for the Weekend

For the just the second time this season, San Diego State head coach Ryan Donovan will utilize the starting lineup of seniors Riccardo Michelini (Carpi, Italy) and Ryann Ree (Redondo Beach, Calif.), junior Nahum Mendoza III (San Diego, Calif.) and sophomores Blake Abercrombie (Rocklin, Calif.) and PJ Samiere (Kailua, Hawaii). The combination led the Aztecs to a third-place finish at the Southwestern Jones Invitational, held Feb. 29-March 1 in Westlake Village, Calif.

Abercrombie is the lone newcomer for the Scarlet and Black at the MW Championship, while Michelini will be making his fourth straight appearance, joining Mendoza, a three-time participant, while Ree and Samiere are back in the mix for the second year in a row.

SDSU boasts three players in the latest Golfstat Cup standings released April 19, including Ree (17), Mendoza (22) and Michelini (59). In addition, Mendoza (1), Michelini (3) and Ree (5) enter the weekend occupying three of the top five positions in the Golfstat Mountain West head-to-head rankings.

The Competition

Five of SDSU's opponents this weekend find themselves among the top 100 in the latest Golfstat rankings released April 20. UNLV is the highest rated team of the group, checking in at No. 29, followed by New Mexico (37), Wyoming (85), Colorado State (89) and Fresno State (94). The Aztecs will also battle Nevada (135), Utah State (141), San José State (166), Boise State (199) and Air Force (210).

SDSU owns a 12-4 record in head-to-head results against nine conference adversaries during the 2015-16 campaign, including unblemished marks against Fresno State (3-0), San José State (3-0), Boise State (2-0), Nevada (2-0), Air Force (1-0) and Wyoming (1-0). However, the Aztecs have come up empty this season vs. New Mexico (0-2), Colorado State (0-1) and UNLV (0-1). Utah State is the lone MW school the Scarlet and Black has not faced in a regularly scheduled tournament this year.

Individually, eight of the top-15 finishers return from last season's conference championship, including the Aztecs' own Ryann Ree (T-4th) and Nahum Mendoza III (T-7th), along with Nick Fuller (3rd) and Grant Booth of Nevada (T-7th), New Mexico's Gustavo Morantes (11th), Dominic Kieffer of Colorado State (T-8th), as well as John Oda and Shintaro Ban of UNLV, who both tied for 13th.

SDSU's Riccardo Michelini, who tied for first in regulation at the 2014 Mountain West Championship, is also expected to contend, along with Andrej Bevins and Sam Kim of New Mexico, UNLV's Harry Hall, Trevor Clayton of Fresno State and Nevada's Travis Fredborg, all of whom find themselves among the top 15 in the MW rankings.

Aztecs At The Mountain West Championship

In the 17-year history of the Mountain West, San Diego State has won three team championships, capturing back-to-back titles in 2011 and 2012, followed by a thrilling victory in 2015. The Aztecs also tied for the top spot in 2009, but lost in a team playoff to TCU after rallying from a five-stroke deficit in regulation.

In addition, SDSU has finished second seven times (2014, 2013, 2010, 2009, 2006, 2003, 2001), placed fourth on three occasions (2005, 2004, 2002), came in fifth twice (2007, 2000) and ended up in the seventh position once (2008).

The Aztecs' best individual finish was recorded in 2001 when John Lepak posted a 3-over 219 to win by one stroke at Sunriver Resort in Oregon. SDSU's Adam Porzak also tied for first place in regulation in 2007, but came up just short in a one-hole playoff loss to Robby Ormand of TCU, Last season, former All-American Xander Schauffele finished just two shots off the pace in second at 9-under 204 to set an SDSU record for lowest 54-hole score at a conference tournament.

The Aztecs have fared routinely well on the individual leaderboard at the MW tournament, placing at least one player among the top four in each of the last 10 seasons and 15 times overall.

Backspin: 2015 MW Championships

San Diego State captured its third conference title in the last five years after firing a collective 9-under par 275 during the final round of the 2015 Mountain West Championship at OMNI Tucson National Golf Club. The Aztecs, who entered the day 11 shots behind UNLV in third place, combined for 19 birdies to help overtake the Rebels by one stroke

With its total, SDSU set a school record for lowest score in MW Championship play, finishing with a collective 17-under 835 to top UNLV (-16), Nevada (-10) and New Mexico (-9), while Colorado State (+13) finished a distant fifth on the par-71, 7,144-yard Catalina Course.

The SDSU resurgence was fueled by Xander Schauffele and Rvann Ree, who each fired a final-round 67. Schauffele posted his highest finish ever at the MW Championship, landing in the runner-up spot on the individual leaderboard with a combined 9-under 204. The Aztec senior drained five birdies on the day, including back-to-back conversions at Nos. 3-4 as well as the 10th and 11th greens, to finish just two shots behind medalist Kurt Kitayama of UNLV (-11).

Schauffele also made a critical sand save later in the round at the par-4, 470-yard 18th, Shortly thereafter, Kitayama, who was playing in the final group, had a chance to force a team playoff with a par, but registered a bogey-5 instead.

Ree, meanwhile, got off to a torrid start, sinking five birdies of his own on the front nine, including a successful make on the par-4, 485yard No. 2, which ranked as the toughest hole of the final round. The junior transfer, who reeled off eight straight pars through the turn, recorded just one blemish on his scorecard, a bogey at No. 17, to complete the tournament at 5-under 208. With his effort, Ree tied his lowest round as an Aztec, climbing eight places into a three-way tie for fourth with UNLV's Carl Jonson and Corey Eddings of Nevada, who finished two shots in back of another Wolf Pack golfer, Nick Fuller, for

Riccardo Michelini and PJ Samiere each contributed to the Aztecs' winning total after tying for 24th at 5-over 218. Despite two bogeys on his final three holes, Michelini recorded his lowest round of the weekend with a 70, notching four birdies, including a successful conversion

on the sprawling par-5, 587-yard No. 8, which ranked as the thirdmost difficult green of the final 18 holes. With his performance, the SDSU junior vaulted 12 places on the leaderboard after ending the second round in a tie for 36th.

Samiere continued his upward mobility as well, leaping an additional four spots after notching his second straight 71 during the final round. The Aztec freshman offset three bogeys with a trio of birdies, completing his first MW Championship appearance just two shots out of the top 20.

Despite firing a 73 which did not count toward SDSU's team score in the final round, Nahum Mendoza III still finished in the top 10, slipping four spots into a tie for seventh at 4-under 209. The SDSU sophomore recorded birdies on two of his last four holes; however, four bogeys, including two to begin his round, thwarted his progress.

A Look At the Course

For the 10th straight year, the Mountain West Championship will be held on the Catalina Course at the OMNI Tucson National Golf Resort & Spa. Designed by Robert Van Hagge and Bruce Devlin, the Catalina Course is known for its magnificent views, traditional parkland-style layout and tree-lined fairways. Nestled in the foothills of the Santa Catalina Mountains, the course also includes eight sparkling lakes and 80 bunkers, while the 18th hole is considered to be one of the finest and most challenging finishing holes on the PGA Tour. Home to over 30 PGA events, including the prestigious Chrysler Classic of Tucson from 1997-2006, as well as several NCAA tournaments, the Tucson National has been selected as one of Golf Digest magazine's "75 Best Golf Resorts in North America."

Mountain West History 101

- A total of six schools have won at least one Mountain West title with just two, New Mexico and San Diego State, claiming consecutive championships. The Lobos captured four straight crowns from 2003-06 before earning the top prize in 2013 and 2014, while the Aztecs emerged triumphant in 2011 and 2012, followed by another conquest in 2015. Colorado State (2008, 2010), UNLV (2000, 2002) and former member Brigham Young (2001, 2007) each earned a pair of titles as well, while TCU came away with its lone championship as a MW affiliate in 2009 when it edged SDSU in a team playoff.
- Six different schools have had a player win the individual title, including SDSU (2001), UNLV (2000, 2004, 2008, 2011, 2013, 2015), New Mexico (2003, 2009, 2014), Colorado State (2002, 2010), BYU (2005) and TCU (2007).
- The inaugural MW Championships took place on the Nicklaus Tournament Course at the PGA West complex in La Quinta, Calif., before moving to the Crosswater Course at Sunriver Resort in Sunriver, Ore., for six straight years from 2001-06. The tournament has since been played in Arizona on the Catalina Course at the OMNI Tucson National Resort.

2015-16 Highlights

- San Diego State is enjoying another highly successful campaign, posting two tournament victories thus far to go with eight top-5 placements. The Scarlet and Black has displayed incredible depth this year with five different golfers leading the team in 10 regular-season events.
- The Aztecs took home the crown at the season-opening Saint Mary's Invitational on Sept. 16, as three players finished among the top 10 on the individual leaderboard at the famed Poppy Hills Golf Course in Pebble Beach, Calif. SDSU was led by Brian Song, who tied for fourth, while Ryann Ree and Riccardo Michelini both landed in the ninth position.
- After a fifth-place showing at the William H. Tucker Intercollegiate in Albuquerque, N.M., the Aztecs reeled off four consecutive thirdplace performances, beginning with the University of California's Alister MacKenzie Invitational in mid-October, where SDSU tied for the third-lowest 54-hole team score in school history with a 31-under 821. Ree (-14) and Michelini (-13), who finished fifth and sixth respectively, became the first set of Aztec teammates to complete three rounds below 70 in the same event since Colin Featherstone and Todd Baek in 2010.
- Ryann Ree captured Mountain West Men's Golfer of the Week honors on Feb. 24 after finishing a solo second at SDSU's spring opener, The Prestige at PGA West. Ree logged his highest placement as a collegian at the event with a 10-under 203, highlighted by

- 15 birdies overall, which ranked second in the field.
- Nahum Mendoza III recorded the first of four straight top 10 individual finishes after tying for the runner-up spot at the Southwestern Jones Invitational in early March. Mendoza carded a 7-under 209, while Ree was one stroke behind at 6-under to finish alone in fourth.
- After another third-place effort at the Lamkin San Diego Classic, which featured additional top-10 placements by Mendoza (T-3rd), Michelini (T-9th) and Ree (T-9th), SDSU claimed its second team title of the year at the Barona Collegiate Cup on March 22. The Aztecs (-26) won in convincing style, topping second-place Minnesota (+16) by a whopping 42 strokes. Brian Song was SDSU's top golfer, finishing solo second at 6-under 210, while Ree (T-3rd), Michelini (T-5th), Gunn Yang (T-5th) and Mendoza (T-9th) all landed in the top 10.
- Mendoza leads the squad with 16 rounds below par, followed closely by Ree, who has 15 to his credit, including 12 in the 60s.
- Four of SDSU's five starters in the MW Championship have turned in a round of 65 during the regular season, which is tied for seventh on the Aztecs' all-time list for lowest 18-hole score. Ree and Michelini accomplished the feat in the second and third round, respectively, at the Alister MacKenzie Invitational, while Abercrombie logged his lowest collegiate tally as an individual competitor in second round of the CSU San Marcos Fall Classic. Likewise, Samiere was an unattached golfer at the Barona Collegiate Cup when he carded his 65 during the final round.
- Pablo Matesanz also recorded his first victory in a Scarlet and Black uniform this season, emerging triumphant as an individual competitor at the Western Illinois Invitational on Feb. 16, held at Carleton Oaks Country Club in nearby Santee, Calif.
- Nahum Mendoza III has been named to the 2016 Arnold Palmer Cup as announced April 16 by the Golf Coaches Association of America. With his selection, the Aztec junior becomes the first SDSU player to compete in the prestigious tournament since former All-American Aaron Goldberg in 2008. Mendoza is one of 10 collegiate players who will represent the United States against their European counterparts in the 20th annual event, which features a Ryder Cup-style format. This year's Arnold Palmer Cup is scheduled for June 24-26 at Formby Golf Club in Formby, England.

Just A Chip Shot Away

The winner of this week's Mountain West Championship earns an automatic bid to the NCAA regional tournament, May 16-18. The two nearest potential regional sites for SDSU are still located outside of California, The Gallery Golf Club in Tucson, Ariz., and UNM Championship Course in Albuquerque, where the Scarlet and Black competed at the William H. Tucker Intercollegiate last September. The Aztecs could also be sent to Karsten Creek Golf Club in Stillwater, Okla., Blackwolf Run in Kohler, Wis., Vanderbilt Legends Club in Nashville, Tenn., or The Ol' Colony Golf Complex in Tuscaloosa, Ala.

In all, 81 teams and 45 individuals not on those squads will be divided up among the six regional tournaments. The participants will be selected by the NCAA men's golf committee and are scheduled to be announced on Thursday, May 5, at 9:30 a.m. ET (6:30 a.m. PT) on The Golf Channel.

A total of 30 schools and two individuals (not on those qualifying teams) will advance to the NCAA championships, May 27-June 1, at Eugene Country Club in Eugene, Ore. The Aztecs have made the national championships on 23 occasions in school history, including seven times (1999, 2003, 2005, 2008, 2011, 2012, 2015) since the regional format made its debut.

Head Coach Ryan Donovan

Ryan Donovan is in his 13th season at the helm of the SDSU men's golf program after serving as an assistant in 2003. Since taking the reins, he has directed the Aztecs to 28 tournament titles and five NCAA national championship appearances. In 2011, 2012 and 2015, he received Mountain West Coach of the Year honors and was named a finalist for the Dave Williams Award, which is handed out annually to the national coach of the year in Division I men's golf. Donovan was also was tabbed the Eaton Golf Pride West Region Division I Men's Coach of the Year by the GCAA following the 2010-11 campaign. A native of Yorba Linda, Calif., Donovan was a four-year member of the Aztec golf squad before graduating in 2001.
