SCENE SETTER (through 2019 season)

- San Diego State opens its 98th season, 52nd at the Division I level on Saturday when the Aztecs play host to UNLV at Dignity Health Sports Park in Carson, Calif. The game marks the return of **Brady Hoke** as SDSU head coach. Hoke, who served as the defensive line coach last season, was the Aztecs' head coach from 2009-10, posting a 9-4 record and a Poinsettia Bowl championship in 2010. That marked the school's first bowl appearance in 12 seasons and the Aztecs have appeared in a bowl game every season since (10 straight years).
- The Aztecs are playing their 2020 and 2021 home games at Dignity Health Sports Park in Carson, Calif., while the University builds its future stadium in Mission Valley in the footprint of SDCCU Stadium. San Diego State is scheduled to play four games this season and seven games next year at DHSP, which is located 113 miles from the University's previous home stadium.
- This is the latest season opener for San Diego State in school history and marks the first time the Aztecs have opened a campaign in October since 1949. In 2009 (Brady Hoke's first season as head coach at SDSU), the Aztecs played on Oct. 24 and claimed a 42-28 victory at Colorado State in its *seventh* game of the season.
- Both teams have plenty of new faces on the sidelines this season with transition head coaches (Hoke and UNLV's Marcus Arroyo), offensive coordinators (Jeff Hecklinski and Glenn Thomas) and defensive coordinators (Kurt Mattix and Peter Hansen) from 2019.
- San Diego State is coming off a 10-3 campaign, culminating with a dominating 48-11 win over Central Michigan in the New Mexico Bowl. Among last season's highlights were the program's first-ever victory over UCLA (23 all-time meetings), a win over Brigham Young (first since 2005) and a 6-1 record in road/neutral games. SDSU spent three weeks in the Top 25 last season and ended the campaign at No. 31 in the final AP Poll.
- The Aztecs are 51-41-5 all-time in season openers, including a 43-16-4 mark in home contests. SDSU, which is 23-7 in season openers played at home in the Division I era, has won its last five home season openers.
- SDSU returns 16 starters (seven offense, eight defense and one kicker). Nine Aztec players on the defensive side of the ball have made at least nine career starts, led by senior **Tariq Thompson** with 39 starts (every game since arriving as a true freshman in 2017).
- Seventeen different Aztec players received preseason accolades, with nine players - sophomore kicker **Matt Araiza**, junior defensive end **Keshawn Banks**, junior tight end **Daniel Bellinger**, long snapper junior **Turner Bernard**, junior running backs/returner **Jordan Byrd**, sophomore guard **William Dunkle**, junior cornerback **Darren Hall**, sophomore defensive tackle **Cameron Thomas** and senior Warrior (safety) **Tariq Thompson** - on watch lists for national honors and/or named first-team all conference.

PROGRAM-AT-A-GLANCE

- SDSU's active consecutive streak of 10 straight bowl games is tied for the 11th-longest streak nationally. San Diego State is the only football team in the state of California - college or pro - to play in the postseason each of the last 10 years.
- SDSU is one of 13 schools and one of two Group of 5 schools in the nation to play in a bowl game each of the last 10 seasons.
- Since the start of the 2015 campaign, San Diego State is 49-18 record with a 73.1 percent winning percentage and the Aztecs are 48-15 (76.2 percent) in winning percentage nationally since Oct. 3, 2015.
- San Diego State leads the nation in turnover margin since the start of the 2014 campaign (+0.78).
- SDSU has four double-digit victory seasons in the last five years. Only 10 schools in the nation can say that - San Diego State, Alabama, Appalachian State, Boise State, Clemson, Georgia, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Oklahoma and Wisconsin.
- San Diego State went 7-0 last season in games decided by seven points or more.
- The Aztecs' three losses last season came by a combined 13 points and seven of their last eight losses have been by nine points or less.
- San Diego State has 10 consecutive winning season, which is the second-longest streak in program history and the longest since a 17-year stretch from 1961-77.
- SDSU has played in a school-record 10 consecutive bowl games (including all nine seasons under Rocky Long).
- San Diego State is 48-15 in its last 63 overall games and 31-11 in its last 42 regular-season games against Mountain West opponents (33-11 against MW opponents, including conference championship games).
- The Aztecs are 13-8 in their last 21 games decided by eight points or less.

OFFENSIVE KEYS

- San Diego State is 44-2 the last 46 times it has rushed for 200 yards.
- The Aztecs are 62-13 since 2011 when committing one turnover or less, something SDSU did in 12 of 13 games last season.
- San Diego State's eight turnovers in 2019 were the second fewest in the country (Oregon State, 6).
- SDSU had an advantage in time of possession in 10 of the 13 games last season. Since 2011, the Aztecs are 27-5 when possessing the football for at least 35 minutes.

DEFENSIVE KEYS

- The Aztecs are 53-3 since 2011 when holding the opposition to 17 points or less. The Aztecs have held each of their last seven opponents to 17 points or less.
- The Aztecs are 28-6 since 2011 when allowing less than 150 passing yards.
- San Diego State is 43-4 when holding the opposition to a 33.3 percent or less mark on third down.
- Since 2009, San Diego State's record broken down by opponent passing efficiency: less than 110: 51-7; between 110-150: 38-21; greater than 150: 5-22.
- Since the start of the 2015 campaign, SDSU is 29-1 when holding its opponent to a passing efficiency rating of below 110.

SPECIAL TEAMS / OVERALL TRENDS

- The Aztecs have are 33-2 the last 35 times when owning a turnover advantage.
- San Diego State is 10-1 the last 11 times it has an advantage in field position.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State leads the nation in kickoff returns for touchdowns with 11.

SERIES NOTES

- Saturday's game marks the 30th meeting between San Diego State and UNLV with the Aztecs owning an 19-10 lead in the series.
- SDSU has won five of the last six (5-1), eight of the last 10 (8-2) and 14 of the last 18 (14-4) encounters with the Rebels.

- The 29 previous meetings are far and away the fewest encounters for San Diego State against any member of the Mountain West against any team that has been in the league for an extended period of time (excludes Boise State, Nevada and Utah State). The teams first met on Oct. 22, 1977, a 37-7 SDSU victory in San Diego, but did not start playing regularly until 1980.
- The San Diego State-UNLV series has been played every season since 1999. It is the longest active continuous series for San Diego State with the teams meeting for the 22nd consecutive season this year.
- This will mark the 22nd straight season the teams have played and the 24th time in the last 25 seasons UNLV and San Diego State have faced off.
- The team with more rushing yards has been victorious in 21 of the last 22 games in the series with the lone exception coming in 2007, when the Aztecs escaped Las Vegas with a 38-30 triumph on Nov. 10.
- SDSU has four losses during the past 18 meetings, with three of those occurring in Las Vegas (2005, 2009 and 2013).
- The teams typically meet late in the season. Of the previous 29 encounters, one was in September, 14 were in October and 14 were played in November.
- **SERIES TIDBITS:** Since 2003, San Diego State has outscored UNLV, 134-54, in the first quarter of the last 17 games... Only twice since 2002 have the Rebels led after the first quarter (in 2012, UNLV 7, SDSU 0 and 2014, UNLV 10, SDSU 7)... UNLV overcame a 17-point deficit to win the 2009 game, the largest margin either team has overcome to win a game in the series... The Aztecs have scored a touchdown in the second quarter in 13 of the last 16 meetings... San Diego State has completed 70 percent or more of its passes in five of the last 14 games between the teams, going 257-for-419 (61.3 percent) during that time... The Aztecs have picked off 21 passes in the last 17 meetings... In the last 13 meetings, the teams have combined to produce at least 800 yards of total offense seven times... Former SDSU running back/kick returner Rashaad Penny had 361 career rushing yards on 59 carries against the Rebels (6.1 ypc)... He had five career touchdowns against UNLV (four rushing, one receiving)... Former SDSU running back Donnel Pumphrey had 80 carries for 534 yards, eight rushing touchdowns and a 6.68 yards per carry rush in his career against UNLV... San Diego State has rushed for more than 200 yards in seven of the last 10 meetings (2,181 yards total), 218.1 yards per game and 23 rushing touchdowns.

LAST MEETING

San Diego State 20, UNLV 17
Oct. 26, 2019 | Sam Boyd Stadium | Las Vegas, Nev.

LAS VEGAS — San Diego State jumped out to a 17-0 lead and held on after a late UNLV rally in a 20-17 win in Las Vegas. The Aztecs, who led the entire game, improved to 7-1 on the season for just the second time in the last 42 years and 4-1 in Mountain West play.

Las Vegas native Ethan Dedeaux got SDSU on the scoreboard on a 49-yard catch-and-run touchdown from Ryan Agnew midway through the first quarter.

Later in the quarter after San Diego State backed the Rebels (2-6, 0-4 MW) back toward their goal line and force a Rebel punt, Trenton Thompson raced through the line and blocked Hayes Hicken's punt. The ball landed in the waiting arms of Caden McDonald in the end zone, giving the Aztecs a 14-0 lead at end of the first quarter. It was SDSU's second straight game with a non-offensive touchdown, 23rd in the Rocky Long era (since 2011) and 24th overall non-offensive score in the Long era.

After exchanging punts most of the second quarter, San Diego State put together a 9-play, 44-yard drive, culminating with a 25-yard field goal by Matt Araiza.

UNLV finally got on the scoreboard with 1:26 left in the half when Kenyon Oblad found Randal Grimes streaking down the sidelines for a 58-yard touchdown after Aztec All-America candidate Luq Barcoo slipped and fell down.

The Rebels put together a 13-play, 70-yard drive to begin the third quarter, but was halted at the SDSU 2-yard line when Thompson stuffed Charles Williams on a third-and-goal situation, making UNLV settle for a 22-yard field goal.

A few drives later, San Diego State went through the air to get deep into Rebel territory, but had to settle for a 34-yard field goal as time expired in the third quarter. On the drive, Aztec quarterback Ryan Agnew as 4-for-5 for 40 yards.

Down, 20-10, UNLV used a 12-play, 77-yard drive to get within three points with 5:57 to go when Oblad's 2-yard pass found Gio Fauolo for the touchdown.

SDSU went three-and-out on three straight rushes by Juwan Washington for nine yards, allowing the Rebels once last chance to mount a comeback. UNLV kept the drive going

when Oblad found Grimes for 42 yards on a fourth-and-24 play. The Rebels got all the way to the San Diego State 25, setting up a 42-yard field goal attempt by Daniel Gutierrez. Gutierrez' try, however, hit the right upright, giving the Aztecs the victory.

Agnew was 14-for-23 for 185 yards and a touchdown, mostly going to Kobe Smith (seven receptions for 78 yards). Washington added 89 yards on the ground on 16 carries (5.6 avg.).

Thompson led SDSU in tackles for the first time of his career, totaling 12 stops, including two for a loss, and the blocked punt, while Kyahva Tezino added 10 tackles and a pair of quarterback hurries.

San Diego State won its fourth consecutive game and improved to 5-0 on the road, the only team in the country to own a 5-0 road record at the time.

OPENING KICK

- San Diego State owns a 51-41-5 all-time record in season-opening games, including a 26-24-1 mark during the Division I era. The Aztecs are 10-11 in opening games since joining the Mountain West in 1999.
- The Aztecs have won five consecutive season openers that have been played at home. San Diego State has outscored the opposition, 150-27, in that streak.
- That record improves when the season openers occur at home. SDSU is 43-16-4 all-time, 23-7-1 in the Division I era and 10-6 in the Mountain West era when the lidlifter occurs at home.
- Brady Hoke is 1-1 in season opening games at San Diego State and 7-5 in career lidlifters.
- This is the first time the Aztecs have opened a campaign playing a conference game since 1989 when SDSU lost at Air Force, 52-36.

- San Diego State returns seven starters on offense this season - junior tight end Daniel Bellinger, junior running back Jordan Byrd, sophomore right guard William Dunkle, sophomore wide receiver Jesse Matthews, junior wide receiver Kobe Smith, senior left tackle Kyle Spalding and senior right tackle Zachary Thomas.
- Jeff Hecklinski is in his first season as offensive coordinator at San Diego State. Hecklinski was on Hoke's original SDSU staff in 2009 and 2010 as the assistant head coach, running backs coach and recruiting coordinator. He was also with Hoke at Michigan (2011-14) and Ball State (2004-08). He replaces Jeff Horton, who now serves as the associate head coach and running backs coach.

- RB Chase Jasmin has played in 39 straight games, the longest streak on the offense and tied for the longest streak on the team.

RUSHING OFFENSE

- San Diego State is 44-2 the last 46 times it has rushed for at least 200 yards and is 41-1 in its last 42 regular-season games when rushing for 200-plus yards.
- San Diego State has a 100-yard rusher in 29 of its last 53 games since 2016 (38, 100-yard rushers total) and 38 of the last 67 games since 2015 (50, 100-yard rushers total). Since Jeff Horton arrived as the running back coach in 2011, SDSU has a 100-yard rusher in 74 of the 119 games and 90, 100-yard rushers overall.
- San Diego State had two rushers at New Mexico State (Jordan Byrd - 118 and Chance Bell - 116) on Sept. 14, 2019 for the 30th time in program history. The Aztecs are 29-1 in those occasions, including a 19-game wing streak. SDSU has multiple 100-yard rushers nine times in the last 49 games.
- Byrd and Bell became the 78th and 79th different 100-yard rusher in school history in the New Mexico State game.
- If you take away the two times QB Carson Baker was sacked for seven yards last year, he rushed six times for 14 yards (2.3 avg.).

PASSING OFFENSE

- Since the start of the 2017 season, San Diego State has thrown 17 interceptions. That is tied for the third-fewest picks in the nation (min. 25 GP).

- QB Carson Baker picked up the win in his first career start (and appearances) against Brigham Young, going 19-for-24 for 172 yards and a touchdown without throwing an interception. He became just the second quarterback in the Aztecs' Division I history (since 1969) to win in his starting debut having never previously thrown a collegiate pass (also Joe Davis vs. Arkansas State on Sept. 12, 1976) and the first SDSU quarterback to start in a game having never previously thrown a pass since Ryan Lindley started on Aug. 30, 2008 vs. Cal Poly.
- Baker also became the fourth straight San Diego State quarterback to win in his starting debut, joining Maxwell Smith (Aug. 30, 2015 vs. San Diego), Christian Chapman (Dec. 5, 2015 vs. Air Force in the Mountain West Championship game) and Agnew (Sept. 15, 2018 vs. No. 23/25 Arizona State). Aztec quarterbacks were 1-13 in the previous 14 debuts prior to this stretch. He finished with the most completions (19) by an Aztec quarterback in his starting debut since Lindley's 27 completions in the Cal Poly game on Aug. 30, 2018 and most completions in a SDSU win in his debut since Tim Gutierrez had 32 in a 48-17 win over Minnesota on Sept. 25, 1993.
- WR Kobe Smith led SDSU in catches (58), yards (691) and touchdown catches (4).
- Smith ranked 10th in the Mountain West in receptions per game (4.46).
- Smith became the 85th different 100-yard receiver in program history (325th occasion overall) when he had 131 yards on seven catches at UCLA on Sept. 7, 2019 after entering the game with nine career receptions for 121 yards.
- Smith recorded his second career 100-yard game with seven catches for 102 yards vs. Utah State (Sept. 21, 2019) and followed with seven receptions for 101 yards and two touchdowns at Colorado State (Oct. 5, 2019).
- Against the Rams, Smith became the first Aztec with back-to-back 100-yard receiving games since Ezell Ruffin had three straight in 2013.
- Smith is now one of 40 players in program history with at least three 100-yard receiving games.
- WR Jesse Matthews had a career-high eight catches for a career-best 119 yards against Fresno State on Nov. 15, 2019, breaking 100 yards for the first time of his career. Matthews became the 86th different 100-yard receiver in program history (328th occasion overall).
- Matthews was named the co-Most Valuable Offensive Player of the 2019 New Mexico Bowl vs. Central Michigan when he had three receptions for 111 yards and his first two career touchdowns. Matthews had a 74-yard touchdown catch in the game, SDSU's longest offensive play in 2019.
- Matthews finished with 19 catches and 340 yards (85.0 ypg) over his final four games of 2019.
- Among freshmen in SDSU single-season history, Matthews ranked second in receptions (48) and third in receiving yards (633) last year.
- Matthews had the fifth-most catches (48) in the country without a dropped pass last year (according to Pro Football Focus).
- Among tight ends last year, Daniel Bellinger's three touchdown catches ranked in a tie for fourth in the Mountain West and a tie for 47th in FBS play.

BULLET NOTES - DEFENSE

- Kurt Mattix is in his first season as defensive coordinator at San Diego State. He previously served as defensive coordinator at Eastern Kentucky and worked with Hoke at Michigan.
- San Diego State's returns nine starters off a team that finished second in the nation in scoring defense and fifth in the national in total defense a year ago. Starters that are back for the Aztecs are senior linebacker Andrew Aleji, junior defensive end Keshawn Banks, junior cornerback Darren Hall, senior cornerback Tyler Hawkins (played safety last year), senior Aztec Dwayne Johnson Jr., junior linebacker Caden McDonald, sophomore defensive tackle Cameron Thomas, senior warrior Tariq Thompson and senior warrior Trenton Thompson.

DEFENSIVE NUMBERS

- Last year SDSU allowed 165 points (12.7 ppg) and 3,741 yards (288.7 ypg). In the last year before Brady Hoke and Rocky Long took over the program (2008), San Diego State allowed 446 points (37.2 ppg) and 5,529 yards (460.8 ypg).
- The Aztecs have allowed just 165 points last season in 13 games (12.7 ppg), their fewest allowed in a season since yielding 165 in 1977 in 11 games (15.0 ppg). The 12.7 points allowed per game were their fewest allowed since giving up 11.4 points per game in 1976 and the fourth fewest allowed in SDSU's Division I history (since 1969).
- SDSU has held an opponent scoreless on its opening drive 48 times since 2015 (66 games).
- Opponents last year had 149 drives where they tried to score on SDSU's defense (excludes kneel downs to end half/game). The Aztecs forced three-and-outs (or better) in 65 of those drives (43.6 pct.). SDSU averaged 5.00 three-and-outs per game.
- Of the last 60 fourth-down chances against the Aztec defense dating back to 2016, opponents have converted just 20 times (33.3 pct.).
- WAR Tariq Thompson has played in 39 straight games, the longest streak on the defense and tied for the longest streak on the team.
- Ta. Thompson has the most consecutive starts among any offense or defense player on the team (39).
- Ta. Thompson is tied for fifth all-time at SDSU in fumble recoveries (5).
- Ta. Thompson tied for sixth in SDSU single-season history last year in fumble recoveries (3).
- Ta. Thompson tied for first in the Mountain West (T-6th in FBS) with three fumble recoveries, while AZT Dwayne Johnson tied for fourth in the league (T-27th in FBS) with two recoveries.

RUSHING DEFENSE

- Opponents rushed 356 times against the Aztecs last year and only five attempts were longer than 20 yards (1.4 pct.).

PASSING DEFENSE

- Despite losing four seniors from the defensive line in 2018 and entering 2019 with just one player with a start on the d-line, the Aztec defensive linemen combined for 37.0 tackles for loss, 18.5 sacks and just six accepted penalties after recording 23.5 tackles for loss, 9.0 sacks and 11 accepted penalties in 2018.
- Ta. Thompson's 11 interceptions are tied for the seventh most in program history.
- Ta. Thompson tied for eighth in the MW last year with 0.92 passes defended (INT + PBU) per game.
- CB Darren Hall tied for the most pass breakups in FBS play (16) in 2019, and tied for sixth in pass deflections (INT + PBU) per game (1.42) and tied for 10th in total passes defended (17).
- Hall tied for second in SDSU single-season history with 16 pass breakups a year ago, six behind Marlon Andrews (22 in 1990).
- DE Keshawn Banks ranked fourth in the Mountain West in tackles for loss per game (1.04) last year.

BULLET NOTES - SPECIAL TEAMS

- ESPN Team Efficiencies ranked San Diego State's special teams unit as the 23rd best in the country in 2015, 13th in 2016, 28th in 2017, 55th in 2018 and 10th in 2019.
- Former SDSU captain Doug Deakin is in his 10th season with the program and his third as special teams coordinator.
- K Matt Araiza set a school single-season record with 22 field goals in 2019, surpassing John Baron II's 21 in 2016, and tied for fifth in field goal percentage (84.62).
- Araiza led the Aztecs with 94 points (No. 2 was 30) last year and had more points than the next three players combined (78).
- Araiza tied for the FBS lead last year with a perfect PAT percentage, and led the Mountain West in touchback percentage (78.46, 6th in FBS), field goals (22, T-11th in FBS), field goals per game (1.69, T-12th in FBS), field goal attempts (26, T-15th in FBS) and touchbacks (51, T-16th in FBS), while ranking third in field goal percentage (84.62, 24th) and kickoff average (62.77, 34th in FBS), tied for fourth in kicking points (94, T-47th in FBS), fifth in kickoff yards (4,080, 57th in FBS) and points per game (7.23), sixth in total points (94, T-72nd in FBS) and seventh in kickoffs (65, T-60th in FBS).
- Among freshmen kickers in the country last year, Araiza ranked first in field goals (22), and was third in field goal percentage (84.62) and eighth in points by kickers (94).
- Araiza was one of only five kickers in FBS play last year to make at least one field goal in every game (min. 12 games).
- Araiza was named the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week for the first time of his career on Sept. 9 for his play at UCLA when he went 3-for-4 on field goal attempts and 2-for-2 on PATs, while posting five touchbacks in six kickoffs. He made a then career-long 43-yarder in the first quarter, while his three field goals and 11 points were also a then career best.
- Jordan Byrd ranked fifth in the Mountain West last year in total kick/punt return yards (412, 60th in FBS).
- KR Kaegun Williams returned a kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown at San Jose State on Oct. 19, 2019, SDSU's first kick return for a touchdown since Juwan Washington had one vs. Army West Point in the 2017 Armed Forces Bowl (Dec. 23).
- Williams tied for second in the Mountain West last year and tied for 12th nationally with one kick return touchdown.
- Caden McDonald tied for third in FBS in punt return touchdowns (1) last season, when he recovered Trenton Thompson's blocked punt in the end zone at UNLV on Oct. 26).
- Tr. Thompson's blocked a punt and return by McDonald was SDSU's first block punt return for a touchdown since Thompson returned Kaelin Himphill's block vs. Air Force on Oct. 12, 2018.
- LS Turner Bernard has played in 43 games, the most of any current Aztec.
- Bernard has played in 39 straight games, tied for the longest streak on the team.
- Michael Shawcraft and Tr. Thompson led the Aztecs with five tackles on special teams last year.
- Tr. Thompson led the team with five stops on the punt return unit.

FOUR AZTECS NAMED TO MW PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM

Four San Diego State football players were named to the 2020 Mountain West Preseason All-Conference Team, the league announced in July. All four selections - sophomore Cameron Thomas (Carlsbad, Calif./Carlsbad High), junior Keshawn Banks (Rio Rancho, N.M./Rio Rancho High), senior Tariq Thompson (San Diego/St. Augustine High) and junior Darren Hall (Pasadena, Calif./Rancho Cucamonga High) - were on the defensive side of the ball, SDSU's most on defense in the history of the league (since 1999).

The four preseason all-MW picks are four of the eight starters returning for an Aztec defensive unit that led the conference and ranked second in FBS in scoring (12.7) and rushing (75.4), fifth in total (287.8) and sixth in pass efficiency (110.25). San Diego State finished 10-3 in 2019, the program's fourth double-digit win campaign over the last five years.

The all-conference team and preseason poll are voted on by media representatives who cover the conference. Yesterday, SDSU was picked to win the West Division of the MW, garnering 19 of the 21 first-place votes. The last three times the Aztecs were picked to win the West Division (2015-17) they won at least 10 games and captured a pair of league titles (2015-16).

Thomas, who is on the preseason watch list for the Chuck Bednarik Award (defensive player of the year) and the Bronko Nagurski Trophy (national defensive player of the year), totaled 49 tackles a year ago as a redshirt freshman, including 9.0 tackles for loss, 5.5 sacks, two pass breakups and 13 quarterback hurries. Thomas racked up numerous postseason awards in 2019, including freshman second-team All-America accolades from The Athletic and first-team all-MW honors. Thomas, who was the only freshman on the all-MW first team (offense or defense), also was chosen as San Diego State's defensive lineman of the year and shared outstanding freshman accolades with wide receiver Jesse Matthews.

Thomas also has been named a preseason all-MW first-team selection by Athlon Sports, Phil Steele Magazine and College Football News. He's also been rated as the second-best player in the MW and SDSU's best defensive player by CFN, and one of San Diego State's

five-best returning players by ESPN.

Playing alongside Thomas in the front three, Banks, meanwhile, had 43 tackles last year as a true sophomore, including a team-high 13.5 tackles for loss for 50 yards, 4.5 sacks for 26 yards, a pass breakup and nine quarterback hurries. For his efforts, he was named a second-team all-MW selection.

This preseason Banks has also been named a preseason all-MW first-team pick by Athlon Sports, Phil Steele Magazine and College Football News. He's also the 16th-rated player in the MW and SDSU's fourth-best defensive player by CFN, and one of San Diego State's five-best returning players by ESPN.

Thompson continued to rack up the preseason accolades, a year after registering 55 tackles (44 solo) to go along with three tackles for loss, a sack, four interceptions, eight pass breakups, two forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries (tied for sixth in Aztec single-season history). Thompson earned second-team all-Mountain West accolades for a third consecutive season.

So far this preseason, Thompson has landed on the watch lists for the Bednarik Award and Jim Thorpe Award (best defensive back), and preseason first-team all-MW picks by Athlon Sports, Phil Steele Magazine and College Football News. Additionally, Thompson has been deemed the sixth-rated player in the MW and SDSU's second-best defensive player by CFN, and one of San Diego State's five-best returning players by ESPN.

Finally, Hall joined Thomas, Banks and Thompson on the preseason all-MW team after 49 tackles (34 solo) last year, as well as 3.5 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, two forced fumbles, a fumble recovery returned for a touchdown, an interception and a team-high-tying 16 pass breakups. His 16 pass breakups tied for the most in the country, and he also ranked in a tie for sixth in pass deflections (INT + PBU) per game (1.42) and tied for 10th in total passes defended (17). Additionally, his 16 PBUs tied Barcoo (2019) and Ron Smith (2017) for the second most in San Diego State single-season history.

Hall, who landed on the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List with Thompson, also has been selected as a preseason first-team all-MW picks by Athlon Sports, Phil Steele Magazine and College Football News. He's also been deemed SDSU's fifth-best defensive player by CFN and one of San Diego State's five-best returning players by ESPN.

Notes: San Diego State's four preseason all-MW selections tied for the second most in the league ... The Aztecs' four all-league selections matched their most since the 2016 season ... SDSU has at least three all-MW picks in six straight years after doing so just four times over the previous 10 years (2005-14) ... San Diego State's defensive selections are their most in league history (since 1999) ... The Aztecs have at least one defensive player on the preseason all-MW team in nine of the last 10 seasons ... SDSU did not have a preseason offensive player for the first time since 2008 after having multiple players the previous five seasons ... WAR Tariq Thompson (three-time second-team all-MW pick) is on the preseason all-MW team for a third straight season, the first Aztec in league history to make a preseason team three different seasons ... DT Cameron Thomas is just the second Aztec sophomore on defense to make a preseason all-MW team (also Thompson in 2018) ... Thomas and Banks are the first SDSU defensive linemen on the preseason all-MW team since Alex Barrett in 2016, just the third and fourth since 2006 (Antwan Applewhite), and the fourth and fifth in league history (Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila in 1999) ... SDSU has two defensive linemen on the preseason team for the first time in MW history ... CB Darren Hall is the first Aztec cornerback on the preseason all-MW team since two-time MW Defensive Player of the Year Damontae Kazee made the teams in 2015 and 2016.

FOOTBALL RELEASES START TIMES, TV DETAILS FOR 2020

The San Diego State football team and the Mountain West announced start times and national television details. The Aztecs are set to play five times on CBS Sports Network, once on FS1, once on ESPN Networks (ABC, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPN3) and once on Spectrum Sports.

Additionally, six of the team's eight regular-season games are set for Saturday with the two exceptions being Friday contests. SDSU's five games on CBS Sports Network all have start times, including home contests vs. UNLV on Oct. 24 (7:30 p.m. PT), San José State on Friday, Nov. 6 (6 p.m. PT) and Colorado State on Dec. 5 (7:30 p.m. PT). San Diego State will also play road games on the network on Oct. 31 at Utah State (7:30 p.m. MT) and Nov. 21 at Nevada (12:30 p.m. PT).

The Aztecs also have a start time for their home game against Hawai'i on Nov. 14, which will begin at 1 p.m. PT on Spectrum Sports.

SDSU's Friday game at Fresno State on Nov. 27 will be broadcast on FS1, but a start time has yet to be announced. Additionally, San Diego State's regular-season finale at Brigham Young on Dec. 12 will air on either ABC, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPN3 or ESPN3 at a time still to be determined.

The Mountain West Championship game will be played on Dec. 19 and will be broadcast on either FOX or FS1.

Was 19-for-24 for 172 yards and a touchdown without throwing an interception ... Had a 79.2 completion percentage and a 153.12 pass efficiency rating ... Also had eight rush attempts for seven yards (0.9 avg.) with a long of five yards ... If you take away the two times he was sacked for seven yards, he rushed six times for 14 yards (2.3 avg.) ...
