► **The Records:** After securing its first victory of the year, the San Diego State women's basketball team will play its next two contests in a three-day period before taking a much deserved break for the holidays. The Aztecs are continuing their five-game homestand to round out 2005, with match-ups against first-time opponent Boise State and Big East Conference member Pittsburgh.

The Broncos are 6-3 overall in 2005-06, after defeating USD on Sunday, while the Panthers are currently 8-2 after defeating Pepperdine Monday before traveling down the coast to San Diego.

► **SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the first year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She coached the Aztecs from 1989 to 1997 and has a school record of 152-88 in nine seasons. Her 14-year head coaching record stands at 233-153.

► **Boise State Head Coach Gordy Presnell:** Presnell is in his first season at Boise State and boasts a school record of 6-3. His career record is 402-130 in 19 seasons.

► **Boise State Series History:** This is the first all-time meeting between SDSU and Boise State.

► **Pittsburgh Head Coach Agnus Berenato:** Berenato has a three-year record of 26-37 at Pittsburgh and an overall 22-year coaching record of 302-299.

► **Pittsburgh Series History:** San Diego State leads, 1-0 (Last: SDSU def. Pitt, 83-69, in San Diego on Dec. 30, 1995.)

SDSU Women's Basketball Plays Two Games In Three Days As Homestand Continues

Coming off its first victory of the 2005-06 campaign, the San Diego State women's basketball team plays its next two games in a three-day span at Cox Arena. The Aztecs faces two schools that are a combined 14-5 on the season, beginning with a Tuesday meeting with first-time opponent Boise State at 5:30 p.m., and followed by a rare Thursday afternoon contest against Pittsburgh at 2 p.m.

The two games are part of a five-game SDSU homestand, which also includes a pair of dates to round out non-conference action at the San Diego Surf 'N Slam Tournament, December 28 and 30.

coach Beth Burns' second tenure Friday night by defeating visiting Portland State, 75-71, at Cox Arena. The Aztecs, playing their first home game in 24 days, improved to 1-5 on the year, while the Vikings dropped to 5-4 overall in 2005-06.

SDSU got 22 points and a career-high 11 rebounds from senior forward **Michelle Strawberry (Corona, Calif.)**. Two other Aztecs reached double-figures in scoring with senior guard **Veronica Shaw (Phoenix, Ariz.)** chipping in 16 points and four assists, and junior center **Desiree Johnson (Kahuku, Hawaii)** adding 10 points, seven rebounds and four blocks. Freshman point guard **Tamika Lipford (Oceanside, Calif.)** also had a career night with 11 assists in only 28 minutes of action.

The story of the game was the Aztecs' shooting, as the team made 26-of-49 field goals for a season-best 53.1 percentage and was also 21-for-30 from the line (70 percent).

San Diego State opened the game by going on an 18-8 run and later led by as many as 15 points at 29-14 with 6:25 remaining in the first half. Portland State rallied all the way back, taking a one and then two-point lead, as the Aztecs were stuck at 29 points for almost six minutes, but they managed to head into the locker room tied at 31.

Shaw broke the tie with the first bucket of the half, giving the Aztecs the lead which they would never relinquish. The Vikings got to within one point on seven occasions and trailed by just a pair following a Delaney Conway lay-up at 70-68 with 1:44 showing on the clock. Portland State, however, committed four turnovers and SDSU made just enough of its free throws (5-for-10) to preserve the 75-71 victory.

Other Portland State Notes

SDSU restarted a pair of streaks after a one-game absence against Portland State, owning an advantage on the boards for the fourth time this season and returning to double-figures in steals for the fifth time in six games... freshman **Brittany Santos (Paso Robles, Calif.)** suited up for the first time this season, but did not see playing time. Santos injured her knee in fall camp and saw her first day of practice last Tuesday... SDSU shot over .500 percent from the field for the first time since last season's win at Air Force... the Aztecs owned an advantage at the free-throw line, while they committed more turnovers than their opponent for the first time in 2005-06.

Strawberry Named MWC Player of the Week

San Diego State senior forward Michelle Strawberry was named Mountain West Conference player of the week, the league office announced Monday. Strawberry led the Aztecs to their first victory of the season on Friday, pouring in 22 points and grabbing a career-high 11 rebounds against Portland State (75-71).

Strawberry shot 70 percent from the field (7-for-10) and 87.5 percent from the line (7-for-8) in logging her second career double-double. She has recorded double-figures in rebounds three times and in points on five occasions already this season, exceeding the 20-point mark twice. Strawberry ranks second in the conference in offensive rebounds (3.50/g), third in scoring (15.8/g), fourth in free-throw percentage (84.0) and fifth in rebounding (8.3/g).

The honor is the first of her career, while she is the first Aztec to be named Mountain West Conference player of the week since December 2002. Strawberry becomes the fifth SDSU player in the league's seven-year history to be named player of the week.

Lipford's Language

In just 28 minutes of action, true freshman point guard Tamika Lipford accomplished something that no Aztec has been able to do in the last five years. Lipford reached double-figures in assists with 11 against Portland State, becoming the first SDSU player to have 10 or more assists in a game since the 2000-01 season. Lipford's 11 assists more than doubled her previous career best of five, which she recorded in the opener. Her total is the most by an Aztec since Shannon Lee had 14 assists against Illinois State on Nov. 24, 2000 (W, 88-59).

With her 11-assist effort, Lipford vaulted from ninth to third in assists per game in the MWC with a 4.67 average.

Blocking Machine

San Diego State has a season-high eight blocks against Portland State with half of them coming from senior

Desiree Johnson. The eight blocks are the most by the Aztecs in a game since tallying 10 versus Creighton on Dec. 22, 2002, while the four rejections ties Lindsey Casey's effort against Northern Colorado last December.

Johnson is the conference leader in blocked shots per game with a 1.67 mark.

Double-Double

Senior Michelle Strawberry tallied her second career double-double versus Portland State with 22 points and 11 rebounds. A year ago, the Aztecs only had one player record a double-double on one occasion. From 2002-04, former SDSU player Ashlee Dunlap dominated that category, tallying 21 during her two-year tenure on The Mesa.

Seniors Rule

Michelle Strawberry hasn't been the only senior to carry the offensive load for the Aztecs in 2005-06. Classmate Veronica Shaw scored 16 points in the win over Portland State after tallying a season-high 17 points versus Pepperdine. The 17 points were just two shy of her career-best of 19 versus Utah last season.

So far this season, Strawberry and Shaw have reached double-figures in points a combined eight times and have accounted for 166 of the team's 369 total points (45 percent). Add in junior Desiree Johnson's 51 points and the three upperclassmen starters are contributing 59 percent of the total offense.

Second-Half Sparks

Both Michelle Strawberry and Veronica Shaw scored in double-figures in the second half of the team's victory against Portland State. Strawberry had 13 of her 22 points, while Shaw had 12 of her 16 points.

So far this year, an Aztec has scored 10 or more points in the second half of a game six times as opposed to only twice in the first 20 minutes.

The Boise State's are under the direction of first-year head coach Gordy Presnell, who replaced current Colorado State head coach Jen Warden... The Broncos have been led by Jessica Thompson, who is averaging 15.2 points per game... Nadia Begay averaged 14.4 points per contest and is the team's top three-point threat (25-for-62)... Jackie Lee is the third Boise State to average in double-figures (14.4 ppg.) and is first in rebounds per game (6.9)... The Broncos have played one common opponent with SDSU thus far (USD), while the Aztecs are the second MWC team on their schedule (L, 68-54 to Wyoming).

► If SDSU defeats both Boise State and Pittsburgh, it will have a three-game win streak for the first time since 2003. That year, the Aztecs opened with a loss to St. Mary's before defeating Nevada and grabbing road wins at Cal State Fullerton and UC Irvine.

► SDSU improves to 8-4 against members of the Big East Conference. Each of the Aztecs' last two games against schools in the Big East have both been against the Panthers.

► SDSU head coach Beth Burns is 5-0 all-time versus Pittsburgh. Burns was 2-0 against the Panthers as the head coach at Ohio State, winning 66-54 in Pittsburgh in 1997, and cruising to a 75-40 victory in Columbus in 1998.

Pittsburgh Tid-Bits

Pittsburgh is coming off a 79-64 win over Pepperdine on Monday night... The Panthers are 8-2 on the season and 1-0 in the Big East Conference... Pittsburgh won its first four games of the year and will bring a three-game win streak to San Diego ... Pitt has been led by center Mercedes Walker's 16.6 points and 7.4 rebounds per game... Junior Mallorie Winn averages 15.9 points an outing and is 20 for 42 from beyond the arc ... Winn is also her team's assists leader with 41, while freshman Xenia Stewart and senior Cheron Taylor have been in Pittsburgh's starting five in all 10 games this season... Winn is a San Diego native, who attended the same high school as SDSU freshman Tamika Lipford (Bishop's)... Winn is the daughter of former Aztec assistant coach Fentriss Winn (2004-05).

Other 2005-06 Aztec Notes Thus Far

- SDSU's 79 points at Wichita State are the program's most in a season-opener since scoring 101 versus McNeese State in 1990. The Aztecs have scored 79 points or more just six times in their first previous campaigns with two of those coming a year ago.

- Wichita State attempted an SDSU opponent record 50 free-throws beating the previous mark of 48, held by Louisiana Tech on Jan. 19, 1986 (L, 87-43).

- Michelle Strawberry's 29 points at Wichita State are the most by an SDSU player since Jamey Cox had 30 against Cal State Fullerton in 1999. Her 12 field goals are the most since Jodi Nowlin-Tres had 12 versus Air Force in Feb. 1997, while her 21 attempts are the most since Nowlin-Tres had 25 at Fresno State in Feb. 1996.

-The SDSU-USD game attracted 971 fans to Cox Arena, the largest Aztec home crowd since 1,062 people saw the Aztecs beat Air Force back on Jan. 26, 2002. It is the best attendance for a non-conference home game since Dec. 11, 1998, when there were 972 fans to watch SDSU play UCLA.

-The Aztecs' 93.8 percent free-throw percentage against USD is the team's best when attempting 10 or more in a game since the 1988-89 campaign. The Aztecs made 22 of their 23 attempts (95.7) in a 78-56 win over Tennessee Tech on Dec. 3, 1988, in the second game of the SDSU Classic in Peterson Gym.

Pick Eight

The San Diego State women's basketball team has been predicted to finish eighth in the Mountain West Conference in a preseason poll released Oct. 13, at the league's basketball media day in Salt Lake City, Utah. The voting panel consisted of the league's nine head coaches and select media.

The Aztecs, who finished tied for seventh with Air Force in the 2004-05 regular season, earned 45 votes from the panel, 13 more than the Falcons (32) and 45 behind Wyoming (90) for seventh place.

Utah, which tied for the 2004-05 regular season crown with New Mexico, was tabbed as the clear-cut preseason favorite, marking the third time the Utes have been picked to finish atop the conference. Utah received

23-of-26 first-place votes and 214 total points. New Mexico had two first-place votes and finished second with 180 points, followed by MWC newcomer TCU with one first-place vote and 164 points. UNLV (137 pts.) placed fourth, followed by Colorado State (117 pts.), BYU (107 pts.), Wyoming, SDSU and Air Force.

Key Points For The Aztecs In 2005-06

Offense - Half of SDSU's top six scorers from the 2004-05 squad return this season, including senior Michelle Strawberry, who averaged a team-best 12.9 points per league game. Guards Kate Eveland and Veronica Shaw chipped in 6.0 and 5.1 points per game, respectively, but the remaining returnees combined to average just 2.1 points per outing.

Defense - San Diego State experienced extremes on the defensive side of the ball a year ago. The Aztecs led the conference in both steals and turnover margin, but on the flip side, struggled on the boards.

Returnees contributed over half of the Aztecs' 281 steals, including 52 by Eveland and 50 by Shaw. Freshmen Tamika Lipford and LaSandra Dixon, as well as transfer Shanna Demus add instant foot speed and athleticism to the line-up.

The Aztecs will look for immediate help in the rebounding department from front court newcomers Desiree Johnson, Jana Heinrich and Audrey Green, as well as redshirt sophomore Erin Jackson.

The Schedule: The most dramatic change in SDSU's 2005-06 schedule comes with the addition of a ninth team, TCU, to the Mountain West Conference ... league games will be played on Wednesdays or Thursdays and on Saturdays from Jan. 5 through March 4, but will no longer feature the travel partner format ... SDSU opens league play on Jan. 5, the earliest the Aztecs have played a conference contest since 1997-98 ... just two of the 10 non-conference foes appeared on last season's schedule (USD, UC Riverside) ... five schools - Auburn, Boise State, Loyola (Md.), Wichita State, UC Davis - are first-time Aztec opponents ... the Aztecs will face schools from as many as eight different conferences ... SDSU plays host to a tournament for the first time since 2000.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa on April 8, 2005. In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02) and has an overall record of 233-153 (.604). Her current SDSU record stands at 152-88 (.633).
