- ▶ **The Records:** SDSU split its two exhibition contests, falling to Vanguard 66-52 and beating Australian travel team Nunawading Spectres Monday night, 71-47. The Aztecs finished the 2002-03 campaign with a 9-18 record and a 3-11 mark in the Mountain West Conference. Saint Mary's is coming off an 11-17 season and a 4-10 record in the West Coast Conference. The Gaels played just one exhibition game prior to tonight's season opener, defeating a Latvian select team, 60-54, on Nov. 9.
- ▶ **In The RPI:** In the 2003-04 preseason strength of schedule report released by the WBCA on Oct. 21, SDSU's schedule is ranked 152nd, while St. Mary's is 134th of the 324 NCAA Division I teams.
- ▶ **SDSU Head Coach Jim Tomey:** Tomey (Michigan '81) is in his second season at San Diego State after taking over the Aztec helm on April 9, 2002. His career and Aztec head coaching record is 9-18.
- ▶ **Saint Mary's Head Coach Michelle Jacoby:** Jacoby is in her fourth season at Saint Mary's and owns a Gael and career record of 53-36.
- ▶ **Series History:** St. Mary's leads 2-0 (Last: SMC def. SDSU, 60-47, in Moraga, 11/25/02)

SDSU Women's Basketball Opens 2003-04 With Televised Home Game With Saint Mary's
With two exhibition games under its belt, the San Diego State women's basketball season officially kicks off this Friday when the Aztecs play host to the Saint Mary's Gaels at 5:00 p.m. at Cox Arena. The game is a re-match from last year when the Gaels beat the Aztecs, 60-47, at Saint Mary's in Moraga, Calif.

SDSU split its two exhibitions games in 2003 for the fifth straight season, defeating Australian travel team Nunawading Spectres (71-47) Monday, after falling to Vanguard (66-52) last week. Saint Mary's, meanwhile, played just one exhibition game, beating a Latvian select team by six points (60-54) on Nov. 9.

Friday's game is the season opener for both schools and will be televised live on Channel 4 San Diego. The SDSU men will play later in the evening against Long Beach State at 7:30 p.m.

record for the fifth straight season as the Aztecs defeated Australian travel team Nunawading Spectres, 71-47, Monday at Cox Arena.

SDSU had two players finish with double-doubles with sophomore Ashlee Dunlap (Los Angeles, Calif.) tallying 13 points and 18 rebounds and junior Candace Mattson (Alpine, Utah) finishing with 11 points and 10 boards.

The Aztecs led the entire game, going up 29-22 with 4:04 remaining in the first half, before taking control with a 10-0 run over the next 8:20 of the game. SDSU led by as many as 29 points at 65-36 with four minutes left in the contest.

San Diego State held Nunawading to 28.4 percent shooting (19-of-67) and 16.7 percent on three's (3-of-18). The Aztecs shot 38.9 percent (28-of-72) and outrebounded the Spectres, 60-41.

Other Nunawading Notes

For the second straight game, all 11 Aztecs players, with the exception injured freshman Jordie Smith (Fort Collins, Colo.), saw at least six minutes of playing time ... Smith is out for at least a month with a stress reaction in a vertebrae in her back ... all 11 players also scored at least two points ... Ashlee Dunlap's 18 boards would have matched her career high had the game not been an exhibition ... Dunlap had 10 of her 18 rebounds and all five blocks in the first half ... freshman Michelle Elliott was the only Aztec to score in double-figures both games, tallying 15 in the first and 11 in the next ... SDSU outblocked its opponents in the two exhibitions, 16-1.

Aztecs For Openers

For the third straight year and just the 11th time in program history, the San Diego State women's basketball team will open its season at home. The Aztecs are 8-2 overall when they kick-off their season at home, while they are 23-4 in home openers. SDSU has not been as fortunate in season openers, carrying a 16-11 record since the program began in 1976-77.

In the past six years, the team has won five of six home openers, but on the flip side, is 3-3 in season openers.

Saint Mary's Tid-Bits

The Gaels return three starters from last year's 11-17 squad which failed to make the postseason for the first time in four seasons ... San Diego native Triola Jackson is coming off an outstanding sophomore campaign in which she earned first team all-conference honors with 16.1 ppg. and 9.5 rpg. ... Jackson had 13 points against the Aztecs last season, while fellow returnee Carey Noakes had a game-high 15 points ... St. Mary's has won each of the teams' two previous meetings, starting with a 83-68 win in 1990 ... this is the first time the two schools will face in San Diego ... St. Mary's is one of just four non-Mountain West teams to appear on both this year's and last year's Aztec schedule.

2002 - Saint Mary's Flashback

The San Diego State women's basketball team shot just 25 percent from the field in the first half, scoring only 17 points, as the Aztecs went on to fall to Saint Mary's College, 60-47, at McKeon Pavilion.

Despite the loss, SDSU got a second double-double of the season in as many tries from Ashlee Dunlap, who posted a team-high 15 points and 13 rebounds. Nicolette McCartney (Chicago, Ill.) added nine points before fouling out, while Jamey Cox was kept scoreless on 0-for-7 shooting for just the fifth time in her career.

al letters of intent. Forward **Ashley Cheesman (Orem, Utah)**, point guard **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)**, center **Whitney Hollison (Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif.)** and wing **Marin McCue (Calgary, Alberta)** will join the Aztecs in the fall of 2004.

Pick Six

The San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish sixth in the Mountain West Conference in a preseason poll released Oct. 7, at the league's basketball media day in Denver, Colo. The voting panel consisted of the conference's eight head coaches and select media.

The Aztecs jumped one spot from each of the three previous preseason polls, receiving 57 total points. SDSU, which finished seventh in the MWC a year ago, was accurately picked to place sixth in the inaugural poll in 1999-2000.

Back Again

While SDSU returns just three letterwinners, all three, senior Nicolette McCartney and sophomores Ashlee Dunlap and **Veronica Shaw (Phoenix, Ariz.)**, played starring roles a year ago.

McCartney is the lone returning upperclassman, having started in all 27 games in 2002-03. The senior is the conference's top returning shot blocker, who is tied for sixth in the Aztec career record books with 76 blocks. McCartney posted career highs in almost every category as a junior, averaging a career best 7.5 points and 6.0 rebounds per game.

averaging a career best 7.5 points and 6.0 rebounds per game.

Dunlap, meanwhile, had an outstanding freshman campaign, leading the conference in both rebounding (8.8/g) and double-doubles (10). In addition, she ranked first on the team in field goals and steals and was second in scoring and blocks. A conference honorable mention selection, Dunlap led the team in scoring 19 times and in rebounding on 20 occasions.

The team's third returning letterwinner, Shaw, started in 14 games before missing most of the second half of the conference schedule with a knee injury. Prior to that, she was the Aztecs' spark on both sides of the ball, averaging 7.6 points and 2.0 steals per game. In the team's upset victory over Colorado State, Shaw showed off her versatility with a team-best 16 points, nine rebounds and three steals.

Sophomore **Michelle Strawberry (Corona, Calif.)** also returns for the Aztecs.

Noting The Newcomers

Eight newcomers comprising three of the four class levels will don Aztec uniforms this season.

The junior class of **Lindsey Casey (Odessa, Texas)** and **Candace Mattson (Alpine, Utah)** adds instant experience to the San Diego State line-up. Casey played for championship squads at

both the University of Oklahoma and Midland College and should help both on the offensive and defensive boards. Mattson, meanwhile, competed at Salt Lake City Community College the last two years and offers great versatility with ability to shoot from the perimeter or post up players inside.

Junior college transfer Faryyn Lewis (Walnut Creek, Calif.) gives SDSU added depth and experience at the forward position, while the five-member freshman class boasts three guards and two forwards, who will need to step in immediately and contribute on all areas of the court.

Geographically Challenged

The SDSU coaching staff traveled far and wide to make-up its 2003 recruiting class. This year's 12-player roster includes players from 10 states with the most coming from California (3). Other states represented include: Arizona, Colorado, Illinois, Nevada, Oregon, Texas, Utah, Washington and Wisconsin.

Another Block Party?

A year ago, San Diego State ranked second in the Mountain West Conference in blocks with 99 or 3.67 blocks per game. The total was surprising, considering only two players, Ashlee Dunlap and Nicolette McCartney, combined for 77 blocks or 78 percent of the team's total. McCartney enters this season tied for sixth on the Aztec career leaders' chart.

Year Two: Fast Facts

Three of the previous five Aztec coaches to coach more than one year at SDSU have seen improvements in their second seasons at the helm. Kathleen Wallace (1976-78) went from four wins in her inaugural campaign to 10 the next season. Richie Spears (1978-1983) followed suit with 23 victories his second year, after tallying 13 his first season.

While Earnest Riggins broke the string, tallying three less victories than his first season, Beth Burns doubled her win total in two years, going from a 7-23 record in 1989-90 to a 14-14 mark in 1990-91. Barb Smith went from 10-15 to 7-19, but then rebounded a year later with the best effort, a 13-15 record, of her Aztec tenure.

Key Points For The Aztecs In 2003-04

Offense - The Aztecs must find a way to replace career three-point leader and team captain Jamey Cox both on and off the court ... Cox averaged a team-best 12.7 points per contest and accounted for 64 percent of SDSU's 121 three-pointers ... scoring is the main focus this season, after the team averaged just 50.8 points per conference game and was kept below the 50-point barrier in each of its final four contests.

Defense - While both of the team's top two rebounders return, SDSU averaged 32.8 rebounds a game and only 30.3 boards in conference play, ranking last in the MWC in both categories ... the Aztecs excelled in steals (8.70/g) and blocks (3.67/g), while holding opponents to a sub .400 field-goal percentage 13 times.

The Schedule - Non-conference meetings with 13 schools from seven states and seven different conferences highlight the 2003-04 San Diego State women's basketball schedule.

The Aztecs begin by playing host to St. Mary's College (Nov. 21) and Nevada-Reno (Nov. 24). The team then heads on a three-game road trip to Big West Conference schools Cal State Fullerton, UC Irvine and Cal State Northridge, prior to a three-game set at home, featuring crosstown rival University of San Diego (Dec. 10). SDSU rounds out 2003 with trips to Washington State and the University of Alabama-Birmingham tournament before concluding non-conference action with Santa Clara and Texas Pan-American.

The Aztecs will once again face a grueling conference schedule as six of the Mountain West's eight schools are coming off postseason bids (three NCAA, three WNIT).

Unparalleled Coverage

Aztec fans will get a chance to follow the women's basketball team in a number of ways this season. Every regular-season game will once again be broadcast live on the internet by a trio of veterans in Bill Earley (play-by-play), Tammy Blackburn (analyst) and Dan Lawton (road games, home pre- and postgame shows). Earley will be the play-by-play announcer for each of SDSU's two television games, Nov. 21 and Dec. 20, on Channel 4 San Diego.

A new feature this season will be gametracker or live stats for every Aztec home game. Gametracker, available on SDSU's official athletics website goaztecs.com, will allow fans to follow each play and check on individual and team stats as they occur.
