## Aztec Basketball Concludes Season-Opening Homestand Tues. vs. UC Irvine

The San Diego State women's basketball team finishes its season-opening, three-game homestand this Tuesday, when the Aztecs take on UC Irvine at 7 p.m. at Viejas Arena.

Both sides are looking for their first victories of the year, as SDSU is 0-2, while the Anteaters come to campus with an 0-3 mark. The Aztecs dropped a 73-62 decision to visiting Cal State Bakersfield last week after a season-opening 55-48 loss to the current No. 15 team in the nation in UCLA.

San Diego State won the most recent meeting with UC Irvine in 2009, as **Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.)** scored a game-high 18 points for the 64-42 victory at the Bren Events Center in Irvine, Calif. UCI, whose three losses this season have all come away from home, is the first of only three non-conference foes that also appeared on last year's Aztec schedule.

After Tuesday's game, SDSU will be on the road for six straight outings over the next three and a half weeks before playing host to Washington State on Dec. 21.

The 23rd all-time meeting with the Anteaters will feature a live audio/video broadcast with Chris Ello, as well as live stats, on goaztecs.com.

## Last Time Out: SDSU Women's Basketball Drops 73-62 Decision To Cal State Bakersfield

Cal State Bakersfield outscored San Diego State 12-3 in the final four minutes of the game to earn a 73-62 victory over the host Aztecs last Wednesday at Viejas Arena. With the loss, SDSU dropped to 0-2 on the season, while the Roadrunners improved to 3-0 following the two schools' first-ever meeting.

San Diego State senior center Paris Johnson led the Aztecs both offensively and on the glass, tallying her 16th career double-double with a career-best 18 rebounds and 19 points on 7-for-8 shooting. Sophomore **Courtney Clements (Long Beach, Calif.)** was the only other Aztec in double-figure points with 15 to go with eight rebounds and three assists. Freshman **Melissa Sweat (Bakersfield, Calif.)** had eight points and was a perfect 2-for-2 from beyond the arc, while senior **Jessika Bradley (Sacramento, Calif.)** had nine rebounds and three assists. Senior **Coco Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** had a team-best six assists, but was 1-for-11 from the field.

Cal State Bakersfield jumped out to an early 10-point lead, taking advantage of SDSU's five turnovers in the first three minutes, and the hot shooting of Roadrunner guard Britney McGee, who had 10 points during that same span. The Aztecs finally were able to put some offense together, scoring six straight points to get to within four at 14-10 at the 13:07 mark.

CSUB, however, pushed its lead back up to nine points until a late run, including a pair of triples by junior **Sajoyia Griffin (San Antonio, Texas)**, put the home team down by only three at 33-30 heading into the locker room.

San Diego State came out of the break and tied the game at 35, before pushing out to its largest lead of the night at 44-37 less than four minutes into the second half. That advantage quickly disappeared when the Roadrunners converted two more Aztec giveaways into points and a 44-44 tie.

After another tie at 48-48, SDSU had another turnover and missed two free throw attempts which ignited a 7-0

CSUB run. The Aztec deficit would grow to 10 with 1:33 remaining and left too little time for another rally, as the Roadrunners came away with the 73-62 win.

San Diego State owned a +16 advantage on the glass, but had 24 turnovers and shot just 34.5 percent from the field. CSUB scored 31 of its 73 points off turnovers and had 24 second-chance points with the help of 19 offensive rebounds. The Roadrunners also had only nine giveaways themselves.

**Other CS Bakersfield Notes**

► SDSU's 22 offensive rebounds are its most in an outing since also grabbing 22 vs. UNLV on March 7, 2009.

► CS Bakersfield's 74 field-goal attempts are the most by an SDSU foe since Colorado State tried 78 on March 1, 2001.

► CS Bakersfield did not tally a blocked shot in the game, something that happened in two of the Aztecs' outings a year ago.

► The Roadrunners' nine turnovers are the fewest by an SDSU opponent since Auburn also had nine on Dec. 30, 2009.

**It's A Paris Double-Double**

San Diego State senior Paris Johnson posted an impressive effort against Cal State Bakersfield. She dominated the boards with a career-high 18, including 12 on the defensive side, while also chipping in a game-high 19 points on 7-of-8 shooting for her 16th career double-double.

Johnson's 18 rebounds exceeded her previous career best of 15 on two occasions, and is the most by an Aztec in a single outing since Ashlee Dunlap also had 18 in a win against American University in Dec. 2002.

The 18 boards helped Johnson go over the 700-mark in her career and makes her just the sixth player in SDSU history to accomplish that feat.

**Paris To 100 & Beyond**

Senior center Paris Johnson is slated to make her 100th career start in her 100th career game at San Diego State on Tuesday vs. UC Irvine.

Johnson needs to log minutes in only 11 more outings to enter the Aztec career top 10 and tie Kate Eveland for 10th place in career games played.

Classmate Coco Davis isn't far behind in reaching the century mark and is slated to play in her 97th game in the Red & Black vs. the Anteaters.

**Did You Know Random Facts?**

► SDSU is opening its season with three consecutive home games for only the second time in program history. The Aztecs were 2-1 the only other time this has occurred in 1978-79. This is only the seventh time SDSU has even played two straight home games to start a campaign (also 1976, 1978, 1992, 1997, 2003, 2006).

► Each of San Diego State's first three opponents have blue and gold as their team colors.

**Notes With A 'W'**

An SDSU victory over the UC Irvine will mean:

► SDSU improves to 18-5 all-time vs. the Anteaters, has won three in a row and 10 of the last 11 in the series.

► SDSU improves to 26-3 at home over the last three season against unranked teams.

► SDSU avoids going 0-3 to start a campaign since dropping the first five contests in 2005-06.

► SDSU is 1-0 vs. teams it also faced a year ago.

► SDSU improves to 83-75 against teams out of the Big West Conference and has won the last 10 match-ups, dating back to 2005.

**UC Irvine Tid-Bits**

UC Irvine and the Aztecs tangle for the 23rd time overall and for the second consecutive season ... SDSU won in both teams' season-openers in 2009-10, and have claimed nine of the last 10 outings ... UCI will play its fourth consecutive road game to open the season, having lost at UTEP (72-57), at New Mexico (71-59) and at Fresno State (67-63) ... The Anteaters are led by junior Mikah Maly-Karros, who is averaging 20.7 points per outing and 9.0 rebounds a game ... She also has 23 of her team's 41 free throws and five of its 10 blocks ... Senior Jade Smith-Williams is the team's second-leading scorer with 8.7 ppg., including five 3-pointers, 13 assists and seven steals ... UCI is shooting 34.0 percent from beyond the arc, but is getting outrebounded by a minus-16.0 margin.

**Flashback - 2009 SDSU at UC Irvine**

The San Diego State women's basketball team used a 12-0 second-half run to come out with a 64-42 victory at UC Irvine in its first game of 2009-10 on Nov. 13, at the Bren Events Center.

SDSU had three players finish in double-figure points, including leading scorer junior Paris Johnson, who notched 11 of her game-high 18 points in the first half. Senior Jené Morris finished with 13 points and junior Allison Duffy contributed 11 points off the bench.

San Diego State got off to a bit of a slow start, as UC Irvine scored the first basket of the game, before the Aztecs' first field-goal at the 17:26 mark by Johnson. The team then reeled off two more baskets to lead by five, but the Anteaters, using a small line-up, tied the score at seven apiece and were within single digits for a majority of the first half, as SDSU only led 32-22 at the break.

In the second half, the two sides continued to trade baskets, until a three-point play by Allison Duffy at the 17:43 mark sparked an 8-0 run for a more comfortable 18-point advantage at 42-24, heading into the first media timeout. The Aztecs extended their scoring spurt to 12 unanswered on a layup and a pair of free throws, until UC Irvine finally broke through with a 3-pointer and another basket to trail by 17 at 46-29.

The San Diego State lead rose once again to 22 points with 5:37 left and never got lower than 16 points, before capturing the 22-point win at 64-42.

The Aztecs shot 47.8 percent from the field, while the Anteaters made just under 26 percent of their shots. SDSU boasted a +9 advantage on the boards, but had 26 turnovers on the night.

UC Irvine was led by Jade Smith-Williams' 15 points and six assists, while Lauren Spinazze had 11 points.

**Aztecs Fall Recruiting Class Ranked 20th**

San Diego State women's basketball's fall 2010 recruiting class has been rated 20th nationally and first in the Mountain West Conference according to *Espn.com's HoopGurlz* national rankings. The Aztecs moved up 11 spots from last year's No. 31 final ranking, after inking

five high school seniors to National Letters of Intent during the early signing period, Nov. 10-17.

For the second campaign in a row, the Aztecs are easily the top ranked school among Mountain West Conference members, as TCU is the only other team listed in the top 40 at No. 38. San Diego State's recruiting class is rated higher than several notable programs including LSU (No. 22), Notre Dame (No. 25), Ohio State (No. 26), Georgetown (No. 27), West Virginia (No. 28), Nebraska (No. 34) and Michigan State (No. 51). The Aztecs are also the only school in a "non-automatic BCS qualifying" conference rated in the top 30.

San Diego State signed three, four-star recruits according to HoopGurlz, including forward Chairese Culberson, who was the No. 7 rated wing and 46th overall, forward Deajanae Scurry (No. 31 forward) and point guard Ahjalee Harvey (No. 32 point guard). Forwards Kristina Hunter and Erimma Amarikwa rounded out the Aztec fall signing class.

### Record Watch

San Diego State's senior trio of Coco Davis, Paris Johnson and Jessica Bradley are well on their way toward making a dent in the Aztec record book.

Johnson needs just 39 more blocks to become the school's all-time career leader, surpassing current record-holder Michelle Suman, who had 251 from 1992-95. Johnson is also sixth in the SDSU record book in career rebounds with 707, and is one of only five Aztecs to post 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 100 blocks in their careers. She is 15th in scoring (1,215), 10th in free throws (223) and fifth in free-throw attempts (402).

Davis, meanwhile, is just one triple away from entering the top 10 in that category, boasting 64. Her 219 attempts from beyond the arc are 10th and her 270 assists are 22 away from the record book.

After only one season in the Red & Black, Bradley needs just five more blocks to enter the SDSU top 10, after posting a squad-best 63 as a junior and three in the opening two games.

### Home Sweet Home

While SDSU's 0-2 start at home is an uncommon sight in recent memory on The Mesa, the Aztecs have still won 27 of their last 32 home games and are 25-3 over the last three years vs. unranked opponents at Viejas Arena.

San Diego State finished its regular-season home campaign with a 12-2 record in 2009-10. Combined with

the 2008-09 squad that went 15-1, the Aztecs recorded back-to-back campaigns with double-digit wins at home for the first time since the 1996-97 squad went 11-2 and the 1995-96 team was 13-0.

SDSU actually has more than 10 wins at home in three of the last four seasons, as the squad went 11-5 in 2006-07.

### Other 2010-11 Notes Thus Far

- Courtney Clements' 19 points vs. UCLA are the most by an Aztec in a season-opener since Michelle Strawberry had 29 points against Wichita State in November 2005.

### Preseason Points

The reigning MWC champion San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish second in the league in 2011 in a vote by the nine head coaches and select media members released Oct. 13, at the conference's annual media day in Denver, Colo.

The Aztecs received three first-place votes and 147 points overall, trailing only TCU, which had 16 first-place votes (174 points). SDSU, which has been picked first or second each of the last three years, just edged out Brigham Young for second place, as the Cougars had 145 points and garnered the other two first-place votes. Utah was picked fourth, followed by Wyoming, New Mexico, UNLV, Colorado State and Air Force.

San Diego State has posted its two highest finishes in conference history the last two seasons, tying with Utah for first place in 2009, and for third place in 2010.

### Aztec Individual Accolades

Aztec senior center Paris Johnson was tabbed to the five-member preseason all-league squad for the third straight year at the MWC's annual media day last month. In addition, sophomore guard Courtney Clements, who redshirted a year ago after transferring from Arizona, was picked as the MWC's newcomer of the year and guard Melissa Sweat was chosen preseason freshman of the year.

Clements is the second SDSU player in a row to pick up the MWC's preseason newcomer of the year distinction, as senior Jessika Bradley was honored and went on to win the award last March.

Sweat, meanwhile, is the second Aztec on the current roster to earn the league's preseason freshman-of-the-year award, joining Johnson, who was honored in 2007.

**Poll Watching**

For the second consecutive season, San Diego State received votes in both national preseason top-25 polls. The Aztecs garnered the 34th-most votes (22 total) in the *USA Today ESPN* coaches edition, while they had the 37th-most votes (8 total) in the Associated Press Top 25.

SDSU earned votes in the coaches' poll eight times in 2009-10, including on Nov. 23, when it reached the No. 24 slot. The Aztecs finished the campaign at No. 20, the first time they had been ranked in the coaches' poll to end a season since it began in 1986.

The team also broke through in the AP poll a year ago, earning its first top-25 ranking (23rd on Nov. 23) since March 1995, when the team ended up 22nd following a 24-6 campaign.

SDSU is joined by TCU as the only two Mountain West Conference schools to receive votes in either poll thus far in 2010-11. The Aztecs garnered one vote in the first regular-season AP poll released Nov. 16.

**Strength Of Schedule**

In 2010-11, SDSU has potentially seven regular-season games against teams receiving votes in the AP preseason poll, which included the match-up with No. 16 UCLA to open the campaign on Nov. 12. Besides No. 23 TCU, who the Aztecs play twice, No. 8 Texas A&M (Dec. 30), North Carolina State (Nov. 27), Dayton (Dec. 18) and USC (Dec. 19) are all ranked or receiving votes.

**Other Things To Watch For In 2010-11**

Coming off one of the most successful seasons in Aztec basketball history, here are a few other things to look for in 2010-11:

- ♦ SDSU is scheduled to play the program's 1,000th game on Nov. 26, when the Aztecs take on Minnesota in Reno, Nev. San Diego State has an all-time record of 528-470.
- ♦ SDSU senior center Paris Johnson has started all 99 career contests since coming to Montezuma Mesa in 2007-08. She needs to start the next 24 outings to beat the school record for consecutive starts of 122, set a year ago by Quenese Davis.
- ♦ The Aztecs have 34 Mountain West Conference wins in the last four seasons after having only 19 in the league's first seven years.
- ♦ SDSU has advanced to the final of the Mountain West Conference Championships three years in a row, after not winning a single game in the MWC tournament's first eight years of existence.

**Back Again**

San Diego State returns three starters, including senior center Paris Johnson, senior forward Jessika Bradley and senior guard Coco Davis. Three other letterwinners also are back in juniors **Candace Chambers (Seattle, Wash.)** and **Kalena Tutt (Long Beach, Calif.)** and

sophomore Gabrielle Clark, who redshirted a year ago after lettering in 2008-09.

**Noting The Newcomers**

Of the 13 student-athletes on this year's roster, eight players did not compete for a full season with the Aztecs in 2009-10.

Four of the eight were on campus, but sophomores Courtney Clements and **Malia Nahinu (Hayward, Calif.)** both had to sit out a year after transferring from Arizona. Gabrielle Clark and **Kiyana Stamps (Moreno Valley, Calif.)**, meanwhile, each tore an ACL either before the season began (Clark) or less than two games into the campaign (Stamps), and utilized their medical redshirt year.

Two players, guards **Chelsea Hopkins (Las Vegas, Nev.)** and Sajoyia Griffin, came from Duke and South Plains College, respectively, while guard Melissa Sweat and forward **Jasmine Porter (Layton, Utah)** are true freshmen.

Entering the 2010-11 season, five players account for 341 of the 366 total career games played (93.2 percent) in an Aztec uniform by the entire SDSU 2010-11 roster.

**Hopkins Join The Aztecs**

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced in early July that Chelsea Hopkins transferred to the Aztecs from Duke University. Hopkins, a 5-8 point guard, has two years of eligibility remaining and will be able to play for SDSU beginning with the 2011-12 season.

Hopkins appeared in 46 contests for the Blue Devils from 2008-10, helping the team to a pair of NCAA tournament appearances, including a trip to the Elite Eight this past year, and a combined record of 57-12.

Hopkins signed with Duke after a successful four-year career at Mojave High School in Las Vegas, where she led the state in scoring as a junior (27.7 ppg.) and senior (28.5 ppg.). The 2006 and 2008 Las Vegas Athletic Club Female Athlete of the Year was a two-time first-team all-state and three-time all-conference honoree. Her freshman season she was named the state of Nevada's Gatorade Newcomer of the Year.

As a prep, Hopkins was rated the 63rd-best player in America and the No. 12 point guard by Hoopgurlz.com, and played during the summer for coach Brian Crichlow's West Coast Premier Black club team, alongside current Aztec guard Kiyana Stamps.

Hopkins has also excelled in the classroom, earning a spot on the Atlantic Coast Conference Academic Honor Roll and in high school, boasted a 4.7 GPA and was her class salutatorian and treasurer.

**2009-10 Rewind**

The San Diego State women's basketball team made a remarkable run in 2009-10, highlighted by its first Mountain West Conference tournament title and a trip to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen.

Below are a few of the accomplishments of last year's team:

- ♦ Earned its first-ever final top 25 ranking in *ESPN/USA Today Coaches* poll (No. 20), becoming the first MWC school to do so since 2006. The No. 20 spot ties as the program's highest-ever final ranking in a national poll (No. 20 in AP in 1985).

- ♦ Earned the program's first AP top 25 regular-season ranking since 1995 (Nov. 23 – No. 23)
- ♦ Posted back-to-back seasons with at least 23 wins for the first time since 1994-95 (24) and 1993-94 (26) ... Logged the program's 13th, 20-win campaign with six of those coming under coach Beth Burns ... Had an eight-game win streak, the team's longest since 1996-97
- ♦ Recorded three wins over AP top 25 teams (No. 10 West Virginia, No. 17 Texas, No. 23 TCU) ... Eight of 11 losses were to teams advancing to the NCAAs, including three vs. teams advancing to the Sweet 16
- ♦ Earned the program's first NCAA Sweet 16 appearance (64-team bracket) and won two NCAA games in the same season for the first time in school history.
- ♦ Garnered the program's eighth NCAA tournament bid and made back-to-back NCAA appearances for the first time since 1994-95

- ♦ Was the lowest seed to advance to the Sweet 16 since 2007, was the first No. 11 seed to advance to the Sweet 16 since 2004, and the first MWC team to advance to the Sweet 16 since 2006 ... Was the 12th double-digit seed all-time to advance to the Sweet 16
- ♦ Won its first MWC championship title and advanced to the third consecutive MWC championship game.

**Last Year's Numbers**

The Aztecs' success also translated into big numbers in the stat columns. Here are some of the 2009-10 team's statistical highlights:

- ♦ SDSU led the MWC in field-goal percentage (44.5), three-point field-goal defense (27.0), blocked shots (5.4), offensive rebound percentage (40.7), victories (23 – tied)
- ♦ SDSU ended the year ranked eighth nationally in three-point field goal percentage defense, 18th in blocks per game, 22nd in field goal percentage and 25th in assists per game.
- ♦ The Aztecs limited 18 of its 34 opponents to under 60 points a game, including a 55-spot by No. 10 West Virginia. Eight foes scored 50 or fewer points and three didn't reach the 40-point barrier.
- ♦ Twelve of the Aztecs' 23 wins were by 19 or more points, after posting only six such victories in 2008-09.
- ♦ SDSU held opponents to three or fewer 3-pointers in a game 20 times last season, including a combined 3-for-22 mark in the NCAA First & Second Rounds.
- ♦ The Aztecs shot at least 40 percent from the field in 26 of 34 outings, topping the 45 mark on 14 occasions. The team's final season field-goal percentage of 44.5 is its best since the 1995-96 squad shot 45.6 percent.
- ♦ SDSU posted a school-record 155 three-pointers for the second season in a row and improved its team free-throw percentage from 61.2 in 2008-09 to 69.9 in 2009-10.

**Award Central**

The awards were aplenty for this past year's Aztec squad, as several individuals were singled out for their achievement.

Guard Jené Morris' was named an honorable mention State Farm Coaches' All-American for the second year in a row, was tabbed the 2010 MWC Defensive Player of the Year for the second consecutive season and became the first Aztec to earn first-team all-league honors twice since Jodi Nowlin-Tres in 1996-97. Morris,

who was the first SDSU player to ever lead the MWC in scoring, also garnered a spot on the MWC all-defensive team and MWC championship all-tournament squad. She began the season by being named to the national watch list for both the Naismith and Wooden Awards, and the Wade Trophy.

Fellow guard Quenese Davis completed her career by picking up the MWC tournament MVP honors after averaging 18.7 points, 12 steals and a 55.6 three-point percentage over the three games. Davis was a third-team all-league pick, while junior Paris Johnson was a second-team honoree.

SDSU forward Jessika Bradley was the other big award-winner as the 2010 MWC Newcomer of the Year.

**Aztec In The WNBA**

Guard Jené Morris became San Diego State's first-ever WNBA Draft pick on April 8, 2010, going in the first round (11th pick overall) to the Indiana Fever. Morris, who was one of 14 players invited to the Draft announcement in Secaucus, N.J., also is the first Aztec to ever don a WNBA jersey.

The San Francisco native became the 11th player in Mountain West Conference history to be tabbed in the WNBA Draft and the fourth selected in the first round. She is the league's highest pick overall since 2006, and third highest in MWC history, trailing only Utah's Shona Thorburn (7th overall) and TCU's Sandora Irvin (3rd).

A two-time honorable mention All-American and Mountain West Conference defensive player of the year, Morris was the first Aztec to ever lead the MWC in scoring (17.1 ppg.), is the conference's all-time leader in career steals (293) and ranks third in the SDSU record book in career points with 1,499, despite only playing three seasons in the Red and Black.

She played 25 games during her rookie campaign for the Fever, before moving to Poland after the WNBA season to play professionally for CCC Polkowice.

**TV Time**

The Aztecs will have seven regular-season televised games in 2010-11. After the UCLA contest that was carried by The Mtn., SDSU will have six of its' MWC regular-season games on TV, including three straight in January. In all, the Aztecs will have six games on The Mtn. and one on CBS College Sports.

**Listen/Watch Live**

For the 10th straight year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of nearly every regular season game (home and away) over the internet at [www.goaztecs.com](http://www.goaztecs.com).

SDSU alum Chris Eilo will have the play-by-play duties both at home and on the road for the fourth straight season.

Again in 2010-11, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of the televised games, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Viejas Arena on [www.goaztecs.com](http://www.goaztecs.com).

Burns was reelected to a three-year term on the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Board of Directors. She continues to serve as a Division I at-large representative on the 23-member board.

Burns had been serving a one-year term in the same position before she was elected in 2010. She is an active member of the WBCA, having previously served as a committee member for the Jostens-Berenson Lifetime Achievement Award and being on the voting panel for the WBCA/USA Today Coaches Top 25 national weekly poll.

**SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns**



The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005, and enters the sixth season of her second stint with the Aztecs.

Burns took the program to new heights in 2009-10, as the Aztecs advanced to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen for the first time since the field was expanded to 64 teams. SDSU notched victories over a pair of top 25 foes in No. 10 West Virginia and defeated No. 17 Texas on the Longhorns' home floor. The 11th-seeded Aztecs were the lowest seed to advance to the Round of 16 in 2010, and lowest overall since 2007.

In the last two seasons, San Diego State has posted a combined record of 47-19, including a 27-3 mark on its home court, with Burns at the helm. The Aztecs claimed the program's first-ever MWC tournament championship in 2010, after earning a share of the regular-season crown in 2009. SDSU has made two consecutive NCAA appearances, going 2-0 in first-round games, after not earning a postseason bid in the 11 previous years.

In her first stint as Aztec head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A four-time conference coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 19-year overall head coaching record of 312-222, while her school record stands at 231-157 over 13 seasons.

Earlier this fall, Burns signed a five-year contract extension to stay as SDSU's head coach through the 2014-15 campaign.

# 2010-11 San Diego State Women's Basketball Box Scores - Games 1-2

## No. 16/15 UCLA 55, San Diego St. 48 Game 1 ■ Nov. 12 ■ Viejas Arena ■ San Diego, Calif.

**SAN DIEGO** - The San Diego State women's basketball team scored only four points in the final 6:58 of the game, as the Aztecs were unable to pull off the upset of 16th-ranked UCLA in front of 2,196 fans at Viejas Arena. The Bruins rallied from an eight-point halftime deficit to claim the 55-48 victory in both schools' season-openers.

SDSU sophomore Courtney Clements had a game-high 19 points, despite missing her first nine shots from the field. Clements also added six rebounds in her first outing as an Aztec, while senior center Paris Johnson pulled down a team-best 10 boards to go with her eight points. Senior Coco Davis chipped in nine points and seven assists in her first start at point guard.

UCLA scored the first five points of the game, before San Diego State notched its first bucket of the 2010-11 campaign by freshman Melissa Sweat at the 17:41 mark. The Bruins went up by seven at 9-2, but the Aztecs went on a 7-0 run to tie the contest at 9-9.

The squads would be tied twice more in the first half, including at 16-16. Davis then hit a jumper and Clements scored seven points in a row to put the Aztecs up by nine at 25-16. After UCLA cut its deficit to five twice in the final two minutes, SDSU's Gabrielle Clark hit a 3-pointer with 23 seconds remaining to give the home team a 32-24 advantage heading into the locker room.

The Aztecs' shooting woes from the field continued into the second half, as the Bruins scored the first eight points to tie the score at 32-32. San Diego State finally got on the scoreboard with a Davis triple to stay ahead, but the lead changed hands five times, including at the 5:53 mark when UCLA hit a pair of free throws to put it up 45-44.

SDSU would manage only four more points the rest of the way as UCLA ended the evening on a 10-4 run to secure the 55-48 victory.

## Cal State Bakersfield 73, San Diego St. 62 Game 2 ■ Nov. 17 ■ Viejas Arena ■ San Diego, Calif.

**SAN DIEGO** - Cal State Bakersfield outscored San Diego State 12-3 in the final four minutes of the game to earn a 73-62 victory over the host Aztecs at Viejas Arena. With the loss, SDSU dropped to 0-2 on the season, while the Roadrunners improved to 3-0 following the two schools' first-ever meeting.

San Diego State senior center Paris Johnson led the Aztecs both offensively and on the glass, tallying her 16th career double-double with a career-best 18 rebounds and 19 points on 7-for-8 shooting.

Sophomore Courtney Clements was the only other Aztec in double-figure points with 15 to go with eight rebounds and three assists. Freshman Melissa Sweat had eight points and was a perfect 2-for-2 from beyond the arc, while senior Jessika Bradley had nine rebounds and three assists. Senior Coco Davis had a team-best eight assists, but was 1-for-11 from the field.

Cal State Bakersfield jumped out to an early 10-point lead, taking advantage of SDSU's five turnovers in the first three minutes, and the hot shooting of Roadrunner guard Britney McGee, who had 10 points during that same span. The Aztecs finally were able to put some offense together, scoring six straight points to get to within four at 14-10 at the 13:07 mark.

CSUB, however, pushed its lead back up to nine points until a late run, including a pair of triples by junior Sajoyia Griffin, put the home team down by only three at 33-30 heading into the locker room.

San Diego State came out of the break and tied the game at 35, before pushing out to its largest lead of the night at 44-37 less than four minutes into the second half. That advantage quickly disappeared when the Roadrunners converted two more Aztec giveaways into points and a 44-44 tie.

After another tie at 48-48, SDSU had another turnover and missed two free throw attempts which ignited a 7-0 CSUB run. The Aztec deficit would grow to 10 with 1:33 remaining and left too little time for another rally, as the Roadrunners came away with the 73-62 win.
