Aztec Basketball Plays Second Straight Thursday Night Contest vs. Montana St.

The San Diego State women's basketball team will look to stay perfect at home this season, as the Aztecs welcome

the Montana State Bobcats to Cox Arena on Thursday at 7 p.m. SDSU is in the midst of a five-game homestand that spans the entire month of December and will play for just the second time in the last seven days, after playing five outings in 10 days to round out November.

The Aztecs and Bobcats are meeting for just the second time overall and the first time since SDSU defeated Montana State, 87-52, at the Dial Classic in Peterson Gym on Dec. 14, 1984.

This season, the Aztecs enter Thursday's game with a 5-3 overall mark, while Montana State, which will continue its trip to southern California on Saturday against USC, is 4-3 with losses to Gonzaga, Washington State and Boise State.

Thursday's game will be streamed live on goaztecs.com with Chris Ello making the call from Cox Arena. Live stats are as available on the Aztecs' official site.

Morris Hits Game-Winner As Aztecs Sneak By UC Riverside, 54-52

San Diego State's Jené Morris (San Francisco, Calif.) hit the game-winning basket at the buzzer to help the Aztec basketball team defeat the visiting UC Riverside Highlanders, 54-52, Thursday evening at Cox Arena in front of a crowd of 1,681 fans. The Aztecs trailed by as many as eight points in the first half and failed to score for over five and a half minutes mid-way through the second half, but outscored the Highlanders 9-3 in the final 2:43 to pull out the win. With the victory, SDSU improved to 5-3 on the season, while UCR dropped to 2-4 overall.

Morris hit her first four three-point field goals of the evening and finished 5-for-6 from beyond the arc for a teambest 19 points to go with three steals and three assists. Morris was the only Aztec in double-figure scoring as senior Jennifer Layton-Bailes (Sacramento, Calif.) had nine points on 4-for-6 shooting. Junior point guard Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.) led the team in rebounding (7) and assists (7) in 37 minutes of action.

SDSU opened the game with a 3-0 lead on a Morris three-pointer, but the Highlanders quickly matched her effort with a triple of their own to tie the score at 3-3. UCR took the lead on a free-throw at the 18:21 mark and held the advantage until a 7-0 Aztec run put the home team in front 12-10. A Kemie Nekele three-pointer restored order in the visitor's favor and UC Riverside led by a game-high eight points at the half, 29-21, behind a 54.5 shooting per-

The Aztecs, meanwhile, shot just 29 percent from the field in the first half, but came out of the locker room with two Morris three-pointers in the first minute and a half to get to within four at 31-27. The Highlanders led by six points at 39-33 and by five at 41-26, but a Davis three-pointer and a jumper inside from Paris Johnson helped SDSU even the score at 41 points.

Following the game's sixth tie score at 45-45, neither side could get its offense going as the teams went without a point for the next three minutes when the Highlanders made back-to-back buckets in the paint to once again lead by four, 49-45.

Morris' final three-pointer of the game broke the Aztecs' scoring drought at 49-48, and Layton-Bailes converted a long distance two-pointer from straightaway for a one-point lead at 50-49. UCR was not done, however, erasing a three-point Aztec advantage and knotting the game at 52-52 with just 21 seconds remaining.

Coming out of a timeout, Morris hit the winning basket from the right elbow just before the buzzer sounded for the 54-52 victory.

Other UC Riverside Game Notes

- SDSU trailed by eight points twice in first half, the largest deficit the Aztecs have overcome in a win since trailing by 10 points against TCU in the MWC semifinals a year ago. SDSU also came back from a nine-point deficit against Cal Poly in November 2007.
- The Aztecs posted season lows for free throws (1) and free throws attempted (4).
- After starting the year with 20 or more turnovers in each of their first four games, the Aztecs have finished below that barrier in three of their last four games.
- SDSU won for the first time since 2003, when an opponent shot at least 50 percent from the field. Sacramento State posted a 50.0 field-goal percentage, but fell to the Aztecs, 77-68, in Sacramento on Jan. 11.

What A Crowd

With the help of the U.S. Marine Corps, the Aztecs post-

UC Riverside. It is the third time in the last two years that SDSU has topped the thousand mark in a game and the figure ranks third in the 12-year history of Cox Arena.

A year ago, SDSU posted an average home attendance of 1,043, up from a 499 average in 2006-07.

59 And Fewer

In each of its five victories thus far this season, San Diego State has held its opponent to fewer than 60 points.

The Aztecs accomplished that feat 15 times a year ago, winning nine consecutive outings before dropping two straight against conference foes Wyoming (55-44) and BYU (46-43) in late February. SDSU rebounded by holding four of its final six opponents under 60 points, including a four-game streak in which it went 4-0.

Since head coach Beth Burns' return to The Mesa in 2005-06, the team is a combined 28-7 when holding an opponent to fewer than 60 points. That's just about 74 percent of the Aztecs' total season win total over the past four campaigns.

Threes Are For Me

After averaging 3.67 three-pointers per game in their first

six games this season, the Aztecs have posted 17 in their last two outings alone.

SDSU had 10 triples against No. 25 lowa State, the program's most since 2005, and followed that up with seven in a win over UC Riverside.

The school record for most three-pointers in a season was set back in 2004-05, when the Aztecs had 140.

Deadly From Three



Much of the Aztecs' success in the last two games from threepoint land can be credited to junior guard Jené Morris, who has 10 of the team's 17 three-pointers.

Not only has Morris been making her three-point shots, she's

also been deadly accurate, shooting 62.5 percent (10-for-16).

For the season, she has made 15 of her 29 threepoint field goal attempts for a percentage of 51.7, which ranks seventh nationally. Interestingly, she is only third in that category in the MWC, coming in behind two TCU players.

Morris is already 10th in school history in career three-pointers (61) and has a career three-point percentage of 40.1, which would be an SDSU record.

The Dish On Q



With seven more against UC Riverside, Aztec junior guard Quenese Davis continues to lead the league in assists per game with a 5.75 mark. That average puts her 20th nationally.

Davis has six or more in six games, including in each of her

last four. She now has 358 for her career, which moves her into a tie for fourth place with Lakeysha Wright (1992-95).

Only two Aztecs have reached the 400 mark in career assists - SDSU Hall of Famer Falisha Wright (448) and Crystal Lee (413).

Another New Aztec Five

With Coco Davis (Sacramento, Calif.) sitting out with an ankle injury, San Diego State started its fourth different starting five of the season against UC Riverside with center Paris Johnson, forward Jennifer Layton-Bailes and guards Quenese Davis, Jené Morris and LaSandra Dixon (Azusa, Calif.). Dixon made her first start of the year and the 11th of her career against the Highlanders, posting a career-high five assists.

In all, eight different Aztecs have at least one start in 2008-09, with Johnson and Quenese Davis being the only pair to start every contest.

In 2007-08, SDSU had just three different starting line-ups.

Leaders Of The Pack

San Diego State leads the Mountain West Conference in three statistical categories thus far - blocks, steals and offensive rebounds.

The most surprising in that category is the offensive rebounds, as the Aztecs have been outrebounded in five

of their eight contests and haven't won a battle on the boards in six straight games. Still, SDSU averages 15.63 o-boards per outing, a full rebound more than its nearest league contender in Colorado State (14.57/g).

As far as blocks are concerned, SDSU added six more in the win over UC Riverside and now has a pergame average of 6.1, which is 12th nationally.

The Aztecs had a season-low five steals last Thursday but still have a MWC-best 9.63 per game mark in 2008-09.

A year ago, SDSU ranked first in the Mountain West with a conference record 391 steals (12.61/g) and were second in blocked shots (4.35/g).

Paris' Party

Of SDSU's 49 blocks in the eight outings, 21 have been



credited to sophomore center Paris Johnson. Johnson had five in the opener with Northwestern State to tie for 10th on the SDSU single-game list. The five trail her career-best of six vs. TCU in the 2008 MWC tournament.

Johnson now has 75 for her

career in just two short seasons. She ranks ninth in school history and needs one more to tie for eighth place with Toni Wallace.

In 2008-09, Johnson is first in the league and 19th nationally in blocked shots with 2.63 per game. Her 21 blocks are eight more than any other MWC player.

The 6-4 center led the conference in blocks per game with 1.74 in 2007-08, following in the footsteps of her sister, Desiree, who ranked first in the MWC in both 2005-06 and 2006-07.

A Big December

With a 1-0 start, San Diego State has continued to find great success during the winter month of December. The Aztecs are 10-3 over the last three campaigns with two of those losses coming against ranked opponents in No. 2 UConn and No. 17 George Washington.

In the Beth Burns' first year of her second stint in 2005-06, all three of SDSU's season wins came in the month of December when the Aztecs were 3-4.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over the Montana State will mean:

►SDSU is 3-0 at home in 2008-09, winning its first three

home games in a year for the second season in a row.

- ► Is 6-1 against teams it did not face a year ago.
- ►SDSU stays perfect all-time against Montana State, improving to 2-0.
- ▶Improves to 20-7 against team in the Big Sky Conference.
- ▶ Improves to 11-3 during the month of December over the last three seasons.

Montana State Tid-Bits

Montana State is 4-3 this season, after finishing 18-13 a year ago ... The Bobcats defeated Utah Valley, North Dakota, Western Carolina and Great Falls ... Two players average in double-figures with Katie Bussey (11.1 ppg.) and Nubia Garcia (11.0 ppg.) ... Garcia is MSU's top rebounder with 9.3 boards per game, while Erica Perry has a team-best 25 assists and 15 steals ... The Bobcats are shooting over 40 percent from the field and 78 percent from the free-throw line ... MSU has only committed 124 turnovers in its seven games ... Aztec freshman forward Candace Chambers and Bobcat Sarah Strand both hail from Seattle.

Other 2008-09 Notes

- The Aztecs' 50 rebounds against Northwestern State are program's most since 2000, when they also had 50 against Northern Arizona.
- Jerica Williams' (San Diego, Calif.) 14 boards vs. Northwestern State are the most in Beth Burns' second stint as head coach and most overall since Ashlee Dunlap had 17 at Washington State on Dec. 22, 2003.
- -SDSU rejected a record 15 shots against Northwestern State, the most ever by a Mountain West Conference team in the league's 10-year history. The Aztecs beat the previous mark of 14 held by New Mexico.
- Jerica Williams scored 23 points at Long Beach State. SDSU now has six players who have at least one 20-point scoring game in their career.
- Sophomore center Paris Johnson was selected to the six-player all-tournament squad at the Waikiki Beach Marriott Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii. She averaged 22.7 points and 8.3 rebounds in the three games, shooting 78.9 percent from the field and recording a career-best 31 points vs. the host Wahine.
- SDSU has had two different players reach the 30-point barrier this season in Paris Johnson (31 pts. vs. Hawai'i) and Jené Morris (34 pts. vs. Iowa State). Morris' 34 points are the most by a player in the MWC this season,

advanced to last season's league championship game, was picked to finish second in the Mountain West Conference in 2009 in a vote by the MWC's nine head coaches and select media members released Oct. 14, at the conference's annual media day in Las Vegas, Nev.

The Aztecs earned six of the 26 first-place votes and garnered 184 points overall, trailing first place Utah, who had 16 first-place votes, by 22 points. The second-place projection is four spots higher than SDSU's previous best placing in the preseason poll when the team was selected sixth in both 1999-2000 and 2003-04.

Behind SDSU in the preseason poll is TCU (161 pts.) and New Mexico (148 pts.), who each garnered a pair of first-place votes. BYU, Wyoming, UNLV, Colorado State and Air Force rounded out the nine-team poll.

In addition, two Aztecs, Jené Morris and Paris Johnson were selected to the five-player preseason all-Mountain West Conference team.

Dixon Named Team Captain



Senior guard LaSandra Dixon will serve as the team's captain for the 2008-09 season.

Dixon started eight games last season, including all three at the Mountain West Conference Championships. She averaged a career-high 2.8 rebounds per

game and also collected 26 assists and 24 steals, also career bests. She was one of nine Aztecs to score 10 or more points in at least one game a year ago.

A scholar-athlete, who is majoring in social science, Dixon has appeared in 76 games in her four seasons.

Aztecs Sign Two Guards TO NLIS

San Diego State head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Wednesday of two, 5-9 guards, Ashley Duffy (Lakeside, Calif.) and Kiyana Stamps (Moreno Valley, Calif.), to National Letters of Intent. The pair will join the Aztecs in 2009.

Three Added To Aztecs Staff

Two assistant coaches, Shanele Stires and Fred

Chmiel, begin their first seasons with the Aztecs in 2008-09. In addition, former SDSU men's basketball student manager, Jorge Cerna, joined the staff as director of player development.

2007-08 Rewind

The San Diego State women's basketball team posted its best season in over a decade in 2007-08, compiling an 18-13 record and advancing to the championship game of the Mountain West Conference tournament.

Below are a few of the accomplishments of last year's team:

- Posted the program's first winning season and most victories since 1996-97.
- Advanced to its first MWC championship game and became the highest seed to do so in conference tournament history.
- Logged its first-ever MWC championship victories and its first conference tournament wins since 1997.
- Recorded the program's most-ever MWC wins (7) and highest-ever MWC regular-season finish (t-5th).
- Beat BYU for the first time since 2001, won in Las Vegas for the first time since 1997, won at Colorado State for the first time since 2000 and defeated TCU for the first time since it joined the MWC in 2006.

Last Year's Numbers

The Aztecs' success in 2007-08 also translated into big numbers in the stat columns. San Diego State, under head coach Beth Burns, has been known for its aggressive defense, but the team showed big improvements on the offensive side of the board, too. Here are some of the team's statistical highlights:

- SDSU led the MWC in assists (15.71/g), steals (12.61/g) and turnover margin (+5.81), while ranking second in field-goal percentage (.418) and blocked shots (4.35/g). The Aztecs' 391 steals and +5.81 turnover margin were both easily conference records.
- SDSU ended the year ranked eighth nationally in steals per game and 27th in assists per outing.
- The Aztecs had 10 or more steals in 22 of 31 games and forced 20 or more opponent turnovers in 25 of 31 contests, including 30 or more six times.
- Nine of the Aztecs' 18 wins were by 20 points or more. In 2006-07, none of the team's 12 victories were by more than 13. SDSU averaged 65 points per outing after putting in only 56.1 points a game in 2006-07.

A Memorable Run

While the 2007-08 campaign could have already been deemed a success prior to the start of the conference tournament, no one could have predicted the Aztecs' memorable run in Las Vegas last March.

Seeded sixth out of the nine schools, SDSU entered the week having never won a conference tournament game in the previous eight years of the event's existence

The Aztecs not only claimed their first MWC championship victory, they won twice en route to their first title game appearance, falling just four points short of a trip to the NCAAs.

SDSU opened the tournament with a 66-54 upset of a Wyoming squad that would go on to earn an NCAA berth. Behind Jené Morris' 21 points, Allison Duffy's double-double and Quenese Davis' nine assists, the

Aztecs never trailed in the game to avenge two regularseason losses to the Cowgirls.

Two days after upsetting the No. 3 seed, SDSU took on second-seeded TCU, which it had never beaten since the Lady Frogs joined the MWC in 2006.

Trailing by one with only two seconds left on the shot clock, Davis in-bounded the ball off the back of a TCU player and scored the go-ahead layup with 18 seconds remaining. Morris then intercepted a Lady Frog pass at mid-court and made one of two free throws, as SDSU dodged two point-blank lay-ups at the buzzer to pull off the 69-67 win.

In the final vs. New Mexico, the Aztecs led for the majority of the game, but could not stop the play of Lobo seniors Dionne Marsh and Brandi Kimble down the stretch, as UNM won its second straight title with a 62-59 victory.

At Home Or On The Road

The 2007-08 Aztec team found success both on the road and at home, a big change from recent memory. SDSU had nine wins away from home, which was more than its combined total from the previous four years. Three of those nine road wins came during MWC play. Entering the year, the Aztecs had only won on the road during conference play a combined six times in the previous eight years of the league and had never even tallied two in the same season.

San Diego State's other nine victories came on its home court, where the team is 20-11 over the last two campaigns. The Aztecs' success translated into bigger home crowds as the single-game attendance record at Cox Arena was broken not once but twice against Cal State Fullerton (2,397) and then vs. No. 2 UConn (5,271). Overall, SDSU logged its highest home season attendance since 1994-95 (15,638).

Tournament Town

San Diego State University and Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl will play host to the 2009 NCAA Women's Basketball First & Second Rounds, March 21 & 23.

SDSU was one of eight additional venues selected last February for 2009 by the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee, which voted to expand from eight to 16 first- and second-round sites, beginning next vear.

This year's event in San Diego will feature four schools vying to advance to the NCAA regionals.

Cox Arena has served as the host site for three other NCAA championship events, including the 2001 and 2006 Men's Basketball First & Second Rounds and the 2001 Women's Volleyball Final Four, since the facility opened in the fall of 1997.

SDSU has played host to NCAA women's basketball games three times previously in Peterson Gym in 1984. 1994 and most recently in 1995.

The Aztecs will have a record seven regular-season games televised either live or shown via tape delay in 2008-09. SDSU's game with UConn was shown on a tape delay basis on The Mtn., while the USD contest

was picked up by Channel 4 San Diego.

The Aztecs will kick-off MWC play at home against Air Force on

CBS College Sports. SDSU has three more conference outings live on The Mtn., followed by the contest at BYU, which will be rebroadcast on the The Mtn. at 7 p.m. PT on Feb. 26.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns



The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005.

In just four short years, she already has the program headed in the right direction, as the Aztecs' posted their best season

in over a decade in 2007-08, going 18-13 overall and advancing to their first-ever MWC championship game.

Burns helped the Aztecs to a 7-9 mark in MWC play in 2008, to finish in a tie for fifth with Brigham Young. The Aztecs' seven league wins and fifth-place showing is their best-ever in the history of the MWC.

In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle. going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regularseason titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 17-year overall head coaching record of 270-204, while her mark school record stands at 189-139 over 12 seasons.

With the victory, the Aztecs improved to 1-0 on the year, while the Lady Demons dropped to 0-1 following the two schools' first-ever

SDSU had four players finish in double-figure scoring and combined for 15 blocked shots, the most ever by a Mountain West Conference team in the

league's 10-year history.

Aztec sophomore center Paris Johnson posted her fourth career double-double with a game-high 14 points and 12 rebounds to go with five blocked shots, which tie for 10th in the SDSU single-game record book. Sophomore Jerica Williams, playing in her first game in the Red & Black, posted nine points and 14 rebounds, 11 of which came in the first half. Williams' 14 boards are the most by an Aztec since December 2003.

Junior guard Quenese Davis added 13 points and eight assists. Sophomore Coco Davis had 11 points and senior Jennifer Layton-Bailes, playing in her first

game since 2007, tallied 10 points and three blocks.

San Diego State never trailed in the game, going up by four points on three occasions, including at 12-8 with just over minutes left in the first half. The Aztecs increased that lead to six on a layup by Layton-Bailes, but the two sides failed to record a point over the next four minutes. Lady Demon Britany Kinlaw broke the stalemate with a jumper to put her team down by just four points at 14-10. Two Johnson free throws sparked an 8-0 SDSU run and the home team went into the locker room up by 13 at 28-15.

Northwestern State got to within 10 on three occasions coming out of the break, but the Aztecs matched the Lady Demons bucket for bucket, pulling away with a 20-point advantage at 49-29. SDSU never looked back, coasting to an

eventual 20-point, 67-47, victory.

The Aztecs forced 30 Lady Demon turnovers and had 50 rebounds, the team's most in a single outing since 2000.

LONG BEACH, Calif. - The San Diego State women's basketball team had a 15-point first-half lead, but had to rally to survive a strong Long Beach State run, coming away with a 67-59 victory at the Pyramid in Long Beach, Calif. The Aztecs start the season 2-0 for the second year in row, while the 49ers dropped to 0-1 in the teams' first meeting since 1997.

San Diego State pushed its lead back into double-figures on a Lindsay Leo jumper to open the second half at 33-22. The rest of the way was a battle, however, as the 49ers drew to within four at the 11:17 mark and the score 46-42.

Another three-pointer by Williams increased the SDSU advantage to seven and the visitor's were up by 10 at 60-50 and again at 67-57. The Aztecs finished out the game by making five of six free throws in the final 1:33 to come away with the 67-59 win.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team overcame a ninepoint, second-half deficit, but was unable to complete the comeback, falling 63-60 to the University of San Diego at the Jenny Craig Pavilion. With the loss, the Aztecs dropped to 2-2 on the year, while the Toreros improved to 3-2 after their fourth-straight win in the series on their home floor.

Junior guard Jené Morris scored 11 of her team-best 14 points in the second half and also contributed three steals. Classmate Quenese Davis added 12 points, three assists and three steals, while her sister Coco Davis scored in double-figures for the second time this season with 10 points and tallied a career best five steals, all of which came in the first half.

The Aztecs got in foul trouble early in the game as both Morris and starting

center Paris Johnson got two quick fouls apiece and played just 10 and two minutes each in the first half. Even without Morris and Johnson, the SDSU hung tough, trailing by just five points on two occasions, including at 28-23 with 2:52 left until the break.

The Aztecs got a spark off the bench from true freshman Kalena Tutt, as the center scored the first five points of her career to keep the team close. A Quenese Davis three-pointer cut the Torero lead to just two at 28-26, and then Coco Davis followed that effort up with a jumper and two straight steals and three-point plays to put SDSU ahead by four points, 34-30, heading in to the locker room.

Out of the break, USD rode the hot shooting of forward Kiva Herman, who finished the game 9-for-11 from the field, to not only erase the deficit, but also go up by as many as nine points at 51-42 with 7:55 remaining.

The SDSU offense, which managed just six points in the first 11:45 of the second half, finally woke up as a Jennifer Layton-Bailes' jumper kick started a 14-4 run that put the Aztecs back ahead 56-55 with just over three minutes left.

USD retook the lead on two free throws and was up by four points with 32 seconds left on a lay-up by Dominique Conners. SDSU countered on its next trip down the court when sophomore guard Jerica Williams banked in a threepointer from the left angle to get to with just one 61-60. The Aztecs stole the ensuing in-bound pass, but Morris was unable to hold on, as two more USD free throws closed out the 63-60 victory.

The Aztecs had a season-best 13 steals, but could not overcome a -10 mar-

HONOLULU - Sophomore center Paris Johnson had a career-high 31 points to help the San Diego State women's basketball team defeat Hawai'i, 71-48, in the first day of the Waikiki Marriott Beach Classic at the Stan Sheriff Center in Honolulu, Hawaii. With the win, the Aztecs ended a two-game losing skid to move to 3-2 on the year, while the Rainbow Wahines dropped to 0-4 after the two schools' first meeting since 1999.

Johnson made her first five shots and ended up with a career-high 31 points on 15-for-19 shooting, beating her previous best of 27 points last year against Indiana State. Johnson is the first Aztec to reach the 30-point barrier this season, while her 15 field goals tie for ninth in the SDSU single-game record book. The 6-4 center also led SDSU with seven rebounds and a pair of blocked shots.

Senior forward Jennifer Layton-Bailes, who made her first start since January 2007, added a season-best 13 points and Quenese Davis had nine points and six assists.

The Aztecs got off to a quick start, going inside to Johnson, who hit each of her first four shots from the field for eight points by the first media timeout to put SDSU ahead, 11-5. Johnson also made her fifth-straight field-goal attempt, but the Rainbow Wahine used almost 60 percent shooting from the field to draw even at 18-18 with just over 10 minutes left in the half.

San Diego State came out of the 18-18 tie with a 6-0 run and held Hawai'i to just five points the rest of the way, heading into the locker room up by 15 points, 38-22.

The Aztecs continued to put points on the board coming out of the break, jumping ahead by 21 points at 46-25 with 16:26 left. Hawai'i drew to within 13 point with just over five minutes remaining, but two straight Johnson lay-ups started a 11-0 scoring run and SDSU went on to win by 23 points 71-48.

San Diego State shot a season-best 49.2 percent from the field, tallied 14 steals and forced 27 Hawai'i turnovers, including 20 in the first half alone.

HONOLULU - Playing its fourth game of the week and third in the last three days, the San Diego State women's basketball team made 10 three-pointers, but could not hold off a hot shooting lowa State team, as the Aztecs fell to the No. 25/22 Cyclones, 87-71, in the final day of the Waikiki Marriott Beach Classic at the Stan Sheriff Center in Honolulu, Hawaii. With the loss, the Aztecs dropped to 4-3, while the Cyclones improved to 5-1.

Aztec junior guard Jené Morris had a season-best 34 points, one off her career high of 35. Morris was 5-for-10 from beyond the arc and 12-for-24 over-

career high of 35. Morris was 5-for-10 from beyond the arc and 12-for-24 overall and also had four assists, three steals and four rebounds.

Sophomore center Paris Johnson recorded her third double-double of the season with 14 points and 10 rebounds and tied a career-best with three steals. For the tournament, Johnson averaged 22.7 points and 8.3 boards an outing.

Junior guard Quenese Davis was the third Aztec in double-figures with 13 points, including three triples. She had seven assists to only one turnover and ended up with 19 helpers over the three-game stay in Hawaii.

hit two and ISU knocked down one.

SDSU took its first four-point advantage of the first half at 10-6 on a Johnson lay-up. The Aztecs were also up by four on four other occasions with the last one coming at 20-16. Iowa State came back to tie the score at 20 apiece and took its first lead of the game on a three-pointer by Heather Ezell at 23-22. The Cyclones added two more triples in a row and were up by seven at 29-22 with 6:48 left in the half.

ISU added to their lead with a jumper from the foul line to go up by nine at 31-22. A Johnson free throw finally broke the streak at the 5:33 mark, but Cyclones again answered with their fourth straight three-pointer to go up by 11 points.

Quenese Davis responded with her own set of three pointers and the Aztecs trailed by seven at 36-29. The lowa State lead was 43-35 heading into the locker room with the help of a 50 percent mark from beyond the arc (6-for-12). The Cyclones continued their hot shooting in the second half, scoring the first 10 points, including two more three-pointers, until Morris ended the drought with a triple from the left baseline with 16:55 left.

SDSU put together its own scoring run of nine unanswered to cut the lead to single-digits at 53-44. The rest of the contest was a battle on both sides of the ball as cut the deficit down to 75-65 with 3:11 left. ISU, however, made all 10 of its free throws in the final 2:10 to claim the 87-71 victory.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State's Jené Morris hit the game-winning basket at the buzzer to help the Aztec basketball team defeat the visiting UC Riverside Highlanders, 54-52, Thursday evening at Cox Arena in front of a crowd of 1,681 fans. The Aztecs trailed by as many as eight points in the first half and failed to score for over five and a half minutes mid-way through the second half, but outscored the Highlanders 9-3 in the final 2:43 to pull out the win. With the victory, SDSU improved to 5-3 on the season, while UCR dropped to 2-4 overall.

Morris hit her first four three-point field goals of the evening and finished 5-for-6 from beyond the arc for a team-best 19 points to go with three steals and three assists. Morris was the only Aztec in double-figure scoring as senior Jennifer Layton-Bailes had nine points on 4-for-6 shooting. Junior point guard Quenese Davis led the team in rebounding (7) and assists (7) in 37 minutes of

SDSU opened the game with a 3-0 lead on a Morris three-pointer, but the Highlanders quickly matched her effort with a triple of their own to tie the score at 3-3. UCR took the lead on a free-throw at the 18:21 mark and held the advantage until a 7-0 Aztec run put the home team in front 12-10. A Kemie Nekele

A Kemie Nekele three-pointer restored order in the visitor's favor and UC Riverside led by game-high eight points at the half, 29-21, behind a 54.5 shooting percentage. The Aztecs, meanwhile, shot just 29 percent from the field in the first half, but came out of the locker room with two Morris three-pointers in the first minute and a half to get to within four at 31-27. The Highlanders led by six points at 39-33 and by five at 41-26, but a Davis three-pointer and a jumper inside from Paris Johnson helped SDSU even the score at 41 points.

Following the game's sixth tie score at 45-45, neither side could get its offense going as the teams went without a point for the peyt three minutes when

offense going as the teams went without a point for the next three minutes when the Highlanders made back-to-back buckets in the paint to once again lead by four. 49-45.

Morris' final three-pointer of the game broke the Aztecs' scoring drought at 49-48, and Layton-Bailes converted a long distance two-pointer from straightaway for a one-point lead at 50-49. UCR was not done, however, erasing a threepoint Aztec advantage and knotting the game at 52-52 with just 21 seconds remaining.

Coming out of a timeout, Morris hit the winning basket from the right elbow

just before the buzzer sounded for the 54-52 victory.
