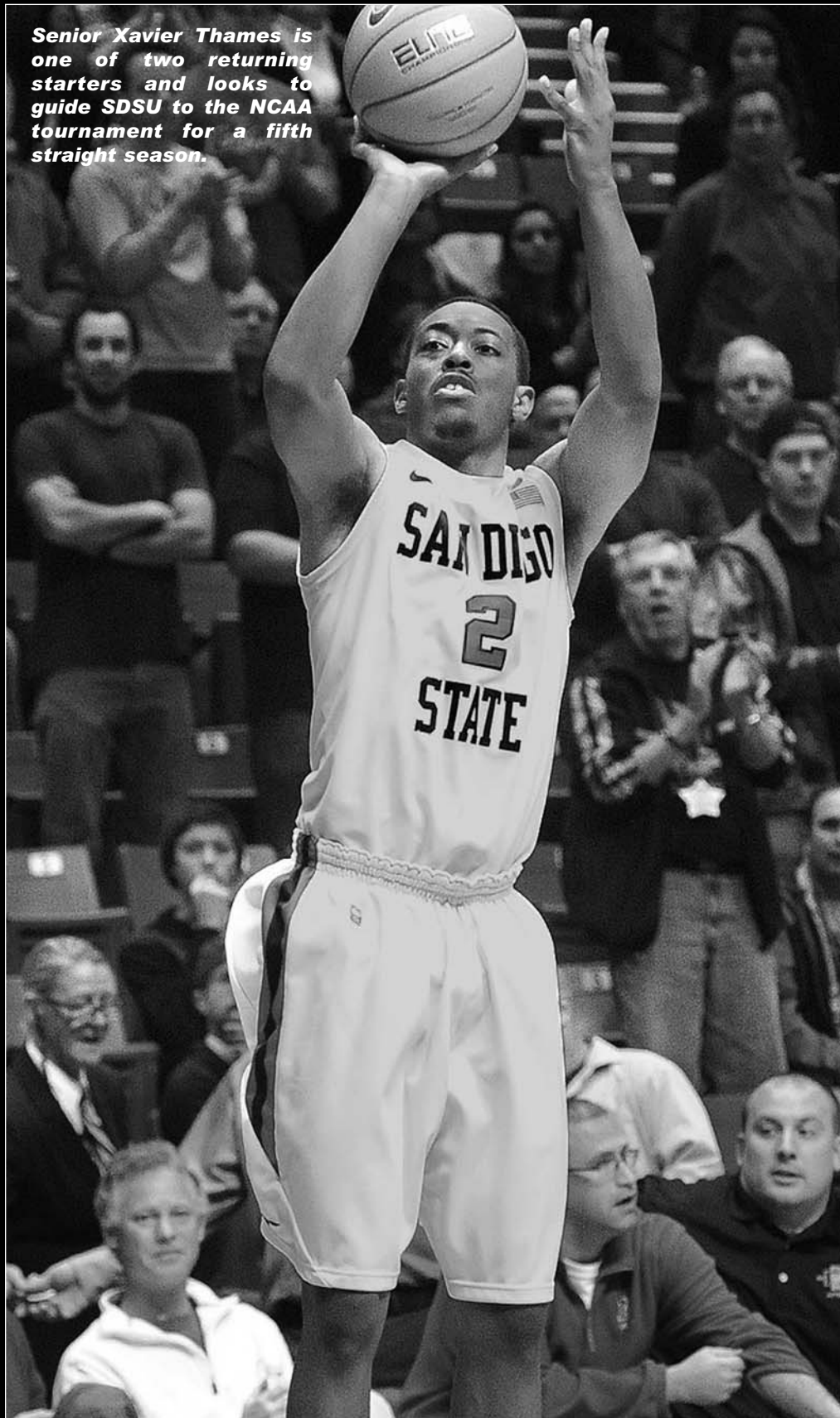

- ♦ Is one of five returning Aztecs to have played in more than a third of the games in 2012-13.





JOHNSON tidbits

- ♦ Is a workout warrior who does push-ups, sit-ups, yoga and hits the weight room daily.
- ♦ Is the middle child with an older and younger sister.
- ♦ Spent nine years in Alberta, Canada, before moving to Southern California.

A forward who will give SDSU size up front... Has an array of inside moves, but can step out and hit the mid-range jumper... Is a workout warrior who can bang with the best of them.

As A Sophomore (2012-13 Season)

Became eligible at mid-season and played 13 games, seven of which occurred during Mountain West action... Averaged 1.1 points, 0.2 rebounds and 4.0 minutes... Made half of his eight field-goal attempts... Scored a career-high six points and had one assist in 12 minutes vs. Point Loma Nazarene (12-18-12), his first game after sitting out due to transfer rules... Matched his season high with two free-throws made vs. CSU Bakersfield (1-3-13)... Finished with two points at Nevada (1-23-13)... Made a free throw and grabbed his first rebound of his SDSU career vs. Fresno State (2-9-13)... Scored a point, grabbed a season-high one rebound and blocked his first career shot vs. Wyoming (2-19-13).

As A Redshirt Freshman at Virginia (2011-12 Season)

Played in six games and averaged 6.2 minutes before transfer-

ring to San Diego State... Averaged 1.5 points and 1.3 rebounds... Had a career-high six points, on 6-of-8 shooting from the charity stripe, and a personal-best three rebounds vs. South Carolina State (11-13-11)... Grabbed one rebound vs. Winthrop (11-15-11)... Finished with two points vs. Drake (11-19-11)... Matched his career high with three rebounds vs. Green Bay (11-25-11)... Picked up his second assist of his career vs. Longwood (12-3-11).

As A Freshman at Virginia (2010-11 Season)

Utilized his redshirt season.

High School

Averaged 18 points, 12 rebounds and three blocked shots in his senior campaign at Elsinore High... Graduated as the nation's No. 22 power forward and No. 108 player overall, according to *Rivals.com*, and was given a grade of 93 by ESPN... Led his squad to the 2009-10 Sunbelt Conference title with a 10-0 record and then guided Elsinore to the semifinals of the CIF Southern Section Division III tournament... His effort garnered him co-MVP honors of the Sunbelt,

first-team all-valley accolades from the *North County Times/The Californian*, first-team placement on the all-CIF Southern Section Division III-AA squad, third-team all-state honors from Cal-Hi Sports and first-team all-Division III distinction from *ESPN Rise.com*... Prior to Elsinore, he played two seasons at Lethbridge Collegiate Institute in Canada, and attended Morse High in San Diego as a junior... While in Canada, he was an all-conference

pick after averaging 16 points, 13 rebounds and three blocks as a sophomore and was a member of the Alberta Provincial Men's U-17 team in 2007 and 2008.

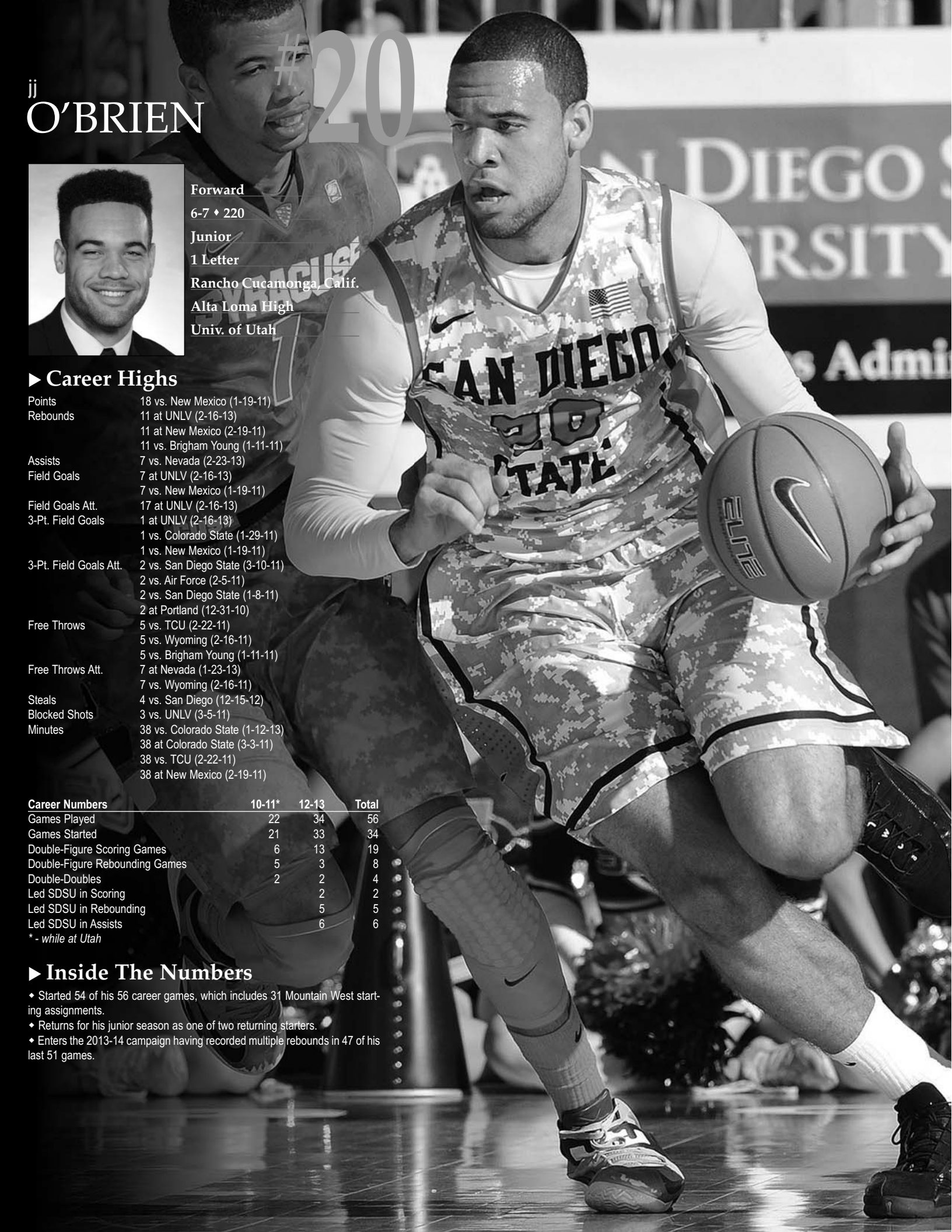

- ◆ Started 54 of his 56 career games, which includes 31 Mountain West starting assignments.
- ◆ Returns for his junior season as one of two returning starters.
- ◆ Enters the 2013-14 campaign having recorded multiple rebounds in 47 of his last 51 games.





O'BRIEN tidbits

- ◆ His mother played basketball at Notre Dame for two seasons before transferring to San Diego, where she played another two seasons.
- ◆ Has an uncle, Sean Rooks, who played in the NBA for 12 seasons with eight different teams.
- ◆ Played against the Aztecs three times as a true freshman at Utah before transferring to San Diego State.

One of two returning starters and one of the smartest players in America... Has a high basketball IQ... Can play all five positions on the floor at an above-average level... Is a good rebounder, especially on the offensive side... Continues to work on his perimeter shot.

As A Sophomore (2012-13 Season)

MW Rankings: 5th in offensive rebounding, 19th in rebounding

Played in all 34 games, starting 33... The lone non-start was on Senior Day... Averaged 7.2 points on 52.6 percent shooting and 4.5 rebounds... Added 1.5 assists... Scored in double figures in 10 of his final 16 outings, including six of his final 11 games... Scored in double figures 13 times... Led the Aztecs in scoring twice, rebounding five times and assists six times... Logged two double-doubles... Pulled down at least 10 rebounds three times... Finished the season by making 95 of his last 174 shots from the field

(54.6 pct.)... Started his first game of his Aztec career vs. No. 9/9 Syracuse and finished with nine points, seven rebounds and a then-career-high-tying two steals... Matched his then-career high with three assists and two steals vs. San Diego Christian (11-13-12)... Grabbed a then-season-high eight boards, including five offensive, at Missouri State (11-17-12)... Had a then-career-high three assists and blocked a shot for the third straight game vs. Arkansas-Pine Bluff (11-21-12)... Finished with 12 points on 6-of-9 shooting at USC (11-25-12)... nine points and three assists in a career-high 38 minutes vs. Colorado State (1-12-13)... Recorded 12 points on 4-of-5 shooting while starting at point guard at Nevada (1-23-13)... Posted his first double-double as an Aztec vs. No. 15/17 New Mexico (1-26-13) with 12 points and 10 rebounds, seven of which were offensive. Also recorded two assists, a season-high two blocks and one steal... Was the Mountain West Player of the Week on Jan. 28... Finished with his third straight double-figure scoring game at Air Force (2-2-13) as he produced 10 points and seven boards... Scored 10 points and pulled down five rebounds, including four offensive, vs. Boise State (2-6-13)... Scored 12 points, grabbed five rebounds and had a team-high two assists at No. 24/24 Colorado State (2-13-13)... Scored a season-high 15 points on a career-high seven field goals, including a personal-best one three-pointer at UNLV (2-16-13). He also grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds and had a team-high two assists... Filled the stat sheet with 10 points, four rebounds, two assists and two steals vs. Wyoming (2-19-13)... Logged a game- and career-high seven assists to go along with 14 points and six boards vs. Nevada (2-23-13)... Scored 10 points and pulled down nine rebounds (season-high seven offensive) at No. 14/14 New Mexico (2-27-13)... Went for a team-high 12 points, which included a season-high four free-throws, and six rebounds (five offensive) vs. Air Force (3-6-13)... Had a game-high three steals at Boise State (3-9-13)... Produced six points, four rebounds, three assists and a block in the second round of the NCAA tournament vs. Oklahoma (3-22-13)... Logged two points, one rebound and a blocked shot vs. Florida Gulf Coast (3-24-13) in the third round of the NCAA tournament.

As A Redshirt (2011-12 Season)

Sat out after transferring from Utah prior to 2011-12... Practiced with the squad the entire campaign.

As A Freshman at Utah (2010-11 Season)

Averaged 6.4 points, 5.5 rebounds and 1.2 assists in 27.7 minutes... His average minutes per game was the third-highest among all Utes... Played in 22 games, mak-

ing 21 starts... The 21 starts were the team's fourth-highest total... His rebounding average was the second best on the team, while his scoring average was fifth... Missed nine games due to a broken foot... In MWC games only, finished in a tie for 10th in rebounding (6.2) and tied for fifth in offensive rebounding (2.4)... Posted six double-figure scoring games... Reached double digits in rebounding five times... Posted two double-doubles... Leading rebounder six times... In the opener vs. Grand Canyon (11-12-10), he had six points and a team-best eight rebounds in a starting role... First game back from injury was vs. Butler (12-22-10) and played 16 minutes... Against SDSU (1-8-11), grabbed a team-high 10 boards... Against BYU (1-11-11), he posted 13 points and 11 rebounds... Went for a career-high 18 points and a team-high 10 rebounds vs. New Mexico (1-19-11)... Had a career-high three assists in back-to-back games at TCU (1-22-11) and vs. Colorado State (1-29-11)... Also scored 11 points vs. the Rams... Recorded 10 points and seven rebounds at BYU (2-12-11)... Finished with 11 points, which included a career-high five free throws, and a personal-best three assists vs. Wyoming (2-16-11)... Matched his career high with 11 boards at UNM (2-19-11)... The game vs. the Lobos was the first of three straight 38-minute outings... Scored 13 points vs. TCU (2-22-11).

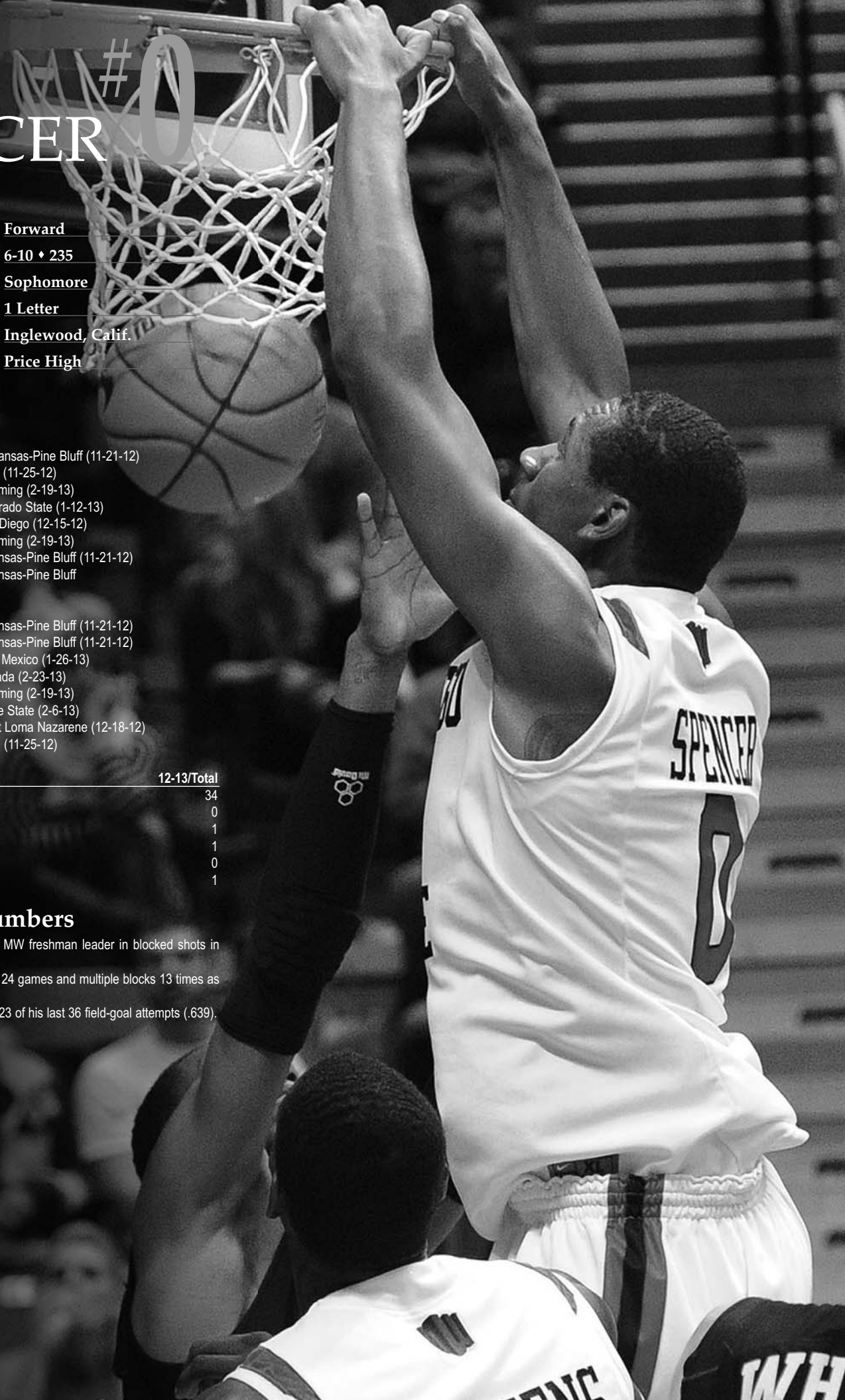

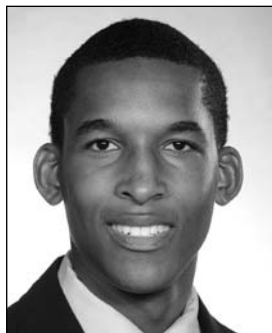
