

### ■ Record

San Diego State is 19-11 overall and 9-7 in the MWC following Saturday's loss in the regular-season finale at Air Force, 46-43.

In 2007-08, the Aztecs are 19-11 overall; 8-8 in road/neutral games; 2-1 in neutral court games; 1-1 vs. Air Force; 3-2 vs. teams from the state of Colorado; 1-1 in March; 12-3 when wearing white uniforms; 0-1 at the Thomas & Mack Center.

### ■ Head Coach Steve Fisher

San Diego State head coach Steve Fisher (Illinois State, 1967) is in his 17th-full season as a head coach and his ninth season on The Mesa. He owns a 330-210 overall record; 146-128 record at San Diego State; 9-10 record vs. Air Force; 7-6 record in the Mountain West Conference tournament (champions in 2002 and 2006); 3-1 record in the MWC tourney as a higher seed; 58-37 record in games played in March or April.

### ■ Last Year's MWC Result

San Diego State lost in the quarterfinal round to sixth-seeded Colorado State, 69-64. That snapped a three-game winning streak for the Aztecs in the event.

**Fourth-Seeded Aztecs Look For Unprecedented Third MWC Championship; Face Fifth-Seeded Air Force for Second Time in Six Days in Thursday's Quarterfinals**

San Diego State (19-11 overall; 9-7 Mountain West Conference), which overcame the graduation and departure of three all-conference performers and devastating injuries to continue its recent run of success, embarks on postseason play this week in the ninth annual Phillips 66 Mountain West Conference Championship in Las Vegas.

The fourth-seeded Aztecs will face fifth-seeded Air Force (16-13; 8-8 MWC) in the second quarterfinal round game on Thursday afternoon at 2:30 p.m. PDT at the Thomas & Mack Center.

San Diego State still has plenty to play for, in addition to the obvious NCAA automatic berth awaiting the MWC champion, the Aztecs are looking to secure their third consecutive 20-win campaign, something that has not occurred on The Mesa since the 1938-39, 1939-40 and 1940-41 campaigns.

The Aztecs are also looking for the security that comes with a 20th victory, as the 25 teams that have won at least 20 games have all advanced to postseason play in the first eight seasons of the Mountain West Conference.

San Diego State had won 20 games in a season just three times in its first 36 seasons as a Division I program, but ninth-year head coach Steve Fisher is on the cusp of leading the Aztecs to that magical mark for a third consecutive season - something that has not been accomplished on The Mesa since the 1938-39, 1939-40 and 1940-41 campaigns.

The Aztecs concluded the regular-season with a tough 46-43 loss at Air Force last Saturday at Clune Arena. SDSU, which scored just two points in the first 9:08 of the game and was 0-for-6 from the field with six turnovers when it scored its first field goal of the game with 10:52 remaining in the first half, shot just 34.1 percent from the field and was an uncharacteristic 9-of-18 from the free-throw line.

Nonetheless, San Diego State rallied from a seven-point deficit to take the lead and battled back from a nine-point second half deficit to pull within two points with under a minute to play. But junior forward Lorenzo Wade could not convert a go-ahead straight-away three-pointer in the closing moments and the Falcons tacked on a free throw to provide the three-point final margin.

Despite the loss, a couple of Aztecs enjoyed big days. Freshman guard D.J. Gay continued his hot shooting, making a season-high tying five three-point field goals on 10 attempts and scoring a game-high 17 points. A native of Sun Valley, Calif., Gay has now connected on 19 of his last 31 three-point attempts (61.3 percent) over his last six games and is 23-of-39 (59.0 percent) over his nine contests. He has four double-digit scoring games in his last six outings (12.8 ppg) after scoring 10 or more in just four of his first 17 games.

Junior guard Richie Williams returned to the starting lineup for just the second time in his last seven games and responded with a game-high six assists (remember, SDSU had just 14 field goals in the entire game). It was his highest total since suffering a broken left wrist in late December which forced him to miss five games.

Although Wade suffered through a difficult shooting day (1-of-8 from the floor), he once again showed why he is one of the most versatile players on the West Coast. A native of Las Vegas, Nev., Wade had five assists, giving him 21 assists in his last three games (7.0 apg). On the season, the junior has produced games of 28 points, 13 rebounds, 11 assists and four steals. Despite scoring a season-low six points against the Falcons, Wade has three games with 21 or more points in his last six outings.

Saturday marked the third, three-point defeat in Mountain West Conference play for an Aztec squad that has played shorthanded at times this season. San Diego State starters have combined to miss 44 games this season due to injury, illness or suspension (Tim Shelton 26, Kyle Spain 10 and Richie Williams 8).

Despite those challenges, the Aztecs sit on 19 victories, the sixth-highest total in the school's 38 Division I season. San Diego State which advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2006 and the NIT in 2007, is looking for a third consecutive postseason berth for the first time since 1940, 1941 and 1942.

**Three Aztecs Earn All-Conference Honors; Wade Earns First-Team Honors While White Named League's Top Freshman**

Three San Diego State men's basketball players earned all-Mountain West Conference accolades, the league announced on Monday. In a vote by MWC coaches and media, junior Lorenzo Wade was named to the all-conference first team, while junior Ryan Amoroso and freshman Billy White garnered third-team honors. White was also voted as the league's Freshman of the Year.

A year after being an MWC honorable mention selection in his first season at SDSU, Wade earned his way onto the Mountain West Conference first team after finishing league play as one of three players to rank in the top 10 in scoring, rebounding, assists, blocked shots and field goal percentage. The Las Vegas, Nev., native averaged 15.9 points (5th), 6.1 rebounds (9th), 4.0 assists (3rd) and 0.81 blocks (t-9th), while connecting on 44 percent of his field goal attempts (7th) in 16 MWC contests. Both of his double-doubles came during conference action as did his career highs in points, rebounds, assists, field goals and free throws. Wade scored in double figures in 12 MWC games with six of his seven 20-plus point performances this season coming during that stretch. This marks the third year in a row in which an Aztec has been named to the

all-MWC first team and Wade joins Randy Holcomb, Marcus Slaughter and Brandon Heath as the only Aztec players to earn first-team MWC accolades. White, another Aztec hailing from Las Vegas, was named to the MWC third team and voted as the league's freshman of the year after he led all conference freshmen in points, rebounds, offensive rebounds, field goal percentage and blocked shots, while finishing second in steals during league play. After starting all 16 conference games, White finished with averages of 9.1 points, 6.5 rebounds, 2.56 offensive rebounds, 62.9-percent shooting and 1.13 blocked shots, in addition to averaging 1.38 steals per game. Among all MWC players, White led the league in offensive boards and ranked fifth in blocks, seventh in rebounding and tied for ninth in steals. Similar to Wade, White's two double-doubles also came during the conference season, once at Colorado State and the other occurring at Wyoming. In February, White became the first freshman in league history to win MWC Player of the Week honors twice in one season. White is the second SDSU player to win the top freshman award in the nine years of the MWC, joining Evan Burns in 2003, and is just the third player since Jason Hamilton in 1993 (Western Athletic Conference) to earn such an honor. White is also just the fourth freshman in league history to be named to an all-conference team.

Amoroso received third-team recognition after being one of the most productive players in the Mountain West during league play. The Burnsville, Minn., native finished his first run through the MWC averaging 12.6 points (12th) and 7.4 rebounds (2nd), while connecting on 50.6 percent of his field goal attempts (5th). A model of consistency on the boards, Amoroso grabbed at least six rebounds in 14 of the 16 conference games and finished the season collecting at least that many in 11 straight outings. The Marquette transfer's effort on the glass also put him in a tie for third with Wade in defensive rebounding (5.00) and fourth in offensive rebounding (2.44). Amoroso recorded 10 double-digit scoring performances, including three 20-plus point games, and had 10 or more rebounds twice during league play.

This is the seventh straight season in which San Diego State has had at least three players recognized by the league's coaches and media and the eighth consecutive campaign in which an Aztec player has been honored at season's end. This is just the second time that three SDSU players have been named to all-Mountain West teams, joining the 2006 championship team when Heath (first-team), Slaughter (first-team) and Mohamed Abukar (second-team) were honored.

## Storylines and Tidbits

### ■ ANOTHER GREAT SEASON

Despite a roster that includes just one senior, San Diego State is in the midst of another outstanding season. Coupled with the 2006 NCAA Tournament team that finished 24-9 and the 2007 team that advanced to the second round of the NIT and finished 22-11, the Aztecs have set school records for most victories over a four-season period (tied) and three-season period.

Some of the notable accomplishments for San Diego State this season:

- \* - The Aztecs clinched a third consecutive winning season (first time since 1982-83, 1983-84, 1984-85 seasons)
- \* - The Aztecs clinched a third straight winning league record (first time since 1965-66, 1966-67, 1967-68 seasons)
- \* - Won at least 19 games in three straight seasons (first time since 1938-39, 1939-40, 1940-41 seasons)

### FISHER KNOWS THE POSTSEASON

One of 11 active coaches to win a national championship (complete list can be found on page 43 of the media guide), Steve Fisher has made a name for himself with his ability to get teams to peak at the right time. With an eye-popping winning percentage, an NCAA, NIT and two MWC tournament titles, Fisher's squads are always worth keeping an eye on. Below is a look at how the ninth-year coach has performed in the postseason.

### CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT TIDBITS

- Quick hits on San Diego State and the conference tournament ...
- \* - San Diego State is going for a league-record third Mountain West Conference tournament championship. San Diego State and UNLV are the only two schools with two MWC postseason championships.
- \* - SDSU has never been the four seed in a conference tournament.
- \* - The Aztecs have never played the five seed in any conference tournament. It is the only seed, one through eight, that SDSU has not met in the MWC tournament.
- \* - San Diego State owns an 8-4 record all time as the higher seed, including a 3-1 mark in MWC tournament action.
- \* - Thursday's game marks a school-record tying fifth consecutive game in league tournament action in which the Aztecs have owned the better seed (three games in 2006, one game in 2007 and the quarterfinal game in 2008).
- \* - This is the third time in school history that the Aztecs have ended the regular season only to face the same opponent in the first game of the conference tournament. In both cases, the regular-season finale and the tournament game had the same outcome (losing to UNLV in 2003 and Utah in 2004).
- \* - In MWC history there have been seven times when two teams have met to end the regular season and then played to open the tournament. On five of those occasions, the team that won the regular season game was victorious in the conference tournament.
- \* - SDSU would love to get Brandon Heath back for another season. An honorable mention All-American player who graduated in December, 2007 and whose eligibility expired last season, scored 143 career points in the MWC tournament. In seven career tournament games, the league's all-time leading scorer averaged 20.4 points, 4.6 rebounds and 2.9 assists. He connected on 18 three-point field goals in the event, 11 more than any other player in school history.
- \* - The history of the four seed is pretty good. In eight previous conference tournaments, the four seed has an 8-7 record, including a 5-3 mark in quarterfinal round games. The seed has advanced to the tournament final on three occasions, but has yet to win the trophy, dropping the three games by a total of eight points.

### THE AIR FORCE SERIES

- \* - San Diego State leads the all time series 39-20.
- \* - This is the fifth time the teams have met in a conference tournament, with SDSU winning three of the previous four league tournament games. The Aztecs have won the last three such games, including the most recent encounter in the 2005 MWC quarterfinals (SDSU, 73-68).
- \* - This is the eighth different city the teams have played in and they have never met at the same neutral site twice. In conference tournament action, the teams have played in El Paso, Texas (1990), Laramie, Wyo. (1991), Albuquerque, N.M. (1996), Denver, Colo. (2005) and now Las Vegas, Nev. (2008). The teams also tangled in Omaha, Neb., at the 1973 Creighton Invitational.

### LIKE US NOW, LOVE US LATER

- San Diego State appears to have all the pieces in place to have another great season in 2008-09. That's because the only players not expected to return are senior Matt Thomas (2.1 ppg, 1.5 rpg, 1.1 apg) and junior Chris Lamb (0.7 ppg, 0.6 rpg, 0.1 apg), who will be graduating in May.
- SDSU will return players that accounted for at least 83.3 percent of its starts, 84.2 percent of its scoring, 83.9 percent of its rebounding and 86.3 percent of its assists.
- The Aztecs are scheduled to return at least six of its top seven scorers.

### ONE OF THE BEST FRESHMEN EVER



SDSU freshman forward Billy White has made a major impact in his first season as an Aztec. A native of Las Vegas, White is one of five players to see action in all 30 games, making 27 starts, and averaging 8.8 points and 6.0 rebounds. He has 44 steals and 24 blocked shots and is on pace to become the first player in Aztec history to lead the team in both categories in the same season.

Not only has White proven himself to be the top freshman in the Mountain West Conference, he is also making a case to be one of the top freshmen at San Diego State in the nine-year history of

the league.

Below is a look at some of his many accomplishments in his inaugural season:

- \* - Only player in the nine-year history of the Mountain West Conference to earn player-of the week honors twice as a freshman.
- \* - Became the first SDSU freshmen to be placed on an all-conference team, as he earned third-team honors (Evan Burns, Brandon Heath, Marcus Slaughter and Matt Thomas all earned honorable mention honors).
- \* - Just the fourth freshman in Mountain West Conference history to be named to the all-conference team (does not include honorable mention), joining Utah's Andrew Bogut (2003-04, second-team), Brigham Young's Trent Plaisted (2005-06, second-team) and Wyoming's Brandon Ewing (2005-06, third team).
- \* - Is shattering Michael Cage's school record for highest field goal percentage by a freshman. He is currently shooting 61.2 percent from the field, almost 5.5 percent ahead of Cage's school-record mark of 55.8 percent set in 1981.
- \* - He is playing particularly well of late as he is averaging 12.2 points and 8.2 rebounds over his last five games. He has made 41 of his last 61 attempts from the field (67.2 percent).

■ **LORRENZO WADE IS THE NEXT GREAT AZTEC**



On Monday, junior forward Lorenzo Wade became the fourth Aztec in the Mountain West Conference era to be named to the all-league first team, joining Randy Holcomb (2002), Marcus Slaughter (2006) and Brandon Heath (2006 and 2007).

Wade is having a monster season, leading the Aztecs in scoring (15.1) and assists (3.4) and adding 4.6 rebounds per game. This season, he has 24 double-digit scoring games, seven 20-point contests, two double-figure rebound games and a career-high 11-assist effort earlier this month against Colorado State. He has led SDSU this season in scoring 12 times, in rebounding six times and in assists 12 times.

The Las Vegas native has plenty left in the tank as well. He is averaging 16.3 points over the last seven games (three games of 21 or more points during that stretch), 6.3 rebounds in the last four games, 7.0 assists in the last three games, and is shooting 50.0 percent (22-of-44) from the field over his last four contests.

■ **PLENTY OF AMMO LEFT**



Along with Wade and White on the all-conference team was junior newcomer Ryan Amoroso, who was named to the MWC third team. Like Wade, Amoroso has seen his production increase as the season has progressed as he has averaged 13.6 points on 50.5 percent shooting and a team-leading 8.0 rebounds in his last 10 games.

Despite his ability to shoot the ball, Amoroso's presence is felt in the painted area where he has grabbed six or more rebounds in 11 straight games and in 14 of his last 15 outings. At 6-8, 257 pounds, Amoroso regularly draws the opposition's big man and has done an outstanding job guarding bigger players. Not once in 30 games has he fouled out of a game and has collected four fouls in a game just three times this season.

■ **SHOOTER'S TOUCH**

Freshman D.J. Gay has definitely had the shooter's touch since he was reinserted into the starting lineup at Utah on Feb. 16. Since that game he has averaged 12.8 points and is shooting at a 59.5 percent clip (25-42), including 61.3 percent from behind the arc (19-31). Prior to the Utah game, Gay was just 8-for-36 from three-point distance. More recently, Gay has made at least one three-pointer in a career-best nine straight games and has nine three-point field goals in his last two

games. The freshman from Sun Valley, Calif., has four double-figure scoring games in his last six outings after doing so just four times in his first 24 games. His hot shooting has resulted in more playing time for the true freshman as he has posted career highs in minutes played in each of the last two games (30 vs. Colorado State, 32 at Air Force).

This season, Gay has made 23 starts, mostly at the point guard position and has done a tremendous job of taking care of the ball. He has had one turnover or less in 20 games and in his last 426 minutes he has 31 assists and just 23 turnovers.

#### ■ RETURN OF THE ROCK

Junior guard Richie Williams made his second straight start in the regular-season finale at Air Force and had a team-high six assists, his highest total since he broke his left wrist against Sam Houston State (Dec. 28). In his last four games, the San Diego native has 12 helpers, his most in a three-game period in a month (had 12 combined vs. AFA, at TCU, vs. UNM). Nicknamed "Rock" by his teammates, the two-year starter has the most career starts of any Aztec at 73 and ranks sixth in career assists average (3.93) and seventh in career assists with 346.

#### ■ HOMECOMING FOR WADE AND WHITE

Two of San Diego State's starting five call Las Vegas home. Junior forward Lorenzo Wade was a first-team all-state selection at Cheyenne High in Las Vegas. He helped lead the Desert Shields to their first state title. Freshman forward Billy White played his prep ball at Green Valley High and was a class 4A all-state selection. He helped lead the Gators to the state playoffs as a senior and to a No. 6 state ranking.

Wade recorded the second double-double of his career (he now has four) with 11 points and 11 rebounds last season (Jan. 27, 2007) against the Rebels at the Thomas & Mack Center.

#### ■ THE PROGRAM TURNAROUND

Although Fisher is certainly linked to guiding Michigan to its only national basketball championship in 1989 and to leading the Wolverines to two more Final Four appearances (1992 and 1993), he has done a remarkable job of breathing life into the once-dormant Aztec basketball program.

Now in his 17th full season as a head coach, Fisher owns a 330-210 career record, with 146 victories coming as the head coach of the Aztecs. He is the third-winningest coach in SDSU history, trailing only George Ziegenfuss (1948-69) and Morris Gross (1929-42).

San Diego State won 143 games over the 14 seasons prior to Fisher's arrival (10.1 wins per year) and had 77 wins in the eight years (9.6 wins per year) before he stepped foot on campus. But Fisher has worked his magic, leading SDSU to postseason play four times in the past six seasons after SDSU had advanced to postseason play just four times in its previous 32 Division I seasons. San Diego State has won 22 or more games each of the last two seasons and is looking to reach the 20-win plateau for a third straight season for the first time since the 1938-39, 1939-40 and 1940-41 seasons. Below are a few of the many milestones Fisher has compiled as a head coach.

#### ■ THE MWC TURNAROUND

Steve Fisher's amazing turnaround project continues at San Diego State. The Aztecs went 20 consecutive seasons without a winning conference record from 1985-86 through 2004-05. But since the beginning of the 2005-06 campaign, San Diego State has posted an impressive 32-16 record (66.7 percent). In the first six seasons of the MWC, the Aztecs were just 26-58 (31.0 percent). This season, the Aztecs posted a third consecutive .500 or better league campaign.

#### ■ WHO NEEDS A BIG MAN?

Despite a roster that includes just two players taller than 6-8 and a starting lineup with a 6-8 center, San Diego State continues to do more than hold its own on the boards. For the season, the Aztecs own a +3.5 rebound margin and SDSU has won the category statistically in 17 of the last 24 games (tied BYU twice and UNLV), including a plus-20 margin at Colorado State. In MWC games only, San Diego State is +5.1 in rebounding margin. For the season, SDSU is 15-5 when owning an edge in the rebounding.

#### ■ FIND A WAY

The 2007-08 San Diego State team is quickly becoming adept at finding ways to win games. Five times this season the Aztecs have won a game in which they have shot 42.3 percent or less from the field. Against UC Riverside, the Aztecs claimed a 59-46 win, despite connecting on just 34.0 percent from the floor.

#### ■ LOVIN' THE 70s

Reaching 70 points is a good sign for San Diego State. The Aztecs are 12-0 this season when scoring 70 or more points and 7-10 when they fail to reach the magic number. Dating back to last season, SDSU has won 15 consecutive games when tallying 70 or more points.

#### ▶ THE DIFFERENCE

SDSU Falls at Air Force in Regular-Season Finale

USAF, Colo. - San Diego State could not overcome 50 percent shooting from the free-throw line and 33.3 percent from behind the arc as it fell, 46-43, to Air Force in the regular-season finale for both teams at Clune Arena.

The Aztecs received a game-high 17 points on the strength of five three-pointers from D.J. Gay, but got little else in the scoring column from their other four starters. Between Lorrenzo Wade, Billy White, Ryan Amoroso and Richie Williams, the starting quartet combined for just 20 points on 6-of-27 from the floor (22.2 percent).

From the outset, it was all Falcons as they scored the first seven points of the game and limited SDSU to just two free throws until a dunk by Wade at the 10:52 mark snapped the Aztecs' field-goal drought. From that point forward, San Diego State went on a 6-2 run to take what would be its only lead of the game at 10-9 with 8:22 remaining in the first half. Air Force wound up outscoring the Aztecs 19-8 in the final eight minutes to take a nine-point lead into halftime.

Coming out of intermission, SDSU tallied the first eight points and used an 11-2 spurt to tie the game at 29. The all-square score was short lived as Air Force retook the lead after an Andrew Henke free throw and never looked back as the Falcons never allowed the Aztecs get closer than two points the rest of the way.

Despite Air Force never relinquishing the lead, the Falcons withstood a fierce SDSU attack in the final minutes and survived a Wade three-pointer with the Aztecs down two with less than three seconds remaining. Air Force tacked on a free throw with one second left to provide the final margin.

Noting the Air Force Game

- ▶ D.J. Gay scored 17 points to lead all scorers and his effort marked the second time he has led the Aztecs in scoring.
- ▶ Gay's six field goals matched his career best and he has six buckets in each of his last two games and three times in his last six outings.
- ▶ Gay's five three-pointers tied his career high. He also had five at Utah en route to his personal-best 21 points.
- ▶ Richie Williams dished a game-high six assists, marking the eighth time this season he has led the team in helpers.
- ▶ Lorrenzo Wade was credited with five assists in the game. In his last two ballgames, the junior has totaled 16 assists (8.0 assists per game).
- ▶ Ryan Amoroso collected nine rebounds extending his streak of six or more rebounds in a game to 11 straight.
- ▶ Billy White had eight rebounds giving him five consecutive ballgames of six or more boards in a game.
- ▶ The Aztecs made six three-pointers in the game marking the 16th time this year they have connected on at least six field goals from behind the arc.
- ▶ San Diego State finished the game with an advantage on the boards, 31-26. It marked the 20th time this season that SDSU held an advantage on the glass.

San Diego State vs. Air Force: The Series

- ▶ San Diego State and Air Force are meeting for the 60th time with the Aztecs holding a 39-20 series lead.
- ▶ SDSU and Air Force are meeting for just the second time in the Mountain West Conference Championships. The Aztecs won the only meeting in 2005 in the quarterfinal round at Pepsi Center in Denver, Colo., 73-68.
- ▶ In neutral-site contests, SDSU owns a 4-1 series lead and has won three straight. The Aztecs last defeat on a neutral court vs. the Falcons came on March 7, 1990, in El Paso, Texas, when Air Force won 70-64 in overtime in the first round of the Western Athletic Conference tournament.
- ▶ The Aztecs own a 14-13 series lead in games played at the Academy. The Falcons have won the last five meetings at Clune, with SDSU's last victory coming on Jan. 11, 2003 (W, 63-48).

▶ The Aztecs own a 21-6 advantage in games played in San Diego and are 7-3 against the Academy in Cox Arena.  
 ▶ It used to be like clockwork. When SDSU and Air Force got together, the team with the halftime lead would go on to win the game. In fact, the team leading at intermission had won 10 straight coming into the 2004-05 campaign. But that season the team with the halftime advantage lost all three games. During the 2005-06 season in the first game of the series, Air Force reverted to the old trend, and despite losing an 11-point halftime advantage, the Falcons were victorious, 65-62. In the second game of the year, both teams were tied at 27 before the Aztecs went on to record the 10-point victory (W, 61-51).

Last year the trend continued as the Falcons led at the half and went on post a 56-51 win at Clune despite SDSU having a chance to win in the final minute. At Cox Arena, the Aztecs led 24-16 on their way to a 62-41 victory over the No. 15/13 Falcons.

The trend continued once again this year as SDSU owned a slim, 17-16, lead at halftime and emerged with a 49-38 victory at Cox Arena in the first meeting. In the regular-season finale, the Falcons went into the locker room ahead by nine and came away with the 46-43 win.

▶ In eight of the last 12 years in which the teams have met, one team has swept the regular season series from the other. In 1996, 1997, 1998, 2001 and 2003, the Aztecs broke out the broom, while in 2000, 2004 and 2005, Air Force won both meetings. Since 1996, there has not a season sweep in 2002, 2006, 2007 or 2008 when each team defended its home court.

▶ The series with the Falcons is the only MWC match-up in which the Aztecs hold the all-time lead. The 39-20 lead is 11 wins better than the Aztecs' next closest series against a conference foe, a 28-35 deficit to Wyoming.

▶ Reaching 60 points in Thursday's game seems to be a key to victory for the Aztecs against the Falcons. Going back to the 1990-91 season over 30 meetings, SDSU has won all but two games (19-2) against Air Force in which it scored 60 or more points.

▶ **Series Trends:** The team ahead at the half has won 15 of the last 18 games in the series (all three losses came during the 2004-05 season)... The team with the fewest turnovers has won 10 of the last 14 games in the series... Since Feb. 24, 2000, teams that reach 60 points are 13-2... Since the formation of the MWC, SDSU is 9-5 vs. the Falcons when committing 18 or less turnovers in a game and 0-5 vs. Air Force when committing 19 or more turnovers... Four of the last nine games that SDSU has lost, the Aztecs have turned the ball over exactly 19 times... Sophomore guard Matt Thomas recorded his career high of 20 points vs. Air Force (Feb. 28, 2005).

**LAST MEETING IN SAN DIEGO**

**San Diego State 49, Air Force 38 | Feb. 6, 2008 | Cox Arena**

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State used a 14-3 run early in the second half to break open a close game as the Aztecs went on to defeat Air Force, 49-38, at Cox Arena.

SDSU limited the Falcons to 31 percent shooting from the field and held them to its second-lowest scoring output of the season. Air Force's 38 points were also the fewest San Diego State has given up in a Mountain West Conference game and was the fewest points scored in arena history.

The game was slow to start with the Aztecs leading 4-0 until the Falcons' Tim Anderson made a three-pointer at the 13:21 mark to record the team's first field goal and points of the contest.

The entire first half was a defensive battle with both teams combining to go 13 of 41 from the field (31.7 percent), including 1-for-12 from behind the arc. At the end of one period, the Aztecs held onto a 17-16 lead.

In the second half after Air Force jumped ahead, 21-19, the Falcons were called for an intentional foul sending Lorenzo Wade to the free throw line plus possession of the ball. Wade's two free throws and a Ryan Amoroso jumper on the ensuing possession ignited a 14-3 run giving the Aztecs a 33-24 cushion with 11:20 remaining in the game.

The Falcons would not get closer than four points the rest of the way and SDSU never relinquish its lead as it ballooned to 15 at one point, to finish with the 11-point decision.

Wade led all scorers with 14 points and Amoroso contributed a game- and career-high 12 rebounds, while adding six points.

**LAST MEETING IN THE MWC CHAMPIONSHIPS**

**(6) San Diego State 73, (3) Air Force 68 | March 10, 2005 | Pepsi Center**

DENVER - Brandon Heath scored 28 points and Marcus Slaughter added 24, helping sixth-seeded San Diego State upset third-seeded Air Force 73-68 in the first round of the Mountain West Conference tournament at the Pepsi Center.

With the victory, the Aztecs advance to face New Mexico in the semifinals.

SDSU led by as much as 13 in the second half before the Falcons cut the lead to 65-62 on Matt McCraw's 3-pointer with 58 seconds left.

Air Force seemed destined to take control when Matt Thomas subsequently missed two free throws. However, the Falcons couldn't control the rebound and Jacob Buttschi was called for a technical foul for arguing the call. Heath then hit two free throws and Slaughter added two more, all but ending Air Force's chances.

Antoine Hood scored 17 points for Air Force, which committed 15 turnovers and had difficulty handling Slaughter and Heath. Slaughter hit 9-of-14 shots and grabbed nine rebounds, while Heath added seven assists and six rebounds.

San Diego State had trouble with Air Force's methodical offense early on as the Falcons hit five 3-pointers in the first 11 minutes and went on an 11-4 run to go up 19-11.

However, the Aztecs quickly adjusted to disrupt Air Force's passing lanes and closed within 29-27 by halftime. SDSU kept it going in the second half, forcing four straight turnovers early to start a 20-8 run that put them up 47-37.

## Wade Named to NABC All-District 13 Second Team

Junior forward Lorenzo Wade was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) all-District 13 second team on March 4. Selected and voted on by member coaches of the NABC, the 150 student-athletes from 15 districts represent the finest basketball players across America and are now eligible for the State Farm Division I All-America team to be announced on April 5, at the 2008 NABC Convention in San Antonio, Texas.

Wade, who hails from Las Vegas, Nev., is averaging a team-best 15.4 points per game and 3.3 assists through 29 games. He is also averaging 4.7 rebounds and is shooting 46.7 percent from the field. In Mountain West Conference games, Wade has elevated his game by averaging 16.6 points, 6.3 rebounds and 3.9 assists. He is one of only three players who currently rank in the top 10 in the MWC in points, rebounds and assists during league play.

The junior has played in every game this season and earned the starting assignment 28 times, while scoring in double figures on 24 different occasions. Of his 24 double-digit scoring efforts, seven have been of the 20-plus point variety, including his career-high of 28 in the home victory over Brigham Young.

Wade also has a pair of double-doubles to his credit as he went for 11 points and a career-best 13 rebounds vs. Wyoming and tallied 18 points and 10 rebounds at Colorado State. In his last outing vs. CSU at home, Wade nearly missed San Diego State's first triple-double after he posted eight points, eight rebounds and a personal-best 11 assists.

The all-district honor marks the fourth time in the last three seasons and the seventh time in the last seven years that an Aztec has been recognized. Last season, Brandon Heath, SDSU's and the MWC's all-time leading scorer earned first-team accolades.

## White Becomes First Freshman to be Twice Named MWC Player of the Week

San Diego State freshman forward Billy White earned Mountain West Conference Player of the Week honors, the league announced Feb. 25, becoming the first freshman in the nine-year history of the league to earn the honor twice. A native of Las Vegas, White averaged 17.0 points, 10.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 2.0 steals and 2.0 blocked shots in SDSU victories at Wyoming (79-68) and over conference-leading Brigham Young (69-65).

White connected on 73.7 percent (14-of-19) of his attempts from the field in the two games, and posted game-high rebound totals in both contests.

At Wyoming, White sparked San Diego State's second-half comeback by scoring 17 points and adding eight rebounds in the second half. For the game, the freshman had 19 points and a career-high 12 rebounds to post his second double-double of the season.

In the contest against Brigham Young, White had 15 points and recorded game-highs with eight rebounds, four blocked shots and three steals to help the Aztecs snap the Cougars' nine-game winning streak. He was 7-for-11 from the field in the game.

White earned conference player of the week honors earlier this season on Dec. 31, after he hit the game-tying shot to force overtime and the game-winning shot in the extra session to lift the Aztecs to a 79-78 victory over previously unbeaten Sam Houston State.

In addition to White's two honors, fellow Las Vegas native Lorenzo Wade also won the award on Jan. 21, following SDSU wins over Utah and Wyoming.

## White Making A Difference

Freshman Billy White has made his presence felt in his first year on Montezuma Mesa and in the Mountain West Conference. The Las Vegas, Nev., native finished the conference season tops among all freshmen in scoring at 9.1 points per game and in rebounding at 6.5 a contest. In the rebounding category, White ranks eighth in the league and is the only freshman in the top 10. The next closest frosh is Chris Collinsworth of BYU and his 4.9 average is 17th-best in the MWC.

In addition to his scoring and rebounding abilities, White has started 27 games, including 27 in a row and is first on the team in blocked shots and steals. He is making free throws at a 68.3 percent clip and is also shooting 61.2 percent from the field. In conference games only, White finds himself in the top 10 in offensive rebounds (1st), blocked shots (5th), rebounding (7th) and steals (t-9th).

For the season, White has a pair of double-doubles, both of which have come during conference play on the road. At Colorado State, the freshman went for 17 points (8-11 FG) and 10 rebounds and in Laramie, he went for 19 points and a career-best 12 rebounds. Through his first go-around in the MWC, White grabbed at least five rebounds 14 times and scored at least eight points 10 times.

## Beast on the Block

Ryan Amoroso is certainly living up to his preseason newcomer of the year award that he earned prior to the start of the 2007-08 season. In conference games only, Amoroso has been one of the most effective players in the Mountain West Conference averaging 12.6 points, 7.4 rebounds and shooting 50.6 percent from the floor to date. He currently ranks second in rebounding and 12th in scoring, and has picked up his play since his 10-point, eight-rebound effort vs. Utah.

Since that home game vs. the Utes, which spans 13 games, Amoroso has added eight more double-figure scoring performances and 12 games with at least six rebounds. More impressive is the fact that he is also shooting 51.0 percent from the field (73-of-143), when including his 5-for-9 effort against Utah.

## Go D.J., That's My D.J.!

D.J. Gay has been shooting the lights out the last six games, all starts, as he has averaged 12.8 points during that span, well above his season average of 6.0. Since returning to the starting lineup at Utah, Gay has gone 25-for-42 from the field (.595), 19-for-31 from behind the arc (.613) and 8-for-12 from the charity stripe (.667). In Salt Lake City, the freshman scored a career-high 21 points on a personal-best five three-point field goals. In Laramie, Gay followed his lifetime-best performance with 11 points after connecting on a trio of three-pointers. In the win over Brigham Young, Gay scored seven points

and missed just one of his three shot attempts and made both free throws. After an off-night at UNLV, Gay responded with 18 points on 6-of-9 shooting, including 4-of-6 from three-point distance against Colorado State. In the regular-season finale at Air Force, Gay was the only Aztec in double figures as he scored a game-high 17 points after tying his career-best with five three-pointers.

His 19-for-31 streak from distance is his best six-game streak of his career and his two-game double-figure scoring streak was a career best before it was snapped vs. BYU. Prior to the Utah game, Gay was mired in a shooting slump as he was 8-for-36 from three-point distance in his previous 11 contests. For the season, Gay is first on the team with 41 three-pointers.

## Streak Stoppers

For the third time this season, San Diego State put an end to a lengthy win streak as it stopped Brigham Young's nine-game winning streak, which was the seventh-longest nationally. Earlier this year, the Aztecs put a halt to a pair of extended win streaks, once vs. Sam Houston State and the other time coming at New Mexico.

Against the Bearkats, San Diego State emerged victorious, 79-78, in overtime to put an end to SHSU's 10-game winning streak, which was tied for eighth nationally at game time. Two weeks later in Albuquerque, SDSU snapped New Mexico's seven-game overall winning streak (17th-best nationally at game time) and its 10-game home streak (21st nationally) with a 72-67 win.

## Fisher Wins 143rd Game at San Diego State With Victory Over Air Force

On Feb. 6 against Air Force, head coach Steve Fisher collected his 143rd career victory at San Diego State. The number might be a little obscure, but it is definitely significant in Aztec basketball history. In the 14 seasons prior to Fisher's arrival on Montezuma Mesa, SDSU won only 143 games combined. Fisher has certainly taken the school to unparalleled heights as he has needed only eight-plus seasons to do what the program did in 14 years.

## Three Double-Doubles With Cheese, Please

At Colorado State, the Aztecs had three players record double-doubles in the game. It was the first such occurrence in SDSU history since Jan. 30, 1982, and the fifth time overall. Ryan Amoroso finished with a team-high 23 points and grabbed 11 rebounds, while Lorenzo Wade had 18 points and 10 boards. The third member of the trio was Billy White, who had his first double-double of his career with 17 points and a personal-best 10 rebounds.

It was the third time in Mountain West Conference history that three double-doubles were recorded in a single game and the first it was done by a team other than UNLV. The Runnin' Rebels accomplished the feat twice in the 1999-00 season, once vs. Air Force and once vs. Cal Poly.

## ... And That's the Game

Twice this season, San Diego State has received a game-winning basket with less than 35 seconds to play to stay ahead for good. Most recently, Lorenzo Wade connected on a three-point attempt to give the Aztecs an 83-82 edge with 21 seconds left in the game at Colorado State to escape with the victory. Earlier this season, fellow Las Vegas, Nev., native Billy White had an offensive put-back basket with 11 seconds left in overtime lifting the Aztecs over Sam Houston State at Cox Arena.

Wade's bucket was the 10th game-winning shot (a field goal or free throw that puts SDSU ahead to stay with less than 35 seconds to play) in the last seven seasons (since 2001-02) and is the fourth time during that span that the Aztecs have at least two game-winning baskets in one season. The other three times it occurred, SDSU advanced to the postseason. In 2002 and 2006, it happened twice and the Aztecs earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament. Last season, San Diego State had three such occurrences and moved on to the postseason NIT.

## Bonus Basketball

San Diego State has played two overtime games this season, marking the first time since 2005-06 the school has accomplished the feat. The Aztecs have been particularly good in extra-session contests having won five straight. Prior to the current streak, SDSU had lost six in a row and 13 of 14 dating back to the 1998-99 season. Earlier this year, San Diego State and Sam Houston State played bonus basketball with the Aztecs emerging with a 79-78 win and in the third MWC game of the season, SDSU and Utah battled into the extra period with the Scarlet and Black earning the 64-56 victory.

## Stingy at Cox

Twice this season San Diego State has held an opponent to its fewest points in a half since joining the Mountain West Conference in 1999-00. In the conference opener vs. TCU and against Wyoming, the Aztecs held their counterparts to just 13 first-half points. During its run to the NIT in 2006-07, SDSU's lowest point total allowed in a half was 14 against UC San Diego.

The Aztecs effort in the first 20 minutes vs. the Cowboys was rather impressive as they jumped to a 19-0 lead, held Wyoming without a point until the 11:25 mark and allowed the Pokes first field goal with 10:43 left in the half. It was not until the 2:42 mark when Wyoming connected on its second field goal of the game. For the half, SDSU limited the Cowboys to just three field goals, two more than the NCAA record of one allowed by Kansas State in its game vs. Savannah State earlier this year.

Later in the season, the Aztecs played one of their most impressive defensive games as they held Air Force to just 16 first-half points and 38 points for the entire contest. The 38 Falcon points were the fewest allowed by SDSU in an MWC game and the fewest ever scored in Cox Arena history.

## Not a One-Hit Wonder

After overcoming a 14-point deficit to win at New Mexico, San Diego State made sure that win was not a fluke after rallying from an 11-point deficit to beat Utah in the next game at Cox Arena. Winning in this fashion is something the Aztecs would rather not do, but they overcame two straight 10-point deficits thanks to their free-throw shooting. At The Pit, SDSU was 13 for its last 14 (92.9 percent) and 16-for-21 overall (76.2 percent). Against the Utes, the Aztecs were 8-for-8 in overtime and 14-for-19 (73.7 percent) for the game.

Although not a double-digit deficit, SDSU rallied from a second-half seven-point hole at Colorado State to post an 83-82 victory at Moby Arena and came from seven points down in the second half vs. Brigham Young at Cox Arena and eventually emerged with the 69-65 win.

The San Diego State 14-point rally at New Mexico was the second-largest come-from-behind victory of the Steve Fisher era, eclipsed only by an 18-point comeback to defeat Monmouth on Nov. 22, 2004. The Aztecs' 11-point rally vs. the Utes ranked as the 10th-largest deficit overcome for a victory during Fisher's tenure at SDSU.

## Success at The Pit

Earlier this season, San Diego State went into The Pit and defeated New Mexico for its third consecutive victory at the facility. With the win, SDSU became the only program to have two win streaks of at least three games at The Pit. The three-game streak is the second-longest win streak of all time for a visiting team in the venue, trailing only a four-game winning streak for UTEP (1983-86). Other three-game winning streaks at The Pit are Arizona (1975-77), San Diego State (1982-84) and Utah (1995-96).

Overall, San Diego State has defeated New Mexico five consecutive times. It is the longest win streak in the series for the Aztecs since SDSU claimed seven straight from 1981-84 and the longest against New Mexico by any team since UNLV defeated the Lobos five straight times between 2002-04.

The win also extends some personal streaks for Lorenzo Wade and Kyle Spain. With the win, Wade improved to 4-0 in The Pit (he recorded two victories in the NCAA Tournament while a member of the Louisville program), while Spain improved to 3-0. Spain is the only Aztec to play in each of the last three victories in The Pit.

## Owning the Boards

In their game vs. Navy, the Aztecs were monsters on the boards as they collected 39 while limiting the Mids to just 21 total rebounds. SDSU's plus-18 margin was a season-best and was the fifth-best in Cox Arena history. Navy's five offensive rebounds also tied Fresno State for the lowest by an opponent this season.

At Arizona, SDSU outrebounded the Wildcats as it won the rebounding battle, 36-35, and had 18 offensive boards. In their game at New Mexico, the Aztecs finished the game at +11 in the rebound column and had 18 on the offensive boards. Against Wyoming, San Diego State outrebounded the Pokes by 15, 41-26, and had 13 more defensive rebounds.

At Colorado State, the Aztecs owned a plus-20 rebound margin, 46-26, to set a new season high for rebounds and rebounding margin in a game. The plus-20 differential was also the second-largest rebound margin for SDSU in MWC history. San Diego State followed that performance with a plus-15 effort over Air Force at home.

Playing the Cowboys seems to bring out the rebounding prowess in the Aztecs because they finished their season series at Arena-Auditorium with a 35-25 advantage on the boards. Of SDSU's 35 total rebounds, 17 were on the offensive end and 12 total rebounds belonged to Billy White. The Rams' return trip to Cox Arena in the series ended with the Aztecs finishing with a +14 advantage, 38-24.

The Aztecs have outrebounded their opponent 20 times this season, including 17 of the last 24 games (finished tied with BYU both times this year and the matched UNLV with 33).

## Robbery Suspects

The Aztecs have been making the art of stealing a regular thing this season. In 21 of 30 games this year, SDSU has recorded at least seven steals, including 15 at San Diego and a season-high 19 at Loyola Marymount. Of the 459 turnovers San Diego State has forced, 52.5 percent or 241 have come via the steal.

## Triple Threat

San Diego State has four players averaging double figures and four more boasting an average of at least 6.0 points per game so it comes as no surprise that the Aztecs have had at least three players score in double figures in 24 of 30 games this year. At Wyoming, SDSU had at least five players score in double figures for the fourth time this year.

## Shutting Down the Bigs

San Diego State has faced five big men this season that have received national attention in Cal's DeVon Hardin, Western Michigan's Joe Reitz, Saint Mary's Omar Samhan, Utah's Luke Nevill and Brigham Young's Trent Plaisted and have had decent success against all of them. In the game against the Golden Bears, the Aztecs used a fierce double team to limit Hardin, an NBA prospect, to five points on 1-of-5 shooting. Against WMU, San Diego State held the two-time all-MAC selection to two points on 0-of-8 from the field. Versus Saint Mary's, the Aztecs limited Samhan to just 10 points and three rebounds. Against Utah, SDSU held the 7-1 Nevill to 12 points and eight rebounds and was mostly ineffective for most of the game at Cox Arena. At Huntsman Center, the Aztecs held Nevill to just 10 points and five rebounds. Lastly, in their most recent meeting with BYU, the Aztecs held Plaisted to just six points on 3-of-10 shooting and three rebounds in 24 minutes.

## Winning By Double Digits

The Aztecs' season-opening four wins, before its five-point win at USD, were all by double-digit margins. It was the first time since the 2002-03 season SDSU had accomplished such a feat. During their NIT season in 2002-03, the Aztecs won at Houston (71-61) and defeated Florida Atlantic (91-75), IPFW (74-58) and Loyola Marymount (79-69) at home. In fact, prior to its game at Houston, SDSU beat Hawai'i at home by 11 (60-49) making the win over the Lions its fifth in a row by at least 10 points. Before losing to Saint Mary's, the Aztecs had another run of their own as they had won three in a row by double figures.

## Contributions from the New Guys

Five of the top eight players when looking at minutes played and points scored are newcomers. Those five include Ryan Amoroso, Kelvin Davis, D.J. Gay, Tim Shelton and Billy White. Their contributions have certainly been felt early on. Between the five of them, they put up a triple double vs. Portland and at Fresno State. The quintet is responsible for 51.2 percent of the team's points, 51.2 percent of rebounds and 37.6 percent of assists.

## 74 is the Magic Number

Reaching the 74-point plateau seems to bring good fortune for the Aztecs as they have done so 44 times since the beginning of 2005-06, including nine times this year. In those 44 games, San Diego State has a record of 41-3. The 36 times SDSU didn't hit the 74-point mark the past two seasons, it wound up losing 21 of them. Coincidentally, 18 of the 36 occurrences have happened away from Cox Arena. Of the 10 times San Diego State didn't reach the magic number this year and won, seven were at home. The only time it happened away from Cox Arena and won was this year's opener vs. Liberty, at San Diego and at New Mexico.

## Freshmen in Starting Lineup

With junior point guard Richie Williams serving a team suspension earlier this year, true freshman D.J. Gay earned the starting nod in the season-opening game against Liberty. Tim Shelton, another true freshman, also found himself in the starting five as well vs. the Flames. Gay and Shelton became just the 10th and 11th freshmen to start a season opener under Steve Fisher. Only four times before had a freshman started a season opener under Fisher at SDSU and that oddly was Williams in 2005 at Alaska Fairbanks. Gay and Shelton joined elite company as only Juwan Howard, Jalen Rose, Chris Webber, Jerod Ward, Albert White, Bradley Jackson, Steve Sir, Brandon Heath and Williams have received the starting nod from Fisher as freshman to open a season.

## Locking Down

San Diego State has used a stifling defense for the better part of 40 minutes in each game this year. Dating back to last season, the Aztecs have held 41 of their last 46 opponents to 74 points or less and have held 26 of their last 44 opponents to less than 45 percent from the field.

Just this year alone, the Aztecs have held 26 of 30 opponents to 74 points or fewer and 12 to under 42.2 percent shooting. SDSU opponents are also averaging 15.3 turnovers a game.

As you might imagine, holding opponents to less than 40 percent from the floor has been a good sign for the Aztecs. San Diego State is 59-10 in the Steve Fisher era when the opponent is held below that field goal percentage.

## Making it Rain

The Aztecs have made at least six three-pointers 16 times this year. This season's squad became the first team in Steve Fisher's tenure to knock down at least six three-pointers in the first six games of a season after it made a season-best 11 at California. SDSU made it seven straight games until it only connected on four vs. Western Michigan.

## White's House Party

Billy White, making his first appearance at Cox Arena on Nov. 17 vs. UCSD, found himself in the starting lineup and did not disappoint. The Las Vegas native connected on his first nine shots before missing with under six minutes left in the game and went on to put back his missed attempt. For the game, White was a 10 of 11 from the field for a game- and career-high 20 points, had a game-high tying nine rebounds, a game- and career-best three blocked shots and one steal in a team-best 29 minutes.

White became the first Aztec to make at least 10 field goals in a game this season. His three blocks are also a 2007 team best. The freshman's 20-point performance was the first by an Aztec freshman since the 2004-05 season when Matt Thomas scored 20 vs. Air Force on Feb. 28, 2005. White's nine rebounds were also the most by an SDSU freshman since Kyle Spain grabbed 12 in the championship game of the MWC tournament vs. Wyoming on March 11, 2006.

White's 10-11 shooting exhibition ranks in a tie for fifth place on San Diego State's individual game records list for best field-goal percentage in a game (min. 6 FGM) during Steve Fisher's tenure.

## Ziegenfuss Honored Prior to BYU Game

Prior to its game vs. Brigham Young, San Diego State honored former Aztec men's basketball head coach and the late George Ziegenfuss. SDSU director of athletics Jeff Schemmel and Aztec head coach Steve Fisher presented the Ziegenfuss family, which included his wife, son and daughter-in-law, his two daughters and grandson, with a framed jersey and photos of the winningest coach in school history from his days at SDSU.

Back on Saturday, Dec. 1, Ziegenfuss passed away in San Diego. He was 90 years old. Ziegenfuss coached on Montezuma Mesa for 21 seasons and guided the Aztecs to the Division II quarterfinals twice and to the second round. Prior to moving into Division II, Ziegenfuss took SDSU to the NAIA tournament on two occasions, going as far as the third round. During his tenure, he posted a record of 316-229 (114-73 CCAA) and finished in first or second place in the California Collegiate Athletic Association 11 times.

## Increasing the Margin

In its three wins at the World Vision Classic, the Aztecs increased their margin of victory in each game. Against Liberty, SDSU won by 12 and then followed it with a 14-point victory over Portland. In the finale, the Aztecs dominated Fresno State and defeated the Bulldogs by 17. The feat marked the first time since the 1984-85 season that the Aztecs have increased their margin of victory in three consecutive non-conference wins. In '84-85, San Diego State beat Long Beach State on the road by two, 62-60, and followed it with neutral-site wins over McNeese State by six (91-85) and Southwest Louisiana by 13 (86-73).

## Aztecs Win World Vision Classic

The Aztecs won their sixth in-season event victory of the Division I era last weekend in Fresno Calif., with three wins in three days. San Diego State claimed tournament titles in the 1977 Cabrillo Classic (San Diego, Calif.), 1981 Cabrillo Classic (San Diego, Calif.), 1984 UNLV Roundup (Las Vegas, Nev.), the 1987 Holiday Bowl Classic (San Diego, Calif.), the 2006 Shamrock Invitational and this season's World Vision Classic.

## Aztecs Picked to Finish in Tie for Fourth

SDSU was been picked to finish in a tie for fourth place in the Mountain West Conference's 2007-08 preseason men's basketball media poll released Oct. 17, at the league's media day held at The Mtn. studios in Littleton, Colo.

The Aztecs, 2007 NIT participants, earned 128 points along with New Mexico (two first-place votes) and also received one first-place vote. Brigham Young was picked to win the league with 181 points and 15 first-place votes,

followed by UNLV (146 pts; 2 first-place votes) and Utah (142; 2).

After SDSU and New Mexico in sixth place was Wyoming (120), with TCU (7th, 58), Air Force (8th, 54) and Colorado State (9th, 33) rounding out the poll.

San Diego State junior forward Ryan Amoroso was the lone Aztec to garner individual accolades as he was voted as the league's top newcomer. Amoroso, a transfer from Marquette who sat out last season, becomes the second SDSU player in the last three years to earn that distinction. Recently departed senior Mohamed Abukar earned the same recognition heading into the 2005-06 campaign.

## Not So Newcomers

Even though they are classified as "newcomers," Ryan Amoroso and Kelvin Davis are anything but that. The pair make up for 33 percent of the team's newcomers, but it is their experience prior to arriving on Montezuma Mesa that would dispute their classification.

Amoroso played in 57 games, while making eight starts in his two-year stint at Marquette. During his time there, the Golden Eagles went 39-23 and advanced to the 2005 National Invitation Tournament and the 2006 NCAA Tournament. Davis, meanwhile, played in 24 games his freshman season at UTEP and was a part of a Miner team that 27-8 and earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament. And although he redshirted the following season, Davis was a part of a UTEP squad that ended the season at 21-10 and advanced to the second round of the NIT.

When compared to last year's five newcomers, only Lorrenzo Wade had prior Division I college experience. Wade saw action in 35 games at Louisville as a freshman and helped lead the Cardinals to a 33-5 record and a spot in the NCAA Final Four.

## Experience Counts

With only one senior on the roster some may think the Aztecs are young. Although there is some truth to that, the players San Diego State has returning are definitely battle-tested. The seven returners, along with the additions of Ryan Amoroso and Kelvin Davis, have all been a part of winning teams that have won at least 20 games and squads that have advanced to postseason play. Of the nine to advance to the postseason, seven have been to an NCAA Tournament and eight have been on teams to win at least one game in the postseason. Last year, SDSU only had eight players who had tasted the postseason and were part of 20-win ballclubs. Of the eight, only Lorrenzo Wade experienced winning a postseason game.



# Steve Fisher

**17th-Full Season • 9th Season at SDSU • Illinois State, 1967**

Steve Fisher has guided the Aztec basketball program to unparalleled heights. In eight seasons, he has taken a program that regularly missed out on the *conference* postseason tournament, to one which has become of the best programs on the West Coast and has the Aztecs knocking on the door of the elite teams in the country.

The best news for SDSU fans is that Fisher signed a new five-year contract prior to the start of the 2006-07 season that will keep him in San Diego for the foreseeable future.

When Fisher arrived on the scene in March of 1999, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were set. The Aztecs were expected to lose. The year before Fisher's arrival on campus, San Diego State won just four games.

Now those days are a distant memory. Fisher guided San Diego State to the NCAA Tournament in 2002, the postseason NIT in 2003, the 2006 NCAA Tournament and the NIT last season. In addition, the Aztecs have a solid core returning and an exciting incoming class, both freshmen and newcomers, that will keep SDSU competitive this season and seasons ahead.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene in the form of a news conference to introduce its new coach, Steve Fisher. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Steve Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching

career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Co., raised the bar even higher in the post-season. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, ranking him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to the championship of the NIT as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great recent turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led SDSU back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.



FRESNO, Calif. - San Diego State defeated Liberty, 62-50, in the opening game of the World Vision Classic.

SDSU shot 46.7 percent from the field and held Liberty to 34.0 percent shooting. The Aztecs out-rebounded Liberty, 32-28, thanks to a game-high seven rebounds from Billy White.

Kyle Spain led the Aztecs with 14 points, while White had 13 points and Lorenzo Wade had 12.

The game was close early as Liberty led 10-9 with 8:55 left in the first half following a layup by Rell Porter. SDSU then scored six straight points to take a 15-10 lead following a dunk by White with 5:59 until halftime.

San Diego State outscored Liberty 8-2 in the final two minutes to lead 27-19 at halftime. To open the second half, the Aztecs went on a 16-3 run to lead 43-22 with 12:50 left in the game. Ryan Amoroso, playing in his first game as an Aztec, contributed nine points and five rebounds in a starting role.

San Diego State maintained the double digit lead the rest of the game.

With freshmen D.J. Gay and Tim Shelton earning the starting nod, the duo became the 10th and 11th freshmen to start a season-opening game under Steve Fisher and the fifth and sixth under Fisher while at SDSU.

The win improves the Aztecs' record in season-opening games to 7-2 under Fisher and SDSU has now won three consecutive season openers for the first time since doing it in 1999-00, '00-01 and '01-02.

Portland shot 41 percent from the floor, but shot 21.1 percent (4-19) from long range.

FRESNO, Calif. - San Diego State used a swarming defense and had six players score in double figures as the Aztecs defeated Fresno State in the championship game of the World Vision Classic.

Ryan Amoroso scored a team- and Aztec career-high 19 points and was followed by Lorenzo Wade's second straight game with 18 points.

Kelvin Davis had his best game at SDSU with 15 points on 6 of 8 shooting from the field in a reserve role, while Kyle Spain added 12. True freshmen Tim Shelton and D.J. Gay rounded out the double-figure scorers with 11 and 10 points, respectively. Shelton also had a game- and career-high eight rebounds.

The Aztecs' six double-figure scorers marked the first time they accomplished the feat since the 2006-07 season when they did it against Campbell.

San Diego State shot 55 percent and hit on nine of 15 three-pointers while limiting the Bulldogs to 47 percent from the floor.

SDSU led from the opening tip and jumped out to a 25-8 lead nine minutes into the game. The Bulldogs went on a run to come within 10 at 27-17 with 8:14 to play in half.

San Diego State then extended its lead to 38-21 and led 48-33 at halftime. Fresno State got no closer than 12 points in the second half.

With the win, the Aztecs snapped a 12-game losing streak to Fresno State in Fresno and delivered the Bulldogs' worst defeat in the history of their five-year old arena, Save Mart Center. It was also Fresno State's largest margin of defeat in a regular-season home game since Dec. 3, 1994.

The Aztecs' third in win in as many days marked the first time in the school's Division I history in which they started consecutive seasons at 3-0.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State received a career game from freshman Billy White as the Aztecs defeated UC San Diego, 76-60, in their home opener at Cox Arena.

White, who earned his first career start, made his first nine baskets and finished the game connecting on 10-of-11 shots en route to a career-and game-best 20 points. The Las Vegas native also added a career-and game-high nine rebounds and a personal-best three blocked shots in 29 minutes.

The game was tight throughout the first half with the Tritons owning a slim 22-21 lead with 5:17 left in the half. But the Aztecs ended the first 20 minutes on a high note scoring 10 unanswered points and finishing the half on a 15-5 run to go into the locker room up 36-27.

At the beginning of the second half, UCSD cut the SDSU lead to three within the first 1:50, but the Tritons would not get any closer the rest of the way as the Aztecs cruised to their fourth straight double-digit win.

Joining White in the double-figure scoring column was Kelvin Davis, who tied his career high with 15 points, and Kyle Spain, who added 12.

Henry Patterson led UCSD with 16 points and nine rebounds, while Jordan Lawley contributed 13 points.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State traveled west to Jenny Craig Pavilion and handed San Diego a 69-64 defeat for the Aztecs' second win on the USD campus since 1975.

SDSU used hot shooting, especially from behind the arc, and a stifling pressure defense to down the Toreros for the second consecutive season and the sixth time in the last seven meetings.

Despite shooting 66.7 percent from the field, the Aztecs only held a four-point lead, 38-34, at halftime thanks to USD's Brandon Johnson's 16 first-half points.

Coming out of intermission, San Diego came out on fire, while SDSU struggled to get itself going. Five minutes into the half, the Aztecs' four-point lead turned into a four-point deficit, but San Diego State stayed close for the next few minutes before going on a 13-4 run to go ahead by nine with four minutes left in the game.

The Aztecs stretched their lead to 10 with 1:26 remaining in regulation before a combination of SDSU missed free throws and USD buckets cut the Aztecs' lead to four with 30 seconds left. Kyle Spain, however, put the game out of reach with his free throw and SDSU emerged with the win.

San Diego State, which had four players score in double figures, was led by Lorenzo Wade's 14 points and six assists. Spain added 11, while Ryan Amoroso and Kelvin Davis each had 10.

The Aztecs forced 25 Torero turnovers, 15 of which were SDSU steals and shot 60 percent from both the field and behind the arc.

Davis led all Aztecs with a career-high five three-point field goals and a personal-best 17 points.

ANAHEIM, Calif. - San Diego State was unable to overcome an 8-for-18 performance from the free-throw line as it fell to Saint Mary's, 69-64, at the 14th annual John R. Wooden Classic.

The Aztecs had four players score in double figures, enjoyed a five-point halftime lead, outbounced the Gaels and were even in turnovers. However, SDSU could not hit free throws down the stretch, which enabled SMC to pull away in the final minutes.

In the first half, the game was close with the Gaels owning a five-point advantage in the early going until SDSU went on a 17-4 run over the course of nearly 11 minutes. By the time SMC's Tron Smith earned his way to the free-throw line with 2:57 to go in the half, the Aztecs were up by eight points.

Smith spurred a late Saint Mary's 7-4 run with his four consecutive free throws cutting SDSU's lead to five, 29-24, at halftime. Smith finished the game shooting 10-of-14 from the line, en route to a game-high 20 points, in a reserve role.

At the beginning of the second half, the Aztecs increased their lead to eight on a pair of jumpers by Lorenzo Wade and Richie Williams and a free throw by Williams. Unfortunately for SDSU, SMC responded by going on an 11-0 run to go up 37-34.

San Diego State was unfazed and fought back to make the game close as neither team led by more than three points and the score was tied on five different occasions.

Despite taking a five-point lead on a layup by Smith, SDSU trimmed the deficit to one with 3:22 left. From that point on, however, the Aztecs went 0-for-5 from the line to let the game slip away.

Kelvin Davis led SDSU in scoring for the second straight game with 19 points. Wade and Williams finished with 11 points, while Billy White added 10.

TUCSON, Ariz. - San Diego State owned an advantage on the boards, made three times as many free throws, but could not overcome a cold shooting performance en route to a 74-58 defeat at the hands of 19th-ranked Arizona at the Fiesta Bowl Classic before 14,608 fans at the McKale Center.

Kyle Spain led all scorers with 20 points behind the strength of seven field goals and a 5-of-6 performance from the free-throw line. The junior also had a team-high tying eight rebounds and a team-season best six offensive boards.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State won its fifth straight overtime game and second in its last five games with its 64-56 decision over Utah.

SDSU improved to 3-0 in Mountain West action for the first time in school history and the first time in league play since the 1984-85 season.

Winning their third MWC game in as many tries was not easy for the Aztecs as they rallied from a double-digit deficit for the second game in a row, trailing by 11 in the first half and by 10 at halftime.

Utah limited San Diego State to just 33.3 percent shooting in the first half and allowed just 20 Aztec points, the fewest for SDSU in a half this year, to take a 30-20 lead at the end of one.

San Diego State, however, erased the Utes' lead at the start of the second half with a 14-0 run to move ahead 34-30. Utah responded over a five-minute period to take a 41-39 lead, but an 11-0 run by SDSU put the Aztecs up nine with 6:02 to play. 10-3

Like San Diego State, Utah made a run of its own to close out the half, outscoring the home team 10-3 to tie the score at 52. With the game on the line, SDSU's Lorenzo Wade turned the ball over with two seconds left in regulation to force overtime.

In overtime, both teams struggled initially, but after Kyle Spain knocked down a jumper and Utah's Tyler Kepkay followed suit, SDSU outscored the Utes 10-0 (8-8 FTs), before Johnnie Bryant hit a shot with 17 seconds left to provide the final margin.

Wade finished with a game-high 20 points and eight rebounds, while Spain added 19 and Billy White 11. Ryan Amoroso, who limited Utah center Luke Nevill to 12 points, chipped in with 10 points and a game-high eight boards.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State jumped to a 19-0 lead and held an opponent to 13 first-half points for the second time in the last four Mountain West Conference games as the Aztecs defeated Wyoming, 70-43.

The Cowboys missed their first eight field goal attempts and were held scoreless until the 11:25 mark when Brandon Ewing made the second of two free throws. Wyoming did not record its first field goal until Tyson Johnson's layup with 10:43 remaining in the half. By the time the Pokes made their second field goal of the game 8:01 later, the Aztecs had built a 23-point lead.

SDSU, which led 35-13 at halftime, was fueled in the first half by Ryan Amoroso, who had 12 points and six rebounds in the period. At one point, Amoroso scored nine straight points to give the home team a 16-0 lead.

The Aztecs continued their torrid pace coming out of the locker room and went on a 7-1 run to inflate their lead to 42-14. Down the stretch, the Cowboys would get no closer than 20 points as San Diego State never looked back on its way to its fourth consecutive conference win in as many tries.

Amoroso finished with a game-high 18 points and eight rebounds, while Kyle Spain added 15 points in just 22 minutes. Frontcourt teammate Lorenzo Wade, meanwhile, posted his first double-double of the season and third of his career with 11 points and a career-high 13 rebounds.

Lorenzo Wade led all scorers with 21 points and grabbed a team-high eight rebounds, while Kyle Spain added 15 points. Billy White ended the game with 13 points and had seven rebounds.

The Aztecs led by as many as nine points in the first half, but went cold after that connecting on just 3-of-13 shots in the final 8:39 to go into halftime with just a 28-27 lead. SDSU's lead at intermission was the first by any opponent at the Marriott Center since Dec. 30, 2006.

In the second half, Brigham Young went on a 6-0 run to open the period and took at 33-28 lead, until San Diego State went on its own 7-0 spurt fueled by White's three-point play to reclaim the lead.



Coming out of the huddle, Spain took a 15-foot jumper that was off, but rebounded his shot and misfired again in the key. Following a pair of Sam Burgess free throws, Spain inbounded the ball to Ryan Amoroso, who missed the game-tying three-pointer at the top of the key at the buzzer giving BYU the win.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. - The Aztecs received double-doubles from three different players, rallied from a second-half seven-point deficit and survived 14 Colorado State three-point field goals to emerge with an 83-82 victory at Moby Arena.

Ryan Amoroso had a season- and team-high 23 points to go along with 11 rebounds, Lorenzo Wade finished with 18 points and 10 boards and Billy White added 17 points and a career-best 10 rebounds to record SDSU's fifth game in school history with three players posting double-doubles. It was the first such occurrence since Jan. 30, 1982.

The Rams, who remain winless in conference play, came out firing and made seven three-pointers and received 14 points from Marcus Walker and 13 from Jesse Woodard to go into halftime ahead 37-35 despite SDSU shooting 48.4 percent from the floor.

CSU continued its hot shooting in the second half and increased its lead to seven points with just under 13 minutes to play thanks to 9-3 Ram spurt, forcing the Aztecs to call a timeout.

Colorado State held SDSU at bay until a Matt Thomas layup gave the Aztecs a 73-72 lead with 5:05 left in regulation. From there on out, the game would see three ties and six lead changes.

With under a minute to go, Kyle Spain was sent to the free-throw line and sank both attempts to put the Aztecs up 80-79. CSU's Walker, however, connected on his fifth three-pointer of the game giving the Rams an 82-80 advantage with 40 seconds left.

After an SDSU timeout, Wade had the ball at the top of the three-point arc with Ronnie Aguilar guarding him and nailed what would end up being the game winner with 21 seconds left in the game.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State used a 14-3 run early in the second half to break open a close game as the Aztecs went on to defeat Air Force, 49-38, at Cox Arena.

SDSU limited the Falcons to 31 percent shooting from the field and held them to its second-lowest scoring output of the season. Air Force's 38 points were also the fewest San Diego State has given up in a Mountain West Conference game and was the fewest points scored in arena history.

The game was slow to start with the Aztecs leading 4-0 until the Falcons' Tim Anderson made a three-pointer at the 13:21 mark to record the team's first field goal and points of the contest.

The entire first half was a defensive battle with both teams combining to go 13 of 41 from the field (31.7 percent), including 1-for-12 from behind the arc. At the end of one period, the Aztecs held onto a 17-16 lead.

In the second half after Air Force jumped ahead, 21-19, the Falcons were called for an intentional foul sending Lorenzo Wade to the free throw line plus possession of the ball. Wade's two free throws and a Ryan Amoroso jumper on the ensuing possession ignited a 14-3 run giving the Aztecs a 33-24 cushion with 11:20 remaining in the game.

The Falcons would not get closer than four points the rest of the way and SDSU never relinquish its lead as it ballooned to 15 at one point, to finish with the 11-point decision.

Wade led all scorers with 14 points and Amoroso contributed a game- and career-high 12 rebounds, while adding six points.

FORT WORTH, Texas - In its first game without suspended junior Kyle Spain, San Diego State lost to TCU for the first time since 1998, 68-62, at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum.

The Aztecs received a near-flawless performance from junior Ryan Amoroso as he went 7-of-8 from the floor with his only miss being from three-point distance and 6-for-8 from the free-throw line en route to a game-high 20 points. He also added six rebounds, two assists and two steals in 37 minutes. Classmate Kelvin Davis, who started in place of Spain, contributed 15 points and made a trio of three pointers.

In the first half, SDSU enjoyed a lead as big as seven points, but an 8-2 run by the Horned Frogs in the final 3:28 knotted the score at 25 at the halftime break.

TCU continued its run out of intermission by going on a 12-4 spurt in the first five minutes of the second half to take a 37-29 lead. The Aztecs countered with a three by D.J. Gay and a jumper by Amoroso to cut their deficit to three, something they would do eight more times down the stretch. In addition to that, SDSU trimmed the TCU lead to two points or less eight times as well, with the Aztecs unable to take the lead at any point in the final 11:53.

For the game, the Horned Frogs outrebounded San Diego State, 38-22, outscored the Aztecs in the paint, 26-18, had more second-chance points (14-7) and scored 10 fastbreak points to SDSU's two.

TCU had four players score in double figures led by Henry Salter's 18 points.

The Lobos led wire-to-wire thanks mainly to their three-point shooting ability. New Mexico made its first five three-point attempts and seven of its first nine baskets came from behind the arc to open up a double-digit lead three times.

Wade and Amoroso, however, kept the Aztecs in the game single-handily as the two combined for 24 points on 7-of-13 shooting, taking SDSU into the locker room only trailing by four, 37-33.

For the Cowboys, Johnson scored a team-high 18 points and had six rebounds, while Dermody was shut out in the second half as he finished with 14 points. Gay ended with 18 points and was joined in double figures by Billy White's 16. Junior Lorenzo Wade nearly posted a triple-double with eight points, eight rebounds and a career-best 11 assists.

Thomas finished with five points and three rebounds, while Lamb chipped in with season highs of two points and four rebounds.

USAFA, Colo. - San Diego State could not overcome 50 percent shooting from the free-throw line and 33.3 percent from behind the arc as it fell, 46-43, to Air Force in the regular-season finale for both teams at Clune Arena.

The Aztecs received a game-high 17 points on the strength of five three-pointers from D.J. Gay, but got little else in the scoring column from their other four starters. Between Lorenzo Wade, Billy White, Ryan Amoroso and Richie Williams, the starting quartet combined for just 20 points on 6-of-27 from the floor (22.2 percent).

From the outset, it was all Falcons as they scored the first seven points of the game and limited SDSU to just two free throws until a dunk by Wade at the 10:52 mark snapped the Aztecs' field-goal drought. From that point forward, San Diego State went on a 6-2 run to take what would be its only lead of the game at 10-9 with 8:22 remaining in the first half. Air Force wound up outscoring the Aztecs 19-8 in the final eight minutes to take a nine-point lead into halftime.

Coming out of intermission, SDSU tallied the first eight points and used an 11-2 spurt to tie the game at 29. The all-square score was short lived as Air Force retook the lead after an Andrew Henke free throw and never looked back as the Falcons never allowed the Aztecs get closer than two points the rest of the way.

Despite Air Force never relinquishing the lead, the Falcons withstood a fierce SDSU attack in the final minutes and survived a Wade three-pointer with the Aztecs down two with less than three seconds remaining. Air Force tacked on a free throw with one second left to provide the final margin.
