

First-Place Aztecs Go For 10th-Straight Victory Saturday At Air Force

► **When & Where:** Saturday, Jan. 21, 2012, Clune Arena (5,858), USAF Academy, Colo., Noon MT/11 a.m. PT.
► **Live Media:** Live audio with Chris Ello, as well as live stats, will be available on goaztecs.com.

► **SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the seventh year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 337-241 in 20 seasons, while she is 256-176 in her 15 campaigns at SDSU.

► **Air Force Head Coach Andrea Williams:** Williams is in her second season as head coach of the Falcons. She has compiled a school record of 14-35 and owns a career mark of 26-70 in four years.

► **Series History:** San Diego State has dominated the series, sporting a 22-6 all-time record against Air Force. The two squads, however, split last year's two meetings with the home team coming out ahead in both. SDSU won the most recent matchup in San Diego, 68-50, on Feb. 19, 2011.

NEWS & NOTABLES

■ The only unbeaten in Mountain West Conference play, the first-place San Diego State women's basketball team competes in its third consecutive Saturday road outing when it heads to Colorado to take on Air Force, beginning at Noon MT at Clune Arena.

■ The Aztecs have tied their best start in the league's 13-year history, as the 2009-10 SDSU squad also went 3-0. The last time the team began a conference campaign at 4-0 was 1997, when the school was a member of the WAC and won its first seven outings.

■ With Wednesday's ninth-straight victory, San Diego State owns the program's longest win streak in 15 years. The streak is the longest since the 1996-97 squad won 11 in a row before falling the NAAs.

■ SDSU's nine-game winning streak ties as the fifth-longest active streak in the nation. The four schools with longer streaks are all ranked in the top 12 nationally in No. 1 Baylor (18), No. 2 Notre Dame (15), No. 12 Green Bay (15) and No. 4 Stanford (12).

■ SDSU's nine-game win streak accounts for more victories than five of the other seven Mountain West teams have for the entire season. The streak is also the longest by an MWC squad by three victories.

■ The Aztecs have exceeded their win total from all of last season when they ended up with a 12-17 overall record. SDSU has 13 victories for the fourth time in the last five years after being able to reach that mark only once in the previous 10 seasons (13 wins in 2000-01).

■ SDSU has kept an opponent to less than 30 points in 13 of the last 14 halves over the last seven contests. Only CSU Bakersfield has broken the barrier, notching 37 in the second half of the Aztecs' 74-60 win.

■ New Mexico became San Diego State's seventh opponent to fail to score at least 50 points. The Aztecs moved past the Lobos into first place in the league in scoring defense, allowing just 54.3 points a contest.

■ SDSU was not outrebounded for the 15th time in 17 outings with a slight +2 advantage against UNM. The team owns a +8.5 season rebounding margin.

LAST TIME OUT

The San Diego State women's basketball team rolled to a 77-47 victory Wednesday over visiting New Mexico to improve to 3-0 in league action and remain the only unbeaten squad in Mountain West play. The win was also the Aztecs' ninth in a row to give the program its' longest such streak since 1997, and allowed them to surpass last season's victory total with a 13-4 overall record. The Lobos, meanwhile, dropped to 6-11 on the year and 0-3 in the MWC.

SDSU had four players score in double-figures, including junior **Courtney Clements (Long Beach, Calif.)**, who notched a game-high 19 points on 7-of-11 shooting to go with a season-high three steals. Redshirt sophomore **Kiyana Stamps (Moreno Valley, Calif.)** was 4-for-7 from beyond the arc and finished with 14 points, while junior **Malia Nahinu (Hayward, Calif.)** also ended up with 14 as well as a team-best five rebounds. Freshman Ahjalee Harvey (**Mountain View, Calif.**) was the fourth Aztec in double-figure points with 10 and junior **Chelsea Hopkins (Las Vegas, Nev.)** contributed seven assists and three steals in 21 minutes.

The Lobos started the evening off with a 5-0 run on a jumper off the glass from Caroline Durbin and a 3-pointer from the right angle by Porche Torrance. San Diego State answered with a 5-0 run of its own to tie the game and the squads were also knotted at 7-7 at the 16:31 mark of the first half.

From there, the Aztecs scored seven unanswered points, including five by Clements, to move into a lead that they would never end up relinquishing. New Mexico cut it to as few as four points at 18-14 on a triple from Lauren Taylor, but SDSU took advantage of the visitors' 13 first-half turnovers and went into the break up by 17 at 40-23.

The Aztecs came out of the locker room with the hot hand shooting, draining five of their first six shots to jump ahead by 24 points at 51-27. The Lobos would get that down to as few as 18 points with 8:05 left in the game, but San Diego State outscored them 17-6 over the final six minutes to secure the 77-47 victory.

OTHER UNM POSTGAME NOTES

- SDSU shot above 50 percent from the field for the third time, converting on a season-high clip of 51.7.
- The Aztecs have scored more than 70 points nine times in 2011-12, a figure they only reached on five occasions a year ago, including just once in the final 18 contests.
- SDSU's 77 points marked the first time the Lobos have given up more than 70 points this season (prev. high 69 vs. Texas Tech) and were over 22 points above their average allowed entering the contest.
- SDSU has trailed at some point during eight of its 13 victories including each of the last four. The team, however, has been down by more than two points in the second half only once in the 13 wins with that being the eight-point deficit vs. Cal Poly.
- The Aztecs matched their season high for steals with 15, which they also tallied earlier this month against Longwood. San Diego State needs just 28 more steals to surpass last year's 29-game total of 182.

HANG TEN

The Aztecs turned the ball over just 10 times on Wednesday, including only three in the second half.

The 10 giveaways are a season low by two and the fewest San Diego State has committed in a single outing since also having 10 in a rout of visiting Navy on Dec. 18, 2007.

SDSU continues to lead the league in season turnover margin at +1.7 and have eclipsed the 20-turnover mark in just three contests with two those being victories.

Last season, the Aztecs were dead last in the league in that category at -3.83, and reached the 20-turnover barrier 11 times.

WINNING BIG

After not having any wins of 25 or more points in 2010-11, San Diego State already has five this year including on Wednesday when it defeated the Lobos by 30 points. That margin was the largest by the Aztecs in the series in the last 40 meetings.

Just three of the team's 13 wins are by a margin of less than 10 points and two are by more than 40 points. Seven of last year's 12 victories were by fewer than 10 points.

SDSU ranks first by a mile in the Mountain West in scoring margin at +13.1, a category that it was 44th in nationally to start the week.

NINE IS FINE

After opening the campaign with three consecutive victories and four wins in its first five chances, San Diego State saw its record drop to .500 with three straight losses.

Since then, however, the Aztecs have rebounded with their current nine-

game win streak. Above is an average statistical comparison of SDSU during its three-game losing streak and its current winning streak.

SCORE IT A TRIPLE

The team had an outstanding performance from beyond the arc against New Mexico, matching its season high for both 3-pointers made and percentage with a 9-for-18 effort.

On the opposite side, the Lobos (are just the second Aztec foe to convert at least 50 percent of their 3-point attempts, joining UCLA, which made 4-of-7. Between those two outings, opponents were only hitting at 22.8 clip, helping SDSU lead the MW in season 3-point percentage defense at 26.5.

Individually, junior Courtney Clements had three of those nine triples, moving her into 10th in the Aztec record book in 3-pointers made (76) and 11th in attempts (221).

ON THE BOARDS

With the fact that SDSU shot a season-high 51.7 percent from the field, it's not surprising that it also pulled down a season-low 30 rebounds against UNM.

The Aztecs still held a +2 advantage on the glass, marking the 15th time in 17 contests that they have not been outrebounded. SDSU remains first in the Mountain West and began the week 16th nationally in season rebounding margin at +8.5. The squad is also No. 1 in the league in both offensive boards (17.5/g) and offensive rebounding percentage (44.5).

San Diego State has eclipsed the 40-rebound mark 13 times in the 17 games, a figure it reached on only eight occasions in 29 outings in 2010-11. The team has outrebounded its opponent by more than 10 eight times, including a high of +25 vs. Penn and +20 at Hawaii.

Last season, the Aztecs held an advantage on the boards 16 times, accounting for eight of the 12 wins.

MASTER D

In the current nine-game win streak, Aztec opponents are averaging just 50.3 points per game and have failed to score more than 50 points on five occasions. Foes have also combined to shoot 32.0 percent from the field and when you take out Cal Poly, which shot 50 percent, teams are making only 29.7 percent of their attempts.

SDSU put together a school-record three-game streak of holding an opponent to less than 40 points with UNCG managing only 29 and both Penn and Longwood notching 37. The Aztecs have also held an opponent to less than 30 points in a half in 13 of their last 14 chances over a seven-game period.

On the year, SDSU has kept opposing squads to under 50 points seven times in 17 games leading to a 54.3 mark in scoring defense, which is now first in the league and put them in the top 40 nationally to start the week. Furthermore, foes have been unable to convert more than 40 percent of their shots in 13 of the 17 games to help the Aztecs rank in the top 25 nationally at 34.0.

CONFERENCE SCORING LEADER

With 39 points in the last two games, junior Courtney Clements maintained her spot as the conference's lead-

ing scorer at 16.5 points per contest. She has five, 20-point scoring outings and has at least 10 points in 15 of 17 games.

WITH THE ASSIST

For the 11th time in 2011-12, Aztec point guard Chelsea Hopkins had six or more assists, contributing seven in the win against New Mexico.

Hopkins continues to lead the league by a wide margin in assists per game (5.9), finishing at exactly the century mark against the Lobos. Her 100 helpers are 25 more than any other conference player, including UNLV's Mia Bell, who is in second place with 75 despite playing in two more games and averaging seven and a half more minutes per outing.

Hopkins has tallied 69 assists (7.7/g) during the team's current nine-game win streak, including seven outings with seven or more and a career-best of 12 at UC Irvine. The last nine efforts came after she was shutout in that category in back-to-back contests against Washington State and USD.

An Aztec has led the league in assists or assists average each of the last three seasons and four of the last five years.

MAKING THE MOST OF IT

Since logging their first career starts vs. USD and UC Irvine respectively, redshirt sophomore Kiyana Stamps and junior Malia Nahinu have been keys to the Aztecs' success in multiple areas.

Over the last nine outings, Stamps has scored in double-figures eight times (13.9 ppg.) after totaling only 57 points (7.1 ppg.) in the eight games prior. She has also contributed 15 steals, shot over 41 percent from the field, including 40.9 percent from beyond the arc, and hauled in 39 rebounds.

In her nine career starts, Nahinu has five double-figure scoring games after tallying none in her previous 25 outings as an Aztec. She has shot above 51 percent from the field, averaged 5.7 rebounds a game and chipped in 21 blocked shots.

San Diego State managed two-straight campaigns with at least 10 home wins with a 15-1 mark in 2008-09, followed by a 12-2 record in 2010-11.

WITH A WIN

An SDSU victory over Air Force will mean:

- SDSU begins a Mountain West campaign 4-0 for the time in the 13-year history of the conference.
- SDSU starts its league schedule with four straight wins for the first time since the 1997 team won seven in a row in the WAC.
- SDSU claims its 10th consecutive victory, the program's longest win streak since 1997, when it won 11 in a row from Jan. 30 to March 8.
- SDSU put together at least a 10-game win streak in the same season for the seventh time in program history (school record is 18 in 1995).
- SDSU improves to 23-6 all-time vs. Air Force, including an 11-4 mark in USAF Academy, Colo.
- SDSU improves to 6-3 vs. teams that it also faced last year.

AIR FORCE NOTES

Air Force enters this Saturday's game with a 5-13 record and are 0-3 in conference action ... The Falcons have lost four straight and nine of the last 10 including a 98-36 loss this past Wednesday at Wyoming ... Air Force has two players averaging in double-figure scoring, including Alicia Leipprandt, who has a pair of 30-point outings to her credit and ranks fourth in the conference with 14.5 points per game ... Dymond James averages 12.1 points and a team-best 6.9 rebounds an outing, while Camille Thompson has 33 assists and Megan O'Neil has 21 blocks ... The Falcons have just 28 3-pointers on the year, ranking dead last in the nation in that category entering this week ... Air Force is also 8th in the league in eight other categories, including scoring defense (70.8 ppg.) and field-goal percentage (34.2) ... The Falcons, however, defeated the Aztecs last year at Clune Arena, 61-58 ... Air Force was 9-22 a year ago and 3-13 in league action to place ninth, but returns four starters.

RECEIVING VOTES

SDSU received votes in both national top-25 polls Nov. 21-22 after opening the season with a 3-1 mark, including an upset of then No. 18 DePaul. The Aztecs garnered 13 votes in the Associated Press top-25 poll,

while they also received one vote in the *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches poll.

The last time San Diego State received votes in either poll was on Nov. 22, 2010, in the AP Top 25. The Aztecs were last listed in both polls in the same week during the 2010-11 preseason.

SDSU was last ranked in the top 25 in 2010, when it finished 20th in the final *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches poll. It marked the first time the Aztecs had been ranked in the final coaches poll in program history.

BEATING RANKED FOES

San Diego State's win over No. 18/18 DePaul on Nov. 18 is the program's first vs. a ranked foe since 2010, when it knocked off No. 10 West Virginia in the NCAA Second Round.

Overall, the victory against the Blue Demons is the Aztecs' sixth against a top-25 squad over the last four seasons. SDSU wins have come against Texas twice when the Longhorns were ranked No. 4 in 2008, and again when they were the No. 17 team on their home floor in 2010. League foes New Mexico (No. 23 - 2009) and TCU (No. 23 - 2010) have also been upset.

Prior to the win over Texas in December 2008, San Diego State had not beaten a ranked team since Dec. 28, 1994, when it handed No. 6 Alabama a 79-76 loss in a tournament held at St. John's in Jamaica, N.Y.

OTHER SEASON NOTES

- With its wins over UAPB and No. 18 DePaul, SDSU scored over 80 points in back-to-back outings for the first time since scoring 85 in consecutive wins over Montana State and Loyola Marymont in Dec. 2008.
- The team did not surpass the 80-point barrier all of last season and that streak dates back to a 87-52 win over Air Force on March 6, 2010.
- The Aztecs' 43-point margin of victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff is SDSU's largest margin of victory since defeating Air Force by 51 in 2009.
- SDSU's 86 points vs. UAPB are the most in a season-opening game since scoring 101 against McNeese State on Nov. 23, 1990 (101-55 victory). The 86 points are the most in any game since it lit up Air Force for 87 in the 2010 regular-season finale.
- The Aztecs claimed the tournament title at the Jack In the Box Rainbow Wahine Classic in Honolulu, Nov. 18-20. It is the first time SDSU has won a non-conference event since going 2-0 at its own San Diego Surf 'N Slam in 2009.
- Courtney Clements and Kiyana Stamps, were named to the six-player all-tournament squad at the Rainbow Wahine Classic. Clements was tabbed the tournament MVP, becoming the first Aztec so honored since 2010.
- Three different Aztecs have nabbed Mountain West Player of the Week honors this year with Courtney Clements doing so Nov. 21, Malia Nahinu receiving the honor Dec. 19, and Chelsea Hopkins picking up accolades on Jan. 16.
- UNCG's 29 points marks the sixth time in program history that an SDSU opponent has failed to reach the 30-mark. It is the fewest points scored against SDSU since Air Force managed 28 on Jan. 7, 2009.

■ San Diego State won its second non-conference tournament title in as many chances by going 2-0 at the seventh annual Surf 'N Slam. Aztecs Courtney Clements and Kiyana Stamps were both named all-tournament for the second time in 2011-12, joining MVP Chelsea Hopkins.

■ After going 5-2 this year, SDSU improved its overall record during the month of December to 27-8 since 2006.

■ For the first time in school history, San Diego State held an opponent to less than 40 points in three consecutive games. The Aztecs gave up 37 to both Longwood and Penn after allowing only 29 vs. UNCG.

SDSU had kept a foe to under 40 points in back-to-back outings three times previously in 1981, 1980 and 1978.

■ SDSU's 10 regular-season non-conference victories are the program's most since the 1995-96 squad also won 10. With the shortened league schedule, the Aztecs played 14 non-conference outings, which are their most since the 1990-91 team competed in 15.

■ SDSU notched its first-ever overtime victory in a Mountain West Conference game on Jan. 14, at UNLV. The team had been 0-2 in that category previously.

■ Ten different Aztecs have scored at least 10 points at least once this season. That is especially notable considering there are 13 players on the active roster and only seven different student-athletes reached the 10-point barrier in 29 outings a year ago.

PRESEASON POINTS

For the fourth straight season, the San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish in the top two in the Mountain West in 2012, earning its second consecutive second-place selection and third in the last four years in a vote by the league's eight head coaches and select media members.

The preseason poll, which was released Oct. 11, at the conference's annual media day in Denver, Colo., had the Aztecs with 127 total points and seven of the 20 first-place votes.

TCU was tabbed as the preseason favorite with 136 points and 12 first-place votes. Colorado State was selected third behind the Aztecs, earning the final first place vote, and was followed by New Mexico, UNLV, Wyoming, Air Force and newcomer Boise State.

INDIVIDUAL ACCOLADES

For the second campaign in a row, San Diego State swept both the preseason newcomer and freshman of the year awards, which were released at the league's annual media day in October.

Junior guard Chelsea Hopkins was chosen as the Mountain West Newcomer of the Year, following in the footsteps of current teammate Courtney Clements and recent graduate Jessika Bradley, who earned the honor both in the preseason and at the end of the year in 2010 and 2011.

SDSU's **Chairese Culberson (Oakland, Calif.)** was chosen as the conference's top freshman, after leading Berkeley High School to a runner-up performance at the California state Division I tournament this past

March. The 6-0 forward was the top ranked recruit in the Mountain West by *HoopGurlz*, receiving a rating of 46th overall and seventh at the wing position.

SCURRY TO REDSHIRT

Head coach Beth Burns announced last month that freshman forward **Deajanae Scurry (Los Angeles, Calif.)** will redshirt the upcoming 2011-12 season.

Scurry will continue to practice with the Aztecs, but will not compete in any games in her first year on campus.

NOTING THIS YEAR'S TEAM

■ San Diego State returns two starters and six other letterwinners from last year's squad. Only three Aztecs had played more than one season in the Red & Black entering 2011-12.

■ Of the 15 student-athletes on this year's roster, seven players did not compete for San Diego State a year ago. Two of the seven were on campus, but junior Chelsea Hopkins sat out after transferring from Duke and red-shirt sophomore Kiyana Stamps missed part of the campaign due to injury and the other half to concentrate on academics. Stamps competed in only two games in 2009-10 after tearing her ACL.

■ The Aztecs' roster boasts five true freshmen, including four post players in forwards **Erimma Amarikwa (Vacaville, Calif.)**, **Chairese Culberson**, **Khristina Hunter (Fairfield, Calif.)** and **Deajanae Scurry** to go with guard Ahjalee Harvey. The last time SDSU had five true freshman on its roster was 2008-09, when the squad also had five.

■ Entering this season, five players accounted for 280 of the 338 total career games played (82.8 percent) in an Aztec uniform by the entire SDSU 2011-12 roster.

AZTECS SIGN PAIR TO NLI's

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Nov. 9, of forward **Aleiah Brandon (Corona, Calif.)** and point guard **Tia Levi-Dixon (San Diego, Calif.)** to National Letters of Intent.

The two high school seniors will join the Aztecs in 2012.

10-11 RECRUITING CLASS EARNS PRAISE

San Diego State's 2010-11 recruiting class was rated best in the Mountain West and 18th nationally according to *Espn.com's* *HoopGurlz* rankings, which are based solely on high school prospect signings. The Aztecs are also the only team in a "non-automatic BCS qualifying" conference rated in the top 30.

The 2010-11 recruiting class included three, four-star recruits according to *HoopGurlz*, including forward Chairese Culberson, who was the No. 7 rated wing and 46th overall, forward Deajanae Scurry (No. 31 forward) and point guard Ahjalee Harvey (No. 32 point guard).

Forwards Khristina Hunter and Erimma Amarikwa both received three stars and round out the class.

A year ago, San Diego State's 2010 recruiting class was ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West and 31st nationally, while the Aztecs did not appear in the websites rankings in either 2008 or 2009.

AZTECS OVERSEAS

San Diego State currently has five of its recent stand-outs playing professionally overseas. Guard Jené Morris (Girona) and forward Jessica Bradley (Arixil) both compete in Spain, while guard Quenese Davis (PAOK) plays in Greece and center Paris Johnson (Gorzow Wlkp.) is in Poland. Quenese's younger sister, Coco, also recently joined a team in Israel.

A year ago, Morris was in both Poland and Israel after playing for the Indiana Fever, who made her the first-ever Aztec to be selected in the WNBA Draft (first round/11th pick overall) in 2010. Davis, the Aztecs' all-time career assists leader, competed professionally in Austria and was named the *Eurobasket.com* All-Austrian AWBL Guard of the Year with the Flying Foxes.

THE NEW LEAGUE LOOK

For the first time since TCU joined the conference in 2005, the Mountain West will have a new look this season.

Gone are BYU and Utah, who claimed the league regular-season and tournament titles a year ago, while Boise State is the newcomer after participating in the Western Athletic Conference.

The Aztecs will now have just 14 league games instead of 16, meaning the MW regular-season slate will start a week later in January and finish up three days earlier in late February. San Diego State will have additional days to prepare for the Mountain West Championships, which will be one day shorter and feature four quarterfinal games on Wednesday, before the semifinals on Friday and the finale on Saturday.

AZTECS ON TV

The Aztecs will have at least 10 of its contests televised in 2011-12, with seven regular-season outings slated for The Mtn. and two contests scheduled to be shown on CBS College Sports Network. In addition, three of The Mtn. games will also be broadcast locally on Channel 4 San Diego and the opening contests of the 2012 Mountain West Conference Championships in Las Vegas next March will be carried on The Mtn.

LISTEN/WATCH LIVE

For the 11th straight year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of nearly every regular season game (home and away) over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU alum Chris Ello will have the play-by-play duties both at home and on the road for the fifth straight season.

Again in 2011-12, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of certain televised games, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Viejas Arena on www.goaztecs.com.

BURNS TABBED WBCA SECRETARY

This past July, San Diego State head coach Beth Burns was appointed as the secretary of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Board of Directors' Executive Committee. Burns previously served as a Division I at-large representative on the organization's

23-member board the last two years.

SDSU HEAD COACH BETH BURNS

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005, and enters the seventh season of her second stint with the Aztecs.

Most recently, Burns has taken the program to new heights, including a trip to the 2010 NCAA Sweet Sixteen, back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances (2009, 2010) and both a conference regular-season (2009) and tournament title (2010).

The Aztecs advanced to three straight Mountain West Conference championship games from 2008-10, after not winning one tournament game in the league's first eight years of existence. SDSU has scored five wins over top-25 foes, including two vs. teams in the top 10 in No. 4 Texas and No. 10 West Virginia.

Including 2010-11, SDSU has recorded at least 12 victories in five consecutive seasons with Burns at the helm, highlighted by back-to-back campaigns with at least 23 victories.

In her first stint as Aztec head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular season titles.

A four-time conference coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 20-year overall head coaching record of 337-241, while her school record stands at 256-176 over 14 seasons.

Last fall, Burns signed a five-year contract extension to stay as SDSU's head coach through the 2014-15 campaign.

SAN DIEGO - For the fourth time in the last five years, the San Diego State women's basketball team started the season off on the right foot, defeating visiting Arkansas-Pine Bluff 86-43 at Viejas Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs moved to 1-0 overall, while the Golden Lions dropped to 0-2, following the first-ever meeting between the two sides.

SDSU had three players finish with double-figure points, including leading scorer Courtney Clements, who notched 21 points on 7-for-13 shooting for her third career 20-point outing as an Aztec. Redshirt sophomore Kiyana Stamps added 17 points in her first contest since 2009, while junior co-captain Gabrielle Clark contributed a career-high 12 points by making four of her seven attempts.

Forward Chairese Culberson hauled in a team-high nine rebounds and point guard Ahjalee Harvey tallied seven assists in their collegiate debuts. Sophomore Melissa Sweat led the defensive effort with four of the Aztecs' 14 steals on the night.

San Diego State never trailed in the game, going up by 13 points at the 12:29 mark of the first half. The Lady Lions used a pair of triples from Markita Quarles and a jumper from Jenise Gentry to cut their deficit down to only seven at 18-11, but the Aztecs then went on a 14-1 run to build a 20-point advantage before settling for a 41-24 lead at the break.

Coming out of the locker room, the UAPB offense continued to struggle as it did not record a field goal until six and a half minutes into the second half on a 3-pointer by Lakendra Marsh at 52-28. The Aztecs would eventually lead by as many as 43 and outscored the visitors 45-19 in the final 20 minutes to secure the 86-43 season-opening win.

SDSU shot over 41 percent from the field, made nine 3-pointers and posted a phenomenal 91.3 free-throw percentage (21-for-23). On the flip side, UAPB shot just 22.2 percent for the game, converting only five second-half field goals.

HONOLULU - The San Diego State women's basketball team went on a 10-0 run with just over five minutes remaining in the game to turn a two-point contest into a 12-point advantage and went on to claim a 82-74 upset victory over 18th-ranked DePaul in the first game of the Jack In The Box Rainbow Wahine Classic. The win was the Aztecs' sixth over a top-25 team in the last four seasons and improved them to 2-0 overall in 2011-12, while the Blue Demons dropped to 2-1.

The Aztecs had four players score in double-figures, led by junior Courtney Clements, who eclipsed the 20-point mark for the second consecutive outing with 25, including 13 in the first half. Sophomore Kiyana Stamps continued to give the Aztecs an offensive punch off the bench with 17 points for the second game in a row. Sophomore Melissa Sweat and freshman Chairese Culberson both chipped in career highs with 14 and 10 points respectively.

Sweat was a perfect 3-for-3 from beyond the arc and Culberson hauled in nine boards to fall just one rebound short of a double-double. Clements tied a career high with eight rebounds, junior Chelsea Hopkins had seven assists and senior Kalena Tutt added three steals.

After the game was tied three times in the first four minutes, the Aztecs utilized a three-point play from Sweat to spark a 12-0 run at 18-6. DePaul eventually caught up with the help of three triples to knot the contest at 27 points apiece. The Blue Demons took the lead on the pair of free throws, but the Aztecs managed to even the score heading into the locker room at 33-33.

The two sides traded free throws coming out of the break, before SDSU's Culberson made a jumper and hit a pair at the line to give the team a lead they would never end up relinquishing. The Aztecs had two nine-point advantages, but saw that cut down to only a pair with 5:50 remaining in the game.

From there, San Diego State started a 10-0 run with baskets by four different players to go up by 12 and go on to secure an eight-point upset victory 82-74.

The Aztecs attempted just one free throw in the first half, but tried 29 in the second half to go 24-for-30 (80.0 percent) at the stripe. SDSU owned a 47-38 advantage on the boards and hit six 3-pointers, which was two more than a DePaul squad that had a combined 25 in its opening two contests this season.

Day then made both free throws to secure the 59-58 victory as the Aztecs' full-court baseball pass was intercepted to end the game.

Despite the loss, SDSU got another standout offensive performance from junior Courtney Clements, who surpassed the 20-point mark for the third time in four outings this season. Clements was 5-for-6 from beyond the arc and 8-for-13 from the field to end up with 21 of the team's 58 points. She was the only Aztec in double-figures as Stamps had eight points and Tutt contributed seven to go with her SDSU-best seven rebounds.

The match-up was tied twice within the first three minutes before Portland notched three consecutive lay-ups over a span of just over a minute to take a six-point lead at 10-4. San Diego State responded with three baskets by Clements, including a lay-up, a jumper and a 3-pointer out of the left corner to put the team up by one at 11-10.

After three lead changes and another tie, the Aztec offense went scoreless for nearly five and a half minutes as the Pilots built a 21-14 lead. A Hopkins basket ended the draught and SDSU ended up catching up by the break at 27-27.

Coming out of the locker room, San Diego State fell behind by three points on three occasions within the first four minutes and that deficit grew to nine at 45-36 on a 3-pointer and a last-second lay-up by Pilot Cassandra Brown. A basket by Sajoyia Griffin at the 11:35 mark started a brief 4-0 run as the Aztecs were within five points three times before being behind by eight heading into the final five minutes of the contest.

SDSU shot just 36.2 percent from the field, while committing 17 turnovers. Portland shot just slightly better and made 18-of-23 free throws, while owning just a slight plus-one advantage on the boards.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team had three players notch career highs in scoring to stay perfect at home with a 63-51 victory over visiting Washington at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs, who are receiving votes in both national top-25 polls, improved to 4-1 overall, while the Huskies dropped to 3-2 on the year following the first-ever meeting between the two sides.

Four of the five SDSU starters scored in double-figures including three with career-high point totals. Freshman Chairese Culberson notched a team-high 14 points, including her first career 3-pointer, to go with four of the team's 13 steals. Senior Kalena Tutt had a career-high 13 points and six rebounds, while junior Chelsea Hopkins posted career bests in both points (12) and rebounds (7) and also recorded five assists and three steals in 27 minutes of action. Junior Courtney Clements was the fourth Aztec with at least 10 points, contributing 11 for her fifth consecutive double-figure scoring outing in as many games this season.

San Diego State trailed just twice, giving up the opening basket to UW's Regina Rogers and falling behind by one point on a lay-up at the 17:32 mark of the first half at 4-3. The Aztecs took the lead on a pair of Tutt free throws and had a two possession advantage until going on a 13-5 run to jump ahead by double figures for the first time at 26-16. Following a timeout, the Huskies trimmed their deficit to eight three times, including at the break with the score 32-24.

Coming out of the locker room, the two sides traded baskets before Tutt sparked a 6-0 Aztec run with a jumper and a basket following a UW turnover to give her team a 14-point advantage at 40-26. The San Diego State lead would grow out to as many as 16 points at the 8:17 mark until Washington made a final push in the final four minutes on four lay-ups in the paint from Rogers to close to within eight at 57-49.

Sophomore Kiyana Stamps restored the SDSU lead into double figures just 21 seconds later and both Clements and Hopkins hit a pair of free throws each to close out the 63-51 victory.

LOS ANGELES - The San Diego State women's basketball team rallied from a 16-point deficit to take a three-point second-half lead, but wasn't able to come out with a victory, as the Aztecs fell 78-71 to host UCLA at the John Wooden Center. With the loss, SDSU dropped to 4-2, while the Bruins improved to 4-2 after defeating the visitors for the second year in a row.

Aztec junior Courtney Clements led the team in scoring with 19 points, but made just seven of her 24 field-goal attempts. Sophomore Melissa Sweat matched her career high with 14 points, highlighted by 12 in the second half, while freshman Erimma Amarikwa and junior Chelsea Hopkins both finished with eight points apiece. Hopkins had six of the team's nine assists and she, along with Clements and senior Kalena Tutt all added six rebounds.

The Aztecs got off to a quick start with a 6-0 lead on baskets from three different players, but the Bruins finally got on the board at the 17:35 mark and took their first lead of the night at 9-8. UCLA then utilized some hot shooting and got a number of second-chance buckets, putting together what would later amount to be a 22-0 run to go up by 16 points with the score at 24-8.

San Diego State, however, would battle back, as a jumper from junior Malia Nahinu ended a near seven-minute. Clements then notched 10 of SDSU's next 12 points and received help from three of the squad's freshmen, who contributed a basket apiece to cut the deficit all the way to just four points at 35-31. The Bruins converted on a 3-point play in the final eight seconds by Rhema Gardner to extend the lead back out to 38-31 heading into the locker room.

Coming out of the break, the Aztecs quickly made a dent in their deficit, getting a bucket from Clements and two lay-ups from Hopkins in under a minute. SDSU successfully completed the come back on a 3-point play from Amarikwa to take its first lead since the first half at 40-39 with 17:48 remaining.

The two sides were tied twice and traded advantages three times before UCLA outscored the Aztecs 15-4 to push it once again to a double-figure Bruin lead at 59-49. The home squad reached the double bonus by the 9:45 mark and made good on four of six free throws while adding a wide-open triple from Thea Lemberger to open the gap to 14 points on two occasions.

The Aztecs cut that deficit in half with under 30 seconds remaining before ultimately falling by that same seven-point margin, 78-71.

USD converted on a pair of free throws and then hit three buckets in a row to tie the game at 17 points apiece.

The score was tied at 19 and 21 and also at the break, as San Diego State erased a five-point deficit with under a minute and a half remaining to go into the locker room all square at 28 points apiece.

USD scored the first point of the second half on a free throw, but the Aztecs bounced back ahead on a jumper from Clements at the 17:52 mark at 30-29. SDSU then went scoreless over nearly a 10-minute span, missing its next 13 shots. Luckily for the home team, the Toreros also had their own streak of cold shooting, as San Diego State finally broke the drought on a triple from sophomore Melissa Sweat to put them down by only five with 8:02 left to play.

The Aztecs cut it to as little as a two-point margin at 39-37 and trailed by just three with 4:55 remaining, but never got any closer as San Diego went to the free-throw line 14 more times, hitting 10 of them to secure the 56-45 victory.

The aforementioned run was a part of an overall 14-4 spurt, which gave San Diego State its largest lead of the game, 14 points, with 7:32 left in the half.

The Aztecs carried their double-figure lead deep into the first half until UC Irvine's Cheyenne Cathey knocked down a three to trim SDSU's lead to nine points. Cathey's bucket was the beginning of an 8-0 spurt to end the half as San Diego State went into the locker room with a 34-30 lead.

SDSU started the second half as hot as the Anteaters ended the first and used a 14-3 run along with a stifling defense to extend its lead to 48-33 before the first media timeout. During the run, the Aztecs received five points apiece from Stamps and Clements and four from Kalena Tutt.

The scoring spree from Stamps and Clements was just a glimpse of what was to come later in the half. SAN DIEGO - San Diego State junior Chelsea Hopkins came up with a critical steal with just three seconds left in the game to preserve a 79-78 come-from-behind victory over visiting Cal Poly at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs rallied from an eight-point second-half deficit to improve to 6-4 on the season, while the Mustangs dropped their second consecutive one-point decision to fall to 3-9 on the year.

After trailing by eight with 11:05 remaining in the game, San Diego State got to within three on five occasions before reeling off eight-straight points to take the lead at 74-70 on two lay-ups apiece by Hopkins and freshman forward Kristina Hunter. The Aztecs had a six-point advantage with 2:05 left to play, however, the Mustangs cut it down to only one point at 79-78 on a jumper from Jonae Ervin. Hopkins missed a pair of lay-ups on the team's next possession, but got it back on the other end of the floor by stealing the ball away from Ervin to force a turnover and secure the loose ball before she was fouled.

The junior missed both of her free-throw opportunities which would have made it a three-point game, but Aztec Courtney Clements secured the rebound on the final shot and ran out the remaining two seconds to preserve the 79-78 victory.

San Diego State came out in the end despite a monster effort by Cal Poly red-shirt senior Kristina Santiago, who went 16-for-23 from the field and 11-for-14 from the line to score 44 points, while also adding eight boards and four steals before fouling out with 59 seconds left and her team trailing by only two.

Clements led the SDSU offensive effort with her fourth 20-point scoring outing of the year, hitting nine of her 15 shots, including three from beyond the arc, for 24 points to go with eight rebounds. Stamps matched her career high with 17 points, while Hunter posted her first contest in double-figures with 12 on 5-for-7 shooting. Stamps also had a four steals and Hopkins tallied nine assists.

The first half featured seven tie scores and eight lead changes with Cal Poly jumping out by as many as five points at 28-23 with 7:38 left until the break. San Diego State caught up before the end of the half, jumping ahead by as many as three points before heading into the locker room trailing by one at 41-40.

After the game was tied at 48 in the second half, the Mustangs scored seven in a row and ended up putting together an 12-4 run capped by a 3-pointer from Ariana Delgado at 60-52 for the largest lead by either team on the afternoon.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team cruised to an easy 57-29 victory over visiting UNGC in the opening game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic at Viejas Arena. The win was Beth Burns' 250th in her 15 overall seasons as head coach at SDSU and improved the squad to 7-4 this year. Junior point guard Chelsea Hopkins also had a solid outing with a team season-high 10 rebounds as well as nine assists and three steals.

San Diego State never trailed in the game, jumping ahead 8-0 with points by four different players. UNGC finally got on the scoreboard at the 16:13 mark on a jumper from Janae Stevenson, but the Aztecs responded with a 7-1 run to increase the advantage out to 12. The host went up by as many as 18 points before heading into the break in front 26-11, as the Spartans finally crossed into double-figures with just under two minutes remaining.

Stamps, who notched only three first-half points, found her shooting rhythm coming out of the locker room with a pair of triples and two free throws in less than three minutes. Neither side had a field goal for the next four minutes until Nahinu broke through with a jumper at the 13:01 mark. After a brief 3-0 run by the Spartans, Stamps hit another triple to spark a 12-2 run to put the host squad in front by 20 at 49-20. The Aztecs led by as many as 30 points before coming out with the 57-29 victory.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State used a plus-24 margin on the glass to propel it to the championship of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam with a 51-37 victory over visiting Penn at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs claimed their third Surf 'N Slam title in the last four seasons by winning their fourth game in a row to improve to 8-4. The Quakers, meanwhile, saw their three-game win streak snapped to fall to 7-3.

The Aztecs accounted for three of the six players on the all-tournament squad, including the MVP in junior point guard Chelsea Hopkins. Hopkins had a career high in rebounding for the second outing a row with 12 to go with seven assists and seven points in 34 minutes. For the second outing in a row, San Diego State never trailed building a 6-0 advantage out of the gate with baskets by three different players. Penn got on the board at the 16:25 mark on a jumper from Jourdan Banks and moved to within three points on a lay-up from Jess Knap at 7-4.

Clements then scored the game's next five points on a triple and a lay-up in the paint for an eight-point advantage. After the Quakers trimmed the deficit to six on two occasions, neither side scored for the next five minutes until back-to-back baskets by SDSU freshman Erimma Amarikwa finally broke the stalemate for an 18-8 advantage.

The Aztecs lead was also 10 points at the break at 25-15, and moved out to 12 points twice early in the second half. Penn kept it to just a two possession game until a Nahinu jumper sparked a 12-2 run for a 16-point lead at 43-27. The Quakers would get as close as nine points with 3:43 remaining before SDSU eventually secured the 14-point win at 51-37.

The Roadrunners managed just three free throws through the first four and a half minutes coming out of the locker room to help the visitors jump ahead by 19 on two occasions. CSUB's first field goal of the second half, a 3-pointer by Kristine Herman, sparked 12-5 run cutting the Aztec advantage down to 50-38 with 11:08 left in the game.

San Diego State immediately countered with a jumper by Nahinu and Stamps and a triple from Hopkins to restore the team's 19-point lead. The Aztecs led by as many as 24 points with 2:54 remaining before CSU Bakersfield ended the afternoon on a 10-0 run to close out the game at 74-60.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team used an 18-0 run in the second half to turn a one-point deficit into a 17-point lead as the Aztecs went on to claim a 61-46 victory over TCU in both sides 2012 Mountain West Conference openers at Viejas Arena. TCU scored the first seven points of the second half to jump ahead 27-26 and also enjoyed a one-point advantage at 29-28. From there, the Aztecs utilized a jumper from the right block by senior Kalena Tutt to kick start what would be an 18-0 run and a 46-29 lead as the Horned Frogs went scoreless for just over six minutes. SDSU led by as many as 19 points, before eventually settling for a 15-point victory at 61-46 over the league's preseason favorite.

San Diego State 66, UNLV 62 (OT)

LAS VEGAS - In a contest featuring the top two squads in the conference, the San Diego State women's basketball team outlasted host UNLV 66-62 in overtime at Cox Pavilion. With the victory, the Aztecs claimed their eighth win in a row and started the conference campaign 2-0 for just the second time in the Mountain West's 13-year history, improving to 12-4 overall. The Lady Rebels, meanwhile, dropped to 13-5 and 1-1 in league action.

Junior Courtney Clements notched her fifth 20-point scoring out of the year, finishing with exactly 20 points on 9-of-18 shooting to go with a team-best eight rebounds for the Aztecs. Sophomore Kiyana Stamps had 14 points, six rebounds and three steals in playing nearly the entire game, while junior Chelsea Hopkins added 11 points, including nine in the second half and overtime, seven assists and three steals.

San Diego State had a four-point advantage at 54-50 with under a minute left in regulation and could have iced the game at the free throw line. Three different Aztecs, however, each missed the front end of a 1-and-1 in the final 39 seconds as UNLV made both of its free throws and got the game-tying basket from guard Mia Bell with six seconds remaining to send it to overtime.

In the extra five minutes, the Lady Rebels struck first with a pair of free throws, but Stamps answered the next time down the court with her only triple of the game to put SDSU in front by one. The Aztecs also led by only one with under two minutes left, before getting three consecutive points from senior Kalena Tutt for their biggest advantage of overtime at 64-60.

UNLV battled to get to within a pair, but Hopkins converted both of her free throws with 10 ticks left on the clock to preserve the 66-62 win.

The game featured 13 lead changes and 10 tie scores with the Aztecs going up by as many as seven points in the second half at 41-34, after the Lady Rebels were in front by six at the 8:14 mark of the first 20 minutes of action.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team rolled to a 77-47 victory over visiting New Mexico to improve to 3-0 in league action and remain the only unbeaten squad in Mountain West play. The win was also the Aztecs' ninth in a row to give the program its' longest such streak since 1997, and allowed them to surpass last season's victory total with a 13-4 overall record. The Lobos, meanwhile, dropped to 6-11 on the year and 0-3 in the MWC.

SDSU had four players score in double-figures, including junior Courtney Clements, who notched a game-high 19 points on 7-of-11 shooting to go with a season-high three steals. Redshirt sophomore Kiyana Stamps was 4-for-7 from beyond the arc and finished with 14 points, while junior Malia Nahinu also ended up with 14 as well as a team-best five rebounds. Freshman Ahjalee Harvey was the fourth Aztec in double-figure points with 10 and junior Chelsea Hopkins contributed seven assists and three steals in 21 minutes.

The Lobos started the evening off with a 5-0 run on a jumper off the glass from Caroline Durbin and a 3-pointer from the right angle by Porche Torrance. San Diego State answered with a 5-0 run of its own to tie the game and the squads were also knotted at 7-7 at the 16:31 mark of the first half.

From there, the Aztecs scored seven unanswered points, including five by Clements, to move into a lead that they would never end up relinquishing. New Mexico cut it to as few as four points at 18-14 on a triple from Lauren Taylor, but SDSU took advantage of the visitors' 13 first-half turnovers and went into the break up by 17 at 40-23.

The Aztecs came out of the locker room with the hot hand shooting, draining five of their first six shots to jump ahead by 24 points at 51-27. The Lobos would get that down to as few as 18 points with 8:05 left in the game, but San Diego State outscored them 17-6 over the final six minutes to secure the 77-47 victory.
