AZTECS MAKE FIRST TRIP TO EMPIRE STATE, TRAVEL TO MICHIE STADIUM TO FACE ARMY

Now in its 89th season of intercollegiate football, San Diego State has played 906 games but not one of them has come against a team from the state of New York. That changes on Saturday, when the Aztecs make the 2,118-mile trip to West Point for the program's inaugural meeting with Army.

One day prior to the 10th anniversary of the Sept. 11 tragedy, the Aztecs and Black Knights meet at historic Michie Stadium on the campus of the United States Military Academy, a mere 45 miles from the World Trade Center site.

Kickoff is set for 12:05 p.m. ET and the game will be televised nationally in high definition by CBS Sports Network and available locally on Channel 4 San Diego.

San Diego State opened the **Rocky Long** era in fine style on Saturday night, with a dominating 49-21 victory over Cal Poly at Qualcomm Stadium. The Aztecs won their third straight game dating back to last season and have not trailed in any of the three victories. That marks the first time San Diego State has won three straight games without falling behind in any of the contests since November 1998.

The Aztecs' three-game winning streak is the 10th-longest active streak in the country and San Diego State has won its last six games against teams that were unranked at game time. That is the program's longest such streak since a six-game stretch during the 1997-98 seasons.

In Saturday's victory, senior quarterback **Ryan Lindley** was 15-of-27 for 203 yards, with four touchdowns and zero interceptions. In the process, he passed Todd Santos atop the school's career touchdown passes chart with 71. He has now thrown 80 consecutive passes without an interception and has 10 touchdown passes during that stretch.

Sophomore running back **Ronnie Hillman** carried 28 times for 189 yards and two touchdowns. In just 14 career games, the La Habra, Calif., native has seven games with at least 150 yards rushing. He had the third-highest rushing game in the country through last Saturday and now has 1,721 yards and 19 rushing touchdowns in his career. He has rushed for more than 100 yards in three-straight outings, becoming the 13th Aztec player to accomplish that feat.

The offensive line, which returns four of five starters from last season, produced another strong game, allowing the Aztecs to rush for 289 yards. It was the team's third consecutive 200-yard game and also included seven runs for more than 10 yards, while yielding just two negative plays in 77 offensive snaps and no sacks.

After giving up a pair of second-quarter touchdowns, the defense settled down, forcing six consecutive three-and-outs. The Aztecs limited Cal Poly to 105 yards in the second half and had nine tackles for loss and two quarterback

sacks. Senior linebacker **Miles Burris** and red-shirt freshman middle linebacker **Jake Fely** recorded six tackles apiece. Burris added two tackles for loss and a quarterback sack, while Fely had a tackle for loss and a forced fumble.

Sophomore wide receiver **Colin Lockett** had a memorable season opener. After entering the game without a career reception, he caught three passes for 82 yards and also electrified the crowd with a 94-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, the first by an Aztec since 2008.

Sophomore wide receiver **Dylan Denso** made his first career start a memorable one, with four catches for 66 yards and two scores.

San Diego State is looking for just its second 2-0 start in the last 17 seasons (since 1994). The first came last year when the Aztecs defeated Nicholls State (47-0) and New Mexico State (41-21) to open with consecutive victories. A win over Army would give SDSU an 11-4 record in its last 15 games, its best 15-game stretch in nearly 33 years.

This marks just the 10th visit by an Aztec football team to the Eastern time zone in the Division I Era (since 1969). The Aztecs are 1-9 out East, with the lone victory coming at Kent State on Sept. 30, 1972 (14-10). On Saturday, 14,224 days will have passed since SDSU's last victory in the time zone. The No. 1 song in the country that day was "Baby Don't Get Hooked On Me" by Mac Davis and the No. 1 album was Chicago V. Later in the month, 14-year-old Michael Jackson had his first No. 1 single, "Ben".

Following the Army game, the Aztecs return home to face Washington State on Sept. 17. After the game against the Cougars, the annual KGB SkyShow fireworks spectacular will take place. Tickets are currently on sale for the game and start at just \$10. Tickets may be purchased online at GoAztecs.com, by calling (619) 283-SDSU or in-person at Qualcomm Stadium.

NEED TO KNOW

■ San Diego State currently has won six consecutive games against unranked teams, regardless of location. That is the longest such win streak for the program since a six-game stretch in 1997-98. The last time San Diego State had a longer winning streak against non-top 25 opponents was in 1976-77, when the Aztecs won 10 straight games.

■ The Aztecs have won three straight games overall entering this week. That modest streak is tied for the 10th-longest active win streak in the country and is second in the Mountain West (Air Force, 5).

■ San Diego State is 10-4 since the beginning of the 2010 season. A win Saturday would give the Aztecs an 11-4 record in their last 15 games marking the best 15-game stretch for the program since going 11-4 from Oct. 17, 1977 until Oct. 21, 1978.

■ San Diego State is going for the Tiger Slam version of the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy. Last season, the Aztecs defeated Air Force (27-25) and Navy (35-14), giving SDSU victories over two service academies in their last nine games. The Aztecs are looking to complete the triple crown on Saturday and become the first team since Notre Dame to defeat all three service academies in a 12-game or less stretch. The Fighting Irish pulled the trick in a four-game span during the 2006 season.

■ San Diego State 1-8 in its Division I era in the Eastern time zone. The Aztecs have lost their last eight trips to the region, although their opponent has been ranked in the top 17 on five of those occasions. SDSU's lone win in the Eastern time zone came on Sept. 30, 1972, when the Aztecs defeated Kent State, 14-10.

■ Aztec head coach Rocky Long is making his third trip to Michie Stadium. In his first game as a collegiate player, Long's New Mexico squad was defeated by Army, 31-14 on Sept. 20, 1969. He also saw a game at the stadium as a fan.

■ The last five San Diego State head coaches - Al Luginbill (1989), Ted Tollner (1994), Tom Craft

(2002), Chuck Long (2006) and Brady Hoke (2009) all lost their first road game as the head coach of the Aztecs. As a group, the previous 17 coaches are 7-9-1 in their road debut.

■ San Diego State has gone consecutive games without committing a turnover for the first time since 1999. The Aztec offense has now run 143 consecutive plays without a turnover dating back to the fourth quarter of last season's regular-season finale against UNLV (Nov. 27). Not counted in the total plays, are 15 punt returns and eight kickoffs which have been turnover free.

■ Last week, the Aztecs were one of 27 teams in the country that did not commit a turnover. In case you are curious, if you factor out the three games which were turnover free (involving six schools), teams that did not commit a turnover went 19-2 last week. In 487 games at the Division I level (starting in 1969), SDSU has never gone three consecutive games without a turnover.

■ San Diego State had six players make their first career start last week. They were WR Colin Lockett, WR Dylan Denso, DL Jordan Thomas, LB Jake Fely, WAR Gabe Lemon and CB Larry Parker. In addition, 13 players saw their first career playing time last Saturday night.

SDSU-ARMY: THE SERIES

■ Saturday marks the first meeting between San Diego State and Army in football. This is the start of a home-and-home series, which will bring the Black Knights to San Diego next season (Sept. 8, 2012).

■ This marks the first time in school history that San Diego State has played a football game in the state of New York. It marks just the 10th time in the school's Division I era that the Aztecs have played a game in Eastern time zone.

■ Saturday will mark the 27th time in San Diego State's Division I era that the Aztecs have encountered a team without a conference affiliation. SDSU owns a 20-6 record in those games and has won four of its last five encounters with the indies, including a 35-14 victory over Navy in the 2010 Poinsettia Bowl.

SDSU-ARMY: CONNECTIONS

■ San Diego State head coach Rocky Long is making his third appearance at Michie Stadium. In his first game as a collegiate player, Long's New Mexico squad was defeated by Army, 31-14, on Sept. 20, 1969. He also saw a game as a fan and more recently, viewed the Army-Navy game in person.

■ Army head coach Rich Ellerson was the head coach at Cal Poly when the Mustangs defeated SDSU in both 2006 and 2008.

■ Aztec head coach Rocky Long (1986-87 - linebackers) and Army head coach Rich Ellerson (1984-85 - defensive line) were both assistant coaches with the British Columbia Lions of the CFL.

■ Aztec head coach Rocky Long was the defensive coordinator and assistant Osia Lewis was the linebackers/special teams coach at Oregon State when Army assistant coach Ian Shields played quarterback for the Beavers and was also a graduate assistant coach.

■ SDSU offensive coordinator Andy Ludwig held the same position at Cal Poly when Army assistant coaches Payam Saadat (linebackers) and Bill Tripp (offensive line) were also on the Mustangs' coaching staff in 1997.

■ SDSU assistant coach LeCharls McDaniel (secondary/special teams) and Army's Bill Tripp (offensive line) were both on the same coaching staff at Cal Poly in 1992.

■ SDSU assistant coach LeCharls McDaniel (1977-80) and Army assistant coaches Andy Guyader (1992-96) and Chris Smeland (1970-74) all played their collegiate football careers for Cal Poly.

■ SDSU sophomore defensive back Gabe Lemon and redshirt freshman wideout Brandon Turner attended Luthern High School in Orange, Calif., with Army sophomore slotback Scott Williams.

■ Army freshman wideout Ryan Morgan (Ramona HS) and freshman offensive lineman Rob Bickel (Granite Hills HS) are from the San Diego area.

■ **Sept. 3, 2011 - San Diego State 49, Cal Poly 21**
The San Diego State football team put on an impressive performance on both sides of the ball, downing Cal Poly, 49-21. With the win before 34,384 fans at Qualcomm Stadium, SDSU claimed its season opener in consecutive years for the first time since 2003-04.

son, marching 81 yards on just six plays to take an early 7-0 lead on a Ronnie Hillman 2-yard run. After a punt, San Diego State scored a TD on three consecutive drives to open up a 28-14 lead at the half.

Quarterback Ryan Lindley found Gavin Escobar for a 3-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter, and Dylan Denso on touchdown passes of 3 and 33 yards in the second quarter to account for the Aztecs' other first-half scores, while Cal Poly countered with a 3-yard run by Mark Rodgers and a 17-yard rushing score by Jake Romanelli.

Despite not mounting much of an offensive attack in the third, the SDSU defense came up big after the break, keeping the Mustangs to just 10 total yards of offense. Lindley threw his fourth touchdown of the game and in the process broke Todd Santos' school record for career touchdowns with his 71st on an 18-yard pass to Colin Lockett.

Hillman scampered for a 27-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter to put San Diego State up 42-14. Following a 2-yard rushing touchdown by Cal Poly's Andre Broadous, Lockett responded with a 94-yard kickoff return for the final score of the game. Lockett's kickoff return was the longest by an Aztec since 1997, and the eighth-longest return in school history.

Besides outgaining the Mustangs, 492-284, SDSU had 10 more first downs (22-12) than Cal Poly, outrushed the visitors, 289-137, and had 203 passing yards to the Mustangs' 147. Additionally, San Diego State had the ball 36:08 compared to just 23:52 for Cal Poly.

Hillman led the Aztec offensive attack with 189 yards on 28 carries and two scores. It was his seventh 100-yard game of his career, all which have eclipsed the 150-yard barrier.

Lindley passed for 203 yards and four touchdowns, while Denso (66 yards, 2 TD) and Escobar (36 yards, TD) each caught four passes. Lockett, meanwhile, had three catches for 82 yards and a touchdown.

POSTGAME NOTES

- San Diego State wins its third consecutive game dating back to last season and has not trailed in any of the three games. It marks the first time the Aztecs have posted a three-game winning streak without trailing since November 1998, when the Aztecs ended the regular-season with wins over Fresno State (10-0), San Jose State (34-6) and UTEP (34-29).
- San Diego State wins its season opener for the second consecutive season. The Aztecs have won two openers in a row for the first time since the 2003 and 2004 campaigns.
- San Diego State extends its win streak against unranked teams at any location to six straight games dating back to a 24-21 loss at Brigham Young on Oct. 9, 2010. It is the longest such win streak since a six-game win streak during the 1997-98 season.
- San Diego State has won six straight games against non-ranked teams at home dating back to a 30-27 loss to Wyoming on Nov. 14, 2009. That is the longest such winning streak since a seven-game winning streak during the 2003-04 campaigns.
- Rocky Long wins his inaugural game as the head coach at San Diego State, improving Aztec head coaches to 10-5-3 in their first game at SDSU. He is the first coach to win his inaugural game since Ted Tollner led the Aztecs to a 56-14 victory at Navy on Sept. 3, 1994.
- San Diego State has won seven consecutive home games against non-conference opponents. The Aztecs last home loss outside of conference play came on Aug. 30, 2008, to Cal Poly (27-29).
- Ronnie Hillman records his seventh 100-yard rushing game of his career and posts the 250th 100-yard rushing game in San Diego State history.
- San Diego State snaps a two-game losing series losing streak to Cal Poly and get its first victory over the Mustangs in 16,044 days, dating back to a 26-20 victory on Sept. 30, 1967. SDSU is now 14-11 all-time vs. Cal Poly.
- SDSU's 28-first-half points are the Aztecs' most in a season-opening first half since scoring 31

against Idaho State in 2004 (W - 38-21).

- SDSU ran for over 200 yards on the ground for the third consecutive outing and the seventh time in the last 14 outings.
- SDSU did not commit a turnover for the second game in a row (also vs. Navy). It is the first time the Aztecs did not commit a turnover in a season opener since 1999, and first time SDSU has logged back-to-back games with no giveaways also since 1999 (vs. South Florida, at Illinois).
- SDSU's 49 points tie as the second-most in a season-opener in school history ... SDSU has scored more than 34 points in five straight outings dating back to last season.

POSTGAME PLAYER NOTES

Ryan Lindley, Sr., QB

- Lindley made his 32nd consecutive start and his 37th of his career overall ... He recorded his fifth career game with four or more passing touchdowns (career high is 6 vs. CSU in 2009).
- With his four touchdown tosses, Lindley set the school's all-time career record for most passing touchdowns with 71. He surpassed the previous record-holder Todd Santos, who had 70 from 1984-87.
- Lindley entered the game with no interceptions in his previous 53 pass attempts and increased that figure to 80.

Ronnie Hillman, So., RB

- Hillman scored a rushing touchdown for the fourth consecutive game and the 18th time in his career in the first half ... Added another rushing TD in the fourth quarter, his fifth career outing with two or more rushing scores.
- Hillman recorded his seventh 100-yard rushing game in just his 14th career game at the college level. He ranks 12th in school history in most 100-yard rushing days (NFL Hall of Famer Marshall Faulk tops the list with 23). All seven of Hillman's career 100-yard rushing games are for more than 150 yards.
- Hillman records his third straight 100-yard rushing game dating back to last season (152 yards vs. UNLV and 228 yards vs. Navy). This is the 18th time in school history that an Aztec player has recorded 100 yards rushing in at least three straight games. The last time it happened was by Lynell Hamilton during the 2005 season. No player has done it in four consecutive games since Larry Ned in 1998.
- Hillman is the 14th Aztec to run for over 100 yards in an opener and the first since Michael Franklin ran for 106 yards vs. Idaho State in 2004.

Dylan Denso, So., WR

- Denso scored his first two career touchdowns in the second quarter with a 3-yard reception (on fourth down) and a 33-yard grab. The two receiving TDs tie as the most by an Aztec in a season-opening game and marks the second year in a row an SDSU player has accomplished the feat (DeMarco Sampson, 2010 vs. Nicholls).

Colin Lockett, So., WR

- Colin Lockett became the first Aztec to return a kickoff for a touchdown since 2008, when Davion Mauldin brought one back 93 yards vs. Colorado State. Lockett's 94-yard return is the eighth-longest in school history and longest kick return overall since Jesus Reyes brought one back 96 yards for a TD vs. Wyoming in 1997.
- Colin Lockett's first career catch was a 59-yarder in the first quarter. He later added his first career receiving touchdown in the third quarter.

POSTGAME OTHER NOTES

- Aztecs making their first career starts tonight included: Colin Lockett (WR), Dylan Denso (WR), Jordan Thomas (DL), Jake Fely (LB), Gabe Lemon (WAR) and Larry Parker (CB).
- Aztecs playing their first career games tonight included: King Holder, Adam Roberts, Cody Galea, Josh Gavert, Sam Meredith, Dontrell Onuoha, Adam Dingwell, Riley Gauld, Brice Heers, Garrett Corbett, Dwayne Garrett, Osmond Nicholas and Paul Pitts.
- The Aztecs scored a touchdown on their opening drive of a game for the fourth time in their last five outings (lone exception vs. Navy).
- Senior punter Brian Stahovich had three kicks land inside the 20-yard line (46th, 47th and 48th of his career) and also punted his 42nd and 43rd career efforts of 50 or more yards.
- Sophomore tight end Gavin Escobar logged his fifth career receiving score in the first half.
- Senior linebacker Demetrius Barksdale recovered his third career fumble in the fourth quarter. It is the third consecutive year he has recovered a fumble ... Jake Fely caused his first career fumble.

THE IMPORTANCE OF GAME ONE

- The opener may count the same as all the other games, but over the past 20-plus years, it has been a good indicator of the type of season San Diego State will have. Beginning with the 1986 Holiday Bowl season (excluding the 1992 season-opening 31-31 tie with USC), the Aztecs have won their season-opening game on 11 occasions, including last week against Cal Poly. In the previous 10 seasons in which the Aztecs won game one, they have gone on to post a 62-54-1 record. That is a winning percentage of 53.4 percent and an average of 6.2 wins per season. During that same time frame, San Diego State has dropped the lidlifter on 13 occasions, posting a

record of 55-97-1, for a 36.3 winning percentage. The Aztecs have averaged 4.2 wins per season and have been unable to finish .500 or better the last eight times they have opened a campaign with an L.

If you are planning to win a conference title, winning the opener is important. In San Diego State's 18 championship seasons, the Aztecs opened with a victory 15 times. In 1962, 1974 and 1998, SDSU overcame a loss in game one to earn a conference championship.

TRYING TO GET TO 2-0

San Diego State is looking for just its second 2-0 start to a season in the last 17 campaigns. Last year, the Aztecs opened up with a 47-0 victory over Nicholls State and a 41-21 win at New Mexico State to get to 2-0 for the first time since 1994.

In 42 previous seasons at the Division I level, San Diego State has started with a 2-0 record on 12 occasions (1969, 1970, 1971, 1972, 1975, 1976, 1977, 1981, 1986, 1991 and 1994). In those 12 seasons in which the team went 2-0, San Diego State went on to post a combined record of 102-33-2 (75.2 percent) and averaged 8.5 victories per season. In 11 of those 12 seasons, the Aztecs posted a winning record.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

SCORING: San Diego State ranks 21st in the country in total offense (492.00) and 15th in scoring offense (49.00)... San Diego State is coming off its highest total point outout (49) since tallying 52 points against Portland State in the third game of the 2007 season (Sept. 22, 2007)... The 49 points are the second most ever in a season-opener and the most since scoring 56 points against Navy on Sept. 3, 1994 (Ted Tollner's coaching debut at San Diego State)... Dating back to last season, San Diego State has scored 34 or more points in five consecutive games... That has not happened since a five-game stretch during the 1996 campaign... The Aztecs have scored 21 or more points in 15 consecutive games for the first time since a streak of 19 straight from Nov. 30, 1968 to Oct. 31, 1970... That streak includes the first 17 games SDSU played as a Division IA team... The Aztecs have committed two turnovers or less in 18 of their last 22 games... The offense has committed just 19 turnovers in the last 14 games (since the start of the 2010 season)... San Diego State has posted 440 or more yards of total offense in 11 of its last 15 games dating back to the final game of the 2009 season (prior to this stretch, SDSU did it once in the previous 11 games).

OFFENSIVE RUSHING: San Diego State ranks ninth nationally in rushing offense (289.00) and 15th in rushing yards per carry (5.90)... Sophomore Ronnie Hillman is third nationally in rushing yards per game (189.00), trailing only Oregon State's Malcolm Agnew and Pittsburgh's Ray Graham... The rushing duo of Hillman and Walter Kazee (82 yards) combined for 271 yards on Saturday and are the most prolific rushing tandem in the country through the first week of the season... Since the beginning of the 2010 season (last 14 games), the Aztecs have 31 rushing touchdowns... That is more than the Aztecs had in the 31 games prior to 2010 (includes every game from the 2008 and 2009 seasons)... The Aztecs have rushed for 200 or more yards in three consecutive games and in seven of their last 14 contests... In the last three games, SDSU has 818 rushing yards and seven rushing touchdowns.

OFFENSIVE PASSING: San Diego State ranks 68th nationally in passing offense (203.00), 30th in pass efficiency (161.64) and fifth nationally in touchdown passes (4), trailing only Baylor (6), Arizona (5), Northern Illinois (5) and Toledo (5)... The Aztecs have 29 passing touchdowns in their last 11 games, including 14 in the last four contests... San Diego State had six different players catch a pass in last Saturday's victory against Cal Poly and three different players caught a touchdown pass in the contest.

TURNOVERS: San Diego State went a second consecutive game without a turnover, something that had not been done at State since 1999... In the school's Division I era (since 1969), the Aztecs have never gone three straight games without committing a turnover... The Aztec offense has now run 143 consecutive plays without a turnover dating back to the fourth quarter of last season's regular-season finale against UNLV (Nov. 27). Not counted in the total plays are 15 punt returns and eight kickoffs which have been turnover free.

AZTEC O-LINE IMPRESSIVE, AGAIN

With four returning starters on the offensive line, it should come as no surprise that San Diego State continued the fine play up front last Saturday from a year ago. The Aztec starting offensive line consists of three seniors (LT Tommie Draheim, LG Emilio Rivera and RT Kurtis Gunther) and two juniors (C Alec Johnson and RG Nik Embernate).

In the season-opening game against Cal Poly, the Aztec offensive line received high marks, helping SDSU rush for 289 yards on 49 carries (5.90 yards per carry), while allowing no sacks and giving up

San Diego State has now gone 89 consecutive pass attempts without allowing a sack dating back to the fourth quarter of the Utah game on Nov. 20, 2010.

ADDITIONAL OFFENSIVE NOTES

■ Through one game, the Aztecs rank among the top 30 in the country in rushing offense (9th, 289.00), kickoff return average (35.75), scoring offense (15th, 49.00), total offense (21st, 492.00) and passing efficiency (30th, 161.64) ... SDSU is one of 28 teams in the country without a turnover ... San Diego State is also one of 28 teams who did not give up a sack over the first weekend ... In fact, the Aztecs have gone three straight games without yielding a sack, dating back to last year ... SDSU's time of possession of 36:08 is the 10th-best mark in the country ... San Diego State was 2-for-2 on fourth-down conversions last night and are now 9-for-14 (64.3 percent) since the beginning of last season.

MORE NOTES ON HILLMAN

■ Running back Ronnie Hillman rushed for 189 yards on 28 carries in the opener against Cal Poly on Saturday ... Only Oregon State's Malcolm Agnew (223 yards) and Pittsburgh's Ray Graham (201) rushed for more yards in the opener ... Hillman now has seven career 150-yard (and seven 100-yard) rushing games ... Over those seven games, he has 1,289 yards (184.1 yards per game) on 175 carries (7.37 yards per carry) ... The seven 150-yard rushing contests are tied with Larry Ned (1998-2001) for the third-most in school history ... Only NFL Hall of Famer Marshall Faulk (16, 1991-93) and George Jones (8, 1995-96) have more 150-yard running games ... Hillman scored two rushing touchdowns, giving him 19 for his career through 14 games ... The 19 rushing touchdowns are already tied for seventh on the school's all-time list (Kevin O'Connell - 2004-07 and David Turner - 1976-77) and trail Ned and Casey Brown (1982-85) for fifth on the charts ... With the 189 rushing yards, Hillman jumped from 14th to 12th on SDSU's all-time rushing list with 1,721 yards, passing Brandon Bornes (1,553, 2004-07) and Art Preston (1,664, 1949-51) ... Ken Carson (1,911, 1961-63) and Lynell Hamilton (2,052, 2003, 05-07) rank 11th and 10th, respectively ... Hillman is one game short of qualifying for the NCAA FBS active career rushing yards per game chart, but his career mark of 122.9 yards per game would rank second in the nation behind Oregon's LaMichael James (128.1) ... Hillman became the 13th Aztec to rush for at least 100 yards in three consecutive games ... The feat has happened 18 times in school history ... The last player with three straight 100-yard contests was Lynell Hamilton in 2005 ... No player has done it in four consecutive games since Ned in 1998 ... Hillman has three consecutive 150-yard contests ... The last Aztec with three straight 150-yard rushing games was also Ned, which was done in 2001 ... The school record for most consecutive 150-yard rushing contests is five, set by Jones in 1995 ... Faulk eclipsed the 150-yard barrier four straight times from 1991-92 (last two games of 1991, first two of 1992) ... Hillman's 191 all-purpose yards rank 13th in the country after one game.

Lindley continues to climb the NCAA career leader chart, ranking among the top five in the nation in completions (2nd), yards (2nd), touchdowns (2nd), total offense (2nd) and total touchdowns responsible for (3rd) ... It was the first kickoff return for a touchdown since 2008 (Davion Mauldin vs. Colorado State) and the longest since Jesus Reyes brought one back 96 yards for a score vs. Wyoming in 1997 ... The 94-yard return was the eighth-longest in school history ... His 225 all-purpose yards rank him in a tie for seventh in the country with Robert Kelley of Tulane ... The 35.8 yards per kickoff return is the ninth-best average ... He was one of

DEFENSIVE NOTES

■ **OVERALL:** San Diego State ranks 58th nationally in scoring defense (21.00) and 36th in total defense (284.00)... The Aztec defense improved as last Saturday's game progressed, yielding just 10 yards of offense in the third quarter and a mere 105 yards after halftime... San Diego State limited the Mustangs to six straight 3-and-outs at one point in the game, nine 3-and-outs for the contest and held Cal Poly to four yards or less on 10 of their 15 drives... Of Cal Poly's 284 yards of offense, 101 came on two plays... That means Cal Poly had 183 yards on their other 58 plays from scrimmage (3.16 per play) ... SDSU is tied for 17th nationally in first downs allowed with 12.

■ **RUSH DEFENSE:** San Diego State is second in the Mountain West and tied for 65th nationally in rushing defense, allowing 137 yards to Cal Poly ... The Mustangs had only three carries for 10 or more yards ... The Aztecs rank 14th nationally in tackles for loss with 9.0 for a loss of 29 yards ... Senior linebacker Miles Burris had two tackles for a loss and now has at least assisted with a tackle for a loss (0.5 or greater) in eight consecutive games ... The last time Burris didn't record a tackle for a loss was Oct. 16, 2010 against Air Force ... Linebacker Vaness Harris' only two stops vs. Cal Poly were behind the line of scrimmage, tying him for the team lead with 2.0 TFL.

■ **PASS DEFENSE:** San Diego State is 28th nationally and first in the Mountain West in pass defense, giving up 147 yards last Saturday against Cal Poly ... Take out the Mustangs two longest plays of the game (a 52- and 49-yard pass) and they threw for only 46 yards on their 12 other pass attempts... The Aztecs did not surrender a passing touchdown for the second consecutive year in a season-opener.

MILES MARKS

■ Aztec senior linebacker Miles Burris, a Butkus, Lombardi and Nagurski Award candidate, tied for the team lead in tackles with six against Cal Poly. Of those six, two were behind the line of scrimmage for a loss of eight yards, including a sack. Burris has recorded at least a half tackle for loss in eight straight outings and 13 of the last 14 contests with the lone exception being last year's win over Air Force. The Granite Bay, Calif., native has two or more tackles for loss in seven career games and has pushed his career total to 29.5 in that category, including 12.0 sacks. Burris also enters the Army outing with a streak of 27 consecutive games with at least one tackle, dating back to the 2008 contest with Utah.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

■ **SPECIAL TEAMS:** San Diego State ranks first in the Mountain West and is ninth nationally in kick returns with a 35.75 average... That mark was helped by Colin Lockett's 94-yard kick return for a touchdown on Saturday, the school's first return for a TD since 2008... The 94-yard return is the school's longest since 1997 and eighth-longest in school history... Aztec punter Brian Stahovich ranks 38th in punting average at 42.17... Of his six punts, he landed three inside the 20-yard line, had three fair caught and boasted a pair of 50-yarders... Senior place-kicker Abelardo Perez notched two more touchbacks on kickoffs, giving him 30 in 14 career outings as an Aztec... Perez was 7-for-7 on extra-point attempts, but saw his streak of consecutive field goals made end at eight when he missed a 46-yard effort in the third quarter.

FOUR AZTECS ON WATCH LISTS

■ San Diego State has already placed four student-athletes on preseason national award watch lists in 2011. Senior linebacker Miles Burris, senior quarterback Ryan Lindley, senior place-kicker Abelardo Perez and sophomore running back Ronnie Hillman are on the initial short list for their positions' top honors.

Burris (Granite Bay, Calif.) is one of 51 players on the Butkus Award Watch List (top linebacker), one of 125 on the Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List (top lineman) and one of 87 on the Bronko Nagurski Trophy Watch List (top defensive player). The last Aztec to be on all three of the same preseason watch lists was another linebacker in Kirk Morrison in both 2003 and 2004.

Burris is coming off a breakout 2010 campaign in which he led San Diego State in tackles (80), tackles for a loss (20) and sacks (9.5). He was also the Mountain West's sack and tackles-for-a-loss leader and was named a MWC first-team selection.

Lindley (Alpine, Calif.) is one of 38 players on the Davey O'Brien Award Watch List (top quarterback), one of 66 players on the Maxwell Award Watch List (most outstanding player) and one of 31 players on the Manning Award Watch List (top quarterback).

Lindley returns for his fourth year as SDSU's starter and has already amassed 9,537 career passing yards and 67 touchdowns in 36 contests. Last year, Lindley threw for 3,830 yards and 28 TDs to lead the Mountain West in passing (294.6 ypg.) and total offense (292.2 ypg.). Lindley was a second-team all-conference selection as a junior and enters 2011 within striking distance of the school's all-time career passing record currently held by Todd Santos (11,425).

Hillman (La Habra, Calif.) is one of 40 players on the Walter Camp Award Watch List (player of the year), one of 51 players on the Doak Walker Award Watch List (top running back) and one of 66 players on the Maxwell Award Watch List (most outstanding player).

Hillman rushed for 1,532 yards and 17 touchdowns a year ago en route to earning freshman All-America and conference freshman-of-the-year honors. He ran for more than 150 yards six times in 2010, including a career high of 228 yards at No. 25 Missouri and then again vs. Navy in the Poinsettia Bowl. Hillman led the Mountain West in rushing and ranked first among all freshmen (10th overall) nationally in that category.

Perez (Tijuana, Mexico) is one of 30 players on the Lou Groza Award Watch List (top place-kicker). He was a second-team all-Mountain West selection in 2010, posting a league-best 28 touchbacks and converting 17 of 22 field-goal attempts, including his final eight. He also led the league in field goals per game (1.42) and in scoring (8.3 ppg.).

SDSU TABBED TO FINISH FOURTH IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

■ For the first time in seven seasons, the San Diego State football team is picked to finish in the upper division of the Mountain West, coming in fourth place with 160 points in the 2011 preseason poll, which is voted on by media representatives who cover the conference.

Released at the league's annual media day in Las Vegas, the MW preseason poll has the Aztecs picked for fourth place, their highest projected finish since being pegged for third in 2004. Last season, San Diego State was projected to come in sixth place, but ended up in a tie for third after posting a 9-4 overall record and a 5-3 mark in Mountain West play. It marked the fifth time in the last six seasons that SDSU has finished at or higher than its

projected finish.

MW newcomer Boise State was picked to win the league title in 2011, capturing 28 of the 31 first-place votes and earning 236 points overall. The Broncos were followed by TCU, Air Force, San Diego State, Colorado State, Wyoming, UNLV and New Mexico.

FOUR AZTECS NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-MOUNTAIN WEST TEAM

■ San Diego State senior linebacker Miles Burris, sophomore running back Ronnie Hillman, junior cornerback Leon McFadden and senior punter Brian Stahovich were all named to the preseason all-conference team. This marked just the second time in league history that the Aztecs placed a student-athlete on the all-conference offensive, defensive and special teams and is the program's most preseason all-league picks since 2004, when it also had four honorees.

McFadden was tabbed a first-team all-league selection in 2010, when he led the MW in passes defended per game (1.08). He ranked third on the team in tackles with a career-high 55 with seven of those stops behind the line of scrimmage. The Inglewood, Calif., native also had a pair of interceptions, started every contest and returned punts.

Stahovich (Solana Beach, Calif.), a first-team all-conference selection a year ago, led the Mountain West and ranked eighth nationally in punting as a junior with a 45.4 yard average. He is a two-time nominee for the Ray Guy Award (top punter) and has 41 career punts of 50 yards or more, including a school-record 89-yard punt last season in the victory at Wyoming.

SDSU ANNOUNCES TEAM CAPTAINS

■ Aztec head coach Rocky Long announced last week that seniors J.J. Autele (Waipahu, Hawaii), Miles Burris and Ryan Lindley have been named football team captains for the upcoming 2011 season. The three were selected in a vote by their teammates.

Autele has played in 28 games in his three seasons as an Aztec. Last season, he played in all 13 contests and was tied for fifth on the team in sacks. Burris has started 25 of his 37 career appearances, and is coming off a year in which he led the Mountain West in sacks and tackles-for-a-loss. Lindley, who enters his fourth year as SDSU's starting quarterback, has already amassed 9,537 career passing yards and 67 touchdowns in 36 games.

FAULK INDUCTED INTO PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

■ Former San Diego State running back Marshall Faulk was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame on Aug. 6 in Canton, Ohio, along with Deion Sanders, Shannon Sharpe, Richard Dent, Ed Sabol, Les Richter and Chris Hanburger.

A three-time All-American (1991-93), Faulk holds the SDSU record for most 300-, 200-, and 100-yard rushing performances by a player and the record for the most 200-yard rushing efforts in a single season. He led the nation in rushing as a freshman in 1991 with 1,429 yards and in 1992 as sophomore with 1,630 yards. Faulk finished in the top nine of the Heisman Trophy balloting in all three of his seasons, including second in 1992 and fourth in 1993. In his time as an Aztec, he rushed for 4,589 yards and 57 touchdowns.

San Diego State's all-time career leading rusher was the second overall pick by the Indianapolis Colts in the 1994 NFL Draft. A seven-time NFL Pro Bowl selection, he rushed for 1,000 yards in seven of his first eight seasons. Faulk was named NFL Most Valuable Player in 2000, after setting a single-season record for touchdowns (26) that included a league-leading 18 rushing scores. He also won the world championship with the St. Louis Rams in Super Bowl XXXIV on Jan. 30, 2000.

GAME 1

Sept. 3 ♦ Qualcomm Stadium (34,384)

vs. Cal Poly

SAN DIEGO – The San Diego State football team put on an impressive performance on both sides of the ball, downing Cal Poly, 49-21. With the win before 34,384 fans at Qualcomm Stadium, SDSU claimed its season opener in consecutive years for the first time since 2003-04.

SDSU wasted no time kicking off the 2011 season, marching 81 yards on just six plays to take an early 7-0 lead on a Ronnie Hillman 2-yard run. After a punt, San Diego State scored a TD on three consecutive drives to open up a 28-14 lead at the half.

Quarterback Ryan Lindley found Gavin Escobar for a 3-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter, and Dylan Denso on touchdown passes of 3 and 33 yards in the second quarter to account for the Aztecs' other first-half scores, while Cal Poly countered with a 3-yard run by Mark Rodgers and a 17-yard rushing score by Jake Romanelli.

Despite not mounting much of an offensive attack in the third, the SDSU defense came up big after the break, keeping the Mustangs to just 10 total yards of offense. Lindley threw his fourth touchdown of the game and in the process broke Todd Santos' school record for career touchdowns with his 71st on an 18-yard pass to Colin Lockett.

Hillman scampered for a 27-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter to put San Diego State up 42-14. Following a 2-yard rushing touchdown by Cal Poly's Andre Broadous, Lockett responded with a 94-yard kickoff return for the final score of the game. Lockett's kickoff return was the longest by an Aztec since 1997, and the eighth-longest return in school history.

Besides outgaining the Mustangs, 492-284, SDSU had 10 more first downs (22-12) than Cal Poly, outrushed the visitors, 289-137, and had 203 passing yards to the Mustangs' 147. Additionally, San Diego State had the ball 36:08 compared to just 23:52 for Cal Poly.

Hillman led the Aztec offensive attack with 189 yards on 28 carries and two scores. It was his seventh 100-yard game of his career, all which have eclipsed the 150-yard barrier.

Lindley passed for 203 yards and four touchdowns, while Denso (66 yards, 2 TD) and Escobar (36 yards, TD) each caught four passes. Lockett, meanwhile, had three catches for 82 yards and a touchdown.


