### NEWS AND NOTES (through March 9)

- Having reached the Mountain West semifinals for the 10th consecutive season, San Diego State faces Colorado State on Friday night at 9:30 p.m. PT in the event's second semifinal game.
- The Aztecs reached the semifinal round by rallying from a 21-point deficit to defeat UNLV for an 11th consecutive time, 62-52 in overtime, and in possibly their best overall performance of the season, defeated Boise State, 87-68.
- San Diego State is looking to advance to the championship game for the fourth straight season, the eighth time in nine years and the 10th time in Mountain West history. SDSU's nine appearances in the title game is the best among active members.
- San Diego State is looking to secure its 12th consecutive 20-win campaign. The streak, which currently stands at 11, is tied for the seventh-longest active streak in the nation.
- Junior forward **Malik Pope** has posted a pair of double-doubles the last two days (13 points, career-best 12 rebounds at UNLV, and a career-high 22 points and 10 rebounds vs. Boise State). He now has three career Mountain West tourney double-doubles, matching Kawhi Leonard and Marcus Slaughter for the most in school history.
- San Diego State dropped two one-point decisions to Colorado State this season. The Aztecs lost 78-77 in San Diego on Jan. 28, and 56-55 on Feb. 25 in Fort Collins.
- The teams have met five times at neutral sites with all of them coming in the Mountain West tournament (2006, 2007, 2010, 2012 and 2015). The Aztecs have won four of those meetings, dropping only the 2007 game. This is the third time the teams have played in the semifinal round.
- With a 2-0 record this season, San Diego State improves to 27-13 in the Mountain West tourney. The 67.5-percent success rate is the highest winning percentage among the league's current membership.
- SDSU has won this event four times (2002, 2006, 2010 and 2011), which is tied with New Mexico for the league lead.
- Amazingly, San Diego State has played for the tournament title three straight years and in seven of the last eight seasons (2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015 and 2016).
- The Aztecs are the six seed for the third time in the Mountain West era (2004, 2005) and own a 3-2 record in that slot.
- Although SDSU has been the No. 1 seed on four occasions (2006, 2012, 2014 and 2016), the Aztecs have only won the event once as the top seed (2006). Other championships have been won from the No. 2 (2011), No. 4 (2010) and No. 5 (2002) positions.
- Four San Diego State student-athletes earned all-conference recognition this week. Junior guard **Trey Kell** earned third-team (coaches, media) honors, sophomore guard **Jeremy Hemsley** (coaches), sophomore forward **Zylan Cheatham** (media) and senior guard **Dakari Allen** (media) were named honorable mention. **Allen** was also named the defensive player of the year and voted to the all-conference defensive team by the coaches.
- This marks the third consecutive season a member of the San Diego State team has been named defensive player of the year in the league (Skylar Spencer in 205 and 2016).
- Fisher-coached teams are 31-19 at Thomas & Mack Center (includes Mountain West postseason games). Fisher's 31 victories in the building are the second most among active Division I head coaches, trailing only former UNLV head coach and current Oklahoma head coach Lon Kruger (100).
- San Diego State is very familiar with Thomas & Mack Center, which is also the home of the MW Championship, and has experienced

plenty of success in the building over the years. Since the start of the 2013-14 campaign, the Aztecs are 12-3 in the building with the three blemishes being single-digit losses in the MW title game. The venue has played host to SDSU celebrations at the Mountain West tournament in 2002, 2010 and 2011.

- Junior forward **Malik Pope**, who has accounted for nine of SDSU's 28 missed games this season due to injury, is averaging 12.8 points, 7.3 rebounds, 1.7 assists and 1.0 blocks during his last 13 games. During that span, he is shooting 43.3 percent from three-point range. In the two tourney games he is averaging 17.5 points, 11.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.5 blocked shots.
- **Pope** has produced remarkable numbers in his career against Colorado State (see bottom of page one). This season is no different, posting 29 points, 14 rebounds, two assists and two blocked shots in 48 minutes of action covering two games.
- **Kell** leads SDSU in scoring (13.1), assists (2.9) and minutes played (31.7). He is one of four players in the league (Elijah Brown (UNM), Jaron Hopkins (FS) and Chandler Hutchinson (BSU)) to average 13 points, 4.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 1.0 steal per game.
- **Hemsley** is averaging 12.9 points and leads the team in three-point field goals (55).
- Long known as one of the best defensive players in the country (see page 47 of the media guide), **Allen** has continued his strong of-fense play. In his last 13 games, he is averaging 8.8 points, 4.5 rebounds and 1.3 assists. During that stretch, he has made 42-of-75 attempts from the floor (56.0 percent).
- **Allen** led all MW players in effective field-goal percentage in league games at 62.6 percent (minimum 80 FGA).
- **Allen** is one of just five players in the Steve Fisher era to record at least 300 rebounds, 100 assists, 100 steals and 50 blocked shots, joining Marcus Slaughter, Chase Tapley, Lorenzo Wade and Billy White.
- Senior center **Valentine Izundu** has nine blocks in the two Mountain West tournament games, tied for the third most in league history. He now has 52 blocked shots on the season, which is tied for the sixth most in program history.
- Despite a 9-9 league record, SDSU was +59 scoring margin in MW games. In five of its nine league defeats, it owned a lead of at least 11 points. In the other four games, it had a seven-point advantage three times and a shot at the buzzer to force overtime in the other.
- Combining the Aztecs' largest leads in their nine conference losses, it totaled 87 points.
- KenPom lists the Aztecs as the ninth "unluckiest" team in the country (a measure of a team's actual winning percentage and what one would expect from its game-by-game efficiencies). Among the 12 unluckiest teams in the nation, SDSU is one of only two teams with a winning record.
- San Diego State is 2-10 this season in games decided by eight points or less. Prior to this season, the Aztecs were 50-22 in games decided by six points or less or in overtime.
- Once again, San Diego State is the top-ranked defensive unit in the conference. In MW games only, the Aztecs ranked first in points

- In each of the last three seasons, SDSU has led the Mountain West (all games) in points allowed per game and field-goal percentage defense. The Aztecs this season own the top defense in terms of points allowed (62.3) and field-goal percentage defense (38.5).

## CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- San Diego State is competing in its 18th Mountain West tournament.
- The Aztecs have won the conference tournament title four times (2002, 2006, 2010 and 2011). SDSU's four titles are tied with New Mexico for the most in league history.
- In the Mountain West era, San Diego State has won the title as the one seed, the two seed, the four seed and the five seed.
- San Diego State's overall MW era tournament record is 27-13 (67.5 percent). The Aztecs' winning percentage of 67.5 percent is the highest in the event's history among active MW members. SDSU surpassed UNLV (26-14, 65.0 percent) on Wednesday after defeating the Runnin' Rebels in the opening round. UNLV has played 33 of their 40 conference tournament games during the span in Thomas & Mack Center.
- San Diego State has advanced to the championship game each of the last three seasons and seven of the last eight seasons.

## SERIES HISTORY VS. COLORADO STATE

- This is the 81st meeting between San Diego State and Colorado State. The all-time series is tied, 40-40.
- SDSU has won 18 of the last 23 vs. the Rams and 19 of the last 24 regular-season match-ups.
- The Aztecs are 25-13 all-time vs. the Rams at home.
- San Diego State is 11-26 at Colorado State, but the Aztecs have won eight of the last 12 at Moby Arena.
- SDSU has handed Colorado State five of its last 33 home losses. Since Feb. 4, 2006, San Diego State is 8-4 at Moby Arena while the rest of the nation is 56-124 as a visitor in the venue.
- SDSU has won 13 of the last 14 (13-1) and 15 of the last 17 (15-2) vs. Colorado State at home.
- Fisher is 28-13 all-time vs. Colorado State and is 8-4 vs. Rams head coach Larry Eustachy. Prior to Eustachy going to Fort Collins for the 2012-13 season, the two coaches met in Fairbanks, Alaska, at the BP Top of the World Classic when Eustachy was at Southern Miss. Fisher and the Aztecs won the third-place game, 79-51.
- Tidbits: Twelve of the last 13 meetings between the teams have been decided by 10 points or less (the outlier came in 2015 in Las Vegas when it was decided by 13 points)... Neither team has shot 50 percent or better from the field in any of the last 16 meetings... SDSU has held Colorado State below 50 percent from the field in each of the last 23 encounters (CSU shot 50.9 percent on March 8, 2007)... San Diego State has nine turnovers or less in 11 of the last 14 meetings (119 total; 8.5 tpg)... In the last 23 meetings (18 of which have been won by SDSU), the Aztecs have held Colorado State to 40.3 percent from the field (529-of-1,312).

## POSTGAME NOTES FROM SDSU'S WIN OVER BOISE STATE

### Team Notes

- The Aztecs win their 10th consecutive quarterfinal round game.
- SDSU improves to 10-4 all-time against Boise State, including a 3-0 mark in the Mountain West tournament.
- San Diego State eliminates the Broncos from the MW tournament for the third time since they joined the league in 2012 (also 2012 and 2013). All three wins by the Aztecs in the MW tournament have come in the quarterfinal round.
- The Aztecs improves to 27-13 all-time in the MW tournament, the best record in MW tournament history.
- SDSU improves to 3-2 in the MW tournament as the No. 6 seed.
- San Diego State improves to 31-19 at the Thomas & Mack Center (including MW postseason games) under head coach Steve Fisher. Fisher's 31 victories at the Thomas & Mack are the second most among active Division I head coaches, trailing only former UNLV head coach and current Oklahoma head coach Lon Kruger.
- The Aztecs improve to 12-3 at the Thomas & Mack since the 2013-14 season with the three blemishes being single-digit losses in the MW title game.
- SDSU improves to 46-16 in its last 62 March games.
- San Diego State scored 15 points in the game's first 6:08 tonight after scoring just 14 in the first half (20:00) Wednesday vs. UNLV.

- The Aztecs scored 42 points in the first half, tied for their second most in the first half this season and most since scoring 42 in a 70-56 win vs. Nevada on Feb. 12.
- SDSU's 87 points were its second most on the season (100 vs. Savannah State).
- San Diego State set its own MW tourney records in points scored (87), field goal percentage (54.7) and 3-point field goal percentage (64.3).
- The Aztecs improve to 18-5 on the season when leading at the half.
- SDSU wins its 58th straight game when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.

##### Malik Pope – 22 points, 10 rebounds, 1 blocked shot, 2 assists

Had his second straight double-double, third of the season and seventh of his career... Now has three double-doubles over his career in the MW tournament, tied with Kawi Leonard and Marcus Slaughter for the most in school history... Is tied with Nevada's Cameron Oliver for the most double-doubles (3) in the MW tournament since 2014-15 (no other player has more than one)... Had his first career game with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds... Became the four Aztec to have at least 20 points and 10 rebounds in a MW tournament game and first since Billy White had 21 and 12 vs. Brigham Young in the 2011 MW title game... Tied his career high with 22 points in just 25 minutes... Scored in double-figures for the 12th time this year and 28th time of his career... Led team in scoring for the sixth time this season and 13th time of his career... Led the team in rebounding for the 11th time this year and 21st time of his career... Made a career-high seven free throws... Is now averaging 15.0 points and 7.7 rebounds per game over his last six MW tournament games.

##### Max Hoetzel – 21 points, 4 rebounds

Scored a career-high 21 points... Reached double-figures in scoring for the first time since the Colorado State home game on Jan. 28, for the 10th time this season and 11th time of his career... Made his first three 3-point attempts and finished the game 5-for-6 from the 3-point arc... The five 3-pointers and 83.3 3-point field goal percentage both tied the best mark by an Aztec in a MW tourney game... In two career games against Boise State (both this season), he is now 10-for-14 (.714) from the 3-point range... Made multiple 3-pointers in the same game for the 14th time this season.

##### Trey Kell – 10 points, 6 rebounds, 2 blocked shots, 5 assists, 1 steal

Reached double-figures in scoring for the 23rd time this season and 57th time of his career... Had six rebounds and now has 34 (8.5 avg.) over his last four games... Became the first Aztec to record at least 10 points, six rebounds, five assists and two blocked shots in a MW tourney game... Tied a career high with two blocked shots.

##### Jeremy Hemsley – 10 points, 2 rebounds, 3 assists

Reached double-figures in scoring for the 19th time this season and 46th time of his career... Had gone four straight games without reaching double-figures in scoring prior to tonight.

##### Valentine Izundu – 2 points, 1 rebound, 4 blocked shots

Had four blocks and now has nine in 42 minutes over two games in the MW tournament... The nine blocks are already tied with New Mexico's Danny Granger (2005) for the third most in a MW tournament, trailing only Wyoming's Justin Williams (23 in 2006) and UNLV's Joel Anthony (11 in 2007)... The nine blocks in career MW tournament games for SDSU only trails Skylar Spencer (22) and Malcolm Thomas (10).

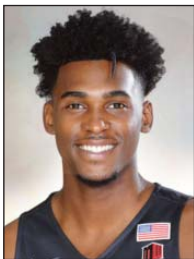
