PACK RETURNS TO NCAA TOURNAMENT:

With a little bit of drama over the last few weeks of the season, not to mention being the last team shown on CBS's Selection Show, NC State will be making its 23rd NCAA appearance.

The Pack was chosen as the 11th seed in the East Region, and will be traveling to Columbus, Ohio, to face sixth-seeded San Diego State on Friday. Game time is 12:40 p.m. on truTV.

The Pack is in the NCAA Tournament for the first time since the 2005-06 season, when NC State made a school record five straight appearances (2002-06). NC State is currently 32-21 in the NCAA Tournament, and is one of just 17 schools to have won multiple titles (1974 and 1983).

PACK AS THE 11TH SEED: NC State will enter the NCAA Tournament as the 11th seed for the second time in school history. The Pack previously was seeded 11th in the East Region in 1987. The Pack traveled to Syracuse, and fell to sixth-seed Florida, 82-70.

PACK VERSUS THE SIXTH SEED: NC State will be looking to capture its first win in the NCAA Tournament against the sixth seed, as the Pack is currently 0-3 in such contests.

The Pack previously fell to sixth-seed Florida in the 1987 tournament in the first round.

NC State also fell to Vanderbilt in the second round in 2004, 75-73, and to Wisconsin in the Sweet 16 in 2005, 65-56, when both teams were the sixth seeds.

PACK IN FIRST ROUND (NOW SECOND ROUND) ACTION: Technically the Pack's first game in the 2012 NCAA Tournament will be in the second round, but in the Pack's previous trips to the Big Dance, NC State has found success in first round action. NC State enters 11-5 in what was formerly the first round, now the second round.

NC STATE VERSUS THE MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE: Friday marks only the sixth time in school history that the Pack is facing a current member of the Mountain West Conference.

NC State is 2-2 all-time against UNLV, last facing the Running Rebels during the 1989-90 season. NC State has also faced Wyoming once, losing in Los Angeles in 1949.

In fact, the Pack has failed to win a NCAA Tournament game only once in its last seven trips. During NC State's recent school record of five consecutive trips (2002-06), the Pack failed to advance out of the first round only once, in 2003 in overtime to California.

FIRST-YEAR FEAT: NC State's Mark Gottfried is just one of seven coaches in the 68-team NCAA field to take his squad to the tournament in his first season. Gottfried and Missouri's Frank Haith are the only two to accomplish this feat at a BCS school.

Gottfried becomes only the third coach in school history to lead his first team to the NCAA Tournament. Only Press Maravich (1965) and Les Robinson (1991) have accomplished that feat before this season.

In Gottfried's two previous coaching stops, he took Murray State to the NCAA Tournament in his second season and Alabama in his fourth year.

NC STATE STAFF KNOWS THE NCAA TOURNAMENT: All three NC State assistant coaches have NCAA Tournament experience.

Bobby Lutz started his NCAA postseason experience with back-to-back NCAA appearances as an assistant coach at

Charlotte in 1997 and 1998. Lutz was then promoted to head coach for the 49ers, and lead them to five NCAA appearances in 1999, 2001, 2002, 2004 and 2005.

Orlando Early was an assistant coach at three different schools that made a combined seven NCAA Tournaments. Early's first NCAA postseason experience came when he was an assistant coach for Western Carolina's 1996 squad that won the Southern Conference. His next postseason experience came as an assistant coach at Charlotte under Lutz in 1999 and 2001. Then Early joined Mark Gottfried's staff at Alabama in 2001 and was an assistant coach for four seasons, reaching the NCAA Tournament in all four years.

Rob Moxley's NCAA postseason experience came as an assistant coach for Charlotte under Lutz, where the 49ers made five NCAA postseason tournament appearances in 1999, 2001, 2002, 2004, 2005.

UNDERDOG MENTALITY: NC State will be entering as a lower seed in the San Diego State game for the 18th time in school history. The Pack is currently 8-9 all-time when coming in as a lower seed, but 3-2 over its last two trips (2005 2-1, 2006 1-1).

With a difference of five spots (San Diego State as a No. 6 and NC State as a No. 11),

the Pack is 3-4 when the margin between the two squads is five or more in its NCAA Tournament history.

THE SERIES VERSUS SAN DIEGO STATE:

Friday's game between NC State and San Diego State will be the first match-up between the two schools.

PACK SOARS AT ACC TOURNAMENT:

NC State entered the 2012 ACC Tournament knowing that it had to improve its resume to be selected to the NCAA Tournament. The Pack took advantage of the opportunity, and thanks to its run to the ACC semifinals, earn an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in six years.

Entering as the fifth seed, the Pack took out 12th seeded Boston College in the first round, 78-57. Scood Wood scored a game-high 22 points on 5-of-9 from three-point range.

The Pack then got revenge for a one-point regular season loss to fourth seed Virginia, downing the Cavs, 67-64, in the quarterfinals. C.J. Leslie had his second straight double-double with 19 points and 14 rebounds, while Lorenzo Brown finished with 15 points and eight assists.

NC State came up just short against the top-seeded Tar Heels in the ACC Tournament semifinals, 69-67. UNC's Kendall Marshall banked in the winning shot with 10.6 seconds left, as Leslie went for 22 points, despite fouling out with 8:03 left, and Brown had 16.

FROM PUPS TO VETS: Last year at the ACC Tournament, then-freshmen Lorenzo Brown and C.J. Leslie had a short stay and a rough go in the 75-67 first round loss to Maryland.

In the loss to the Terps, Brown was 3-of-13 from the field, and had just 8 points in 28 minutes. Leslie was 2-of-9 from the field, and scored just 5 points in 19 minutes, although he did pull down 11 rebounds.

This season was much different, as the Pack's sophomore duo pushed the Pack to wins over Boston College and then Virginia before the Pack fell in the semifinals to North Carolina 69-67.

Leslie posted team-best averages of 17.3 points and 10.7 rebounds and shot 69.7 percent (23-33) from the field. He finished with double-doubles in the wins over Boston College (11-11) and Virginia (19-14), and had

22 points in the loss to the Tar Heels despite fouling out with 8:03 left.

Brown was the conductor of the Pack's offense, as he averaged 14.3 points and 7.3 assists. Brown also shot the ball well in the Pack's three games, hitting 55.6 percent (15-27) from the field and 60.0 percent (3-5) from long range.

The two went from averaging 6.5 points and shooting just 22.7 percent (5-22) from the field last year, to averaging 31.7 points a game and shooting 63.3 percent (38-60) at this year's tournament.

For their efforts, Leslie was named first-team All-ACC Tournament while Brown was second-team.

SOPHOMORES CLEAN UP ACC AWARDS:

NC State's sophomore duo of Lorenzo Brown and C.J. Leslie have picked up some ACC hardware of the last two weeks.

Leslie was tabbed an All-ACC second-team selection, while Brown received third-team honors.

Leslie was also named to the All-ACC Tournament first-team after averaging 17.3 points and 10.7 rebounds in the Pack's three games. Leslie is the first Pack player selected to the first-team since Brandon Costner and Gavin Grant led NC State to the 2007 ACC Tournament championship game.

Brown was also recognized in helping the Pack to the ACC semifinals, as he was named to the second-team after averaging 14.3 points and 7.3 assists.

BIG IMPROVEMENT: Going into the NCAA Tournament, NC State has already improved its win total by seven games. Last season, the Pack finished at 15-16, and this season NC State posts a 22-12 mark.

The season marks NC State's biggest turnaround since the 2001-02 squad improved 10 games from 2000-01 (13-16).

FAST PACED: The biggest draw for the returning NC State players with the hire of Mark Gottfried was his commitment to let the Pack get up and down the floor. The Pack has taken advantage of Gottfried's system, as NC State outscores its opponents by 8.7 fast break points per game.

On the season, NC State has a 512-219

(15.1-6.4) advantage in fast break points. The Pack has posted more fast break points than its past seven opponents, and in 28 of the 34 games this season.

But it's not just the Pack scoring fast break points, it is also the Pack getting back on defense and not allowing them. In the 34 games this season, opponents have been held to single digits in fast break points 27 times (compared to only six for NC State), and the Pack has even held three teams to zero in a contest this year.

PACK COACHES SUCCESSFUL IN TOURNAMENT PLAY:

NC State has had six previous coaches lead the Pack into the NCAA Tournament, and every one of the six posted at least a .500 record in tournament play during their NCSU careers. Overall, NC State is 32-21 in NCAA Tournament play, a 60 percent winning percentage.

Everett Case was 6-6 in his career in NCAA Tournament games, while Press Maravich was 1-1, Norm Sloan was 5-2, Jim Valvano was 14-6, Les Robinson was 1-1 and Herb Sendek was 5-5.

NC State is one of only six schools to have every coach in its history have at least a .500 record in NCAA play, given a minimum of four coaches. The others who have done it are Georgetown, Maryland, Michigan, Oklahoma and Syracuse. In fact, only Michigan with seven coaches, eclipses the Pack's six coaches that have done so.

FROM WRONG TO RIGHT: In mid-February, NC State had the opportunity to get some all-important quality wins to bolster its NCAA Tournament resume. The Pack faced No. 5 Duke, No. 20 Florida State, No. 7 North Carolina, and went to Clemson. But the Pack lost all four, its longest losing streak of the season.

NC State has turned things around, winning the final two regular season games and advancing to the ACC Tournament semifinals with wins over Boston College and Virginia before falling 69-67 to North Carolina. That stretch of four straight wins over ACC foes was the most since the 2005-06 season (4).

Not many statistical categories are that much different when comparing the numbers of both stretches. In the four losses, Pack opponents shot 44.5 percent compared to 39.4 percent over the last five games. The Pack's three-point shooting improved from

28.8 percent in the losses, to 36.1 percent.

On of the main factors in the Pack's late season turnaround has been Scott Wood.

During the Pack's four game losing streak, Wood was the Pack's seventh leading scorer averaging 6.0 points while shooting just 20.0 percent (4-20) from three-point range. But during the Pack's last five games, Wood has been the Pack's third leading scorer at 13.2 points and has shot 41.7 percent (15-36) from long range.

MOVES TO MAKE: Even though the Pack plays only three players in the post, two are 6'8" and one is 6'9", the Pack has been getting work done down low.

During the Pack's run in the ACC Tournament, NC State outscored Boston College, Virginia and North Carolina a combined 102-88 in points in the paint. In fact, the Pack has won the points in the paint battle the last seven games and in 14 of the 19 games against ACC foes this season.

The Pack received production from its 'biggs' with C.J. Leslie averaging 17.3 points, Richard Howell 10.0 points and DeShawn Painter 6.3 points in the three games in Atlanta.

BROWN DELIVERS FOR THE PACK: Point guard Lorenzo Brown has been a great leader of Coach Mark Gottfried's offense this season.

In his first full season running the show, Brown has done a tremendous job of not only learning a new system like his teammates, but he's become the first Pack player since Chris Corchiani in 1991 to crack the season top-10 list in assists.

Brown's 216 assists this season is the seventh-best single season mark. He is only seven from tying Nate McMillian (Portland Trailblazers head coach) for sixth on the list.

BEEFING UP THE SCHEDULE: One of the first things head coach Mark Gottfried did when he accepted the NC State coaching job, was go out and improve the schedule. With the support of the NC State administration to drop and add games after contracts were already signed, Gottfried and his staff put together one of the top schedules nationally which played into the Pack's NCAA Tournament at-large bid.

Going into the NCAA Tournament, NC State strength of schedule is 26th nationally according to CollegeRPI.com. Even more impressive, the Pack's non-conference SOS is 21st, and the sixth-best among BCS schools.

The Pack has played 12 games against 10 teams in the 2012 NCAA field.

GOTTFRIED COLLECTS 300TH CAREER WIN: Mark Gottfried earned the 300 win of his career in the 67-64 win over Virginia.

LESLIE PICKS UP THE PACE: C.J. Leslie, an ACC Tournament first-team and All-ACC second-team selection, has picked up his play over the last 19 games, averaging 17.4 points and 10.6 rebounds per game. In his 29 games played this season, only three have not been double figures.

He is the Pack's top returning scorer from a year ago (11.0 ppg) and he leads NC State in scoring with an average of 14.4 points per contest this season.

STARTING PRODUCTION: This season, the Pack's starting quintet is accounting for .810 percent of the team's scoring. That figure reflects a considerable power boost from last year when the starters were responsible for .646 percent of the scoring. It's also the highest scoring production by the starters since the 2006-07 season.

OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION: NC State ranks third in the ACC in scoring offense at 73.6 points per game. UNC leads the league in the category with an output of 82.4 points per contest followed by Duke at 78.2 points per game.

WOOD MOVES UP CAREER THREE-POINTER

LIST: Scott Wood has now made 223 during his NC State career, which ties for second in school history along with Engin Atsür. But Wood is still 99 behind the school's all-time leader, Rodney Monroe.

WOOD FROM THREE: Scott Wood is shooting .411 percent (88-of-210) from three-point range this season.

Wood's season-high for threes in a game is six in the win over Wake Forest on Feb. 4.

Wood's 29-game streak with a made three pointer ended in the Pack ACC semifinal loss to North Carolina.

WOOD FREE THROW STREAK ENDS: On Feb. 9, NC State fans and the media that follow the Pack saw something from Scott Wood it hasn't seen since last season: a missed first free throw.

After making his first two attempts in the win at Georgia Tech, he missed his next three tries.

Wood's 66 successful conversions dating back to last year is good for the fourth best streak in NCAA history. He also eclipsed the ACC free throws made mark, formerly held by Duke's J.J. Redick (54, 2003-04).

Wood's latest streak of 16 consecutive made free throws ended with a miss against Virginia in the ACC Tournament.

CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARDS: Junior forward Richard Howell leads the Wolfpack in rebounding with an average of 9.3 boards per game.

Howell is the first Pack player since Todd Fuller during the 1995-96 season to average nine plus boards a game. If Howell could

THE DIFFERENCE MAKERS: NC State has not only improved its overall and conference record from a year ago, but each of the five starters has improved in almost every statistical category. Some of the improvements come from more playing time, as all five starters are playing more minutes in 2011-12.

However, three of those starters, Scott Wood, C.J. Leslie and Lorenzo Brown, are averaging less than five minutes more per game than a year ago and yet have improved across the boards.

push his average in double digits, he would become the first NC State player since Kenny Carr registered double figures in rebounds (10.3) in 1975-76.

HOWELL IN THE ACC SUPERLATIVES: Richard Howell has posted several performances that rank him among the league's best this year.

Howell's career-best 18 boards against Virginia is tied for the second best rebounding performance in the ACC this season with

UNC's Tyler Zeller, who also had 18 boards against Wake on Jan. 3. He is also tied for the fourth-best (17 vs. Campbell, 12/29) and ninth-best (16 vs. Boston College, 1/19) rebounding days in the conference this season.

His .846 percent (11-of-13) shooting display versus Morehead State is the third-best performance by a ACC player this season.

DOUBLE FIGURE SCORING: In 30 of its 34 contests this season, the Pack has had at least three players score in double figures.

Against Wake Forest (2/4/12) and at home versus the Yellow Jackets, the Pack had five players record double figures. The other time NC State accomplished this feat was against Western Carolina (12/31/11). The Pack is 2-1 this season when it has five players score in double figures.

Versus North Carolina (2/21) and Florida State, only C.J. Leslie and Lorenzo Brown scored in double figures for the Pack. Leslie had a career-high 24 points against the Heels and 21 against Seminoles. Brown had 18 points in the North Carolina at home and 12 against FSU. Including the first UNC game (1/26/12), the only other occasion on which NC State did not reach this mark was the St. Bonventure contest. Yet the Wolfpack was able to notch a 67-65 win. Only Scott Wood (20) and C.J. Leslie (12) tallied double figures against the Bonnies. Against the Tar Heels, Wood was the only Pack player log double figures with 11.

NC State has five players that are averaging double-figure scoring: C.J. Leslie (14.6), Lorenzo Brown (12.7), Scott Wood (12.5), Richard Howell (10.7) and C.J. Williams (10.6). The Pack is the one of ACC programs (Duke) that can boast four starters in the league's top 25 scorers.

THE OTHER STREAK IS OVER: Junior forward Scott Wood's streak of 70 consecutive starts ended when he didn't start in the Wolfpack's victory over Texas on Nov. 21. Wood also did not start in State's loss to Vanderbilt on Nov. 19. Wood missed the Vandy game due to a sprained ankle suffered in the early going of the Princeton game on Nov. 16. His consecutive games started streak ranks 10th all-time at NCSU.

GETTING IT DONE AT THE LINE: Against the Longhorns, NC State attempted a season-high 44 free throws and converting 33 of those attempts (75 percent). The 33 made free throws are most made by an ACC team this season.

Last season, the Wolfpack attempted 41 free throws against Tennessee Tech with 31 made in a 82-69 win. The NC State record for free throws attempted in a game is 52 against Charleston Southern on Nov. 27, 1998, in 93-57 victory.

PACK SIGNING CLASS NAMED TO McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICA SQUAD: All three of NC State's men's basketball signees for next season, Tyler Lewis, Rodney Purvis and T.J. Warren, were named to the prestigious McDonald's All-American team on Thursday. This marks only the third time in school history that more than one incoming Wolfpack player was named to the squad and the first time the Pack has ever boasted three. NC State was the only school with three selections this year.

In addition to the incoming trio, 13 other State players have been named McDonald's All-Americans. In 1979, high school teammates Sidney Lowe and Dereck Whittenburg were both honored as seniors at DeMatha High School before coming to NC State, where they would end up leading the Pack to the 1983 national title. In 1987, Chris Corchiani and Rodney Monroe, who went on to become the Pack's legendary "Fire and Ice" combo, were selected.

PACK INKS NO. 7 CLASS IN EARLY SIGNING PERIOD: On Nov. 9, first-year NC State basketball coach Mark Gottfried announced the signings of Tyler Lewis (Statesville, N.C.), Rodney Purvis (Raleigh, N.C.) and T.J. Warren (Durham, N.C.) to play for the Wolfpack beginning with the 2012-13 season.

"We're extremely excited about Tyler, Rodney and T.J.," said Gottfried. "They are great additions to our team. We like that they are great people, and they have the potential to become great players."

The highly touted trio is considered one of the premier classes by several recruiting services and media outlets. According to ESPN 100 rankings, Gottfried has assembled the No. 7 class in the nation, while Rivals.com has rated the Wolfpack's incoming class as the No. 3 class in the country.

"The class that Mark Gottfried has put together will change the direction of the program," said Paul Biancardi, National Director of Recruiting for ESPN. "This is an impressive class considering the team is coming off some tough years. The perception of NC State is changing under Mark Gottfried. He and his staff will not be outworked."

GOTTFRIED 11TH ACC FIRST YEAR COACH TO TAKE TEAM TO NCAA

Mark Gottfried is the 11th ACC coach to take his team to the NCAA Tournament in his first year with an ACC program. He is the first two do it since Brad Brownell led Clemson to the tournament just last year with a 22-12 record, the same record the Pack had this year.

NC State and North Carolina are the only ACC schools to have three different coaches take to a league team to the NCAA Tournament in their first year with the program.

If Gottfried can lead NC State to the Sweet 16 he would be just the second ACC head coach to do that in his first year. Bill Guthridge took North Carolina to the Final Four in 1997-98 in his first year.

NC State Mark Gottfried has led NC State to 22 wins entering the NCAA Tournament. He is tied for third in victories for an ACC Coach in his first year with a league program. The record is 34 by Bill Guthridge at North Carolina in 1997-98. Matt Doherty had a 26-7 record in his first year at North Carolina.

Gottfried is the 11th ACC head coach to take a league program to at least 20 wins in his first year with the program. He is the fourth NC State coach to do it and the Pack program has had the most coaches accomplish this. Press Maravich did it in 1964-65, Les Robinson in 1990-91 and Sidney Lowe in 2006-07 all won at least 20 in their first seasons.

While Gottfried is sixth in wins, he has the Pack ranked 49th in the RPI entering the NCAAs, the fourth best RPI among programs with coaches in their first year.

ATLANTA, GA. - The Pack earned its 18th victory and seventh ACC win with a 61-52 decision over Georgia Tech. The win helped NC State avenge an earlier loss to the Yellow Jackets in January and helped it earn its fourth conference road win of the season. C.J. Williams led the Pack in scoring with a team-high 15 points on 6-of-11 shooting. C.J. Leslie added 13 points, going 5-of-10 from the floor. Leslie also grabbed 10 boards for his third double-double of the year. Scott Wood and Lorenzo Brown each chipped in 10 points to round out the Wolfpack's double figure scorers. NC State fans saw something from Wood it had not seen in sometime, a miss from the free throw line. history on April 5, 2011. He inherited a team that hadn't been to the NCAA Tournament in five years and had not finished higher than ninth in the ACC standings.

In less than a year's time, Gottfried and his staff have turned that team into a force to be reckoned with. The Pack enters the NCAA Tournament with 22 wins and finished the ACC regular season tied for fourth in the league standings.

Gottfried, 47, came to NC State after serving as an ESPN basketball analyst the last two seasons. One of America's most respected coaches, he brought a wealth of experience and achievement to the Wolfpack position. He spent 11 seasons as head coach at Alabama (1999-09), compiling a record of 210-132 with five NCAA Tournament and three NIT appearances. He led Alabama to three top 25 final rankings, including one top 10 ranking.

He led the Tide to the SEC regular season championship in his fourth season, also the first of five straight trips to the NCAA Tournament. For his efforts, Gottfried was named the 2002 SEC Coach of the Year.

Gottfried's 2002-03 squad became the first in Alabama history to be ranked No. 1 in the AP poll, as the team held the ranking for two weeks.

The program achieved another first during the 2003-04 season, as Alabama upset top-ranked and top-seeded Stanford in the second round of the NCAA Tournament and then defeated reigning national champion Syracuse to advance to the school's first Elite Eight appearance.

Gottfried served as head coach at Murray State for three seasons, compiling a 68-24 record and 40-12 in conference play. In his first season with the Racers, Gottfried's squad advanced to the 1996 NIT, then made the NCAA Tournament in both 1997 and 1998. He coached Murray State to Ohio Valley Conference championships in each of his seasons as head coach, becoming the first head coach to win three OVC titles in only three seasons. In his last season, the Racers finished 25th in the final AP poll with a 29-4 record.

Prior to his stint at Murray State, Gottfried spent eight years as an assistant at UCLA (1988-95) and was on the staff when the Bruins won the 1995 national championship. Gottfried coached under Jim Harrick, and was an assistant along with current St. John's head coach Steve Lavin and current Washington head coach Lorenzo Romar.

He started his collegiate playing career at Oral Roberts, where he was a freshman all-american during his one season (1983) with the Golden Eagles.

Gottfried then transferred to Alabama, where he started 98 consecutive games and helped the Crimson Tide advance to the Sweet Sixteen in all three seasons he played. He holds the school record for most three-point field goals in a single game (8), and is the school's all-time leader in three-point field goal percentage (.485).

Gottfried earned a B.A. in communications from Alabama in 1987. He won both the school's Hayden Riley Top Scholar Award and the Bryant Award as the school's top scholar-athlete during his senior year.

A seventh round draft pick of the Detroit Pistons in the 1987 NBA Draft, Gottfried would go on and tour internationally with Athletes in Action as a player in 1987-88 and later returned in 1989 to coach a summer tour in Poland and Germany.

Gottfried is the son of Joe and Mary Gottfried. Joe is the former Director of Athletics at South Alabama before retiring in 2009 after 25 years. His uncle, Mike Gottfried, was a longtime college football coach and serves as an ESPN college football analyst.

Born January 20, 1964 in Crestline, Ohio, Gottfried is married to the former Elizabeth Kozel, the couple has five children: Brandon (20), Mary Layson (19), Cameron (16), Aaron (15), and Dillon (14). Brandon is currently plays tight end for the Stanford football team.

Orlando Early is in his second stint working with head coach Mark Gottfried. Early spent four seasons as an assistant under Gottfried at Alabama (2001-05), helping the Crimson Tide reach the NCAA Tournament all four years.

"Orlando was on my staff for four years at Alabama and he is one of the best assistants I've ever had," said Gottfried. "He played a vital role during our most successful years, including our run to the Elite Eight in 2004.

"He's been a successful head coach - he was the coach of the year in the Sun Belt Conference. He's also a tremendous recruiter and will have a great relationship with our players. I'm very excited to have him join us here at NC State."

Early spent four seasons (2001-05) as an assistant under Gottfried at Alabama. The Crimson Tide topped the 20-win mark three times, posted a combined 88-41 record, advanced to four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, held a No. 1 national ranking, won an SEC regular-season championship and made an NCAA Elite Eight appearance with Early on the bench. His work as an assistant coach was recognized on a national level in 2004, as Athlon Sports named him the third-best assistant coach in the nation.

Early joins the Wolfpack after serving one season as an assistant coach at South Carolina. Prior to that he spent the previous five seasons as the head coach at the University of Louisiana-Monroe.

"I am really excited to join Coach Gottfried once again and be part of his staff," said Early. "We had a great four years at Alabama, and we are hoping to duplicate that success. I am excited to be coaching in the ACC, and looking forward to once again bringing success here to NC State."

Early led Louisiana-Monroe to a 60-92 record during his five-year tenure, including a 43-24 mark in home contests. He led a squad that was heavily affected by Hurricane Katrina to a 10-18 mark during his first season (2005-06), and followed that with an 18-14 record in 2006-07 - the program's first winning season since 2001-02. His sophomore squad collected a 14-0 mark in home contests and a share of the Sun Belt Conference West Division title in the program's first season in the league.

For his efforts, Early was named Coach of the Year by four different outlets, including the Sun Belt Conference, Louisiana Association of Basketball Coaches, the Louisiana Sports Writers Association and National Association of Basketball Coaches (District 8 Coach of the Year). He also concluded the season as a finalist for the Hugh Durham Mid-Major Coach of the Year award.

Early began his coaching career at his alma mater, Gardner-Webb, serving as an assistant from 1993-95. He followed with a three-year stint at Western Carolina. He was an assistant coach in 1996, when the Catamounts captured the Southern Conference championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament. He served as associate head coach during his last two years at Western Carolina.

Early followed his term at WCU by continuing to climb the coaching ladder, spending three seasons (1998-01) as an assistant at Charlotte under head coach Bobby Lutz. He helped the 49ers to a pair of Conference USA titles, two NCAA Tournament appearances and an NIT appearance.

Early and his wife, Jualeah, have three children, Nakita, Storm and Erica.

Considered one of the top basketball minds in the nation, Bobby Lutz is in his first season as an assistant coach on head coach Mark Gottfried's inaugural staff at NC State.

"I coached against Bobby so I know from first-hand experience what an exceptional coach he is," said Gottfried. "He has great ties in the state of North Carolina from his time at Charlotte and Pfeiffer and that will be a huge help for us in recruiting. That recruiting advantage, plus his on-the-floor coaching expertise, will make him an asset in every part of our program."

The 53-year-old Lutz comes to NC State after a season on the staff at Iowa State, where he helped the Cyclones earn their highest win total since 2005-06. Prior to his stint in Ames, Lutz served as the head coach at Charlotte from 1999-2010, where he led his alma mater to eight postseason appearances (five NCAA, three NIT) in his 12 years at the helm. He is the winningest coach in 49er history, posting a record of 218-158.

A native of Catawba, N.C., Lutz led Charlotte to a school-record five 20-win seasons, averaged more than 18 wins a year and won three league titles (1999, 2001, 2004) in his tenure with the 49ers. He had four top-20 national recruiting classes and tutored 10 players who earned first-team all-conference honors. Five times in his career a Lutz-coached 49er squad knocked off a top-10 opponent, including a win over No. 3 Cincinnati in 1999. Five of the eight wins over top-10-ranked opponents in Charlotte's history came under Lutz's watch.

In 2005, Lutz was a finalist for the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award.

Prior to being named head coach, Lutz was an assistant coach at Charlotte for three seasons (1996-98) under head coach Melvin Watkins. The 49ers compiled a record of 56-35 and went to back-to-back NCAA Tournaments when Lutz was an assistant for Watkins.

Prior to his stint at Charlotte, Lutz molded Pfeiffer University, an NAIA school in Misenheimer, N.C., into a national power as head coach from 1987-95. He posted a 181-91 record and qualified for six-straight NAIA Tournament berths, including three Final Four appearances. His teams had an .785 winning percentage (153-42) from 1990-95 and he developed 10 NAIA All-Americans.

From 1985-86, Lutz served as an assistant at Clemson.

Lutz graduated with "High Honors" from UNC Charlotte in 1980 with a degree in economics and psychology and a 3.82 GPA. He earned three other degrees: Lenoir-Rhyne, 1981 (A.B. Secondary Education); Winthrop, 1985 (M.A.T. Secondary Social Studies); Clemson, 1986 (M.A. Education - Administration & Supervision).

Lutz has been extremely active in off-the-court endeavors and goodwill campaigns in his successful career. He has served as the honorary chair of the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society's Light Up the Night Campaign as well as the Coaches' Curing Kids' Cancer organization.

He is a member of Pfeiffer's Athletics Hall of Fame and UNC Charlotte's Alumni Hall of Fame.

Lutz and his wife, Janet, have two daughters: Natalie and Christine.

When NC State head coach Mark Gottfried announced the hiring of Rob Moxley as an assistant coach on the Wolfpack staff, it marked the third time that Moxley and Bobby Lutz have worked together.

"I've known Rob for a long time and I've always had great respect for him," said Gottfried. "He is a phenomenal recruiter with great ties along the Atlantic coast and he will be a tremendous asset to our coaching staff."

Moxley comes to NC State after serving as an assistant coach at Middle Tennessee last season. Prior to his one-year stint at MTSU, he served as Lutz's associate head coach at Charlotte for five seasons and was with the program 12 years overall. He served as an assistant coach for seven years (1999-2005) before accepting an assistant coaching position at Maryland in 2005-06. He returned to Charlotte after one season to take over as associate head coach.

In 2008, HoopScooponline.com ranked Moxley among the nation's top 100 assistant coaches. In 2007, rivals.com ranked him as one of the Top 25 recruiters in the country, and Basketball Times placed him 10th in its top 16 "Friends of Junior Colleges".

During his time at Charlotte, Moxley helped land four Top 20 recruiting classes for the 49ers and was instrumental in signing 2001 ESPN.com National Freshman of the Year Rodney White and 2003 All-Conference USA choice Demon Brown. Moxley helped attract Maryland's 18th-ranked 2006 recruiting class (Rivals.com) and recruited 2010 ACC Player of the Year and 2010 NBA first-round pick Greivis Vasquez.

He began as an assistant under Lutz at Pfeiffer University in 1993. They worked together for two years before moving together to Gardner-Webb in 1995. When Lutz was offered an assistant position with the 49ers for 1995-96, Moxley remained at Gardner-Webb. He returned to Pfeiffer for two years, 1996-98, as an assistant to head coach Dave Davis.

A 1994 graduate of Pfeiffer, Moxley and his wife Jennifer have four children: Joey, Emily, Allison and Jack. He was a junior college Division III All-America guard in 1991 at Montgomery (Md.) C.C. He played two seasons at Newberry (S.C.) College under coach Tom Quinn.

A 26-year veteran of the coaching ranks, Jeff Dunlap is in his first year as the Wolfpack's director of basketball operations. Dunlap is no stranger to NC State head coach Mark Gottfried with the two having an association that spans more than 20 years, including a two-year stint in which

Dunlap served on Gottfried's staff at Alabama.

"It's great to be able to work with Jeff again," said Gottfried. "He brings years of experience on every level to our program and will be a tremendous asset from an operations standpoint. He understands the UCLA system and is a visionary guy who sees the big picture and can pinpoint what needs to be done."

A proven and successful coach, administrator and recruiter, Dunlap has worked in the SEC, MAC, Horizon League and Big West Conference in his Division I tenure and also coached in the Division II and junior college ranks.

Dunlap served as an assistant coach at Western Michigan last season, helping lead the Broncos to a 21-13 record and a postseason berth. It was his second stint at WMU, as he also served as an assistant coach from 2005-07.

Dunlap spent the 2010 season working for Big Shots, an organization that organizes exposure camps for high school basketball players across the country. He was the tournament director at camps held in Georgia and Alabama.

Prior to his most recent stint at Western Michigan, Dunlap spent two seasons (2008-09) as an assistant coach and director of basketball operations at Alabama. In his first season with the Crimson Tide, he was promoted to assistant coach at midyear.

Dunlap spent four seasons as an assistant at the University of Georgia (2000-03), helping the program claim the SEC East title in 2002 on the way to finishing 22-10 and No. 23 in the country in the final AP poll. Georgia advanced to back-to-back NCAA Tournaments in 2001 and 2002 with Dunlap on staff.

Other stops on Dunlap's extensive resume include Loyola-Chicago (2004, 1999), Fullerton College (1998), Cal-State Fullerton (1995-97), Quincy University (1992-94) and College of the Canyons (1989-91).

Dunlap is also the founder and director of the California-based Complete Player Basketball Camp, which he runs with former UCLA teammate Jack Haley, an 11-year NBA veteran. Throughout his career, Dunlap has gained additional experience by participating in several basketball camps including the Superstar Invitational, John Wooden and Pat Riley camps.

Dunlap earned a bachelor's degree in political science from UCLA in 1986 and a master's in education from Azusa Pacific University in 1998. As a student-athlete at UCLA, he was the recipient of the Outstanding Senior Award in 1986. Dunlap started his collegiate career at Los Angeles Pierce Community College and then was a three-year letterman for the Bruins from 1984-86 and a member of the 1985 NIT Championship team, playing under Larry Farmer and Walt Hazzard.

Dunlap is married to the former DeeDee Hinson, who played basketball at Azusa Pacific. The couple has two children, Brady Douglas (7) and Brooklin Grace (4).

- ✓ The top three-point shooter in the ACC with a .411 mark for the season.
- ✓ The Pack's third-leading scorer with 12.5 points per game.
- ✓ With 223 career three pointers made, he is tied for second place in school history with Engin Atsur. His 88 three's this season ranks third on the single-season list and only two other players in school history have ever had more in a season (Rodney Monroe and Tom Gugliotta).
- ✓ Has attempted 555 three-pointers for his career, the fourth-highest mark in the Pack record books. His 214 attempts this season also rank third on the school single-season list.
- ✓ Scored 22 points in the Pack's win over Boston College in the first round of the ACC Tournament, hitting 7-of-11 shots from the field, 5-9 on three's

- ✓ Returned from injury in State's win over Texas, scoring 16 on 4-of-9 shooting including 3-of-8 from long range, in 27 minutes.
- ✓ Ranks 10th all-time on the NC State consecutive starts list with 70. Had his starts streak broken when he came off the bench versus Texas after missing the Vandy game.
- ✓ Father played basketball at Western Carolina.
- ✓ Majoring in parks and recreation tourism - program management.
