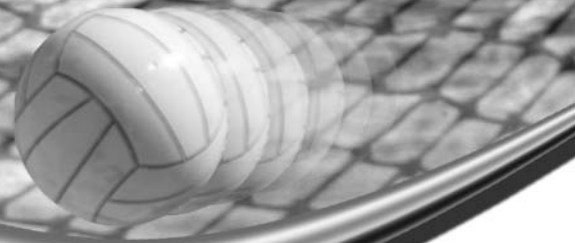

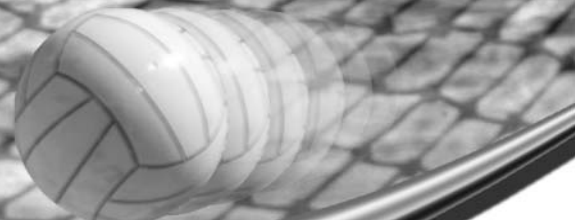

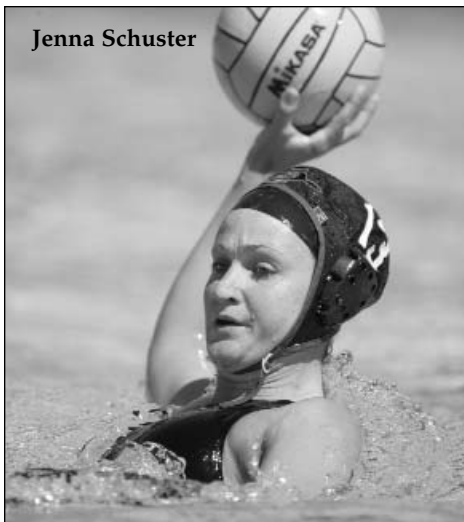

■ SDSU earned its first-ever at-large bid to the NCAA tournament, where the Scarlet and Black finished fourth.

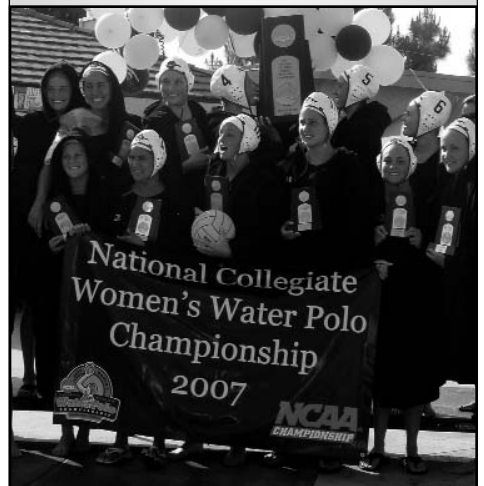
■ Anna Gonzales (80) and Jenna Schuster (84) became San Diego State's first 80-goal scoring duo in school history.

■ Three Aztecs garnered ACWPC All-America honors. Stacy Werner and Anna Gonzales were second- and third-team selections, respectively, while Jenna Schuster received honorable mention recognition. Werner and Schuster also garnered all-MPSF accolades.

■ SDSU had four players named to the MPSF all-academic team including, Tiphonie Elliott, Sarah Kilgore, Jenna Schuster and Becca Ur. It was the third consecutive year that Ur received the award.

■ Rachel Scott-Ruano became the first water polo player to be inducted into the Aztec Hall of Fame on Nov. 2, 2007. Scott-Ruano played for SDSU from 1995-98. As a freshman, she was named the National Collegiate Goalie of the Year and later earned All-America honors in both 1997 (first team) and 1998 (second team).

■ Senior Elana Cervantes was selected as the Mountain West Conference winner for the 2007 NCAA Woman of the Year award in November. Cervantes ended her Aztec career as the all-time leader in assists.
