OPENING KICKOFF

1 The climb starts now. Boise State opens Mountain West Conference play Friday evening at San Diego State on CBS Sports Network. While this will be the ninth meeting between the two programs, it is the first time the two teams will open conference play against each other. Speaking of the Mountain West Conference, San Diego State is the ONLY current MW program against which the Broncos do not have a winning record with each team having won four of the eight meetings (4-4, .500).

2 For the first time in four weeks this season, the Broncos will not face an offense that leads the nation in a major statistical category regardless of level. In the opening week it was Michael Penix Jr and Washington's top-rated pass attack from last season. In the second week UCF brought the country's top-rated rushing attack and second-best total offensive unit. Then the third week saw one of the most prolific offenses in FCS visiting The Blue as North Dakota made its first-ever trip to Boise.

3 Boise State's defense often leaves opponents feeling blue when they are seeing red. Entering this week's contest, the Broncos have posted a Red Zone Defense that ranks 47th in the country. So far this season BSU opponents have scored 10 times (nine touchdowns, one field goal) in 13 visits with the Broncos forcing three red zone turnovers against UCF.

4 Boise State has historically been successful against teams from the California Republic, with an 82-38-3 all-time record against programs from the state.

5 Welcome to Hispanic Heritage Month, which runs from Sept. 15 to Oct. 15 each year. Boise State is proud to celebrate the hispanic heritage of head coach Andy Avalos, one of five hispanic head coaches in the FBS.

Credentials

THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT

SCOUTING SAN DIEGO STATE

- San Diego State enters this week's contest with a 2-2 record, having dropped back-to-back contests to a pair of Pac-12 schools (for now).
- Brady Hoke is in his second stint as head coach of the Aztecs proving that you can go home again.
- By hosting Boise State on Friday, San Diego State will be the only team in the country to have hosted four games through the first five weeks of the season.
- San Diego State has one of the best red zone defenses in the nation, ranking 47th in the country and second in the Mountain West.
- The Aztecs excel at capitalizing on mistakes, ranking 34th in the country in fumbles recovered.
- SDSU leads the country in turnovers gained (10) while ranking 119th in turnovers lost (8). Here's hoping equipment manager Dale Holste packs the Stick 'Em this week.
- Expect a low scoring affair. San Diego State ranks 114th nationally and 11th in the Mountain West in scoring offense, averaging 18.8 points per game.
- However, to move the ball against the Aztecs it might be wise to consider a ground attack. SDSU ranks 33rd nationally and second in the MW in team pass efficiency defense (112.89).
- That defense starts with Cedarius Barfield, the national leader in interceptions (3), while Noah Tumblin (2) follows behind him by ranking eighth nationally.
- But wait, there's more! Tumblin also ranks seventh in the country and second in the Mountain West with 1.8 passes defended per game this season.
- Sure, San Diego State has a good punter in Jack Browning, whose 43.7 average ranks 28th nationally, but does he also have a cool accent?
- With three home games under its belt, the Aztecs are averaging just over 26,000 people per game, or nearly 10,000 fewer per game than its student body enrollment. Boise State is averaging 36,029 fans across two home games. 🤔👀
- The Broncos will be the second team from Idaho that the Aztecs will face this season. San Diego State already battled Idaho State on Sept. 2, escaping with a win from the mighty, mighty Bengals (who were 1-10 last year), 36-28. We do not believe a return trip to Pocatello is in the cards. Pity.
- The first major sport sponsored by San Diego State was rowing, followed by tennis, basketball, golf, croquet and baseball.
- In its early days, San Diego State was a member of the Junior College Conference proving that schools that were a member of a junior college conference more than a half century ago can, in fact, be considered for Power 5 conference membership.

Broncos Rally to Beat San Diego State at Home

BOISE, Idaho — Boise State football scored 35 unanswered points in the second half to rally from a 13-0 halftime deficit and defeat San Diego State, 35-13, Friday night at Albertsons Stadium.

The second half was all in favor of the Broncos (3-2, 2-0 MW), as the Aztecs were held to 12 total yards in the second half — including none through the air. The three-headed rushing attack of George Holani (131), Taylen Green (105) and Ashton Jeanty (82) gave the Blue and Orange 316 rushing yards on the night, its most in a game since a 400-yard outburst against UConn in 2018.

Green jumpstarted Boise State's comeback with a 17-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, as both he and Holani had two rushing scores in the second half. Jeanty powered the Broncos to retake the lead from San Diego State (2-3, 0-1 MW) with a 32-yard run in the waning seconds of the third quarter.

The 35 second-half points are the most for Boise State since matching that total at San Jose State in 2019.

THE CLIMB STARTS NOW

Boise State opens Mountain West Conference play this week and, if history is any indication, that's a good thing for the Broncos. BSU is 58-15 all-time in conference openers and have won 22 of their past 23 league debuts as well as eight straight MW opening games. But it's not just the winning, it's how the team has won. Only once in the past 10 league openers as Boise State allowed more than 20 points.

SUCCESS IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

In its 12 seasons in the Mountain West, Boise State has lost just 15 games in conference play, and only five of those losses have come by more than seven points.

UNBLEMISHED MARKS

Boise State posted a perfect 8-0 mark last season in MW play. That marks the third time in the last four years the Broncos have been unbeaten in conference action (8-0 in 2019, 5-0 in 2020).

WE HANG BANNERS HERE

The Broncos currently have 14 league titles since 1996, when they joined the Football Bowl Sub-division, tied with Oklahoma for the most in the country during that time. Ohio State (13) and Florida State (11) are the only other schools in the country to win double-digit conference titles during that time.

The Broncos have won 35 conference championships all-time, including four in the Mountain West, eight in the WAC, two in the Big West, six in the Big Sky and 15 in the Intermountain Collegiate Athletic Conference (ICAC).

HIGHWAY 20 RIDE

Punter James Ferguson-Reynolds may come from the Land Down Under but his time in America has the native Aussie humming a tune sung by a group from down in the Deep South. Boise State's punter enters this week's action in the top 10 nationally - and leading the Group of 5 - in several other punting categories.

So far this season, kicker Jonah Dalmas and punter James Ferguson-Reynolds have been superb for the Broncos. Boise State is one of three teams in the nation to have a kicker that has made a field goal of 50 yards or longer and a punter averaging over 50 yards per punt. Dalmas tied a program record with a 56-yard field goal against UCF while Ferguson-Reynolds ranks fourth nationally with an average of 51.3 yards per punt. Joining the Broncos in this exclusive group are Alabama (Will Reichard, 51-yard FG; James Burnip, 50.2 yards per punt) and Iowa State (Chase Contreras, 56-yard FG; Tyler Perkins, 52.9 yards per punt).

Kicker Jonah Dalmas has established himself as a threat anytime he steps on the field and that was reaffirmed on Sept. 9. The senior from Meridian is practically hitting field goals from Meridian after tying the Boise State school record with a 56-yard field goal made against UCF. That ties for the third-longest in the country this year, ties for the longest field goal made by a Mountain West kicker this season and ties for the third-longest field goal made in MW history.

That also marked the fourth time in his career Dalmas has converted a field goal attempt of 50 yards or longer.

ROAD WARRIORS

Boise State is one of four schools nationally to post a winning record on the road each of the last nine seasons. The other are college football royalty in Alabama, Georgia and Ohio State. The Broncos are 18-1 in their last 19 Mountain West road games.

A RARE OCCURRENCE

On Sept. 9 at Albertsons Stadium, a sellout crowd witnessed something that had only happened twice before in NCAA history. The Boise State vs. UCF game was only the third time in the 154-year history of NCAA Football that opposing kickers hit field goals of 55-plus yards in the same game. It previously happened on Oct. 15, 1977 in the Texas vs. Arkansas game held in Fayetteville and then was repeated in the Arizona vs. Washington State game on Oct. 28, 2017 in Tucson.

James Ferguson-Reynolds continues to flip the field and climb the record book. Against Washington, the sophomore punter from the Land Down Under punted seven times for an average of 52.1 yards per punt, the second-highest single-game total in program history. Against North Dakota, he booted the ball three times for 154 yards, giving him an average of 51.3 yards per punt. His season average is also 51.3 yards per punt, which ranks him first in the nation.

CELEBRATING OUR HERITAGE

Each year, Boise State joins millions of Americans in celebrating National Hispanic Heritage Month from Sept. 15 to Oct. 15. That includes celebrating the heritage of head coach Andy Avalos, one of five hispanic head coaches in FBS. Not only one of a handful, Avalos has the highest winning percentage of any hispanic head coach that has led a team for more than one full season. Additionally, the Mountain West Conference is home to 40% of the nation's Hispanic FBS coaches.

There's not many places that are tougher environments to play on than the infamous blue turf in Boise. Entering this week's contest, the Broncos have an .891 winning percentage on The Blue (131-16) since 2000. That marks the third-best home winning percentage of any team in the nation, trailing only Oklahoma (.908, 128-13) and Ohio State (.895, 137-16).

RANKINGS INFO

Boise State entered the 2023 season receiving votes in both the AP and Coaches Poll.

The Broncos have finished the year ranked after opening the season unranked eight times - 2002, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2008, 2014, 2017 and 2019. In two of those seasons, 2006 and 2014, the Broncos capped the year with a victory in the Fiesta Bowl.

NOT SO FAST, MY FRIEND!

Visiting Boise generally has opponents feeling (and seeing) blue. The less-than-hospitable reception often leads to confusion for opponents, causing a national-best 3.03 false starts per game by opponents since 2018. That's well more than North Carolina State's 2.48 opponent false starts per game, which is the second best mark in the country.

WINNING WAYS

If you've read to this point, perhaps you're seeing a trend. Boise State knows a thing or two about football. In fact, the Broncos currently rank fifth in the nation in all-time winning percentage at the FBS level with a .726 mark. Wake up the Echoes because that is just four percentage points behind Notre Dame (.730) and five points behind the alleged Champions of the West, Michigan (.731). Ohio State (.733) has the best all-time winning percentage while Alabama is close behind at .732.

RUN, RUN, AS FAST AS YOU CAN...

Can't catch him, he's the Jeanty-man! One week after recording 153 all-purpose yards against nationally-ranked Washington, Ashton Jeanty totaled a career-best 212 all-purpose yards against UCF. He followed that with a three-touchdown performance against North Dakota, with all three scores coming on rushes of two or fewer yards. He is the first Bronco to score three rushing touchdowns in a single game since teammate George Holani, who scampered for three against Colorado State on Oct. 29, 2022.

BLUE IS AN INTERNATIONAL COLOR

It has to be, considering the Broncos have four players on its roster that have come from overseas in order to play football at Boise State. So yes, it's more than just lip service when we proclaim that student-athletes come from far and wide to play on The Blue. BSU's roster features the following players with international roots: James Ferguson-Reynolds (Geelong, Australia), Ahmed Hassanein (Cairo, Egypt), Prince Strahan (Freeport, Grand Bahama) and Max Stege (Cologne, Germany).

BLOCK LIKE AN EGYPTIAN

Known for setting records, Boise State has achieved another first. Defensive lineman Ahmed Hassanein, who was raised in Cairo, Egypt, is the first player from Egypt to ever play Division I football. Even more remarkable, he did not even speak English until five years ago. Anyone who speaks to the bilingual Hassanein would be surprised to learn that fact as he is nearly fluent in English.

But how rare is that recruiting area? In all of Division I sports (not just football), there were only 53 Egyptians participating in intercollegiate athletics during the 2021-22 academic calendar year (the last year of data publicly available).

SAY WHAT?

If Boise State opponents think a little noise is going to throw off the Broncos defensive line, they might want to rethink that strategy. The unit led by Erik Chinander has learned to communicate regardless of the decibel level and that was the easy part. Across the line, Chinander's unit speaks a total of eight different languages including: English, Arabic, German, Spanish, French, Samoan, Greek and ASL. Each game, the unit affectionately named the "United Nations" looks to unite themselves with opposing quarterbacks. Ready, Set, Hutt! jahizi, jahizi, hut! Auf die Plätze, fertig, Hutt! Listo, listo, Hutt! À vos marques, prêts, Hutt! Sauni, Seti, Hutt! Έτοιμος, Σετ, Χατ!

THE MAGIC NUMBER IS 140

Boise State is 13-2 under Andy Avalos when rushing for 140 yards or more, including 7-1 last season (the only loss was to Fresno State in the Mountain West Championship Game).

ESTABLISHING A LEGACY

The Broncos are the second-winningest football program by percentage in the country since 2000 (.817, 241-54), trailing only Ohio State (.835; 238-47).

AMONG THE LEAGUE'S LEADERS

With four players hailing from overseas that have come to play football at Boise State, the Broncos rank tied for second in the Mountain West Conference with the most international players on their roster. Hawai'i (6 or 13) leads the way while Colorado State and New Mexico also have four each. No, we didn't forget how to read a globe. The difference of opinion in Hawai'i's number is because the Warriors have seven players on their roster from American Samoa which is actually a U.S. Territory and not an independent nation. Mrs. Morris in Ninth Grade World Civ would be proud we actually did pay attention in class.

NOT EXACTLY THREE-AND-OUT

Last season Boise State won four consecutive games from Sept. 30 to Oct. 29 to extend one of the nation's longest streaks. The Broncos have won at least three straight games now for 24 consecutive seasons. Only Georgia has a longer active streak, putting together a streak for 25 consecutive years.

FLIP THE SCRIPT

Credit James Ferguson-Reynolds for flipping the field at Washington. The sophomore punter from the Land Down Under punted seven times for an average of 52.1 yards per punt, the second-highest single-game total in program history and currently the sixth-highest nationally. He downed one punt inside the opponents 20-yard line while registering a career-long punt of 62 yards.

TWO-FOUR GOING FOR THREE

Redshirt senior George Holani has bookended his career with 1,000-yard rushing seasons, recording 1,014 yards on the ground during his freshman season in 2019 and then grinding out 1,157 yards last season. Entering the 2023 campaign, Holani is looking to hit four figures on the ground this year to become the first Bronco to do so in back-to-back seasons since current Minnesota Viking Alexander Mattison achieved the feat on The Blue in 2017-18.



GREEN DAY

Last season, Taylen Green rushed for 105 yards and two touchdowns in his first ever collegiate start, leading Boise State to a 35-13 victory over San Diego State on Sept. 30, 2022. Earning Mountain West Freshman of the Week honors for his performance against the Aztecs, he became the first Boise State quarterback to run for 100 or more yards in a game since Grant Hedrick eclipsed the century mark against New Mexico on Nov. 8, 2014. Having ran for 102 yards in the season opener at Oregon State, Green also became the first-ever Bronco signal caller to record multiple 100-plus-yard rushing performances in the same season. Hedrick was the only other QB to achieve that feat throughout his Boise State career. Green added a 119-yard rushing performance against North Texas in the 2022 Frisco Bowl, where he was named the Offensive MVP.

HE'S NOT THE ONLY ONE

George Holani posted six performances last season where he recorded 100 yards or more on the ground, including a season-high 157 yards against Fresno State on Oct. 8, 2022. That gives the redshirt senior 12 performances of 100-plus yards on the ground in his career entering the 2023 season.

SEALED WITH A KISS

Did you know that Boise State is 13-0 when George Holani surpasses the century mark on the ground?

STOP THE COUNT!

Last season, Boise State allowed just 19.5 points per game, a mark that ranked the Broncos 15th in the country. The Blue Collar Stampede gave up 23 points or less in every conference game last season, a low allowance mark had not been achieved by the Broncos since the 1980 campaign, when Boise State won the I-AA National Championship.

That followed the 2021 season where Boise State allowed just 19.0 points per game, ranking 12th nationally. BSU did not allow a touchdown in the second half or overtime of six games during that 2021 campaign.

HIGH FIVE!

The Broncos wrapped up the 2022 season ranking fifth nationally in passing defense, yielding just 167.7 yards per game. Boise State held their first two conference opponents under 100 yards passing for the first time since 2010 when BSU achieved that feat against New Mexico State and San Jose State in Western Athletic Conference (WAC) play.

Last season at Wyoming (Nov. 19), Boise State allowed 30 yards passing on three completions and intercepted three passes. Since 2000, it was the ninth time nationally a school has allowed three completions or less while recording at least three interceptions and the first time since 2018. Boise State is the only school to accomplish the feat twice having also done so against North Texas in 2000.

Boise State's passing efficiency defense (109.70) last season was the best in the Mountain West and eighth in the NCAA. Here's hoping history repeats itself on Saturday.

DOLLAR DALMAS

Why should we call Jonah Dalmas by the nickname "Dollar"? Because he's money scoring one after touchdowns. Dalmas enters this game with 118 career points after touchdown, a mark that ranks seventh in school history. Now he has his eyes set on a top-five mark. Mike Black (1988-91) and Anthony Montgomery (2005-06) both scored 122 PATs over their respective careers to tie for fifth. The school record for career PATs is Kyle Brotzman who successfully converted 238 PATs during his career from 2007-10.

HE SCORES OTHER WAYS TOO

Don't think that Jonah Dalmas has it easy though. He is also just as successful at kicking field goals. Going into this week's game, Dalmas has 59 field goals and needs only nine more field goals to tie Kyle Brotzman for the school record of 67 field goals in a career.

AND I GUESS THAT'S WHY THEY CALL IT THE BLUE(S)

Under Andy Avalos, Boise State opponents have reached the red zone 83 times. More often than not, those possessions have resulted in three points or the opponent coming up empty.

The Broncos' defense has allowed 65 scores, 39 of which were touchdowns. To put another way, in the red zone, Bronco opponents kicked 26 field goals and failed to score 18 times – three or zero on 44 of 83 trips inside the Boise State 20-yard line (53% of the time). Last season, Boise State gave up 12 field goals and 16 touchdowns on 35 opponent possessions inside the 20-yard line.

OUR SPECIAL TEAMS ARE SPECIAL

PUNT RETURN FOR A TOUCHDOWN

Boise State is one of only three schools nationally (San Diego State and Kansas State) to have a punt return for a touchdown in each of the last six seasons. The Broncos extended their streak last year with a blocked punt for a score against New Mexico when Andrew Simpson broke through the Lobos' line and Deven Wright recovered in the end zone.

BOISE BLOCKS

Last season Kaonohi Kaniho blocked a field goal at Nevada on Nov. 12. That block gave the Broncos multiple blocked kicks in five consecutive seasons, the longest active streak in the nation.

BOISE BLOCKS - PART II, ELECTRIC BOOGALOO

In 2021, the Broncos tied for 10th nationally with four blocked kicks. Last season Boise State stopped two kicks to rank 36th nationally. That extended another streak as Boise State has blocked a punt in eight consecutive seasons entering the 2023 campaign.

SUCCESS IN THE (MOUNTAIN) WEST

In its 12 seasons in the Mountain West, Boise State has lost just 15 games in conference play, and only five of those losses have come by more than seven points.

UNDEFEATED IN CONFERENCE

Boise State posted a perfect 8-0 mark this season in MW play. It is the third time in the last four years the Broncos have been unbeaten in conference action (8-0 in 2019, 5-0 in 2020).

CHAMPIONSHIP COORDINATES

Trying to find your way to the conference championship trophy? Adventurers everywhere need only plug in the coordinates 43.6028° N, 116.1959° W. Those coordinates will lead you to none other than Albertsons Stadium in Boise.

That's not just wishful thinking, either. The Broncos currently have 14 league titles since 1996, when they joined the Football Bowl Subdivision, tied with Oklahoma for the most in the country during that time. Ohio State (13) and Florida State (11) are the only other schools in the country to win double-digit conference titles during that time.

The Broncos have won 20 conference championships all-time, including four in the Mountain West, eight in the WAC, two in the Big West and six in the Big Sky.

A BRONCO LEADS THE BRONCOS

Boise State is in its third season with Andy Avalos at the helm of the program. As a Bronco student-athlete, Avalos was a four-year letterwinner, served as team captain, earned a pair of first-team all-conference accolades at linebacker and was a member of the All-Blue Team – a selection of the 30 greatest players in school history, as voted on by the Bronco fan base, in the 30th anniversary season of the world-famous turf. Avalos initially returned to The Blue in a coaching capacity in 2012 as defensive line coach, took over as linebackers coach in 2014 and was then promoted to defensive coordinator in 2016. After three seasons leading the Bronco defense, Avalos left for Oregon, where the Ducks captured a Rose Bowl victory in his first season and earned a spot in the Fiesta Bowl in his second.

DRIP DEFINED

We're so blue collar that our blue collars say "BLUE COLLAR".

Boise State unveiled a new look for the 2017 season, the first time the Broncos had overhauled their Nike uniforms since 2011.

Included in the new slate were blue, orange and white, and the jerseys featured new stripes on the sleeves and "Blue Collar" on the inside of the neck. The Broncos added a black set of uniforms that were unveiled against Air Force, Sept. 20, 2019.

The uniforms are from the Nike Vapor Untouchable line, with stretch woven material, a seamless front and shoulders and laser perforation fabric instead of mesh. The uniforms combine materials and science designed for speed and comfort for the players, based on four core principles – fit, durability, weight and core body temperature.

Andy Avalos is in his third season as the head football coach at Boise State. He is a former Bronco student-athlete, assistant coach and defensive coordinator.

His second year at the helm of the Broncos witnessed a perfect record in conference play with eight consecutive Mountain West wins to host the MW Championship Game and a Frisco Bowl Championship. That marked the 25th-consecutive season the Broncos have been bowl eligible courtesy of a squad that ranked sixth nationally in total defense (292.5 ypg). Boise State ranked 14th in the country with 15 interceptions on the year, a number that led the Mountain West.

In 2021 - Avalos' first season - Boise State was bowl eligible (7-5) for a 24th-straight season while being ranked 12th nationally in points allowed (19.0 per game) and 17th in turnover margin (+0.67).

Avalos, a team captain and all-conference linebacker during his playing career (2000-04) under head coaches Dirk Koetter and Dan Hawkins, is just the second graduate of Boise State to lead the Broncos' football program (Bryan Harsin). He previously coached at Boise State from 2012-18 under head coaches Chris Petersen and Harsin, ascending to defensive coordinator for the 2016-18 seasons before accepting the same role at Oregon for the 2018-19 seasons under then-head coach Mario Cristobal.

In addition to coaching stops at Boise State (2012-18) and Oregon (2019-20), Avalos also spent time working under Hawkins at Colorado (2006-08), and also at Sacramento State (2011) and at Nebraska-Kearney (2009-10).

The Broncos achieved bowl-eligible status for the 24th-consecutive season in Avalos's head coaching debut, ultimately receiving an invitation to the Barstool Sports Arizona Bowl. Boise State's 24-straight seasons of bowl eligibility is the third-longest streak in the country, trailing only Ohio State (33) and Georgia (25). The Broncos also picked up a pair of road wins over top-25 teams for the first time in school history, and defeated five bowl-eligible teams, tied for the 14th-most in the country during the 2021 regular season.

The Broncos' 13 selections to All-Mountain West Teams were the most among Mountain Division schools in 2021, including first-team honorees Jonah Dalmás (K), John Ojukwu (OL) and Khalil Shakir (WR). Additionally, five student-athletes were named to the NCAA Division I CoSIDA Academic All-District First Team, the most among all schools in District 7, which encompasses Colorado, Idaho, Kansas, Nebraska, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Texas.

Shakir and fellow team captain, Kekaula Kaniho, received invitations to the Reese's Senior Bowl and the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl, respectively, slated to take place following the conclusion of the season.

During his five seasons as a defensive coordinator, Avalos established himself as one of college football's premier coordinators. He was named a semifinalist for the Broyles Award, which honors college football's top assistant coach, during his first season at Oregon in 2019.

The Ducks won Pac-12 championships each season with Avalos in charge of the defense, adding to three Mountain West Championships the Broncos captured with Avalos on staff (2012, 2014 and 2017) and two Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference championships while at Nebraska-Kearney (2009-10). As a student-athlete, Avalos won three Western Athletic Conference championships (2002, 2003, 2004) in his four years as a starting linebacker.

In Avalos' two seasons at Oregon, the Ducks earned a victory in the 2020 Rose Bowl and played in the 2021 Fiesta Bowl, a game the Broncos also appeared in during the 2014 season, defeating Arizona (38-30) for Boise State's third victory in the game. With Avalos on staff, Boise State also appeared in the Las Vegas Bowl (2012 and 2017), the Hawai'i Bowl (2013), the Poinsettia Bowl (2015) and the Cactus Bowl (2016), and was selected to play in the First Responder Bowl (2018). While Avalos was playing for the Broncos, Boise State appeared in the 2002 Humanitarian Bowl, the 2003 Fort Worth Bowl and the 2004 Liberty Bowl, a game in which he returned an interception 92 yards for a touchdown.

Avalos has overseen the development of 50 student-athletes that have garnered all-conference honors, and multiple All-Americans, of whom several will be familiar to Bronco Nation - DeMarcus Lawrence, Curtis Weaver and Leighton Vander Esch. Ducks defensive end Kayvon Thibodeaux picked up All-America accolades this past season, in addition to being one of four student-athletes to earn Freshman All-America honors in Avalos' two seasons with Oregon (linebacker

Noah Seweill in 2020, and Thibodeaux, defensive back Verone McKinley III and linebacker Mase Funa in 2019). Thibodeaux and Sewell were named Pac-12 Freshman Defensive Player of the Year in back-to-back seasons (2019-20).

Vander Esch was named MW Defensive Player of the Year for the Broncos in 2017 before declaring early for the National Football League Draft and ultimately being selected in the first round by the Dallas Cowboys. Lawrence and Weaver also opted to forego their final seasons of eligibility with the Broncos, being selected in the second and fifth rounds, respectively.

Oregon led the Pac-12 in sacks over the course of his two seasons as coordinator, and ranked third in the conference in both rush defense and total defense. Oregon finished the 2019 season ninth in the nation in scoring defense, allowing just 16.5 points per game. The Ducks ranked 13th nationally in rushing defense (108.93 yards per game) and 22nd in total defense (329.1 YPG). Avalos' defense disrupted opposing offenses, finishing second in the country in interceptions (20), sixth in passes defended (76), 13th in sacks (41.0) and 21st in tackles-for-loss (97.0).

Prior to joining the Oregon staff, Avalos spent seven seasons coaching at Boise State, including the final three as defensive coordinator. During his time as coordinator the Broncos led the MW in sacks, ranked second in rush defense and third in total defense. While at his alma mater he also served as defensive line coach (2012-13) and linebackers coach (2014-15).

Avalos started his coaching career in his hometown of Corona, Calif., where he coached linebackers at Corona High School. He then spent three seasons as a graduate assistant at Colorado before coaching two seasons at Nebraska-Kearney and one at Sacramento State.

A four-year letterwinner for the Broncos, Avalos earned first-team All-WAC honors at outside linebacker in each of his final two seasons. He completed his career ranked fourth all-time with 355 tackles, and led the Broncos in the statistical category in each of his final three seasons. He was named to the All-Blue Team during the 2016 season, a list of the 30 greatest players at Boise State since the inception of The Blue in 1986.

Avalos and his wife Summer had their first child, a daughter named Paityn, Jan. 31, 2014, and added a second daughter, Paige, April 12, 2016.
