Big Notes

- The Aztecs won their 32nd straight game against a current Big West school and 24th straight against a Big West school at gametime.
- San Diego State won its 16th consecutive season opener against an unranked opponent, 10th straight season opener (17-1 in last 18 openers) and 13th straight when the season opener started at home.
- SDSU won its 91st straight home game when shooting at least 50 percent.
- The Aztecs win their 32nd straight game when shooting at least 50 percent from the field (44-1 under Brian Dutcher).
- San Diego State improves to 1-0 at home this season, 68-9 in the Brian Dutcher era at home and has now won 24 of its last 25 home games.

- SDSU improves to 36-2 in its last 38 games when leading at the half (105-13 in Brian Dutcher era).
- The Aztecs improve to 102-7 when shooting better than their opponent.
- SDSU outscored Cal State Fullerton, 22-12, off turnovers.
- San Diego State outscored CSF, 32-24, in the paint.
- The Aztec bench outscored the Titans, 29-17.

Game Flow

- San Diego State never trailed in the game and enjoyed its largest lead, 28-points, 63-35 with 10:52 to play.
- San Diego State held Cal State Fullerton to 0-of-12 shooting from 3-point range to start the game and did not allow the Titans to convert its first attempt until there was 10:02 to play in the game.
- Darrion Trammell scored the first basket of the game on a 3-pointer from the top of the arc with 17 seconds gone in the game. The Aztecs improve to 84-20 in the Brian Dutcher era when SDSU scores first.
- San Diego State held the Titans to 3 of its first 13 shots (.231) in the first 8:11 of the game.
- San Diego State held Cal State Fullerton scoreless from beyond the 3-point in the first half (0-of-7).
- San Diego State led, 34-29, one minute into the second half and then went on a 29-7 run, to take control of the game.

Player Notes

Darrion Trammell – 18 points, 6-7 FG, 4-5 3PFG, 2 rebounds, 1 assist, 3 steals

Led the team in scoring in his first career game as an Aztec... It was his 50th career double-digit scoring game... Had four 3-pointers, one off a career high (has had five 3-points in three different games).

Lamont Butler – 11 points, 6 assists, 3 rebounds, 4 steals, +21 plus/minus rating

Logged his 13th career double-digit scoring game (SDSU is 10-3)... Matched a career high with six assists... Was one steal shy of a career high... His +21 plus/minus rating was the highest in the game... Became the first Aztec with at least 10 points, 5 assists and 4 steals in a game since Malachi Flynn on Jan. 21, 2020 against Wyoming.

Jaedon LeDee – 11 points, 4 rebounds, 3 assists, 1 steal

Recorded his ninth career double-digit scoring game in his Aztec debut... His three assists were a career high.

Nathan Mensah – 10 points, 5-6 FG, 6 rebounds, 1 blocked shot, 1 steal

Scored in double figures for the 28th time of his career (SDSU is 23-5)... The senior was 4-of-5 in the first half and 5-for-6 for the game.
