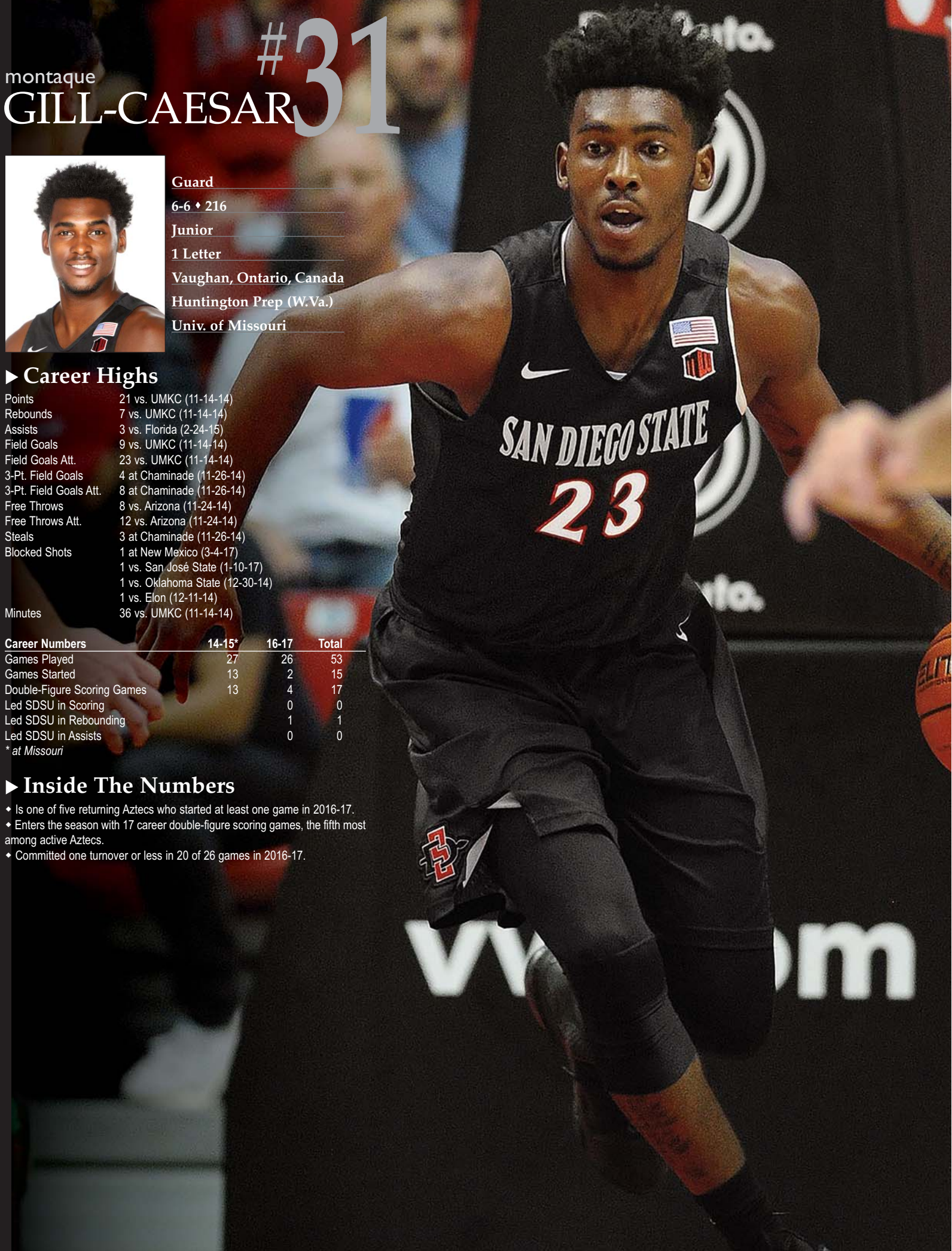

A junior with a year of playing experience at San Diego State under his belt... A scorer who has been known to score in bunches... A big, experienced guard who will compete for minutes this season on the wing... Transferred to San Diego State from Missouri in time for the 2015-16 campaign, but sat out due to NCAA transfer rules... Has worked tirelessly on his jumpshot and defense, and in the weight room to get stronger.

As A Sophomore (2016-17 Season)

Played in 26 games and earned the starting assignment twice... Averaged 3.3 points and 1.8 rebounds in 12.3 minutes... Scored in double figures four times, all of which occurred at home... Led the team in rebounding once... Missed five games due to injury... Was named the preseason Mountain West Newcomer of the Year... Started his first SDSU game vs. San Diego (11-11-16) after becoming eligible following his transfer, making him the first to do so since Josh Davis in 2013-14... Came off the bench to grab a team-best six rebounds at No. 14/14 Gonzaga (11-14-16)... Posted 12 points, which was one more than he had coming into the game, and five rebounds

vs. Savannah State (11-28-16)... Made half of his six attempts from the field to finish with 11 points and a season-high two assists vs. Alabama State (12-12-16)... Scored nine points and had a season-high two steals vs. Tulsa (12-23-16) in the semifinals of the Diamond Head Classic... Contributed 10 points, four rebounds, a career-high one blocked shots and a season-high two steals vs. San José State (1-10-17)... Scored 12 points on a season-high five baskets and had a season-high two steals in 12 minutes vs. Wyoming (1-31-17)... Posted six points, three rebounds and a career-high one blocked shot at New Mexico (3-4-17).

As A Redshirt (2015-16 Season)

Redshirted the season after transferring from Missouri.

As A Freshman at Missouri (2014-15 Season)

Played in 27 games, making 13 starts for a team that went 9-23 (2-15 SEC)... Finished with the highest scoring average (9.1) for a Missouri freshman since the 2006-07 season... Ranked third on the team in scoring and minutes played (24.0)... Scored in double digits 13 times with his season-best 21 points coming in his collegiate debut vs. UMKC (11-14-14)... Made multiple treys in eight different games, including a season-best four against Oral Roberts (11-19-14) and Chaminade (11-26-14)... Against ORU, he

finished with 19 points, his second-highest total of the season... Put up 13 points (season-high eight free-throws) vs. Arizona (11-24-14)... Averaged 11.5 points through the non-conference schedule before a back injury sidelined him for the first three games of SEC action... Was injury plagued after a foul landed him on his back in a clash vs. Illinois (12-20-14), but he did manage a 15-point effort vs. Oklahoma State (12-30-14) in the game immediately following the injury... Played nine minutes vs.

Lipscomb (1-3-15) before a back injury forced him out of the game... Returned to early season form vs. Arkansas (1-24-15), scoring a team-high 16 points off the bench... Finished the season by scoring 10 points vs. South Carolina (3-11-15) at the SEC tourney.

Was a consensus Top 50 recruit in the Class of 2015 before reclassifying to 2014 and signing with Missouri... Was the 2014 Gatorade Player of the Year in West Virginia

as a junior at Huntington Prep High School... Averaged 16.1 points, 6.5 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.7 steals in 2013-14, helping the team to a 28-5 record and a No. 5 national ranking... The Fighting Irish advanced to the semifinals in the 2014 Dick's Sporting Goods High School National Tournament... Named a Class of 2015 Fifth-Team All-America selection by MaxPreps... Played for Team Canada at the 2014 FIBA Americas U18 Championship... Finished second among all players at the tournament in scoring (19.6 ppg) and helped Team Canada to the silver medal with a 4-1 overall record... Also ranked second at the tourney at the foul line, hitting 30-of-33 attempts (90.9 percent) and was sixth with eight three-pointers... His top scoring game of the event came in a win over Argentina when he posted 24 points and six rebounds... Also had 23 points in a win against the Dominican Republic and 22 points in the gold medal game loss to Team USA... Played his freshman season at Vaughan Secondary School in his hometown of Vaughan, Ontario, Canada, where he helped the team win the OFSAA.

JEREMY HEMSLEY ◀ PLAYERS

Ascoring guard who has played a major role on the team in his first two seasons... Improved his three-point shooting, scoring average and turnover rate from his first to his second season... Has worked on improving his court vision and his perimeter shooting.

As A Sophomore (2016-17 Season)

MW Rankings: 17th in scoring
Earned Mountain West honorable mention accolades from the coaches... Played in 32 games, starting a career-high 31 times... Averaged a personal-best 12.9 points, 2.4 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 28.7 minutes... Made a career-high 56 three-pointers... Had 21 double-figure scoring games, including five 20-point efforts and one 30-point outburst... Led the team in scoring a team-high-tying 12 times and in assists 12 times... Made multiple three-pointers on 15 different occasions... Set career highs in points (25) and field goals (9), while adding a team-high-tying two assists and a game-high-tying three steals in just 28 minutes vs. San Diego (11-11-16)... Led the team with 14 points and two assists at No. 14/14 Gonzaga (11-14-16)... Led all players with 23 points on 9-of-12 shooting and five assists vs. San Diego Christian (11-16-16)... Had a team-high 15 points, three assists and a career-high two blocked shots vs. California (11-21-16)... He

scored 10 straight late in the first half vs. the Golden Bears to extend SDSU's six-point lead to 16... Had a career-high nine assists and zero turnovers, while scoring 14 points, vs. Savannah State (11-28-16) to become the first Aztec, and the 12th in Division I at game time, to have a 9-assist, 0-turnover game vs. a Division I opponent since at least 1996-97... Established what was then a career high with 28 points (25 in second half, 6-6 3FG) on a career-high-matching nine field goals, including a personal-record seven three-pointers, at Grand Canyon (12-7-16)... At one point vs. the Lopes, he scored 14 straight points and finished by scoring 18 of the team's final 22 points... His 7-for-8 performance from three-point range vs. GCU was tied for the second-best three-point field goal percentage in a Division I game at that point in the season (Micah Seaborn of Monmouth was 8-for-9 against South Carolina State on Nov. 26, 2016) and it was the highest three-point field-goal percentage ever for an SDSU player (minimum eight attempts), matching Al Faux's 7-for-8 performance against Oklahoma State on Dec. 30, 2000... Knocked down 5-of-7 shots from three-point distance and finished with 20 points and a season-high three steals vs. Tulsa (12-23-16) in the semifinals of

the Diamond Head Classic... Led the team with 16 points in a season-high 37 minutes vs. New Mexico (1-1-17)... Set a career high with 30 points in 33 minutes at Nevada (1-4-17)... He made a personal-best 12 field goals, six of which were three-pointers, had five assists and zero turnovers in 33 minutes vs. the Wolf Pack and it was the first 30-point game at SDSU since March 2014... His performance at Nevada made him the sixth player in

Division I at game time with a line of at least 30 points, five assists and zero turnovers and the first at SDSU since at least 1996-97... Led the team in scoring (12), assists (4) and blocked shots (career-high 2), while grabbing a career-best seven rebounds vs. San José State (1-10-17)... Made three treys before finishing with a team-high 14 points to go with three assists vs. Utah State (1-14-17)... Poured in 17 points and led the team with three assists and two

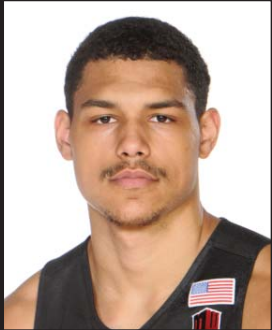

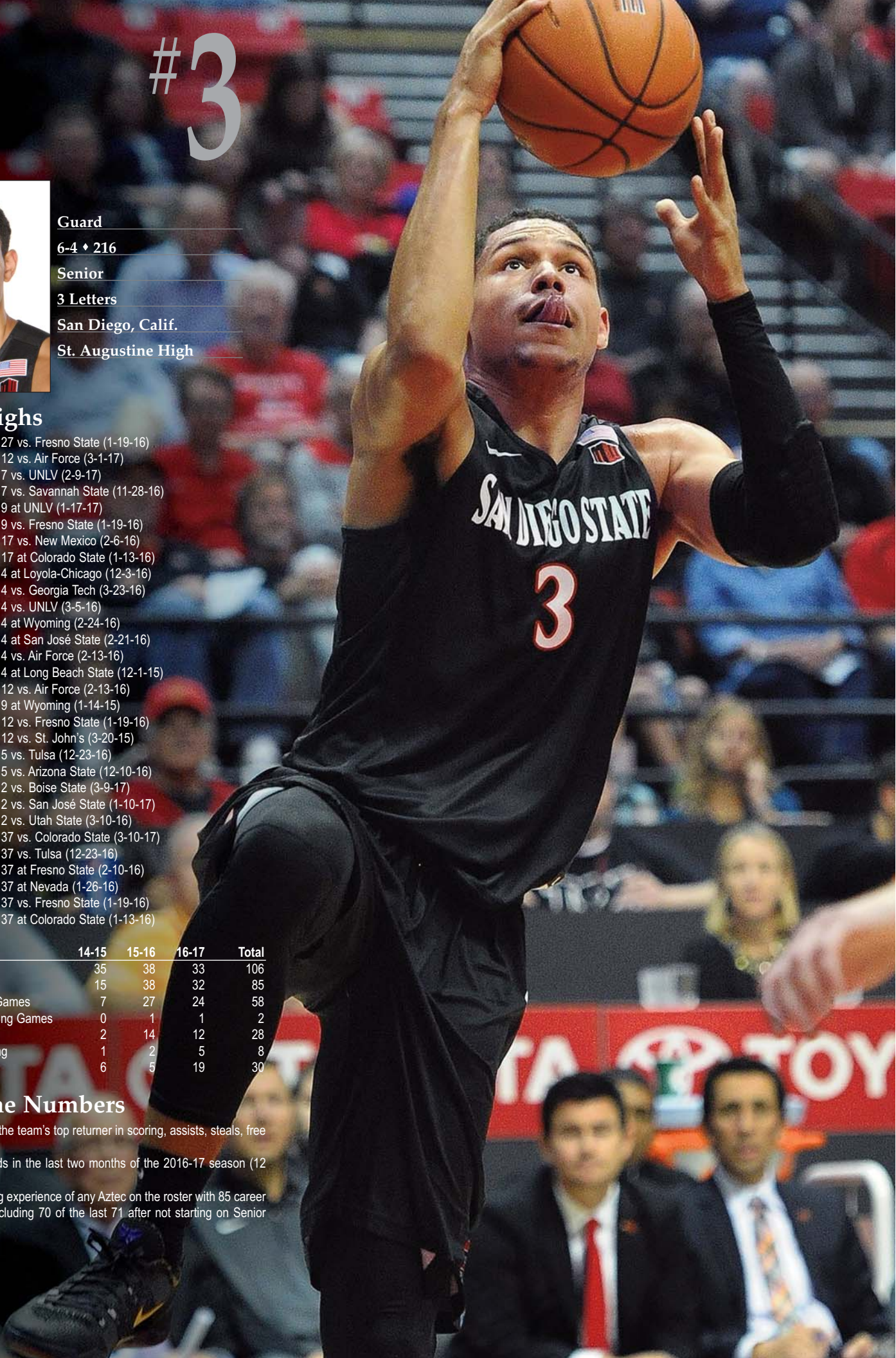
