## OFF THE BOUNCE (through games of Sunday, December 29)

- Owners of the nation's eighth-best winning percentage since the start of the 2009-10 campaign and Mountain West regular-season champs in two of the last three seasons, San Diego State plays its first 2022-23 Mountain West road contest on Saturday afternoon with a 1 p.m. tip off against the UNLV Runnin' Rebels in the Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas.
- San Diego State, when it plays at UNLV on Saturday, will be playing just its second true road game of the season; the first game was a 74-62 victory at Stanford on Nov. 15. Through December 29, the Aztecs are one of 28 Division I programs that have only played one true road contest.
- San Diego State has won 10 of its last 11 Mountain West games including a 4-1 mark in conference road contests and has wins in each of its last four games against the Runnin' Rebels at the Thomas & Mack Center, including clinching the 2020-21 Mountain West regular season title at the site.
- Since the beginning of the 2019-20 campaign, San Diego State's 86-19 record is the fifth best in the nation (see box on page 8).
- The last time out, San Diego State defeated Air Force, 71-55, at Viejas Arena in each program's conference opener. The victory was the team's 16th straight over the Falcons at Steve Fisher Court.
- With its win, SDSU is 40-4 in its last 44 Mountain West home games since January 24, 2018.
- San Diego State limited Air Force to 55 points and moved to 136-4 in its last 140 home games, when it's held its opponent to under 60 points.
- SDSU moved to 82-4 the last 86 times it has shot better than its opponent and the Aztecs improved to 142-9 the last 151 home games when leading at the half, both of which it did against Air Force.
- The Aztecs and Rebels are meeting for the 78th time in program history with SDSU holding a 40-37 advantage in the all-time series. The Aztecs once trailed the series, 26-6, but is 34-11 against the Rebels in the last 45 meetings.
- San Diego State is 12-1 in its last 13 games at UNLV's Thomas & Mack Center. Since March 5, 2014, San Diego State is 12-1 against the Rebels in TMC, while the rest of the country is 52-84.
- Since the start of the 2008-09 season, no Division I team has won more road games against a single opponent than San Diego State's 17 victories over UNLV at Thomas & Mack Center. Saint Mary's (at Loyola Marymount) is second with 14 wins and Vermont (vs. Hartford) is third with 13 wins.
- San Diego State's 41 victories at Thomas & Mack Center since the start of the 2008-09 campaign (24 neutral and 17 road wins) are the most by any team in any building in which it has not played at least one home game. Villanova is second with 34 victories at Madison Square Garden.
- The Aztecs enter Saturday's game winners of 10 of its last 11 regular season Mountain West contests, including its last five in a row.
- San Diego State's calling card is defense, and it is playing it at an elite level, according to Kenpom, which has the Aztecs ranked No. 13 nationally in adjusted defense. In addition, the SDSU offense, which ended the 2021-22 campaign ranked No. 167 in adjusted offense, slots in at No. 61 so far this year and SDSU is No. 14 in adjusted efficiency margin.

**14-Time MW Champions, 13 Postseason Berths in Last 15 Years**

- SDSU has won at least 19 games in 17 straight seasons.
- SDSU has advanced to the postseason in 14 of the last 16 seasons in which a champion was crowned (2006 NCAA, 2007-09 NIT, 2010-15 NCAA, 2016 NIT, 2018, 2021 & 2022 NCAA).
- SDSU has won 43 of last 46 games when leading at the half.
- SDSU has won its last 82-of-87 when having a higher FG pct.
- SDSU is 8th nationally in winning percentage (.753) since the beginning of the 2009-10 season.
- Since its founding in 1999, no men's basketball program has won more Mountain West championships (regular-season and tournament) than San Diego State's 14.
- Since 2006, SDSU's 13 appearances in its conference championship game are tied for second most in Division I.
- SDSU's 17 MW wins in 2019-20 are the most in MW history.

- According to Kenpom, through the games of Dec. 29, San Diego State (10-3) has the No. 24-ranked strength of schedule. The only teams currently ranked in the AP Top 25 with a stronger strength of schedule are No. 8 Alabama (11th), No. 10 Gonzaga (5th) and No. 25 North Carolina (14th).
- San Diego State, receiving votes in this week's AP poll, has appeared in the top 25 for 93 weeks since the start of 2010-11 season. SDSU's 93 weeks in the top 25 are the 18th most nationally and are the most for any California school in that time frame (see graphic on page 5).
- SDSU enters today's game with a 10-3 record, with its losses coming against then No. 5 Arizona and No. 9 Arkansas at the 2022 Maui Jim Maui Invitational and Saint Mary's at the Jerry Colangelo Classic. Two of the three, vs. Arizona and Arkansas, are Quad 1 games, played on a neutral court, and all three rank among the top-20 in Kenpom rankings. In addition, the Aztecs victory over Ohio State, No. 14 in Kenpom is also a Quad 1 game. Those four games and the team's win at Stanford are Tier A games in the Kenpom rankings.
- San Diego State, which in 2021-22 reached the Mountain West championship game for the fifth time in head coach Brian Dutcher's five seasons, looks for its unprecedented 15th Mountain West men's basketball title. Entering the 2022-23 season, San Diego State, the most successful program in conference history, has won eight regular season and six Mountain West tournament titles.
- San Diego State owns a 86-19 record (81.9 percent) since the start of the 2019-20 campaign. That is the fifth best record in the nation, trailing only Gonzaga (101-10), Baylor (91-15), Houston (96-19) and Kansas (94-19).
- Senior **Matt Bradley** led the Aztecs with 27 points, including 13 in the first half in SDSU's 71-55 win over Air Force on December 28. He scored in double figures for the sixth time this season and 103rd of his career. His 13 first half points came on 5-of-7 shooting, including 3-of-3 from the bonus distance, and 14 in the second half (4-for-5 FG, 3-for-4 3PG). He became the eighth Aztec, since at least the 1996-97 season, to score at least 25 points without committing a turnover and he did it in the fewest minutes (31).
- **Brian Dutcher** is now in his sixth season as San Diego State's head coach and his 24th season on the Aztec sidelines. In his five-plus seasons as head coach, he has led the Aztecs to four conference titles, five Mountain West championship game appearances, a 129-43 overall record, and has been named the national coach of the year and twice the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year.

## WHAT HAPPENS IN LAS VEGAS...IS USUALLY GOOD FOR SAN DIEGO STATE

- Overall, San Diego State has a 40-37 lead in the all-time series with UNLV. At one time, the Aztecs trailed 26-6 in the series, but is 34-11 in the last 45 meetings between the teams.
- Since the start of the 2008-09 campaign, San Diego State has 41 victories at Thomas & Mack Center. That is the most victories by any school in the nation in any venue in which they have not played a home game during that span. In second place is Villanova in Madison Square Garden with 34 victories.
- San Diego State is 12-1 in its last 13 games at UNLV (games played at Thomas & Mack Center).
- San Diego State is 18-2 in the last 20 games played between the Aztecs and Rebels.
- Brian Dutcher has been on the sidelines for 36 of San Diego State's 40 victories in the series. While Dutcher has been on the Aztec sidelines for the 36 series wins, the victories have come against nine different UNLV head coaches (Bill Bayno, Max Good, Charlie Spoonhour, Jay Spoonhour, Lon Kruger, Dave Rice, Todd Simon, Marvin Menzies, T.J. Otzelberger and Kevin Kruger).

## ROAD (AND NEUTRAL) WARRIORS

With San Diego State having played 5-of-14 regular season road/neutral contests, here are some road and neutral site facts about SDSU:

- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 94-57 (.623) record in road games is the ninth best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 150-88 (.630) record in road/neutral games is the 10th best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, among teams that have played at least 80 neutral site games, San Diego State's 56-31 (.645) record is the 12th best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 72-43 (.626) record in road games against the Mountain West leads the conference.

## MOUNTAIN WEST OPENERS

With its 71-55 victory over Air Force in its 2022-23 Mountain West Conference opener on Wednesday, here is some San Diego State Mountain West opener info:

- In its 24 openers to Mountain West play, the Aztecs have a 16-8 record.
- San Diego State is 8-5 when its league opener is at home.
- San Diego State head coach Brian Dutcher is 3-3 in league openers, with only two of those games played at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.
- San Diego State and Air Force have played in a Mountain West opener four times, in 2002-03 & 2008-09 in Clune Arena, SDSU defeated the Falcons 63-48 and 61-44, respectively, and in Viejas Arena in 2014-15, 53-49, and on Wednesday, 71-55.

## BRADLEY HEATING UP

Senior **Matt Bradley** is one of the nation's elite scoring guards. In 2021-22 he was one of six players in the nation to average 16.9 points and 5.4 rebounds, while shooting 43.8 percent from the floor, 40.1 percent from the bonus distance, 77.9 percent from the line. In addition, he was one of two players, who in a minimum of 15 home games, averaged 18.2 points while shooting at least 48.2 percent from the floor (with a minimum of 195 shot attempts) and 46.4 percent (on a minimum of 69 3-point attempts)...and is the only Division I player who has returned in 2022-23 with those stats.

- In the team's first five games he averaged 8.8 points on 15-of-52 FG (28.8 percent), with 3.4 rebounds and 1.0 assist.
- Since then, in the last eight games, he is averaging 14.3 points on 41-of-82 FG (50.0 percent), with 4.6 rebounds and 2.4 assists.
- For his career, Bradley is a 15.3 points per game scorer on 43.4 percent shooting with 4.6 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game.

## MORE ON BRADLEY

Senior Matt Bradley finished the team's game against Air Force with a season-high 27 points on 9-of-12 shooting, including 6-of-7 from beyond the arc, 3-of-5 from the charity stripe and added three rebounds, an assist, a steal and did not turn the ball over in 31 minutes of action. He is the eighth Aztec, since at least the start of the 1996-97 season, to enjoy a game of at least 25 points without a turnover and is the first to do so since Jeremy Hemsley (2016-19) scored 30 points in 33 minutes at Nevada without a turnover on January 4, 2017. The other Aztecs to accomplish those minimums are:

- Xavier Thames (January 25, 2014 at Utah State) 31 points, zero turnovers in 39 minutes.
- Xavier Thames (January 15, 2014 vs. Fresno State) 28 points, zero turnovers in 34 minutes.
- Chase Tapley (December 22, 2012 vs. San Francisco) 33 points, zero turnovers in 35 minutes.
- Brandon Heath (January 24, 2004 vs. Colorado State) 26 points, zero turnovers in 43 minutes.
- Aerick Sanders (December 31, 2003 vs. Portland) 34 points, zero turnovers in 40 minutes.
- Evan Burns (February 24, 2003 vs. New Mexico) 31 points, zero turnovers in 34 minutes.
- Jason Richey (December 2, 1997 vs. Oregon) 25 points, zero turnovers in 38 minutes.

Bradley enters the UNLV game 11 points from becoming the eighth active player in Division I to score 2,000 career points. He will join the following active player who have totaled 2,000 career points:

- Aotine Davis (Detroit) - 3,048 points
- Taevion Kinsey (Marshall) - 2,210 points
- Darius McGhee (Liberty) - 2,151 points
- Jayden Gardner (Virginia) - 2,129 points
- Souley Boum (Xavier) - 2,094 points
- Sam Sessoms (Coppin State) - 2,073 points
- Max Abmas (Oral Roberts) - 2,047 points

## KEYS TO VICTORY

- San Diego State is 8-1 this season when leading at the half. (SDSU is 175-22 (.888) in the last 197)
- San Diego State is 8-1 this season when leading with five minutes to play. (SDSU is 371-14 (.964) in the last 385)
- San Diego State 8-1 this season when scoring first. (SDSU is 208-55. (.791) in the last 263)
- San Diego State is 8-1 this season when it has outrebounded its opponent. (SDSU is 234-37 (.863) in the last 271)
- San Diego State is 9-1 this season when it shoots a higher field goal percentage. (SDSU is 272-18 (.938) in the last 290)
- San Diego State is 4-1 this season when its opponent shoots 40% or lower. (SDSU is 293-39 (.883) in the last 332)

- San Diego State is 6-0 this season when it holds its opponent to under 60 points. (SDSU is 136-4 (.971) in the last 140 at home)
- San Diego State is 9-2 this season when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponent. (SDSU is 136-25 (.845) in the last 161)

## SWEET HOME CALIFORNIA

In the first 13 games of the campaign, from Cal State Fullerton (11/7) to Air Force (12/28), the Aztecs have played and won each of its nine contests in the state of California. Here is how important that is:

- Since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State is 209-35 (.857) in games played in the state of California.
- **Since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State is 178-23 (.885) in games played in Viejas Arena.**

## HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament 10 of the last 12 seasons in which a national championship has been crowned, and has an NIT national semifinalist appearance during that span as well. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, and after eight home games this season, San Diego State has the seventh-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 192-24 home record, winning 88.9 percent of its home games during that span.

With the 2022-23 season underway, here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on.

- In its last 226 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 201-25 mark, including a 108-12 record against non-conference competition at Viejas Arena.
- **Since the start of the 2002-03 season, San Diego State has a 138-29 (82.5 percent) home record against conference opponents.**
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 147-20 at home, including a 67-9 record in non-conference home contests during that stretch (64-7 against non-top 25 non-conference foes).
- The Aztecs are 71-10 in their last 81 conference home games and 71-9 in their last 80 non-conference home games.

## MORE HOME COOKING

- In the last 51 home games, San Diego State is 47-4, with an average scoring margin of +17.1 points in those victories. Thirty four of those 47 home wins were decided in the Aztecs' favor by at least nine points.
- The Aztecs current 13-game non-conference home court win streak, started on November 11, 2021, against UC Riverside, equals the sixth-longest in school history; a win streak that began on December 16, 2000 and ran to November 23, 2002.
- San Diego State is 58-5 in its last 63 home games dating back to January 1, 2019.
- **The Aztecs are 40-4 in their 44 Mountain West Conference home games since Jan. 24, 2018.**
- San Diego State has never had an undefeated home season as a Division I program. The last time the Aztecs made it through the home portion of the schedule unscathed was 1966-67. That season, San Diego State went 16-0 at home en route to a 24-5 record. In the Division I era, SDSU has ended the home portion of its schedule with a single loss on seven occasions (1977-78, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15 and 2019-20).

## RECORDS SET VS. OCCIDENTAL

San Diego State set or equaled team and individual and team records in its 95-57 win over Occidental on December 2.

- The Aztecs knocked down 19 three-pointers, setting the program record, and matching the Viejas Arena record which was established by Troy on Nov. 30, 2003, the team it faced on December 5.
- SDSU committed just four personal fouls which are the fewest for the team since at least the start of the 1996-97, bettering the previous low of seven fouls vs. Boise State on Feb. 16, 2020, vs. St. Katherine on Dec. 27, 2013, and vs. Southern California on Nov. 17, 2011. Only six teams have had fewer fouls in a Division I game since at least the 1996-97 season.
- Senior **Adam Seiko** hit a career-record six 3-pointers and scored a career-high 20 points off the bench.
- Senior **Matt Bradley** had a career-best eight assists.
- Freshman **Miles Byrd** set career-highs in points (8), assists (6), rebounds (1) and steals (1). **His six assists are the most by an Aztec true freshman since Chase Tapley recorded nine vs. Pomona-Pitzer on Dec. 31, 2009 and equals Jeremy Hemsley vs. East Carolina (11/23/15) and Lamont Butler vs. Wyoming on Jan. 28, 2021 among those who have competed in the Dutcher/Fisher era.**
- Freshman **Demarshay Johnson Jr.** set career-highs in points (8), rebounds (2), assists (1) and blocks (1).
- Freshman **Elijah Saunders** set career-highs in points (4), rebounds (8), assists (1) and blocks (1).

## OFF THE BENCH

San Diego State's bench scored 53 of the team's 95 points (55.8 percent) vs. Occidental (12/2), and this group of reserves may be the program's best since the start of the Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-00 season).

- The Aztecs bench is averaging 28.5 points per game, 5.6 more than the 22.9 of the 2020-21 team's bench, the highest since the start of the 1999-00 season.
- SDSU's 12.7 rebounds from the bench are 1.1 more than the average of the 2015-16 reserves, the best in the Dutcher/Fisher era.
- In addition, the 2022-23 bench's 3.2 three-pointers, 3.0 steals, 9.2 defensive rebounds, 9.8 field goals, 20.6 field goal attempts, 5.5 free throws are all single-season bests.
- The 8.5 three-point attempts, 72.0 free throw percentage, and 7.7 free throw attempts rank second for the bench since the start of the Dutcher/Fisher era.
- The Aztec bench has outscored its opponents bench 370-to-268 (28.5-to-20.6 points per game).
- Since Brian Dutcher assumed control of the program, the 2022-23 bench is trending as the best in his now sixth season as head coach.

## STREAKS ON THE LINE FOR THE AZTECS ON SATURDAY

When the Aztecs play UNLV on Saturday here are some of the streaks that are on the line for SDSU:

- 36-game win streak when shooting 50 percent or better.
- 23-game win streak in games in which it scores between 80-89 points.
- 6-game win streak when holding its opponent to less than 60 points.
- 5-game regular season win streak against UNLV in Thomas & Mack Center.
- 3-game win streak against UNLV (regardless of location).
- 3-game win streak in true road games.

## SERIES HISTORY VS. UNLV

- This is the 78th meeting between UNLV and San Diego State with the Aztecs owning a 40-37 advantage in the all-time series. The Aztecs once trailed the series, 26-6, (SDSU is 34-11 since that time) and the last time the series was last tied, prior to the 2020-21 (37-37), in 2019-20 (36-36) and entering the 1974-75 game (2-2).
- Since 2014, San Diego State has won 19 of the 21 meetings (19-2) with the Runnin' Rebels (regardless of location).
- Since the start of the 2008-09 season, no Division I team has won more road games against a single opponent than San Diego State's 17 victories over UNLV at Thomas & Mack Center. SDSU's 28 total victories over the Rebels during that time period equals the national lead for victories over a single opponent.
- Brian Dutcher has been on the SDSU sidelines for 36 of SDSU's 40 victories in the series. Those 36 wins have come against 10 different UNLV head coaches (Bill Bayno, Max Good, Charlie Spoonhour, Jay Spoonhour, Lon Kruger, Dave Rice, Todd Simon and Marvin Menzies, T.J. Otzelberger & Kevin Kruger).
- Since the start of the 2008-09 season, only Kansas has won more games in a building the NCAA does not consider its home venue than the Aztecs 41 victories in Thomas & Mack Center. Kansas has 42 victories in the T-Mobile Center, but 10 of those are considered home games.
- The Aztecs are 12-1 vs. UNLV in the Thomas & Mack Center since March 5, 2014. That is the most victories by a visiting team vs. the Runnin' Rebels during that span (Nevada is second with six).
- Since February 9, 2014, San Diego State owns a 17-4 record against the Runnin' Rebels at the Thomas & Mack Center.
- These programs have met 12 times when SDSU has been ranked in the AP top-25, regardless of location, and the Aztecs are 9-3 in those games, including 6-1 as the visiting team.
- Matt Bradley** has played UNLV three times and has shot 51.2 percent (22-of-43) and 47.1 percent (8-17) from the bonus distance and has averaged 22.3 points per contest. **Nathan Mensah** is averaging 8.2 points per game against the Runnin Rebels and has blocked 11 shots in six career games. **Adam Seiko** has played more games against UNLV than any player currently on the Aztecs roster (8 games).

**LAS VEGAS** - Matt Bradley had 17 points and seven rebounds and Keshad Johnson recorded his first career double double, 10 points and 11 rebounds, to carry San Diego State to a 62-55 win over UNLV on Saturday in each program's Mountain West Conference opener. The victory was San Diego State's 15th-straight against Mountain West Conference opponents and its 12th win against UNLV in Thomas & Mack Center in its last 13 tries.

San Diego State (9-3, 1-0) earned its fourth consecutive victory. Chad Baker added 11 points. Nathan Mensah had 10 points, seven rebounds and four blocks to move into third place on the program's career blocked shots list. He has 130 rejections in his Aztecs career.

The Aztecs held UNLV to 29.7 percent field goal shooting. That is the lowest for the Runnin' Rebels since they shot 29.0 percent against No. 14 North Carolina on Nov. 30, 2020 (neutral site game). The last time they were held to this percentage or lower at Thomas & Mack Center was Jan. 4, 2017, against Boise State.

Trailing by as many as seven points, 20-13, midway through the first half, SDSU used a 22-12 run in the final nine minutes to take a three-point, 35-32 advantage into the intermission.

The San Diego State defense limited UNLV to 23 points in the second half, a season low for the team, and built a 10-point lead with just over half a minute to play before earning the seven-point victory.

SDSU dominated the paint, outscoring UNLV 30-16 and outrebounded the Runnin' Rebels, 55-42. For the Aztecs, it enjoyed season highs in offensive rebounds (19), defensive rebounds (36), total rebounds (55) and rebound margin (+13).

Donovan Williams had 16 points and three blocks for the Runnin' Rebels (8-6, 0-1), whose four-game win streak ended. Bryce Hamilton added 15 points. Royce Hamm Jr. had 14 rebounds.

San Diego State won the game despite being without two starting guards in Trey Pulliam and Lamont Butler. The pair are averaging 20.3 of the team's 64.5 points per game.

## LAST TIME OUT

**San Diego State 71, Air Force 55**

**SAN DIEGO** - Senior guard Matt Bradley scored a season-high 27 points as the San Diego State Aztecs leaned on his strong shooting night to beat Air Force 71-55 on Thursday night at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena. It was the 2022-23 Mountain West Conference opener for each team.

"First of all, Air Force is always a tough game to get ready for," head men's basketball coach Brian Dutcher said, "They're patient, they

make you guard for 30 seconds almost every possession, they can shoot the three, so they're dangerous. Then they play (a) switching man (defense) where they switch every single screen on the floor. I felt good because we had three good days of practice. I told (our team) that a coach takes comfort if he likes practice going into a game, and I liked practice. I thought we would play well, and we did."

The win was SDSU's 15th straight at Steve Fisher Court, the eighth longest streak in program history, and it improved to 31-1 in its last 32 games played at home. In addition, the Aztecs have defeated Air Force for the 16th consecutive time in Viejas Arena and overall is 20-3 in the venue against the Falcons.

Bradley finished the game 9-of-12 from the field, including 6-of-7 from the bonus distance and 3-of-5 from the line. He added three rebounds and an assist and a steal without turning the ball over. The San Bernardino, Calif., native, is the eighth Aztec, since at least the 1996-97 season, to score at least 25 points without committing a turnover. Of those eight, his 31 minutes played is the fewest minutes.

"It's always good to see Matt assert himself at the offensive end," Dutcher added. "When that happens, the offense looks better. I look like a better coach, and we look like a better team. So hopefully Matt has hit a little bit of rhythm now heading into the conference and we'll take it on the road. Home teams went 5-0 in the Mountain West tonight. I think you're going to see that this is a (half conference in which to win on the road) and we're going to go try to do it at UNLV on the 31st."

The Aztecs (10-3, 1-0 Mountain West) started the game off knocking down five of its first six shots to take a 12-2 lead, capped off by Bradley's first of a career-high six 3-pointers. With just over 12 minutes left in the half, he continued his hot start driving into the lane, beating the first defender, and then acrobatically put the ball in the basket to extend the SDSU lead to 21-9.

"Yeah, it was a much-needed break," Bradley said of the team's eight-day layoff between its two most recent games. "During that time a lot of things happened, a lot of good things. That gave me good mojo coming into the game. I got a new puppy, got to spend some time with my family and girlfriend, so coming in I was feeling fresh and rejuvenated. I played free out there."

Down 12 points, Air Force (9-5, 0-1 Mountain West) would respond with a 11-4 run of its own to make it a 25-20 San Diego State lead with six minutes to go before the intermission. Bradley would again respond with a triple, his third of the half, to push the advantage to 28-20. After Jaedon LeDee finished down low on the teams next possession the lead went back to double digits, 30-20, with 3:45 left in the half.

Adam Seiko would hit the Aztecs fifth triple of the half, giving San Diego State a 33-20 lead, before taking a 36-23 advantage into the break. Bradley finished the half 3-of-3 from bonus distance and 13 points.

Both teams would find buckets hard to come by to begin the second half, but Bradley put the Aztecs offense into high gear again. He sank a 3-pointer on back-to-back possessions to push the lead to a game-high 19 points, 44-25, with 15:13 left to play.

The teams would trade buckets over the next few minutes, and each time Air Force would close the gap, SDSU would respond with a three. First it was Micah Parrish nailing a corner three, before Seiko re-established the 19-point advantage on his second try of the night to put the Aztecs up 59-40 with 7:58 remaining.

Bradley would sink his sixth and final three with just over four minutes to play, putting SDSU out front 66-47 and from there the Aztecs finished the game with a 71-55 victory.

## DUTCHER KEEPS THE BALL ROLLING...AND ROLLING

Brian Dutcher has on The Mesa in now his 24th season, 18 of them as the top man on San Diego State Hall of Fame Head Coach Steve Fisher's bench. In that time, he's experienced 512 victories, 14 Mountain West titles and helped the Aztecs to 15 postseason tournaments, including 10 NCAA appearances and a pair of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014).

- Since his ascension to the top job, prior to the 2017-18 season, he has captured four Mountain West crowns and guided his team to the championship game in the league tournament each of his five years.
- In his inaugural campaign, in 2017-18, he was the only first-year Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament.
- He is the only head coach in program history to win at least 21 games in each of his first five seasons.
- His 119 wins in his first five seasons are a program record for victories in a coach's first five campaigns.
- His 129 wins to date are the most of any head coach who started at his current institution at the start of the 2017-18 season.

## CHASING AZTEC HISTORY

Senior **Nathan Mensah** entered the 2022-23 season on the precipice of Aztec history.

He has the opportunity to become just the second player in program history to amass at least 800 points, 700 rebounds and 200 blocked shots in the course of a career.

At the start of this season, Mensah had 732 points, has added 86 more in the first 13 games, and has reached the 800 point plateau (818).

The Accra, Ghana native, has grabbed 78 rebounds since the start of the season to eclipse the 700-rebound milestone. He surpassed 700 boards vs. No. 14 Arizona in the Maui Invitational, and currently sits at 745 (No. 5 in program history) entering the UNLV game. He starts today's game with 192 blocks (No. 3 in program history), eight shy of 200 for his career.

If he achieves all three marks, Mensah will join **Leonard Allen** (1982-85) as the only Aztec to compile those combined numbers in their careers. Allen ranks No. 32 in points (1,019), and No. 7 in rebounds (716) and No. 2 in blocks (214).

- Is 8 blocks from becoming the second player in program history to achieve 800 points, 700 rebounds and 200 blocked shots (also: Leonard Allen - 1982-85).
- Only Aztec, since the start of the 1996-97 season, to shoot 100 percent with a minimum 3 FGA and grab 7 rebounds in a game. Has done it three times, including vs. Arizona (11/21).
- One of two active Division I players who have amassed at least 818 points, 745 rebounds, 192 blocks and hit two 3-pointers & the only one playing for the school where he started his college career.
- Ranks No. 3 on the program's list for career blocked shots (192) and has averaged 1.6 blocks per game in his 120 career games. At that pace, he can pass Leonard Allen (1982-85), who is No. 2 with 214 blocks, in five games. The program leader in career blocked shots is Skylar Spencer who swatted 303 shots in his Aztec career (2013-16).
- Last season, he was one of five players nationally who are 6-10 or taller to block at least 71 shots and make at least one 3-pointer.
- In his last 23 games has totaled 45 blocked shots (1.9 per game).
- Has shot at least 50.0 percent in 10-of-13 games this season & for his career, when he shoots at least 40.0 percent, SDSU is 67-21.
- Has at least one block in 49 of his last 54 games, including two or more in 29 of those 49 outings.
- Among seven double-digit scoring games in 2021-22, he established a career-high vs. UC San Diego (12/22) with 19 points.
- Six of his 16 career double-digit rebounding games came in 2021-22 led by a pair of 13 rebound efforts: vs. Saint Mary's (12/17) and vs. San Jose State (2/25).
- Equaled a career-high with seven offensive boards vs. Boise State (3/12/22) in the championship game of the Mountain West tournament.
- Has recorded a block in 33 of his last 35 appearances & had at least two blocks in 23 contests (SDSU is 17-6 in those games).
- In games in which he had a minimum of three blocks, the Aztecs are 11-3 since the start of the 2021-22 season (34 games).
- He became the first Aztec player in at least 25 seasons to produce a game with at least 18 points, 13 rebounds and six blocked shots (vs. Saint Mary's on 12/22/20). He was one of just two players to do it in Division I basketball that season (also: Charles Bassey, Western Kentucky).

- A physical guard who can score from all three levels and is an elite defender.
- The team is 52-16 in games in which he has played and is 30-10 in his starts where he is averaging 7.6 points, 2.3 rebounds & 2.6 assists.
- His 10 assists in the first two games of 2022-23, and again in games two & three equals the best two game total in his collegiate career.
- Has begun 2022-23 with a career-best 1.60:1 assist-to-turnover & 108 steals-to-turnover ratios.
- Since the start of the Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-00) he is just the second Aztec to have four steals and a 6:1 assist-to-turnover ratio in a game (also Deandre Moore vs. Wyoming on March 1, 2001). He did it in the season opener vs. Cal State Fullerton (11/7).
- Dished out six assists without a turnover at Stanford (11/15).
- Has totaled 12 games of three or more steals and in those contests San Diego State has an 11-1 record.
- In his first two seasons, scored in double figures one out of every five games (12-of-55), compared to this year where he has done it one out of every 3 games (4-of-12).
- In his last 8 home games is shooting 45.3 percent from the field (24-of-53) while averaging 7.0 points, 2.6 rebs., 3.5 assists and 2.8 steals.
- A starter in 38 of his last 40 appearances.



- Was the only Aztec true freshman (2020-21) to start back-to-back games since Nathan Mensah on March 15 & 16, 2019 and is just the third freshman in the last five seasons to start a game for SDSU (Matt Mitchell & Nathan Mensah).

- In his last 8 true road games, is averaging 11.6 pts on .426 shooting (29-of-68), with 5.6 rebs and 1.3 assists.
- Streak of 57 consecutive starts halted vs. Cal State Fullerton (11/7) and failed to grab at least one rebound for just the second time in his collegiate career (70 games).
- Versus Troy (12/5) failed to score a point for just the third time in his college career (70 games) and the first time as an Aztec.
- Has scored in double digits in four of his last 10 appearances.
- A starter in his last 57 appearances at Oakland, including all 30 last season.

## SAN DIEGO STATE FINISHES IN FOURTH PLACE IN THE MAUI INVITATIONAL

In 2022 San Diego State participated in the Maui Invitational for the fourth time.

- With its 78-74 defeat versus Arkansas on Wednesday, the Aztecs went 1-2 in the 2022 edition of the Maui Invitational, have a 6-6 overall record, and in its four trips to Maui have second, third, fourth and sixth place finishes.
- In 2003, the team went 2-1, defeated Ohio State 83-61 in the quarterfinal, then lost to Dayton 76-71 before winning the tournament's third-place game 75-67 over host Chaminade.
- The 2014 edition also saw No. 15 SDSU post a 2-1 record. The team opened with a double-overtime victory against Brigham Young, 92-87, and followed that up with a 74-57 win against Pittsburgh. In the championship game, the No. 3 Arizona Wildcats got the better of the Scarlet and Black 61-59.
- The last time the Aztecs competed in the Maui Invitational prior to 2022 was in 2018, opening against No. 1 Duke, which resulted in a 90-64 loss. The team bounced back against Xavier with a 79-74 victory, but Iowa State handed SDSU another lopsided loss, 87-57.
- Three current Aztecs Aguek Arop, Nathan Mensah and Adam Seiko, were on the squad which competed in 2018 and are the largest number of players who are on the same team to have competed twice in the Maui Invitational.

## TOP-25 FACTS

- San Diego State opened the 2022-23 season ranked No. 19 in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll. It is the fourth time that SDSU has been included in the AP's preseason poll; all coming during the Dutcher/Fisher era, and is the second highest ranking for the program in the initial poll of a year.
- The previous three occasions when San Diego State was ranked in the preseason poll by the AP voters was prior to the 2010-11 season when the Aztecs were initially No. 25; prior to the 2012-13 campaign, when SDSU was No. 20; and the most recent appearance before this year, was 2014-15 when the Scarlet and Black was No. 16, the program's highest ranking in the preseason poll.
- How important is the preseason ranking or what does it portend? The three previous Aztec teams which were ranked in the preseason AP poll, finished a combined 84-23, including a 44-3 mark in Viejas Arena. Each squad made at least the round of 32 in the NCAA tournament with the 2010-11 team reaching the Sweet 16 and finishing the season with a 34-3 record.
- San Diego State's longest consecutive streak of weeks ranked in the AP Top-25 is 22 straight (Dec. 2, 2013 to Dec. 15, 2014).
- Entering this season, the Aztecs had appeared in the AP Poll for 88 weeks, and all have come since the start of the 2010-11 campaign.
- **As of the Monday, Dec. 19 poll, San Diego State's 93 appearances since the start of the 2010-11 campaign, are the most of any school in California. (See box in the left column of page 5)**

- Prior to this season's ranking, the last time the Aztecs appeared in the AP poll was March 15, 2021, the final poll of the 2020-21 season, and the Aztecs were ranked No. 16.
- Since the start of the 2019-20 season San Diego State has appeared in the USA Today Coaches Poll 21 times, including this year's preseason ranking of No. 20 and each successive week this year.

### AZTECS NO. 22 IN THE ASSOCIATED PRESS & COACHES POLLS

Despite falling to a pair of teams ranked in the top-15, No. 9 Arkansas and No. 14 Arizona, at the 2022 Maui Invitational, the San Diego State men's basketball team remained in the Associated Press Top 25 and USA Today Coaches Polls, slotting in at No. 24 in each organization's rankings. SDSU totaled 189 points in the AP poll and 126 in the Coaches poll and continues to be the only Mountain West program to be ranked in either.

- This marks the 93rd week San Diego State has been ranked in the AP Top 25 since the start of the 2010-11 season, the most of any program in the state of California in that time frame.
- San Diego State is ranked No. 22 for the fifth time in school history. SDSU has appeared in every position in the poll between No. 4 and No. 25, except for No. 12.
- Today's poll ranking, released on Dec. 5, marks the fifth time SDSU has appeared in the AP Top 25 on this date.

### TRAMMELL EARNS MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Darrion Trammell, a senior guard, is the Mountain West men's basketball Player of the Week, for the week ending Sunday, Nov. 13. The announcement was made Monday morning at the league office in Colorado Springs, Colo.

- The Marin City, Calif., native, shot 60.0 percent from the floor (12-of-20), 70.0 percent from distance (7-of-10), and sank 80.0 percent of his free throws (8-of-10) in wins over Cal State Fullerton and Brigham Young, a pair of 2022 NCAA tournament teams.
- Trammell opened the 2022-23 season, his first as an Aztec, with 18 points against Cal State Fullerton. Trammell was 6-of-7 from the field, including 4-of-5 five from beyond the arc, and knocked down both his free throw attempts. He added three steals, two rebounds, and an assist in 24 minutes of action.
- Trammell hit his first two shots against CSF, a 3-pointer, 13 seconds in to stake the Aztecs to a 3-0 lead, and just before the first media timeout, a jumper to extend the advantage to five points, 9-4. His next shot was off the mark, but for the rest of the contest he did not miss in SDSU's 80-57 win over the Titans.
- Against Brigham Young, Trammell totaled 21 points, hitting 6-of-13 shot attempts from the floor (46.2 percent), 3-of-5 from the bonus distance (60.0 percent), and 6-of-8 from the line (75.0 percent), with four assists, three rebounds and a steal in a team-high 35 minutes on the floor.
- Trailing 60-58 with 8:23 to play, Trammell hit a jumper in the paint and was fouled. He sank the free throw to give SDSU its first lead, 61-60, since a 20-18 advantage with 11:55 to play in the first half.
- The Cougars jumped back in front 67-61, but Trammell hit a three and followed that with a free throw to bring SDSU back to within a bucket. He dished out assists on the team's next two possessions and with 3:48 left, helped put the Aztecs up 71-68.
- With 2:03 to go in the contest and the score 73-70 in San Diego State's favor, Trammell nailed a baseline three as the shot clock expired to extend the Aztecs' cushion to six points. Down the stretch he sank each of his four free throw attempts to secure the 82-75 victory over the program's longtime rival.
- This is the first Mountain West men's basketball Player of the Week award in Trammell's career and the first for an Aztec this season.

### SDSU INKS TWO IN EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

San Diego State's men's basketball program bolstered its roster on Thursday signing guard B.J. Davis and forward Miles Heide to National Letters of Intent. The pair will compete for the Scarlet and Black beginning in the 2023-24 school year.

Davis, a 6-1, 170-pound point guard, will graduate in May from Modesto (Calif.) Christian High School. He is a three-star prospect who is ranked as the No. 137 recruit in the country, including a No. 22 national ranking at his position, and a No. 20 ranking overall within the state of California according to 247Sports.com.

Davis is a lanky ball handler whose athletic ability and crafty playing style make him explosive on both ends of the court. He possesses an impressive offensive skill set; able to create shots for both him and his teammates, as well as knocking down spot-up opportunities at an efficient rate. Defensively, Davis has proven to have great hands, finding ways to get into passing lanes and poke balls free consistently. He is an exciting and explosive addition for the Aztecs, who already have a strong backcourt coming back next year.

Davis, a team captain, led Modesto Christian as the primary ball handler in the 2021-22 campaign, averaging 17.0 points, 6.5 rebounds, 4.5 assists, and 2.6 steals per game, according to Maxpreps. He was very efficient offensively, completing the season shooting 52.4 percent from the field, 41.7 percent from the bonus distance, 88.6 percent from the line, and a 2.18:1 assist-to-turnover ratio.

He led Modesto Christian to a second-place finish at the 2022 CIF State Finals Open Division and an overall record of 30-6. Highlighting the playoff run was a 28-point performance in routing touted San Jose's Archbishop Mitty, 77-55, to reach the tournament's semifinals and was named to the All-Northern California basketball team in his junior year as well as the first-team All-Tri City Athletic League.

Davis chose the Aztecs over offers from 15 other schools including Washington and Ole Miss as well as Mountain West programs Wyoming, Boise State, and Fresno State.

Heide is a 6-9, 225-pound forward who is set to graduate from Mount Si High School in Snoqualmie, Washington, at the conclusion of the school year. He is a three-star recruit who ranks No. 274 player in the nation according to PrepHoops, the No. 30 rated center in the country, and the No. 3 recruit out of the state of Washington, according to 247 Sports.

Heide is a lean big man who is a skilled interior player. His athleticism allows him to swallow up rebounds on both ends of the court, and his efficient offensive close to the basket is elite. Heide's defensive presence shows up in his block statistics, 2.3 per outing. He is a skilled big who can run the floor and contribute to the Aztecs fast-paced offense.

Heide's most productive year is his most recent, finishing his junior campaign averaging 14.5 points, 10.1 rebounds, and 2.3 blocks per game according to Maxpreps. He led Mount Si to an impressive 25-1 record on the year, including a 16-0 mark in 4A KingCo District play. Perhaps most impressive from Heide, apart from his double-double average, is his efficiency scoring the ball, shooting 71.0 percent from the field. Even more, the big man improved from his offensive totals as a sophomore significantly, more than doubling his point production which suggests he will continue to grow as a scorer within the Aztecs offense.

Heide chose the Aztecs over 13 other programs, including BYU, Iowa, and Loyola Chicago, as well as Mountain West programs Fresno

## SEASON OPENERS

- With its 80-57 victory over Cal State Fullerton on November 7, San Diego State improved its record to 69-33 (.676) in season opening games, regardless of location.
- In its now 53rd season of Division I basketball, San Diego State is 34-19 (.642) in DI season-opening games.
- San Diego State has won its last 18 home openers, regardless of whether the game was the season opener.
- The Aztecs have won 10 consecutive season openers, regardless of location.

## AZTECS PREDICTED TO FINISH FIRST IN MOUNTAIN WEST PRESEASON MEDIA POLL

- San Diego State has won an unprecedented 14 Mountain West titles in men's basketball (eight regular season & six tournament), six more than any other Mountain West program, and despite not winning either the regular season and tournament crowns in 2021-22, but returning four starters, has been predicted to finish in first by a poll of the media that regularly cover the conference.
- SDSU has been predicted to finish either first or second in the Mountain West media's preseason poll in each of the last nine years.
- It is also the 14th time in the last 18 years that San Diego State has been picked first or second in the Mountain West's preseason poll.
- San Diego State received 16 of a possible 20 first place votes.
- The Aztecs have garnered at least one first-place vote in the preseason poll in eight of the last nine years.
- Complete Mountain West media preseason predicted order of finish is located in the column on page 4.

## BRADLEY AND TRAMMELL EARN PRESEASON MOUNTAIN WEST HONORS

In addition to SDSU being predicted to win its Mountain West-record 15th league title in 2022-23, a pair of Aztec players, Matt Bradley and Darrion Trammell, were included on the conference's list of preseason honors. Bradley was included on the All-MW Team and Trammell was named the Newcomer of the Year by the media who regularly cover the Mountain West.

- Last season, Bradley was second-team NABC All-District 17, Mountain West Newcomer of the Year (coaches & media), first-team All-MW (coaches), second-team All-MW (media), MW All-Tournament Team, Two-Time MW Player of the Week & ESPN National Player of the Week (March 7), NCAA March Madness Player of the Week (March 7).
- Bradley's 542 points in 2021-22, are the 14th most in a single season in the program's Division I era (since the start of the 1970-71 campaign) and he led the team in points, was second in assists (85), and rebounds (174) and third in steals (33).
- Bradley is the second Aztec to be named to the preseason All-Mountain West in the last three seasons, joining Matt Mitchell who was named to the team prior to the 2020-21 campaign. Mitchell went on to be named the Mountain West Player of the Year and a first-team performer following that season.
- In 2021-22, Bradley was one of nine players in the nation and the second Aztec since the start of the 1996-97 season, to shoot at least 43.8 percent from the field (minimum 425 shots attempts) & 40.1 percent from the bonus distance (minimum 142 shot attempts).
- Trammell is one of four players in Division I who totaled at least 539 points, dished out at least 157 assists and had a 1.73:1 assist-to-turn-over ratio last season, and if you add his 5-10 height to the mix, he is the only player to accomplish those statistics in 2021-22.
- Trammell ranked as the 5th most productive pick and roll scorer in the nation (6.9 ppg) according to Synergy Sports.
- Joining Malachi Flynn (2019-20) and Matt Bradley (2021-22), Trammell becomes the third Aztec in the last four seasons to be recognized by the media as the preseason Newcomer of the Year. Both Flynn and Bradley proved the prognosticators correct by earning the award when the season was complete.

## CALIFORNIA DREAMIN' FOR SDSU...CALIFORNIA NIGHTMARE FOR IN-STATE OPPONENTS

- Since the start of the Coach Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-2000), the Aztecs are 129-35 (.787) against 24 of the other 25 current Division I schools in California (SDSU has not played Cal Baptist), and have a winning record against all but four of those 24 opponents.
- In the last 96 home games against those same 24 opponents, and also starting in 1999-2000, San Diego State is 85-11 (.885).
- In program history against the 24 schools, the Aztecs are 463-325 (.588) overall.

San Diego State opened the 2022-23 season hosting an in-state foe in Cal State Fullerton and improved to 23-10 against the Titans in the all-time series. The Aztecs won at Stanford on Nov. 15, 74-62, to capture its first win against the Cardinal in five tries and downed UC Irvine 72-69 on Nov. 29. After a 16-68 defeat against Saint Mary's in the Jerry Colangelo Classic at Phoenix, SDSU has three games remaining on the schedule against in-state Division I opponents, including a game against UC San Diego on Dec. 20 at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

## BRADLEY INCLUDED ON JERRY WEST AWARD WATCH LIST

- For the second time in as many years, Matt Bradley has been included on the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame's initial watch list for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award, the most prestigious individual honor a collegiate shooting guard can earn.
- Bradley, one of 20 men's basketball players who have been included on the watch list, transferred to The Mesa from the University of California prior to the 2021-22 season and last year led the Aztecs in points per game (16.9), 3-pointers (57), free throws (113) and minutes (1,007). In addition, he ranked second on the squad in rebounds (174), assists (85), and was third in steals (33). His 542 points are the 15th most in a season in program history.
- The native of San Bernardino, Calif., returns in 2022-23 as the No. 4 scorer and the No. 5 rebounder in the Mountain West. He reached double-figure scoring 26 times last year and in those games the team was 20-6. He enjoyed 19 games of 15 or more points, 12 games of 20 or more, and a career-high 30-point game in a 73-66 victory at Wyoming, the only home loss the Cowboys suffered last season. At the conclusion of the year, he was named a second-team NABC All-District 17 performer, the Mountain West Newcomer of the Year, first-team All-Mountain West, and was included on the Mountain West All-Tournament Team.
- A 6-4, 220-pound shooting guard, he has scored 1,831 points in 117 career games and is one of five players in the nation, who still have eligibility and will compete this year, to score at least that many points in the last four seasons.

## AZTECS OPEN 2022-23 NO. 19 IN THE AP TOP 25 POLL

The San Diego State men's basketball team is ranked No. 19 in the Associated Press' preseason Top 25 poll, garnering 394 points. It marks the fourth time in program history SDSU has earned inclusion on the initial AP poll and all have come since the start of the 2010-11 campaign. The Aztecs are the only program in the Mountain West to appear in the AP's initial 2022-23 poll.

In its three previous appearances in the AP preseason poll, San Diego State was ranked No. 25 and received 158 points to start the 2010-11 season, was No. 20 with 463 points before the 2012-13 season, and No. 16, garnering 560 points, to open the 2014-15 campaign.

# BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach

Sixth Season • 24th Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher enters his sixth season as San Diego State head men's basketball coach, building on the previous five years in which he led the Aztecs to five title games in Mountain West tournament, its conference-record 11th, 12th, 13th & 14th Mountain West crowns, and to a bid to the NCAA tournament three times. He is the only coach in the 101-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first five seasons. His 119 victories in five seasons (119-40) are the most for any Division I head coach whose first year guiding his current program was 2017-18 and the accompanying win percentage, 74.8 percent, is the highest for any head basketball coach in San Diego State history.

Dutcher has been recognized twice, following the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons, with Mountain West Coach of the Year honors and was the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year in both those years as well. In addition, Dutcher earned USA Today National Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year distinction following the 2019-20 campaign and was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naimsmith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

His teams have faced top-25 ranked opponents on 15 occasions and posted a 9-6 record (60.0 percent) and includes wins over Gonzaga, UCLA and Arizona State as well as Nevada (four times) and Colorado State (twice). Since the start of the 2018-19 season, his Aztecs are 4-2 against Pac-12 opponents and 8-4 in multi-team events in season. Since the start of the 2017-18 season, SDSU has the 14th best home win percentage in the nation (88.3 percent), and in the last three years, San Diego State has posted a 91.1-win percentage (41-4) in Viejas Arena, the ninth best in the nation.

The team's success on the court is reflected in the honors his players have earned under his tutelage. In 2020 Malachi Flynn was a consensus All-American, the third Aztecs to earn that honor and the following season Matt Mitchell was recognized by the Associated Press with the All-American moniker.

San Diego State put a player on the USBWA's All-District IX first team in 2020 (Flynn) and 2021 (Mitchell). The NABC has bestowed its All-District 17 honors seven times to an Aztec in the last five years. In 2019, Jalen McDaniels earned first team designation. Flynn, Yannik Weitzell were first team and Mitchell was second team in 2020. In 2021, Mitchell and Jordan Schakel earned first team and second team honors, respectively and in 2022 Matt Bradley was a second team performer.

Within the Mountain West, Flynn was named the 2020 Mountain West Male Athlete of the Year, Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, Newcomer of the Year and a member of the All-Defensive Team. In the same season, KJ Feagin was named to the all-defensive team and one year prior, Jeremy Hemsley was included on the league's all-defensive team. In 2021, Mitchell earned Mountain West Player of the Year, first team All-Mountain West and inclusion on the all-defensive team along with Nathan Mensah. In 2022, Mensah was the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year and a member of the all-defensive team. Bradley was the Newcomer of the Year. Chad Baker-Mazara was named the Sixth Man of the Year and Lamont Butler garnered all-defensive team honors.

His players have earned 14 all-Mountain West designations and 15 player of the week honors. Two Aztecs, Trey Kell in 2018 and Mitchell in 2021, were named Mountain West tournament MVP among 10 SDSU players who have been included on the league's all-tournament team. In his five seasons, his charges have garnered 14 league all-academic team distinctions with Flynn being named to the 2020 NABC Honors Court.

The 2021-22 campaign featured a 23-9 record and SDSU's second straight appearance in the NCAA tournament and its second consecutive single-digit seed, No. 8. Six of its nine losses were by 6 points or less and after Dec. 8, 2021, five of the team's six defeats were by six points or less. Twice during that stretch, the Aztecs defeated nationally ranked Colorado State.

The team's No. 2 ranking in KenPom's adjusted defensive efficiency was the best for a Dutcher coached team and matched the program's best rating since the start of the 2006-07 season (the team was No. 2 following the 2010-11 campaign). Among its national rankings, SDSU was No. 2 in scoring defense, No. 4 in field goal percentage defense, No. 25 in 3-point field goal percentage defense and No. 32 in blocks per game.

The defensive success was in part due to Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year Nathan Mensah. The Accra, Ghana native averaged 2.2 blocks per game to lead the Mountain West, totaled a career-high 71 blocks for the season, and was No. 5 in offensive rebounds, No. 7 in total rebounds and No. 13 in defensive boards.

Offensively, the team was led by first year player Matt Bradley, who transferred into the program in the summer of 2021. The Mountain West Newcomer of the Year and first-team all-league designee, led the team in virtually every offensive statistical category, including points (542), field goals (186), 3-pointers (57) and free throws (113).

In 2020-21, he guided San Diego State to the Mountain West regular-season and tournament crowns and earned a No. 6-seed in the NCAA tournament. The Aztecs went 23-5 and finished the regular season ranked No. 7 in field goal percentage defense (.387), No. 8 in scoring defense (60.6), No. 12 in scoring margin (+13.5), No. 14 in total steals (233), and No. 16 in turnover margin (+3.9) nationally. Among the Mountain West teams, San Diego State led the league in turnovers forced (15.15), steals per game (8.19), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.25:1), three-point field goal percentage (.381), field goal percentage defense, scoring defense, scoring margin, turnover margin and total steals. The team posted a 14-game win streak, which is the fourth longest in school history and is the third at least nine games under Dutcher.

The 2019-20 squad ripped off a program-record 26-straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both national polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2, including 17-1 in Mountain West play.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the third most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game

winning streak, which set a new Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus second-team All-American Malachi Flynn, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blowout victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the championship game. A month later, three days after Utah defeated then No. 6 Kentucky, the Aztecs handed the Utes a 28-point drubbing in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic.

With the expected return for the postseason of forward Nathan Mensah, who had been sidelined for the final 19 games of the year, San Diego State was poised for a deep run in the NCAA Tournament. The Aztecs were projected to be either a No. 1 or No. 2 seed and some felt were a Final Four team, but the corona virus pandemic put an end to the postseason and fans were left to wonder what could have been.

In 2017-18, his first season as head coach, he was the only Division I coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament after going 22-10 in the regular season, including winning the 2018 Mountain West Tournament championship.

Over the course of his 23 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 16 times, including 11 trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 14 Mountain West titles and record 17 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, SDSU has twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games eight times and captured 11 MW championships (seven regular season, four tournament).

In his first year on The Mesa (1999-00) the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the program's first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 campaign that produced the school's first MW regular-season and tournament title sweep. The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

LAHAINA, Maui — Matt Bradley scored 18 points before fouling out in the final minutes and helped No. 17 San Diego State rally from a slow start to beat Ohio State 88-77 Monday night in the first round of the Maui Invitational.

Lamont Butler and Micah Parrish had 15 points apiece and Adam Seiko added 14 for the Aztecs (4-0).

Sean McNeil scored 20 of his 22 points in the second half for Ohio State (3-1), which was playing away from Columbus for the first time this season. Brice Sensabaugh scored 17 and Bruce Thornton 13.

Ohio State threatened to turn the momentum three times in the final minutes but the Aztecs answered each time.

Tanner Holden made a dunk and was fouled by Bradley, which was determined to be flagrant. He made both free throws to pull the Buckeyes to 80-72. Sensabaugh made one of two free throws for the Buckeyes before Parrish drained a 3 to give the Aztecs a double-digit lead.

Bradley fouled out with 2:53 left and Thornton made both free throws to pull the Buckeyes to 83-75.

Darrion Trammell of SDSU then made two free throws with 1:49 left.

In a crazy sequence with more than 13 minutes left, the Buckeyes closed within four points but then saw SDSU extend the lead back to double digits. Sensabaugh made a 3-pointer and there was a foul away from the play allowing the Buckeyes to keep the ball, and McNeil made a jumper to pull OSU to 51-47.

But the Aztecs came back to score eight points in less than a minute to jump ahead 59-47. Parrish had consecutive 3s and Butler had a steal and fed Aguek Arop for a layup. The Aztecs extended the run to 17-5 on a 3-pointer by Seiko.

Saint Mary's started clamping down defensively in the second half, holding San Diego State scoreless for more than five minutes to build a five-point lead. The Aztecs finally hit a shot, but went on another scoreless drought of nearly four minutes, falling behind 59-50 on a 3-pointer by Ducas.

San Diego State tried to fight back, but the Gaels pushed them away to pull out a key nonconference win.

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State's men's basketball team, led by a game-high 19 points off the bench from Micah Parrish, defeated Kennesaw State 88-54 on Monday night at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

"Well, it felt great to be back in Viejas, we had a great crowd," Aztec head coach Brian Dutcher said. "They brought the energy and that's what I put on the board: we have to bring energy. It feels like we're playing every other night, but we've had a pretty good schedule. It's balanced out. Sometimes it just feels like you're playing every other night and so I was concerned about this game. I knew Kennesaw had a week off before us. We played a tough game against Saint Mary's in Phoenix, [had a] one day prep, but we did a really good job on that one day."

Parrish's 19 points are a season-high and one off his career-high, 20 points, which he achieved three times at Oakland.

Joining Parrish in double-digits were Darrion Trammell and Jaedon LeDee, who each finished with 14 points. LeDee was 10-for-11 from the free throw line and pulled down seven rebounds.

Up 18-14 with 11:03 to play in the first half, SDSU went on an 11-0 run over the succeeding 3:30 to take its first double digit lead, 29-14 and had a 14-point advantage going into the half.

The Aztecs put together another double-digit scoring run in the second half, 10-0, led by eight points from LeDee. San Diego State pushed its lead to 40 points with 5:11 to play before earning the 34-point win.

SDSU used a size advantage to outscore the Owls 40-to-16 in the paint and 14-2 in second chance points

SDSU outrebounded the Owls 39-28 with Nathan Mensah pulling down a game-high nine boards and added three blocked shots.

Kennesaw State was led by Kasen Jennings' 17 points.

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State wrapped up non-conference play Tuesday with a 62-46 triumph over UC San Diego at Viejas Arena.

With the victory, the Aztecs remain unbeaten in 13 all-time meetings against the Tritons.

Darrion Trammell was the lone player to reach double figures for SDSU (9-3), finishing with 18 points on 6-of-11 from the floor, including a 4-of-6 from beyond the arc, while Jaedon LeDee grabbed a career-high 12 rebounds.

However, both teams witnessed their share of offensive struggles, with the Aztecs shooting 36.1 percent from the floor (22-61) compared to the Tritons' 31.6 percent pace (18-57).

SDSU connected on 10-of-24 tries from three-point range (41.7 percent), while UCSD (5-7) was just 5-for-28 (17.9 percent) on its long-range attempts.

In addition, the Scarlet and Black maintained a sizeable 47-31 advantage in rebounds and a 17-10 edge in points off turnovers to help fuel their win.

The Aztecs never trailed, opening a 11-0 lead through the first five-plus minutes, capped by a Keshad Johnson dunk.

SDSU limited the Tritons to 22.2 percent shooting (6-27) in the first half, including draining just 2-of-15 from three-point range (13.3 percent).

Conversely, Trammell shouldered much of the Aztecs' offensive burden, nailing triples on three consecutive possessions late in the half to give the hosts a commanding 35-16 lead by intermission.

SDSU missed its first nine shots of the second period; however, UCSD could draw no closer than 13 points after Justin DeGraaf's layup cut the margin to 35-22 with 15 minutes remaining.

Unfazed, the Aztecs responded with a 16-3 blitz to quash any Triton comeback hopes. Nathan Mensah scored all six of his points during the run, including his first trey of the season at the 10:05 mark to give SDSU its largest lead of the night at 51-26.

In addition to Trammell's production, which included four assists, the Aztecs received nine points from Johnson, while Matt Bradley and Micah Parrish pulled down six rebounds apiece, with the latter notching a collegiate best.

After a slow start, UCSD's Bryce Pope scored 16 of his game-high 20 points on 7-of-11 shooting in the second half, while Francis Nwaakorjie totaled nine points and seven boards for the Tritons in the loss.

**SAN DIEGO** - Senior guard Matt Bradley scored a season-high 27 points as the San Diego State Aztecs leaned on his strong shooting night to beat Air Force 71-55 on Thursday night at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

The win was SDSU's 15th straight at Steve Fisher Court, the eighth longest streak in program history, and improved to 31-1 in its last 31 games played at home. In addition, the Aztecs have defeated Air Force for the 16th consecutive time in Viejas Arena and overall is 20-3 in the venue against the Falcons.

Bradley finished the game 9-of-12 from the field, including 6-of-7 from the bonus distance and 3-of-5 from the line. He added three rebounds and an assist and a steal without turning the ball over. He the eighth Aztec, since at least the 1996-97 season, to score at least 25 points without committing a turnover. Of those eight, he played the fewest minutes (31).

The Aztecs (10-3, 1-0 Mountain West) started the game knocking down five of its first six shots to take a 12-2 lead capped off by a Bradley first of a career-high six 3-pointers. With just over 12 minutes left in the half, Bradley continued his hot start when he drove into the lane, beat the first defender, and then acrobatically put the ball in the basket to extend the Aztecs lead to 21-9.

Air Force (9-5, 0-1 Mountain West) would respond with an 11-4 run of its own to cut its deficit to five points with six minutes to go before the half. Bradley would again respond with another triple, his third of the half, to push the Aztecs' advantage to 28-20. After a Jaedon LeDee bucket on the next possession the lead back to double digits, 30-20. Adam Seiko would hit the Aztecs fifth triple of the half, and SDSU took a 36-23 advantage into the break.

Both teams would find buckets hard to come by to begin the second half, but Bradley put the Aztecs offense into high gear again. He sank a 3-pointer on back-to-back possessions to push the lead to a game-high 19 points, 44-25, with 15:13 left in the game.

The teams would trade buckets over the next few minutes, and each time Air Force would close the gap, SDSU would respond with a triple. First it was Micah Parrish nailing a corner three, before Seiko re-established the 19-point advantage on his second trey of the night to put the Aztecs up 59-40 with 7:58 remaining.

Bradley would sink his sixth and final three with just over four minutes to play, putting SDSU out front 66-47 and from there the Aztecs finished the game with a 71-55 victory.
