Aztec Men's Soccer Returns to San Diego This Weekend to Face 12th-ranked California, Stanford

The San Diego State men's soccer team looks to snap a three-game losing streak this weekend when it plays host to California and Stanford. The Aztecs (7-5-1, 1-4-0 Pac-10) will meet the Bears (8-2-2, 4-1-0 Pac-10) at 3 p.m. Friday and the Cardinal (7-6-0, 3-2-0 Pac-10) at 1 p.m. Sunday. SDSU, which is ranked in a tie for 10th with Stanford in the latest NSCAA/HendrickCars.com Far West Region poll, outshot both teams last weekend in the Bay Area, but lost both matches. California is ranked as high as No. 12 by NSCAA/HendrickCars.com, *Soccer Times* and *Top Drawer Soccer*.

Noting the Aztecs

* Despite losing three consecutive games, San Diego State is still 7-5-1 (.577). The seven victories are one more than its win total from each of its past two seasons (6-6-6 in 2009, 6-9-3 in 2008).

* The Aztecs began their season with a seven-game (6-0-1) unbeaten streak, outscoring the opposition, 15-4. The seven-match unbeaten streak was the program's longest since an eight-game undefeated span in 2007 (Sept. 9-Oct. 14) and tied for the eighth-longest in program history.

* SDSU dropped from fifth to a tie for 10th in the NSCAA/HendrickCars.com Far West Region poll. Two weeks ago, San Diego State was fourth and three weeks ago it was third, the highest in head coach Lev Kirshner's 11-year tenure. Other Pac-10 teams in the top 10 include UCLA (No. 2), California (No. 3), Washington (No. 7) and Stanford (T-10th).

* San Diego State is 5-0-1 in tournament games in 2010.

* Senior Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.) leads the team in points (16), goals (6), penalty kick goals (3), shots (50), shots on goal (20), and is tied for first with two game-winning goals. Among the national leaders, Reza ranks in a tie for 53rd with 1.23 points per game and in a tie for 59th with 0.46 goals per game. Sophomore Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS), meanwhile, is tied for 15th in the country with 0.54 assists per game.


* Reza has started 49 consecutive matches.

A Glance at the Bears

California continued its torrid start, downing the Aztecs, 3-0, in Berkeley, on Friday before falling to UCLA, 1-0, in double-overtime on Sunday. The Bears are now 8-2-2 overall and in a tie for first place in the Pac-10 with UCLA at 4-1-0. Cal, which is outscoring the opposition in league play, 15-2, is ranked 12th in the nation by NSCAA/HendrickCars.com, *Soccer Times* and *Top Drawer Soccer*, and 13th by *Soccer America* and *College Soccer News*.

Davis Paul is second in the Pac-10 at 1.42 points per game with his 17 points on five goals and seven assists. John Fitzpatrick has added 12 points on five goals and two assists, while A.J. Soares has 11 points (five goals, one assist). David Bingham leads all league keepers in goals against average (0.62), saves per game (5.50) and shutouts (6, tied for first).

California's win on Friday over the Aztecs snapped a three-game losing streak in the series. SDSU leads, 17-13-2, all-time, including a 7-3-1 mark in Pac-10 play. San Diego State is 5-0-0 at home against Cal in the Pac-10 era.

Scouting the Cardinal

Streaky Stanford comes into the weekend with a 7-6-0 record and a 3-2-0 mark in the Pac-10. The Cardinal lost its first four matches, won its next four, lost its next two and has now won its last three games by a combined 4-1 score.

Dominique Yahyavi leads Stanford offensively with 11 points on five goals and an assist. Hermann Award candidate and Lowe's Senior Class Award finalist Bobby Warshaw has chipped in with four goals., while Adam John has been good for two goals and three assists (seven points). Galen Perkins has taken over for an injured Jason Dodson and is 3-1-0 with a 0.72 goals against average and two shutouts in 376:51. Dodson was 4-4-0 with a 0.97 GAA and three clean sheets in 744:28.

San Diego State leads the all-time series between the two schools, 10-5-5, including a 5-4-2 mark in SDSU's Pac-10 era (since 2005). The Aztecs are 5-1-3 against the Cardinal in San Diego and 3-1-1 at home since 2005. Each of the last five matches have been decided by one goal with the Aztecs winning three times.

At the Helm

Lev Kirshner is in his 11th year as head coach at San Diego State and 14th season overall. Kirshner, just one of three coaches in the 42-year history of the program, has brought SDSU back to the national spotlight with two trips to the NCAA tournament since he helped orchestrate the program's move to the Pac-10 in 2005.

Since the men's soccer team earned its full allotment of scholarships (2005), the Aztecs have gone 44-36-24 (.538), including an 18-21-16 (.473) mark in the competitive Pac-10.

Over his 10 seasons, Kirshner has coached two All-America selections, three Academic All-America picks, nine professional players, seven all-Far West selections and 50 all-conference picks.

A Look at the Last Three Games

San Diego State is in a bit of a funk, losing each of the past three games on the road to Pac-10 Conference foes UCLA (1-0), California (3-0) and Stanford (1-0).

Over those three games, however, the Aztecs outshot the opposition, 46-31. Rarely does a visiting team outshoot the home team and even more rare does that happen in losses. Senior captain Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.) has 14 of those attempts and leads the Pac-10 with 3.85 shots per game.

Another good indicator of how SDSU is playing is corner kicks. Over those three contests, San Diego State has 11 corners to its opponents seven.

SDSU Falls Out of the National Polls

With three consecutive losses, the Aztecs have fallen out of the national polls. It is the first time that SDSU hasn't been nationally ranked or receiving votes since Sept. 7.

On Oct. 5., San Diego State was ranked in all five polls for the first time since Oct. 11, 2005 (only four polls, *Top Drawer Soccer* was unavailable).

Three weeks ago (Sept. 28), the Aztecs were tied for 22nd, its highest in the NSCAA/HendrickCars.com poll since Oct. 31, 2006.

SDSU has been as high as No. 21 in the Oct. 5 edition of the *Soccer America* poll.

San Diego State and the RPI

The Aztecs are ranked No. 79 in the latest RPI, which was released Monday (Oct. 18), down from No. 65 in the first RPI of the season a week ago (Oct. 11). The rating, a mathematical formula that objectively compares results, strength of schedule and opponents' strength of schedule, is out of 204 Division I programs.

A year ago, SDSU was rated No. 56 in the initial RPI before skyrocketing to No. 11 two weeks later after the Pac-10 season got into full swing.

San Diego State, however, could move up in the ratings as its plays five games against teams who are ranked higher.

SDSU's Scoreless Streak Stopped

The San Diego State men's soccer team yielded a late goal in a 1-0 loss to No. 8 UCLA on Oct. 9 in Los Angeles. It was the first time the Aztecs were held scoreless since Nov. 6, 2009, breaking the team's 12-game scoring streak. It was the longest scoring streak by the program since a 13-match stretch from Oct. 19, 1990-Sept. 29, 1991. In fact,

Aztecs Know Shorthanded Soccer

San Diego State's Daniel Kohen was issued a red card in the team's 4-3, overtime victory over Washington on Oct. 13. Despite playing a man down the final 19 minutes, 30 seconds, the Aztecs prevailed with a second minute overtime goal. Playing shorthanded soccer and doing it well is nothing new to SDSU.

Since 2006, the program has had nine red cards over eight matches. Over those eight games, San Diego State has played a combined 360:49 a man down and 12:02 two men down. While playing shorthanded in those games (more than four complete regulation matches), the Aztecs have outscored the opposition, 5-4. One of those four goals allowed was a penalty kick directly after a SDSU red card. What's even more impressive is San Diego State's 3-1-4 (.625) record while playing a man down.

Start Me Up

The Aztecs got off to a 6-1-1 start (.813), the program's best eight-game start to a season since 2005 when they were 6-0-2 (.875). The 6-1-1 start was tied for the eighth-longest in school history with five other teams. Four of the seven teams - 2005, 1982, 1981 and 1969 - with better eight-match starts made the NCAA tournament.

Aztecs Among National Leaders...

Despite the recent struggles, three SDSU players are among the national leaders. Sophomore Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS) leads the way as his 0.54 assists per game rank in a tie for 15th in the country. Altamirano has started all 13 matches for the Aztecs and has seven points on seven assists.

Senior captain Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.), meanwhile, is tied for 53rd in points per game (1.23) and tied for 59th in goals per game (0.46). He has six goals and four assists for 16 points. Reza led the squad in points and goals in both 2008 and 2009.

Redshirt senior Brad Byrns (Alamo, Calif.) is 78th in the country in save percentage (0.774) and tied for 95th in saves per game (3.73).

...and the Pac-10 Leaders

Among the Pac-10 best, Reza leads the conference in shots (50) and shots per game (3.85). Reza is also in the top five in goals (6, T-2nd), goals per game (0.46, T-2nd), game-winning goals (2, T-3rd), points (16, 4th), points per game (1.23, 4th) and assists (4, T-5th).

Altamirano is tied for first with seven assists and second in assists per game (0.54), while Byrns is tied for third in saves (47), saves per game (3.62) and shutouts (4), and fifth in save percentage (.746) and shutouts per game (0.31). Junior captain Daniel Steres (Calabasas, Calif.) is tied with Reza and others for third with two game-winning goals.

Unbeatable No More

SDSU recently had its seven-game unbeaten streak snapped with a 2-1 loss to Oregon State on Friday (Oct. 1). Over the seven matches, San Diego State outscored the opposition, 15-4.

The seven games without a loss was tied for the eighth-longest unbeaten in the history of the program. Four of the teams - 2005, 1989, 1988 and 1969 - with the same or longer unbeaten streaks in a season ended up making the NCAA tournament.

The Young...

Coming into the season the big question was, "Who is going to replace the departed seven seniors?" Of those seven seniors (six who finished the season), three were drafted by Major League

Soccer and five were named to the 2009 all-Pac-10 team (one first team selection, four honorable mention picks).

Thirteen games into the season, 10 (of 16) newcomers have seen action with six earning a combined 48 starts. True freshmen Casey Meuser (Granite Bay, Calif.) and Tyrone Martin (Indianapolis, Ind.) have started all 13 games, while redshirt freshman Robbie Freise (Canyon County, Calif.) has 12 (consecutive) starts to his credit. True freshman Sean Zaher (Las Vegas, Nev.) has six starts, while redshirt freshman Jordan Ongaro (Edmonton, Alberta) has two straight starts. True freshmen Miles Byass (Highland, Calif.) and Brett Helm (Frisco, Texas) also have started once for SDSU. Zaher and graduate student Falke Verwer (Delft, Netherlands) each have a goal apiece, and Ongaro has two assists to tie for third on the team. True freshmen Kody Duff (Roseville, Calif.) and Meuser have one assist apiece.

In the opener at Loyola Marymount on Sept. 1, four freshmen (all true) started. The four freshmen was the most in a season-opener in head coach Lev Kirshner's 11-year tenure and five later started in the 4-3 overtime win against No. 23 Washington on Oct. 3. An amazing six started the second half at San Diego (Sept. 5) and at home versus Air Force (Sept. 10) (both wins).

...and the "Rustless"

Maybe a bit overlooked because of the 16 newcomers are the four Aztec seniors Brad Byrns (Alamo, Calif.), Khadim Diouf (Dakar, Senegal), Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.) and Michael Rocha (Pasadena, Calif.). The four, however, have been rocks in the program since their arrival on The Mesa and this year is no different.

A 2007 honorable mention all-Pac-10 pick, Byrns returned from an injury-plagued 2008 season to start 16 of SDSU's 18 games a year ago, leading the league in saves per game (4.50). Over his career, San Diego State is 21-12-7 (.613) when he earns the start. This year, Byrns is 7-5-1 with a 1.21 goals against average, a mark which ranks 78th in the nation.

An all-Pac-10 selection all three years (second team in 2009, honorable mention in 2007-08), Diouf tied for third on the team in 2009 with nine points on three goals and three assists. Over his career, the tri-captain has five career game-winning goals (14 total). This year, Diouf has seven points on three goals and an assist.

A two-time all-conference honoree (second team in 2009, honorable mention in 2008), Reza is a two-time team MVP after leading the squad in scoring each of the past two seasons. Reza had 16 points (six goals, four assists) last year after recording the top SDSU offensive season in a decade in 2008 (20 points - eight goals, four assists). The tri-captain already has 16 points (six goals, four assists) in 13 games in 2010. The 1.23 points per game ranks in a tie for 53rd in the country, while his 0.46 goals per game is tied for 59th.

Rocha, meanwhile, has come back strong after missing all of 2009 with a wrist injury. Rocha scored his first career goal on Sept. 12 in the team's 4-1 win over Oakland and added another on Sept. 24 vs. Houston Baptist. Rocha has seven career points on two goals and three helpers.

Reza Moves to No. 23 in Top Drawer Soccer's Upperclassmen Top 100

Senior Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.) is ranked No. 23 in the latest *Top Drawer Soccer* Upperclassmen Top 100 list, released Oct. 8. Reza improved 44 places from the initial release (Sept. 15). According to the website, the list, which will be updated weekly, "is meant to reflect overall quality of players. This means it is far more than a ranking of statistics. As soccer in many ways is not a statistical game, it is important to understand the qualities that players can bring to defense, attack, central midfield and wing play, along with goalkeeping. So many of the things that make players desirable to have on teams are not reflected in statistics."

Reza leads the team in points (16), goals (6), assists (4), shots (50), shots on goal (20), penalty kick goals (3) and game-winning goals (2, tied).

Reza also improved from No. 6 to No. 3 in the *Top Drawer Soccer* College Players to Watch Men's Top 20 list for the Pac-10. Sophomore Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS) and senior Khadim Diouf (Dakar, Senegal), meanwhile, are 16th and 17th, respectively, on the Pac-10 list.

SDSU's Martin, Meuser Make College Freshmen Top 100

San Diego State's Tyrone Martin (Indianapolis, Calif.) and Casey Meuser (Granite Bay, Calif.) are ranked the same in the *Top Drawer Soccer* College Freshmen National Top 100 list, the website announced Oct. 8. Like the initial list (Sept. 22), Martin is rated No. 34, while Meuser is at No. 85 in the rankings.

The duo has played an important part in leading the Aztecs to a 7-5-1 record out of the gate, their best start to a season in five years. Both Martin and Meuser have started all 13 games, mostly playing in a backline that has surrendered just 16 goals in 2010.

Martin has played all 1,193 minutes for SDSU in the back, joining redshirt senior goalkeeper Brad Byrns (Alamo, Calif.) as the only players not to come off the field this season. Martin was named to the Courtyard Marriott San Diego Central all-tournament team last month.

Meuser, meanwhile, has logged an impressive 1,104 minutes this season, a mark that only trails Byrns and Martin. Meuser, who has mainly seen action in the back, but also some time in the midfield, has seven shots on the year, including one on net, and an assist.

Byass Named One of 100 Freshmen to Keep an Eye On

San Diego State men's soccer forward Miles Byass (Highland, Calif./Redlands HS) recently has been picked by *College Soccer News* as one of the 100 Freshmen From Coast To Coast To Keep An Eye On during the 2010 season. Current Aztecs who have previously been named to the preseason list include redshirt junior Gemechu Abraham (Beaverton, Ore./Beaverton HS) and sophomore Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS).

Byass (6-0, 155) brings instant credibility to this year's class after playing for the United States Under-18 National Team for each of the past two years. A Parade All-American in 2009, Byass was ranked as the 16th-best recruit in the nation, according to *Top Drawer Soccer.com*. Byass scored 17 goals in 25 games for the U-18 Arsenal

This season, Byass has appeared in eight games (four are Aztec wins), with one start to his credit. Byass has 17 shots (five on net) in 368 minutes and has taken four corner kicks, the second most on the team.

SDSU's Justin Davies Featured on ESPN.com

San Diego State redshirt junior Justin Davies (San Diego/Brooks School (Mass.)) has been featured as the lead story on the "College Sports" section of the popular website ESPN.com. The article, written by Sheldon Shealer and entitled 'O Brother,' talks about Davies' new offensive role in the Aztec lineup.

After playing mainly in the back his first two seasons, Davies scored his first two career goals and assisted on another to help SDSU go 2-0 at the Courtyard Marriott San Diego Central Tournament earlier this month. Davies had a career-high six shots and the game-winning goal in a 1-0 San Diego State win over Air Force on Sept. 10. Two days later, Davies equaled his high with six attempts, including a collegiate best five on net with the other shot hitting the post. He scored once and assisted on another as the Aztecs defeated Oakland, 4-1. For his efforts, he was named to the all-tournament team.

SDSU Men's Soccer's 2010 Recruiting Class Ranked No. 29 Nationally

San Diego State's 2010 men's soccer recruiting class has received a No. 29 national ranking from *College Soccer News*. It is the fourth year in a row that the Aztecs have had a top-30 recruiting class, and the fifth time in the last six seasons that they've been ranked in the top 40.

The 2010 recruiting class, consisting of 12 players, is the largest of head coach Lev Kirshner's 10-year tenure. Ten high school prospects and two college transfers will be asked to replace seven seniors, three of whom were Major League Soccer draft picks.

The individual accolades of Kirshner's class include an under-18 U.S. National Team starter, two U-17 and U-20 Canadian National Team members, a high school All-American, an adidas ESP participant, multiple starters on regional ODP teams and two top-100 nationally-ranked players.

The Aztecs are one of four Pac-10 squads to receive top-40 rankings. Perennial powerhouse UCLA picked up the top rated class, with California (No. 15) and Stanford (No. 31) also included. The Aztecs' No. 29 class ranked ahead of Big Ten schools Michigan State (No. 30) and Wisconsin (No. 35), as well as a pair of Big West squads in UC Irvine (No. 32) and Cal Poly (No. 38).

Aztec Men's Soccer Tie for Fourth in 2010 Pac-10 Preseason Poll

The San Diego State men's soccer team has been picked in a tie for fourth place in the 2010 Pac-10 preseason poll, the league announced Aug. 18.

SDSU picked up 10 points, tied with Oregon State, six behind third-place California. UCLA has been chosen to win the regular season title with 25 points, including five first-place votes, while Stanford grabbed the other first-place tally and is picked second with 20 points. Washington's nine points rounded out the preseason poll.

The fourth-place prediction is tied for the Aztecs' best ever (2006). San Diego State, however, has finished the season better than each of its predicted finishes. In its inaugural Pac-10 campaign in 2005, SDSU was picked sixth, yet managed a fourth-place finish. The Aztecs finished second in each of their next two seasons despite being picked fourth and fifth, respectively, in the preseason poll. In 2008, San Diego State was picked fifth but finished third in league play, while last year's squad (T-4th) bettered its prediction of fifth.

SDSU's 19-match (regular season) schedule, which includes 10 games away from SDSU Sports Deck, the program's most since 2004, kicks off Sept. 1 at Loyola Marymount at 4 p.m. PT. Six of the Aztecs' 19 games are against teams who made the 2009 NCAA Tournament, while three are versus squads who earned national seeds in last year's tourney (No. 6 UCLA, which San Diego State will play twice, and No. 11 San Diego).

Senior Khadim Diouf (Dakar, Senegal), senior Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.) and junior Daniel Steres (Calabasas, Calif.) will be looked upon to provide leadership and guidance to the 2010 Aztecs.

The three captains have played a pivotal part in SDSU's transformation into a Pac-10 and national power. As of Oct. 20, 2010, the three have combined for 176 appearances, including 156 starts. The trio has recorded 104 points (41 goals, 22 assists). Each player earned all-Pac-10 Conference honors a year ago (Diouf and Reza - second team, Steres - honorable mention) and have combined for a total of six all-league selections over their career.
