#### **PRESEASON NOTES**

- San Diego State embarks on its 101st season in 2021-22. In 100 seasons, the Aztecs are 1,538-1,132-1 overall and, in its 51 seasons at the Division I level, has posted a 850-687 mark.
- San Diego State preps for the 2021-22 campaign after finishing last season 23-5, ranked No. 16, Mountain West regular-season champions with an 14-3 mark in league play, and the championship in the 2021 Mountain West Tournament. The Aztecs have captured a league-high 14 conference titles, have finished champion or runner-up in 13-of-22 Mountain West Tournaments. Since 2006, SDSU's 12 appearances in its conference championship game are tied for the second most in the nation (also: Belmont and New Mexco State).
- Entering the 2021-22 season, SDSU will look to return to the NCAA tournament for the third time in the last four years in which a champion was crowned (the 2020 NCAA Tournament was canceled due to COVID-19). The Aztecs' appearance in 2021 was their 13th postseason berth (9 NCAA, 4 NIT) in the last 15 years in which a national champion was crowned.
- Head coach Brian Dutcher is set for his fifth season after auiding San Diego State to a 23-5 record in 2020-21, and now has a career mark of 96-31. He is the only head coach in program history to record 20+ wins in each of his first four season. In addition, among first time head coaches whose first season guiding his program was 2017-18, his 96 victories are the most and are seven more that the next highest total.
- In 2018, Dutcher was the only first-year head coach to lead his team to the NCAA Tournament and in the previous 96 seasons of SDSU basketball, no other coach had won more games and/or won a conference title in his initial season.
- Dutcher is the only coach in program history (since 1921-22) to lead his team to 96 or more victories in his first four seasons. Tim Vezie (1974-75 through 1977-78) ranks second with 62 wins. In addition, Dutcher and Vezie are the only coaches to lead their teams to the NCAA Tournament in their first season coaching at San Diego State.
- Dutcher's .756 winning percentage (96-31) is the highest in program history and with four more victories he will become just the fifth coach in program history to reach 100 career wins. In addition, his .636 winning percentage (7-4) against top-25 competition is the best for any Aztec coach and he is the only Aztec coach to post a winning record against the top-25.
- Dutcher welcomes back two returning starters in senior forwar and 2021 honorable mention All-Mountain West selection and member of the All-Defensive Team Nathan Mensah, and senior quard Trey Pulliam, who was also an honorable mention All-Mountain West selection last season. Mensah and Pulliam played in all 28 games a year ago, with Mensah starting 27 times and Pulliam getting 28 starting nods.
- In 2021-22, SDSU will replace its leader from last year's team in scoring average (Matt Mitchell 15.4), 3-point field goals (Jordan Schakel - 83), and minutes (Jordan Schakel - 814).
- SDSU loses three starters (Terrell Gomez, Matt Mitchell & Jordan Schakel) from its 2020-21 squad that won the 2020-21 regular season and 2021 MW Tournament championships. The trio provided SDSU with 49.8 percent of its points last season (1,028-of-2,062), 68.6 percent of its 3-point field goals (165-of-240), 39.0 percent of its steals (90-of-229) and 36.0 percent of its assists (141-of-392). In addition, Mitchell, an honorable mention AP All-American. Mountain West Player of the Year, first-team All-MW, first-team NABC All-District 17, first-team USBWA All-District IX. Basketball Times West Coast All-District Team. MW Tournament MVP, and along with Schakel was selected to the 2021 Mountain West All-Tournament Team
- SDSU has four Division I transfers on the 2021-22 roster, three of whom are immediately available to compete. Matt Bradley (California) and Tahirou Diabate (Portland), a grad transfer, have one year of eligibility and Chad Baker-Mazara (Duquesne) has up to four years of eligibility. Jaedon LeDee (TCU) will have to redshirt the 2021-22 season, and will be eligible to compete for the Aztecs in 2022-23.
- When the season tips off, the Aztecs will have six players on the roster who have never played a game in an SDSU uniform. Grad transfer Tahirou Diabate (Portland), guards Chad Baker-Mazara (Duquesne) and Matt Bradley (California) also transfers who have three and one year of eligibility, respectively. Derek Morhar (Calabasas (Calif.) High) is a redshirt freshman and Demarshay Johnson Jr. (Salesian College Prep. Richmond, Calif.) and Max Wilson (Reston, Va., Oakton High) are true freshman. Jaedon LaDee (TCU) will sit out the year due to NCAA transfer rules and will have one year of eligibility starting in 2022-23.
- In addition to Nathan Mensah (forward) and Trey Pulliam (guard), SDSU welcomes back seniors Aquek Arop (forward), Adam Seiko (quard), and Joshua Tomaić (forward), juniors Keshad Johnson (forward) and Jared Barnett (quard) and sophomores Lamont Butler

(guard), Keith Dinwiddie Jr. (guard), Che Evans (forward), Cade Alger (forward), Triston Broughton (guard), Tyler Broughton (guard) and redshirt freshman Derek Morhar (guard). In 2020-21, Arop averaged 4.2 points and 2.3 rebounds, Seiko (4.2 ppg., 2.0 rpg.), Tomaić (4.6 ppg., 3.3 rpg.), Johnson (4.0 ppg., 3.6 rpg.), Butler (4.3 ppg., 1.7 rpg.), Dinwiddie Jr. (5.1 ppg. 45.5 3-PT%), and Evan (1.1 ppg., 0.5 rpg.) are all forecast to play larger rolls and make larger contributions in 2021-22.

#### **TEAM NOTES**

- The Aztecs finished last year with a 23-5 record and a 14-3 mark in the Mountain West. SDSU posted its 16th straight season with at least 19 victories, which is tied for the third most consecutive seasons with at least 19 wins in the nation.
- Once again, San Diego State was the most consistent Mountain West team on both ends of the court according to KenPom. Offensively, among the nine metrics which are tracked, SDSU ranked No. 1 in 3-point percentage and No. 2 in offensive efficiency, effective field goal percentage & turnover percentage, turnover percentage, offensive rebounding percentage & 2-point field goal percentage. No other program in the MW could equal or surpass SDSU's 10 No. 1 or No. 2 rankings. Colorado State & Utah State tied for second with six top-two rankings.
- San Diego State has done a good job in close games last two seasons, going 8-4 in games decided by five points or less. In addition, SDSU was 12-3 in games where the margin of victory was 10 points or less.
- Last year when the Aztecs won, it was by a wide margin. In the team's 23 victories in 2020-21, 15 were decided by 10 or more points...11 by 15 or more, 7 by 20 or more and 6 by 25 or more points.
- In the last two seasons, the Aztecs have posted 37 double-digit margin of victory wins among its 53 total victories... 37 came by 10 or more points, 27 by 15 or more, 16 by 20 or more and 12 by 25 or more points.
- Seven Azters (Aguek Arop, Terrell Gomez, Matt Mitchell, Nathan Mensah, Trey Pulliam, Jordan Schakel & Adam Seiko) made 137 of a possible 140 starts last season. Entering the 2021-22 season, San Diego State will have to replace 68 starting assignments (28 from Schakel, 24 from Mitchell & 16 from Gomez).
- The Aztecs were once again the top defensive team in the Mountain West in 2020-21, ranking first in scoring defense (61.2 ppg), scoring margin (+12.5 ppg), turnover margin (+3.96), and steals (8.18). In addition, SDSU ranked second in the league in field-goal percentage defense (.392), 3-point field goal percentage defense (.313), rebounding defense (32.0 rpg) and rebounding margin (+3.9). In conference games only, San Diego State ranked first in steals (8.06) & turnover margin (+3.24/g), and was second in scoring defense (60.9 ppg), scoring margin (+13.9 ppg), field-goal percentage defense (.390), rebounding defense (30.9), and rebounding margin (+6.0).
- SDSU has posted at least 20 wins 15 times in the last 16 years, 18 times in its Division I history (50 years) and 25 times overall. Head Coach Brian Dutcher has on the San Diego State bench for 16 of those 25 seasons.
- San Diego State has appeared in the NCAA Tournament 10 times and played 16 games (6-10) in the last 20 seasons, in which a national champion was crowned. All 16 of those games have occurred with Brian Dutcher on the sideline and are the most in MW history.
- SDSU has claimed a Mountain West-leading 14 conference titles, including six MW Tournament crowns (2002, 2006, 2010, 2011, 2018 & 2021). The Aztecs, who won the 2020-21 Mountain West regular-season title, played in their seventh Mountain West championship game in the last nine seasons, won the Mountain West Tournament and earned the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament in 2021.
- San Diego State has been one of the elite programs in the nation since the start of the 2010-11 season, posting a cumulative record of 284-91. SDSU's 284 wins & .757 winning percentage is the ninth-best nationally over the last
- SDSU enters the 2021-22 season having won at least 20 games and advancing to the postseason in 13 (9 NCAA, 4 NIT) of the last 16 years, in which a national champion was crowned. In the last 16 seasons (since the start of the 2005-06 campaign), the Aztecs have won 401 games (tenth most in Division I & one of three teams on the list not in a Power-5 conference: also Gonzaga & Memphis), an average of 25.1 victories per season.
- The Aztecs have won the Mountain West regular-season crown (outright or shared) seven times (2010-11, 2011-12, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16, 2019-20 & 2020-21) in the last 10 years.

#### **PLAYER PERSONNEL**

- In senior forward Nathan Mensah adn senior guard Trey Pulliam, San Diego State returns two starters from its 2020-21 squad. The duo figures to be included in the team's first five from the outset of the 2021-22 season. Pulliam started all 28 games last year, while Mensah finished with 27 starts and has made the starting lineup in 60-of-75 career games. Both appeared in all 28 games last year. Mensah started in each of the first 23 games before making way for a teammate who earned a starting assignment in his final senior season home game.
- Nathan Mensah, a 2020-21 honorable mention All-Mountain West selection by the media & coaches and MW All-Defensive Team member, had a strong bounce back junior season which saw him average a career best 8.1 points (.579 FG). He grabbed 6.1 rebounds, and while equaling his single-season best with 39 blocks, became the tenth player in program history to block 100 shots. A stater in 27 of his 28 appearances, he finished in the top-three team rankings in 11 statistical categories, including leading th team in FG%, offensive, defensive, and overall rebounds & blocks. Half of his 20 career double figure scoring games came in 2020-21. Played in just 13 games as a sophomore

due to injury, but at the time when his season ended after 13 games, he led the squad in field goal percentage (.617), offensive (27), defensive (62) and total rebounds (89), as well as blocks (22). In 2018-19, he was just the second SDSU freshman to have a 10-point, 10-rebound, three-block and two-assist game in the previous 23 years (the other to accomplish the feat was Kawhi Leonard in 2009-10).

- Trey Pulliam returns by utilizing the NCAA's additional year of eligibility. After coming off the bench in each of the team's 32 games in 2019-20, the Bryan, Texas native was the squads starting point guard in all 28 games in 2020-21, and led the MW in assist-to-turnover ratio, was fifth in steal, and sixth in assists. For his efforts, he was recognized as an honorable mention All-MW performer. Pulliam more than doubled his points per game (3.3-to-7.3) and nearly doubled his output from year one to year two as an Aztec in steals (19-to-39), field goals (43-to-85), and 3-point field goals (7-to-13). Prior to coming to SDSU, in two seasons at Navarro College in Corsicana, Texas, he averaged 11.6 point, 4.9 assists and 3.6 rebounds in 58 games, of which 52 were starts. The 6-3 guard finished his Navarro College career ranked second in assists (283), fifth in steals (101) and 11th in scoring (671). His squad finished the year ranked 24th in the nation, after he led them to the 2018-19 NJCAA Division I Region XIV championship game. He had 37 double-digit scoring games with a single-game high 30 points, and dished out a career-high 10 assists on three occasions.
- With the graduation of Matt Mitchell and Jordan Schakel, and departure to Terrell Gomez, who averaged a combined 38.4 points, 11.5 rebounds and 5.3 assists last year, head coach Brian Dutcher will replace major parts of his roster in 2021-22. Look for transfers Matt Bradley from California, Duquesne's Chad Baker-Mazara and Tahirou Diabate, a graduate transfer from Portland, to help replace some of the productivity which was lost. The three combined to average 37.1 points, 12.6 rebounds, and 3.2 assists in their last season of Division I competition (Diabate opted out of last season).
- Matt Bradley joins the Aztecs in 2021-22 with one year of eligibility, after transferring from California. The high-scoring guard from San Bernardino, Calif., averaged 18.0 points, 4.3 rebounds and 1.7 assists in 2020-21, his last season with the Bears. In 22 games last season, he reached double figures 21 times, including a career-high 29 points against Colorado, and was one of just five players in Division I to average at least 18.0 points per game, while shooting at least .455 from the field, .364 from the bonus distance, a minimum of .821 from the line, while also grabbing 4.6 rebounds per game. For his career, he has averaged 15.2 points, 4.4 rebounds and 1.8 assists in 66 starts among 85 total appearances. A two-time All-Pac-12 honoree, his 18.0 ppg, .455 FG%, .364 3PFG% & .821 FT% last year would have all ranked the top-5 in the Mountain West.
- Chad Baker-Mazara is a 6-7 sophomore guard who transfered from Duquesne with up to four years of eligibility remaining. He averaged 9.5 points on 43.8 percent shooting from the floor, including 41.7 percent from 3-point range. His 41.7 percent from the bonus distance last year was the second highest for a freshman in Duquesne history, led the team, and would have ranked No. 4 in SDSU's Division 1 Freshman record book. In a total of 366 minutes, he added 17 assists, 15 steals and 13 blocked shots. His 13 blocks were the second highest on the team. Baker-Mazara reached double figure scoring four times, twice cracking the 20-point plateau, including a season-high 23 points at Fordham (1/27). In that Fordham game, he hit seven three pointers, becoming just the third freshman in Duquesne history to make at least seven treys in a game. His averages per 40 minutes played are 15.6 points, 4.7 rebounds, 1.9 assists. 1.6 steals and 1.4 blocks. Baker-Mazara is the first Aztec men's basketball player who is a native of the Dominican Republic in the Steve Fisher/Brian Dutcher era (1999-00 to present).
- Tahirou Diabate is a 6-9 forward who competed for the University of Portland for three seasons (2018-20) and owns the fifth-best career field goal shooting percentage in that program's history (55.3 percent). During his three season's competing for Portland, he was one of just eight players in the nation to average at least 16.0 points, 9.1 rebounds, 1.7 blocks and 1.3 steals per 40 minutes played, while shooting at least 55.3 percent from the floor. He made 70 starts in 91 total appearances for the Pilots and averaged 7.2 points and 4.1 rebounds in his three-year playing career. In an average of 18 minutes per game, he hit 272-of-492 from the floor and totaled 73 blocks and 55 steals. His 73 career blocked shots rank ninth on that program's career list. The native of Bamako, Mali opted out of the 2020-21 season, and is the first player of Malian decent to compete for San Diego State.
- Adam Seiko, one of the team's best on-ball defenders, appeared in 27 of the team's 28 games last season, including seven starts. The 6-3, guard competed for the Ugandan National Team in FIBA AfroBasket 2021 in late August. Seiko continued to show he is a reliable shooter from the perimeter making 38.9 percent of his shots from the floor (34-of-98), as well as 61-of-169 from three-point range (36.1 percent) for his career. In the last two seasons, he has made multiple treys in 14-of-22 games in which he scored from beyond the arc. The Boston. Mass., native has committed just 48 turnovers in 1,290 minutes of action, which works out to 1.4 turnovers per 40 minutes played. For his career 61-of-79 buckets (77.2 percent) have been three-pointers.
- Aguek Arop returns for his senior season after making seven starts in 2020-21, but was limited to 20 games. The native of Omaha, Neb., and pound-for-pound the strongest player on the roster, averaged a career-high 4.2 points, while grabbing 2.3 rebounds in 13.9 minutes of action per contest. Projecting his stats from last season per 40 minutes played, he averaged 11.9 points, 6.6 rebounds, 1.9 assists and 2.0 steals. For his career (73 games), he has collected more offensive rebounds (90) than defensive boards (89). Arop grabbed a career-high seven rebounds against UC Irvine (22/27/20) and recorded a career-high 14 points at Air Force (1/22/21).
- Joshua Tomaić returns to the Aztecs by utilizing the NCAA's additional year of eligibility. The Lanzarote, Canary Islands, Spain native obliterated his statistical highs from the three seasons he competed at Maryland, and from where he graduated with a degree in information science last summer. In 28 games at SDSU, he has 128 pts. versus 83 total points in 62 appearances in his three seasons at Maryland and, through the first 24 games had more than doubled his highest single-season point total (57 pts as a freshman in 26 games). Upon signing with Maryland in 2016, he was reportedly the first Canarian to compete for an NCAA collegiate basketball program. Tomaić is a 6-9 forward who can score with his back to the basket, step out and hit from the three-point line, and run the floor.

- Keshad Johnson, a 6-7 junior forward, was the lone scholarship sophomore on the roster a year ago and appeared in 24 of the team's 28 contests, all off the bench. A prototypical Aztec wing, Johnson has strength, is long, gets off the floor quickly, and plays above the basket. He can finish at the rim and continues to improve his perimeter game. He returns in 2021-22 as the team's third leading rebounder and last season nearly tripled his total rebounds from his freshman season (30-to-86). From his freshman to sophomore campaigns his numbers improved in points (1.9-to-4.0/game), blocks (1-to-13), assists (4-to-16), field goal percentage (.353-to-452), and 3-point percentage (.222-to-.333). He is expected to be a major contributor in 2021-22. Johnson was rated by ESPN as a four-star prospect and one of the top-25 high school players in California when he arrived at SDSU.
- Lamont Butler is a 6-2 sophomore point guard, who appeared in all 28 games last season, the only freshman to do so, and started twice (at Air Force on Jan. 22 & 24). He is the first Aztec true freshman to start back-to-back games since Nathan Mensah on March 15 & 16, 2019 and is just the third freshman in the last four seasons to start a game for SDSU (also: Matt Mitchell & Nathan Mensah). Butler is the only player to compile at least 13 points & five steals off the bench (at Utah State on 1/16) for SDSU, regardless of class, in the last 25 years. Combine his 13 pts & 5 steals at Utah State and he is just the third San Diego State true freshman to have at least that many points and steals in a game since the start of the 1996-97 season (Kyle Spain & Richie Williams in 2005-06). He averaged 4.3 points (39.6 % shooting), 1.7 rebounds, 1.5 assists & 0.9 steals in 12.4 minutes per game. A four-star rated recruit by ESPN and three-star talent by Rivals.com and 247Sports.com, he was named one of the class of 2020's top-50 point guards nationally by ESPN (No. 30).
- Keith Dinwiddie Jr. is a 6-0 sophomore shooting guard, who was limited to seven appearances due to injury. He can provide instant offense off the bench, especially from distance. Ten-of-13 field goals (76.9 percent) came from beyond the arc. Dinwiddie Jr. hit 13-of-29 shots (44.8 percent) from the floor, including 10-of-22 (44.8 percent) from the bonus distance. He made multiple 3-pointers in three of the four games in which he made at least one trey, and sank a single-game high four threes vs. St. Katherine. A three-star rated recruit by Rivals.com and 247Sports, he was named one of the class of 2020's top-50 shooting guards nationally by Rivals.com (No. 47).
- Che Evans is a 6-6 sophomore wing, who was a four-start recruit by ESPN and Scout.com and three-star talent by Rivals.com and 247Sports. Appearing in 10 games last season, he averaged 1.1 point, 0.5 rebounds per appearance and added three steals and two assists. Evans was named one of the class of 2020's top-50 small forwards nationally by ESPN (No. 45), Rivals.com (No. 49) and 247Sports.com (No. 38).
- Jared Barnett is a 6-1 junior guard, out of Los Angeles' Westchester High, who walked on to the team in 2019-20 and has appeared in 18 contests in two seasons. At Westchester, he earned second-team All-Western League honors as a senior after averaging 13.0 points, 6.0 assists and 3.0 rebounds per game. As a senior, he helped guide the Comets to a 24-5 record and a birth in the Los Angeles City Section finals.
- Cade Alger is a 6-9 sophomore forward who averaged 1.6 points, 0.3 rebounds while shooting 83.3 percent (5-of-6 FG) from the floor. Prior to the 2020-21 season, he transfered to San Diego State from Seattle U.
- Triston Broughton is a 6-4 sophomore guard, who was a member of the 2019-20 practice squad which helped the team to a 30-2 record and a final national ranking of No. 6/6 and whose twin brother Tyler is also a member of the Aztecs program. In his first season he appeared in four games, all off the bench. He is the son of former NBA player Chris Mills.
- Tyler Broughton is a 6-4 sophomore guard, who was a member of the 2019-20 practice squad which helped the team to a 30-2 record and a final national ranking of No. 6/6 and whose twin brother Triston is also a member of the Aztecs program. In his first season he appeared in four games, all off the bench. He is the son of former NBA player Chris Mills.
- Derek Morhar is a 6-5 redshirt freshman guard, out of Calabasas (Calif.) High School. As a senior, was a first-team All-Marmonte League performer and Ventura County Basketball Coaches Association all-county selection. He led the team in scoring and earned its Most Valuable Player honor last season, averaging 17.6 points and 5.5 rebounds. Morhar won the Marmonte League championship as a junior and was twice named the team's Most Improved Player (as a sophomore and a junior). He earned academic distinction following his sophomore, junior and senior seasons as well as first-team academic all-county as a senior. In the best offensive game of his career, poured in 37 points versus Westlake High School.
- Demarshay Johnson Jr. is a 6-10 forward out of Salesian College Prep in Richmond, Calif. In four seasons, he helped his team to a 101-12 record, including a 37-0 mark in Tri-County Athletic League (TCAL) play. The program won three TCAL championships and back-to-back (2017-18 & 2018-19) CIF North Coast Section Division III titles. In each of his first three years, Salesian finished the season nationally ranked No. 16 (2017-18), No. 14 (2018-19) and No. 31 (2019-20) according to maxpreps.com. As a junior, Salesian posted a 25-7 record, were TCAL champions with a 10-0 mark, and reached the semifinals of the CIF North Coast Section Open Division playoffs. As a sophomore earned honorable mention All-TCAL distinction as Salesian went 31-1, including 10-0 in league play. A three-star recruit according to Rivals and 247Sports, who also had him rated as the No. 27 center in the nation.
- Jaedon LeDee is a 6-9 forward who will sit out the season due to NCAA transfer rules. The native of Houston, Texas, originally competed for Ohio State in the 2018-19 season, his freshman year. He then transferred to TCU and played for the Horned Frogs in each of the past two seasons. In 79 collegiate games, LeDee has averaged 5.2 points and 3.1 rebounds in 11.0 minutes per game. He has gone 90-of-182 (49.5 percent) from the floor and 112-of-156 (71.8 percent) from the line in his college career. In addition, he has 15 assists, 21 blocks and 23 steals in 869 total minutes. Per 40 minutes played, LeDee averages 13.4 points and 10.2 rebounds. After competing immediately after he transfered from Ohio State to TCU, LeDee will sit out the 2021-22 season due to NCAA transfer rules.

### **BRIAN DUTCHER**

Head Coach
Fifth Season • 23rd Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher enters his fifth season as San Diego State head men's basketball coach after four years in which he led the Aztecs to four Mountain West Tournament title games, its conference-record 11th, 12th, 13th & 14th Mountain West crowns and to the NCAA tournament twice. He is the only coach in the 100-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first four seasons. His 96 victories in four seasons (96-31), are the most for any Division I head coach whose first season leading a program was 2017-18 season.

In 2020-21, he guided the Aztecs to the Mountain West regular-season and tournament crowns and earned a No. 6-seed in the NCAA Tournament. For the second time in as many seasons, he was named Mountain West and National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year.

The Aztecs went 23-5 and finished the regular season ranked No. 7 in field goal percentage defense (.387), No. 8 in scoring defense (60.6), No. 12 in scoring margin (+13.5), No. 14 in total steals (233), and No. 16 in turnover margin (+3.9) nationally. Among the Mountain West teams, San Diego State led the league in turnovers forced (15.15), steals per game (8.19), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.25:1), three-point field goal percentage (.381), field goal percentage defense, scoring defense, scoring margin, turnover margin and total steals. The team posted a 14-game win streak, which is the fourth longest in school history and it is the third of at least nine games under Dutcher.

The 2019-20 squad ripped off a program-record 26-straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both national polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2, including 17-1 in Mountain West play and Dutcher earned USA Today National Coach of the Year, Mountain West Coach of the Year (in both the coaches and media polls), NABC Division I District 17 Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year honors. In addition, he was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the third most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game winning streak, which set a new Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus second-team All-American Malachi Flynn, the team won the Continental Tires
Las Vegas Invitational with a blow out victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the
championship game. A month later, three days after Utah defeated then No. 6 Kentucky, the Aztecs handed the Utes
a 28-point drubbing in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic.

In addition to Flynn, forwards Matt Mitchell and Yanni Wetzell and guard KJ Feagin, were recognized by the MW in its postseason awards as well as numerous national outlets.

With the expected return for the postseason of forward Nathan Mensah, who had been sidelined for the final 19 games of the year, San Diego State was poised for a deep run in the NCAA Tournament. The Aztecs were projected to be either a No. 1 or No. 2 seed and some felt were a Final Four team, but the coronavirus pandemic put an end to the postseason and fans were left to wonder what could have been.

İn 2017-18, his first season as head coach, he was the only Division I coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament after going 22-10 in the regular season, including winning the 2018 Mountain West Tournament championship.

Dutcher, who took the helm of the program following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017, was on The Mesa for all 18 of Fisher's seasons, and is the 15th head coach in the program's history.

Over the course of his 22 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 15 times, including ten trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 14 Mountain West titles and record 16 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, SDSU has twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games eight times and captured 11 MW championships (seven regular season, four tournament).

Dutcher arrived at San Diego State shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the program's first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 campaign that produced the school's first MW regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories. That run to the 2009 NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and two-time NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11, when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and freshman Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title, and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received

first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2012 NCAA tournament as an at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next season, San Diego State was again an at-large selection to the NCAA tournament, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the campaign by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an at-large invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, San Diego State won three games and qualified for the NIT national semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

SDSU completed the 2016-17 slate with a 19-14 record despite experiencing a rash of injuries. The 2016 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic champions entered 2017-18 as one of 12 teams to have won at least 19 games in 12 consecutive seasons, which was a sign of things to come in Dutcher's first year.

Dutcher's first roster as head coach featured a pair of seniors that had won multiple Mountain West titles and owned NCAA tournament experience in Trey Kell and Malik Pope.

Prior to coming to SDSU, Dutcher spent 10 seasons on Steve Fisher's bench at Michigan, the program reached the postseason each year and participated in the NCAA Tournament eight times, including three trips to the Final Four and the championship game including a national championship in 1989.
