SDSU Men's Golf Set for MW Championship

The San Diego State men's golf team will be aiming for its third conference title in the last five years this weekend when it travels to the desert for the Mountain West Championship, May 1-3, in Tucson, Ariz. For the ninth straight season, the 54-hole event will be contested on the par-71, 7,144-yard Catalina Course at the OMNI Tucson National Golf Club.

The 11-team field will play 18 holes on each of the three days, following a practice round on Thursday. The Aztecs, who have been idle since April 12, earned the No. 3 seed are slated to tee off with No. 4 Colorado State and No. 5 San Jose State in the second group on Friday, starting at 7:50 a.m. PT, while the pairings for the final two rounds with be based on team standings. A live scoring link will be available courtesy of Golfstat on GoAztecs.com.

SDSU, which received a No. 32 national ranking in the latest Golfstat ratings, will be returning to the Catalina Course for the second time this season after finishing sixth at the University of Arizona's National Invitational Tournament, Feb. 28-March 2.

Aztec Lineup for the Week

San Diego State head coach Ryan Donovan has adjusted his starting lineup this week to include junior Riccardo Michelini (Carpi, Italy), who will join the usual mix of senior Xander Schauffele (San Diego, Calif.), junior Ryann Ree (Redondo Beach, Calif.), sophomore Nahum Mendoza III (San Diego, Calif.) and freshman PJ Samiere (Kailua, Hawaii). The combination comprised five-sixths of the SDSU delegation in the regular-season finale at the Western Intercollegiate.

Michelini, who appeared in just two tournaments during the spring due in part to an ailing foot, will be making his third straight appearance at the MW Championship along with Schauffele, while Mendoza will be playing for the second year in a row, joining first time participants Ree and Samiere.

Schauffele, who ranks fourth in the conference with a team-best 70.85 scoring average, landed in the 22nd position nationally in this week's Golfstat Cup standings.

The Competition

Three of SDSU's opponents this week find themselves among the top 100 in the latest Golfstat rankings released April 29. New Mexico is the highest rated team, checking in at No. 22, followed by UNLV (31) and Colorado State (95), while San José State (103) remains just outside the group. The Aztecs will also battle Nevada (119), Utah State (141), Fresno State (145), Boise State (167) Wyoming (186) and Air Force (209).

SDSU owns a 14-3 record in head-to-head results against seven conference adversaries during the 2014-15 campaign, posting undefeated marks vs. San José State (4-0), Wyoming (3-0), Colorado State (2-0), Nevada (2-0), Fresno State (1-0) and UNLV (1-0). New Mexico is the lone conference school to maintain the upper hand against the Aztecs this year, posting a 3-1 ledger, including a higher finish (2 vs. 6) at the National Invitational Tournament held in March on the same Catalina Course. In addition, the Scarlet and Black will have their first look at Air Force, Boise State and Utah State.

Individually, eight of the top-10 finishers return from last year's conference tournament, including the Aztecs' own Riccardo Michelini (T-1st), who fell to UNM's Gavin Green in a sudden-death playoff. In addition, Carl Jonson of UNLV (3rd) finds himself in the mix once again, along with SDSU's Xander Schauffele (T-5th), Sean Romero (T-7th) and Sam Saunders (T-10th) of New Mexico, the Aztecs' Nahum Mendoza (T-10th) and Dominic Kieffer of Colorado State (T-10th).

San José State's Cody Blick and Jon Oda of UNLV, who own the league's second and third-best scoring averages this season, respectively, are expected to contend as well, along with SDSU's Ryann Ree and PJ Samiere, Gustavo Morantes and Andrej Bevins of New Mexico, UNLV's Kurt Kitayama and Shintaro and Blake Cannon of Colorado State, all whom find themselves among the top 20 in the Mountain West rankings.

Aztecs At The Mountain West Championship

In the 15-year history of the Mountain West, San Diego State has won two team championships, capturing back-to-back titles in 2011 and 2012. The Aztecs also tied for the top spot in 2009, but lost in a team playoff to TCU after rallying from a five-stroke deficit in regulation.

In addition, SDSU has finished second seven times (2014, 2013, 2010, 2009, 2006, 2003, 2001), placed fourth on three occasions (2005, 2004, 2002), came in fifth twice (2007, 2000) and ended up in the seventh position once (2008).

The Aztecs' best individual finish was recorded in 2001 when John Lepak posted a 3-over 219 to win by one stroke at Sunriver Resort in Oregon. SDSU's Adam Porzak also tied for first place in regulation in 2007, but came up just short in a one-hole playoff loss to Robby Ormand of TCU.

The Aztecs have routinely fared well on the individual leaderboard at the MW tournament, placing one player among the top four in each of the last nine seasons and 14 times overall.

Backspin: 2014 MW Championship

Despite a late lead, San Diego State fell short in its quest for a fourth conference title last season, finishing second at the 2014 Mountain West Championship at the OMNI Tucson National Golf Club. The Aztecs posted their lowest 18-hole total of the weekend with a final-roud 280, but wound up in the runner-up spot for the second straight year after finishing the tournament with a combined 3-under 849, three strokes behind New Mexico (-6).

The Aztecs also experienced disappointment on the individual leaderboard after Riccardo Michelini fell to UNM's Gavin Green on the first hole of a sudden-death playoff for medalist honors.

SDSU, which trailed the Lobos by nine strokes entering the day, catapulted in front by three shots on the back nine, only to see the UNM reclaim the lead with the help of three birdies over the final four holes.

UNLV, which recorded the lowest team score of the weekend with a final-round 276, landed in the third position two strokes behind SDSU with a 1-under 851, while Air Force (+9) and Colorado State (+22) comprised the remainder of the top five.

Individually, Michelini became the first Aztec to finish atop the leaderboard in regulation at the MW Championship since Adam Porzak in 2007, after posting a 1-under 70 during the final round on Sunday. The SDSU sophomore took the lead after carding an eagle on the par-5, 511-yard 10th hole, followed by a birdie at the par-4 No. 11 to get to 3-under for the day. Despite a bogey at No. 14, Michelini still owned a one-shot advantage over Green as both players notched pars on holes 15-17.

However, the Lobo adversary forced a playoff after making another crucial par on the 18th, while Michelini settled for a bogey. The two players returned to the same fairway for sudden death, where Green claimed the title after each posted identical marks as in regulation. Despite the stumble, Michelini logged his highest career finish, completing the tournament with a 4-under 209, which is tied for the fourth-best 54-hole score ever by an SDSU player at a conference championship.

The Aztecs' best round of the day belonged to Xander Schauffele, who tied for the low round of the tournament with a 66. The SDSU junior played exceptional bogey-free golf, draining five birdies, including four on the back nine, to vault 14 places into a tie for fifth at 1-under 212. With his strong performance, Schauffele logged the Aztecs' third-lowest score over 18 holes in MW Championship history en route to his fifth top-five showing of the season.

In addition, Nahum Mendoza III became the third SDSU player to crack the top 10 at the event, tying for that said position at 2-over

213 after firing a final-round 73. The Francis Parker High alumnus, who led the field with 42 pars on the weekend, made 14 on Sunday, along with a birdie on the par-3 No. 4, which played as the fifth-toughest hole of the third round. However, three bogeys, including a pair at Nos. 16 and 18 cast a damper on his round. Nevertheless, Mendoza still completed the event with the lowest total of all freshmen in the tournament.

Meanwhile, James Holley recorded a 73 as well to finish in a tie for 15th at 4-over 217. The Aztec junior posted identical marks as Mendoza with 14 pars, along with a birdie on the expansive par-5, 610-yard No. 15. However, Holley slid five spots on individual leaderboard as a trio of bogeys, including one on No. 18, also proved too much to overcome.

Rounding out the SDSU lineup was freshman Ricky DeSantis, who rebounded with a vengeance after suffering an 84 during the second round. The Carlsbad High product managed to climb seven places into a tie for 38th at 12-over 225 following a final-round 71. DeSantis was 2-under through 14 holes, thanks in part to three birdies on the front nine. However, untimely bogeys at No. 15 and No. 18 thwarted any further advance.

A Look At the Course

For the ninth straight year, the Mountain West Championship will be held on the Catalina Course at the OMNI Tucson National Golf Resort & Spa. Designed by Robert Van Hagge and Bruce Devlin, the Catalina Course is known for its magnificent views, traditional parkland-style layout and tree-lined fairways. Nestled in the foothills of the Santa Catalina Mountains, the course also includes eight sparkling lakes and 80 bunkers, while the 18th hole is considered to be one of the finest and most challenging finishing holes on the PGA Tour. Home to over 30 PGA events, including the prestigious Chrysler Classic of Tucson from 1997-2006, as well as several NCAA tournaments, the Tucson National has been selected as one of Golf Digest magazine's "75 Best Golf Resorts in North America."

Mountain West History 101

- A total of six schools have won at least one Mountain West title with just two, New Mexico and San Diego State, claiming consecutive championships. The Lobos captured four straight crowns from 2003-06 before earning the top prize in 2013 and 2014, while the Aztecs emerged triumphant in 2011 and 2012. Colorado State (2008, 2010), UNLV (2000, 2002) and former member Brigham Young (2001, 2007) each earned a pair of titles as well, while TCU came away with its lone championship as a MW affiliate in 2009 when it edged SDSU in a team playoff.
- Six different schools have had a player win the individual title, including SDSU (2001), UNLV (2000, 2004, 2008, 2011, 2013), New Mexico (2003, 2009, 2014), Colorado State (2002, 2010), BYU (2005) and TCU (2007).
- The inaugural MW Championships took place on the Nicklaus Tournament Course at the PGA West complex in La Quinta, Calif., before moving to the Crosswater Course at Sunriver Resort in Sunriver, Ore., for six straight years from 2001-06. The tournament has since been played in Arizona on the Catalina Course at the OMNI Tucson National Resort.

2014-15 Highlights

- San Diego State is enjoying another successful campaign, placing among the top five as a team in seven out of 11 tournaments played during the regular season.
- After posting three top-five finishes during the fall schedule, the Aztecs opened their spring slate in convincing fashion, sweeping both the team and individuals title at the revived Barona Collegiate Cup in February. SDSU shot a combined season low 31-under 833 to win by 12 shots over USD.
- At Barona, Schauffele claimed medalist honors for the third time in his collegiate career after posting the school's lowest score ever in relation to par with a 17-under 199. With his performance, the SDSU senior garnered the first of three straight MW Men's Golfer of the Week accolades.
- In addition, Schauffele captured the award for logging a pair of runner-up finishes at The Prestige at PGA West as well as the National Invitational Tournament at OMNI Tucson.
- For the season, Schauffele leads the Aztecs with a 70.85 stroke average and six top-five finishes, completing a team-best 15 rounds below par, including 10 in the 60s.
- Competing at The Prestige for the fourth straight season, SDSU posted a strong third-place team finish in an elite field that featured seven top-20 squads.

- Along with Schauffele, PJ Samiere is the only other Aztec to compete in all 33 rounds for the Scarlet and Black this season. SDSU's top freshman during the 2014-15 campaign with a 73.27 scoring average, Samiere boasts a pair of top-10 finishes, including a fifth-place effort as an individual at the season-opening Southwestern Intercollegiate.
- The Aztecs have also received a tremendous boost from junior Ryann Ree, who became eligible in mid-January after transferring from Oregon. A native of Redondo Beach, Ree posted a 72.38 stroke average with five top-20 performances, including an eighth-place tie at Barona. He was also the team's top finisher at the ASU Thunderbird Invitational, where he landed in the 14th position.

Just A Chip Shot Away

The winner of this week's Mountain West Conference championship earns an automatic bid to the NCAA regional tournament, May 14-16. This year's six regional sites include two courses located in the Pacific time zone, The Farms Golf Club in nearby Rancho Santa Fe, Calif., and Gold Mountain Golf Club in Bremerton, Wash. The Aztecs could also be sent to The Rawls Club in Lubbock Texas, The Sagemore Club in Noblesville, Ind., The Club at Yale in New Haven, Conn., or UNC Finley Golf Course in Chapel Hill, N.C.

In all, 81 teams and 45 individuals not on those squads will be divided up among the six regional tournaments. The participants will be selected by the NCAA men's golf committee and are scheduled to be announced on Monday, May 4 on The Golf Channel during its Morning Drive program.

A total of 30 schools and two individuals (not on those qualifying teams) will advance to the NCAA championships, May 29-June 3, at Concessions Golf Club in Bradenton, Fla. The Aztecs have made the national championships 22 times in school history, including six times (1999, 2003, 2005, 2008, 2011, 2012) since the regional format made its debut.

Aztecs Add Otto Vanhatalo for 2015-16 Season

Last fall, SDSU head coach Ryan Donovan announced the signing of Otto Vanhatalo (Espoo, Finland) to a National Letter of Intent. Vanhatalo, who is currently a senior at Torrey Pines High School, will join the Aztecs in August and will be eligible to compete in time for the 2015-16 campaign.

As a prep junior in 2014, Vanhatalo garnered first-team all-section honors by the San Diego Hall of Champions after helping Torrey Pines High capture a record fifth consecutive CIF San Diego Section championship at the Admiral Baker North Course. The talented Finn was part of a Falcon squad that established a CIF record with a team score of 10-under par 710 and was one of four Torrey Pines players to finish the tournament below par, tying for fifth on the individual leaderboard at 3-under 141.

Vanhatalo has also excelled on the European stage, placing second at the Finnish International Junior Under-18 tournament in June of 2013, followed by a third-place tie three months later at the European Boy's Challenge in Skalica, Slovakia. That same year, he also landed in a four-way tie for the sixth position at the Sir Henry Cooper Junior Masters in Kent, England.

In addition, Vanhatalo recorded a pair of top-15 placements in the fall of 2014 at the Finnish Amateur Championship (t-11th) and the Audi Finnish Tour Final (t-14th), where he tied for third among amateur golfers.

Vanhatalo has also made his presence felt in junior competition around southern California, highlighted by a seventh-place tie at the 2013 San Diego Junior Amateur Championships at Steele Canyon Golf Club. In 2014, he tied for eighth at the Future Champions Golf (FCG) Western States Players Cup at Menifee Lakes Country Club before finishing in the ninth spot at the AJGA Junior at River Ridge Golf Club in Oxnard.

Head Coach Ryan Donovan

Ryan Donovan is in his 12th season at the helm of the SDSU men's golf program after serving as an assistant in 2003. Since taking the reins, he has directed the Aztecs to 26 tournament titles and five NCAA national championship appearances. In both 2011 and 2012, he received Mountain West Coach of the Year honors and was named a finalist for the Dave Williams Award, which is handed out annually to the national coach of the year in Division I men's golf. Donovan was also was tabbed the Eaton Golf Pride West Region Division I Men's Coach of the Year by the GCAA following the 2010-11 campaign. A native of Yorba Linda, Calif., Donovan was a four-year member of the Aztec golf squad before graduating in 2001
