### Aztecs Travel To Columbus To Face No. 3/2 Ohio State

- San Diego State hits the road for the first time in the 2013 campaign as the Aztecs travel to Columbus, Ohio, to face No. 3/2 Ohio State on Saturday afternoon.
- The game will air nationally on ABC / ESPN2. The San Diego market can view the game on KGTV (ABC) Channel 10.
- Saturday will mark the fourth all-time meeting between the programs, with Ohio State having won all three previous encounters, all of which have been played in Columbus. The aggregate score in the series is 70-31, with previous games played in 2001, 2003 and 2005. >> **OHIO STATE: THE SERIES, pg. 3-5**
- San Diego State enters Saturday's game having recent success on the road. The Aztecs have won three straight, six of their last eight (6-2) and nine of 13 (9-4) on the road. >> **WINNING ON THE ROAD, pg. 5**
- San Diego State's last four-game road winning streak came during the 1980-81 seasons with victories over UTEP, Colorado State, Oklahoma State and New Mexico. >> **WINNING ON THE ROAD, pg. 5**
- Ohio State dropped to No. 3 in the AP poll, but remains at No. 2 in Coaches' poll this week. It will mark the highest opponent SDSU has faced since battling No. 2/2 Ohio State on Sept. 6, 2003. The Aztecs had large statistical advantages in that game (first downs: SDSU 20, OSU 10; total yards: SDSU 216, OSU 196; 3rd down conversions: SDSU 5-for-15, OSU 1-for-14) and led in the fourth quarter before falling, 16-13. >> **PLAYING THE ELITE, pg. 5**
- San Diego State lost 23 straight games to AP top 25 teams from Sept. 13, 1997 through Nov. 21, 2009. That trend has changed under Rocky Long, as the Aztecs have gone 2-4 in their last six contests against top 25 opposition. >> **PLAYING THE ELITE, pg. 5**
- Included in that run is last season's 21-19 victory at No. 19/14 Boise State. The win marked the highest ranked team the Aztecs have ever defeated on the road. >> **PLAYING THE ELITE, pg. 5**
- Under Rocky Long, San Diego State is 5-2 in the game following a loss in the same season. Since 2010, the Aztecs are 8-3 in the same scenario.

- San Diego State passed for 318 yards in the season opener against Eastern Illinois. That is a new career high for junior quarterback Adam Dingwell (318 yards) and represents the highest total for the Aztecs through the air since throwing for 413 yards against Louisiana-Lafayette in the 2011 R + L New Orleans Bowl. >> **ADAM DINGWELL PLAYER PROFILE, pg. 24-25**
- Senior wide receiver Colin Lockett caught eight passes for 98 yards against the Panthers. Although narrowly missing his third career 100-yard game, he did tie a career-high with eight catches. It was the highest total for an Aztec player since Lockett and Gavin Escobar each caught eight passes against Boise State on Nov. 19, 2011. >> **COLIN LOCKETT PLAYER PROFILE, pg. 33-35**
- Senior kicker Wes Feer connected on all four of his field goal attempts in SDSU's loss on Saturday. He became the first Aztec to kick four field goals in a game since J.C. Mejia in 2003. His four field goals are tied for the most in the country. >> **WES FEER PLAYER PROFILE, pg. 25-26**
- Since Sept. 29, 2012, San Diego State has gone 7-3. In the three losses, the Aztecs have turned the ball over 15 times (5.0 turnovers per game). In the seven wins, the Aztecs have a total of 10 turnovers (1.4 tpg).
- Last Saturday, San Diego State had an average field position of the 33-yard line. That is the best average starting field position in a loss for the Aztecs since Nov. 14, 2009, against Wyoming (average start 35-yard line). **Program Notes**

- San Diego State has advanced to three consecutive bowl games. The Aztecs join Stanford as the only football teams in California - college or pro - to advance to the postseason in each of the past three seasons.
- With bowl game appearances in a school-record three straight seasons, San Diego State has equaled its total number of bowls played in the 40 prior seasons (1970 through 2009).
- Between 2000-09, SDSU was 38-80 and owned the nation's 106th-highest winning percentage. Since 2010, the Aztecs are 26-14, with the nation's 33rd-highest winning percentage.
- Since the beginning of the 2010 campaign, San Diego State has posted a 26-14 record (.650). The only team in the state of California with a better record during that span is Stanford. The 26 wins during the past three seasons is the highest three-year total since the Aztecs went 28-5 in 1975-77.
- San Diego State owns 19 conference championships, but the 2012 Mountain West title was the school's first since claiming the 1998 Western Athletic Conference Pacific Division championship.

**Ohio State: The Series**

- San Diego State and Ohio State are meeting for the fourth time. All three of the previous games have been played in Columbus, Ohio, with the Buckeyes ending up on top.
- The three Ohio State victories have come by margins of 3, 15 and 21 points.
- Counting Saturday, Ohio State has been ranked among the AP top-9 entering three of the four games played between the teams. Twice the Buckeyes have been ranked second (2003, 2013).
- San Diego State has scored first in all three of the previous meetings, including the first play from scrimmage when the teams last met in 2005.
- After never having met prior to the 2001 campaign, this will mark the fourth meeting between the teams in 13 years.
- San Diego State has struggled to rush the ball in its last two meetings with Ohio State. In 2003, the Aztecs carried 19 times for 13 yards and in 2003, SDSU rushed 26 times for 28 yards. That means in the last two games against Ohio State, the Aztecs have 45 rushes for 41 yards and no touchdowns. In the three-game series San Diego State has 82 carries for 158 yards and one touchdown.
- In the Division I era (since 1969), two of the 12 worst field position margin games have come against Ohio State. In 2005, OSU had an average starting field position advantage of 41 to 20. The -21-yard discrepancy is tied for the eighth worst in school history. In 2001, the Buckeyes benefitted from a 40 to 23 average starting field position. The -17-yard disadvantage is tied for the 12th worst in school history. How important is average starting field position? SDSU is 2-43-1 in the Division I era when facing a 10-yard or greater disadvantage in average field position. Likewise, SDSU is 23-0 when owning an 11-yard or greater advantage in the category.
- The teams first met in 2001 and was originally scheduled to be played on Sept. 15. Following the terrorist attacks, the game became one of the first to be postponed the following weekend and was played later that season on Oct. 21, a week that both teams had scheduled byes.

**Versus The Big Ten**

- San Diego State is 2-13 lifetime against the 12 teams that currently comprise the Big Ten Conference.
- Ten of the previous 15 games against the league have been played on enemy soil. That number grows to 11 of 16 on Saturday.
- San Diego State is 0-10 in road games against the league.
- The Aztecs have dropped 11 straight to members of the conference dating back to a 48-17 victory over Minnesota on Sept. 25, 1993.
- Of the last six Big Ten Conference teams San Diego State has played, five have been nationally-ranked, including three in the top 9.
- Saturday marks the seventh consecutive time that SDSU has met a Big Ten opponent on the road. The last time San Diego State played host to a Big Ten team was Sept. 9, 2000 (Illinois).
- The Aztecs have been extremely competitive with ranked teams from the Big Ten, dropping a 24-21 decision at 17th-ranked Michigan on Sept. 18, 2004, a 16-13 decision at second-ranked Ohio State on Oct. 20, 2001, and a 26-14 game at 20th-ranked Wisconsin on Sept. 5, 1998.

**Ohio State-San Diego State Connections**

- The two head coaches have met twice before. While Rocky Long was the head coach at New Mexico and Urban Meyer was the head coach at Utah, the two squared off twice. During the 2002 campaign, the Lobos upset the 25th-ranked Utes, 47-35, in Salt Lake City. It was one of only two losses for Utah that season (the other was at Texas A&M). The Lobos had a 633-300 advantage in total offense that day. The following season, Utah won at New Mexico, 28-7. The 28 points were the second most scored by the Utes that season en route to a 12-0 record and a win in the Fiesta Bowl.
- San Diego State assistant coach/quarterback coach Brian Sipe played for the Cleveland Browns for 10 seasons, earning NFL most valuable player honors in 1980. Sipe, who played at San Diego State from 1969 through 1971, was taken in the 13th round of the 1972 NFL Draft. He went on to start 113 regular-season games and is credited with 17 fourth-quarter comebacks and 23 game-winning drives. He threw for 23,713 yards and 154 touchdowns with the Browns.
- In addition to playing for the Browns, Sipe's father graduated from Ohio State University and his old sister was born at the Ohio State University hospital.
- In the first NFL season he played (1974), Sipe played an exhibition game at Ohio Stadium in Columbus, helping the Browns to a 21-17 victory over Cincinnati on Sept. 1
- San Diego State sophomore defensive back T.J. Hickman and Ohio State freshman tight end Marcus Baugh are both from Riverside, Calif. Hickman attended Martin Luther King High, while Baugh went to J.W. North High.
- Ohio State sophomore wide receiver Michael Thomas is from Los Angeles and attended Taft High School. San Diego State has six players from Los Angeles including sophomore defensive back Pierre Romain (Crenshaw HS), freshman defensive back Billy Vaughn Jr. (Dorsey HS), senior defensive back Marcus Andrews (Crenshaw HS), freshman running back Marcus Stamps (Jefferson HS), sophomore defensive back Tony Bell (Locke HS) and senior linebacker Vaness Harris (Dorsey HS).
- San Diego State men's basketball coach Steve Fisher, a two-time national coach of the year and seven time Mountain West champion, owns a 10-6 record against Ohio State. Although he guided the Aztecs to an 83-61 victory over the Buckeyes in the 2003 EA Sports Maui Invitational, most Ohio State fans probably remember him leading his 1992 Michigan squad to a 76-72 overtime victory in the NCAA Southeast Regional Final. Chris Webber led all scorers with 23 points and 11 rebounds, while Jalen Rose added 20 points and six rebounds in the game. Fisher would make the national championship game for the second time in his career (he also made the NCAA finals in 1993) before losing to Duke.

**Ohio State-SDSU: Last Meeting****No. 9 Ohio State 27, San Diego State 6****>> Sept. 17, 2005 >> Ohio Stadium >> Columbus, Ohio**

San Diego State started off on the right note scoring on its first play from scrimmage, but could not overcome a stifling Ohio State defense as the ninth-ranked Buckeyes defeated the Aztecs, 27-6, before a crowd of 104,533 at Ohio Stadium.

SDSU quarterback Kevin O'Connell, who threw for 159 yards on 12-of-17 passing, silenced the crowd when he hit wide receiver Brett Swain on the sideline for an 80-yard touchdown. The scoring drive, which took all of 11 seconds, was the Aztecs' longest single play of the season.

After taking an early lead for a second consecutive week, SDSU would never see the scoreboard again as the Buckeyes came with defensive pressure early and often. For the game, San Diego State only recorded three first downs, 13 rushing yards and 166 passing yards.

Despite SDSU's offensive struggles, the Aztec defense kept the visiting side in the game as it kept Ohio State to only 375 yards of total offense. The 179 yards the Buckeyes earned on the ground were the fewest allowed by SDSU this season.

Leading the way for the Aztecs was Freddy Keiaho. The senior linebacker totaled 18 tackles, 10 of which were of the solo variety, a tackle for a loss of eight yards and a pass break up. Cornerback Donny Baker also had an impressive game with 12 tackles, a forced fumble, a pass break up and the team's first interception of the season. Safeties Marcus Demps and Reggie Grigsby each chipped in with nine tackles apiece.

The Buckeyes matched SDSU's opening touchdown with 26 seconds left in the first quarter when quarterback Troy Smith scored on a 14-yard TD run after beginning their drive on the San Diego State 20. Ohio State was kept in check for most of the second quarter until Smith scored from one yard out with 5:15 left in the first half giving the Buckeyes a 14-6 advantage.

OSU then took its initial second half drive 62 yards into Aztec territory and posted another three points on a Josh Huston 25-yard field goal.

Then as the third quarter winded down, Ohio State punted to the SDSU 13 with an Aztec penalty to follow as time expired. With no time left on the clock and the ball at the SDSU 7-yard line, O'Connell rushed to his right, fumbled the ball and Buckeye linebacker Anthony Schlegel recovered it on the one-yard line.

Both teams marched to the other side of the field to begin the final quarter and Brandon Schnittker ran it in from a yard out effectively ending any chance of an Aztec rally. OSU would later tack on another field goal to give the game its final score.

### Welcome To The ETZ

- This marks just the 12th visit by an Aztec football team to the Eastern time zone in the Division I Era (since 1969). The Aztecs are 2-9 out East, with the lone victories coming at Kent State on Sept. 30, 1972 (14-10) and at Army on Sept. 10, 2011 (23-20).
- When the Aztecs won at Army in 2011, it marked the first win for the program in the Eastern time zone since 1972. On the day of that victory, 14,224 days had passed since SDSU's last victory in the time zone. The No. 1 song in the country that day (Sept. 30, 1972) was "Baby Don't Get Hooked On Me" by Mac Davis and the No. 1 album was Chicago V. Later in the month, 14-year-old Michael Jackson had his first No. 1 single, "Ben".
- San Diego State's last game in the time zone came two seasons ago when the Aztecs dropped a 28-7 decision to No. 22/21 Michigan.

### Playing the Elite

- San Diego State owns an 8-62 all-time record against teams ranked in either of the major polls at game time, including a 7-59 mark against teams in the AP Top 25 at game time.
- From Sept. 13, 1997 through Sept. 18, 2010, the Aztecs dropped 26 straight games to nationally-ranked opponents (25 if you include the Associated Press poll exclusively). Recently, that trend has improved with the Aztecs going 2-4 in their last six games against top 25 teams. Both of those victories have come with Rocky Long on the sidelines.
- The Aztecs won their most recent contest against a nationally-ranked team, winning at No. 19/14 Boise State, 21-19, on Nov. 3, 2012. That is the highest ranked opponent San Diego State has ever defeated on the road.
- SDSU is looking for a second consecutive victory over a top 25 foe. The Aztecs have never won two straight games against nationally-ranked teams.
- The highest ranked team SDSU has ever defeated was No. 12 (AP) Iowa State on Oct. 10, 1981. The Aztecs defeated the Cyclones, 52-31, that day in San Diego.
- This will mark the sixth time in school history that San Diego State has faced either the No. 1 or No. 2 ranked team in the country. The Aztecs are 0-3 against No. 1 and 0-2 against No. 2 in school history. The two games against the second-ranked team in the country were decided by a total of five points.

### Winning On The Road

- San Diego State carries a three-game road winning streak into Saturday's game in Columbus. It matches the longest road win streak in 33 seasons.
- The last time the Aztecs won more than three straight road games was the 1980-81 campaigns when they put together a four-game road win streak with victories over UTEP (28-7), Colorado State (30-14), Oklahoma State (23-16) and New Mexico (17-15).
- This is yet another area in which Rocky Long and Co. have made their presence felt. From 2001-09, the Aztecs posted an 11-43 record on the road and were outscored by 690 points (average: Opp. 29.4, SDSU 16.6). Since 2010, SDSU is 10-6 on the road, outscoring its opponents by 41 points (average: SDSU 29.6, Opp. 27.0).
- From 2001-09, San Diego State had the 12th-worst road record in the country. Since 2010, San Diego State ranks 25th nationally in that category in winning percentage and the 10 road wins are tied for 17th most nationally during that span.
- While compiling the 10-6 record in the 16 road games since the beginning of the 2010 campaign, SDSU has protected the ball.

In nine of those 16 games, the Aztecs have one turnover or less. During the streak, SDSU is 3-0 with no turnovers, 4-2 with one turnover, 1-1 with two turnovers and 2-3 with three or more turnovers.

**Bizarre Opening Weekend**

There were plenty of statistical oddities provided in Saturday's season-opening game against Eastern Illinois. Below is a look at some of the rather strange happenings at Qualcomm Stadium last Saturday night.

- San Diego State saw its seven-game regular-season win streak come to an end. It was its longest win streak since Nov. 15, 1980 - Oct. 10, 1981.
- San Diego State attempted a school-record 64 pass attempts. That is particularly notable given the Aztecs' rich tradition of moving the ball through the air (121 career 300-yard passing games).
- San Diego State ran 99 offensive plays. It is the fourth-highest total in school history and most since Sept. 14, 1991.
- The 99 offensive plays matched the most in the country in the opening weekend of play. Both teams that had 99 offensive snaps - San Diego State and California - lost their game.
- The Aztecs had an average starting field position of the 33-yard line, marking just the second loss in the Rocky Long era when having average field position of the 30-yard line or better. SDSU is now 13-2 in those situations.
- San Diego State had possession for 37:50. It was the fifth-highest total in a losing effort in the Division I era for the Aztecs. SDSU is now 37-8 when having at least a 10:46 advantage in the category.
- San Diego State had four interceptions for the first time since Sept. 26, 2009 and had five total turnovers for just the third time in the last 31 games.

**Offensive Quick Hits**

- For the second consecutive season, San Diego State returns seven offensive starters from the previous season. The current offensive players entered the season with 125 starts on that side of the ball.
- San Diego State scored 427 points last season and averaged 32.8 points per game. That total was third in the Mountain West and 36th nationally. The 427 points are the fifth most in school history.
- The three highest scoring seasons in the past 16 years have occurred during the past three seasons, 2010 - 455 points/35.0 ppg, 2011 - 387/29.8 and 2012 - 427/32.8.
- The seven returning offensive starters for SDSU with career starts in parentheses: LT Bryce Quigley (26), WR Colin Lockett (19), FB Chad Young (19), RB Adam Muema (15), RT Zach Dilley (14), TE Adam Roberts (9) and LG Japheth Gordon (8).
- Junior Adam Muema enters the campaign on the Doak Walker Watch List for the nation's top running back. He becomes the third different Aztec back to appear on the list in the last three seasons (Ronnie Hillman in 2011 and Walter Kazee in 2012).
- San Diego State's offensive line entered the season with 46 combined starts. That number sounds impressive, but keep in mind that Bryce Quigley's 26 starts (includes the season opener), most among the o-line, only 13 came at left tackle.
- San Diego State has gone 78 games without suffering a shutout (Nov. 18, 2006 at TCU). That is the only time the Aztecs have been shutout in their last 173 games.
- San Diego State has scored 30 or more points in 12 of the last 18 games dating back to the 2011 season.
- The Aztecs did not have a turnover in 4 of their last 13 games and have one or less in 13 of the last 22 games.

**OFFENSIVE RUSHING:**

- Last season, SDSU ranked 20th in rushing offense (220.69), 27th in rushing yards per carry (5.0), T-27th in rushing TDs (30).
- San Diego State has rushed for 2,612 yards in the last 12 games (217.7 rypg).
- The Aztecs rushed for 2,869 rushing yards in 2012, the highest mark in the Division I era.
- Since the beginning of 2010 (last 40 games), SDSU has 88 rushing TDs (the 24th-highest total during that time frame).
- San Diego State has at least 1 rushing TD in 21 of its last 22 games, dating back to the Oct. 8, 2011 contest vs. TCU, & has 29 rushing TDs in the last 13 games.
- In two career games against nationally-ranked opponents, San Diego State junior running back Adam Muema has 246 yards rushing (123.0 ypg) on 38 carries with three rushing touchdowns (four total). He has averaged 6.5 yards per rush against top 25 opponents.

**OFFENSIVE PASSING:**

- San Diego State passed for 318 yards in the season-opening game last week. That is the highest total for the Aztecs since the 2012 R + L New Orleans Bowl when SDSU threw for 413 yards.
- San Diego State broke the school record for pass attempts against Eastern Illinois with 64.
- San Diego State completed 50 or more percent of its passes in 17 consecutive games from Nov. 5, 2011 through Nov. 24, 2012. The Aztecs have completed 41.4 percent (vs. Brigham Young in the Poinsettia Bowl) and 42.2 percent (vs. Eastern Illinois) in their last two games.
- The Aztecs ranked 103rd in passing offense (175.92) & 55th in pass efficiency (136.38) in 2012.
- SDSU had just one interception in its first six games last season.
- During the last 29 games, SDSU has 50 passing TDs with just 22 interceptions.
- San Diego State has just 15 interceptions in the past 16 games combined.

**Defensive Quick Hits**

■ SDSU returns nine starters off a squad that continually gotten better under the direction of third-year head coach Rocky Long, who is in his fifth season as the defensive coordinator. Statistically one of the nation's worst units less than six years ago, Long has transitioned the San Diego State defense into one of the most feared units on the West Coast. Below is a look at the progress made under Long's direction, entering this season.

- Entering the season the defensive unit returns a combined 177 starts to their credit. A total of 11 players on the defensive side of the ball logged at least one career start prior to this season, led by DB Nat Berhe (29, including the opener) and Jake Fely (27, including the opener).
- A pair of Aztec defensive players are on preseason watch lists as the nation's top player at their position. Senior defensive back Nat Berhe is on the Thorpe Award Watch List (best defensive back) and Lott IMPACT Trophy Award Watch List (impact on and off the field), while junior linebacker Jake Fely is on both the Bednarik Award Watch List (defensive player of the year) and Lombardi Award Watch List (top lineman)
- SDSU has forced 10 turnovers in the last four games.
- San Diego State has allowed a total of 1,986 yards rushing in its last 16 games combined (124.1). The Aztec defense has held its opponent to 100 yards or less on the ground in seven of the last 19 games.
- Since the beginning of last season, San Diego State has forced 28 turnovers. That is tied for the 31st-highest total in the country.
- Last year San Diego State ranked 32nd in turnovers gained (26), 39th in total defense (369.00) and 42nd in scoring defense (24.38).
- SDSU returned 3 interceptions for TDs last season, which ranked in a tie for 6th nationally behind SMU (8), Fresno St. (6), Oregon (4), Stanford (4) & Toledo (4).

**DEFENSIVE RUSHING:**

- Last season, San Diego State was 22nd in yards allowed per rush (3.57), 28th in rushing yards allowed per game (133.50) & tied for 33rd in fewest rushing TDs allowed (16).
- Only four opponents in 2012 (Army, UNLV, Boise St. & Air Force) averaged more than 3.67 yards per rush.

**Aztecs Slip to Eastern Illinois in Opener, 40-19**

■ Eastern Illinois spoiled San Diego State's season-opener by scoring three unanswered touchdowns in the second half to pull away for a 40-19 victory in front of 42,978 fans at Qualcomm Stadium.

Aztec quarterback Adam Dingwell posted career-highs of 27 completions and 318 passing yards to go along with a school-record 63 attempts. However, the junior signal-caller threw four interceptions and lost a fumble, as the Panthers converted three of those miscues into touchdowns to help secure the upset.

SDSU opened the scoring on first of Wes Feer's four field goals on night, before EIU responded with a 37-yard touchdown pass from Jimmy Garoppolo to Erik Lora with 11:14 to go in the first quarter.

The Aztecs reclaimed the lead on their ensuing drive after wide receiver Colin Lockett sprinted 48 yards to paydirt on a reverse, putting the host school up 10-7. Feer added another field goal later in the period to boost the Aztec advantage to 13-7.

With the scored knotted at 19-19, the Panthers drove 75 yards on 12 plays, taking the lead for good when running back Taylor Duncan plowed into the end zone on a two-yard run with 7:36 remaining in the third quarter.

After limiting the Aztecs to just four plays on their next possession, Sheperd Little returned the ensuing punt 60 yards to put the visitors up 33-19.

Later in the period, Duncan closed out the scoring with a 45-yard touchdown burst with 4:40 left.

Quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo completed 31-of-46 passes for 361 yards and three touchdowns, including two to Erik Lora as Eastern Illinois beat San Diego State, 40-19, Saturday night.



Eastern Illinois (1-0) snapped a 19-19 tie when Taylor Duncan capped a 12-play 75-yard drive with a two-yard TD run with 3:36 left in the third quarter.

Duncan, who rushed for 94 yards on 20 carries, would cap the night with a 45-yard TD run with 4:40 left.

Eastern Illinois built a 19-13 lead at halftime as Garoppolo completed 15-of-24 passes for 246 yards and threw touchdown passes of 37 and four yards to Lora and a 62-yard strike to Keiondre Gober that snapped a 13-13 tie with 3:22 left in the first half.

Lora caught 10 passes for 87 yards.

San Diego State (0-1) got a 48-yard touchdown run from Colin Lockett in the first quarter.

## Aztec Football Picked Second in MW West Division

The San Diego State football team was picked to finish second in the West Division of the Mountain West in the 2013 preseason poll, the league announced July 22 in Las Vegas. The poll was voted on by media representatives who cover the conference.

The second-place prediction is the Aztecs' highest in the 15-year history of the league, although this is the first year of two divisions in the MW. SDSU was picked to finish third in 1999 and 2004, and averaged a predicted finish of 6.5 from 2005-12.

Last season San Diego State was selected fifth and finished in a three-way tie for the conference title with Boise State and Fresno State. It marked the fourth straight year and seventh time in the last eight seasons that the Aztecs finished at or higher than their projected finish. SDSU also picked up one of the 41 first-place votes in the West Division.

San Diego State garnered 181 points, including the one first-place vote. Fresno State earned 39 first-place votes and 243 points total in the West Division. San Jose State had 168 points and the other first-place vote to come in third, while Nevada (132), UNLV (69) and Hawai'i (58) rounded out the West.

Boise State paced the Mountain Division with 245 points, including 40 first-place votes. Utah State came in second with 204 and the other first-place vote, followed by Air Force (143), Wyoming (116), Colorado State (90) and New Mexico (63).

Additionally, senior Nat Berhe and juniors Jake Fely and Adam Muema each were named to the MW preseason all-conference team, giving the Aztecs three players on the team for the school-record fourth consecutive season.

This marks only the third time in the MW era that SDSU has had multiple players on the preseason all-conference defensive team (also 2004 in Matt McCoy and Kirk Morrison and 2011 in Miles Burris and Leon McFadden). San Diego State joined Fresno State and San Jose State as the only teams with multiple student-athletes on the preseason defensive team.

A two-time all-MW selection at defensive back, Berhe picked up his fifth preseason honor of the summer after earlier being named to the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List (best defensive back) and Loft IMPACT Trophy Watch List (Integrity, Maturity, Performance, Academics, Community and Tenacity), and a first-team all-MW pick by *Phil Steele* and *Athlon Sports*.

Last season Berhe led the Aztecs with 94 tackles, which ranked 10th in the MW and was the highest total for a SDSU player since head coach Rocky Long took over the defense in 2009. He also added five pass breakups, two interceptions and a fumble recovery.

Fely, who was a second-team all-MW pick as a linebacker in 2012, also picked up his fifth preseason honor of the summer. Fely has been named to the Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List (down end-to-end lineman (offense or defense) and linebackers) and Bednarik Award Watch List (Defensive Player of the Year), as well as first-team all-MW honors by *Phil Steele* and *Athlon Sports*.

Last year Fely ranked second on the team with 90 total tackles and 11.5 tackles for loss, while recording a team-high seven sacks.

A running back, Muema was a second-team all-MW selection in 2012. It was the fifth preseason honor of the summer for Muema, who also has been named to the Doak Walker Award Watch List (top running back) and the Maxwell Award Watch List (Player of the Year), and first-team picks by *Phil Steele* and *Athlon Sports*.

Muema rushed for 1,458 yards and 16 touchdowns on 237 carries in 2012, the third-highest yardage ever by a San Diego State sophomore behind Ronnie Hillman and Marshall Faulk. He ranked 17th in the nation with 112.2 rushing yards per game and third among sophomores. He had seven 100-yard performances, including a pair of 200-yard efforts vs. San Jose State and at Wyoming.

**Three Aztecs on Watch Lists**

■ San Diego State has placed three student-athletes on preseason national award watch lists in 2012. Senior safety Nat Berhe, junior linebacker Jake Fely and junior running back Adam Muema are on the initial short list for their respective positions' top honors.

Berhe (Colton, Calif.) is one of 48 players on the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List (best defensive back) and one of 42 on the Lott IMPACT Trophy Watch List (impact on and off the field). Last season Berhe led SDSU with 94 tackles, which ranked 10th in the MW and was the highest total for an Aztec since head coach Rocky Long took over the defense in 2009. He also added five pass breakups, two interceptions and a fumble recovery, while earning second-team all-MW accolades and winning MW Defensive Player-of-the-Week honors on Sept. 10. Berhe was one of only four players to start all 13 games for SDSU last season, leading the Aztec defense to a No. 1 conference ranking in rushing defense, and a No. 3 ranking in both total defense and scoring defense. He has 200 total tackles in his three-year career, and has made 27 consecutive starts.

Fely (Oceanside, Calif.) is one of 75 players on the Bednarik Award Watch List (defensive player of the year) and one of 107 on the Rotary Lombardi Watch List (top lineman). Fely, also a 2012 second-team all-MW selection, was second on the team last season with 90 total tackles and 11.5 tackles for loss, while recording a team-high seven sacks. He also had two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and two pass breakups. Fely, who was named the MW Defensive Player of the Week on two occasions in 2012 (Oct. 13 and Oct. 27), also became just the second Aztec in the past 15 seasons with at least two fumble recoveries, two forced fumbles and 10 tackles for loss in the same season (also Kirk Morrison).

Muema (Covina, Calif.) is one of 63 players on the Doak Walker Award Watch List (top running back) and one of 76 on the Maxwell Award Watch List (player of the year). During the 2012 campaign, Muema rushed 1,458 yards and 16 touchdowns on 237 carries, which marked the third-highest yardage total ever by an SDSU sophomore behind Ronnie Hillman and Marshall Faulk. He was 17th in the nation and third among sophomores last year with 112.2 rushing yards per game. Muema's banner 2012 season also produced seven 100-yard performances, including a pair of 200-yard efforts against San Jose State and at Wyoming. He needs just 289 yards to become the 12th player in Aztec history with 2,000 yards and a 1,100 campaign in 2013 will put him among SDSU's top five.

**SDSU Football Names Captains for 2013 Season**

■ San Diego State head football coach Rocky Long announced Aug. 19 that seniors Nat Berhe, Colin Lockett and Bryce Quigley have been named captains for the upcoming 2013 season. The three Aztec players were selected in a vote by their teammates the previous week.

Berhe, a defensive back from Colton, Calif., led SDSU with 94 tackles during the 2012 campaign, which ranked 10th in the Mountain West and was the highest total for an Aztec since Rocky Long took over the defense in 2009. He also recorded five pass breakups, two interceptions and a fumble recovery and captured MW Defensive Player of the Week honors following SDSU's victory over Army.

Berhe was one of only four players to start all 13 games for the Aztecs last season, leading the SDSU defense to a No. 1 MW conference ranking in rushing defense and a No. 3 ranking in both total defense and scoring defense. He has compiled 200 total tackles in his three years on The Mesa and has made 27 consecutive starts.

Berhe has collected five preseason honors, earning a spot on the 2013 Jim Thorpe Award and Lott IMPACT Trophy watch lists to along with first-team all-MW recognition by *Phil Steele* and *Athlon Sports*. He also landed on the all-MW preseason team as voted by media representatives who cover the conference.

Lockett, a wide receiver/returner from Diamond Bar, Calif., posted the third-highest single-season kickoff return total in school history last year with 777 yards, moving into second place on the Aztec career list in that statistic (1,455 yards). In addition, he ranked 21st in the nation with an average of 25.9 yards per kick return and scored two touchdowns.

Lockett, who has amassed 78 career receptions for 1,163 yards and 11 touchdowns at wide receiver, enters the 2013 campaign with a pair of preseason accolades, garnering second-team all-MW preseason distinction by both *Phil Steele* and *Athlon Sports*.

Quigley, meanwhile, was an honorable mention all-MW pick in his first season on the offensive line in 2012, helping the Scarlet and Black rush for a school-record 2,869 yards. The Granite Hills High product started all 13 games at left tackle after playing his first 24 games in an Aztec uniform at tight end.

Earlier this summer, Quigley was selected to Athlon Sports preseason all-MW third team and was an honorable mention all-MW pick by *Phil Steele*.

**SDSU Completes Football Radio Broadcast Team**

■ After switching its radio affiliation to The Mighty 1090 and its sister BCA stations earlier in the spring, San Diego State announced on Aug. 16 that it has filled its football broadcast lineup for the 2013 season. Joining veteran play-by-play announcer Ted Leitner in the booth as color analyst is former Aztec star linebacker Kirk Morrison, while Jeff Lasky assumes the role of sideline reporter. In addition, Ted Mendenhall will serve as host for the pregame, halftime and postgame shows.

Morrison was a four-year letterwinner at SDSU, earning All-America honors in 2003 and 2004. He was named the Mountain West defensive player of the year in 2003 and was the co-recipient of the award the following season. Morrison, who left Montezuma Mesa as the school's second all-time leading tackler, was a third-round selection of Oakland in the 2005 NFL Draft. He spent five seasons with the Raiders before playing the 2010 campaign with the Jacksonville Jaguars, followed by a two-year stint with the Buffalo Bills. During his eight years in the professional ranks, Morrison amassed 566 tackles, seven interceptions and five fumble recoveries.

Lasky, who is in his second year at The Mighty 1090, also covers the San Diego Padres for FoxSports San Diego as a feature producer and reporter to go along with his duties as associate news producer at KGTV Channel 10. In addition, he has broadcasted high school sports, worked on Padres pregame and postgame shows and provided updates as a studio anchor. Before his arrival in San Diego, Lasky served as play-by-play announcer for Montana State football and basketball contests for five years and also called minor league baseball games.

Mendenhall, meanwhile, has worked at The Mighty 1090 in a variety of roles since 2004, including his current stint as producer for Coach John Kentera's show, as well as play-by-play duties for the station's high school football and basketball broadcasts. He has also served as host for The Mighty 1090's College Football Gameday show and worked as a pregame and postgame host for the Padres.

Under the direction of third-year head coach Rocky Long, San Diego State has made a dramatic turnaround.

■ SDSU is one of 39 schools nationally to appear in bowl games each of the last three seasons. San Diego State is one of only two California schools to appear in three consecutive bowl games (Stanford) and is one of only three current Mountain West schools to appear in bowl games in 2010, 2011 and 2012 (Air Force and Boise State).

■ Long's impact has been felt almost immediately, first as the defensive coordinator in 2009-10 and then as the head coach since 2011. SDSU went without a winning season for the nine straight years from 2000-09 when it won 32.2 percent of its games and owned one of the nation's worst records. Below is a look at the dramatic turnaround.

■ San Diego State owns a 26-14 record over the past three-plus seasons. Prior to the 2010 campaign, it took the Aztecs 80 games to compile 26 victories. San Diego State was 26-54 in the 80 games from Sept. 20, 2003 to the conclusion of the 2009 campaign.

■ San Diego State has gone 42 games with losing three straight games. That period encompasses the entire Rocky Long era. That is the longest such streak without a three-game losing streak since a 46-game stretch spanning 1989 to 1993.

## COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

- Has the most all-time victories in the Mountain West with 79.
- Was named the Mountain West Coach of the Year in 2002 and again last season (2012).
- Has 13 years of head coaching experience and has spent 16 seasons as a defensive coordinator.

## AT SAN DIEGO STATE:

- Became San Diego State's 18th head football coach on Jan. 12, 2011.
- Was the defensive coordinator at SDSU from 2009-10.
- In 2012, led the Aztecs to a share of the Mountain West title at 7-1. It was San Diego State's 19th conference title, first Mountain West championship and first league title since 1998. The Aztecs were picked fifth in the preseason poll.
- In his first year in 2009, helped SDSU improve defensive marks in points allowed, first downs, first downs, rushing, total defense, third-down conversion percentage, fourth-down conversion percentage, sacks, interceptions and red-zone conversion percentage, among other categories.

## AT NEW MEXICO

- Compiled a school-record 65 victories and led the Lobos to five bowl game appearances in his final seven seasons. His teams were bowl eligible in seven of his last eight campaigns.
- In his final nine seasons in Albuquerque, Long's defensive units ranked among the top 30 in fewest yards allowed six times and among the top 40 against the rush every year. In both 2001 and 2003, New Mexico's defense ranked fifth nationally in fewest rushing yards allowed per game.
- While at New Mexico, he coached 13 players selected in the NFL Draft, 10 players who earned All-America honors and had a MWC-high 34 first-team all-conference selections since 2003.

## OTHER COACHING EXPERIENCE

- Prior to accepting the head coaching position at New Mexico, Long served as defensive coordinator for 12 seasons at three different schools. He was the defensive coordinator for two years under Bob Toledo at UCLA in 1996-97, for five seasons at Oregon State from 1991-95, and for five campaigns at Wyoming from 1981-85.
- Also served as an assistant coach at TCU, with the CFL's British Columbia team and started his career at New Mexico as a graduate assistant coach in 1972.

## PLAYING EXPERIENCE:

- Originally a defensive back, Long became a three-year starter at quarterback for the Lobos from 1969-71. He earned team most valuable player honors and was the Western Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year as a senior.
- Long played professionally in the CFL with British Columbia in 1972-73 and 1975-76. He also competed in the World Football League with the Detroit Wheels in 1974.
- Attended Alta Loma High School in Alta Loma, Calif.

## PERSONAL:

- Both of Long's daughters are head coaches at the university level. Roxanne was hired in July of 2012 as the head women's basketball coach at Rogers State University (NAIA) in Claremore, Okla., after four years in the same position at Texas Lutheran (NCAA Division III). Hannah, meanwhile, is the head volleyball coach at Southwestern University, an NCAA Division III school in Georgetown, Texas. She is a four-time conference coach of the year, having compiled a 309-71 (.813) record in nine years, including a pair of regional finals appearances in 2008 and 2009.

- Owns the most victories of any Mountain West head coach in the league's history. Was named the league's coach of the year in 2002 and in 2012.

**#6 ADAM DINGWELL**

**Quarterback • Junior • 6-4 • 210 • Rockwall, Texas • Rockwall HS**

- **At San Diego State:** One of the top returning quarterbacks in the Mountain West ... Started the final five games of his sophomore season in 2012 after coming off the bench to lead San Diego State to a dramatic come-from-behind victory at Nevada ... Is an athletic, dual-threat quarterback.
- **2013 (Junior):** Named to the inaugural Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award watch list, which is to be presented annually to the nation's top NCAA Division I offensive player who exhibits integrity, performance, teamwork, drive, community and the tenacity to overcome adversity ... The nominees must also be born in Texas or graduated from a Texas high school or played at a Texas-based four-year college or junior college ... Has thrown for 318 yards this season ... Is ranked 16th in the country in completions per game (27.00), 19th in passing yards per game (318.00) and 33rd in total offense per game (298.00) ... **vs. Eastern Illinois (Aug. 31) ...**



Started the opener vs. Eastern Illinois and was 27-for-63 for 318 yards ... Became the 23rd Aztec to pass for 300 yards (121st occasion) ... He was the first SDSU player with a 300-yard game since Ryan Lindley passed for 413 in the 2011 New Orleans bowl vs. Louisiana-Lafayette ... The 63 passing attempts were also a school record, besting the previous high of 60 by Adam Hall (Sept. 14, 2002) and Todd Santos (Oct. 17, 1987).

- **2012 (Sophomore):** Initially the No. 2 quarterback, Dingwell entered the Nevada game on Oct. 20, following a season-ending injury to Ryan Katz and started the final five games of the season ... Led San Diego State to a come-from-behind victory at Nevada in addition to posting a 5-1 record as a starter ... Won his first four games as a starting quarterback. That is the fifth-best start to an Aztec career and best since 1991 ... Was the only quarterback utilized in the final 403 offensive snaps of the season ... In his eight games in which he attempted a pass (six of which he had at least 18 attempts), he threw more than one interception on just one occasion ... Completed 57.6 percent of his passes for the season, including three consecutive games with a completion percentage of 60.0 percent or better ... Became the fifth SDSU quarterback in the last 17 seasons to produce at least four games with 60 percent completions and 18 pass attempts in a single season (Billy Blanton, Adam Hall, Ryan Katz and Kevin O'Connell) ... One of 64 FBS players to pass for 900 yards and rush for 100 yards ... Logged snaps in the opener at Washington, but did not attempt a pass ... Did attempt his first-ever rush, however, gaining seven yards on a 1st and 10 in the fourth quarter ... Rushed three times for 11 yards off the bench vs. Army, including a 7-yard touchdown run in the first quarter ... Logged playing time vs. North Dakota, but did not record a stat ... Carried twice for three yards against San Jose State ... Also came in on the team's last drive and was 0-for-2 ... Came in off the bench against Fresno State, but did not record a stat ... Completed the first two passes of his career vs. Hawai'i, going 2-for-4 for 28 yards, including a 21-yard pass to Dylan Denso ... Came in to hold for PATs and FGs vs. Colorado State ... Had a breakout game at Nevada, coming in for an injured Ryan Katz and leading the Aztecs to a come-from-behind victory ... Played the final three and a half quarters, and led SDSU from a 10-point fourth-quarter deficit for just the fourth time in 188 scenarios and for the first time since Oct. 26, 1991 ... Was 14-for-23 for 177 yards and three touchdowns, all career-best marks ... The three touchdown passes tied Ryan Katz (North Dakota) for the most in a game in 2012 by an Aztec ... Also had career highs in carries (11), rushed for 26 yards, and had an 18-yard carry ... Earned his first career start at quarterback against UNLV, and set a career high with 231 passing yards, while adding two touchdowns ... Also had a career-long 52-yard pass completion to Gavin Escobar ... He became the first Aztecs' quarterback to win his first start since Spencer Brinton in 1997 ... Led the Aztecs to a win over No. 19/14 Boise State, the highest ranked team SDSU has ever defeated in a road or neutral game ... Was 12-for-18 for 105 yards at Boise State ... The 66.7 completion percentage was his highest to date and started a streak of three consecutive games with a 60 percent or better completion percentage ... With the win, he became the first SDSU quarterback to win his first two career starts since David Lowery did in October of 1991 ... Boise State entered the game with a 71-1 record in its last 72 regular-season home games ... Was 11-for-18 for 90 yards and a touchdown vs. Air Force ... Finished his regular season in style, going 19-for-24 for 164 yards and two touchdowns (and one interception) ... The 79.17 completion percentage was a career high, while the 19 completions were then a career high ... Also rushed four times for a career-high 46 yards, including a career-long 22-yard run ... Lost his first game as a starting QB against Brigham Young in the Poinsettia Bowl after four consecutive wins ... Completed 12-of-29 passes for 144 yards ... Numbers were skewed due to the Aztecs trailing in the fourth quarter ... Through three quarters, he was 10-of-18 for 121 yards.

Enters the Ohio State game with the second-highest rushing average among any Aztec running back with at least 1,500 yards during the Division I era and entered the season with more rushing yards and touchdowns through 237 carries than honorable mention All-American and current Denver Bronco Ronnie Hillman ... Needs just 272 yards to become the 12th player in school history with 2,000 rushing yards and an 1,100 yard campaign will put him among the Aztecs all-time top five ... A hard-nosed runner, who can get yardage after contact and is tough to bring down ... In 15 career starts, he has eight 100-yard rushing games ... Went 117 touches to start his career before his first fumble (and fumble lost) at Fresno State (Sept. 29, 2012) ... Has five career multiple rushing touchdown games and six multiple touchdown games when including receptions ... Of his 279 carries in 2012, 38 or 13.6 percent resulted in a gain of at least 10 yards.
