SAN DIEGO STATE TRAVELS TO AIR FORCE FOR SATURDAY SHOWDOWN

- San Diego State continues its Mountain West play Saturday night when it travels to Air Force.
- Saturday will just be the second road game of the year so far for the Aztecs (2-3, 0-1 MW).
- SDSU is one of six schools which have played four home games this season - the most in FBS - joining Arizona State, Baylor, Georgia, Michigan State and Michigan.
- Amazingly, after having four home games in a 27-day span to start the season, San Diego State goes 28 days (starting Sept. 23) in between its next home game on Oct. 21 vs. Nevada.
- The Falcons (4-0, 2-0 MW) enter Saturday's game on a nine-game winning streak, tied for the fifth-longest active winning streak in the country. AFA also has won four straight home games, which is tied for the 17th-longest active streak in the nation.
- Air Force is already the fifth opponent for the Aztecs this season that had at least nine wins and played in a bowl game a year ago.
- SDSU is playing one of the toughest schedules in the country this season with five games against 10-win teams - vs. Ohio, at Oregon State, vs. Boise State, at Air Force and vs. Fresno State - and eight vs. bowl teams from a year ago - also vs. UCLA, vs. Utah State and at San Jose State.
- The beginning of San Diego State's schedule has been particularly tough as five of its first six opponents made a bowl in 2022, including games vs. Ohio (10-4) on Aug. 26 (W, 20-13), UCLA (9-4) on Sept. 9 (L, 35-10), at Oregon State (10-3) on Sept. 16 (L, 26-9), vs. Boise State (10-4) on Sept. 22 (L, 34-31) and at Air Force (10-4) on Sept. 30 before hitting its open week in the first week of October.
- The four FBS opponents for the Aztecs so far have combined to go 12-5 (.706). When you take away the games vs. SDSU, those opponents are still 9-4 (.692).
- Thirteen (13) players have earned their first career collegiate start this season for San Diego State and 16 players overall have made their first start at SDSU.
- The Aztecs are coming off a tough 34-31 loss to Boise State on Friday night. SDSU controlled the clock (32:10-27:50) and outgained the Broncos, 439-403, but lost two costly fumbles - one in Boise State's end zone and another in its own territory which led to a touchdown - gave up six explosive plays (20 yards or longer) and missed a 40-yard field goal early in the second half.
- San Diego State saw its 13-game winning streak snapped when scoring at least 30 points and 14-game winning streak snapped under Brady Hoke.
- The Aztecs totaled a season-high 439 yards of offense, including 326 yards from senior quarterback Jalen Mayden. Mayden was 16-for-22 for 241 yards and a touchdown through the air. He added 85 yards and a touchdown on the ground but fumbled twice.
- True freshman wide receiver Baylin Brooks had a breakout game vs. Boise State, setting career highs in receptions (5) and receiving yards (117), while logging his first career touchdown. He became the first Aztec true freshman with at least 100 receiving yards in nearly 29 years since Az Hakim had 143 at Wyoming on Oct. 22, 1994 and just the fourth in SDSU's Division I history (since 1969).

- SDSU has already played three top-50 defenses in the country this year, including No. 4 Ohio (237.2 yards allowed per game), No. 9 UCLA (263.8) and No. 45 Oregon State (327.0). In those games, San Diego State totaled 318 against Ohio, 259 vs. UCLA and 326 at Oregon State. Air Force's defense enters the week ranked second in total (223.0), fourth in rushing (62.0), 12th in passing (161.0) and 14th in scoring (12.8).
- The Aztecs have lost three straight games for the first time since falling in the final four contests of the 2018 season. SDSU played 50 consecutive games without a three-game losing streak prior to the latest stretch.
- San Diego State trails the all-time series with Air Force, 20-18, but has won nine of the last 10 meetings. The Aztecs' nine-game winning streak in the series was snapped in a 13-3 loss to the Falcons on Senior Day last November (Nov. 26). Heading into the game, SDSU's nine-game winning streak was the longest active winning streak against the Academy (TCU was second at four games).
- The last five games in the series have been decided by a total of 27 points. Over the last five meetings, San Diego State has a three-point win (27-24 in the 2015 Mountain West Championship game), two four-point wins (28-24 at Air Force in 2017 and 21-17 in San Diego in 2018), a six-point victory in 2021 (20-14 at AFA) and a 10-point loss at home in 2022 (13-3). Over the last 10 games vs. the Falcons, six have been decided by seven points or less.
- This marks the sixth consecutive meeting between the two schools where the combined winning percentage was at least .600 heading into the matchup.
- The Aztecs have forced 10 turnovers on the season, tied for the eighth most in the country.
- SDSU also ranks in a tie for second in FBS with eight interceptions, two behind Liberty's 10.
- Five different players have San Diego State's eight interceptions, including three by safety Cedarius Barfield, tied for the most in the nation.

PROGRAM-AT-A-GLANCE

- Since the start of the 2015 campaign, San Diego State is 74-33 with a 69.2 winning percentage (T-15th nationally) (*Top 25 listed on the right*) and the Aztecs are 73-30 (70.9 percent) since Oct. 3, 2015 (12th nationally).
- SDSU had five double-digit victory seasons from 2015-21. Only eight schools in the nation can say that - San Diego State, Alabama, Appalachian State, Clemson, Georgia, Notre Dame, Ohio State and Oklahoma.
- Only 17 schools have more wins than SDSU's 21 over the last two-plus seasons (since 2021), including Georgia (33), Michigan (29), Alabama (27), Ohio State (26), Air Force (24), Cincinnati (24), Fresno State (24), Notre Dame (24), Oregon (24), Utah (24), UTSA (24), Clemson (23), Coastal Carolina (22), Houston (22), Louisiana (22), Penn State (22) and Wake Forest (22).
- San Diego State has posted 13 consecutive seasons with at least a .500 record. That is tied for the sixth-longest streak nationally and is the longest streak among Pacific Time Zone teams. In 12 of those 13 seasons, the Aztecs have posted a winning record.
- The Aztecs have played in 12 bowl games since 2010. Only seven schools have played in all 13 over that stretch - Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, Mississippi State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State and Wisconsin.
- Since the start of the 2019 campaign, San Diego State is 25-10 in games decided by seven or more points (1-2 this year).
- The Aztecs are 25-11 in their last 35 games decided by one score (started with 27-24 win at Wyoming in 2016 Mountain West Championship game). SDSU's eight-game winning streak in one-score games was snapped Oct. 29, 2022 at Fresno State (L, 32-28).
- San Diego State is 47-18 in its last 65 regular-season games against Mountain West opponents.
- Brady Hoke is the only active college coach to lead three different FBS programs (Ball State, Michigan and SDSU) to an 11-win season and one of only two coaches overall since 1996 (also Urban Meyer with Utah, Florida and Ohio State).

2022 IN REVIEW

- After starting 2-3, the Aztecs won five of their final seven regular-season games (5-2) to clinch a bowl spot.
- SDSU finished 5-2 in its first season at Snapdragon Stadium.
- San Diego State played in its 12th bowl game since 2010, tied for the eighth most in the country over that stretch.
- The Aztecs finished 7-6 for their 13th straight season with at least a .500 record, which is tied for the sixth-longest active streak in the country. SDSU's lone .500 season in that stretch was a 4-4 campaign in the COVID-shortened 2020 season.
- Two Aztecs were Pro Football Focus All-Americans (Jonah Tavai - 1st team, and Jack Browning - 2nd team). SDSU was one of only eight schools with multiple first or second-team PFF All-Americans, joining USC, Ohio State, Alabama, Notre Dame, North Carolina, Illinois and Iowa.
- Tavai and Browning also earned other All-America nods. Tavai was a first-team selection by Bleacher Report, a second-team pick by Associated Press and USA Today, and an honorable-mention selection by College Football Network. Browning, meanwhile, was an honorable mention punter by College Football Network.
- San Diego State had seven first-team all-Mountain West selections, the most in the league for the fourth straight year. The seven selections were C Alama Uluave, KR Jordan Byrd, DE Jonah Tavai, LB Caden McDonald, S Patrick McMorris, P Jack Browning and PR Jordan Byrd.
- The Aztecs also had the most overall selections (16), matching a program record (also 2001). Making the second team were WR Tyrell Shavers, TE Mark Redman, LG Cade Bennett and LB Michael Shawcraft with honorable-mention accolades going to QB Jalen Mayden, WR Jesse Matthews, DE Keshawn Banks, CB Dez Malone and CB Dallas Branch.
- Browning was named the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Year. An Aztec has now won the award five times (all over the last eight years), the most in the 24-year history of MW.
- Byrd became the first Aztec to make a MW first team at both kick returner and punt returner.
- Byrd became the first FBS player with at least one rushing touchdown, receiving touchdown, kick return touchdown and punt return touchdown in the same season since Temple's Isaiah Wright in 2018 and just the second MW player in league history (also former Aztec Rashaad Penny in 2017).
- McDonald made the all-MW first team for a third consecutive season, joining fellow Aztec Kirk Morrison (2002-04) as the only line-backers in league history (since 1999) to make three all-MW first teams.
- McMorris landed on his second straight all-conference team, becoming just the second SDSU safety to make two all-MW first teams, joining Will Demps from 2000-01.
- Shavers was a second-team all-MW selection, the first San Diego State wide receiver to earn first or second-team honors since both Vincent Brown and DeMarco Sampson were first-team picks in 2010.
- Mayden became an honorable mention selection at quarterback, despite playing the first five games at safety. Mayden is the first Aztec quarterback since Ryan Lindley in 2010 (second team) to earn all-MW honors when he was named an honorable mention pick.
- Banks became a four-time all-Mountain West pick with an honorable-mention nod.

OFFENSIVE KEYS

- San Diego State is 55-2 the last 57 times it has rushed for 200 yards. The Aztecs surpassed 200 yards this year vs. Idaho State on Sept. 2 (W, 36-28).
- The Aztecs are 83-17 since 2011 when committing one turnover or less, something SDSU has done in 37 of its last 53 games.
- SDSU has an advantage in time of possession in 35 of the last 52 games. Since 2011, the Aztecs are 34-7 when possessing the football for at least 35 minutes.

DEFENSIVE KEYS

- The Aztecs are 71-4 since 2011 when holding the opposition to 17 points or less. SDSU has held 27 of its last 49 opponents to 17 points or less.
- San Diego State has won 22 of its last 26 games when forcing at least two turnovers (SDSU's 17-game winning streak came to an end on Sept. 3, 2022 vs. Arizona) and 32 straight games when forcing at least three turnovers (2-0 this season).
- San Diego State is 75-6 in its Division I history when owning at least a plus-3 turnover advantage, something it did twice last year (vs. Toledo and vs. UNLV).
- The Aztecs are 33-9 since 2011 when allowing less than 150 passing yards.
- San Diego State is 60-7 the last 67 times it has held the opposition to a 33.3 percent or less mark on third down.
- Since 2009, San Diego State's record broken down by opponent passing efficiency: less than 110: 68-10; between 110-150: 44-27; greater than 150: 7-28.
- Since the start of the 2015 campaign, SDSU is 46-4 when holding its opponent to a passing efficiency rating of below 110. SDSU did that in five of 13 games last year and two of five games this year.

SPECIAL TEAMS / OVERALL TRENDS

- The Aztecs are 48-3 the last 51 times when owning a turnover advantage.
- San Diego State had won 17 straight games when committing fewer turnovers than its opponent before falling at No. 16/17 Oregon State on Sept. 16 with a plus-1 advantage (streak started on Nov. 30, 2019 vs. Brigham Young). The Aztecs have now won 23 of the last 25 games when winning the turnover battle.
- San Diego State is 32-5 the last 37 times it has an advantage in field position.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State has 14 kickoff returns for touchdowns, the most in FBS play over that time. To

put that stat into perspective, 12 other teams have played at least 60 games over that span and do not have a single kick return touchdown.

- Since the start of the 2020 season, San Diego State has 14 non-offensive touchdowns, tied with Kentucky and Ohio State for the ninth most in the country over that span, trailing only Iowa (16), Middle Tennessee State (16), Alabama (15), Houston (15), Pittsburgh (15), TCU (15), Utah (15) and Western Kentucky (15).
- San Diego State had five non-offensive touchdowns last year, including a blocked punt recovery in the end zone to score against Arizona on Sept. 3, a returned punt for a touchdown against Idaho on Sept. 10, a blocked punt and return at Boise State on Sept. 30, a fumble return at Nevada on Oct. 22 and a kick return touchdown against San Jose State on Nov. 12. The five non-offensive touchdowns were tied for seventh most in the country, only trailing Mississippi State (7), Western Kentucky (7), Iowa (6), Middle Tennessee (6), Pittsburgh (6) and TCU (6).
- SDSU has won 35 of its last 37 games leading after three quarters (36-5 in Brady Hoke era) (30-game winning streak was snapped at Fresno State on Oct. 29, 2023).

BULLET NOTES - OFFENSE

- San Diego State returns five starters on offense this season, including three who earned 2022 all-Mountain West honors in offensive lineman **Cade Bennett** (second team), tight end **Mark Redman** (second team) and quarterback **Jalen Mayden** (honorable mention). Offensive linemen **Brandon Crenshaw-Dickson** and **Ross Ulugalu-Maseuli** are also back for the Aztec offense.
- **Ryan Lindley**, San Diego State's all-time leading passer from 2008-11, enters his first season as the offensive coordinator. Lindley came to SDSU from Mississippi State (defensive analyst) last Oct. 3 and will continue to coach the Aztec quarterbacks.

OFFENSIVE NUMBERS

- **San Diego State is 63-15 since 2015 when scoring just 20 or more points (2-1 this year).**
- The Aztecs are 48-5 the last 53 times they have scored at least 30 points. SDSU won 13 straight games when scoring at least 30 points before falling, 34-31, to Boise State on Sept. 22 (1-1 this year).
- SDSU has won 19 straight games when scoring 40 points (8-0 under Brady Hoke).
- SDSU is 27-6 since 2011 when having at least 36 minutes of time of possession.
- **San Diego State has won nine straight games when not committing a turnover (11-0 under Brady Hoke).**
- Since the beginning of 2014, SDSU is 67-15 when committing one turnover or less (13 straight win streak was snapped at Boise State on Sept. 30, 2022) and 14-24 when having two or more turnovers in the game. San Diego State has one turnover or less in 37 of its last 53 games.
- San Diego State has one turnover or less in 55 of its last 80 games.
- **SDSU is 56-14 in its last 70 games when owning an edge in time of possession (1-3 this season).**
- San Diego State had its 17-game winning streak at No. 16/17 Oregon State on Sept. 16 snapped when winning the turnover battle. The Aztecs are 20-3 under Brady Hoke when committing fewer turnovers than their opponent.
- SDSU is 30-6 under Brady Hoke when starting at least the 30-yard line (1-1 this season).
- San Diego State is 18-2 under Brady Hoke when having both advantages in turnovers and average field position. The Aztecs had their 13-game winning streak at No. 16/17 Oregon State on Sept. 16 (+1 turnovers, +10 average starting field position).
- The Aztecs are 19-6 under Brady Hoke when totaling just 400 yards of offense.
- LT **Christian Jones**, LG **Cade Bennett**, RT/RG **Myles Murao** and C **Ross Ulugalu-Maseuli** have played all 336 snaps on offense this season, while TE **Mark Redman** has played in 335 of the 336 snaps.

RUSHING OFFENSE

- **San Diego State is 55-2 the last 57 times it has rushed for at least 200 yards (1-0 this year) and is 52-1 in its last 53 regular-season games when rushing for 200-plus yards.**
- **The Aztecs have won 14 straight games when rushing for at least 200 yards.**
- San Diego State has a 100-yard rusher in 50 of the last 107 games since 2015 (62, 100-yard rushers total).
- San Diego State had two 100-yard rushers at New Mexico State (**Jordan Byrd** - 118 and **Chance Bell** - 116) on Sept. 14, 2019 for the 30th time in program history. The Aztecs are 29-1 in those occasions, including a 19-game win streak.
- The Aztecs ran for 302 yards against Idaho State on Sept. 2, their most since running for 380 against the same Idaho State team on Sept. 10, 2022.
- SDSU is now 33-1 in its Division I era (since 1969) when rushing for at least 300 yards in a game.
- San Diego State outrushed Idaho State by 268 yards, its largest margin since outrushing the same Bengal team by 300 yards on Sept. 10, 2022.
- **San Diego State is 29-7 in the Brady Hoke era when outrushing its opponent (2-0 this year).**
- SDSU's rushing average this season by down - 1st: 4.8; 2nd: 4.3; 3rd: 1.7 and 4th: 2.0.
- San Diego State's rushing average this season by quarter - 1st: 4.4; 2nd: 3.2; 3rd: 4.6 and 4th: 4.2 - and by half - 1st: 3.7 and 2nd: 4.4.
- In the running game, QB **Jalen Mayden** ranks fourth in the Mountain West in rushing attempts (56, T-43rd in FBS), fifth in rushing yards (278, 61st in FBS), sixth in rushing yards per carry (4.96, 72nd in FBS), tied for eighth in rushing touchdowns (3, T-60th in FBS) and 10th in rushing yards per game (55.60).

- Among quarterbacks, Mayden ranks fourth in the country in rushing attempts (56, 1st in MW), fifth in rushing yards (278, 1st in MW) and tied for 13th in rushing touchdowns (3, T-1st in MW). Mayden's 350 "gained yards" (excludes sacks and runs for losses) is tied for the second most in the country.
- Mayden ran for 132 yards against Idaho State on Sept. 2, the most by an Aztec quarterback in program history.
- Against Idaho State, Mayden became just the third quarterback in SDSU's Division I history (fourth overall) with a 100-yard rushing game and first since current Minnesota Viking head coach Kevin O'Connell had 101 at Brigham Young on Nov. 6, 2004.
- The 132 rushing yards were the most by an Aztec in Snapdragon Stadium.
- The 132 yards are the eighth most by a quarterback this season.
- Mayden became the 82nd Aztec with a 100-yard rushing game.
- Mayden's 56-yard touchdown run against Idaho State on Sept. 2 is the 14th-longest run this season by a quarterback and the third longest by an Aztec quarterback since at least the 1996 season. It is the longest touchdown run by an Aztec quarterback since at least 1996.
- Mayden has two games with two rushing touchdowns, including Sept. 2 vs. Idaho State.
- If you take away the 11 times Mayden has been sacked this year (for 68 yards), he has rushed 45 times for 346 yards (7.7 avg.).
- If you take away the 17 times Mayden was sacked last year (for 101 yards), he rushed 52 times for 332 yards (6.4 avg.) with three touchdowns. The three rushing scores were tied for the fifth most among Mountain West quarterbacks.
- RB Kenan Christon ran for 102 yards and a touchdown on just 10 carries (10.2 avg.) at New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2022. It was his second career 100-yard rushing game and first since rushing for 103 in his first college game at USC against Arizona on Oct. 19, 2019. He became the 81st Aztec with a 100-yard rushing game. He also became the first Aztec since Rashaad Penny against Army West Point on Dec. 23, 2017 and just the third Aztec overall since 2000 (has now happened eight times overall) to average at least 10 yards per carry on at least 10 attempts.
- Christon is ranked in a tie for ninth in the Mountain West in rushing attempts (46).
- RB Jaylon Armstead is tied for sixth in the Mountain West in rushing touchdowns (4, T-32nd in FBS) and rushing attempts (48), and tied for ninth in total touchdowns (4, T-54th in FBS).
- Armstead ranked fifth in the Mountain West in rushing yards per attempt (6.02, T-48th in MW) last season.
- Armstead ran for 96 yards against Idaho State on Sept. 10, 2022 on just five carries. The 19.2 average was the second-highest by an Aztec since at least 1996 (min. 5 att.), trailing only Rashaad Penny's 20.8 average at Nevada on Nov. 12, 2006.
- Armstead's 19.2 average against Idaho State was also the eighth-highest average in a FBS game last season (min. 5 att.).

PASSING OFFENSE

- **Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State has thrown 55 interceptions, the fourth-fewest picks in the nation over that span behind option teams Navy's 41 (min. 70 GP), Air Force's 46 and Army West Point's 53. In contrast, Purdue has thrown 116 interceptions over that span, which is the most since 2015.**
- SDSU has won five of its last six games when throwing for at least 300 yards (1-1 last year).
- With QB Jalen Mayden behind center, the Aztecs threw multiple touchdown passes in four consecutive games from Oct. 29-Nov. 18 for the first time since a four-game stretch in 2016 (Nov. 5-26).
- In the passing game, Mayden ranks second in the Mountain West in total offensive plays (194, 9th in FBS) and total offensive yards (1,220, T-23rd in FBS), fourth in passing attempts (138, T-20th in FBS), total completions (86, T-27th in FBS), passing yards (942, 53rd in FBS) and total offense per game (244.00, 63rd in FBS), fifth in completion percentage (62.32, 63rd in FBS) and completions per game (17.20, 67th in FBS), sixth in pass efficiency rating (123.43) and yards per attempt (6.33), seventh in passing yards per game (188.40), tied for seventh in points responsible for (42, T-73rd in FBS), eighth in yards per completion (10.85) and tied for eighth in passing touchdowns (4).
- **Since Mayden has moved to quarterback for the Oct. 8, 2022 game against Hawai'i, he is ranked seventh in the country in yards per completion (13.16, 1st in MW, min. 350 att.), 13th in yards per attempt (7.95, 1st in MW, min. 350 att.), 20th in pass efficiency rating (133.9, 1st in MW, min. 350 att.), 18th passing yards (2,974, 2nd in MW) and a tie for 49th in touchdown passes (16, T-4th in MW).**
- Mayden accounted for 11 touchdowns over a four-game stretch (nine passing, two rushing) from Oct. 29-Nov. 18, 2022.
- Mayden had a monster starting debut vs. Hawai'i on Oct. 8, 2022, throwing for 322 yards and a touchdown. The 322 yards were just six passing yards shy (328) of what San Diego State had for its first five games of the season.
- Mayden's 322 yards were the most by an Aztec quarterback in their starting debut since current offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Ryan Lindley threw for 352 against Cal Poly on Aug. 30, 2008 and the most in a debut in an Aztec win since Kevin McKechnie threw for 371 against Navy on Sept. 5, 1997.
- Mayden became the 27th different Aztec with a 300-yard passing game (127th time overall).
- At Fresno State on Oct. 29, 2022, Mayden had another good game with four overall touchdowns, including his first multi-touchdown passing game and first multi-touchdown rushing game. He was 19-for-24 for 291 yards and two touchdowns (and two interceptions), while rushing for 43 yards and two touchdowns on eight attempts (5.4 avg.). Mayden became just the second SDSU quarterback since at least 1996 with at least two passing touchdowns and two rushing touchdowns, joining Ryan Katz (Oct. 6, 2012 vs. Hawai'i).
- Mayden had another big game against San Jose State on Nov. 12, 2022 en route to being named the Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week (the first by an Aztec quarterback since Ryan Katz on Oct. 8, 2012), throwing for 268 yards and a career-high three touchdown passes (to three different receivers), rallying SDSU back from a 14-0 deficit. Against a team that ranked in the top 30 on defense in passing (28th, 196.50), rushing (28th, 120.38), total (20th, 316.88) and pass efficiency (34th, 122.58), SDSU managed 268 passing yards, 157 rushing yards, 425 yards and a 206.14 pass efficiency rating under his quarterbacking. The 206.14 pass efficiency rating was the highest allowed by San Jose State since a 245.7 mark against San Diego State on Nov. 4, 2017. The 14-point deficit overcome was SDSU's largest (win or loss) since also overcoming a 14-point deficit at San Jose State on Nov. 9, 2013, SJSU's first year in the league. Mayden also ran 13 times for 61 yards including 69 yards on 11 carries when taking away the two times he was sacked.

- Mayden threw for 280 yards and two touchdowns in a win at New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2022, while adding 38 rushing yards on five carries. It was his fourth straight multiple touchdown game, the first time an Aztec quarterback has accomplished that since Christian Chapman in 2016 (Nov. 5-26).
- Mayden earned honorable mention from the Mountain West coaches and media in 2022, becoming the first Aztec quarterback since Ryan Lindley in 2010 (second team) to earn all-MW honors.
- WR Mekhi Shaw became the 90th different Aztec in program history with a 100-yard receiving game with career highs of six catches, 120 yards and two touchdowns at New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2022.
- TE Mark Redman is the first SDSU tight end to earn preseason all-MW honors since David Wells in 2017 and just the second since 2012.
- Among tight ends in the country this year, Redman ranks fifth in receptions (18, 2nd in MW), 10th in receiving yards (208, 2nd in MW) and a tie for 11th in receiving touchdowns (2, 2nd in MW).
- Redman had a big game against Ohio in the 2023 opener on Aug. 26, catching five passes for 62 yards and two touchdowns. Redman became just the third Aztec tight end since at least 1996 with two touchdown catches in a game, joining Gavin Escobar (three games from 2011-12) and Kahale Warring (at Nevada in 2018).
- Redman became the first Aztec tight end with two touchdown catches in a season opener and the seventh overall player (the other six were all wide receivers).
- Redman has all four of his touchdown catches over the last 10 games.
- WR Baylin Brooks ranks second in the Mountain West in yards per reception (17.27, 69th in FBS).
- Brooks had a breakout game against Boise State on Sept. 22, setting career highs in receptions (5) and receiving yards (117), while logging his first career touchdown. He became the first Aztec true freshman with at least 100 receiving yards in nearly 29 years since Az Hakim had 143 at Wyoming on Oct. 22, 1994 and just the fourth in SDSU's Division I history (since 1969). Brooks became SDSU's first 100-yard receiver since Mekhi Shaw had 120 at New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2022 and the 92nd different Aztec with a 100-yard receiving game. The 117 yards are the second most in the country this year among true freshmen.
- WR Brionne Penny ranks eighth in the Mountain West in yards per reception (14.38).
- Against Ohio on Aug. 26, the Aztecs did not allow a sack in a season opener for the first time since Sept. 3, 2011 against Cal Poly, the final season of current offensive coordinator Ryan Lindley's college career at SDSU.
- According to Pro Football Focus, Cade Bennett's 83.1 pass block rating last year was the second highest in the Mountain West among offensive linemen and first among MW guards (min. 200 pass opportunities).

BULLET NOTES - DEFENSE

- Kurt Mattix is in his fourth season as defensive coordinator running the 3-3-5 defense at San Diego State. He previously served as defensive coordinator at Eastern Kentucky and worked with Brdy Hoke at Michigan. Mattix has been named a nominee for the Broyles Award for the top assistant coach in both 2020 and 2021.
- San Diego State's returns six starters return from a defense that ranked 15th in the country last year in total defense (322.77), 19th in rushing defense (113.85) and scoring defense (20.54), and 39th in passing defense (208.85). Starters that are back for the Aztec defense are honorable-mention all-MW cornerbacks Dallas Branch and Dez Malone, along with linebacker Cooper McDonald, safety Cedarious Barfield and cornerback Noah Tumblin.

DEFENSIVE NUMBERS

- Since 2014, SDSU ranks first in the country in interceptions (151), tied for fourth in turnovers forced (216), sixth in total defense (317.5) and seventh in scoring defense (19.2).
- San Diego State has held its opponent to single digits 20 times time since 2015 (107 games) and to 10 or less points 30 times over that span.
- SDSU won 18 straight games when holding its opponent to under 24 points until the streak was snapped in a 13-3 loss to Air Force on Nov. 26, 2022. San Diego State is now 35-3 under Brady Hoke when keeping its opponent to under 24 points (1-0 this season.)
- The Aztecs have allowed just 909 points over the last 190 quarters (4.78 points per quarter) (does not include overtime periods).
- SDSU has allowed just 983 points over the last 53 games (18.5 ppg).
- San Diego State has held its opponent scoreless on its opening drive three times this year in five games with three three-and-outs, 11 times in 18 games since 2022, 23 times in 31 games since 2021 and 77 times since 2015 (107 games).
- This year opponents have had 61 drives where they have tried to score on SDSU and the Aztecs forced three-and-outs (or less) in 16 of those drives (26.2 pct.). San Diego State averages 3.20 three-and-outs per game.
- Last year, SDSU forced three-and-outs (or less) in 41.1 pct. of the 163 drives (67 three-and-outs) and averaged 5.15 three-and-outs per game.
- San Diego State has forced 10 turnovers (eight interceptions, two fumble recoveries) on the season, tied for the eighth most in the country.
- SDSU opponents are 2-for-11 against the Aztecs on third down in the red zone.
- LB Zyrus Fiaseu is tied for the Mountain West lead in forced fumbles (2, T-4th in FBS), tied for second in total tackles for loss (6.0, T-22nd in FBS), fourth in tackles for loss yards (30, T-26th in FBS) and tackles for loss per game (1.20, T-65th in FBS), tied for fourth in sack yards (23, T-35th in FBS), fifth in forced fumbles per game (0.40, T-37th in FBS), tied for fifth in fumble recoveries (1, T-19th in FBS) and total sacks (2.0), and tied for ninth in solo tackles (18, T-59th in FBS) and total tackles (30, T-74th in FBS).

SERIES HISTORY

- This is the 38th meeting between San Diego State and Air Force with the Falcons owning a 20-18 series lead.
- The Aztecs won a school-record nine straight games in the series before falling, 13-3, on Senior Night last November (Nov. 26). That was the longest active win streak against the Academy.
- San Diego State is 8-11 lifetime at the Air Force Academy, but has won on its last three visits to Falcon Stadium (41-27 in 2011, 27-20 in 2013, 28-24 in 2017 and 20-14 in 2021).
- The Aztecs have a 10-8 series advantage in games played in San Diego.
- Fifteen of the last 27 games in the series have been decided by seven points or less. Of those 15 games, three have been decided by one point, one decided by two points, one decided by three points, three decided by four points, one decided by five points, three decided by six points (one that went to overtime) and three decided by seven points.
- This will mark the 38th time in the last 43 years the two teams have played. Air Force and San Diego State have tangled every season since 1980 with the lone exceptions being 1995, 1998, 2016, 2019 and 2020. The two teams will also play in the regular season in 2024, but not in 2025.
- Since 1994, the team that has committed fewer turnovers has lost just twice in the series. The teams have played 22 times since 1994, with the team turning the ball over less posting a 17-2 record (four ties). The 2013 and 2015 games are the only times during that span that the team with more turnovers (2013: SDSU (2), defeated the team with fewer turnovers, Air Force (1), 27-20, and 2015: SDSU (1) defeated the team with fewer turnovers Air Force (0), 27-14).
- **SDSU-AIR FORCE TIDBITS:** This is the 22nd time in 25 seasons the teams have played... The Falcons won the first three encounters during the MW era, but San Diego State has won 13 of the last 18 meetings... The games in the series have typically featured plenty of offense... In the last 25 meetings, the games had a combined average of 51.3 points and 684.4 yards of total offense... Only seven times in the last 25 encounters have the teams failed to combine to score at least 42 points and five times during that stretch the teams have posted at least 69 points... Last year's was the lowest combined score in series history (AFA 13, SDSU 3) and featured just 472 total yards and 22 first downs... Over the last 28 games, the cumulative point total is San Diego State 717, Air Force 710... In 2010, SDSU defeated 23rd-ranked Air Force, 25-23... Brady Hoke was the head coach and it snapped a 24-game losing streak to AP Top 25 teams... In 2015, the Aztecs defeated Air Force, 27-14, in the Mountain West Championship game... In 1993, SDSU rallied from a 17-point fourth quarter deficit to win at Air Force, 38-31... That is the largest second-half deficit SDSU has overcome to win a game in the Division I era.

Big Notes

- San Diego State had its three-game winning streak snapped. The three-game winning streak entering the game was tied for the 14th longest in the country.
- The Aztecs had their five-game home winning streak snapped. It was their longest streak in played in San Diego since a seven-game streak from Nov. 18, 2017-Oct. 20, 2018. The five-game home winning streak entering the game was tied for the 12th longest in the country.
- SDSU also had its nine-game winning streak against Air Force snapped. The nine-game winning streak was the longest active streak against the Academy and the fourth longest active streak against any FBS service academy.
- With the loss, San Diego State's longest active winning streak against any team is nine against both New Mexico and New Mexico State.
- The Aztecs had their seven-game winning streak snapped in games played in November.

Series Notes

- San Diego State fell to 20-18 all-time against Air Force.
- The Aztecs saw their five-game home streak snapped in the series. SDSU is now 10-8 all-time vs. Air Force at home.

Team Notes

- San Diego State had its 18-game win streak snapped when holding its opponent to under 17 or less points. The Aztecs are now 23-1 under Brady Hoke when keeping an opponent to 17 or less points.
- SDSU had its 14-game win streak snapped when holding an opponent to 15 or less first downs (SDSU is 18-2 under Brady Hoke).

Aztecs Fall to Air Force, 13-3, on Senior Night

SAN DIEGO -- Visiting Air Force snapped San Diego State's three-game winning streak and spoiled the Aztecs' Senior Night festivities with a 13-3 triumph at Snapdragon Stadium.

With the loss, SDSU also saw its nine-game victory streak against the Falcons halted, slipping to 7-5 on the year and 5-3 in Mountain West play. Conversely, Air Force (9-3, 5-3 MW) limited the Aztecs to minus-1 yard rushing and eight first downs for the game while posting two fourth quarter interceptions in the end zone to dash any hopes of an Aztec comeback.

The Falcons, who completed just one of two passes, gained 271 of their 285 total yards on the ground and nearly doubled the time of possession (39:13 to 20:47) to secure the win.

SDSU found itself in pursuit mode for the entire game after Air Force fullback Brad Roberts broke free up the middle for 63 yards to the Aztec 6 on the second play of the game. Three snaps later, Roberts plowed into the end zone, giving the Falcons a 7-0 lead they would not relinquish.

San Diego State responded with a 7-play, 45-yard drive on its first possession, highlighted by Jalen Mayden's 28-yard completion to Mark Redman to the Air Force 28. However, the Scarlet and Black came up empty when Jack Browning misfired on a 45-yard field goal attempt, setting an ominous tone for the remainder of the contest.

After mustering just three first downs and 76 total yards in the first half, the Aztecs looked to reverse their offensive woes coming out of the locker room. However, those plans were short-circuited when Mayden fumbled on the second play of the third quarter and Payton Zdroik recovered at the SDSU 14.

Moments later, the Aztec defense managed to minimize the damage, limiting the Falcons to just one yard on the next three plays, as the visitors ultimately settled for Dapore's 30-yard field goal, extending their advantage to 10-0.

Shortly thereafter, SDSU picked up a pair of first downs on Mayden's 15-yard completion to Tyrell Shavers followed by a 13-yard connection to Jesse Matthews. However, the drive stalled, and Browning was summoned to salvage three points on a field goal from 26 yards out, trimming the margin to 10-3.

The score remained unchanged until the 9:03 mark of the fourth quarter when the Falcons made it a two-possession game once again on Dapore's 32-yard field goal, capping an 11-play, 54-yard march.

Trailing 13-3 after another exchange of punts, the Aztecs set up shop on the Falcon 47 and advanced to the 6, as Mayden hooked up with Brionne Penny on a 16-yard completion before connecting with Chance Bell on a 13-yard play.

However, two false start penalties sandwiched around a pair of incompletions derailed the Aztec momentum. Facing a third-and-goal from the 16, Mayden lofted an ill-advised pass over the middle, as Jayden Goodwin picked off the ball in the end zone to extinguish the threat.

SDSU had one last chance with under two minutes to play, as Mayden completed a 40-yard pass to Penny on fourth-and-4, while a 5-yard sideline interference penalty by Air Force on the play gave the Scarlet and Black a first down at the 20.

Two plays later, however, Trey Taylor cut in front of Shavers in the end zone for another interception to end the Aztecs' frustrating night.

Mayden finished with 188 yards on 16-of-32 passing with two picks, while Matthews totaled four catches for 29 yards, becoming the 14th player in SDSU history with over 2,000 career receiving yards.

Defensively, the Aztecs were led by Michael Showcroft and Jonah Tavai, who set collegiate bests with 12 tackles apiece. Showcroft came up with nine solo stops and had two tackles for loss, including a sack.

On the flip side, Roberts gained 187 yards on the ground for the Falcons, while John Lee Eldridge III had 53 rushing yards of his own.

- **Fiaseu** had a monster game against UCLA on Sept. 9. Entered the game with six tackles on the season and finished with seven in the first half and a career-high 12 for the game (previous high was four). He also forced his first two fumbles and recovered his first career fumble. The two forced fumbles tied a SDSU single-game record (14th occasion). Tied a season and career high with two tackles for loss. Logged his second sack of the season and had his first career pass breakup. His Pro Football Focus grade of 90.5 was the highest in the country among linebackers for Week 2 (min. 45 snaps) and the third highest regardless of defensive position.
- LB **Cody Moon** was named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week on Aug. 28 for his play in the Aug. 26 opener against Ohio. Moon had a team-high 12 tackles (seven solo) in his first game as an Aztec after playing at New Mexico the past two seasons. The 12 tackles were two more than the next two Aztecs combined. It was his fifth career double-digit tackle game and third over a four-game stretch.
- In the opener against Ohio on Aug. 26, S **Marcus Ratcliffe** became the first true freshman to start at the signature Aztec position in SDSU's 3-3-5 defense, which started in 2009. The other true freshmen to start on defense since 2009: CB Leon McFadden (2009), S Tariq Thompson (2017), CB Noah Avinger (2021) and S CJ Baskerville (2021).
- **Ratcliffe** has played the most defensive snaps (338) this season.
- CB **Dallas Branch** was named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week for the first time of his career on Nov. 7, 2022 for his play against UNLV on Nov. 5. Branch had four tackles, a sack, two tackles for loss, an interception and a fumble recovery. He ended up setting career highs in tackles for loss (2) and had his first sack, while tying career bests in interceptions (1) and fumble recoveries (1). He first recovered a fumble in the second quarter after UNLV reached SDSU territory and later picked off a Doug Brumfield pass in the end zone on the second play of the fourth quarter.

RUSHING DEFENSE

- Opponents have rushed 160 times this season with only six attempts longer than 20 yards (3.8 pct.).
- **Over the past two-plus seasons since 2021, opponents have rushed 1,010 times with only 25 attempts longer than 20 yards (2.5 pct.).**
- Opponent rush average this year vs. SDSU by down: 1st - 4.4; 2nd - 5.9; 3rd - 5.9; 4th - 9.0.
- Opponent rush average this year vs. SDSU by quarter: 1st - 4.4; 2nd - 8.3; 3rd - 3.7; 4th - 4.3 - and by half: 1st - 6.7; 2nd - 4.0.
- San Diego State held Middle Tennessee State in the 2022 EasyPost Hawai'i Bowl to a Division I-era program-record minus-66 yards rushing, eclipsing a minus-44-yard effort against Cal State Los Angeles on Sept. 27, 1969.
- It was the second time of the season SDSU held a team below zero yards (also -3 vs. Fresno State on Oct. 28, 2022).
- **The minus-66 yards rushing by Middle Tennessee State were the fewest allowed in a FBS game since Michigan State held Tulsa to minus-73 yards on Oct. 30, 2019 and fewest in any bowl game since at least 1996.**
- The Aztecs did not allow a rushing first down vs. MTSU for the first time in any game since at least 1996.

PASSING DEFENSE

- **SDSU's 151 interceptions since the 2014 season are the most in the country over that while its 15 interceptions returned for a touchdown rank 18th.**
- **San Diego State ranks in tie for second in the country this season with eight interceptions (also Oklahoma and Ohio).**
- The eight Aztec interceptions have come from five different players.
- **CB Noah Tumblin leads all of FBS in total passes defended (10) and total pass breakups (8),** and is tied for second in passes defended per game (2.00, 1st in MW), tied for 17th in interceptions (2, T-3rd in MW) and tied for 68th in interceptions per game (0.40, 5th in MW).
- **According to Pro Football Focus, Tumblin is the top cornerback in the country in pass coverage with a grade of 86.8 (min. 150 pass snaps) and ranks third among cornerbacks with a defensive grade of 84.3**
- **S Cedarius Barfield is tied for the FBS lead in interceptions (3) and 20th in interceptions per game (0.60, 2nd in MW).**
- **CB Dez Malone ranks in a tie for second in the Mountain West in passes defended (7, T-3rd in FBS), tied for third in pass breakups (6, T-3rd in FBS) and tied for sixth in interceptions (1).**
- **Malone** had four pass breakups against Idaho State on Sept. 2. The four pass breakups are tied for the second most in a game this season in FBS and tied for the fourth most in a game in school history. An Aztec has only recorded games with at least four PBUs 17 times in program history, including Tumblin against New Mexico State in the 2021 opener.
- LB **New Zealand Williams** ranks fifth in the Mountain West in interception yards (40, T-46th in FBS) and a tie for sixth in total interceptions (1, T-71st in FBS).
- LB **Trey White** is tied for fifth in the Mountain West in both fumble recoveries (1, T-19th in FBS) and a tie for sixth in total interceptions (1, T-71st in FBS).
- DT **Tupu Alualu** ranks in a tie for fifth in the Mountain West in sacks (2.0).
- CB **Dallas Branch** had an interception in three straight games last year from Nov. 5-18, which was tied for the longest in FBS play this season. Only two Aztecs since 2007 have had a longer streak - Larry Parker in 2011 and Vonnie Holmes in 2007, each with four.

BULLET NOTES - SPECIAL TEAMS

- ESPN's special teams efficiency rating had San Diego State at 72.2, which ranked second in FBS, trailing only South Carolina (79.8). The Aztecs were fifth in 2021 at 69.9. This year, SDSU is 35th at 63.3.
- **Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State has 14 kickoff returns for touchdowns, the most in FBS play over that time. To put that stat into perspective, 12 other teams have played at least 60 games over that span and do not have a single kick return touchdown.**
- **The Aztecs also have five 100-yard kickoff return touchdowns since 2015, one behind Western Michigan for the most in FBS play over that span.**
- San Diego State had five non-offensive touchdowns last year, including a blocked punt recovery in the end zone to score against

Arizona on Sept. 3, a returned a punt for a touchdown against Idaho on Sept. 10, a blocked punt and return at Boise State on Sept. 30, a fumble return at Nevada on Oct. 22 and a kick return touchdown against San Jose State on Nov. 12. The five non-offensive touchdowns were tied for seventh most in the country, only trailing Mississippi State (7), Western Kentucky (7), Iowa (6), Middle Tennessee (6), Pittsburgh (6) and TCU (6).

- The Aztecs have 10 non-offensive touchdowns since the start of the 2021 season. Only eight schools have more non-offensive touchdowns over that span, including Middle Tennessee State (14), Iowa (13), Pittsburgh (13), Western Kentucky (12), Utah (12), Houston (11), Kentucky (11) and Ohio State (11). Over that span, SDSU has four blocked punt returns for touchdowns, two interception returns for touchdowns, two kickoff returns for a touchdown, a fumble recovery for a touchdown and one punt return for a touchdown.
- **Since the start of the 2020 season, San Diego State has 14 non-offensive touchdowns, tied with Kentucky and Ohio State for the ninth most in the country over that span, trailing only Iowa (16), Middle Tennessee State (16), Alabama (15), Houston (15), Pittsburgh (15), TCU (15), Utah (15) and Western Kentucky (15).**
- P/K **Jack Browning** has been named the 2023 Mountain West Preseason Special Teams Player of the Year. Browning is the second straight Aztec to be named the MW Preseason Special Teams of the Year (Jordan Byrd) and the fourth overall (also Rashaad Penny in 2016 and 2017).
- **Browning** is just the second Aztec punter to garner preseason all-MW accolades, joining Brian Stahovich (2010 and 2011).
- **Browning was named the 2022 Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Year, SDSU's second straight punter to win the award and the fifth time an Aztec has captured the award in the last eight years (since 2015). The five special teams players of the year are the most in the history of the league (started in 1999). Browning also made the all-MW first team as a punter.**
- For his career, **Browning** ranks fourth at SDSU in field goal percentage (.750, min. 25 att.) and 10th in made field goals (27).
- **Browning is 3-for-4 for his career on field goal attempts of at least 50 yards (1-for-1 this year). The 75.0 percent is tied for the second highest among all active kickers (min. 4, 50-yard attempts).**
- **Browning** has nine games with multiple field goals, including two games this year. He has multiple field goals in nine of the 18 games he's been the Aztec kicker.
- **Browning** ranked third in SDSU single-season history last year in punt average (46.10), tied for third in field goals (20) and tied for seventh in field goal percentage (80.0).
- This year, **Browning** is tied for the FBS lead in PAT percentage (100.00), tied for second in field goal attempts (11, 2nd in MW), tied for seventh in punts (24, T-1st in MW), ninth in total punt yards (1,037, 1st in MW), tied for 12th in made field goals (7, 3rd in MW), 21st in field goal attempts per game (2.20, 3rd in MW), 25th in punt average (43.21, 4th in MW) and tied for 25th in punts per game (4.80, T-2nd in MW). Browning is also third in the league in punt yards per game (207.40, 26th in FBS), field goals per game (1.40, T-35th in FBS), punts inside the 20-yard line (6, T-40th in FBS) and kickoff average (62.07, 73rd in FBS), fifth in net punt average (40.42, T-43rd in FBS), ninth in total points (32, T-69th in FBS), kickoff touchback percentage (33.33), made PATs (11) and attempted PATs (11), 10th in field goal percentage (63.64) and tied for 10th in total kickoffs (15).
- Last year, **Browning** tied for the FBS lead in PAT percentage (100.00), and was sixth in punt average (46.1, 1st in MW), tied for sixth in punts inside the 20-yard line (28, 1st in MW), eighth in kickoff average (64.14, 1st in MW) and total punt yards (3,145, 3rd in MW), 12th in net punt average (42.3, 1st in MW), tied for 12th in field goal attempts per game (1.92, T-1st in MW), tied for 14th in field goal attempts (25, T-2nd in MW), 16th in punt yards per game (241.92, 3rd in MW), tied for 16th in total punts (68, 3rd in MW) and field goals made (20, 3rd in MW), and tied for 17th in field goals per game (1.54, T-3rd in MW) and punts per game (5.25, 4th in MW). Browning also was second in the league in kickoff touchbacks (37, T-48th in FBS), third in kickoff touchback percentage (62.71, 37th in FBS), fourth in field goal percentage (80.00, T-47th in FBS), fifth in total points (90), sixth in points per game (6.92), seventh in made PATs (30) and attempted PATs (30), and tied for eighth in points responsible for (90).
- **Browning** didn't have a touchback from a punt until his 33th attempt of the season last year (Sept. 30 at Boise State).
- **Browning** made his first career eight field goal attempts and made 20 of 25 last season.
- **Browning** picked off where he left off last year, being named the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week for the third time of his career on Aug. 28 for his play against Ohio on Aug. 26. Browning helped the Aztecs beat Ohio, 20-13, accounting for eight points on two field goals (49 yards and 21 yards) and two PATs. He also punted three times for 169 yards (56.3) with all three going for at least 50 yards. **His 56.3 punt average is the highest in a game this season (min. 3 punts).**
- **Browning** had an impressive game against Idaho State on Sept. 10, 2022, punting six times for a 47.5 avg., with all six landing inside the 20-yard line, including five inside the 10 and four inside the 5. He became just the second punter with four punts inside the 5-yard line since at least 2012 (also Michael Dickson (Texas) vs. Missouri on Dec. 27, 2017). Additionally, Dickson was the only player since 2012 with more than five punts inside the 10 (he had six). Off Browning's six punts, Idaho State averaged a 4.83 starting field position. He also made his only field goal and all five PATs, while kicking off seven times for a 65.7 average with six touchbacks. He also had a 26-yard rush on a fake punt attempt.
- **Browning** was named the MW Special Teams Player of the Week for the first time of his career on Sept. 26, 2022 for his play against Toledo on Sept. 24. In the kicking game, Browning made his only field goal attempt - a career-long 50-yarder - and was 2-for-2 in PATs. Browning also punted nine times for 364 yards (40.4 avg.) (three of his punts started in Toledo territory) with a long of 56 yards. Out of his nine punts, six landed inside the 20 (last six of the game) and three inside the 10. Out of his nine punts, Toledo averaged a 21.7-yard field position. Browning also kicked off four times for a 64.2 average with two touchbacks. Off his four kickoffs, Toledo averaged a 22-yard field position. Out of his 13 overall kicks (punts and kickoffs), Toledo averaged starting on its own 21.8-yard line.
- **Browning** had another good game at Boise State on Sept. 30, 2022, punting a career-high 10 times for a career-high 48.5 average. The 48.5 average was the third highest last season for those with at least 10 punts in a game and the 24th highest since at least 1996. Browning also made both of his field goal attempts.
- **Browning** was named the MW Special Teams Player of the Week for the second time of his career on Nov. 21, 2022, for his play at New Mexico on Nov. 18. Browning made all six kicks (four PATs, two field goals), scoring 10 of SDSU's 34 points. He also punted twice for a 52.5 average, including a career long of 63 yards, and kicked off seven times with four touchbacks for a 64.1 average,

- while logging a tackle on a kickoff.
- For his career on planned fakes, **Browning** has rushed three times on fake punts/kicks for 72 yards (24.0 avg.) with a touchdown.
- RB/KR **Kenan Christon** ranks second in the Mountain West in total kick return yards (209, 18th in FBS) and combined return yards (209, 23rd in FBS), tied for second in total kick returns (8, T-16th in FBS), third in kick return average (26.13, 17th in FBS), fourth in total all-purpose plays (67, T-37th in FBS) and all-purpose yards (461, T-39th in FBS) and eighth in all-purpose yards per game (92.20).
- **Mekhi Shaw** is fourth in the Mountain West in total punt return yards (38) and tied for fourth in total punt returns (4, T-65th in FBS).
- **Martin Blake** ranks ninth in the Mountain West in kick return yards (79) and 10th in combined kick return yards (79).
- **Cam Davis** ranks in a tie for seventh in the Mountain West in total punt return yards (25).

SAN DIEGO -- San Diego State opened its Mountain West schedule on a sour note Friday, dropping a hard-fought 34-31 decision to Boise State at Snapdragon Stadium.

Missed tackles, untimely penalties and two crucial fumbles ultimately contributed to the Aztecs' downfall, despite the host school maintaining the edge in total offense (439-403) and time of possession (32:10 to 27:50).

However, SDSU was unable to contain the exploits of Bronco running back Ashton Jeanty, who rushed for 205 yards and two touchdowns on 23 carries, adding 49 yards on four receptions to account for nearly 63 percent of Boise State's offensive output.

Quarterback Jaylen Mayden completed 16 of 22 passes for 241 yards and one touchdown for the Aztecs (2-3, 0-1 MW), running for another score to finish with a team-high 85 yards rushing in 16 attempts.

Wide receiver Baylin Brooks set a career high with 117 yards and one touchdown on five receptions, matching the production of Brionne Penny, who also made five grabs for 97 yards.

However, Mayden twice turned the ball over, fumbling at the goal line on SDSU's opening possession before repeating the miscue later in the fourth quarter that led to a Bronco touchdown.

After Kenan Christon electrified the crowd with a 71-yard return on the opening kickoff, the Aztecs came up empty on their first drive when Mayden lost the ball on a head-first dive at the goal line on a 3rd-and-5 scramble up the middle. The SDSU super senior was originally called down at the half-yard line, but the call was reversed, and Boise State gained possession on a touch-back.

The Broncos (2-2, 1-0 MW) recorded just one first down on their first drive before Dez Malone returned the ensuing punt 36 yards, giving the Aztecs excellent field position at their own 48. Six plays later, Mayden threaded a pass to Brooks along the right sideline, as the true freshman sprinted 34 yards to the end zone for his first career touchdown that put the host school in front, 7-0, at the 7:37 mark of the first quarter.

SDSU outgained Boise State 97-26 in the opening period, including a 51-9 advantage on the ground. However, the Broncos flipped the script with 227 total yards in the second period, topping the Aztecs' 137. In addition, the visitors owned a 146-31 spread in rushing yardage during that span. After gaining just six yards on two carries in the first quarter, Jeanty rushed for 131 yards in the second period alone on just eight attempts.

On its first march of the second quarter, Boise State knotted the score with just over three minutes elapsed when Taylen Green connected with Eric McAlister in the left corner of the end zone on a 25-yard touchdown pass to cap a 5-play, 76-yard drive.

SDSU took advantage of a short field on its next foray, taking possession on its own 45-yard line following an unsuccessful squib kick, as the Broncos looked to catch the Aztecs by surprise.

After a 37-yard completion to Brooks down to the Boise State 10, however, the drive stalled, forcing the Scarlet and Black to settle for a 22-yard field goal by Jack Browning, which put the hosts back on top, 10-7, at the 9:13 mark.

Boise State needed just four plays to take the lead, as Jeanty burst up the middle and broke away for a 58-yard touchdown scamper with 7:13 left in the period.

With the game evolving into a see-saw affair, it was SDSU's turn to respond, and the Aztecs did just that, advancing 75 yards in seven plays to vault back in front, 17-14. The Scarlet and Black reached into its bag of tricks, as Martin Blake hit Penny on a 32-yard option pass on the first play of the drive down the Bronco 43. Mayden also completed a 12-yard pass to Blake and another 14-yarder to Penny before Jaylon Armstead bulldozed his way across the goal line from two yards out with 2:48 remaining in the half.

However, the lead proved to be short-lived, as Boise State tied the score on a 29-yard field goal by Jonah Dalmas with just 22 seconds before intermission to cap an 11-play, 72-yard march. Jeanty keyed the drive with a 36-yard jaunt and followed with another 10-yard run before Green hit McAlister with an 11-yard strike to the SDSU 16.

The Aztecs threatened on their first drive of the second half, as Mayden completed a 22-yard pass to Brooks and a 14-yarder to Mark Redman that gave the hosts a first down at the Bronco 25. However, the ensuing three plays netted just two yards before Browning's 40-yard field goal attempt hooked wide left.

Boise State then jumped in front to stay at 20-17 on Dalmas' 27-yard field goal with 4:52 left in the third quarter. After several missed tackles on Jeanty's 25-yard run shy of midfield, McAlister broke free himself on a short pass from Green for a 39-yard gain to the Aztec 6. However, the SDSU defense stiffened, forcing the Broncos to settle for three points.

On the first snap of the Aztecs' next possession, Jayden Virgin recovered a Mayden fumble at the SDSU 26. Four plays later, Green sprinted around left end on 3rd and goal from the 10, beating the defense to the pylon for a touchdown, which gave the visitors a 27-17 advantage with 3:05 to go in the period.

The Aztecs answered with their longest drive of the season, marching 92 yards in 10 plays, punctuated by Armstead's 10-yard blast up the middle on the second play of the fourth quarter that trimmed the margin to 27-24. The Scarlet and Black converted a trio of third downs on the advance, as Mayden found Penny for a 36-yard completion before helping his own cause with scrambles of 11 and 16 yards, the latter of which put the ball at the Bronco 10.

The teams exchanged punts before Boise State put the game essentially out of reach with Jeanty's six-yard touchdown run with 2:02 left on the clock. Earlier in the drive, the Broncos converted a 4th-and-1 situation from the Aztec 30 when Jeanty rushed for six yards, while Green scrambled for another first down on a 3rd-and-3 play moments later.

SDSU fought to the end with a 72-yard march in seven plays, culminating in Mayden's 10-yard touchdown run, which narrowed the gap to 34-31 with just 42 seconds remaining. However, the Broncos ran out the clock after recovering the ensuing outside kick.

Along with Mayden's rushing total, Christian gained 44 yards on 12 carries, while Armstead finished with 35 yards in 10 attempts.

Defensively, the Aztecs were led by Eric Butler's eight tackles, including six solo stops and two-and-a-half tackles for a loss, while Cooper McDonald finished with six stops (5 solo) of his own.

Conversely, Green totaled 162 yards on 12-of-22 passing for the Broncos, while McAlister hauled in five receptions for 90 yards in the victory.

TEAM NOTES

- San Diego State lost its conference opener for just the third time in the last 11 years.
- The Aztecs fell to 9-2 in their last 11 Mountain West home openers.
- SDSU fell to 20-7 in games played in September since the start of the 2016 campaign.
- San Diego State dropped to 74-33 (.692) since the start of the 2015 season.
- The Aztecs saw their 13-game winning streak snapped and 14-game winning streak snapped under Brady Hoke when scoring at least 30 points. SDSU is now 22-3 under Hoke when scoring at least 30 points.
- San Diego State fell to 63-15 since 2015 when scoring at least 20 points (2-1 this year).

COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

- Has amassed 39 years of coaching experience at the collegiate level including 14-plus seasons as a FBS head coach at Michigan (2011-14), San Diego State (2009-10, 20-) and Ball State (2003-08).
- Received conference coach-of-the-year recognition in three different leagues as a head coach while posting a 103-85 overall record. During his tenure as a head coach, Hoke's teams have produced 107 all-conference selections.
- Brings 20 years of experience as a collegiate defensive coach with stints at Grand Valley State (1983), Western Michigan (1984-86), Toledo (1987-88), Oregon State (1989-94), Michigan (1995- 2002), Oregon (2016) and Tennessee, where he was named interim head coach for the final two games of the 2017 campaign.

AT SAN DIEGO STATE

- Hoke returned to "America's Finest City" as the Aztecs' defensive line coach in 2019, helping SDSU rank second in FBS in rush defense (75.4), third in scoring defense (12.7), and sixth in both total defense (287.8) and pass efficiency defense (110.25).
- Spent two seasons as San Diego State's head coach (2009-10), earning Mountain West Coach of the Year honors in 2010 after leading the Aztecs to their first postseason appearance in 12 years with a victory over Navy in the Poinsettia Bowl.
- Coached 18 all-MW performers during his first stint at SDSU, as well as 25 conference all-academic recipients.

OTHER COACHING EXPERIENCE

- Served as head coach at Michigan from 2011-14, guiding the Wolverines to a 31-20 record, including an 18-14 conference ledger. He became the first Michigan head coach to go undefeated at home (14-0) in his first two seasons since Fielding Yost in 1901-02.
- Directed the Wolverines to an 11-2 record and a victory in the Allstate Sugar Bowl in his first season on the Ann Arbor campus. For his efforts, Hoke collected the inaugural Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year award from the Big Ten Conference coaches while garnering Dave McClain Coach of the Year accolades from the Big Ten media. In addition, he was named the Maxwell Football Club Collegiate Coach of the Year that season and was a finalist for three other national Coach of the Year honors: Bear Bryant, Eddie Robinson and Liberty Mutual.
- During Hoke's tenure in Ann Arbor, the Wolverine defense improved from a unit that in 2010 ranked 108th in the FBS in scoring defense and 110th in yards allowed to one that ranked among the top 20 in total defense in 2011, 2012 and 2014. Meanwhile, the offense averaged nearly 30 points per game (29.2) in his four years at the helm.
- Under Hoke's tutelage at Michigan, a total of 21 Wolverine players received all-Big Ten recognition.
- Earned his first head coaching job at his alma mater, Ball State, where he guided the program for six seasons, culminating with a 12-1 campaign in 2008 and an undefeated Mid-American Conference regular season.
- With Hoke at the controls, Ball State made its' first-ever appearance in the national polls in 2008, ranking as high as 12th by the Associated Press and 13th in the USA Today Coaches poll. For his efforts, Hoke was one of 10 finalists for the 2008 Liberty Mutual National Coach of the Year award.
- Led the Cardinals to back-to-back bowl game appearances (2007-08), the first time the feat was accomplished in school history. The 2008 team, which also advanced to its first MAC championship contest, earned an invitation to the GMAC Bowl in Mobile, Alabama.
- As a defensive line coach at Michigan, Hoke was part of three Big Ten champion teams (1997, 1998, 2000), including the 1997 national champion and Rose Bowl-winning squad, before his promotion to associate head coach in 2002.
- Began his coaching career as an assistant at Yorktown (Ind.) High School in 1981 before entering the collegiate ranks as a defensive line coach at Grand Valley State in 1983.

- Spent two years as a GA at South Carolina (2015-16) and Western Michigan (2012-13).

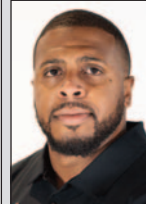

SDSU Downs Ohio, 20-13, in 2023 Opener

SAN DIEGO -- Jalen Mayden threw two touchdown passes to Mark Redman and San Diego State opened the season with a 20-13 win over Ohio at Snapdragon Stadium.

The game turned in the final minute of the first half when Cedarius Barfield intercepted Ohio quarterback CJ Harrison inside the Aztecs 30-yard line. Mayden then drove the Aztecs 71 yards in 44 seconds, hitting Redman for a 13-yard score as time ran out. That made it 10-6 at halftime.

The Bobcats then missed a 31-yard field goal to cap the opening drive of the second half, a drive that chewed up more than half of the third quarter.

After a 3-and-out, San Diego State put together two long drives — a 10-play, 77-yard drive for Jack Browning's 21-yard field goal and an 11-play, 79-yard march capped by a 4-yard Redman touchdown. In the second drive, Mayden was 7-for-7 for 68 yards.

Ohio threw three straight incompletions from the SDSU 6 with less than three minutes to play and on fourth down Marcus Ratcliffe had a 100-yard interception return nullified by a roughing-the-passer penalty on Cody Moon.

The Bobcats then cashed in with a 3-yard touchdown pass from Harris to Miles Cross with 2:04 to go, making it a 20-13 game instead of 27-6. The onside kick went out of bounds but the Aztecs only picked up eight yards on four runs, failing to convert on fourth-and-3 from the Bobcat 36.

Ohio got the ball back on its 35 with 55 seconds to play and picked up a pair of first downs before New Zealand Williams had an interception at the 20, returning it 40 yards before stepping out of bounds with a second to play.

Mayden was 17 of 27 for 164 yards, including five passes for 62 yards and two touchdowns to Redman. Redman became just the third Aztec tight end since at least 1996 with two touchdown catches in a game, joining Gavin Escobar (three games from 2011-12) and Kahale Warring (at Nevada in 2018). Additionally, Redman became the first SDSU tight end with two touchdown catches in a season opener and the seventh overall player (the other six were all wide receivers).

San Diego State picked off Harris three times and won its 31st consecutive game when forcing three or more turnovers. The Aztecs also won their 17th straight game when committing fewer turnovers than their opponent. This against an Ohio team that won 10 games a year ago, returned nine starters on offense and owned the eighth-best turnover margin in the country in 2022 at +0.86. The Bobcats only threw five interceptions in 14 games a season ago.

Jaylon Armstead rushed for 78 yards on just eight carries for SDSU, which had eight players make their first career Division I start and 10 players overall make their first start at San Diego State.

Cody Moon had 12 tackles in his first game as an Aztec after transferring from New Mexico, while Noah Tumblin came off the bench for five solo tackles and three pass breakups.

SDSU improved to 16-1-1 all-time against current members of the Mid-American Conference, avenging a 27-0 loss to Ohio in the 2018 Frisco Bowl.

San Diego State improved to 62-14 since 2015 when scoring just 20 points.

Big Notes

- The Aztecs are 2-0 for the fourth time in the last five seasons (2019, 2020, 2021 and 2023) and for the sixth time in the last eight seasons (2016, 2017, 2019, 2020, 2021 and 2023).
- SDSU won its 21st game since the start of the 2021 season, which is tied for the ninth most in the country over that span, one behind Clemson or Notre Dame.
- San Diego State has won seven of its last 10 games dating back to last season.
- The Aztecs won their 32nd consecutive game when forcing three or more turnovers.
- SDSU improved to 63-14 since 2015 when scoring at least 20 points.
- San Diego State logged their first safety on special teams since Oct. 4, 2013 vs. Nevada (W, 51-44 in OT).

Mayden's Big Night Propels SDSU Past ISU, 36-28

SAN DIEGO -- San Diego State's Jalen Mayden rushed for 132 yards and two touchdowns on Saturday to lead the Aztecs to a 36-28 victory over a pesky Idaho State squad at Snapdragon Stadium.

Mayden set a school record for rushing yards by a quarterback, becoming the fourth signal-caller in program history to surpass the 100-yard barrier on the ground and third in the Division I era. In addition, Mayden is the first SDSU quarterback to accomplish the feat since Kevin O'Connell gained 101 yards vs. Brigham Young in 2004.

In all, SDSU maintained a sizable 302-34 advantage in rushing yardage to raise their record to 2-0 on the young season. The Aztecs' dominant ground game was augmented by Jaylon Armstead and Martin Blake, who each gained 58 yards with one touchdown, while Kenan Christon racked up 40 yards of his own.

Despite allowing 309 yards through the air, the SDSU defense came up with three timely interceptions, including two in the first half, which led to 10 points. In addition, the Scarlet and Black registered a crucial stop on a fourth-and-2 situation at the Aztec 30 in the fourth quarter with ISU driving toward a potential tying touchdown.

The teams traded field goals in the first quarter, including a 43-yarder by Jack Browning, which knotted the score at 3-3. On the first play of ISU's ensuing possession, Cedarius Barfield made a leaping interception of a Jordan Cooke pass at the Bengal 32, and the Aztecs wasted little time to convert the opportunity. Two snaps later, Mayden sprinted 24 yards around right end into the end zone to put SDSU in front for good, 10-3.

Thomas Kopcho split the uprights from 33-yards out for his second field goal of the game, which trimmed the deficit to 10-6. However, the Aztecs responded with a 12-play, 68-yard march, capped by Armstead's four-yard scoring burst.

Dez Malone picked off Hunter Hays on the ensuing possession, and seven plays later Browning connected on a 41-yard field goal to increase the SDSU advantage to 20-6.

However, ISU needed just 50 seconds to drive 65 yard for its first touchdown of the evening, as Cooke hit Christian Fredricksen over the middle on a 24-yard scoring strike that trimmed the margin to 20-13 just before intermission.

SDSU advanced deep into ISU territory on its first possession of the third quarter, but Armstead fumbled at the 10. Unfazed, the Aztec defense rose to the occasion, limiting ISU to just two yards following the turnover. Moments later, the Bengals' long snapper sailed the ball high over punter Ross Bolger and through the back of the end zone for a safety, giving SDSU a 22-13 lead.

Blake returned the ensuing free kick 35 yards and ISU was flagged for a face mask penalty, putting the Aztecs in business at the Bengal 27. Five straight rushing plays followed, as Blake plowed into the end zone from three yards out to increase the SDSU advantage to 29-13.

After an exchange of punts, Idaho State fashioned its longest drive of the game, marching 80 yards in 14 plays, punctuated by Hays' eight-yard touchdown pass to Chedon James early in the fourth quarter. Jordan corralled Hays' two-point conversion pass shortly thereafter, which cut the deficit to 29-21, to the ground.

Later, Mayden burst through a gaping hole up the middle on a keeper and raced 56 yards into the end zone to give SDSU a comfortable 36-21 cushion with just 6:50 left in the game.

With the clock winding down, the Bengals scored a late touchdown to account for the final margin, as Hays crossed the goal line from two yards out with 14 seconds left. However, the Aztecs recovered the outside kick to secure the hard-fought victory.

Aztecs Stumble vs. UCLA, 35-10

SAN DIEGO -- San Diego State was unable to match the big-play capability of visiting UCLA in a 35-10 defeat on a warm Saturday evening at Snapdragon Stadium.

Despite trailing in time of possession (34:55 to 25:05), the Bruins maintained a sizable advantage in total offense (550-259), recording seven plays of over 20 yards to hand the Aztecs (2-1) their first loss of the season.

Additionally, UCLA (2-0) outscored the Scarlet and Black 21-3 in a pivotal second quarter to build a commanding 28-10 lead by halftime.

Bruin quarterback Dante Moore completed 17 of 27 passes for 290 yards and three touchdowns without an interception to pace the visitors' attack.

After rushing for 302 yards last week against Idaho State, the SDSU ground game was stifled by UCLA, with the Scarlet and Black gaining just 63 yards on 33 attempts.

The Bruins struck quickly on their third possession when Josiah Norwood hauled in a short play-action pass over the middle from Moore and outraced the Aztec defense for an 81-yard scoring strike at the 7:26 mark of the first quarter.

The SDSU offense awakened on its ensuing drive, as Mayden completed five of six tosses for 68 yards, punctuated by Mekhi Shaw's 21-yard reception near the right pylon at the goal line that knotted the score at 7-7.

The Bruins answered with a seven-play, 75-yard march on their next series, aided by two Aztec pass interference penalties that put the ball just outside the red zone. Facing a fourth-and-1 situation from the Aztec 13, Carson Steele hit pay dirt on a sweep around right end on the first play of the second quarter that put UCLA in front for good.

SDSU gained just 11 yards on its following drive, and it took the Bruins just three snaps to extend their lead to 21-7, as T.J. Harden burst through the line and rambled 59-yard for a touchdown with 10:21 left in the period.

The Aztecs drove to the UCLA 27 on their next foray, as Mayden lofted a pass to a wide-open Joshua Nicholson in the right corner of the end zone on a third-and-10 situation. However, the ball skipped off Nicholson's fingertips, forcing SDSU to settle for a 44-yard field goal by Jack Browning, cutting the margin to 21-10 with 5:03 left in the half.

Following another exchange of punts, the Bruins needed just 56 seconds to cover 85 yards in seven plays, culminating in a 24-yard touchdown pass from Moore to a wide-open Logan Loya that increased the UCLA advantage to 28-10.

Trailing by 18 points, the snake-bit Aztecs were unable to capitalize on a golden opportunity at the 8:07 mark of the third quarter when Trey White recovered a Moore fumble just short of the goal line. After two running plays were promptly stuffed, Mayden's pass bounced off the hands of Blake and was intercepted in the end zone by Darius Muasau.

Following the turnover, UCLA marched 80 yards in 12 plays, capped by Moore's 6-yard toss to Carsen Ryan on a screen pass out of the backfield for his third touchdown strike of the night that closed out the scoring.

Defensively, Zyrus Fiaseu led the Aztecs with 12 tackles, including eight solo stops, to go with two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, one pass break-up and one quarterback hurry. In addition, Cedarius Barfield finished with seven tackles (3 solo), while Dez Malone made six stops (4 solo) of his own.

On the other side of the ball, Mayden finished with 196 yards on 19-for-37 passing but was intercepted three times and sacked twice before giving way to Tabin O'Dell late in the fourth quarter.

Shaw was SDSU's leading receiver, gaining 54 yards on five receptions, matching Mark Redman, who also had five grabs for 32 yards.

SDSU Falls at No. 16/17 Oregon State, 26-9

CORVALLIS, Ore. -- San Diego State battled in its first road game of the season at No. 16/17 Oregon State, but fell, 26-9, Saturday in Corvallis, Oregon.

Quarterback DJ Uiagalelei passed for 284 yards and a touchdown, ran for a touchdown, and the Beavers (3-0) sacked the Aztecs (2-2) six times in a sellout crowd of 35,591 at Reser Stadium.

In his third game as OSU's starting quarterback after transferring from Clemson, Uiagalelei completed 14 of 30 passes and had two interceptions. It was the first two turnovers of the season for Oregon State, which had combined to outscore its opponents, 97-24, over its first two games prior to playing SDSU.

Damien Martinez anchored the Beaver running game with 102 yards on 15 carries. San Diego State running back Jaylon Armstead scored on a 6-yard run with 9:01 remaining for the first Aztec touchdown of the game. SDSU got the ball back when Cedarius Barfield picked off Uiagalelei on the San Diego State 43. The Aztecs then went 57 plays on nine plays, ending with the Armstead TD run. The 2-point conversion pass failed, however, and OSU maintained a two-score lead at 19-9.

Oregon State answered when Anthony Gould turned Uiagalelei's short pass into a 75-yard touchdown and a 26-9 advantage.

SDSU quarterback Jalen Mayden led a drive inside the Beavers' 10-yard line, but safety Akili Arnold's interception in the end zone at the 5:40 mark.

San Diego State got the ball back on Noah Tumblin's second interception of the season. The Aztecs got into OSU territory for the ninth and final time, but Jack Browning's 49-yard field goal attempt to cut the lead to two scores sailed left.

Oregon State then ran out the clock for its seventh consecutive victory, its longest streak since 2000. That team went 11-1, defeated Notre Dame in the Fiesta Bowl, and finished No. 4 in the final Associated Press poll.

Earlier, Beaver wide receiver Silas Bolden came up big on an 84-yard scoring drive that extended the OSU lead to 19-3 at 7:40 of the third quarter. He caught a 31-yard pass, ran 18 yards on the next play on a fly sweep to the 1, setting up Uiagalelei's 1-yard touchdown run.

A 31-yard pass to tight end Jack Velling and a 35-yard strike to wide receiver Rhewa Muniyagi Jr. set up the game's first touchdown midway through the second quarter. Uiagalelei tossed a backward pass to left tackle Joshua Gray, who scored untouched from the 3-yard line to make it 12-0. It was the first rushing touchdown by an Oregon State offensive lineman since 1996.

Browning kicked a 52-yard field goal for the Aztecs with 44 seconds left in the second quarter to make it 12-3 at halftime. Browning is now 3-for-4 on 50-yard field goal chances for his career.

The first two Beaver scores came on field goals (48 and 44 yards) by Atticus Sappington. Mayden was 20 of 32 for 256 yards and an interception. Brionne Penny (six receptions) and Mark Redman (four receptions) each logged a career-high 77 receiving yards for SDSU, which was outgained, 475-326, for the game.

San Diego State was outgained on the ground, 191-70, primarily due to negative 50 yards in sacks against Mayden. Armstead rushed for a team-high 48 yards on 11 carries (4.4 avg.).

Zyrus Fiasueu led the Aztecs in tackles for a second straight game, coming up with seven stops and a tackle for loss.

Team Notes

- San Diego State lost its conference opener for just the third time in the last 11 years.
- The Aztecs fell to 9-2 in their last 11 Mountain West home openers.
- SDSU fell to 20-7 in games played in September since the start of the 2016 campaign.
- San Diego State dropped to 74-33 (.692) since the start of the 2015 season.
- The Aztecs saw their 13-game winning streak snapped and 14-game winning streak snapped under Brady Hoke when scoring at least 30 points. SDSU is now 22-3 under Hoke when scoring at least 30 points.
- San Diego State fell to 63-15 since 2015 when scoring at least 20 points (2-1 this year).
- The Aztecs fell to 2-1 on the season in games decided by eight points or less (14-10 under Brady Hoke).
- SDSU dropped to 1-1 on the year and 23-7 under Brady Hoke when scoring first.
- San Diego State fell to 1-1 on the season and 19-12 under Brady Hoke when leading after the first quarter.
- The Aztecs had a season-high 439 yards of total offense, slipping to 19-6 under Brady Hoke when gaining at least 400 yards.
- SDSU had more time of possession than its opponent for a fourth straight game. San Diego State is now 25-8 under Brady Hoke when outpossessing its opponent.
- The Aztecs had their 10-game winning streak snapped when having more first downs and more time of possession than their opponent. SDSU is now 21-3 when having more first downs and possessing the ball longer than its opponent.
- San Diego State had its highest passing yards per attempt (11.87) since a 12.20 mark at Arizona on Sept. 11, 2021.

Aztecs Edged by Boise State, 34-31

SAN DIEGO -- San Diego State opened its Mountain West schedule on a sour note, dropping a hard-fought 34-31 decision to Boise State at Snapdragon Stadium.

Missed tackles, untimely penalties and two crucial fumbles ultimately contributed to the Aztecs' downfall, despite the host school maintaining the edge in total offense (439-403) and time of possession (32:10 to 27:50).

However, SDSU was unable to contain the exploits of Bronco running back Ashton Jeanty, who rushed for 205 yards and two touchdowns on 23 carries, adding 49 yards on four receptions to account for nearly 63 percent of BS's output.

Quarterback Jaylen Mayden completed 16 of 22 passes for 241 yards and one touchdown for the Aztecs (2-3, 0-1 MW), running for another score to finish with a team-high 85 yards rushing in 16 attempts.

Wide receiver Baylin Brooks set a career high with 117 yards and one touchdown on five receptions, matching the production of Brionne Penny, who also made five grabs for 97 yards. Brooks became the first Aztec true freshman since Az Hakim in 1994 to record a 100-yard receiving game and just the fourth true freshman in SDSU's Division I history (since 1969).

However, Mayden twice turned the ball over, fumbling at the goal line on SDSU's opening possession before repeating the miscue later in the fourth quarter that led to a Bronco touchdown.

The Broncos (2-2, 1-0 MW) recorded just one first down on their first drive before Dez Malone returned the ensuing punt 36 yards, giving the Aztecs excellent field position at their own 48. Six plays later, Mayden threaded a pass to Brooks along the right sideline, as the true freshman sprinted 34 yards to the end zone for his first career touchdown that put the host school in front, 7-0, at the 7:37 mark of the first quarter.

On its first march of the second quarter, Boise State knotted the score with just over three minutes elapsed when Taylen Green connected with Eric McAlister in the left corner of the end zone on a 25-yard touchdown pass to cap a 5-play, 76-yard drive.

SDSU took advantage of a short field on its next foray, taking possession on its own 45-yard line following an unsuccessful squib kick, as the Broncos looked to catch the Aztecs by surprise. After a 37-yard completion to Brooks down to the Boise State 10, however, the drive stalled, forcing the Scarlet and Black to settle for a 22-yard field goal by Jack Browning, which put the hosts back on top, 10-7, at the 9:13 mark.

Boise State needed just four plays to take the lead, as Jeanty burst up the middle and broke away for a 58-yard touchdown scamper with 7:13 left in the period.

SDSU responded on its ensuing drive, advancing 75 yards in seven plays to vault back in front, 17-14, on a 2-yard run by Jaylon Armstead.

However, the lead proved to be short-lived, as Boise State tied the score on a 29-yard field goal by Jonah Dalmas with just 22 seconds before intermission to cap an 11-play, 72-yard march.

Boise State answered a missed field goal by the Aztecs with a 27-yard Dalmas field goal with 4:52 left in the third quarter.

On the first snap of the Aztecs' next possession, Jayden Virgin recovered a Mayden fumble at the SDSU 26. Four plays later, Green sprinted around left end on third-and-goal from the 10, giving the visitors a 27-17 advantage with 3:05 to go in the period.

The Aztecs answered with their longest drive of the season, marching 92 yards in 10 plays, punctuated by Armstead's 10-yard blast up the middle on the second play of the fourth quarter that trimmed the margin to 27-24.

The teams exchanged punts before Boise State put the game essentially out of reach with Jeanty's 6-yard touchdown run with 2:02 left on the clock.

SDSU fought to the end with a 72-yard march in seven plays, culminating in Mayden's 10-yard touchdown run, which narrowed the gap to 34-31 with just 42 seconds remaining. However, the Broncos ran out the clock after recovering the ensuing onside kick.

Posted a season-best 179.7 passer rating ... Threw a 34-yard passing touchdown to Baylin Brooks for the first score of the game ... Recorded a season-long 37-yard pass, also to Brooks, ultimately leading to an Aztec field goal in the first quarter ... On the ground, ran for 85 yards on a career-high 16 carries (5.3 avg.) with his third rushing touchdown of the season ... His rushing touchdown was the final score of the game, a 10-yard run in the fourth quarter ... Ranked eighth among FBS quarterbacks by Pro Football Focus' passing grades (min. 20 dropbacks).
- **2022 (Senior):** Was named a honorable-mention all-Mountain West selection at quarterback, despite playing only the final seven games at the position ... Became the first Aztec quarterback since Ryan Lindley in 2010 (second team) to earn all-MW honors ... Also was a second-team selection at the 'Flex' position by College Football Network ... Was the recipient of the team's John Simcox Memorial Trophy for the offensive player of the year, the first quarterback to win the prestigious award since current Minnesota Vikings head coach Kevin O'Connell in 2007 ...

Also was named the team's offensive player of the year (Byron H. Chase Memorial Trophy) ... Played in all 13 games on the season, the first five on defense and special teams, and the last eight as the team's quarterback ... Played 81 snaps on defense and 523 snaps on offense ... Had nine tackles (four solo) on defense ... On offense was 141-for-237 (59.5 pct.) for 2,031 yards and 12 touchdowns (also 10 interceptions), owning a 139.7 pass efficiency rating ... Also rushed for 231 yards with three touchdowns on 69 carries (3.3 avg.) ... An Aztec quarterback has now won his starting debut in six of the last eight tries. SDSU quarterbacks were 1-13 in the previous 14 debuts prior to this stretch ... Made his first career start at quarterback after playing safety for 65 snaps just two weeks prior against Toledo ... Set career highs in passing yards, completions, attempts, long pass and carries ... Threw his second career touchdown pass ... Was named the team's offensive player of the game ... Earned the start at Nevada on Oct. 22, going 12-for-25 for 156 yards ... Also rushed seven times for a career-high 50 yards, including a 32-yard touchdown which put the Aztecs up, 23-7, with 5:29 left in the third quarter, the final points of the game ... passes in four straight games) ... Threw for 309 yards and two touchdowns (and three interceptions) against Middle Tennessee in the EasyPost Hawai'i Bowl on Dec. 24, going 19-for-43 ... Fell to 5-3 as the team's starting quarterback ... Had multiple touchdown passes for the fifth straight game ... Now has 12 touchdown passes on the season and 13 for his career ... Had a career-long 73-yard pass for a touchdown to Kenan Christon ... Recorded his second career 300-yard passing game ... Also rushed for 36 yards on 12 carries ... Set career highs in passing attempts (43).
