SDSU Tries For Its Second Consecutive Win As It Concludes Its Longest Homestand Of The Season, Then Hits The Road For MWC Action

• The 37th-ranked San Diego State women's tennis team closes out its longest homestand of the season Tuesday when it hosts Ohio State at SDSU Tennis Stadium. The Aztecs are coming off a win over No. 53 Tulsa that snapped their two-match slide and gave them a record of 4-2 on the homestand.

After the Ohio State match, SDSU travels to Sin City for the beginning of Mountain West Conference play. On Thursday, the Aztecs will face the Air Force Academy, followed by No. 32 UNLV and 47th-ranked New Mexico on Friday and Saturday, respectively. All three matches are slated for a 10 a.m. start.

Once conference play opens up, SDSU will not be in action until April 6 when it hosts Pepperdine.

Weekly Wrap Up

• The Aztecs snapped their two-match losing streak by defeating Tulsa last Tuesday, 4-3, at SDSU Tennis Stadium. SDSU earned the doubles point by sweeping all three matches despite playing with two different combinations. Indra Erichsen and Nina Spaeth, along with Andrea Hermansen and Eliska Krausova, played together for the first time, with both duos winning at Nos. 1 and 3. The only constant was Dita Hauerlandova and Alesya Vidov playing at No. 2 and they, too, won their match.

In singles, Tulsa won at Nos. 1 and 4 to take a 2-1 match lead, but Nina Spaeth recorded her eighth consecutive victory to tie it at 2-2. Tulsa responded with a win at three, but Krausova won her match at five to knot the contest at 3-3.

In the deciding match, Hauerlandova and Lisette Pereira duked it out, with the SDSU junior taking the first set, 7-6. In the second, Pereira went up 4-3, but Hauerlandova won three straight games to win the match and give the Aztecs the 4-3 victory.

Super Spaeth

• Freshman Nina Spaeth is making a real case for MWC freshman of the year honors. Consider this: she currently owns an eight-match winning streak with a

record of 5-1 at No. 5 and a 5-0 record at No. 6., she is 10-1 this spring and 12-2 for the 2004-05 season, and with Sisse Nielsen as her doubles partner, the duo has gone on to post a 6-4 spring record at No. 3.

Good FOURtune

• Earlier this season, SDSU enjoyed a four-match winning streak with three of them coming against nationally-ranked teams. Winning four in a row has been a good omen for Aztec teams in the past. Since 1994, SDSU has posted wins of four or more in a row in every year except 1994, 2000 and 2004.

In those years in which it enjoyed streaks of four or more, SDSU went deep into the conference tournament and/or qualified for the NCAA Tournament.

The last time the Aztecs won four or more consecutive was in 2003. That team had streaks of eight and five wins in a row, including four straight on two occasions and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

Scouting Ohio State

• Ohio State comes into the San Diego State match with a record of 5-9 having lost its last match against TCU, 5-2. This will be just the third Buckeye road match of the season as they have gone 1-1 in matches played away from Columbus.

The Buckeyes are led by Sonia Ruzimovsky who is 8-2 in dual matches this season with all of her matches coming at Nos. 4-6. She leads the team in wins this season with 18.

This is only the second time these two schools have met with the Aztecs owning a 1-0 record.

Scouting Air Force

• Air Force heads into the MWC opener with a record of 8-6 (as of March 21). The Falcons are led by Kat Bushey who primarily plays at No. 1 and has a record of 12-8 this season.

This is the seventh all-time meeting between the conference mates, with SDSU winning all seven times, including last season's 4-3 victory.

Scouting UNLV

• UNLV boasts a No. 32 ITA Ranking and is 7-4 (as of March 21) on the season having lost to No. 7 Duke, 5-2, last Friday. The Rebels are led by No. 29 Elena Gantcheva who is 25-3 this season.

Last season, the Aztecs fell to the Rebels, 5-2, in San Diego, but hold the all-time series lead, 10-8.

Scouting New Mexico

• No. 47 New Mexico is 8-7 on the season having lost its last match with 40th-ranked Sacramento State 4-3. The Lobos have been a streaky team all season after losing its first three, winning its next four, losing the following three, being victorious the three after that, before losing to the Hornets. New Mexico is led by its two ranked players in No. 56 Iva Gersic and No. 66 Maja Kovacek.

SDSU is 14-5 all-time against the Lobos, including losing once during the regular season and in the MWC Championship semifinal match.

SDSU Looks To Rebound From Loss When It Travels To Hawaii For The Aloha Rainbow Classic

• Coming off of Sunday's loss at Long Beach State, San Diego State (9-10, 2-6 Mountain Pacific Sports Federation) will look to get back into the win column when it takes on Cal Baptist (11-4) and Canada at the Aloha Rainbow Classic in Hawaii.

The Aztecs will take on the Lancers at 2:30 HT on March 26 and follow it up with two exhibitions against Team Canada on March 27. The pair of games against Canada are scheduled for 10 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. HT starts.

After the weekend's three contests, SDSU will remain in Hawaii for an MPSF game on March 30 against Hawaii. That game is slated for a 4:30 p.m. HT start.

Weekly Recap

• After playing five games in four days two weeks ago, San Diego State had a week off before hitting the road and taking on Long Beach State Sunday afternoon.

The Aztecs were shutout, 4-0, in the first half thanks to a pair of Long Beach State goals by Cassie Azevedo and goals from Drue Wawrzynski and Robyn Gordin.

But Stacy Werner scored on SDSU's first two possessions of the third quarter to bring the Aztecs to within two. Later, Rachel Serna found the back of the net to cut the 49er advantage to one going into the fourth quarter.

In the final period, Long Beach State received a second goal from Gordin to make the score 5-3. Werner recorded her second hat trick of the season when she put one past 49er goalie Bri Hawkins to pull the Aztecs within a goal, but LBSU's Jeanine Jackson scored with 1:04 remaining to end the threat.

Elana Cervantes added a goal of her own with 48 seconds left to give the game its final score.

Goalkeeper Sarah Kilgore made seven saves, including three in the fourth quarter, in a losing effort for the Aztecs.

Serna Says Score

• Junior driver Rachel Serna leads the team in scoring through 19 games of the 2005 season. So far, Serna has scored 35 goals and has netted a goal in 17 of 19 games this season.

In 2004, the Coronado native tallied just 15 goals in 70 attempts. For her career, Serna had 23 goals in her two seasons on Montezuma Mesa.

Scouting the Lancers

• Cal Baptist comes into the game with SDSU on a bit of a roll having won its last eight contests. In those eight games, the Lancers have averaged 9.5 goals a game while only allowing 5.3. During their winning streak, they have beat MPSF schools and SDSU opponents, Pacific and Cal State Northridge, along with Bucknell and Pomona-Pitzer.

The Lancers have six players who have recorded double-digit scoring seasons thus far, but junior Cheryl Ogden leads the team with 41 goals.

In goal for Cal Baptist is sophomore Kasey Weaver who has made 162 saves to date.

Series History vs. Cal Baptist

• The Aztecs hold a 7-2 all-time series advantage against the Lancers. SDSU has won five in a row in the series, including last year's season-opening 6-5 triumph at the UCSD Invitational (Feb. 7) and its 11-2 victory in San Diego (April 24).

See-Saw Season

• After defeating Princeton March 13 and losing Sunday at Long Beach State, the win one, lose one trend epitomizes the 2005 season. This year has been so up and down it's comparable to a see-saw. The Aztecs have not won more than two in a row this season and have been winners of two straight only twice this year. They did it to begin the season with victories over Cal State Bakersfield and UC Davis and did it versus Michigan and at Pacific. Besides those two cases, it's been one up and one down for the Aztecs all year long.

Road Warriors

• Before hosting UC Irvine March 10, the Aztecs had never played their first 13 games on the road to start the season. The last time an SDSU team played nearly as many on the road as this year's team has was back in 1999 when it played it first 11 away from America's Finest City.

So far this season, 14 of the team's 19 games have been away from the Kroc Community Center and it doesn't get much easier with a road trip to Hawaii coming up this week. But after the trip to the nation's 50th state, the Aztecs return home for three, before heading to Long Beach for the LBSU Invitational and then closing out the regular season with two home games versus UCSD and Arizona State.

Aztecs In The State Of Hawaii

• The Aztecs are 1-4 all-time in the state of Hawaii and will be looking to reverse the trend this week. SDSU has made the trip to the nation's 50th state on three previous occasions.

Back in 1999, the Aztecs played in the Hawai'i Invitational and went 1-2, losing to Southern California, defeating Long Beach State and losing to the host Hawai'i.

SDSU also lost regular season games in 2001 (L, 4-9) and in 2003 (L, 3-4) to Hawai'i.

Aztecs Head East For Florida Relays

• After a successful home opener, the San Diego State track and field squad heads east to the University of Florida for the 62nd Annual Coca-Cola Florida Relays, March 24-26, at the Percy Beard Track and Field Complex in Gainesville, Fla.

• The Florida Relays boasts some of the top prep and collegiate talent from around the nation. Last year, Clemson, Georgia Tech, Indiana and South Carolina made the trip south to join Miami, Florida State and the host Gators in the competitive field. Florida, South Carolina, Georgia and Miami each finished in the top-10 at the 2004 NCAA outdoor meet.

• The meet actually begins Wed., March 24, with the heptathlon and decathlon. Thursday's action is slated for a 9:30 a.m. EST start, while the last two days of the meet both kick-off at 9 a.m.

Flashback: 2004 Florida Relays

• In its first outdoor meet away from America's Finest City, the SDSU track and field team performed very well at the 61st Annual Coca-Cola Florida Relays. Marie Nilsson kicked things off on the first day (Friday) of the meet, running the fastest time by an Aztec in the 5,000 meters since the 1982 season, placing second overall in 16:43.56. The NCAA regional qualifying time put her fifth on the SDSU all-time list.

The following day, the Aztecs' 4x200 relay of Larnie Boyd, Bianca McNair, Tonette Dyer and Hollann Givens placed fourth in the field of 19, crossing the finish line in 1:35.98, fifth fastest in school history and three seconds off the SDSU record of 1:32.99.

Also on Saturday, Shayla Balentine tied for fourth in the pole vault by clearing 12-3.50 and Jamillah Titus came in fifth in the 800 with the team's top time of the season (2:11.43).

Aztec All-American Tonette Dyer won the 100 meters on Sunday with a wind-aided time of 11.44. The team's distance medley relay of Boyd, Givens, Nicole Carmier and Nilsson logged the other first-place finish for the team, beating the field of nine other squads in 11:37.77. The time was the second-fastest in school history and was over 16 seconds faster than SDSU's effort of 11:53.59 at the 2003 Florida Relays.

The Aztecs also boasted matching fourth places in the 4x100 (45.56) and 4x400 (3:38.39) relays both in NCAA regional qualifying efforts.

Rewind: 27th Annual Aztec Classic

• The San Diego State track and field team claimed three event titles in its only home meet of the year Saturday at the 26th annual Aztec Track & Field Classic at the SDSU Sports Deck. Seniors Shayla Balentine and Heather Heron also posted NCAA

regional qualifying marks in their respective events.

Balentine broke her own school record in the pole vault, clearing 13 feet, 4 1/4 inches, to win her second consecutive Aztec Classic pole vault title. The mark bettered last year's winning jump (12-4 1/2) by almost one foot.

Not to be outdone, Heron took first in a competitive 100-meter hurdle field, which included 2004 Olympic Trial semifinalist Tanisha Mills, with a time of 13.70 seconds. Heron also earned a second-place finish in the 400 hurdles (1:04.52).

Junior Nicole Carmier tied for first in the high jump (5-7) and also placed in the top-three in the 800 (second place, 2:10.84) and 400 (third, 56.30) for the Aztecs.

SDSU also performed well in the mid-distance and distance events on Saturday, led by senior Marie Nilsson and sophomore Lisa Naucler. Nilsson finished second in the 3,000 (9:59.65) and was third in the 1,500 (4:40.88), while Naucler took second in the 1,500 (4:39.44) and fourth in the 800 (2:14.39).

In other distance action, the trio of sophomore Lital Azulay, and juniors Christal Cuadra and Christian Fairing finished 3-4-5 in the 3,000 with times of 10:12.85, 10:29.30 and 10:41.51, respectively.

In the field events, sophomore Janine Polischuk earned a second-place finish in the javelin with a toss of 127-6 and freshman Monica Pacas was second in the pole vault (12-0 1/2).

Other Aztec highlights included senior Jennifer Greene's third-place leap in the triple jump (26-7 3/4), junior Jamillah Titus in the high jump (second, 5-5) and the third-place finish by the 4x100 (Vonnie Fulford, Tori Respass-Parsons, Heron and Sherraine Pencil) relay team (47.15).

SDSU Heads North To Oregon Duck Invitational

The San Diego State women's golf team travels to the Pacific Northwest this week for the 2005 Oregon Duck Invitational in Junction City, Ore., March 21-22. The 48-hole tournament will be held at the par-72, 6,103-yard Shadow Hills Country Club about 17 miles northwest of Eugene, Ore.

The Aztecs will be facing their toughest competition in the spring thus far with four teams ranked in the *Golfweek/Sagarin* Top 30. Highlighting the field are No. 4 Washington, No. 20 Stanford, No. 23 Washington State and No. 29 California. Mountain West Conference foe Wyoming will also be among the 16-team field.

The first 36 holes will be played on Monday, with the final 18 holes on Tuesday. An 8:00 a.m. (PST) shotgun start is scheduled for both days.

Duck, Duck, Duck

The Aztecs return to the Oregon Duck Invitational after a one-year absence. SDSU competed in both the 2002 and 2003 tournaments, highlighted by a team runner-up finish in 2003.

Former standout Shayna Miyajima, who graduated a year ago, placed second overall in 2003 with a seven-over 223. Miyajima and Heather Rollo were the top Aztecs in 2002, tying for 19th with matching scores of 12-over par 228.

The only Aztec on the current roster to compete in either invitational is senior **Toni Lutz (Anaheim, Calif.)**, who carded a 24-over 240 in 2003, tying for 36th place.

Rewind: Dr. Thompson Invitational

The San Diego State women's golf team came in seventh overall with a 54-hole score of 1049 (+185) at the Donniss Thompson Invitational in Kaneohe, Hawaii last week. The Aztecs were just one stroke away from tying for sixth with Weber State, while No. 22 Washington State claimed the team title with a 976 at the challenging par-72, 5,829-yard Kaneohe Klipper Golf Course.

The Aztecs were led by freshman Jackie Kazarian, who tied

for 18th place, marking the second time in two events that she has finished in the top 20. Kazarian ended the tournament at 40-over 256, including a 90 in the third and final round.

Kazarian's classmate, Anna Booth, was just two strokes behind her with a 258 to tie for 21st on the individual leader board.

Senior Megan Mulhaupt notched the team's low round of the day with an 85 to vault from 40th into a tie for 35th place with a 270. Freshman MacKenzie Swecker also logged her best performance of the tournament in the final 18 holes with a 18-over 90 to come in 44th. Sophomore Jamie Oliver rounded out the SDSU competitors with a 97 in the third round for a 56-over par 273.

Senior co-captain **Veronica Ojeda (San Diego, Calif.)**, competing as an individual, tied for 27th place with a 261 (+45), including a third round score of 90.

Roster Notes

Aztec senior Cameron MacFarland, who participated in one tournament this past fall, earned her degree in December and will not compete in the spring ... senior Heather MacRae and newcomer freshman **Megan McLeod (Fallbrook, Calif.)** are not expected to see action in spring 2005 ... this year's spring SDSU roster is at both extremes when it comes to class levels. The Aztecs have four seniors, no juniors, one sophomore and five freshmen.

New For Spring

The Aztecs take a week off before making their annual trip to St. George, Utah (April 3-5) for the BYU Dixie Classic. The tournament is SDSU's final tune-up prior to the Mountain West Conference championships, which are slated for April 21-23 in Sunriver, Ore.

The NCAA West Regionals take place in Las Cruces, N.M., May 5-7, while the Aztecs hope to make a return trip to Sunriver for the NCAA championships, May 17-20.

Recapping 2003-04

- SDSU made the program's first trip to the NCAA tournament since 2001 and its third trip overall.

- SDSU ended the year ranked No. 40 in the *Golfweek/Sagarin* rankings after placing fourth at the MWC championships.

- SDSU earned their first win in three years during the fall when they set a school record by shooting 878 to win the Lady Aztec Invitational. SDSU has also recorded two runner-up finishes and was in the top four in four of its last five outings.

Head Coach Felicia Brown

Head coach Felicia Brown is in her third season at the helm of the SDSU golf program after serving as an assistant in 2001-02. A native San Diegan, Brown prepped locally at San Marcos High School before playing collegiately at Arizona.

She is assisted by Doug Barba for the second year in a row.
