Four-Game Week Up Next For Aztec Basketball Beginning Tuesday Against USD

The San Diego State women's basketball team will play its first of four games over the next six days when it makes the trip across town to face the University of San Diego on Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. PT at the Jenny Craig Pavilion.

This is the seventh straight meeting between the two sides, after taking a six-year break in the series between 1996 and 2002. Since the restart of the series, USD has come away with five wins, however, a year ago, SDSU put an end to that streak with a five-point victory at Cox Arena.

This year's edition will be televised live locally on Channel 4 San Diego with Paula Bott (play-by-play) and Susie Barosso (color) calling the action. A live audio feed with Chris Ello and live stats will also be available on goaztecs.com.

Aztecs Fall To Consensus No. 1 UConn

Junior **Jené Morris (San Francisco, Calif.)** had a team-best 17 points, but the Aztec defense was unable to stop the high-powered UConn offense, as the San Diego State women's basketball team fell to the consensus No. 1 team in the country, 99-55, at the XL Center in Hartford, Conn. SDSU dropped its first game of the season to fall to 2-1 overall, while the Huskies improved to 2-0, as the two schools met for the second consecutive year.

Morris was the only SDSU player in double-figures, as the junior also added a team-best three steals and five offensive rebounds. Sophomore **Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.)** had nine points and two blocked shots, while junior **Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** had six assists, but was just 1-for-5 from the floor.

The Aztecs never led in the game as UConn got out to a 7-0 run, before freshman Lindsay Leo scored a pair of free throws to put the visitors down 7-2. The Huskies answered with a lay-up and would go up by 10 at the 15:53 mark. SDSU also trailed by 10 at the mid-way point of the half, but were down 56-27 heading into the break with the help of a 10-0 run.

The Huskies added to that huge lead coming out of the locker room, outscoring the Aztecs 14-0, and eventually went on to post a 99-55 victory.

Other UConn Notes

- With the addition of Morris in place of **Coco Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)**, SDSU used its second different starting line-up of the season.

- The 99 points are the Aztecs most points allowed in a game since giving up 104 vs. UCLA in 1998.

- With the addition of Morris and sophomore **Allison Duffy (Lakeside, Calif.)**, 14 Aztecs have seen playing time this season. SDSU had just 11 players log minutes a year ago, 12 in 2006-07 and 15 in 2005-06.

A Tough Road Ahead

The Aztecs are in the midst of a six-game road swing, their longest of the season. SDSU played at LBSU on Sunday, Nov. 16, and were out on the East Coast last Thursday for a meeting with the consensus No. 1 team in the nation in the University of Connecticut.

The Aztecs returned from Connecticut late Friday night and are in town, but playing away from home, on Tuesday at USD. They will then jump on a plane Wednesday morning to prepare for three games in three days at the Waikiki Beach Marriott Classic, Nov. 28-30.

Between the flight to and from Connecticut (4,890 miles) and back and forth to Hawaii (5,220 miles), the Aztecs will log 10,110 miles through the air in a span of 13 days.

The six-straight road games is SDSU's longest stint away from home since 1994-95, when the Aztecs also played six in a row from Dec. 28-Jan. 14.

On The Offensive Glass

While UConn owned a +8 margin on the boards last Thursday night, the Aztec actually outrebounded them 16-12 on the offensive glass. SDSU currently ranks first in the Mountain West Conference in offensive rebounding by a wide margin with 19.33 per outing. The next best is Colorado State at 16.33 per game.

A year ago, SDSU ranked last in the MWC in rebounding margin in 2007-08, at -3.0 per outing. The team only outrebounded an opponent 11 times in 31 contests.

Block Party 2008-09 Edition

San Diego State had four blocked shots against No. 1 UConn last week, giving the team 25 by eight different players in just three games in 2008-09.

SDSU rejected a record 15 shots against Northwestern State, the most ever by a Mountain West Conference team in the league's 10-year history. The Aztecs beat the previous mark of 14 held by New Mexico and the next best performance in the MWC this season is eight by the Lobos.

A year ago, the Aztecs ranked second in the MWC and 46th nationally with 4.35 per outing.

Paris' Party

Of SDSU's 25 blocks in the three outings, 11 were credited to sophomore center Paris Johnson. Johnson had five in the opener with Northwestern State to tie for 10th on the SDSU single-game list. The five trail her career-best of six vs. TCU in the 2008 MWC tournament.

Johnson now has 65 for her career in just two short seasons. She needs just two more to tie for 10th in Aztec career history and is already in the top 20 in the league record book.

In 2008-09, Johnson is first in the league in blocked shots with 3.67 per game. Her 11 blocks are six more than any other MWC player.

The 6-4 center led the conference in blocks per game with 1.74 in 2007-09, following in the footsteps of her sister, Desiree, who ranked first in the MWC in both 2005-06 and 2006-07.



The Dish On Q

Just three games into her third campaign in the Red & Black, Aztec junior guard Quenese Davis has 329 career assists, including 17 this year. Davis needs 13 more helpers to move from seventh to sixth in the Aztec record book, surpassing Jamey Cox, who tallied 341 from 2000-03.

Davis is the MWC returning assists leader and is leading in that category again this year with 5.67 per outing. She also is tops in steals per game with 3.33.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over the USD will mean:

►SDSU has won at least three of its first four games of a season for the 14th time in program history, but just the third occasion in the last decade.

►SDSU snaps a three-game losing streak in games played at USD ... The Aztecs improved to 26-6 all-time against the Toreros and 10-3 at USD.

►SDSU head coach Beth Burns improves to 9-3 all-time vs. the Toreros.

►SDSU is 1-1 against teams it also faced last season.

►SDSU is 1-1 against schools that advanced to last year's NCAA tournament.

USD Tid-Bits

Both schools are coming off of losses in their most recent outings, as the Toreros fell to Cal Poly on Saturday, 70-64 ... USD is led by fifth-year senior center Amber Sprague, who is averaging 19.0 points and eight rebounds per contest ... Sprague also has 10 blocked shots and is shooting 90.9 percent from the free-throw line ... Kiva Herman is the team's second-leading scorer with 13.3 points per game and 6.8 rebounds an outing ... Sprague and Herman are the only two Toreros to average in double-figures ... Sam Child and Morgan Henderson have both started all four games along with Herman and Sprague ... Three other USD players have logged a start this year ... The Toreros return four starters from their 2007-08 squad that advanced to the NCAAs and posted a 19-13 mark ... USD head coach Cindy Fisher used to be the head coach at Wyoming, while Nya Mason played at Colorado State.

USD Rewind 2007

The San Diego State women's basketball team won their fourth straight and remained perfect at home following a tough 58-53 victory over University of San Diego at Cox Arena. The Aztecs won for the first time in their last six meetings with the Toreros.

SDSU redshirt freshman Allison Duffy led the Aztecs in both scoring and rebounding with 14 points and six boards. Freshman center Paris Johnson and sophomore guard Quenese Davis both reached double-figures with 10 and 11 points, respectively. Davis had a game-high seven assists, while classmate Jené Morris contributed four of the Aztecs' 13 steals in just 18 minutes of action.

USD's Sam Child began the game with the hot hand, scoring each of her team's first nine points as the Toreros led by four early at 9-5. The visitors were up by as many as five at 16-11, before the Aztecs came storming back with an 8-2 run to take their first lead of the night at 19-18. The advantage changed hands two more times, before SDSU headed into the locker room up four at 29-25.

After a bucket by Torero Kiva Herman to open the second half, SDSU scored 11 unanswered points to build its largest lead of the evening at 40-27. USD would get to within three points on two occasions, including as late as 39 seconds remaining and the score 56-53. After securing a critical defensive rebound, Davis made both of her free-throw shots with 10 seconds left, as the Aztecs claimed the 58-53 win.

San Diego State held USD without a three-point field goal, as the Toreros were 0-for-4 from beyond the arc, compared to the Aztecs' 4-for-9 performance, three of which came in the second half. USD is the second SDSU opponent this season to fail to record a three-pointer, as Southern Utah also went without a triple.

Other 2008-09 Notes

- The Aztecs' 50 rebounds against Northwestern State are program's most since 2000, when they also had 50 against Northern Arizona.

- Jerica Williams' 14 boards vs. Northwestern State are the most in Beth Burns' second stint as head coach and most overall since Ashlee Dunlap had 17 at Washington State on Dec. 22, 2003.

- Jerica Williams scored 23 points at Long Beach State. SDSU now has six players who have at least one 20-point scoring game in their career.

- Aztec sophomore Paris Johnson had a pair of double-doubles in her opening two games of the season with 14 points and 12 boards against both Northwestern State and Long Beach State.

Strength Of Schedule

SDSU's current 2008-09 schedule includes four teams ranked in the Associated Press top 25 in No. 1 UConn, No. 11 Texas, No. 22 TCU and No. 25 Iowa State. Utah, who the Aztecs face twice, is also receiving votes in this week's poll.

San Diego State also has 13 games scheduled versus schools who advanced to either the NCAA tournament or WNIT in 2008.

Preseason Points

The San Diego State women's basketball team, which advanced to last season's league championship game, was picked to finish second in the Mountain West Conference in 2009 in a vote by the MWC's nine head coaches and select media members released Oct. 14, at

the conference's annual media day in Las Vegas, Nev.

The Aztecs earned six of the 26 first-place votes and garnered 184 points overall, trailing first place Utah, who had 16 first-place votes, by 22 points. The second-place projection is four spots higher than SDSU's previous best placing in the pre-season poll when the team was selected sixth in both 1999-2000 and 2003-04.

Behind SDSU in the preseason poll is TCU (161 pts.) and New Mexico (148 pts.), who each garnered a pair of first-place votes. BYU, Wyoming, UNLV, Colorado State and Air Force rounded out the nine-team poll.

In addition, two Aztecs, Jené Morris and Paris Johnson were selected to the five-player preseason all-Mountain West Conference team.

Dixon Named Team Captain



Senior guard **LaSandra Dixon (Azusa, Calif.)** will serve as the team's captain for the 2008-09 season.

Dixon started eight games last season, including all three at the Mountain West Conference Championships. She averaged a career-high 2.8 rebounds per game and also collected 26 assists and 24 steals, also career bests. She was one of nine Aztecs to score 10 or more points in at least one game a year ago.

A scholar-athlete, who is majoring in social science, Dixon has appeared in 71 games in her four seasons.

Back Again

San Diego State returns its entire starting line-up from the final eight games of last season, including senior guard LaSandra Dixon, junior guards Quenese Davis and Jené Morris and the front court tandem of sophomore forward Allison Duffy and center Paris Johnson.

Both Duffy and Johnson were honorable mention all-MWC picks after ranking one-two in the league in scoring among freshmen, while Morris was a second-team

Davis enters the year seventh in school history in career assists (312) after starting all but one game over the last two seasons. Dixon, the team's lone fourth-year player, has been a spark, especially on defense.

Besides the starting five, head coach Beth Burns, entering her fourth year of her second stint, welcomes back two other letterwinners in sophomore guard Coco Davis and junior guard **Kim Spinardi (Merced, Calif.)**. Senior forward Jennifer Layton-Bailes also returns to the fold after a one-year absence and UCLA transfer Jerica Williams is eligible to compete to help give the guard positions some depth.

Noting The Newcomers

All six of the Aztec newcomers play in the front court and are at least six-feet tall. Four of the six were McDonald's All-America nominees last season and each comes from a successful prep program.

Baylor transfer, junior **Jessika Bradley (Sacramento, Calif.)**, will not be eligible to play this season, but will be an asset to the team in practice.

Aztecs Sign Two Guards TO NLI's

San Diego State head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Wednesday of two, 5-9 guards, **Ashley Duffy (Lakeside, Calif.)** and **Kiyana Stamps (Moreno Valley, Calif.)**, to National Letters of Intent. The pair will join the Aztecs in 2009.

Three Added To Aztecs Staff

Two assistant coaches, Shanelle Stires and Fred Chmiel, begin their first seasons with the Aztecs in 2008-09. In addition, former SDSU men's basketball student manager, Jorge Cerna, joined the staff as director of player development.

2007-08 Rewind

The San Diego State women's basketball team posted its best season in over a decade in 2007-08, compiling an 18-13 record and advancing to the championship game of the Mountain West Conference tournament.

Below are a few of the accomplishments of last year's team:

- ◆ Posted the program's first winning season and most victories since 1996-97.
- ◆ Advanced to its first MWC championship game and became the highest seed to do so in conference tournament history.
- ◆ Logged its first-ever MWC championship victories and its first conference tournament wins since 1997.
- ◆ Recorded the program's most-ever MWC wins (7) and highest-ever MWC regular-season finish (t-5th).
- ◆ Beat BYU for the first time since 2001, won in Las Vegas for the first time since 1997, won at Colorado State for the first time since 2000 and defeated TCU for the first time since it joined the MWC in 2006.

Last Year's Numbers

The Aztecs' success in 2007-08 also translated into big numbers in the stat columns. San Diego State, under head coach Beth Burns, has been known for its aggressive defense, but the team showed big improvements on the offensive side of the board, too. Here are some of the team's statistical highlights:

◆ SDSU led the MWC in assists (15.71/g), steals (12.61/g) and turnover margin (+5.81), while ranking second in field-goal percentage (.418) and blocked shots (4.35/g). The Aztecs' 391 steals and +5.81 turnover margin were both easily conference records.

◆ SDSU ended the year ranked eighth nationally in steals per game and 27th in assists per outing.

◆ The Aztecs had 10 or more steals in 22 of 31 games and forced 20 or more opponent turnovers in 25 of 31 contests, including 30 or more six times.

◆ Nine of the Aztecs' 18 wins were by 20 points or more. In 2006-07, none of the team's 12 victories were by more than 13. SDSU averaged 65 points per outing after putting in only 56.1 points a game in 2006-07.

A Memorable Run

While the 2007-08 campaign could have already been deemed a success prior to the start of the conference tournament, no one could have predicted the Aztecs' memorable run in Las Vegas last March.

Seeded sixth out of the nine schools, SDSU entered the week having never won a conference tournament game in the previous eight years of the event's existence.

The Aztecs not only claimed their first MWC championship victory, they won twice en route to their first title game appearance, falling just four points short of a trip to the NCAAs.

SDSU opened the tournament with a 66-54 upset of a Wyoming squad that would go on to earn an NCAA berth. Behind Jené Morris' 21 points, Allison Duffy's double-double and Quenese Davis' nine assists, the Aztecs never trailed in the game to avenge two regular-season losses to the Cowgirls.

Two days after upsetting the No. 3 seed, SDSU took on second-seeded TCU, which it had never beaten since the Lady Frogs joined the MWC in 2006.

Trailing by one with only two seconds left on the shot clock, Davis in-bounded the ball off the back of a TCU player and scored the go-ahead layup with 18 seconds remaining. Morris then intercepted a Lady Frog pass at mid-court and made one of two free throws, as SDSU dodged two point-blank lay-ups at the buzzer to pull off the 69-67 win.

In the final vs. New Mexico, the Aztecs led for the majority of the game, but could not stop the play of Lobo seniors Dionne Marsh and Brandi Kimble down the stretch, as UNM won its second straight title with a 62-59 victory.

At Home Or On The Road

The 2007-08 Aztec team found success both on the road and at home, a big change from recent memory. SDSU had nine wins away from home, which was more than its combined total from the previous four years. Three of those nine road wins came during MWC play. Entering the year, the Aztecs had only won on the road during conference play a combined six times in the previous eight years of the league and had never even tallied two in the same season.

San Diego State's other nine victories came on its home court, where the team is 20-11 over the last two campaigns. The Aztecs' success translated into bigger home crowds as the single-game attendance record at Cox Arena was broken not once but twice against Cal

State Fullerton (2,397) and then vs. No. 2 UConn (5,271). Overall, SDSU logged its highest home season attendance since 1994-95 (15,638).

Tournament Town

San Diego State University and Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl will play host to the 2009 NCAA Women's Basketball First & Second Rounds, March 21 & 23.

SDSU was one of eight additional venues selected last February for 2009 by the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee, which voted to expand from eight to 16 first- and second-round sites, beginning next year.

This year's event in San Diego will feature four schools vying to advance to the NCAA regionals.

Cox Arena has served as the host site for three other NCAA championship events, including the 2001 and 2006 Men's Basketball First & Second Rounds and the 2001 Women's Volleyball Final Four, since the facility opened in the fall of 1997.

SDSU has played host to NCAA women's basketball games three times previously in Peterson Gym in 1984, 1994 and most recently in 1995.

TV Time

The Aztecs will have a record seven regular-season games televised either live or shown via tape delay in 2008-09. SDSU's game with UConn was shown on a tape delay basis on The Mtn., while the USD contest has been picked up by Channel 4 San Diego, and will be aired live at 7:30 p.m. PT.

The Aztecs will kick-off MWC play at home against Air Force on CBS College Sports. SDSU has three more conference outings live on The Mtn., followed by the contest at BYU, which will be rebroadcast on the The Mtn. at 7 p.m. PT on Feb. 26.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns



The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005.

In just four short years, she already has the program headed in the right direction, as the Aztecs' posted their best season in over a decade in 2007-08, going 18-13 overall and advancing to their first-ever MWC championship game.

Burns helped the Aztecs to a 7-9 mark in MWC play in 2008, to finish in a tie for fifth with Brigham Young. The Aztecs' seven league wins and fifth-place showing is their best-ever in the history of the MWC.

In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 17-year overall head coaching record of 267-202, while her mark school record stands at 186-137 over 12 seasons.

San Diego St. 67, Northwestern State 47

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team won its season-opener for the second consecutive year, defeating visiting Northwestern State, 67-47, at Cox Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs improved to 1-0 on the year, while the Lady Demons dropped to 0-1 following the two schools' first-ever meeting.

SDSU had four players finish in double-figure scoring and combined for 15 blocked shots, the most ever by a Mountain West Conference team in the league's 10-year history.

Aztec sophomore center Paris Johnson posted her fourth career double-double with a game-high 14 points and 12 rebounds to go with five blocked shots, which tie for 10th in the SDSU single-game record book. Sophomore Jerica Williams, playing in her first game in the Red & Black, posted nine points and 14 rebounds, 11 of which came in the first half. Williams' 14 boards are the most by an Aztec since December 2003.

Junior guard Quenese Davis added 13 points and eight assists. Sophomore Coco Davis had 11 points and senior Jennifer Layton-Bailes, playing in her first game since 2007, tallied 10 points and three blocks.

San Diego State never trailed in the game, going up by four points on three occasions, including at 12-8 with just over minutes left in the first half. The Aztecs increased that lead to six on a layup by Layton-Bailes, but the two sides failed to record a point over the next four minutes. Lady Demon Britany Kinlaw broke the stalemate with a jumper to put her team down by just four points at 14-10. Two Johnson free throws sparked an 8-0 SDSU run and the home team went into the locker room up by 13 at 28-15.

Northwestern State got to within 10 on three occasions coming out of the break, but the Aztecs matched the Lady Demons bucket for bucket, pulling away with a 20-point advantage at 49-29. SDSU never looked back, coasting to an eventual 20-point, 67-47, victory.

The Aztecs forced 30 Lady Demon turnovers and had 50 rebounds, the team's most in a single outing since 2000.

LONG BEACH, Calif. - The San Diego State women's basketball team had a 15-point first-half lead, but had to rally to survive a strong Long Beach State run, coming away with a 67-59 victory at the Pyramid in Long Beach, Calif. The Aztecs start the season 2-0 for the second year in row, while the 49ers dropped to 0-1 in the teams' first meeting since 1997.

Sophomore Jerica Williams had a career-best 23 points with 16 in the second half and three of the team's four triples. Sophomore center Paris Johnson had 14 points and 12 boards for the second outing in a row, posting her fifth career double-double to go with four blocked shots. Junior guard Quenese Davis was the third Aztec in double-figures, notching 16 points and a game-high five steals.

The host 49ers scored the first point of the afternoon on a free throw, the only time LBSU would lead during the game. The Aztecs countered with a Williams' three pointer and took a 4-1 advantage on a free throw. The Beach got back to within one on a fast break lay-up by Courtney Jacob.

Over the next seven minutes, SDSU held LBSU without a field goal, building an 18-3 lead, before the 49ers could finally break the string at the 9:52 mark. That 15-point advantage at 18-3 was the Aztecs' largest of the game, but LBSU was able to shave six points off that deficit and went into the break down by just nine, 31-22.

San Diego State pushed its lead back into double-figures on a Lindsay Leo jumper to open the second half at 33-22. The rest of the way was a battle, however, as the 49ers drew to within four at the 11:17 mark and the score 46-42.

Another three-pointer by Williams increased the SDSU advantage to seven and the visitor's were up by 10 at 60-50 and again at 67-57. The Aztecs finished out the game by making five of six free throws in the final 1:33 to come away with the 67-59 win.

HARTFORD, Conn. - Jené Morris had a team-best 17 points, but the Aztec defense was unable to stop the high-powered UConn offense, as the San Diego State women's basketball team fell to the consensus No. 1 team in the country, 99-55, at the XL Center in Hartford, Conn. SDSU dropped its first game of the season to fall to 2-1 overall, while the Huskies improved to 2-0, as the two schools met for the second consecutive year.

Morris was the only SDSU player in double-figures, as the junior also added a team-best three steals and five offensive rebounds. Sophomore Paris Johnson had nine points and two blocked shots, while junior Quenese Davis had six assists, but was just 1-for-5 from the floor.

The Aztecs never led in the game as UConn got out to a 7-0 run, before freshman Lindsay Leo scored a pair of free throws to put the visitor's down 7-2. The Huskies answered with a lay-up and would go up by 10 at the 15:53 mark. SDSU also trailed by 10 at the mid-way point of the half, but were down 56-27 heading into the break with the help of a 10-0 run.

The Huskies added to that huge lead coming out of the locker room, outscoring the Aztecs 14-0, and eventually went on to post a 99-55 victory.

UConn had five players in double-figures, including preseason All-American Maya Moore, who had 21 points, nine rebounds and six assists in just 25 minutes.
