A prototype wideout, who was a three-year starter ... Had 34 receptions in each of the last three seasons ... Had at least one catch in 25 of his final 26 games ... Served as one of the team's six captains in 2007 ... Passed the 1,000 mark in career receiving yardage against New Mexico, and currently has 1,603 yards ... 17 straight starts, before missing the Portland State, Cincinnati, Colorado State and Utah games.

2007: Played in eight games, starting six times ... Team's second-leading receiver with a career-best 35 catches for 679 yards and three touchdowns ... Ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference in receiving yards per league game (100.7) and was sixth in receptions ...
