OPENING KICKOFF

- San Diego State enters its 100th season of football, 54th at the Division I level and fifth under the direction of the 2011 National Coach of the Year, Brady Hoke.
- After playing their last 23 games (two-plus seasons) out of San Diego County, the Aztecs will play seven home games in 2022 at Bashor Field at Snapdragon Stadium in Mission Valley. SDSU's last game in San Diego County was Nov. 30, 2019 against Brigham Young (W, 13-3).
- Saturday will be the first official athletic event at Snapdragon Stadium, a \$310 million, 35,000-seat venue that SDSU will call home.
- San Diego State returns 13 starters off the 2021 squad (3 offense, 7 defense, 3 special teams).
- SDSU finished the 2021 campaign with a 12-2 record, including a 7-1 record in Mountain West play and an appearance in the Mountain West Championship game for the first time since 2016 and third time overall since the championship started in 2013.
- San Diego State's 12 victories in 2021 were its most in the 99 seasons of football.
- The Aztecs were one of only 10 schools with at least 12 victories in 2021.
- Only four teams had more victories than SDSU, including national champion Georgia, and CFP teams Alabama and Cincinnati.
- San Diego State finished the 2021 season ranked 25th in the final Associated Press Top 25 poll. It was just the third time in program history that Aztecs finished in the final AP poll (also 16th in 1977 and 25th in 2016).
- SDSU was also ranked in the College Football Playoff rankings, making the top 25 in all six of the rankings. San Diego State had never made a CFP Top 25 prior to last season.
- The Aztecs played five teams who reached double-digit victories in 2021, securing wins over Pac-12 Champion/Rose Bowl participant Utah (10-4), UTSA (12-2) and Air Force (10-3).
- The Aztecs have posted a .500 or better overall record and a winning record in Mountain West action in each of the last 12 seasons.
- SDSU has two players who appear on preseason lists for the player of the year, including S **Patrick McMorris** (Bednarik Award Watch List and Bronko Nagurski Award Watch List, both for most outstanding defensive player) and LB **Caden McDonald** (Bednarik Award Watch List).
- Last season, San Diego State had a league-high 15 all-Mountain West selections, matching its most since 2001 (16), and the most first and second-team picks (12). Of those 14 players (one player made it at two positions), seven return for the 2022 campaign, including first-team honorees **McDonald**, **McMorris** and KR **Jordan Byrd**. The Aztecs have five players on the defensive side of the ball who earned all-conference accolades last season.
- SDSU is 53-41-5 all-time in season openers, including a 45-16-4 record in home season opening games. San Diego State, which is 25-7 in season openers played at home in the Division I era, has won its last seven home season openers.

- In all, 13 starters are gone from the 2021 squad, including the MW Defensive Player of the Year and the MW Special Teams Player of the Year.
- San Diego State had four players picked in the 2022 NFL Draft, including DE **Cameron Thomas** in the third round to Arizona and TE **Daniel Bellinger** in the fourth round to New York (Giants). The four draft selections matched the Aztecs' most since the NFL went to seven rounds in 1994. SDSU has now had four draft picks on four occasions, including the 1997 draft, 2008, 2012 and 2022. Like the 1997 draft, this year there were four San Diego State selections without a seventh-round pick (2008 had two seventh-round selections and 2012 had one). The four draft picks are the most by SDSU since five Aztecs were selected in the 12-round 1988 draft.
- Last season, San Diego State dominated the Mountain West postseason awards, winning the coach of the year, defensive player of the year and the special teams player of the year.

PROGRAM-AT-A-GLANCE

- Since the start of the 2015 campaign, San Diego State is 65-24 with a 73.0 winning percentage (10th nationally) and the Aztecs are 64-21 (75.3 percent) since Oct. 3, 2015 (7th nationally).
- SDSU has five double-digit victory seasons in the last seven years (includes this season). Only eight schools in the nation can say that - San Diego State, Alabama, Appalachian State, Clemson, Georgia, Notre Dame, Ohio State and Oklahoma.
- San Diego State has posted 12 consecutive seasons with at least a .500 record. That is tied for the seventh-longest streak nationally and is the longest streak among Pacific Time Zone teams. In 11 of those 12 seasons, the Aztecs have posted a winning record.
- Since the start of the 2019 campaign, San Diego State is 17-4 in games decided by seven or more points (5-1 last year).
- San Diego State is 63-21 in its 42-14 in its last 56 regular-season games against Mountain West opponents.
- The Aztecs are 19-8 in their last 27 games decided by eight points or less (6-0 last year).
- Brady Hoke is the only active college coach to lead three different FBS programs (Ball State, Michigan and SDSU) to an 11-win season and one of only two coaches overall since 1996 (also Urban Meyer with Utah, Florida and Ohio State).

2021 SEASON IN REVIEW

- SDSU (12-2) finished with a school-record 12 victories last season, one of only 10 programs with at least 12 wins.
- Only four teams had more victories than San Diego State, including national champion Georgia, and College Football Playoff teams Alabama and Cincinnati.
- The Aztecs played five teams who reached double-digit victories in 2021, securing wins over Pac-12 Champion/Rose Bowl participant Utah (10-4), UTSA (12-2) and Air Force (10-3).
- SDSU, which played all 14 of its games away from its own market, including eight "home games" two hours from campus at Dignity Health Sports Park in Carson, California, finished the 2021 season ranked 25th in the final Associated Press Top 25 poll. It was the third time in program history San Diego State made the final AP Top 25 poll (also 1977 (16th) and 2016 (25th)).
- The Aztecs were also ranked in every CFP poll in 2021 after never being ranked in each of the first seven years of the poll.
- SDSU finished 7-1 in Mountain West play and earned an appearance in the Mountain West Championship game for the first time since 2016 and third time overall since the championship started in 2013.

2022 SEASON SETUP

- San Diego State returns 13 starters off the 2021 squad (3 offense, 7 defense, 3 special teams).
- Of the three returning starters on offense for third-year offensive coordinator **Jeff Hecklinski**, two are on the offensive line in LT **Brandon Crenshaw-Dickson** (played right tackle last year) and C **Alama Uluave**, and WR **Jesse Matthews**.
- Five SDSU offensive players are either up for national awards at their position and/or were preseason first-team all-conference selections - senior quarterback **Braxton Burmeister** (Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award), senior running back and return specialist **Jordan Byrd** (Paul Hornung Award Watch List - most versatile player), senior wide receiver **Jesse Matthews** (Reese's Senior Bowl Watch List), junior tight end **Mark Redman** (John Mackey Award Watch List - most outstanding tight end) and senior center **Alama Uluave** (Rimington Trophy Watch List - most outstanding center - and Outland Trophy Watch List - top interior lineman).
- Nobody was hotter down the stretch last year than wide receiver **Jesse Matthews**. Matthews, who totaled 37 catches for 465 yards and seven touchdowns over his final four games, caught nine touchdown passes on the season, the most by an Aztec since Vincent Brown had 10 in 2010. Matthews was named the 2021 Frisco Bowl Most Valuable Offensive Player after totaling career highs 11 catches and 175 yards, along with two touchdowns.
- Senior quarterback **Braxton Burmeister** has emerged as the starting quarterback, winning the job after spring drills following a transfer from Virginia Tech. Burmeister, who also played at Oregon (2017-18), brings 21 starts to The Mesa and 29 appearances at the Power 5 level. Altogether, he has thrown for 3,020 yards with 19 touchdowns against 11 interceptions, completing 239 of his 426 attempts (56.1 pct.). Additionally, the La Jolla, California, native has rushed for 834 yards and seven touchdowns.
- San Diego State's offensive line (left to right) - **Brandon Crenshaw-Dickson**, **Cade Bennett**, **Alama Uluave**, **Ross Ulugalu-Maseuli** and **Josh Simmons** - have combined for just 36 starts (22 for Uluave and 14 for Crenshaw-Dickson). The rest of the projected starting offensive line has played a combined three games (two for Bennett and one for Ulugalu-Maseuli).
- Seven starters return from a defense that ranked third in rushing yards allowed per game (80.4), 12th in total defense (324.5), 14th in pass efficiency rating (118.2) and 17th in scoring defense (19.8). Defensive coordinator **Kurt Mattix** is in his third year running SDSU's 3-3-5 defense.
- Senior defensive end **Keshawn Banks** returns for a fifth season after earning all-Mountain West honors three times (2019 and 2021 second team, and 2020 honorable mention).
- LB **Caden McDonald** joined Kirk Morrison (2002-04), Miles Burris (2010-11), Calvin Munson (2015-16) and Kyahva Tezino (2018-19) as the only Aztec linebackers to make multiple all-MW first teams in league history when he made the 2021 squad for a second straight year.
- S **Patrick McMorris** joined Nat Berhe (2013) as the only player to play the 'Aztec' position since the start of the 3-3-5 defense at San Diego State in 2009 to earn first-team all-MW accolades, recording a team-high 90 tackles (53 solo), including 2.5 tackles for loss, a team-best four interceptions for 61 yards, nine pass breakups and a 15-yard fumble recovery.
- DT **Jonah Tavai** was named a first-team All-America selection by The Action Network last year, logging 47 tackles (23 solo), including 14 tackles for loss, 8.5 sacks and 11 quarterback hurries in 14 starts. According to Pro Football Focus, he ranked second in the Mountain West in quarterback pressures (sacks/hits/hurries) (61, T-7th in FBS) and hurries (40, T-8th in FBS), and tied for fifth in hits (11, T-21st in FBS).
- Despite losing punter/kicker/kickoff specialist Matt Araiza to the NFL Draft, Aztec special teams coordinator **Doug Deakin** is still loaded in the special teams space.
- Two-time all-Mountain West kick returner (2021 first team, 2020 second team) **Jordan Byrd** returns for a fifth year. Byrd ranks second in program history in kick return average (25.4), fourth in kick return touchdowns (2), kick return yards (1,449), fifth in kick returns (57) and sixth in punt returns (49). Byrd also ranks third among active FBS players in kick return average (25.4, min. 50 KR).
- **Byrd** was named the preseason Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Year by the league's media, while also making the all-MW first team at both kick returner and punt returner.
- **Jack Browning** is expected to take over in all three kicking phases - field goal/PATs, kickoff and punting.

LEADER OF THE PAC-12

- The Aztecs are 7-2 against Pac-12 teams since the start of the 2016 season, including pair of victories over nationally ranked schools (20-17 over No. 19/19 Stanford on Sept. 16, 2017 and a 28-21 victory over No. 23/25 Arizona State on Sept. 15, 2018).
- The 7-2 record is the best mark against the Pac-12 among all FBS teams (min. six games). Below is a look at the best records against the league since 2016.

- San Diego State is 31-81-4 against teams that make up the current configuration of the Pac-12 Conference.
- The Aztecs are 8-6 in games against teams that were in the Pac-12 at the time of the game (3-5 on the road) and 15-45 against teams that were in the Pac-8/Pac-10/Pac-12 in the Division I era at the time of the game (4-30 on the road).
- San Diego State dropped 19 straight games to Pac-10 teams from 1996 until breaking that streak with a 42-24 victory over Washington State on Sept. 17, 2011.
- SDSU has won a pair of games against the Pac-12 in the same season twice since 2017, winning at Arizona State (30-20) and at home against No. 19/19 Stanford (20-17) in 2017 and downing Arizona (38-14) and Utah (33-31 in three overtimes) last year. The Aztecs play both Arizona (this Saturday) and Utah (Sept. 17) this season.

OFFENSIVE KEYS

- San Diego State is 52-2 the last 54 times it has rushed for 200 yards. The Aztecs surpassed 200 yards rushing in the first five games last season (SDSU won all five games).
- The Aztecs are 76-15 since 2011 when committing one turnover or less, something SDSU has done in 28 of its last 35 games.
- San Diego State's 33 turnovers since the start of the 2019 are the sixth fewest in the country (California, Kent State leads with 28). What makes that number so impressive is that the Aztecs have played 35 games over that span (the five teams with fewer turnovers than SDSU have played between 29 and 32 games).
- SDSU had an advantage in time of possession in 25 of the last 35 games. Since 2011, the Aztecs are 31-7 when possessing the football for at least 35 minutes.

DEFENSIVE KEYS

- The Aztecs are 64-3 since 2011 when holding the opposition to 17 points or less. SDSU has held 18 of its last 28 opponents to 17 points or less.
- The Aztecs are 33-7 since 2011 when allowing less than 150 passing yards.
- San Diego State is 55-5 the last 60 times it has held the opposition to a 33.3 percent or less mark on third down.
- Since 2009, San Diego State's record broken down by opponent passing efficiency: less than 110: 63-8; between 110-150: 40-24; greater than 150: 7-24.
- Since the start of the 2015 campaign, SDSU is 41-2 when holding its opponent to a passing efficiency rating of below 110. SDSU did that in eight of 14 games last season.

SPECIAL TEAMS / OVERALL TRENDS

- The Aztecs have are 43-2 the last 45 times when owning a turnover advantage.
- San Diego State is 24-2 the last 26 times it has an advantage in field position.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State is tied for the most kickoff returns for touchdowns (13) with Kansas State.
- Since the start of the 2020 season, San Diego State has nine non-offensive touchdowns, tied for 5th nationally (Alabama, 11).
- Last season, the Aztecs had five non-offensive touchdowns (two punt return, kickoff return, two interception returns). That was tied for 11th most in the nation.

100TH SEASON OF AZTEC FOOTBALL

- The 2022 campaign is the 100th season of Aztec football.
- Among the highlights for the 100th-year celebration include the unveiling of all-decade teams at each Aztec home game this season, along with the recognition of various San Diego State legends.
- Ten former football players were announced as legacy ambassadors for the 100th Aztec football season, including Willie Buchanan, Fred Dryer, Marshall Faulk, Akbar Gbaja-Biamila, Haven Moses, Kirk Morrison, Rashaad Penny, Donnel Pumphrey, Todd Santos and Brian Sipe.
- Two of the legacy ambassadors - Pumphrey and Sipe - were honorary head coaches for the 2022 Spring Game, which Team Pumphrey came out on top, 28-6.
- Buchanan (1970-71) was a 1971 first-team All-America selection by The Sporting News, Time Magazine and Pop Warner. Buchanan

- was drafted in the first round of the NFL Draft by the 1972 Green Bay Packers, where he was named the 1972 NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year. A charter member of the 1988 Aztec Hall of Fame, Buchanan also was inducted into the Packers Hall of Fame in 1993.
- Dryer (1967-68) was a 1968 Little All-American before being drafted in the first round of the 1969 NFL Draft, and playing 13 seasons for the New York Giants and the Los Angeles Rams. A two-time Pro Bowl selection, Dryer starred in the long-running television series "Hunter" following his professional career. Dryer was inducted into the 1988 Aztec Hall of Fame and the 1997 College Football Hall of Fame.
- Faulk (1991-93) was a three-time All-American (1991-93) and two-time unanimous All-American (1992-93), recording back-to-back NCAA rushing titles (1991-92). Faulk, who was second in the Heisman Trophy voting in 1992 and fourth in 1993, went on to be the second pick in the 1994 NFL Draft, where he was a seven-time Pro Bowl selection and was the 2000 NFL MVP. Faulk was inducted into the 1998 Aztec Hall of Fame, 2011 NFL Hall of Fame and 2017 College Hall of Fame.
- Gbaja-Biamila (1999-02) was an honorable-mention all-Mountain West selection as a senior in 2002, when he amassed 45 tackles, 13 tackles for loss and five sacks. A team captain as a senior, Gbaja-Biamila went on to play in the NFL for the Oakland Raiders. Gbaja-Biamila eventually found a role in TV, including the last nine years as a co-host for American Ninja Warrior.
- Moses (1966-67) was a first-team All-America selection by The Sporting News and Time Magazine as a senior in 1967. Moses ended up being picked in the first round of the 1968 NFL Draft by the Buffalo Bills, where he became a Pro Bowler in 1974. Moses was inducted into the 1988 Aztec Hall of Fame.
- Morrison (2001-04) capped off his 2003 junior season by being named a first-team College Football News All-American and the MW Defensive Player of the Year, before repeating as the league defensive player of the year in 2004. A third-round NFL Draft pick to his hometown Oakland Raiders in 2005, Morrison spent eight seasons in the NFL with Oakland, Jacksonville and Buffalo. Morrison, who currently works as a college football analyst for ESPN, was inducted into the Aztec Hall of Fame in 2014.
- Penny (2014-17) earned consensus first-team All-America honors as a senior in 2017 and finished fifth in the Heisman Trophy voting after rushing for an FBS-leading and school-record 2,248 yards. A three-time MW Special Teams Player of the Year (2015-17) and 2017 MW Offensive Player of the Year, Penny was drafted in the first round by the Seattle Seahawks in 2018. Penny recently signed a contract extension with Seattle in the offseason.
- Pumphrey (2013-16) garnered first-team All-America accolades in 2016 by Walter Camp and Sports Illustrated, ending his collegiate career with a FBS-record 6,405 rushing yards. A two-time MW Offensive Player of the Year (2015-16) and three-time first-team all-MW selection (2014-16), Pumphrey was a 2016 Doak Walker Award finalist. Pumphrey was drafted by the Philadelphia Eagles in 2017.
- Santos (1984-87) was a third-team All-America selection by The Sporting News in 1987 after throwing for a school-record 3,932 yards and 26 touchdowns, and twice garnered honorable-mention accolades from the Associated Press (1986-87). Santos was drafted by the New Orleans Saints in the 1988 NFL Draft. He was inducted into the Aztec Hall of Fame in 1996.
- Sipe (1969-71) was a two-time honorable-mention All-America selection (1970-71 AP and United Press (AP)). Drafted by the Cleveland Browns in 1972, Sipe went on to play for 10 years in the NFL, where he was named the NFL's Most Valuable Player in 1980 and was a two-time Pro Bowl selection (1979-80). Sipe was inducted into the 1988 Aztec Hall of Fame.
- In 99 seasons of football, the Aztecs are 581-433-32 (.571), including a 349-270-8 (.563) mark in 53 seasons of Division I play (since 1969).
- SDSU has won 21 conference championships, including three Mountain West titles (2012, 2015 and 2016).
- San Diego State has made 19 bowl games, including 11 in the past 12 seasons (in 2020 during COVID-shortened season SDSU withdrew from bowl consideration).
- SDSU has won 21 conference championships, including three Mountain West titles (2012, 2015 and 2016).

SNAPDRAGON STADIUM DEBUT SET FOR SATURDAY

- A 35,000 capacity multi-use stadium for college football, professional soccer, other sports, concerts and events; expandable for NFL football.
- Saturday will be the first official sporting event (excluding a scrimmage on Aug. 20) at Bashor Field at Snapdragon Stadium.
- Snapdragon Stadium is a \$310 million, 35,000 capacity multi-use stadium for Aztec football, along with professional soccer, other sports, concerts and events. It's expandable for NFL football.
- Snapdragon Stadium is a small piece of SDSU's plan for Mission Valley. The other plans for the Mission Valley site include:
 - 1.6 million square feet of academic and research/innovation space, affording technology transfer between companies and SDSU researchers
 - More than 80 acres of open space with a River Park, athletic and recreational fields, and more than 4 miles of hiking and biking trails
 - Approximately 4,600 residential units, including student, faculty, and staff housing, as well as, affordable, workforce, and market-rate housing
 - 95,000 square feet of neighborhood-serving retail shops and business services
 - 400 hotel rooms and 40,000 square feet of conference space that will accommodate visitors and serve as an incubator for students in SDSU's L. Robert Payne School of Hospitality and Tourism Management
 - Approximately 6,000 parking spaces for public and game-day use along with additional spaces as required for housing and retail
- The first stage of construction will include the new stadium, the River Park, and the initial phase of residential housing and research/innovation space.
- Snapdragon Stadium timeline:
 - Nov. 6, 2018: A citizen initiative was on the ballot for voters in San Diego County, California. A yes vote was a vote in favor of authorizing the sale of 132 acres of Mission Valley Stadium to San Diego State University. Measure G competed with Measure E, the Mission Valley Stadium SoccerCity Lease and Redevelopment Initiative. Measure G was approved while Measure E was easily defeated.
 - Aug. 13, 2020 - Closed Escrow on Purchase of Site

- Aug. 20, 2020 - Groundbreaking
- April 20, 2022 - River Park Groundbreaking
- Aug. 19, 2022 - Ribbon Cutting Ceremony
- Sept. 3, 2022 - Opening Event (SDSU vs. Arizona)
- Oct. 22, 2022 - Opening Concert (Jimmy Buffet and the Coral Reefer Band and Jason Mraz)
- As of Aug. 23, 2022, Snapdragon Stadium is 99 percent complete, while the initial site development and river park are 65 percent complete.
- SDSU Mission Valley and Snapdragon Stadium Construction Statistics:
 - 1,200,000 workhours have been spent on-site
 - 420,000 cy of soil has been imported to date of the 470,000 total to elevate the development site out of the flood plain
 - 16,000 tons of new asphalt has been laid across the initial site development and stadium
 - 210,000 tons of concrete (125,000 cy) were crushed from old stadium and re-used on site for base under new roads and temporary parking
 - 90 percent of the old stadium was recycled
 - When completed with the stadium, initial site development and river park projects at SDSU Mission Valley, it will have used:
 - < 160-acre site = 70 downtown city blocks
 - < 6,400,000 lbs. of structural steel
 - < 7,500,000 lbs. of rebar
 - < 50,000 CY (Cubic Yards) of concrete
 - < 470,000 CY of imported soil = 40,000 dump trucks
 - < 125,000 CY of concrete generated from Qualcomm/SDCCU/ Jack Murphy Demolition = 210,000 tons
 - < All together moving 2,000,000 cy of dirt (That is a football field 1,000 feet high)
 - < Over 1,000 new trees, 75,000 new plantings throughout the site, most of which are drought tolerant and native plants

BULLET NOTES - OFFENSE

- San Diego State returns three starters on offense this season - senior center **Alama Uluave**, senior wide receiver **Jesse Matthews** and junior offensive tackle **Brandon Crenshaw-Dickson**.
- **Jeff Hecklinski** is in his third season as offensive coordinator at San Diego State. Hecklinski was on Hoke's original SDSU staff in 2009 and 2010 as the assistant head coach, running backs coach and recruiting coordinator. He was also with Hoke at Michigan (2011-14) and Ball State (2004-08). He replaced Jeff Horton, who now serves as the associate head coach and running backs coach.
- Of all FBS schools that have played at least 50 games since 2015, San Diego State is second in fewest turnovers with 91 (LSU is first with 88).

- The Aztecs are 44-4 the last 48 times they have scored at least 30 points. SDSU has won its last 10 games when scoring at least 30 points.
- San Diego State is 57-11 since 2015 when scoring just 20 or more points.
- SDSU is 25-6 since 2011 when getting at least 36 minutes of time of possession.
- Since the beginning of 2014, SDSU is 60-13 when committing one turnover or less (12 straight wins) and 12-17 when having two or more turnovers in the game. San Diego State has one turnover or less in 25 of its last 32 games.
- San Diego State has one turnover or less in 46 of its last 62 games.
- SDSU is 50-10 in the last 60 games when owning an edge in time of possession.
- C Alama Uluave played the most offensive snaps (953) on the season.

RUSHING OFFENSE

- **San Diego State is 52-2 the last 54 times it has rushed for at least 200 yards and is 49-1 in its last 50 regular-season games when rushing for 200-plus yards.**
- San Diego State has a 100-yard rusher in 47 of the last 89 games since 2015 (59, 100-yard rushers total). Since Jeff Horton arrived as the running back coach in 2011, SDSU has a 100-yard rusher in 81 of the 141 games and 97, 100-yard rushers overall.
- San Diego State had two 100-yard rushers at New Mexico State (Jordan Byrd - 118 and Chance Bell - 116) on Sept. 14, 2019 for the 30th time in program history. The Aztecs are 29-1 in those occasions, including a 19-game win streak.
- San Diego State ran for at least 200 yards in each of the first five games last season, which was its longest streak since the final five games of 2017.
- The Aztecs had back-to-back games with at least four rushing touchdowns last year (Sept. 25 vs. Towson and Oct. 9 vs. New Mexico) for the first time since the 2015 season (Nov. 21 at UNLV and Nov. 28 vs. Nevada).
- **Chance Bell** ranks 31st all-time at SDSU with 1,187 yards.
- Byrd had a 73-yard touchdown at Utah State on Oct. 31, 2020, the longest by an Aztec since Rashaad Penny's 81-yard touchdown run against Army West Point in the 2017 Armed Forces Bowl (Dec. 23).
- If you take away the one time QB (now S) **Jalen Mayden** was sacked (for eight yards), he rushed three times for 44 yards (14.7 avg.).

SERIES HISTORY

- San Diego State and Arizona are meeting for the 17th time with the Wildcats owning a 10-6 series advantage.
- The Aztecs beat UA, 38-14, last year in Tucson, snapping a four-game losing streak in the series.
- Arizona had won the previous four meetings between the teams by a combined score of 106-57 with the previous game happening in 2001.
- Saturday is the first game being played at Snapdragon Stadium, located in Mission Valley near the old SDCCU Stadium (aka Qualcomm, Jack Murphy, San Diego Stadium site).
- The two Universities, located 401 miles apart (driving), will meet Saturday for just the second time in 7,674 days (21 years, 4 days).
- SDSU's first time hosting an out-of-state opponent came on Nov. 19, 1932, when the Aztecs downed Arizona, 13-0, at Balboa Stadium.
- The highest San Diego State has ever been ranked in the AP Poll was No. 13 on Nov. 3, 1975. An 8-0 Aztec team was defeated five days later by No. 15 Arizona (entered game 6-1), 31-24, in front of 53,611 in San Diego. The Aztecs outgained the Wildcats (365-330), but could not overcome three interceptions and four total turnovers. The Aztecs had a couple of opportunities late, including first-and-goal at the 6-yard line in the closing minutes (turnover on downs) and first-and-10 at the Arizona 24 with 41 seconds left (interception).
- In eight of the 16 games between the teams, San Diego State has been held to 10 points or less.
- **SDSU-ARIZONA TIDBITS:** SDSU has led Arizona at the half in each of the last five meetings, but has only come out on top last year in Tucson (led, 35-7, at the half and won, 38-14)... SDSU scored the first 21 points (in just 8:53 of game time) in the 38-14 win last year... It was the first time the winning team did not trail in the game since San Diego State's 21-14 victory in 1977 (previous five games leads were exchanged)... Last season, San Diego State had its first second-half lead in the series since 1997... The last time the Aztecs defeated Arizona in San Diego was a 42-10 win on Nov. 10, 1979, when the No. 1 song was "Heartache Tonight" by the Eagles.

SAN DIEGO STATE VS. PAC-12

- San Diego State is 31-81-4 against teams that make up the current configuration of the Pac-12 Conference.
- The Aztecs are 8-6 in games against teams that were in the Pac-12 at the time of the game (3-5 on the road) and 15-45 against teams that were in the Pac-8/Pac-10/Pac-12 in the Division I era at the time of the game (4-30 on the road).
- San Diego State dropped 19 straight games to Pac-10 teams from 1996 until breaking that streak with a 42-24 victory over Washington State on Sept. 17, 2011.
- Recently, the Aztecs have done quite well, posting a 7-2 record against the Pac-12 since 2016. That despite playing five of those games on the road, three of the Pac-12 teams being ranked and being an underdog in eight of those games.
- Since the start of the 2016 campaign, San Diego State owns the nation's best non-conference record against the Pac-12 Conference. (minimum six games played). The Aztecs are 7-2, 1.5 games better than Notre Dame at 5-3. *See note and chart on page 1*

- Aztec offensive coordinator Jeff Hecklinski coached at Arizona during the 2003 season, acting as the QB coach/passing game coordinator.
- San Diego State's football offensive analyst Gary Bernardi coached at Arizona from 1980-86, spending time as their offensive tackles/tight ends coach (1980-84, 1986) and their tight ends coach (1985).
- Bernardi and Wildcats' defensive line coach Ricky Hunley crossed paths at USC in 1992, where Bernardi acted as the Trojans' offensive tackles/tight ends/special teams coordinator and Hunley spent time as a graduate assistant.
- SDSU's football defensive analyst Kevin Wolthausen spent four seasons in Tucson, coaching Arizona's defensive line (1986) and outside linebackers (1985), while spending time as a Wildcat graduate assistant from 1983-84.
- Arizona senior offensive analyst Michael Switzer spent the 2014 season as a graduate assistant at Michigan under current Aztec head coach Brady Hoke.
- Aztecs running back Kenan Christon and Wildcats defensive lineman Hunter Echols both played for USC.
- San Diego State linebacker Cooper McDonald and tight end Mark Redman, and Arizona linebacker Anthony Ward all spent time at Washington.
- SDSU offensive lineman Rambo Mageo, quarterback DJ Ralph, and running back Lucky Sutton and U of A wide receiver Rex Haynes all prepped at Cathedral Catholic High in San Diego.
- Scarlet and Black defensive lineman Dylan Taylor, and Cardinal and Navy defensive lineman Hunter Echols both attended Cathedral High in Los Angeles.
- Aztecs offensive linemen Drew Azzopardi and Tiger Yu ,and Wildcats safety Samuel Chung spent time at Junipero Serra High in San Mateo, California.
- San Diego State safety Josh Hunter and offensive linemen Ross Ulugalul-Maseuli, and Arizona defensive linemen Jacob Kongaika and Uiagalelei Ta'ita'i all played high school ball at Mater Dei High in Santa Ana, California.
- U of A offensive lineman JT Hand and SDSU offensive lineman Thomas Mirabella each spent time at Mission Viejo High in Mission Viejo, California.

- Aztecs offensive lineman Cade Bennett and Wildcats wide receiver Gavin Smith both played at Notre Dame Prep High in Scottsdale, Arizona.
- San Diego State cornerback Noah Avinger and wide receiver Mikey Welsh, and Arizona tight end Keyan Burnett, quarterback Noah Fifita, linebacker Jacob Manu, and wide receiver Tetairoa McMillan all played high school ball at Servite High in Anaheim, California.
- SDSU offensive lineman Laakea Kapoi and linebacker Darrell Masaniai, and U of A quarterback Jayden de Laura and offensive lineman Jonah Savaiinaea attended St. Louis High in Honolulu, Hawai'i.

PASSING OFFENSE

- Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State has thrown 36 interceptions. That only trails Navy (35) for the fewest picks in the nation over that span (min. 50 GP). In contrast, Texas State has thrown 97 interceptions over that span, which is the most since 2015.
- WR Jesse Matthews ranked eighth in the Mountain West last year in receiving touchdowns (9, T-31st in FBS).
- The nine touchdown catches for Matthews were the most by an Aztec since Vincent Brown had 10 in 2010 and tied for the 11th most in a season.
- Matthews had a then career-high nine receptions for 75 yards and three touchdowns at UNLV on Nov. 19. The three touchdown catches for the most by an Aztec since Colin Lockett had three in the 2011 New Orleans Bowl, while the nine catches were then the most at SDSU since Mikah Holder had nine at UNLV on Oct. 7, 2017.
- Matthews followed that up with another 9-catch game for 133 yards and a touchdown against Boise State on Nov. 26.
- Matthews had career highs of 11 catches and 175 yards, along with two touchdowns, en route to being named the offensive most valuable player at the 2021 Frisco Bowl. The 11 receptions were the most by an Aztec since DeMarco Sampson had 12 vs. Utah on Nov. 20, 2010, while the 175 yards were the most since Fred Trevillion had 189 at Fresno State on Nov. 17, 2018.
- Matthews is one of 27 Aztecs with at least five, 100-yard receiving games.
- Over the final four games last year, Matthews totaled 37 catches for 465 yards and seven touchdowns.
- In two career bowl games, Matthews has totaled 14 receptions for 286 yards and four touchdowns, winning offensive MVP honors both times (shared the award with Jordan Byrd at the 2019 New Mexico Bowl).
- Among freshmen in SDSU single-season history in 2019, Matthews ranked second in receptions (48) and third in receiving yards (633).
- Matthews had the fifth-most catches (48) in the country without a dropped pass in 2019 (according to Pro Football Focus)

BULLET NOTES - DEFENSE

- Kurt Mattix is in his third season as defensive coordinator running the 3-3-5 defense at San Diego State. He previously served as defensive coordinator at Eastern Kentucky and worked with Hoke at Michigan. Mattix has been named a nominee for the Broyles Award for the top assistant coach in both 2020 and 2021.
- San Diego State's returns seven starters return from a defense that ranked third in rushing yards allowed per game (80.4), 12th in total defense (324.5), 14th in pass efficiency rating (118.2) and 17th in scoring defense (19.8). Starters that are back for the Aztecs are senior defensive ends Jonah Tavai and Keshawn Banks, senior linebackers Caden McDonald and Michael Shawcroft, senior safeties Patrick McMorris and Cedarius Barfield, and junior cornerback Noah Tumblin.

DEFENSIVE NUMBERS

- Since 2014, SDSU ranks as the fifth-best scoring defense (18.7), sixth-best total defense (311.3) and seventh in turnovers forced (186).
- The Aztecs held their opponent to 35 or less points in 46 consecutive games before allowing 46 against Utah State in the 2021 MW Championship game. The 46 consecutive games holding its opponents to under 35 points was the longest active streak at the time.
- SDSU had gone 29 straight games keeping its opponents under 450 yards of total offense until Fresno State totaled 485 against the Aztecs on Oct. 30, 2021. It was the longest active streak in FBS at the time.
- San Diego State has held its opponent to single digits 18 times since 2015 (89 games) and to 10 or less points 29 times over that span.
- San Diego State forced at least one turnover in 22 consecutive games prior to not recording one in a 23-21 win against Nevada on Nov. 13, 2021. It was the second-longest active streak in the country at the time.
- The Aztecs have allowed just 506 points over the last 118 quarters (4.29 points per quarter) (does not include overtime periods).
- SDSU has allowed just 580 points over the last 35 games (16.6 ppg).
- San Diego State held its opponent scoreless on its opening possession in 12 of the 14 games last year (10 three-and-outs over that span) and 66 times in 89 games since 2015.
- Last year opponents had 180 drives where they tried to score on SDSU's defense (excludes kneel downs to end half/game). The Aztecs forced three-and-outs (or less) in 68 of those drives (37.8 pct.). SDSU averaged 4.86 three-and-outs per game.
- The Aztecs allowed 4.73 yards per play last year, which ranked eighth in the country.
- LB Caden McDonald has played in 48 straight games, the longest streak on the team.
- McDonald has started 31 straight games, the longest streak among Aztec defensive and offensive starters.
- DE Keshawn Banks has the most starts among active Aztecs (34).
- LB Michael Shawcroft ranked in a tie for ninth in the Mountain West (T-58th in FBS) with two forced fumbles.
- LB Caden McDonald was named a first-team all-Mountain West selection for a second straight season and joined Kirk Morrison (2002-04), Miles Burris (2010-11), Calvin Munson (2015-16) and Kyahva Tezino (2018-19) as the only Aztec linebackers to earn multiple all-MW honors.
- AZ Patrick McMorris was named an all-MW first-team pick, becoming the first 'Aztec' in the 3-3-5 defense (started in 2009) to earn an all-MW first or second team since Nat Berhe in 2013. Berhe is the only other 'Aztec' to even earn a second team (2012).
- McMorris earned first-team all-MW honors, making it the first time in league history that the Aztecs have had a pair of first-team safeties.

- CB Noah Avinger started the opener against New Mexico State on Sept. 4, 2021, becoming the first true freshman Aztec cornerback to start since Leon McFadden in 2009 and just the third true freshman to start on defense since 2009 (also S Tariq Thompson in 2017). True freshman S CJ Baskerville later started at UNLV, along with Avinger in the secondary.

RUSHING DEFENSE

- Opponents have rushed 413 times this season with only five attempts longer than 20 yards (1.2 pct.).
- SDSU's rushing defense rankings: third in rushing yards per game (80.4), tied for third in rushing touchdowns allowed (7) and sixth in rushing yards per attempt (2.7).
- Opponent rush average vs. SDSU by quarter: 1st - 3.4; 2nd - 3.1; 3rd - 1.9; 4th - 2.9 - and by half: 1st - 3.2; 2nd - 2.4.
- SDSU held six straight opponents to less than 100 yards rushing for the first time in its Division I era (since 1969) before allowing 117 to San Jose State on Oct. 15, 2021. The six straight games of holding its opponent under 100 rushing yards was the longest streak in the country at the time.
- SDSU opponents had just 71 rushing first downs last season against the Aztecs on 413 rushing attempts and only seven touchdowns, the first which came in the first overtime against San Jose State on Oct. 15. The rush came on the 171st rushing attempt against San Diego State last season.
- The Aztecs allowed a rushing touchdown with 3:59 left in the fourth quarter the following game (Oct. 23) at Air Force, the first one given up by SDSU this season in regulation. San Diego State had gone 33 quarters without allowing a rushing touchdown until that score dating back to 2020.

PASSING DEFENSE

- SDSU's 130 interceptions since the 2014 season are tied for the most in the country, while its 15 interceptions returned for a touchdown ranks in a tie for eighth.
- Opponents averaged 6.25 yards per attempt (10th in FBS) last year.
- S Patrick McMorris ranked in a tie for second in the Mountain West in interceptions (4, T-14th in FBS), third in interceptions per game (0.29, T-34th in FBS), tied for fourth in total passes defended (INT + PBU) (13, T-20th in FBS), fifth in total pass breakups (11, T-23rd in FBS) and seventh in passes defended per game (0.93, T-41st in FBS).
- DT Jonah Tavai was sixth in the Mountain West in total sacks (8.5, T-37th in FBS), seventh in sacks per game (0.61, T-54th in FBS) and tackles for loss (14.0, T-52nd in FBS), eighth in sack yards (57, T-37th in FBS), ninth in tackles for loss yards (65, T-57th in FBS), and tied for 10th in tackles for loss per game (1.00).
- According to Pro Football Focus, Tavai ranked second in the Mountain West in quarterback pressures (sacks/hits/hurries) (61, T-7th in FBS) and hurries (40, T-8th in FBS), and tied for fifth in hits (11, T-21st in FBS).
- According to Pro Football Focus, DE Keshawn Banks ranked second in the Mountain West in quarterback hits (19, T-2nd in FBS), third in quarterback pressures (sacks/hits/hurries) (59, T-10th in FBS) and tied for seventh in quarterback hurries (33, T-20th in FBS).
- CB Noah Tumblin ranked in a tie for ninth in the MW in pass breakups (7).
- Tumblin's four pass breakups in the 2021 opener against New Mexico State were tied for the fifth most in a game in FBS last season and tied for the fourth most in a game in school history (an Aztec has only recorded games with at least four PBU's 16 times in program history).
- McMorris led the Aztecs with 37 tackles on passing plays.

BULLET NOTES - SPECIAL TEAMS

- Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State has 13 kickoff returns for touchdowns, tied for the most in FBS play over that time. To put that stat into perspective, 20 other teams have played at least 60 games over that span and do not have a single kick return touchdown.
- The Aztecs also have five 100-yard kickoff return touchdowns since 2015, tied with Western Michigan for the most in FBS play over that span.
- SDSU had a non-offensive touchdown in each of the first four games of the 2021 season and had one in five of the 14 games overall.
- SDSU's five non-offensive touchdowns are tied for the 11th most in FBS play last season.
- KR Jordan Byrd was named a first-team all-Mountain West kick returner, joining Rashaad Penny (2015-17) as the only Aztecs to make an all-MW first team in league history.
- Byrd ranks second in program history in kick return average (25.4), fourth in kick return touchdowns (2) and kick return yards (1,449), fifth in kick returns (57) and sixth in punt returns (49).
- Byrd ranks fourth among active FBS players in kick return average (25.6, min. 54 KR).
- Byrd led the Mountain West in total punt returns (27, 4th in FBS), combined kick return yards (794, 6th in FBS), kick return average (27.3, 15th in FBS), punt return yards (193, 18th in FBS) and punt return average (7.1, 30th in FBS), tied for first in kick return touchdowns (1, T-13th in FBS), and third in kick return yards (601, 18th in FBS) and total kick returns (22, T-24th in FBS).
- Byrd returned a kickoff 100 yards or a touchdown against Utah on Sept. 18 to become the fifth Aztec in program history with a 100-yard kickoff return (has happened eight times overall) and first since Rashaad Penny against Nevada on Nov. 18, 2017.
- Byrd's 63.0 kick return average was the ninth highest in a FBS game last season (min. 2 KR) and the fourth highest by an Aztec since at least 1996 (min. 2 KR). Byrd now has two of the four-highest kick return averages in a game by an Aztec since at least 1996 (min. 2 KR) (74.0 vs. Colorado State on Dec. 5, 2020 (No. 1) and 63.0 vs. Utah on Sept. 18, 2021 (No. 4)).
- Byrd is one of only 19 FBS players with a 100-yard kick return for a touchdown this season.
- Byrd (93-yard kick return) and Busbee (90-yard punt return) helped San Diego State become the first team with a kickoff return and punt return in the same quarter (second) on Dec. 5, 2020 vs. Colorado State since Oct. 31, 2015 vs. Tennessee (third quarter at Kentucky).
- The Aztecs have returned a kickoff and punt for a touchdown three times in the same game in the last 26 seasons (since 1996).
- Tyrell Shavers ranks in a tie for fourth in program history in blocked kicks (2).

AZTECS PICKED SECOND IN PRESEASON MOUNTAIN WEST POLL

The San Diego State football team has been picked to finish second in the West Division of the Mountain West preseason vote by media representatives who cover the conference, the league announced July 20 at the annual league media days in Las Vegas. The West Division winner has won four of the past seven MW Championships, including the Aztecs in both 2015 and 2016.

SDSU received 148 points with eight first-place votes, trailing only Fresno State's 160 points and 20 first-place votes. San Diego State won the West Division last year before falling to Utah State in the MW Championship game. The Aztecs have now been picked first or second in nine of the 10 years of division play (since 2013). San José State is third in the West Division with 105 points, followed by Nevada (66), UNLV (58) and Hawai'i (51).

Boise State, meanwhile, was picked to win the Mountain Division for the 10th consecutive season. The Broncos, who have made five MW Championship games, received 151 points and 14 first-place votes. Air Force (136) and Utah State (122) garnered 10 and three first-place votes, respectively, while Colorado State (90) had the other first-place vote in the Mountain Division. Wyoming (60) and New Mexico (29) also had votes.

Notes: SDSU's 148 points are its most in the preseason poll since having 168 in 2017 ... San Diego State, which averaged a predicted finish of 6.5 from 2005-12, has ended up at or better than its predicted finish in 10 of the last 13 seasons and 13 times over the past 17 years ... The Aztecs have won two of the last seven Mountain West titles (2015 and 2016) and three of the past 10 (also 2012) ... Three of the four previous times Brady Hoke was head coach, SDSU finished above its preseason selection (finished seventh in 2009 after being picked eighth, finished tied for third in 2010 after being picked sixth and finished first in the West Division last year after being picked third).

AZTECS DOMINATE 2022 MOUNTAIN WEST PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM

The San Diego State football team landed a school-record seven players (eight selections) on the 2022 Mountain West Preseason All-Conference Team, the league announced July 21. Highlighting the seven Aztecs on the preseason team are co-defensive player of the year Patrick McMorris (Santa Ana, Calif.) and special teams player of the year Jordan Byrd (Albuquerque, N.M.).

SDSU earned eight of the 26 all-MW picks, one more than in its inaugural season of the league in 1999. San Diego State had one more selection than its previous two seasons combined (three in 2021, four in 2022) despite losing four players to the NFL Draft. The Aztecs also matched program highs in preseason defensive selections (four) and special teams picks (two).

Joining McMorris and Byrd (kick returner and punt returner) on the preseason all-conference team were Jesse Matthews (San Diego/Christian High), Alama Uluave (Laie, Hawaii), Keshawn Banks (Rio Rancho, N.M.), Jonah Tavai (Manhattan Beach, Calif.) and Caden McDonald (Haslet, Texas).

The all-conference team and preseason poll are voted on by media representatives who cover the conference. Yesterday, SDSU was picked to finish second in the West Division of the MW, despite representing the division in the 2021 MW Championship.

McMorris, who became SDSU's first MW preseason defensive player of the year since Damontae Kazee in 2016, was a first-team all-MW selection last year in his first season in 2021 while playing the signature 'Aztec' position in San Diego State's 3-3-5 defense. McMorris joined Nat Berhe (2013) as the only player to play the 'Aztec' position since the start of the 3-3-5 defense at SDSU in 2009 to earn first-team all-MW accolades, while Berhe (2012) is the only other 'Aztec' to even make a second team over that span. McMorris had a team-high 90 tackles (53 solo), including 2.5 tackles for loss, a team-best four interceptions for 61 yards, nine pass breakups and a 15-yard fumble recovery. He ranked in a tie for second in the Mountain West in interceptions (4, T-14th in FBS), third in interceptions per game (0.29, T-34th in FBS), tied for fourth in total passes defended (INT + PBU) (13, T-20th in FBS), fifth in total pass breakups (11, T-23rd in FBS) and seventh in passes defended per game (0.93, T-41st in FBS).

Byrd, meanwhile, became San Diego State's second MW Preseason Special Teams Player of the Year, joining Rashaad Penny in 2016 and 2017. A two-time all-MW selection at kick returner (first team in 2021, second team in 2020), Byrd returned 22 kickoffs for 601 yards (27.3 avg.) with a 100-yard kick return touchdown in 2021 while returning 27 punts for 193 yards (7.1 avg.). Byrd, who also rushed 37 times for 246 yards (6.6 avg.) with three touchdowns and a long of 55 yards, while making 13 catches for 76 yards (5.8 avg.) with a long of 20 yards, led the MW in total punt returns (27, 4th in FBS), combined kick return yards (794, 6th in FBS), kick return average (27.3, 15th in FBS), punt return yards (193, 18th in FBS) and punt return average (7.1, 30th in FBS), while tying for first in kick return touchdowns (1, T-13th in FBS), and ranking third in kick return yards (601, 18th in FBS) and total kick returns (22, T-24th in FBS).

Matthews had team highs of 57 catches, 642 yards and nine touchdowns last year. The nine touchdown catches were the most by an Aztec since Vincent Brown had 10 in 2010 and tied for the 11th most in a season in program history. Matthews ranked eighth in the MW in receiving touchdowns (9, T-31st in FBS). Over his final four games, he totaled 37 catches for 465 yards and seven touchdowns.

Uluave, who has started all 22 games the past two seasons for San Diego State at center, is coming off an honorable-mention year in 2021. According to Pro Football Focus, Uluave allowed just six pressures (two hits, two hurries and two sacks) in 409 passing chances. Additionally he played the most offensive snaps on the team (953).

A three-time all-MW pick (2019 & 2021 second team, 2020 honorable mention), Banks logged 35 tackles (16 solo) in 2021, including 11 tackles for loss for 51 yards, five sacks for 31 yards, two pass breakups and 17 quarterback hurries. According to Pro Football Focus, Banks ranked second in the Mountain West in quarterback hits (19, T-2nd in FBS), third in quarterback pressures (sacks/hits/hurries) (59, T-10th in FBS) and tied for seventh in quarterback hurries (33, T-20th in FBS).

A two-time honorable-mention all-MW pick (2020-21), Tavai had 47 tackles (23 solo) last year, including 14 tackles for loss, 8.5 sacks and 11 quarterback hurries in 14 starts. Tavai ranked sixth in the league in sacks (8.5, T-37th in FBS), seventh in sacks per game (0.61, T-54th in FBS) and tackles for loss (14.0, T-52nd in FBS), eighth in sack yards (57, T-37th in FBS), ninth in tackles for loss yards (65, T-57th in FBS), and tied for 10th in tackles for loss per game (1.00). According to Pro Football Focus, he ranked second in the Mountain West in quarterback pressures (sacks/hits/hurries) (61, T-7th in FBS) and hurries (40, T-8th in FBS), and tied for fifth in hits (11, T-21st in FBS).

McDonald is a two-time first-team all-MW pick (2020-21), joining Kirk Morrison (2002-04), Miles Burriss (2010-11), Calvin Munson (2015-16) and Kyahva Tezino (2018-19) as the only Aztec linebackers to make multiple all-MW first teams in league history. McDonald, who was on the 2021 Bronko Nagurski Award Watch List (most outstanding defensive player) and the Chuck Bednarik Award Watch List (college defensive player of the year), registered 49 tackles (21 solo) in 2021, including three sacks for 22 yards and 6.5 tackles for loss of 28 yards, seven quarterback hurries, two pass breakups and a blocked PAT.

Notes: San Diego State's eight preseason all-MW selections were three more than the second most in the league (Fresno State, 5) ... All eight preseason all-MW picks were seniors ... The eight preseason selections were more than the Aztecs had each of the last two years (7) ... SDSU has at least three all-MW picks in eight straight years after doing so just four times over the previous 10 years (2005-14) ... San Diego State's four defensive selections are their most in league history (also 2020) ... WR Jesse Matthews became the first Aztec wide receiver to earn preseason all-MW honors since Colin Lockett in 2012 ... AZTECS NAME TEAM CAPTAINS

The San Diego State football team has named seniors Jesse Matthews (San Diego/Christian High), Patrick McMorris (Santa Ana, Calif.), Jonah Tavai (Manhattan Beach, Calif.) and Alama Uluave (Laie, Hawaii) as its captains for the 2022 campaign. The quartet was chosen in a team vote on Aug. 27.

A former walk-on, Matthews led the Aztecs last year in catches (57), receiving yards (642) and receiving touchdowns (9), the most by an Aztec since Vincent Brown had 10 in 2010. Matthews particularly shined down the stretch, recording 37 catches for 465 yards and seven touchdowns over his final four games, including 11 receptions for 175 yards and two touchdowns against No. 24/25 UTSA in the Frisco Bowl en route to earning offensive MVP honors. Matthews has been named to the Reese's Senior Bowl Watch List, and a preseason first-team all-Mountain West selection by the league media, Phil Steele Magazine and Athlon Sports.

McMorris, who last month was named the MW preseason co-defensive player of the year, started all 14 games for the Aztecs last year at safety. The 2021 MW first-team selection had a team-high 90 tackles (53 solo), including 2.5 tackles for loss, a team-best four interceptions for 61 yards, nine pass breakups and a 15-yard fumble recovery in 2021. McMorris has landed on three preseason watch lists, including the Chuck Bednarik Award Watch List (college defensive player of the year), the Bronko Nagurski Award Watch List (most outstanding defensive player) and the Senior Bowl Watch List, and is a preseason first-team all-league selection by four publications.

A two-time honorable-mention all-MW pick (2020-21), Tavai had 47 tackles (23 solo) last year, including 14 tackles for loss, 8.5 sacks and 11 quarterback hurries in 14 starts. Tavai ranked sixth in the MW in sacks and seventh in tackles for loss. According to Pro Football Focus, he ranked second in the league in quarterback pressures (sacks/hits/hurries) (61, T-7th in FBS) and hurries (40, T-8th in FBS), and tied for fifth in hits (11, T-21st in FBS). Tavai has also been named to the Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Award Watch List, and a preseason first-team all-league pick by the MW media, Phil Steele Magazine and Athlon Sports.

Uluave started all 22 games the past two seasons for the Aztecs at center. Uluave was an honorable mention all-league pick in 2021 after allowing just six pressures (two hits, two hurries and two sacks) in 409 passing chances, according to Pro Football Focus. Additionally, Uluave played the most snaps on the team (953). So far this preseason, Uluave has been named to the Rimington Trophy Watch List for the nation's top center, the Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Watch List, and a preseason first-team all-MW pick by the league media, Phil Steele Magazine and Athlon Sports.

COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

- Has amassed 36 years of coaching experience at the collegiate level including 14 seasons as a FBS head coach at Michigan (2011-14), San Diego State (2009-10) and Ball State (2003-08).
- Received conference coach-of-the-year recognition in three different leagues as a head coach while posting a 94-76 overall record. During his tenure as a head coach, Hoke's teams have produced 91 all-conference selections.
- Brings 20 years of experience as a collegiate defensive coach with stints at Grand Valley State (1983), Western Michigan (1984-86), Toledo (1987-88), Oregon State (1989-94), Michigan (1995- 2002), Oregon (2016) and Tennessee, where he was named interim head coach for the final two games of the 2017 campaign.

AT SAN DIEGO STATE

- Hoke returned to "America's Finest City" as the Aztecs' defensive line coach in 2019, helping SDSU rank second in FBS in rush defense (75.4), third in scoring defense (12.7), and sixth in both total defense (287.8) and pass efficiency defense (110.25).
- Spent two seasons as San Diego State's head coach (2009-10), earning Mountain West Coach of the Year honors in 2010 after leading the Aztecs to their first postseason appearance in 12 years with a victory over Navy in the Poinsettia Bowl.
- Coached 18 all-MW performers during his first stint at SDSU, as well as 25 conference all-academic recipients.

OTHER COACHING EXPERIENCE

- Served as head coach at Michigan from 2011-14, guiding the Wolverines to a 31-20 record, including an 18-14 conference ledger. He became the first Michigan head coach to go undefeated at home (14-0) in his first two seasons since Fielding Yost in 1901-02.
- Directed the Wolverines to an 11-2 record and a victory in the Allstate Sugar Bowl in his first season on the Ann Arbor campus. For his efforts, Hoke collected the inaugural Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year award from the Big Ten Conference coaches while garnering Dave McClain Coach of the Year accolades from the Big Ten media. In addition, he was named the Maxwell Football Club Collegiate Coach of the Year that season and was a finalist for three other national Coach of the Year honors: Bear Bryant, Eddie Robinson and Liberty Mutual.
- During Hoke's tenure in Ann Arbor, the Wolverine defense improved from a unit that in 2010 ranked 108th in the FBS in scoring defense and 110th in yards allowed to one that ranked among the top 20 in total defense in 2011, 2012 and 2014. Meanwhile, the offense averaged nearly 30 points per game (29.2) in his four years at the helm.
- Under Hoke's tutelage at Michigan, a total of 21 Wolverine players received all-Big Ten recognition.
- Earned his first head coaching job at his alma mater, Ball State, where he guided the program for six seasons, culminating with a 12-1 campaign in 2008 and an undefeated Mid-American Conference regular season.
- With Hoke at the controls, Ball State made its' first-ever appearance in the national polls in 2008, ranking as high as 12th by the Associated Press and 13th in the USA Today Coaches poll. For his efforts, Hoke was one of 10 finalists for the 2008 Liberty Mutual National Coach of the Year award.
- Led the Cardinals to back-to-back bowl game appearances (2007-08), the first time the feat was accomplished in school history. The 2008 team, which also advanced to its first MAC championship contest, earned an invitation to the GMAC Bowl in Mobile, Alabama.
- As a defensive line coach at Michigan, Hoke was part of three Big Ten champion teams (1997, 1998, 2000), including the 1997 national champion and Rose Bowl-winning squad, before his promotion to associate head coach in 2002.
- Began his coaching career as an assistant at Yorktown (Ind.) High School in 1981 before entering the collegiate ranks as a defensive line coach at Grand Valley State in 1983.

- Began his coaching career as a volunteer assistant with the San Diego State football program in 2010 and 2011, working with the offensive line.

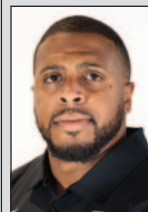
